



Adobe Acrobat Reader

Finding Words

You can use the Find command to find a complete word or part of a word in the current PDF document. Acrobat Reader looks for the word by reading every word on every page in the file, including text in form fields.

To find a word using the Find command:

- 1. Click the Find button (**Binoculars**), or choose Edit > Find.
- 2. Enter the text to find in the text box.
- 3. Select search options if necessary:

 Match Whole Word Only finds only occurrences of the complete word you enter in the box. For example, if you search for the word *stick*, the words *tick* and *sticky* will not be highlighted.

Match Case finds only words that contain exactly the same capitalization you enter in the box.

Find Backwards starts the search from the current page and goes backwards through the document.

4. Click Find. Acrobat Reader finds the next occurrence of the word.

To find the next occurrence of the word, Do one of the following:

Choose Edit > Find Again Reopen the find dialog box, and click Find Again. (The word must already be in the Find text box.)

Copying and pasting text and graphics to another application

You can select text or a graphic in a PDF document, copy it to the Clipboard, and paste it into another application such as a word processor. You can also paste text into a PDF document note or into a bookmark. Once the selected text or graphic is on the Clipboard, you can switch to another application and paste it into another document.

Note: If a font copied from a PDF document is not available on the system displaying the copied text, the font cannot be preserved. A default font is substituted.



To select and copy it to the clipboard:

1. Select the text tool T, and do one of the following: To select a line of text, select the first letter of the sentence or phrase and drag to the last letter.

To select multiple columns of text (horizontally), hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option (Mac OS) as you drag across the width of the document.

To select a column of text (vertically), Hold down Ctrl+Alt (Windows) or Option+Command (Mac OS) as you drag the length of the document.

To select all the text on the page, choose Edit > Select All. In single page mode, all the text on the current page is selected. In Continuous or Continuous – facing mode, most of the text in the document is selected. When you release the mouse button, the selected text is highlighted. To deselect the text and start over, click anywhere outside the selected text. The Select All command will not select all the text in the document. A workaround for this (Windows) is to use the Edit > Copy command. Choose Edit > Copy to copy the selected text to the clipboard.

2. To view the text, choose Window > Show Clipboard

In Windows 95, the Clipboard Viewer is not installed by default and you cannot use the Show Clipboard command until it is installed. To install the Clipboard Viewer, Choose Start > Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs, and then click the Windows Setup tab. Double-click Accessories, check Clipboard Viewer, and click OK.

- 6 ABSTAIN, AND THAT WOULD BE A WAY TO ALLOW FOR THOSE
- 7 DISTINCTIONS TO BE MADE. A FIFTH ISSUE WAS HOW WILL BE CHAIR
- 8 AND VICE CHAIR OF THE CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATION COMMITTEE BE
- 9 SELECTED. IN SHORT, THE COMMITTEE, AT ITS FIRST MEETING, WILL
- 10 VOTE IN A CHAIR FROM MTC OR ABAG, AND THE VICE CHAIR WOULD BE
- 11 FROM THE OTHER COMMITTEES, SO THEY WILL, YOU KNOW, IT WILL
- 12 ALTERNATE, CHAIR, VICE CHAIR, BETWEEN MTC AND ABAG, AND THAT
- 13 ROTATION WILL HAPPEN EVERY TWO YEARS. THE SIXTH ISSUE HAS TO
- 14 DO WITH RECONCILING AN OPEN VERSUS CLOSED MEMBERSHIP, AND HOW
- 15 TO MAINTAIN QUORUM. THIS WAS A TOPIC OF CONSIDERABLE
- 16 DISCUSSION, BUT IT WAS RESOLVED IN THIS WAY. THAT, MTC
- 17 COMMISSIONERS, AS IS THE CURRENT PRACTICE, THAT ARE NOT
- 18 APPOINTED TO A PARTICULAR COMMITTEE, CAN ATTEND AN AD-HOC,
- 19 NON-VOTING MEMBERS, UNDER CURRENT PROCEDURES, THAT PROCESS
- 20 WILL ALSO BE EXTENDED TO THE ABAG BOARD FOR PURPOSES OF THE
- 21 LEGISLATION COMMITTEE. ANY MTC COMMISSIONER OR ANY ABAG
- 22 EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBER HAS THE OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE AS A
- 23 NON-VOTING MEMBER FOR THIS CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATION COMMITTEE.
- 24 FURTHERMORE, SHOULD THERE BE QUORUM ISSUES FOR THE LEGISLATION
- 25 CONSOLIDATED COMMITTEE, MTC OR EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBERS CAN BE



