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1 2 CLERK OF THE BOARD: WE HAVE A QUORUM. 3 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: MOVING TO APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES. 4 5 RICHARD HEDGES: MOVE APPROVAL ON THE MINUTES. 6 7 8 RAHMON MOMOH: SECOND. 9 10 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: HEDGE SUPERVISOR MOMOH? OKAY. 11 CLERK OF THE BOARD: THERE IS NO PUBLIC COMMENT RECEIVED ON THE 12 MINUTES. SO GOING TO DO A ROLL CALL VOTE. [ROLL CALL VOTE] IT 13 PASSES UNANIMOUSLY BY ALL MEMBERS PRESENT. 14 15 16 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU MARTHA FOR KEEPING US ON TRACK. ITEM FOUR BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE UPDATE. 17 RANDI KINMAN IS PRESENTING THIS ITEM FOR YOUR INFORMATION IS 18 NO ACTION IS REQUIRED. RANDI. 19 20 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. I'M GOING TO SUM UP THE LAST TASK 21 FORCE MEETING, KIND OF THE LAST TWO ITEMS WERE ABOUT MONEY, 22 HOW THE MONEY COMES IN AND WHAT THE SITUATION IS AND I THINK 23 IT CAN BE SUMMED UP THIS WAY. WE DON'T NEVER HAVE ENOUGH 24 25 MONEY, WE NEVER HAVE ENOUGH MONEY, OPERATIONS ARE BAD, AND WE

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NEED MORE MONEY. IT'S A COMPLICATED THING. IT WENT INTO A LOT 1 OF STUFF, BUT REALLY THAT'S ALL WE NEED TO KNOW RIGHT NOW. AND 2 3 IT'S JUST GOING TO CONTINUE TO BE THAT WAY UNTIL WE RESOLVE OUR ISSUES. IT'S REALLY -- I WILL SAY IT'S REALLY BLEAK FOR 4 5 ANY MEMBER OF THE TRANSIT AGENCIES WHO ARE, BASICALLY GEARED TO RUN OUT OF MONEY AT THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR. SO IT'S 6 GOING TO IMPACT A LOT OF PEOPLE. HOWEVER, MOVING INTO WHAT 7 8 AFFECTS US IS THE TRANSFORMATION GOALS THAT WE HAVE COMING UP. I HAVE THEM SENDING THE PACKET SO THAT YOU WOULD SEE WHAT THE 9 TASK FORCE RECEIVED. AND THERE WERE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES TO 10 THE TASK FORCE. THE FIRST ONE WAS RECOVERY. WE'RE STILL IN THE 11 PROCESS OF THAT. THE SECOND GOAL IS EOUITY, WHICH IS AWESOME, 12 BECAUSE IT'S LIKE, THAT MAKES IT THE NUMBER ONE GOAL. COMING 13 UP IN THE DISCUSSIONS WILL BE, HOW DO WE ADVANCE EQUITY. AND 14 15 THAT'S A CONVERSATION THAT THIS GROUP NEEDS TO KIND OF HAVE, 16 OR GIVE ME INPUT ON, BECAUSE IT'S -- TO ADVANCE EQUITY, THE STATED GOAL IS TO "INTEGRATE AND BE ACCOUNTABLE TO EQUITY AND 17 POLICY SERVICE DELIVERY AND ADVOCACY RECOMMENDATION AS 18 EMBODIED IN MTC'S EQUITY PLATFORM. THE OBJECTIVES ARE TO 19 DEVELOP SPECIFIC EOUITY PRINCIPLES TO GUIDE TRANSIT 20 21 TRANSFORMATION PLANNING AND TO INCLUDE FOCUSED OUTREACH TO CURRENT RIDERS, UNDERSERVED POPULATIONS AND PERSONS WITH THE 22 DISABILITIES TO INFORM THE TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN." I WILL 23 TELL YOU THAT -- WE HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE ON THE TASK FORCE 24 THAT ARE FOCUSED ON EQUITY. WE DON'T HAVE THAT MANY PEOPLE WHO 25

ARE FOCUSED ON WHAT WOULD BE THE SECOND HALF OF OUR COMMITTEE, 1 EQUITY AND ACCESS. SO, TO THAT END -- AND I DO HAVE -- I KNOW 2 3 THAT COMMISSIONER GIOCAPINI, WHO BROUGHT UP SOMETHING, I WILL LIKE HER INPUT AT THE BEGINNING OF THIS, SO THAT WE CAN HAVE -4 5 - CONTINUE OUR CONVERSATION. AND I WANT TO THANK HER FOR TAPPING ME AND SAYING OH SHE WILL BE HERE. SO WHERE --6 7 8 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: I'M HERE. 9 RANDI KINMAN: OH THERE YOU GO. 10 11 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: THE THING I WANT TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT, 12 OBVIOUSLY IN GENERAL, TO GET YOUR INPUT ABOUT WHAT'S WORKING 13 AND WHAT'S NOT WORKING NOW, AND IN THE FUTURE, WITH REGARD TO 14 15 ACCESS. THE SPECIFIC THING, THOUGH, THEY WANTED TO GET YOUR 16 INPUT ABOUT IS I'M HEARING FROM A LOT OF PEOPLE THAT THEY ARE NOT RIDING BART IF THEY HAVE ANY OTHER ALTERNATIVE, AND IF 17 THEY ARE RIDING BART, THEY FEEL LIKE THEY'RE ENDANGERING THEIR 18 LIVES, AND IT SEEMS TO BE LESS A CONCERN ABOUT THE CARS 19 THEMSELVES, WHICH BART HAS PROVIDED INFORMATION ABOUT THE 20 21 FILTRATION SYSTEM AND THAT SORT OF THING, AND IT MORE HAS TO DO WITH THE ELEVATORS. AND, I DON'T KNOW, RANDI, DID YOU GET 22 THE E-MAIL I JUST SENT YOU? 23

