

4	MUTE. UNLESS YOU'RE INTERESTED IN DISCUSSION PLEASE SPEAK UP.
5	WE'RE HEARING NO ONE SPEAK UP. DO WE NEED TO DO A ROLL CALL
6	MARTHA?

10	DAVID CORTESE, CHAIR: PLEASE PROCEED WITH THAT.

16	DAVID CORTESE, CHAIR: THAT CONCLUDES CONSENT CALENDAR WE'LL
17	MOVE TO ITEM FIVE WHICH IS AN ACTION ITEM CONTRACTS TO DELIVER
18	BAY BRIDGE FORWARD 2020, AND I THINK KEVIN CHEN IS HERE TO
19	PRESENT TO US ON THIS ITEM.
20	
21	KEVIN CHEN: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS I'M KEVIN CHEN MTC
22	STAFF WITH DESIGN AND PROJECT DELIVER SECTION. I DO HAVE A
23	PRESENTATION. SO HOPEFULLY THAT CAN BE BROUGHT UP.
24	



DAVID CORTESE, CHAIR: ACKNOWLEDGING THAT SPERING HAS JOINED 1 2 US. 3 KEVIN CHEN: THAT'S ACTUALLY NOT THE PRESENTATION. THIS IS FOR 4 5 THE NEXT ITEM. GREAT. THANK YOU. ALL RIGHT. SO I'M HERE TO PROVIDE AN UPDATE ON BAY BRIDGE FORWARD INITIATIVE. WITH THIS 6 ITEM WE ARE SEEKING FOR THE COMMITTEE'S APPROVAL ON SEVERAL 7 8 CONSULTING CONTRACTS RELATED TO THIS EFFORT SO THAT WE CAN MOVE FORWARD WITH THE PROJECTS. BAY BRIDGE FORWARD IS A SUITE 9 OF NEW TERM OPERATIONAL AND TRAFFIC DEMAND MANAGEMENT 10 STRATEGIES TARGETED TO REDUCE DELAYS FOR BUSSES AND HOVS AND 11 IMPROVING THEIR TRAVEL TIME RELIABILITY. AND MOST IMPORTANTLY 12 TO REALLY INCREASE'S THROUGHPUT ON THE BAY BRIDGE CORRIDOR. 13 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. AS WE KNOW TRAFFIC CONDITIONS HAVE CHANGED 14 15 OUITE A BIT WITH THE IMPACT OF COVID-19. WE HAVE BEEN 16 MONITORING TRAFFIC CONDITIONS VERY CLOSELY AND STARTING ABOUT MAY OR SO WE HAVE SEEN QUITE A BIT OF TRAFFIC HAS ALREADY 17 RETURNED TO THE CORRIDOR. ALTHOUGH IN THE PAST MONTH OR SO IN 18 TERMS OF THE TRAFFIC RETURN BUT AS THE REGION CONTINUES TO GET 19 BACK TO NORMAL HOPEFULLY THIS YEAR WE EXPECT TRAFFIC DEMAND TO 20 21 CONTINUE TO RISE. ON SHOULD SLIDE ARE A COUPLE OF PHOTOS TAKEN 22 IN MID-AUGUST. AS YOU CAN SEE CONGESTION HAS RETURNED AT THE BRIDGE TOLL PLAZA AND ON THE BRIDGE APPROACHES PARTICULARLY ON 23 THE I-580 AND I80 APPROACHES AS YOU CAN SEE ON THE RIGHT HAND 24

SIDE. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT TO MAKE A NOTE OF BECAUSE THIS