- 1 DEPUTIZED TO ADDRESS THOSE QUORUM ISSUES. SO THAT'S HOW WE
- 2 HAVE ADDRESSED THAT SITUATION. LET ME NOW TURN TO THE QUESTION
- 3 OF MEMBERSHIP. BECAUSE THIS IS THE ARENA WHERE SOME FURTHER
- 4 ADJUSTMENTS NEED TO BE MADE. OVERALL, CHAIR HAGGERTY, AND
- 5 PRESIDENT ARREGUIN WILL BE MEETING TO DISCUSS APPOINTMENTS TO
- 6 THE COMMITTEE BEFORE FORMALIZING THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS. WITH
- 7 AN EMPHASIS ON STRIKING APPROPRIATE BALANCE BETWEEN COUNTY
- 8 REPRESENTATION, JURISDICTIONAL SIZE, ET CETERA. A KEY
- 9 OBJECTIVE HERE, IS THAT THERE WILL BE EQUAL NUMBERS OF MTC
- 10 REPRESENTATIVES, AND ABAG REPRESENTATIVES ON THIS CONSOLIDATED
- 11 COMMITTEE. HOWEVER, THE ISSUE THAT AROSE VERY RECENTLY HAS TO
- 12 DO WITH THE FACT THAT THE COMMISSION PROCEDURES MANUAL AND THE
- 13 ABAG BYLAWS ARE NOT ALIGNED WITH RESPECT TO THE ROLE ON
- 14 COMMITTEES OF THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR OF MTC, AND THE
- 15 PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF ABAG. THOSE TWO ESTABLISHING
- 16 DOCUMENTS ARE A BIT IN CONFLICT WITH RESPECT TO THOSE RULES.
- 17 THE OBJECTIVE IS TO HAVE EQUIVALENT STATUS FOR THE CHAIR AND
- 18 VICE CHAIR OF MTC, AND THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF
- 19 ABAG ON THIS CONSOLIDATED LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE. WE THOUGHT WE
- 20 HAD IT FIXED. WE ARE NOT QUITE THERE. SO, WHAT WE WILL BE
- 21 ASKING IS FOR THIS ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE TO RECOMMEND THE
- 22 CHANGES, NOTING THAT FURTHER ADJUSTMENTS WILL NEED TO BE MADE
- 23 IN ORDER TO ENSURE THIS OUTCOME IS ACHIEVED. SO, THAT JUST --
- 24 WITHOUT GOING INTO THE WEEDS, THIS'S THE ISSUE THAT STILL
- 25 NEEDS TO BE RESOLVED. IN ADDITION THAT, WITH RESPECT TO



- 1 MEMBERSHIP, THIS IS ANOTHER SITUATION WHERE, AGAIN, THE
- 2 COMMISSION PROCEDURES MANUAL, AND ABAG BYLAWS AREN'T QUITE
- 3 ALIGNED, WE NEED TO CLARIFY THE ROLE OF EX-OFFICIO NON-VOTING
- 4 MEMBERS SERVING AS OFFICIAL MEMBERS THIS CONSOLIDATED
- 5 COMMITTEE. THERE IS DIFFERENCES IN HOW ABAG AND MTC HAVE
- 6 ADJUSTED AND DEALT WITH THAT, AND WE NEED TO WORK WITH THE
- 7 PRESIDENT, JESSE ARREQUIN OF ABAG, AND CHAIR SCOTT HAGGERTY OF
- 8 MTC IN ORDER TO GET TO AN AGREEMENT ON HOW THAT SPECIFICALLY
- 9 SHOULD WORK. DEEP APOLOGIES, WE THOUGHT WE HAD ALL THESE
- 10 THINGS DOWN BUT REALIZED GOING INTO THE MEETING TODAY, THESE
- 11 ARE AREA THAT STILL AREN'T QUITE ALIGNED. THERE ARE OPTIONS TO
- 12 MAKE THAT HAPPEN, AND WE WILL BE DISCUSSING THAT WITH THE
- 13 CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR, AND PRESIDENT AND VICE PERSPECTIVE OF
- 14 MTC AND ABAG. BUT WE WANT TO GET IT RIGHT, AND WE DIDN'T WANT
- 15 TO DO IT ON THE FLY WITH YOU THIS MORNING. SO WITH THAT, I
- 16 WOULD -- STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE
- 17 FORWARD RESOLUTION 1053, REVISED, NOTING THAT THERE ARE STILL
- 18 SOME ADJUSTMENTS THAT NEED TO BE MADE ON THE ISSUE I
- 19 DESCRIBED, WITH RESPECT TO RULES OF THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR
- 20 AS MEMBERS OF THIS NEW CONSOLIDATED COMMITTEE. I'M HAPPY TO
- 21 ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS. OUR GENERAL COUNSEL ADRIENNE WEIL IS
- 22 ALSO AVAILABLE IF YOU HAVE SOME SPECIFICS ON THE ISSUES I
- 23 RAISED. THANK YOU.