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25 RANDI KINMAN: PROBABLY. BUT I DIDN'T --

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DORENE M. GIACOPINI: OH THAT'S OKAY. THAT'S OKAY. THERE HAVE 2 3 BEEN MEETINGS AND BOB FRANKLIN IS THE GUY WHO, WITH BART, WHO WOULD BE KIND OF FOCUSING ON ACCESS ISSUES, AND OF COURSE, THE 4 5 ELEVATORS ARE NOT -- DO NOT JUST ACCOMMODATE BART, THEY'RE MULTI-MODAL IN SEVERAL LOCATIONS. AND SO, I JUST THINK THAT 6 WE'RE GOING TO HAVE A HARD TIME GETTING PEOPLE WHO NEED TO USE 7 8 THE ELEVATORS, BACK ON BART UNLESS THEY ABSOLUTELY HAVE NO CHOICE AND ARE ENDANGERING THEIR LIVES, UNTIL WE CAN GET THE 9 10 ELEVATOR SITUATION UNDER CONTROL. AND SO TO THAT END, I DISCUSSED WITH HIM, AND WITH THE BART ACCESS COMMITTEE, THE --11 WHAT THE -- THE PROTOCOLS -- THAT'S THE WORD -- ARE, AND IT 12 DIDN'T SEEM LIKE THERE WERE VERY MANY WITH REGARD TO THE USE 13 OF THE ELEVATOR. I DID NOT HEAR BACK FROM BOB. I JUST -- THIS 14 15 HAS BEEN GOING ON FOR SEVERAL -- FOR A MONTH OR SO. I DIDN'T 16 HEAR BACK FROM HIM TODAY. I SENT HIM ANOTHER E-MAIL ASKING HIM 17 WHAT THEY ARE GOING TO BE DOING ABOUT IT, AND HE DID RESPOND, BUT HIS RESPONSE WAS BASICALLY, THIS IS MY JOB, AND I HAVEN'T 18 DONE IT YET, AND I GOT TO -- I GOT TO DO IT. BUT THERE STILL 19 DOES NOT SEEM TO BE -- SO I DON'T KNOW HOW MUCH INTO THE WEEDS 20 YOU WANT ME TO GET ABOUT THIS. I MEAN I DID SEND YOU THE E-21 MAIL WHICH HAS SOME OF THE DETAILS THAT HE'S PROVIDED. I KNOW 22 THAT PEOPLE ARE SAYING -- A LOT OF PEOPLE, WHO USE 23 WHEELCHAIRS, ARE SAYING THAT THEY WON'T USE BART -- THEY WON'T 24 USE THE ELEVATOR UNLESS THEY KNOW THEY WILL USE IT, GIVEN THE 25

SIZE OF THE ELEVATORS WILL NOT USE IT WITH ANYBODY WHO IS NOT
 PART OF THEIR BUBBLE, PRESENT. AND I'M JUST WONDERING IF I'M
 THE ONLY ONE HEARING ALL OF THIS. AND WHAT WE NEED TO DO IN
 TERMS OF THE CURRENT PROBLEM FOR PEOPLE WHO DON'T HAVE
 CHOICES, BUT TO GET ON SOMETHING THAT THEY FEEL IS VERY UNSAFE
 AT THE MOMENT.

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8 RANDI KINMAN: IF I CAN MAKE A SUGGESTION THAT CONNECTS TO THIS AND THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE, IS THIS COMMITTEE'S EOUITY AND 9 10 ACCESS, AND WE LOOKING AT THE -- WE'RE LOOKING AT THE -- NOT JUST THE COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN, BUT ALL OF OUR EQUITY ISSUES 11 AND NEXT MONTH WE'LL HAVE ANOTHER MEETING ON THAT. SO, IF WE 12 CAN MOVE THAT PORTION OF IT INTO OUR EQUITY STUDY, THAT --13 THIS COMMITTEE WILL DO THAT, AND THEN I WILL CONTINUE TO PUSH 14 15 THROUGH THE TASK FORCE TO GET SOME RESOLUTION. BECAUSE IT IS A GAPING -- I WILL TELL EVERYBODY, IT'S A GAPING HOLE IN WHAT I 16 SEE IN THE INITIAL RECOVERY PLANS. IT TELLS US HOW MANY TIMES 17 BUSES ARE CLEANED WHEN THEY'RE CLEANED IT TELLS US ABOUT THE 18 AIR FILTRATION SYSTEM ON BUSSES AND TRAINS. BUT I HAVE NEW 19 BART SYSTEMS DOWN HERE THAT HAVE ELEVATORS THAT CONNECT TO 20 OTHER TRANSIT SYSTEMS AND I WILL TELL YOU, I'M SORRY, IT DID 21 NOT OCCUR TO ME TO MAKE SURE THAT COMPONENT WAS IN THE TRANSIT 22 RECOVERY PLAN, BUT IN THE LONG-TERM EQUITY PLAN, WE CAN MOVE 23 THAT THROUGH THIS COMMITTEE. SO DOES THAT HELP, COMMISSIONER? 24 25

