IT IS THE SEASON WHERE I GET TO TELL EVERYBODY HOW 4 5 THEIR YEAR ENDED. AND FORTUNATELY YOU'RE THE FIRST ONES I GET TO TELL HOW THE YEAR ENDED AND YOURS ENDED PRETTY WELL. IN A 6 7 VERY DIFFICULT YEAR WE DIDN'T HAVE A BAD ONE. LET ME SAY ONE 8 THING ABOUT THE FINANCIAL --9 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: BRIAN JUST A SECOND. SCOTT, YOU'RE NOT 10 MUTED. AND I SEE BELIA, SHE SENT ME A NOTE THAT SHE NEEDS TO 11 BE MADE A PANELIST, IF SHE HASN'T ALREADY BEEN MADE ONE. OKAY. 12 THANK YOU BRIAN. SORRY FOR THE INTERRUPTIONS. 13 14 BRIAN MAYHEW: NO WORRIES. IT GETS MY HANDS A CHANCE TO STOP 15 16 SHAKING. AS THE YEAR HAS GONE BY, IT WENT FROM PROBABLY THE END OF THE EXPANSION -- THE LONGEST RUNNING --17 18 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: SCOTT? 19 20 SPEAKER: THAT WASN'T SCOTT. 21 22

- 1 BRIAN MAYHEW: IT WAS A TOUGH YEAR FOR EVERYBODY. ALL BUDGETS
- 2 SUFFERED. IF YOU'RE AT THE END OF THE YEAR FOR MTC, OUR
- 3 REVENUE WAS OFF 15 PERCENT AND DIVING. GOOD NEWS IS HERE IF
- 4 YOU GO THROUGH THE TOTALITY OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS, YOU
- 5 WILL SEE WE HAD TOTAL REVENUE OF 28 MILLION, TOTAL EXPENSES OF
- 6 31 MILLION WHICH WOULD NORMALLY CONCERN THE AVERAGE FINANCE
- 7 OFFICER, BUT BECAUSE WE'RE SUCH A HEAVILY GRANT ORIENTED
- 8 OPERATION, THAT IS JUST A TIMING DIFFERENCE. MIND YOU, THESE
- 9 ARE JUNE 30TH NUMBERS, THEY ARE STILL SUBJECT TO COMPLETION OF
- 10 THE OUGHT AND WHEN WE RECORD THE FINAL ARS THAT IS PROBABLY
- 11 GOING TO MAKE MOST OF THAT GO AWAY. LET ME GET TO THREE
- 12 DISTINCT FOUND TALK ABOUT, ONE PARTICULARLY, THE
- 13 ADMINISTRATION OF ABAG, IF I'M PERMITTED FOR A MOMENT. IT WAS
- 14 NOT LONG AGO THAT AN AUDIT FIRM CAME OUT WITH THE OPINION THAT
- 15 ABSENT SUPPORT FROM MTC, ABAG WOULD FAIL. IT WOULD NOT BE ABLE
- 16 TO PAY ITS PENSIONS, IT WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO SUPPORT ITS OPEB,
- 17 IT WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO MAKE ITS BILLS. NOW, THREE YEARS
- 18 LATER, WE COME OUT WITH A SURPLUS IN THE BUDGET, STRAIGHT UP
- 19 CASH OF \$155,000. NOT BAD, CONSIDERING THE YEAR WE HAD. YOUR
- 20 MEMBERSHIPS, DUES WERE ALL COMPLETELY PAID. A MILLION DOLLARS
- 21 CAME OVER FROM FAN, THE OPEB LIABILITY HAS BEEN COMPLETELY
- 22 RETIRED. WE ARE ABOUT 15 PERCENT -- AND I WISH IT COULD BE
- 23 BETTER -- AND WE'RE WORKING ON THAT. WE'RE NOT KNOCKING DOWN
- 24 THE PENSION OBLIGATIONS BUT AT THE VERY LEAST, THE FUTURE
- 25 PENSION OBLIGATIONS NOW THEY HAVE BEEN RESTRUCTURED THROUGH