- 20 POINT. THIS IS THE FIRST COMMITTEE THAT WE'RE LOOKING AT
- 21 MERGING. THERE WILL BE OTHER COMMITTEES, BUT WE DECIDED THAT

- 8 THERESE MCMILLAN: SO AND I -- AND THE ONLY THING I WOULD ADD,
- 9 IS I JUST WANTED TO MAKE THE POINT THAT THE, YOU KNOW, OF THE
- 10 TECHNICALITIES OF IT BEING PUT TOGETHER SHOULD NOT OVERSHADOW
- 11 THE BROADER OBJECTIVE, THAT THE COLLABORATIVE SPACE THAT CHAIR
- 12 HAGGERTY JUST SPOKE TO, AND SO I JUST WANTED TO NOTE THAT
- 13 IT'S, UNFORTUNATELY, I HAD TO FOCUS ON THOSE TECHNICALITIES OF

- 18 JEANNIE BRUINS, VICE CHAIR: OKAY. SO FOR ME, AGAIN, THE FIRST
- 19 CONCERN IS WHETHER OR NOT WE ARE COMPLIANT IF WE HAVE A
- 20 MAJORITY OF OUR COMMISSION ON A COMMITTEE, AND I THINK THAT
- 21 WOULD CARRY FORWARD WITH ANY OTHER CONSOLIDATIONS THAT WE'RE
- 22 TALKING ABOUT. OTHER THING IS, AGAIN, I APPRECIATE TRYING TO
- 23 GET MORE EFFICIENT AND SUCH, BUT IF WE HAVE -- IF THIS BODY

- 3 DEALING WITH SUBJECT MATTER THAT IS RELEVANT TO THE BODY THAT
- 4 HAS A MAJORITY OF THE -- THE MINORITY OF THE PEOPLE PRESENT AT
- 5 IT. YOU KNOW, IF THERE'S SOMETHING ABOUT ABAG, OKAY, THAT IT'S
- 6 LEGISLATION, OR SOMETHING THAT'S PERTINENT TO THEM, AND NOT SO
- 7 MUCH TO MTC IT CLEARLY SAYS THAT AS AN MTC COMMISSIONER, THE

- 4 THERESE MCMILLAN: I WOULD SAY THAT INCREASINGLY AGAIN --
- 5 THERESE MCMILLAN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR -- INCREASINGLY, AGAIN,
- 6 WE HAVE SEEN THAT THE ISSUES THAT ARE, FOR EXAMPLE, DEALING
- 7 WITH CLIMATE CHANGE ISSUES THAT ARE DEALING WITH HOUSING,
- 8 ISSUES THAT ARE DEALING WITH THE FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC
- 9 TRANSIT, GIVEN THIS OUR LONG RANGE PLAN, PLANNED BAY AREA 2050
- 10 POINTS OUT THE INTERRELATED NATURE OF ALL OF THESE ISSUES, AND
- 11 IF THOSE AREAS FUNCTIONALLY ARE NOT WORKING TOGETHER TO
- 12 ADVANCE, YOU KNOW, AN OPPORTUNITY FOR BAY AREA RESIDENTS, THAT
- 13 THEN COLLECTIVELY WE'RE FOLLOWING. AND I WOULD POINT OUT THAT
- 14 OTHER MPOS DEAL WITH ALL OF THESE ISSUES TOGETHER, WHERE THOSE
- 15 BOARDS ARE, YOU KNOW, DEALING WITH THESE ISSUES, THEY'RE SET
- 16 UP TO DEAL WITH THEM COLLECTIVELY. SO IN FACT, WE ARE DOING
- 17 THE SAME THING BY VIRTUE OF BRINGING THESE TOGETHER IN THIS
- 18 FORUM.

- 2 RAISE. GO AHEAD. COMMISSIONER.