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DORENE M. GIACOPINI: YES. 1 2 3 RANDI KINMAN: OKAY. 4 5 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: IT DOES. THAT MAKES SENSE. YOU KNOW, AND KEEP ME INFORMED. LET ME KNOW IF THERE IS ANYTHING THEY CAN DO 6 WITH REGARD TO ANY OF THESE THINGS. I DON'T KNOW IF PEOPLE ARE 7 8 GOING TO FIND IT COMFORTING. 9 RANDI KINMAN: THAT'S GOOD TO KNOW. AND I CAN MAKE SURE WE 10 CONNECT, VEDA, SO THAT GOING FORWARD, ANY INFORMATION YOU FEEL 11 WE NEED TO BE LOOKING AT, GETS FOLDED IN. 12 13 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: FANTASTIC. OKAY. ARE YOU READY FOR 14 15 OUESTIONS? 16 17 RANDI KINMAN: I AM. 18 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: OKAY. I SEE RICHARD HEDGES HAS HIS HAND 19 20 UP. PLEASE. 21 22 RICHARD HEDGES: I COUPLE OF THINGS. DOREEN WILL REMEMBER THIS. FIRST MILLBRAE, A GOOD COMPARISON IS THE MILLBRAE STATION 23 CALTRAIN AND BART WERE BUILT AT THE SAME TIME, I DON'T SEE 24 CALTRAIN ELEVATOR OUT OF SERVICE BUT OFTEN BART ELEVATOR OUT 25

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OF USE. I DON'T KNOW WHETHER IT'S USE OR POOR MAINTENANCE ON 1 BART'S SIDE OR WHETHER IT'S AN INFERIOR ELEVATOR. THE OTHER 2 3 ISSUE, WE WERE ABLE TO GET MTC AGREE TO WITHHOLD AREA PLANNING GRANTS IF THE HOUSING AROUND STATIONS IN THE TODS WERE NOT 4 5 MAKING ACCESS AND LIVEABILITY, BECAUSE THERE WERE MANY STATIONS THAT -- AND AN INVESTIGATION THAT MARSHALL WE FOUND 6 THERE WERE TOWN HOMES WITHOUT ACCESS EVEN THOUGH THERE WAS 7 8 STATIONS WITH ACCESS FOR WHEELCHAIRS WE NEED TO FOCUS ON THAT AND KNOW WHERE THERE IS ATTEMPTING PLANNING WHERE THERE IS 9 REQUESTS FOR PLANNING GRANTS FOR THE TODS THAT WE MAKE SURE 10 THAT THERE IS ACCESS TO UNIVERSAL DESIGN AS WELL AS IF THE 11 BUILDING TOWN HOMES, AT LEAST THAT THERE IS ACCESS FOR 12 WHEELCHAIRS IN THOSE TOWN HOMES. AND JUST TO GIVE YOU AN 13 EXAMPLE, THERE WERE A NUMBER OF TOWN HOMES BUILT NEAR TRANSIT 14 15 IN LONG BEACH, AND THERE WERE THREE STORY TOWN HOMES AND ABOUT 16 20 PERCENT OF THEM HAD ELEVATORS, WHICH DOES RAISE THE EXPENSE, BUT IT ALSO ALLOWS PEOPLE WHO ARE DISABLED, AND IN 17 WHEEL CHAIRS, OR WHO HAVE OTHER DISABILITIES TO LIVE THERE. 18 IT'S AMAZING, RANDI, YOU HAVE BEEN READING MY MIND. I HAVE 19 BEEN THINKING ABOUT THIS ALL DAY THAT WE HAVEN'T THOUGHT MUCH 20 21 ABOUT ACCESSIBILITY ON THIS COMMITTEE. IS THAT RUNS THE GAMUT OF ALL GROUPS. 22

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VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THIS IS A REALLY
 IMPORTANT TOPIC. AND I'M HAPPY THAT IT'S BEING BROUGHT UP HERE
 IN THIS SUBCOMMITTEE. I SEE ANNE OLIVIA, AND THEN RICH COATS.

5 ANN OLIVIA-ELDRED: THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR BRINGING UP THIS, I LIVE IN A HOUSE WITH SEVERAL TRANSIT DEPENDENT PEOPLE, ONE OF 6 THEM DUE TO COVID HIS LOST HIS JOB HERE IN THE EAST BAY BUT 7 8 GOES INTO SAN FRANCISCO AND WORKS FOR THREE DAYS AND HE SAYS HE'S SO UNCOMFORTABLE ON BART THAT HE'S STAYING IN FOR THREE 9 DAYS ON SOMEBODY'S COUCH AND THEN COMING BACK. AND I ASKED HIM 10 WHAT WOULD MAKE HIM FEEL MORE COMFORTABLE AND HE SAYS HAND 11 SANITIZING STATIONS THAT IF HE COULD SEE HAND SANITIZING 12 STATIONS THAT HE WOULD SEE THAT PEOPLE ARE BEING GOOD AGENTS 13 AND THIS WOULD MAKE HIM FEEL MORE SAFE IT'S HARDLY A 14 15 REPRESENTATIVE EXAMPLE, BUT HE'S ONE OF THOSE PEOPLE WHO CAN'T 16 HAVE A DRIVER'S LICENSE BECAUSE HE HAS A DISABILITY AND WHILE HE ISN'T DEPENDENT ON THE ELEVATOR THAT'S A REAL CONCERN FOR 17 HIM. SO I WILL START REACHING OUT RIGHT NOW AND SEEING WHAT 18 ELSE I CAN GET AND FUNNEL THAT THROUGH RANDI. BUT THANKS SO 19 MUCH FOR BRINGING THIS TO US. 20

22 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: RICH COATS?

