



- 16 THE GOVERNMENT CODE AND THINGS YOU HAD TO READ. IT WAS VERY

- 23 WITH MTC'S EXPRESS LANES TEAM. I AM HERE TODAY FOR A PUBLIC
- 24 HEARING RELATED TO BAIFA TOLL ORDINANCE TO EXTEND SOUTH BOUND
- 25 680 LANE INTO CONTRA COSTA COUNTY AND FOLLOWING THAT I'LL MAKE



- 1 A RECOMMENDATION ABOUT HOW TO PROCEED. AS A REMINDER WE ARE
- 2 PROPOSING THE SAME TOLLING RULES AS THE EXISTING 680 EXPRESS
- 3 LANES FOR CONSISTENCY. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. MY PRESENTATION
- 4 BEGINNING WITH SOME BACKGROUND INFORMATION BEFORE WE PAUSE FOR
- 5 THE PUBLIC HEARING RELATED TO THE PROPOSED TOLL ORDINANCE
- 6 AMENDMENT. THEN I'LL GIVE AN OVERVIEW OF WRITTEN PUBLIC
- 7 COMMENTS THAT WE RECEIVED DURING THE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD TO
- 8 INFORM YOUR DECISION ABOUT WHETHER TO APPROVE THE AMENDED
- 9 ORDINANCE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. FIRST, I WANT TO QUICKLY REMIND
- 10 EVERYBODY WHY WE ARE BUILDING EXPRESS LANES. WHILE THE CURRENT
- 11 PANDEMIC HAS AFFECTED TRAFFIC OUR HOV LANES ARE DEGRADED WE'RE
- 12 WORKING WITH THE EXPRESS LANE AND BUSES OFFERING ALTERNATIVE
- 13 OF TRAFFIC TO ALL DRIVERS AND PROVIDING A CONSISTENT USER
- 14 EXPERIENCE. MAP SHOWS THE EXPRESS LANE NETWORK DEVELOPED
- 15 THROUGH OUR ONGOING STRATEGIC PLAN AND THE PURPLE PORTION
- 16 POINTS TO THE 680 PROPOSED FOR INCLUSION IN THE BAIFA TOLL
- 17 ORDINANCE TODAY. NEXT SLIDE. BAIFA ALREADY OPERATING THE I 680
- 18 EXPRESS LANES FROM WALNUT CREEK TO SAN RAHMON SHOWN IN YELLOW
- 19 WE HAVE PARTNERED WITH CONTRA COSTA TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY
- 20 TO EXTEND THE PRESS LANE FROM MARTINEZ TO WALNUT CREEK IN THE
- 21 SOUTHBOUND DIRECTION SHOWN IN BLUE CREATING A CONTINUOUS 23
- 22 MILE EXPRESS LANE. EVENTUALLY OUR EXPRESS LANE WILL CONNECT TO
- 23 THE 680 EXPRESS LANES IN ALAMEDA COUNTY WHICH HAVE RECEIVED
- 24 RM3 FUNDS FROM MTC TO CLOSE THE GAP. THE TRANSPORTATION
- 25 AUTHORITY EXPEDITED PROJECT DELIVERY SO OUR 680 EXTENSION TO



- 1 OAKLAND IS A 2-PERSON CARPOOL LANE ON AUGUST 24TH AND SHOULD
- 2 BEGIN OPERATING AS AN EXPRESS LANE WITH TOLLING IN EARLY 2021,
- 3 ABOUT 9 MONTHS AHEAD OF SCHEDULE. AMENDING OUR TOLL ORDINANCE
- 4 IS KEY STEP IN THE PROCESS TO TOLL THE EXTENSION. I WANT TO
- 5 POINT ON YOU FOR THE EXISTING 680 EXPRESS LANES BAIFA WILL
- 6 BEGIN TOLLING CLEAN AIR VEHICLES HALF PRICE TOLL ON FRIDAY
- 7 OCTOBER 2ND. WE ARE ALSO PARTNERING WITH THE TRANSPORTATION
- 8 AUTHORITY ON CUSTOMER EDUCATION WHICH WILL CONTINUE THROUGH
- 9 EARLY 2021. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THE TOLL ORDINANCE ALLOWS BAIFA
- 10 TO ENFORCE TOLL VIOLATIONS ON ITS EXPRESS LANES. IT DOCUMENTS
- 11 OUR TOLL POLICIES IN THE CONTEXT OF CALTRAIN'S HOV LANE
- 12 POLICIES. BAIFA'S TOLL ORDINANCE LAST AMENDED IN JANUARY TO
- 13 ENABLE TOLLING ON THE 880 EXPRESS LANES AND HALF-PRICE TOLLS
- 14 FOR CLEAN AIR VEHICLES ON ALL BAIFA EXPRESS LANES. STAFF IS
- 15 PROPOSING THAT BAIFA AMEND ITS TOLL ORDINANCE TODAY TO ENABLE
- 16 TOLLING ON 680 EXTENSION. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. AS YOU CAN SEE,
- 17 IN THE PURPLE BOX, TOLLS ON THE 680 EXTENSION ARE PROPOSED TO
- 18 BE THE SAME AS ON BAIFA'S EXISTING 680 EXPRESS LANES SO THE
- 19 ENTIRE SOUTHBOUND EXPRESS LANE HAS CONSISTENT RULES SHOWN IN
- 20 THE RIGHT COLUMN TOLLING RULES ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE 680
- 21 EXPRESS LANES AND 580 IN ALAMEDA WITH EXCEPTION OF HOV
- 22 AVAILABILITY. FOR THE 680 EXTENSION CALTRANS DETERMINED
- 23 OPERATING HOURS ARE WEEKDAYS FROM 5:00 A.M. UNTIL 8:00 P.M.
- 24 AND ELIGIBILITY IS TWO OR MORE PERSONS FASTRAK WOULD BE
- 25 REQUIRED AND TOLLS FREE FOR TWO OR MORE PERSON CARPOOLS AND



