

AND MAY WE DO THE 6 7 SAME FOR THE MTC COMMITTEE? 8 9 SCOTT HAGGERTY: JAKE, CAN YOU CALL FOR A MOTION, PLEASE? 10 SPEAKER: MOVED. 11 12 13 JAMES P. JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR: ALL RIGHT NEXT ITEM REGIONAL LEGISLATION 1 2 ITEM 4A TO DO WITH MEASURE RR WITH THE CALIFORNIA ONE PERCENT 3 SALES TAX. AGENDA SAYS A PRESENTATION FROM RANDY RENTSCHLER. 4 5 RANDY RENTSCHLER: THANK YOU MADAM CHAIR. AND MEMBERS OF THE NEW COMBINED COMMITTEE. THIS IS A COMBINATION OF THINGS WE DO 6 AT THIS TIME LOOKING TO THE ELECTION THIS IS THE FIRST OF 7 8 THREE ITEMS THAT WE'RE LOOKING TOWARD THE ELECTION. THIS ONE IS ASKING YOUR SUPPORT FOR A ONE 8TH CENT SALES TAX IN THE 9 10 THREE COUNTIES SAN JOSE, SAN MATEO AND SAN FRANCISCO TO SUPPORT CALTRAIN. I KNOW THAT THIS IS NOT AN UNFAMILIAR THING 11 TO YOU, PARTICULARLY SO TO COMMISSIONER LICCARDO WHO WORKED ON 12 THIS VERY INTENSIVELY. I THINK A NUMBER OF YOU ALSO FOLLOWED 13 THIS. I ARE AWARE CALTRAIN IS SUPPORTED BY FUNDING FROM THE 14 15 THREE AGENCIES IN THOSE THREE COUNTIES AND THIS WOULD BE AN 16 ADDITIONAL SALES TAX TO ALLOW THEM A LONG SOUGHT GOAL TO HAVE DEDICATED FUNDING TO AMERICA THE -- TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT 17 THEY HAVE AVAILABLE TO INCREASE SUBSIDY BUT IN A POST COVID 18 WORLD IT'S DIFFICULT TO TELL WHAT KIND OF SUBSIDY THEY NEED 19 BECAUSE THEY ARE ONE OF THE MOST SUCCESSFUL SYSTEMS WE HAVE 20 21 GIVEN 70 PERCENT REVENUE FROM FARE BOX THIS IS GOING TO BE ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT ASK WE URGE YOU TO SUPPORT THIS ITEM ON 22 CALTRAIN. WITH THAT I'LL ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS YOU MIGHT HAVE. 23 24

2 JULIE PIERCE, CHAIR: ITEM FIVE STATE LEGISLATION PROP 16 3 STATEWIDE PROPOSITION FOR AFFIRMATIVE ACTION BAN. 4 5 REBECCA LONG: PROP 16 REPEALS A BALLOT MEASURE MANY OF YOU MAY RECALL. BACK IN 1996, PROP 209 BANS THE USE OF RACE OR GENDER 6 AS A FACTOR AMONG OTHERS IN ADMISSIONS INTO PUBLIC 7 8 INSTITUTIONS HIRING AND CONTRACTING. I WOULD NOTE THAT THE FEDERAL CONSTITUTION PROHIBITS ANY KIND OF STRICT RACIAL OR 9 AGENDA QUOTA. SO PROP 16 DOES NOT CHANGE THAT, BUT WOULD ALLOW 10 FOR THE USE OF GENDER AND RACE CONSCIOUS POLICIES TO PROMOTE 11 DIVERSITY WHEN IT COMES TO COLLEGE ADMISSIONS, PUBLIC AGENCY 12 HIRING AND CONTRACTING.
