





- 16 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION, INCLUDING FIVE YEARS
- 17 OF DIRECTOR OF POLICY AND LEGISLATION FOLLOWED BY 35 YEARS
- 18 REPRESENTING THE COMMISSION'S INTEREST IN WASHINGTON, D.C. AS
- 19 PRESIDENT OF GOVERNMENT REALIZATIONS, INC. WHEREAS TOM IS AN
- 20 INFLUENTIAL BUILDER OF ENDURING COALITIONS, AN ARCHITECT OF
- 21 MTC'S LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY PROGRAM AND FOUNDER OF THE

- 15 CRITICAL PROJECTS AS A CORRIDOR FOR THE CALDECOTT TUNNEL AND
- 16 UPGRADES TO THE GOLDEN GATE PRIVILEGE AND SOUTHERN APPROACH
- 17 WHERE THIS OBSOLETE AND WHICH DOYLE DRIVE WAS REPLACED BY THE
- 18 SCENIC AND EFFICIENT PRESIDIO PARKWAY AND WHEREAS THE
- 19 THOUGHTFULNESS IS ATTENTION TO DETAIL, WITH WHICH TOM TAKES
- 20 CARE OF COMMISSIONERS AND MTC STAFF UNDER VISITS TO WASHINGTON
- 21 REFLECT HAS COMMITMENT TO HOSPITALITY AND FRIENDSHIP AS WELL
- 22 AS A FINE TUNED UNDERSTANDING OF LOGISTICS. AND WHEREAS, TOM'S