23

24 RICK COATES: YEAH. I JUST WANT TO POINT OUT THAT ACCESS IS
25 RELATED TO CONNECTIVITY, AS WELL. IF YOU CAN'T GET THE

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CONNECTION BETWEEN ONE MODE AND ANOTHER, YOU MIGHT AS WELL NOT 1 HAVE ACCESS. SO I HOPE THAT THEY WON'T BE VIEWED IN ISOLATION 2 FROM ONE ANOTHER. ALSO, WHEN WE TALK ABOUT DISABLED, AND 3 ACCESS FOR DISABLED FOLKS, I THINK WE SHOULD REMEMBER THAT 4 5 DISABLED INCLUDES YOUNGER FOLKS WHO MAY HAVE JUST, SAY, HAD SURGERY ON A HIP, OR A BROKEN LEG, AND ARE TRYING TO GET 6 AROUND ON CRUTCHES, THINGS LIKE THAT, AGAIN, CONNECTIVITY IS 7 8 IMPORTANT THERE. YOU DON'T WANT TO HAVE TO WALK A HALF A MILE TO GET TO THE NEXT MODE OF TRANSPORT. SO, JUST SOME THOUGHTS 9 10 THERE.

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VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. AND FOR ME, AS FOR ME, I THINK 12 THIS IS AN EXCELLENT OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO ADDRESS THE 13 CLEANLINESS OF THE STATIONS ITSELF, AND SOME OF OUR RESTROOMS, 14 15 CAN WE TRUST THAT THE RESTROOMS ARE BEING CLEANED? ARE BUS 16 STOPS BEING CLEANED FOR COVID. IT'S SOMETHING THEY HAVE NEVER PERSONALLY THOUGHT ABOUT BUT AS LONG AS THE CONVERSATION IS 17 HERE, RANDI PLEASE TAKE OUR NOTES BACK TO THE TASK FORCE. ANY 18 OTHER QUESTIONS? OKAY. RAHMON? 19

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21 RANDI KINMAN: CAN I -- OH OKAY.

22

23 RAHMON MOMOH: I WAS CURIOUS, CONSIDERING THE RIDERSHIP HAS
24 GONE DOWN SIGNIFICANTLY, WHAT ARE THE REASONS FOR THE
25 ELEVATORS OUTAGES? DID THEY GIVE US REASONS? BECAUSE THEY HAVE

> LOST 87 OR 80 PERCENT OF THE RIDERS WHY DO WE HAVE A PROBLEM 1 WITH THE ELEVATORS IF IT'S NOT BEING USED AS FREQUENT AS 2 3 BEFORE? I MEAN, DO WE HAVE ANY REASON FOR THAT? 4 RANDI KINMAN: NO -- WELL, I WILL ASK THEM. BUT I'M GUESSING 5 IT'S LIKE THE REST OF THE SYSTEM. IT WAS BUILT IN THE 1970S 6 AND HAS BEEN PATCH WORKED TOGETHER THAT THERE IS VERY FEW NEW 7 8 ELEVATORS THERE. BUT I WILL ASK. 9 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: OKAY. 10 11 RANDI KINMAN: AND WHAT THE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE IS. 12 THANK YOU. AND IF ANYBODY COMES UP WITH ANYTHING ELSE, PLEASE 13 LET ME KNOW. JUST E-MAIL ME. 14 15 16 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: OKAY. 17 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: RANDI, FEEL FREE TO SHARE THAT E-MAIL 18 WITH, AT LEAST, THE COMPONENTS OF IT THAT ARE RELEVANT TO --19 WITH THE COMMITTEE. 20 21 22 RANDI KINMAN: WILL DO. THANK YOU COMMISSIONER. 23 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: MARTHA DO WE HAVE ANY MEMBERS OF THE 24

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25 PUBLIC WHO WOULD LIKE TO COMMENT?

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CLERK OF THE BOARD: NO COMMENT SUBMITTED ON THIS ITEM AND NO 2 3 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND RAISED AT THIS MOMENT. 4 5 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. RANDI. LET'S GO AHEAD AND MOVE FORWARD WITH ITEM FIVE. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE 6 PRESENTATION, AND THANK YOU COMMISSIONER FOR BEING HERE, AND 7 8 YOUR INPUT. ITEM NUMBER FIVE IS PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN DEVELOPMENT. WE HAVE A PRESENTATION. AND I 9 10 AM NOT GOING TO READ YOUR NAME. I MAY NOT GET IT RIGHT. SO, IT LOOKED LIKE THIS IS AN INFORMATION ITEM ONLY AND NO ACTION IS 11 REQUIRED BY THE SUBCOMMITTEE. PLEASE. 12 13 CHIRAG RABARI: HI. GOOD AFTERNOON, THIS IS CHIRAG RABARI 14 15 PRINCIPAL WITH THE REGIONAL PLANNING PROGRAM MANAGE AND 16 PROJECT MANAGER FOR THE PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN AND VERY EXCITED TO PRESENT ON THIS EFFORT TO YOU ALL 17 TODAY AS WE OFFICIALLY KICK OFF THIS ELEMENT OF THE PLANNED 18 BAY AREA 2050 FINAL PHASE. AND IF THE TECHNICAL STAFF COULD 19 PULL UP THE POWERPOINT, PLEASE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE SOME OF YOU 20 21 MAY RECALL THE ACTION PLAN THAT MTC AND ABAG DEVELOPED FOR THE 22 PREVIOUS PLAN PLANNED BAY AREA 2040 FOCUSED ON AREAS WHERE THE PLAN'S PERFORMANCE WAS MOVING IN THE WRONG DIRECTION AND 23 SOUGHT TO ADDRESS EMERGING POLICY ISSUES SUCH AS HOUSING AND 24 RESILIENCE THE CASA EFFORT WAS ONE THAT GREW OUT OF THE ACTION 25