- 4 JAKE MACKENZIE: THANK YOU. I AM FASCINATED BY THIS DISCUSSION
- 5 AS THE CURRENT CHAIR OF MTC'S LEGISLATION COMMITTEE, WHICH HAS
- 6 BEEN MEETING JOINTLY WITH ABAG'S LEGISLATION COMMITTEE UNDER
- 7 THE CHAIR OF JULIE PIERCE. WE HAVE ACTUALLY BEEN DOING THIS
- 8 SINCE WE AGREED TO SIGN THE CASA COMPACT, AND THE CREATION OF
- 9 A SPECIAL MECHANISM AT THAT TIME, AND WE HAVE BEEN MEETING
- 10 JOINTLY, AND I WOULD ARGUE SUCCESSFULLY, OVER THE PAST YEAR
- 11 AND A HALF. WHAT I JUST HEARD WAS THAT, YOU KNOW, A VERY
- 12 STRONG ARGUMENT FOR, ACTUALLY MOVING TOWARDS ONE GOVERNING
- 13 BOARD. AND I HEAR OUR CHAIR SAYING, WELL, THIS IS A FIRST
- 14 STEP, AND I WOULD ACKNOWLEDGE THAT. SO THAT BEING THE CASE,
- 15 THE PRESENT MECHANISM AS FOR AS I'M CONCERNED, CONTINUES TO
- 16 WORK WELL AND COOPERATIVELY BETWEEN THE TWO AGENCIES, AND MY
- 17 OBSERVATION IS THAT IT'S BEEN STAFFED, BOTH THESE COMMITTEES
- 18 HAVE BEEN STAFFED BY THE SAME PEOPLE AT THE SAME TIME. THAT
- 19 BEING SAID, I DO HAVE A QUESTION. EVER SINCE I HAVE BEEN ON
- 20 THE COMMISSION, IT WAS TOLD TO ME THAT WE HAVE WEDNESDAY
- 21 COMMITTEES, AND WE HAVE FRIDAY COMMITTEES. SO IF YOU'RE ON THE
- 22 FRIDAY COMMITTEES, THEN, IPSO DE FACTO, THEN YOU ARE A MEMBER
- 23 OF THE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE. AND DOES THAT CONTINUE TO BE THE
- 24 CASE IF THIS COMBINATION IS ADOPTED?



- 1 THERESE MCMILLAN: I DEFER TO CHAIR HAGGERTY TO ADDRESS THAT AS
- 2 HE AND PRESIDENT ARREGUIN HAVE BEEN DISCUSSING WITH HOW TO
- 3 MOVE FORWARD WITH APPOINTMENTS TO THE COMMITTEE.

4

5 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: ARE YOU STILL ON? CHAIR HAGGERTY?

- 7 DIR. SCOTT HAGGERTY: NO. THAT'S JUST A FACADE OF ME. I RUN A
- 8 VIDEO. SO I THINK THAT CHAIR ARREGUIN AND MYSELF HAVE BEEN IN
- 9 DISCUSSIONS. WE DID HAVE A MEETING SCHEDULED ABOUT A WEEK --
- 10 MAYBE TWO WEEKS AGO, AND IT WAS A CRAZY COVID DAY. SO WE BOTH
- 11 DECIDED WE PROBABLY SHOULD BETTER DO SOMETHING ELSE. AND YOU
- 12 KNOW, WE HAVE HAD DISCUSSIONS ABOUT HOW WE'RE GOING TO
- 13 APPOINT. I BELIEVE THAT I'M IN A LITTLE MORE DIFFICULT
- 14 POSITION THAN THE PRESIDENT OF ABAG. AND THE REASON WHY IS
- 15 BECAUSE WE HAVE WEDNESDAY COMMITTEES AND FRIDAY COMMITTEES,
- 16 AND SO WHEN I APPOINT A LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE, I HAVE TO BE
- 17 MINDFUL THAT IT'S PROBABLY MEMBERS OF THE FRIDAY COMMITTEE. SO
- 18 I MAY HAVE TO MOVE SOME PEOPLE AROUND BETWEEN WEDNESDAY AND
- 19 FRIDAY. MY GOAL IS TO NOT DO THAT. BUT I THINK THE PRESIDENT
- 20 OF ABAG HAS AN EASIER TIME WHERE HE CAN JUST PICK PEOPLE. HE'S
- 21 NOT BOUND BY A DAY OF A COMMITTEE. SO WE'RE GOING TO SIT DOWN
- 22 AND WE'RE GOING TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO DO THE APPOINTMENTS. BUT
- 23 FROM THE MTC SIDE, I'LL JUST ADDRESS THAT, IF YOU'RE CURRENTLY
- 24 SERVING AS A MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE, I FULLY



- 1 EXPECT THAT YOU WILL STAY THERE. THAT'S MY GOAL. I HOPE THAT
- 2 ANSWER YOUR QUESTION JAKE.