- 1 RELATES DIRECTLY TO THE BAY BRIDGE FORWARD PROJECTS WE WOULD
- 2 LIKE TO MOVE FORWARD WITH. WE SEE BLUE SKIES WITH TAKEN A
- 3 COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO. MISSING THAT ALREADY, SO HOPEFULLY WE
- 4 WILL SEE BLUE SKIES AGAIN SOON. MEDIUM FLOW TRAFFIC ON THE
- 5 BRIDGE KEY HERE IS TO GET THE BUSSES AND HOVS TO THE TOLL
- 6 PLAZA AND ONCE YOU GET THROUGH IT IT'S TYPICALLY AN UNIMPEDED
- 7 FLOW INTO THE CITY. IT'S IMPORTANT TO POINT OUT THAT WITH THE
- 8 RECENT IMPACT OF COVID-19 AND SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIREMENTS,
- 9 THERE HAS BEEN A DRAMATIC REDUCTION IN TRANSIT SERVICES,
- 10 TRANSIT RIDERSHIP AS WELL AS CARPOOLS AND VANPOOLS ALL OF
- 11 THESE RESULT IN A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN SINGLE OCCUPANCY
- 12 VEHICLE. SO AS THE ECONOMY AND TRAVEL ACTIVITIES CONTINUE TO
- 13 RESUME, THE TRAFFIC -- REGULAR TRAFFIC COULD SOON OVERWHELM
- 14 OUR HIGHWAY SYSTEM PARTICULARLY ON THE BAY BRIDGE CORRIDOR
- 15 WHICH IS USUALLY WELL SERVED BY HIGHER MODES OF
- 16 TRANSPORTATION. SO WE NEED TO BE VERY PROACTIVE IN ADDRESSING
- 17 THIS ISSUE, AND THAT IS A GOAL OF BAY BRIDGE FORWARD IS TO GET
- 18 PEOPLE BACK TO HIGH-OCCUPANCY TRAVEL MODES. NEXT PLEASE. AS I
- 19 MENTIONED THERE IS URGENCY TO DELIVER BAY BRIDGE FORWARD
- 20 DEVELOPMENT AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. FOR REASONS I JUST
- 21 MENTIONED. BUT IT TYPICALLY TAKES ABOUT 5 TO 7 YEARS TO
- 22 DELIVER EVEN MINOR OPERATION IMPROVEMENTS IN A NORMAL PROCESS
- 23 AND USUALLY OVER A DECADE FOR MAJOR CAPITAL PROJECTS AND WE
- 24 CERTAINLY CANNOT WAIT THAT LONG FOR BAY BRIDGE FORWARD WE'RE
- 25 WORKING WITH CALTRANS TO IDENTIFY WAYS TO STREAMLINE THE



- 1 APPROVAL AND PROCESS WITH A GOAL TO DELIVER BAY BRIDGE
- 2 PROJECTS IN THE NEXT TWO YEARS OR SO. NEXT SLIDE. HERE IS A
- 3 MAP WITH A SUITE OF BAY BRIDGE FORWARD 2020 IMPROVEMENTS.
- 4 FIRST SEVEN PROJECTS, NUMBER 1 THROUGH 7 SHOWN IN GREEN REALLY
- 5 OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS, FOCUS ON IMPROVING TRANSIT AND BUS
- 6 TRANSIT AND HOV OPERATIONS IN THIS CORRIDOR. PROJECTS 8
- 7 THROUGH 11 SHOWN IN BLUE AND ORANGE ARE DEMAND MANAGEMENT
- 8 STRATEGIES. THESE STRATEGIES ARE TARGETED TO GET PEOPLE OUT OF
- 9 DRIVING, INTO SHARE MODES OF TRAVEL. INCLUDING PILOT EXPRESS
- 10 BUS SERVICES AND SO FORTH. AT THE BOTTOM OF THE TABLE ON THE
- 11 RIGHT SIDE THE TOTAL COST OF THE BAY BRIDGE FORWARD PROJECT IS
- 12 \$65 MILLION. SO FAR BETWEEN MTC AND OUR PARTNER AT ALAMEDA
- 13 CTC, WE HAVE IDENTIFIED \$15 MILLION TO ADVANCE THE FIRST FOUR
- 14 PROJECTS SHOWN HERE, WHICH WE ARE SEEKING FOR COMMITTEE
- 15 APPROVAL TODAY. THESE PROJECTS INCLUDE NUMBER 1580HOV LANE
- 16 PROJECT WHICH WE'RE PROPOSING TO CONVERT TO HOV LANE FROM THE
- 17 TOP PLAZA TO THE INTERCHANGE. PROJECTS 2 AND 3 GO HAND IN HAND
- 18 IN TERMS OF IMPROVING THE BUS TRANSIT OPERATIONS COMING OUT OF
- 19 EMERYVILLE TO THE INTERCHANGE WITH A ROUND ABOUT ON THE STREET
- 20 TO GET THE BUSES TO THE FREEWAY MORE EFFICIENTLY AS WELL AS
- 21 CONVERTING A PORTION OF THE SHOULDER 180 TO AN HOV BUS LANE.
- 22 PROJECT NUMBER FOUR IS A DESIGN ALTERNATIVE ASSESSMENT THAT
- 23 ALLOW US TO REALLY DEVELOP STRATEGIES ON THE 180 CORRIDOR.
- 24 BETWEEN THE BAY BRIDGE AND THE CARQUINEZ BRIDGE WHICH COULD
- 25 POTENTIALLY INCLUDE DUAL MANAGED LANES IN EACH DIRECTION AND