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PLAN. WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN WE'RE HOPING TO BUILD ON 1 THE SUCCESSES OF THE ACTION PLAN AND BUILDING A COMPREHENSIVE 2 3 EFFORT THIS TIME ONE LIKE PLAN 2050 ITSELF MORE FOCUSED IN NATURE. HERE WE'RE GOING TO LOOK AT ARTICULATING THE SPECIFIC 4 5 SHORT-TERM ACTIONS WE AND OUR PARTNERS CAN TAKE TO FULFILL THE GOALS AND VISIONS OF THE PLAN AND ADVANCE ITS 30 ADOPTED 6 STRATEGIES OVER THE OF THE FACTS 1 TO 5 YEARS. WE VIEW 7 8 PARTNERSHIP AND COLLABORATION AS MAJOR COMPONENTS OF THE EFFORT STRATEGIES PROPOSED IN THE PLAN CAN BE IMPLEMENTED BY 9 ABAG AND MTC OUR ATTEMPT IS TO ENGAGE LOCAL AGENCIES THE 10 PUBLIC CIVIC ORGANIZATIONS NON-PROFITS AND A BROAD ARRAY OF 11 STAKEHOLDERS AS WE WORK THROUGH SHARED CHALLENGES. NEXT SLIDE 12 PLEASE. ALTHOUGH WE ANTICIPATE THIS COULD CHANGE AND EVOLVE AS 13 THE PROCESS MOVES FORWARD AT THIS STAGE WE HAVE IDENTIFIED 14 FOUR EARLY INTERCONNECTED GOALS. MAXIMIZE THE PLAN STRATEGIES 15 16 WITH FOCUS ON EQUITY, EFFECTIVE RESIDENCE AND EFFICIENCY. WE WANT TO REINFORCE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF EXISTING INTERNAL, 17 EXTERNAL, OR HYBRID INITIATIVES THAT COMPLIMENT THE STRATEGIES 18 AND VISION. THIS COULD INCLUDE FOR EXAMPLE, IMPLEMENTING THE 19 RECOMMENDATIONS OF EFFORTS SUCH AS BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT 20 21 RECOVERY TASK FORCE WE WANT TO BE RESPONSIVE TO ISSUES RAISED BY PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS AND BODIES LIKE THIS ONE. WE WANT 22 TO MAKE SURE WE ADDRESSING TECHNICAL OBLIGATIONS AND 23 REQUIREMENTS AS DEFINED BY THE CALIFORNIA AIR RESOURCES BOARD 24 FOR A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY 25

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STRATEGIES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. BEFORE WE DELVE INTO FURTHER 1 IT'S IMPORTANT TO OFFER CLARIFICATION ON THE DIFFERENCE 2 3 BETWEEN A STRATEGY AND AN IMPLEMENTATION ACTION. AS WE HAVE PRESENTED BEFORE WE DEFINE A STRATEGY AS EITHER A PUBLIC 4 5 POLICY OR SET OF INVESTMENTS THAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED OVER THE 30 YEAR PLANNING HORIZON OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. STRATEGIES 6 ARE NOT THEREFORE NEAR TERM ACTIONS OR LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS. 7 8 BY CONTRAST IMPLEMENTATION ACTIVITIES ARE THE SPECIFIC ACTIONS REQUIRED TO MOVE THOSE PUBLIC POLICIES AND INVESTMENTS 9 FORWARD. WE SEE THESE AS THE WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN, AND HOW 10 OF MAKING THE STRATEGIES A REALITY, WITH A FOCUS ON THE NEXT 1 11 TO 5 YEARS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE AS THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN 12 PROCESS MOVES FORWARD WE HAVE DEFINED SPECIFIC IMPLEMENTATION 13 OBJECTIVES FOR EACH PLAN STRATEGY. WE WILL BE WORKING THROUGH 14 15 THIS IDENTIFICATION AND RECOMMENDATION PROCESS COLLECTIVELY 16 WITH OUR PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS. FIRST WE WANT TO UNDERSTAND THE PRIMARY ELEMENTS THAT A GIVEN STRATEGY REQUIRES 17 TO SUCCEED. WHETHER THAT LEGAL AUTHORITY AS DEFINED THROUGH 18 LEGISLATION, FUND WIDTH REOUISITE CONTROL AND STABILITY, 19 INSTITUTIONAL WRAP AROUND OF KNOWLEDGE, STAFFING, PROCESS, AND 20 21 PROCEDURE, AS WELL AS PUBLIC AND POLITICAL SUPPORT S AND GIVEN 22 THOSE STRATEGIES, SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS WE WANT TO THEN 23 IDENTIFY AN APPROPRIATE MTC ABAG ROLE IN IMPLEMENTATION, WHETHER TO LEAD, PARTNER, OR SUPPORT. AND IMPORTANTLY, ON THE 24 OTHER SIDE OF THAT IDENTIFY WHO THE APPROPRIATE PARTNERS ARE, 25