- 1 PERS LOOK LIKE THEY'RE GOING TO STAY WELL WITHIN YOUR CURRENT
- 2 MEMBERSHIP DUES THEREFORE THERE DOES NOT SEEM TO BE A
- 3 FORESEEABLE FUTURE TO SPIKE THEM AT THE MOMENT, I CANNOT SPEAK
- 4 FOR SPURS IN THE FUTURE. ON THE DETAIL, AS YOU KNOW, REVENUE
- 5 WAS UP ABOUT \$4 MILLION, EXPENSES ROUGHLY ABOUT \$4 MILLION. AS
- 6 YOU COME DOWN TO THE BALANCE IN ABAG, YOU WILL SEE THAT THERE
- 7 IS \$155,000 SURPLUS. IF YOU TAKE THE DEPRECIATION EXPENSE
- 8 AWAY, WHICH I'M STILL NOT SURE WHY THIS IS CLASSIFIED THAT
- 9 WAY. YOUR ACTUAL NET RETURN AT THE END OF THE YEAR IS
- 10 \$500,000. SO FOR THE FIRST TIME WE ACTUALLY HAVE A POSITIVE
- 11 NET RETURN IN THE ADMINISTRATOR'S SIDE. EVERYTHING LOOKS LIKE
- 12 BY YEAR END IT'S GOING TO BE IN GOOD SHAPE. HIGHLIGHTED
- 13 MEMBERSHIP DUES CAME IN RIGHT ON THE MONEY. YOU GET ABOUT
- 14 \$535,000 REFUND FROM PERS FOR YOUR RETIREE PENSION COST NOW.
- 15 YOUR OPEB COSTS HAVE BEEN COMPLETELY RETIRED. SALARIES AND
- 16 BENEFITS STAYED RIGHT ABOUT ON THE PIKE. WE HAVE YEAR'S END IN
- 17 THE POOL SO I DON'T WANT TO JUMP ON THAT TOO HARD.
- 18 ENCUMBRANCES REMAINING AT THE END OF THE YEAR WILL BE GONE
- 19 WITH ONE CARRY OVER CONTRACT AND THAT'S ALREADY WITHIN THE
- 20 SURPLUS THAT WE HAVE. SO THAT LEAVES THE ADMINISTRATIVE SIDE
- 21 OF IT IN PRETTY DECENT SHAPE GOING INTO THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR.
- 22 YOU MADE YOUR OPEB'S AGAIN, YOU MADE THE TRANSFERS, AND YOU
- 23 STILL MADE THE TRANSFER FOR MTCS. SO PRETTY GOOD WAY TO END
- 24 THAT YEAR. ESTUARY PARTNERSHIP, THE ONLY THING TO BRING UP ON
- 25 THE ESTUARY PARTNERSHIP IS THESE ARE KIND OF STRANGE GRANTS



- 1 BECAUSE OF THEIR TIMING SO YOU WILL SEE A LARGE REVENUE SOURCE
- 2 OF 40, \$50 MILLION. 30 MILLION OF IT IS NOT BUDGETED YET
- 3 BECAUSE IT'S NOT ACTIVE YET. WE GOT THE ENTRANT BUT THE OTHER
- 4 SIDE PROGRAMMING THE GRANT HASN'T HAPPENED YET. SO YOU WILL
- 5 SEE MISMATCH THERE. A SLIGHT DEFICIT AT THE END OF THE YEAR
- 6 BUT WE EXPECTED BECAUSE THAT'S THE YEAR END COOLS AND WE BUILT
- 7 THE GRANTS ON THAT. SAY THING IS TRUE OF BAYREN. SAME
- 8 SITUATION, SALARIES AND BENEFITS CAME IN ON THE PIKE REVENUE
- 9 IS RECORDED AS WE EARN IT SO THERE IS ABOUT 20 MILLION TO GO
- 10 ON THESE GRANTS. AGAIN, THERE'S THIS CASH FLOW DEFICIT. IT
- 11 DOESN'T BOTHER US AND WHEN WE GET TO THE INVESTMENT REPORT,
- 12 I'LL TELL YOU WHY. ALL IN ALL WITHOUT GOING INTO THE
- 13 FINANCIALS AND AGAIN REMINDING YOU THAT THIS IS STILL SUBJECT
- 14 TO FINAL ENTRIES AND CLOSING OUR BOOKS, A PRETTY GOOD SOLID
- 15 YEAR.

1 DIR. SCOTT HAGGERTY: NO ATTRIBUTE IT TO ERIN. 2 3 JULIE PIERCE: WE GOT HER. KAREN, I JUST WANT TO SAY THANK YOU 4 5 TO YOU, BRIAN. WHEN WE MADE THIS TRANSITION, A FEW YEARS AGO, IT WAS DOOM AND GLOOM AND THERE WERE THOSE WHO WERE PREDICTING 6 THE END OF ABAG AND BANKRUPTCY AND IT WAS HORRIBLE AND IT 7 8 COULDN'T BE MADE TO WORK, AND FRANKLY BRIAN WASN'T SO SURE AT FIRST EITHER. BUT BRIAN FIGURED OUT HOW TO MAKE IT WORK. AND I 9 10 GOT TO SAY, BRIAN, YOUR CREATIVITY, YOUR STEADFAST DETERMINATION TO MAKE SURE WE COULD DO THIS, PARTICULARLY WITH 11 OUR RETIREES, AND WITH OUR PERS ISSUES, YOU KNOW, YOU HAVE 12 DONE A MASTERFUL JOB OF GETTING US ALL ON A REAL EVEN KEEL, 13 AND I CANNOT SAY THANK YOU IN A BIG ENOUGH WAY. BECAUSE, YOU 14 15 KNOW, WE WERE BEING TOLD IT COULDN'T BE DONE. AND YOU WEREN'T 16 EVEN SURE AT THE BEGINNING, BUT I AM SURE GLAD YOU WERE THE 17 ONE SITTING IN THAT CHAIR, BECAUSE YOU MADE IT HAPPEN, AND YOU'RE CREATIVITY, PARTICULARLY THE FIGURING OUT HOW TO MAKE 18 IT WORK FOR THE RETIREES, JUST REALLY MADE EVERYONE FEEL SO 19 MUCH BETTER AND SO MUCH MORE COMFORTABLE AND POSITIVE AND 20 21 SECURE. AND KUDOS. BIG KUDOS. 22 BRIAN MAYHEW: WELL LET ME -- I SHOULDN'T SAY ANYTHING BUT LET 23 ME SAY ONE THING, FIRST OF ALL I DON'T DESERVE CREDIT. I GOT A 24