3

- 4 JAKE MACKENZIE: [LAUGHTER] THAT'S FAIR ENOUGH. I MEAN, YOU
- 5 HAVE LAID OUT EXACTLY THE CHALLENGES THAT FACE YOU AS CHAIR,
- 6 OF MTC, AND I LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING TO PLAY A ROLE. AND
- 7 THAT'S IT, CHAIR GLOVER. I HAVE SAID MY PIECE.

8

- 9 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: THANK YOU. ARE THERE ANY OTHER
- 10 COMMISSIONERS THAT HAVE QUESTIONS OR COMMENTS?

11

- 12 AMY R. WORTH: FEDERAL, IT'S AMY, I DON'T KNOW IF YOU CAN SEE
- 13 MY HAND.

14

15 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: AMY.

- 17 AMY R. WORTH: THANK YOU MR. CHAIR. I HAVE A COUPLE OF QUICK
- 18 THINGS FIRST OF ALL I SHARE JEANNE'S THOUGHTS ABOUT HAVING
- 19 MORE MEMBERS THAN A QUORUM OF THE COMMISSION BUT PARTICIPATION
- 20 IN THE PREVIOUS DISCUSSIONS IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING -- I DON'T
- 21 KNOW HOW WE GET TO 11 COMMISSIONERS FOR THE LEG COMMITTEE. I
- 22 THOUGHT AGAIN AS WE CONCLUDED THAT IT WOULD BE PERIL TO SAY TO
- 23 THE FRIDAY COMMITTEE. AM I MISSING SOMETHING THAT WE'RE ADDING
- 24 TWO PEOPLE. THAT'S ONE THING. SECOND, IT SOUND LIKE WHAT I'M
- 25 HEARING FROM STAFF IT SOUND LIKE THERE IS A CLERICAL STRUCTURE



- 1 AROUND THIS TO FIND THE RIGHT NUANCES AND WE JUST HAVE TO FIND
- 2 THE RIGHT LANGUAGE TO MAKE THIS HAPPEN. IS THAT WHERE WE ARE?

3

- 4 THERESE MCMILLAN: THIS IS THERESE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. YES. I
- 5 WOULD SAY THAT ONE OF THE THINGS THAT ONE COULD CONSIDER WE --
- 6 CHAIR HAGGERTY, AND PRESIDENT ARREGUIN WERE DISCUSSING HOW WE
- 7 WANTED TO MAKE SURE THAT THE SIZE OF THE COMMITTEE DID NOT GET
- 8 TOO BIG, BUT THEY WERE ALSO TRYING TO BALANCE, AS THIS IS THE
- 9 FIRST CONSOLIDATED COMMITTEE, THE REPRESENTATIONAL
- 10 CONSIDERATION THAT WOULD NEED TO BE BROUGHT TO BAY AREA FROM
- 11 BOTH SIDES. AND THE TWO MAIN ONES ARE REPRESENTATION ACROSS
- 12 THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA OF THE BAY AREA THAT'S, I GUESS, A NO-
- 13 BRAINER. BUT AS WELL, I THINK THERE WERE QUESTIONS CONCERNING
- 14 THE REPRESENTATION OF THE SIZE OF JURISDICTION, AND THE NUMBER
- 15 OF CITY REPRESENTATIVES VERSUS THOSE REPRESENTING COUNTIES. IT
- 16 HAS BEEN INITIALLY THOUGHT THAT 11 ON BOTH SIDES WAS LARGE
- 17 ENOUGH TO ALLOW FOR THAT BALANCING TO BE ACHIEVED. AND NOT
- 18 MAKE IT TOO BIG. ON THE OTHER HAND, YOU KNOW, AS THE
- 19 DISCUSSIONS ON WHAT THE COMPOSITION WILL BE, HAVE NOT BEEN
- 20 FINALIZED, YOU KNOW, THAT NUMBER COULD BE ADJUSTED AS WE
- 21 EVALUATE THINGS THAT WERE RAISED TODAY. SO I WOULD OFFER,
- 22 PERHAPS, THAT THAT NUMBER 11 BE VIEWED AS, YOU KNOW, VALUABLE,
- 23 AS WE ADDRESS THE POINT THAT BOTH I RAISED, AND WHAT
- 24 COMMISSIONER BRUINS AND COMMISSIONER WORTH HAVE ALSO RAISED.