AS WELL AS THEIR EXPECTED ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES. WE WANT 1 TO IDENTIFY THE APPROPRIATE VEHICLES FOR STRATEGY 2 3 IMPLEMENTATION, WHETHER IT'S ADVOCACY, LEGISLATION, CONVENINGS, TASK FORCE, NEW PROJECT OR PROGRAM, OR PLANNING, 4 5 OR RESEARCH. WE WANT TO IDENTIFY DETAILED IMPLEMENTATION ACTIONS INCLUDING TIME FRAMES FOR IMPLEMENTATION. NEXT SLIDE 6 PLEASE OUR INITIAL WORK HAS FOCUSED ON CONDUCTING AN 7 8 ASSESSMENT OF THE REQUIREMENTS FOR STRATEGY SUCCESS ACROSS THE PLAN'S 30 STRATEGIES AS WELL AS GETTING THE LAY OF THE LAND IN 9 TERMS OF COMPLIMENTARY EFFORTS AND INITIATIVES WE'LL REVIEW 10 INITIAL OUTPUTS IN A MOMENT. THE EXTERNAL PHASE THAT KICKS OFF 11 TODAY WILL INCLUDE TWO LARGE VIRTUAL STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS HELD 12 NOVEMBER 17TH AND NOVEMBER 19TH. THESE WILL BE VIRTUAL 13 BRAINSTORMING MEETINGS FOR US AND PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS TO 14 PULL TOGETHER INITIALLY IDEAS ON OBJECTIVES PREVIOUSLY 15 16 ARTICULATED STRATEGIES, REOUIREMENTS ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES IMPLEMENTATION VEHICLES AND DETAILED ACTIONS 17 FOR EACH OF THE PLAN STRATEGIES. THIS WILL BE FOLLOWED UP BY 18 OFFICE HOURS AND SMALL MEETINGS IN DECEMBER WHERE WE IDENTIFY 19 AREAS FOR DEEPER AND FOCUSED CONVERSATIONS. DURING EARLY 2021 20 WE WILL BE BEGINNING OUR PUBLIC OUTREACH IN THIS CASE FOCUSED 21 22 ON LOW INCOME COMMUNITIES AND THOSE WITHOUT INTERNET, NON-ENGLISH SPEAKERS, PERSONS IS DISABILITIES, YOUTH, AS WELL AS 23 OUTREACH TO OUR EQUITY CBOS. THE DRAFT IMPLEMENTATION PLAN 24 WILL THEN BE RELEASED IN THE SPRING OF 2021, IN CONJUNCTION

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WITH THE DRAFT PLAN AND DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT. AND 1 THE EXACT SHAPE IS STILL TO BE DETERMINED BUT WE ARE STILL 2 3 ANTICIPATING IN THE SPRING AND SUMMER INVESTMENT IN STAKEHOLDER GROUPS TO IRON OUR STRATEGIES. THIS MAY FOCUS ON 4 5 COMPLICATED COMPLEX OR POLITICALLY CHALLENGING ITEMS THAT EMERGE DURING OUR BRAINSTORMING PROCESS OR OVER THE FALL AND 6 WINTER. FINALLY THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN WILL BE RELEASED IN 7 8 FALL OF 2021. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE HERE WE WANTED TO PROVIDE A HIGH LEVEL SUMMARY OF THE KIND OF WORK THAT WILL BE PRESENTED 9 IN GREATER DETAIL ONCE FINALIZED AT THE NOVEMBER STAKEHOLDER 10 WORKSHOP IN A FEW WEEKS AND TO GIVE INSIGHT TO FRAMEWORK FOR 11 EVALUATING STRATEGIES. ONE OF THE FIRST THINGS WE WANT TO DO 12 IS CONDUCT ASSESSMENT LOOKING AT FOUR FACTS AUTHORITY, 13 FINANCIAL RESOURCES TECHNICAL CAPACITY AND PUBLIC SUPPORT. THE 14 IDEA WAS TO GET A PICTURE THAT HELPS US GET ORIENTED WITH 15 16 RESPECT TO MTC'S ABAG ROLE IN IMPLEMENTATION, AND IDENTIFY CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES THAT COULD DEVELOP SPECIFIC 17 IMPLEMENTATION ACTIVITY IN CONCERT WITH OUR PARTNERS AND 18 STAKEHOLDERS. ON THE QUESTION OF OUR ROLE, GENERALLY SPEAKING, 19 IF WE ARE GOING TO LEAD, WE WANT TO EITHER HAVE OR BE IN A 20 POSITION TO SECURE ALL OF THE FOUR FACTORS FOR STRATEGY 21 22 SUCCESS. IF WE'RE GOING TO PARTNER PERHAPS WE MAY HAVE OR BE 23 ABLE TO SECURE SOME IF NOT ALL OF THE FOUR FACTORS BY CONTRAST IN A SUPPORT ROLE PERHAPS WE WILL NOT BE IN THE BEST POSITION 24 TO SECURE FUNDING OR AUTHORITY OR HAVE THE RESIDENT TECHNICAL 25

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CAPACITY TO STRATEGIZE BUT WE WILL HAVE A ROLE IN PLAYING 1 POLITICAL SUPPORT FOR A STRATEGY. AS YOU CAN SEE MANY OF OUR 2 3 STRATEGIES EXIST ACROSS A DIFFERENT SPECTRUM OFTENTIMES DEPENDING ON UPON WHICH ELEMENT OF THE PLAN THEY'RE IN WHETHER 4 5 IT'S THE ECONOMY, THE ENVIRONMENT, TRANSPORTATION, OR HOUSING. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE AND, AGAIN, I WANT TO EMPHASIZE THAT OUR 6 INTENT ISN'T ONLY TO FOCUS ON AREAS WHERE WE SCORE ON THE HIGH 7 8 SIDE, PER SE, INSTEAD IN COLLABORATION WITH OUR PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS, WE HOPE THIS TYPE OF ASSESSMENT CAN HELP CLARIFY 9 10 WHERE THE NEEDS ARE, WHERE THE OPPORTUNITIES ARE, WHAT THE APPROPRIATE IMPLEMENTATION VEHICLE SUPERVISOR ACTIONS ARE, AND 11 AS WELL AS WHAT ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES SHOULD BE FOR 12 DIFFERENT PARTNERS AND ENTITIES AS WE MOVE FORWARD. NEXT 13 SLIDE. AS I ALSO MENTIONED ANOTHER COMPONENT OF OUR EARLY WORK 14 HAS BEEN LOOKING AT COMPLIMENTARY INITIATIVES AND PARTNERS 15 16 SOME EXIST WITHIN OUR RESPECTIVE AGENCIES SOME ARE HYBRID IN NATURE AND SOME ARE INITIATIVES, RESPONSIBILITIES OF OUR 17 GOVERNMENT PARTNERS. AND THEN THERE IS THE WHOLE WIDE WORLD IN 18 THE NON-GOVERNMENTAL SECTOR AS WELL. IN MANY CASES THESE ARE 19 ALREADY EFFORTS UNDERWAY THAT SUPPORT THE PLAN STRATEGIES. WE 20 21 WANT TO LEVERAGE THE EXISTING EXPERTISE AND EXISTING RESOURCES TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE INSOFAR AS THEY CAN WORK 22 TOGETHER WITH THE PLAN. AND I SHOULD NOTE THAT OBVIOUSLY THE 23 LIST PRESENTED HERE IS NOT EXHAUSTIVE. IT WILL BE FURTHER 24 REFINED AS WE MOVE FORWARD WITH AN EYE TOWARDS MAPPING THESE 25