- 1 HALF PRICE FOR CLEAN AIR VEHICLES, PENALTIES AND LATE FEE
- 2 NOTICES FOR VIOLATIONS IS THE SAME AS OTHER EXPRESS LANES.
- 3 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO NOW I'M GOING TO COVER THE FASTRAK RULES
- 4 THAT WOULD APPLY TO THE 680 EXTENSION SAME FOR ALL BAY AREA
- 5 EXPRESS LANES ALL VEHICLES IN THE EXPRESS LANE WOULD BE
- 6 REQUIRED TO HAVE A FASTRAK ACCOUNT. SOLO DRIVERS COULD USE A
- 7 STANDARD FASTRAK TOLL TAG OR A PROPERLY SET FASTRAK FLEX TOLL
- 8 TAG TO TRAVEL TOLL FREE. ELIGIBLE CLEAN AIR VEHICLES MUST
- 9 REGISTER AND USE A PROPERLY SET FASTRAK CLEAN AIR VEHICLE TOLL
- 10 TAG TO PAY HALF PRICE TOLLS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. OUR APPROACH
- 11 TO ENFORCEMENT, ON THE 680 EXTENSION WOULD BE THE SAME AS FOR
- 12 ALL BAY AREA EXPRESS LANES WORKING WITH FASTRAK OFFICE TOLL
- 13 SYSTEM WILL USE TOLL TAG READERS AND LICENSE PLATE CAMERAS TO
- 14 AUTOMATICALLY ISSUE VIOLATIONS FAILURE TO PAY RESULTS IN \$25
- 15 FOR FIRST NOTICE 45 FOR SECOND LATE FEE FOR TOTAL OF \$70 PLUS
- 16 TOLL. PENALTY WAIVED FOR FIRST TIME VIOLATORS WHO HAVE FASTRAK
- 17 ACCOUNT. LICENSE PLATE READS VERIFY NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN THE
- 18 CAR, AS A GOAL FOR OUR EXPRESS LANES. THERE ARE MULTIPLE
- 19 EXPRESS LANE OPERATORS ARE IN THE BAY AREA AND WE STRIVE FOR
- 20 CONSISTENCY ACROSS ALL EXPRESS LANES THE AMENDMENT PROCESS IS
- 21 AN OPPORTUNITY TO TOUCH BASE WITH THE PUBLIC ABOUT OUR TOLLING
- 22 POLICIES SO WE CAN MAKE SURE THEY MAKE SENSE FOR THE REGION
- 23 OVER TIME. PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS AMENDMENT SHOULD BE VIEWED
- 24 IN A BROADER CONTEXT OF REGIONAL CONSISTENCY FOR TOLLING
- 25 POLICY. WE ARE RESPONSIVE TO PUBLIC COMMENT BUT SOMETIMES IT



- 1 MAY TAKE A LITTLE BIT OF TIME SINCE WE HAVE TO WORK WITH OTHER
- 2 OPERATORS AND CALTRANS. REGARDLESS THE LISTENING PROCESS IS
- 3 KEY. AS AN EXAMPLE WHEN WE AMENDED THE TOLL ORDINANCE IN
- 4 JANUARY WE RECEIVED MANY COMMENTS ABOUT THE NEED TO ADDRESS
- 5 EQUITY ESPECIALLY AFFORDABILITY AND AS A RESULT BAIFA WILL
- 6 PILOT A MEANS TOLL DISCOUNT ON EXPRESS LANES. NEXT SLIDE. THIS
- 7 IS THE END OF THE BACKGROUND INFORMATION PORTION OF MY
- 8 PRESENTATION. I'M NOW GOING TO TURN IT BACK OVER TO OUR
- 9 COMMISSIONER TO CONDUCT THE PUBLIC HEARING AND ASK OUR
- 10 TECHNOLOGY TEAM TO PAUSE MY PRESENTATION.



- 19 I WANT TO DRAW ATTENTION TO WAS A PART OF THE INFORMATION
- 20 PIERCE INCLUDED IN HIS PRESENTATION. THIS IS ABOUT THE I 680
- 21 LANES IN CONTRA COSTA COUNTY. AGAIN, THE CONTRA COSTA COUNTY
- 22 TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY WAS ABLE TO COMPLETE WILL