- 1 AMY R. WORTH: OKAY. SO IF I COULD JUST FOLLOW UP THEN. I THINK
- 2 IT'S IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER, TOO, WHAT SCOTT HAS INDICATED,
- 3 THAT THIS WAS THE GOAL OF BRINGING THESE GROUPS TOGETHER. WE
- 4 DO KNOW THAT THESE COMMITTEES ARE MERELY ADVISORY TO THE
- 5 COMMISSION, OR TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE. SO IT'S NOT
- 6 LIKE WE'RE CREATING A FORUM WHERE THE FINAL WORD IS SPOKEN. SO
- 7 YOU KNOW, AGAIN, AND THIS'S THE SAME THING WITH
- 8 REPRESENTATION. I MEAN, I THINK YOU JUST DO THE BEST YOU CAN,
- 9 BUT RECOGNIZING THAT BOTH OF THESE, ANY BILL WILL GO,
- 10 OBVIOUSLY IN EMERGENCY SITUATION, WE SEE MOST OF THESE BILLS
- 11 ARE NOT OUT OF THE BLUE. HAVING SPENT A NUMBER OF HOURS
- 12 YESTERDAY ON A CALL WITH A LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE, WITH SOME
- 13 LEGISLATION IN CONTRA COSTA, YOU KNOW, I RECOGNIZE THE
- 14 IMPORTANCE OF US BEING NIMBLE IN TERMS OF BEING ABLE TO
- 15 PARTICIPATE WHEN BILLS MOVE QUICKLY IN SACRAMENTO. I
- 16 APPRECIATE THAT FEEDBACK IN TERMS OF BRINGING THIS INFORMATION
- 17 BACK TO THE COMMISSION.

18

- 19 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I HAD SEEN A RAISED HAND
- 20 BUT DON'T KNOW WHO THAT WAS. MADAM CLERK, DO YOU HAVE --

- 22 JAKE MACKENZIE: IT WAS ACTUALLY COMMISSIONER MACKENZIE WHO
- 23 RAISED HIS HAND AND SORT OF HAD SECOND THOUGHTS. BUT I WAS
- 24 GOING TO REACT TO COMMISSIONER WORTH'S REMARKS JUST IN TERMS
- 25 OF ACTIONS TAKEN BY OUR MTC LEGISLATION COMMITTEE, AND SEVERAL



- 1 TIMES THIS LEGISLATIVE SESSION -- OR AT LEAST A COUPLE OF
- 2 TIMES, WE HAVE UTILIZED THE URGENCY REQUIREMENTS AND AS THE
- 3 CHAIR IN CONCERT WITH OUR CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR OF MTC, WE HAVE
- 4 RECOMMENDED POSITIONS ON BILLS, SO WE'RE NOT COMPLETELY
- 5 TOOTHLESS.

6

- 7 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: OKAY. ANY OTHER COMMENTS? QUESTIONS?
- 8 OKAY. DO WE HAVE ANYONE FROM THE PUBLIC?

9

- 10 CLERK OF THE BOARD: I SEE NO RAISED -- WELL, WE DO NOW HAVE A
- 11 MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC. RICH HEDGES HAS RAISED HIS HAND.

12

13 FEDERAL D. GLOVER, CHAIR: OKAY. MR. HEDGES?

14

- 15 RICHARD HEDGES: NO PROBLEM WITH THE CONCEPT. I JUST WANTED TO
- 16 WEIGH IN ON THE BROWN ACT ISSUE. IF YOU'RE HAVING A -- AND
- 17 THIS IS WHAT I THINK. IT DOESN'T MEAN IT'S TRUE. IF YOU'RE
- 18 HAVING A MAJORITY OF THE COMMISSIONERS, YOU MAY HAVE TO
- 19 ANNOUNCE THE COMMITTEE AS MTC TO DISCUSS ADMINISTRATIVE
- 20 ISSUES. BECAUSE I THINK, WHEN YOU HAVE A MAJORITY OF THE BODY,
- 21 YOU HAVE TO -- YOU HAVE TO DISCLOSE ITS MAJORITY OF THE BODY
- 22 FOR THE BROWN ACT. THANK YOU.