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DIFFERENT PARTNERS AND INITIATIVES IN GREATER DETAIL TO THE 1 2 SPECIFIC THEMES AND STRATEGIES IN THE PLAN ITSELF. NEXT SLIDE 3 PLEASE. AND HERE, WE WOULD LOVE TO GET SOME FEEDBACK FROM THE MEMBERS OF THIS BODY ON VARIOUS ITEMS FROM THE PRESENTATION, 4 5 WHETHER IT'S A HIGH PRIORITY AREAS FOR US TO ADDRESS KEY STAKEHOLDERS AND PARTNERS YOU WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE ENGAGING 6 WITH, WHETHER THERE ARE AREAS OF POTENTIAL CONTROVERSY WE 7 8 SHOULD BE THINKING ABOUT AT THIS EARLY STAGE AND THOUGHTS ON THE APPROACH WE HAVE PRESENTED HERE. HERE I'M HAPPY TO PAUSE 9 10 FOR QUESTIONS AND FEEDBACK.

25 TAKE A LOOK AT THAT LIST AND SEE IF WE CAN SUPPLEMENT IT A



LITTLE BIT ESPECIALLY FOR CASE MANAGERS AND PROVIDERS AND
 THOSE KINDS OF FOLKS.

CHIRAG RABARI: SURE. I WOULD SAY THAT FOR -- THERE ARE A 4 5 COUPLE OF PIECES HERE, FOR THE STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS THAT ARE COMING UP IN A COUPLE OF WEEKS, YOU KNOW, THOSE INVITATIONS 6 WERE INITIALLY SHARED OUT WITH ALL THE BODIES THAT ARE ON OUR 7 8 REGIONAL ADVISORY WORKING GROUP LIST, THE REWG, THE REGIONAL EQUITY WORKING GROUP, THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL THE REGIONAL 9 10 PLANNING COMMITTEE AND WE HAVE A STAKEHOLDER LIST WE HAVE DEVELOPED OVER THE COURSE OF HORIZON AND THE PLAN SO WE WOULD 11 BE HAPPY TO SHARE THAT. AND IN TERMS OF THE MORE EOUITY 12 FOCUSED PUBLIC OUTREACH, THAT'S PLANNED FOR THE BEGINNING OF 13 2021, WE ARE STILL IN THE PROCESS OF, YOU KNOW, DEVELOPING 14 THAT PLAN, BUT I THINK WE DO HAVE A, YOU KNOW, A BENCH OF SOME 15 16 EQUITY ORGANIZATIONS THAT WE HAVE, YOU KNOW, THAT WE HAVE BEEN 17 WORKING WITH, AND I WOULD BE HAPPY TO SHARE THAT AS WELL.

19 ANN OLIVIA-ELDRED: THAT WOULD BE GREAT. HISTORICALLY, OUR 20 OUTREACH TO UNSHELTERED, RECENTLY UNSHELTERED COMMUNITIES WE 21 HAVEN'T HAD NAMES ON THE LIST OR THERE HAS BEEN, LIKE, ONE. I 22 HAVE BEEN TRYING TO INTRODUCE ORGANIZATION SUPERVISOR NAMES 23 THINGS LIKE THAT TO HELP BUILD THAT LIST AND I WOULD LIKE TO 24 DO THAT NOW AS OPPOSED TO IN THREE WEEKS WHEN IT'S LIKE DAYS 25 BEFORE, AND WE DON'T ACTUALLY HAVE TIME TO DO THE KIND OF

> OUTREACH THAT WOULD ALLOW OUR CONSTITUENTS TO ENGAGE IN THOSE 1 STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS. SO IF YOU COULD FOLLOW UP WITH ME ON 2 3 THAT, I WOULD BE HAPPY TO DO THE WORK TO HELP AUGMENT THOSE LISTS GOING FORWARD SO WE HAVE -- SO WE GIVE THOSE FOLKS THE 4 5 TIME TO RESPOND. AND THANK YOU FOR LISTENING. 6 7 CHIRAG RABARI: WE CAN CERTAINLY DO THAT. THANK YOU. 8 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: YES AND IT WOULD BE GREAT FOR EACH OF OUR 9 COUNTIES TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE IMPLEMENTING OR USING THE 10 ORGANIZATIONS THAT REACH OUT TO OUR HOMELESS COMMUNITIES IF 11 YOU COULD SEND THAT TO MARTHA THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL. 21 RICHARD HEDGES: A COUPLE OF THINGS. HOW ARE WE GOING TO DEAL,
22 WHEN WE REACH OUT TO PEOPLE WITH EQUITY ISSUES, TO MAKE SURE

