- 6 HAS IDENTIFIED SAVINGS AND UNSPENT RESERVES AVAILABLE FOR
- 7 REPROGRAMMING TO NEW NEAR TERM REGIONAL PRIORITIES WITHIN THE
- 8 SAME CORRIDORS. OVERALL MTC PROPOSES TO MODIFY THE SCOPE OF
- 9 TWO EXISTING PROJECTS AND REASSIGN APPROXIMATELY \$663,000 IN
- 10 RM2 FUNDS. THE EXACT CHANGES ARE DETAILED IN A NOTICE OF
- 11 PUBLIC HEARING ATTACHED TO THIS ITEM. FOR CLARITY SAKE, I'LL
- 12 GROUP THE CHANGES INTO THREE PROJECT CATEGORIES AS IN THE
- 13 STAFF MEMO. FIRST THE BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE,
- 14 TO SUPPORT THE WORK OF THE TASK FORCE, STAFF PROPOSES
- 15 MODIFYING THE SCOPE OF PROJECT 35, THE TRANSIT COMMUTER
- 16 BENEFITS PROMOTION TO INCLUDE TRANSIT RECOVERY STRATEGIES.
- 17 ADDITIONALLY STAFF HAS IDENTIFIED APPROXIMATELY \$438,000 IN
- 18 SAVINGS FROM PREVIOUS REGIONAL PLANNING PROJECTS AROUND RM2
- 19 PROJECT 33 REGIONAL RAIL MASTER PLAN UNDER THIS PROPOSAL THESE
- 20 SAVINGS WOULD BE REDIRECTED INTO PROJECT 35 ALTOGETHER A TOTAL
- 21 OF APPROXIMATELY \$2 MILLION WOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR THE
- 22 NEW SCOPE. SECOND, BAY BRIDGE FORWARD. IN MAY 2020, THE BATA
- 23 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE HEARD A PRESENTATION ON A FUNDING PLAN FOR
- 24 BAY BRIDGE FORWARD WHICH INCLUDES \$4.8 MILLION FOR RM2
- 25 ALLOCATED TO THE I-880 EXPRESS LANES IN 2030 THE CHANGES IN

- 2 LANE NETWORK FOR OPERATIONS ON THE BAY BRIDGE CORRIDOR WITH
- 3 IMPROVEMENTS IDENTIFIED IN THE BAY BRIDGE FORWARD SUITE OF
- 4 PROJECTS. THIRD AND FINALLY DUMBARTON FORWARD STAFF PROPOSES
- 5 REDIRECTION OF APPROXIMATELY \$225,000 IN REMAINING SAVINGS
- 6 FROM THE DUMBARTON RAIL PROJECT TO RM229 EXPRESS BUS SOUTH FOR
- 7 UPCOMING DUMBARTON PROJECTS TO IMPROVE BUS TRAVEL IN THE
- 8 DUMBARTON CORRIDOR THIS CONCLUDES STAFF OVERVIEW I'LL NOW TURN
- 9 IT BACK OVER TO THE CHAIR. THANK YOU.

AND SO IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT, AND I THINK OUR --19 AS YOU HAVE HEARD ABOUT THE WORKING GROUPS, ARE REALLY TO 20 FIGURE OUT HOW, AT THIS URGENT TIME, WE CAN FACILITATE MORE 21 ROBUST TRANSIT RESOURCE IN THESE CORRIDORS. SO, I THINK THAT'S 22 REALLY THE THOUGHT PROCESS IN TERMS OF TRYING TO IDENTIFY SOME 23 FUNDS RIGHT NOW, THAT WE CAN DO THIS. BECAUSE ABSENT THESE 24 FUNDS, IT'S REALLY -- IT'S A REAL UPHILL BATTLE TO TRY TO GET 25

- 23 TO NORMAL BY THE END OF THE YEAR. THAT OBVIOUSLY HASN'T
- 24 HAPPENED AND WE DON'T KNOW WHEN OR TO WHAT DEGREE IT WILL.