WOULD LOOK AT THE POSSIBILITY OF RAISING VEHICLE OCCUPANCY 1 REQUIREMENT ON THE 180 CORRIDOR. ALSO A REMINDER THAT AT THE 2 3 180 CORRIDOR IS PART OF THE MTC BAIFA EXPRESS LANES NETWORK THIS WOULD ALLOW A RANGE OF ALTERNATIVES AS WE ADVANCE FORWARD 4 5 WITH IMPLEMENTING BUS LANES ON 180. SO THESE PROJECTS WOULD REALLY HELP PROVIDE A JUMP-START IN IMPROVING BUS AND HOV 6 7 OPERATIONS ON THE BAY BRIDGE CORRIDOR. WE DO THINK IT 8 INCENTIVIZES FOLKS TO MOVE TO HIGHER MODES OF TRAVEL AS WE MOVE THROUGH COVID-19 HOPEFULLY THIS WILL HELP TRANSIT 9 OPERATORS TO MAINTAIN THEIR BUS HIGHWAYS, THIS IS CRITICAL 10 DURING TIMES LIKE THIS WHEN EVERYONE IS STRUGGLING WITH 11 RESOURCES. WE WILL TURN TO WORK WITH OUR PARTNER AGENCIES AT 12 CALTRANS, ALAMEDA AND CONTRA COSTA COUNTIES AS WELL AS TRANSIT 13 OPERATORS TO IDENTIFY FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES BECAUSE WE DO HAVE 14 15 A FUNDING GAP THAT PREVENTS US FROM MOVING FORWARD WITH OTHER 16 PROJECTS AT THE MOMENT SO THAT WE CAN TRY TO DELIVER THE FULL SUITE OF IMPROVEMENTS IN THE NEXT TWO YEARS OR SO. WITH THAT, 17 THAT CONCLUDES MY PRESENTATION AND WITH THIS ITEM WE'RE 18 SEEKING FOR THE COMMITTEE'S APPROVAL ON THE CONSULTANT 19 CONTRACT DESCRIBED IN THE MEMO AND I AM HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY 20 21 QUESTIONS.