- 8 THOSE REVENUES AND EACH OF THE BAY AREA TRANSIT OPERATORS RELY
- 9 ON A DIFFERENT MIX OF OPERATING REVENUE SOURCES MEANING SOME
- 10 ARE MORE EXPOSED TO THE PANDEMIC'S IMPACTS OF REVENUES THAN
- 11 OTHERS AGENCIES THAT RELY ON PARKING TOLLS BRIDGE TOLLS FACING
- 12 MORE ACUTE CRISIS AND OPERATORS DEPENDING ON SALES TAXES ARE
- 13 NOT DOING AS BADLY AS INITIALLY EXPECTED WITH NOTABLE
- 14 EXCEPTION OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO. NEXT SLIDE
- 15 PLEASE. IN FISCAL YEAR 2019/'20 PASSAGE OF THE CARES ACT
- 16 PROVIDED \$25 BILLION LIFELINE FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION
- 17 OPERATORS NATION WOOD. 1.3 BILLION OF WHICH WE WERE FORTUNATE
- 18 TO RECEIVE IN THE BAY AREA THANKS TO THE LEADERSHIP OF NANCY
- 19 PELOSI AND OUR CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION ESTIMATING THE 1.3
- 20 BILLION WOULD ADDRESS MOST TRANSIT OPERATOR LOSSES IN THE BAY
- 21 AREA THROUGH THE END OF THE YEAR GIVEN OF THE PANDEMIC IMPACTS
- 22 WE EXPECT BAY AREA TRANSIT OPERATORS WILL COLLECTIVELY FACE AN
- 23 OPERATING SHORT FALL BETWEEN 40,600 MILLION BY THE END OF THE
- 24 CURRENT FISCAL YEAR. LOOKING FORWARD TO FISCAL YEAR '21/'22
- 25 WITHOUT A SUBSTANTIAL FACILITATING RETURN OF RIDERSHIP AND





- 1 GENERAL MOBILITY THE SCALE OF OPERATING REVENUE LOSSES COULD
- 2 APPROACH 1.7 BILLION IN THAT YEAR. SO TO PUT A POINT ON THE
- 3 SCALE OF THE CRISIS, THE BAY AREA'S TRANSIT OPERATORS FACE A
- 4 POTENTIAL REVENUE LOSS OVER THE NEXT YEAR AND A HALF OF OVER

- 18 OUESTIONS INCLUDING WHAT LEVEL OF TRANSIT SERVICE ARE WE ABLE
- 19 TO OPERATE, AGENCIES ARE USING OPERATING EXPENSES THROUGH A
- 20 VARIETY OF MEASURES, ARE WE DIRECTING SERVICES TO BE OPERATED
- 21 AND IF SO WHERE, WHEN WOULD REDIRECTED FUNDS BE AVAILABLE
- 22 FISCAL YEAR 2021, 2022 OR LATER. WHAT STEPS AND APPROVALS ARE
- 23 NEEDED TO REDIRECT FUNDS SOURCE? CAN MTC APPROVE REDIRECTING
- 24 OF A FUND SOURCE OR ARE OTHER PARTIES NEEDED TO DO SO? WHAT
- 25 PROGRAMS, PROJECTS, OR JOB LOSSES WOULD BE IMPACTED BY





- 1 REDIRECTING FUNDS? AND, DOES THE AMOUNT OF FUNDING AVAILABLE
- 2 FROM A FUND SOURCE HELP ADDRESS THE OPERATING NEED IN A
- 3 MEANINGFUL WAY? MANY FUND SOURCES MAY NOT HAVE ENOUGH FUNDING
- 4 AVAILABLE THAT CAN BE REDIRECTED TO TRANSIT OPERATIONS TO MAKE
- 5 A MEANINGFUL IMPACT ON THE OPERATING SHORT FALL ESPECIALLY