1 CLERK OF THE BOARD: COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ? 2 3 DAVID CORTESE, CHAIR: COMMISSIONER, GO AHEAD. 4 5 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THANK YOU. THIS IS REALLY EXCITING, BUT 6 7 THERE ARE -- AND I KNOW WE DON'T HAVE ENOUGH MONEY TO DO THIS. 8 BUT AS WE THINK ABOUT THE QUICK RIGHT NOW -- AS WE THINK ABOUT OUICK BILLS WERE TWO APPROACHES THAT WEREN'T INCLUDED IN THAT 9 LIST WHICH WERE 880 AND WEST GRAND AND I WAS WONDERING WHY WE 10 DON'T HAVE PLANS FOR THAT THAT WE COULD DEPLOY WHEN THE 11 FUNDING BECOMES NECESSARY. WHEN THE FUNDING BECOMES AVAILABLE, 12 I MEAN. 13 14 KEVIN CHEN: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER WEST GRAND IS A PROJECT 15 16 WE'RE WORKING ON IN THE DESIGN PHASE WE HAVE FUNDING WITH BAY BRIDGE FORWARD INITIATIVE TO FUND THAT PROJECT FORTUNATELY, SO 17 I JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERYONE IS AWARE THAT WE'RE 18 WORKING VERY HARD TO -- IT'S A LANE EXTENSION ON THE WEST 19 GRAND APPROACH TO THE BAY BRIDGE WHERE WE'RE EXTENDING BOTH 20 21 THE BUS LANE AND PROVIDING MULTI-USE PATH ON WEST GRAND AS 22 WELL. 23 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: WHAT ABOUT 880? 24



- 1 KEVIN CHEN: ON THE 880 APPROACH, THE HOV RAMP ON BOTH OF THE
- 2 LEFT-HAND SIDE AND ALSO ON THE RIGHT HAND SIDE WHERE WEST
- 3 GRAND COMES IN. SO THE BUSES ON 880 AND HOVS FOR THE MOST
- 4 PART, THEY DO GET PRETTY FREE FLOW CONTINUES, REALLY THE
- 5 PROBLEM HAPPENS WHERE THE WEST GRAND APPROACH COMES IN. SO, WE
- 6 ARE HOPEFUL THAT WITH THE WEST GRAND PROJECT THAT WILL REALLY
- 7 HELP WEST GRAND CONNECT TOGETHER IN CONCERT WITH THE 880
- 8 APPROACH. IS

- 13 THEIR HAND RAISED. ALETA DUPREE.

- 15 SPEAKER: CHAIR CORTESE AND MEMBERS. ALETA DUPREE FOR THE
- 16 RECORD, THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT TO ME. IT'S VERY CLOSE TO HOME.
- 17 BECAUSE ONE OF THE METHODS THEY USED TO GET FROM WEST OAKLAND
- 18 TO SAN FRANCISCO IS THE AC TRANSIT F LINE. F AS IN "FOX TROT"
- 19 AND, 1, 2, 3, AND 6 ON THE MAP ARE MOST RELEVANT TO ME. AC
- 20 TRANSIT BUS USES THE POWELL STREET INTERCHANGE WITH 80 AND
- 21 GOES AROUND THAT JUG HANDLE, IF YOU WILL TO GET ON TO THE 880
- 22 GOING WEST TOWARD THE BRIDGE AND INTO THE BRIDGE AND TOLL
- 23 PLAZA BYPASS. IN THE OTHER DIRECTION IN THE AFTERNOONS COMING
- 24 EASTBOUND OFF OF THE BRIDGE BACK INTO OAKLAND, BECAUSE OF THE
- 25 DIFFICULTIES IN CROSSING TO THE RIGHT, WHEN NAVIGATING 80 TO



- 1 THE NORTH THAT BUS HAS TO GO ON 580 AND NEAR SAN PABLO, DO A
- 2 U-TURN. SO AS CONGESTION RETURNS IT'S IMPORTANT THAT WE STAY
- 3 ON THIS. I WANT MORE PEOPLE TO RIDE BUSES MUCH BETTER THAN
- 4 HAVING LOTS OF CARS ON THE ROAD CLOGGING THINGS UP. THANK YOU.

- 18 JAMES P. SPERING: I'LL MOVE IT. IT'S IMPORTANT AS WE'RE TRYING
- 19 TO GET TRANSIT TO RECOVERY, THESE ARE THE FACTORS ARE THAT WE