25 SAMARITAN HOUSE IN SAN MATEO COUNTY, AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

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IN SAN MATEO THAT HAS MAIL DROPS FOR HOMELESS PEOPLE IN THE
AREA. SO WE MIGHT WANT TO REACH OUT TO THEM AND MAKE SURE
THEY'RE TUNED IN SO THEY CAN PROVIDE A PLACE FOR PEOPLE TO
COME, WOULD BE ONE OF MY THOUGHTS. AND AS FAR AS NUMBER THREE
GUIDANCE IN AREAS OF POTENTIAL CONTROVERSY, MY QUESTION WOULD
BE, WHERE DO YOU SEE THE HIGHEST CONTROVERSY? IN GOVERNANCE?
OR IN GETTING AUTHORITY TO DO THE WORK WE NEED TO DO?

9 CHIRAG RABARI: SO WITH RESPECT TO YOUR FIRST SUGGESTION,
10 THAT'S DEFINITELY SOMETHING THAT WE CAN FOLLOW UP ON. I DO
11 KNOW THAT OUR OUTREACH TEAM HAS, YOU KNOW, CERTAINLY BEEN
12 PUTTING CONSIDERATION INTO THE OVERALL QUESTION OF HOW WE'RE
13 MAKING SURE THAT WE'RE ABLE TO SUCCESSFULLY REACH NON-DIGITAL
14 POPULATIONS. SO WHEN I FOLLOW UP WITH THEM, I WILL BE SURE TO
15 PASS ON THE SUGGESTION OF THE SAMARITAN HOUSE.

17 RICHARD HEDGES: SAMARITAN HAS A FUNDING, AND ALSO BUILDING IN 18 SAN MATEO WHERE THEY DEAL WITH FOLKS THAT NEED SERVICES AND 19 THEN THEY HAVE A HOMELESS SHELTER NEAR THE AIRPORT. SO THERE 20 IS THREE POTENTIAL AREAS WHERE WE COULD SETUP PEOPLE IN SAN 21 MATEO COUNTY JUST WITH ONE AGENCY.

CHIRAG RABARI: GREAT. AND WITH RESPECT TO THE -- YOUR SECOND
QUESTION ON, YOU KNOW, AREAS OF POTENTIAL CONTROVERSY, YOU
KNOW, I'LL PROBABLY ASK MY COLLEAGUE, DAVE VAUTIN TO JUMP IN

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ON MAYBE SOME OF HIS THOUGHTS HERE. YOU KNOW, I WOULD 1 2 GENERALLY SAY, AT THIS STAGE, WE'RE STILL IN, IN KIND OF THE 3 EARLY ASSESSMENT PHASE, AND I THINK WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS IS WE WORK COLLECTIVELY WITH 4 5 OUR PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS IS GET A SENSE OF THE LAY OF THE LAND IN TERMS OF WHERE THE HEAVY LIFT IS EXPECTED TO BE. I 6 THINK INTUITIVELY WE KNOW THAT SOME OF THE STRATEGIES IN THE 7 8 PLAN ARE MAYBE MORE POPULAR THAN OTHERS, AND AS WE THINK THROUGH HOW WE'RE GOING TO IMPLEMENT A PER MILE CONGESTION 9 10 FEE, FOR EXAMPLE, YOU KNOW, THAT COULD BE CHALLENGING, AND, YOU KNOW, WE'RE GOING TO HAVE TO THINK ABOUT IMPLEMENTATION 11 ACTIONS THAT MAYBE SPEAK TO OVERCOMING SOME OF THOSE PUBLIC 12 AND POLITICAL SUPPORT CHALLENGES THAT THOSE KINDS OF 13 STRATEGIES DO HAVE. AND YOU KNOW, ON THE GOVERNANCE QUESTION, 14 15 I THINK IT WILL BE AN OPEN OUESTION, THAT, I THINK WE'RE GOING 16 TO BE LOOKING FOR A LOT OF GUIDANCE ON FROM POLICY MAKERS, AS WELL AS OUR STAKEHOLDERS, FOR AREAS WHERE, WE DON'T 17 NECESSARILY HAVE AUTHORITY TO PURSUE, YOU KNOW, TO PURSUE SOME 18 OF THE STRATEGIES, OR IN CASES WHERE, YOU KNOW, THE AUTHORITY 19 IS DIFFUSE, OR MAYBE NOT VERY CLEARLY DEFINED. YOU KNOW, WE'RE 20 21 GOING TO HAVE TO GO THROUGH A PROCESS OF TRYING TO FIGURE OUT WHAT THE MOST APPROPRIATE PATH FORWARD IS ON THOSE. AND YOU 22 KNOW, THOSE CONVERSATIONS MAY NOT BE, YOU KNOW, COMPLETELY 23 SIMPLE. SO, I THINK THAT'S PART OF THE REASON WHY WE'RE 24 THINKING, AT LEAST AT THIS EARLY STAGE, THAT HAVING FOCUSED 25

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CONVENINGS OF, YOU KNOW, STAKEHOLDER GROUPS, HAVING FORUMS TO 1 HAVE SOME OF THOSE CONVERSATIONS, AFTER WE HAVE KIND OF 2 3 IDENTIFIED THE LAY OF THE LAND IN A LITTLE BIT MORE DETAIL, AS WE MOVE INTO THE SPRING AND THE SUMMER, THOSE MIGHT BE 4 5 APPROPRIATE THEN TO POTENTIALLY DISCUSS SOME OF THOSE 6 QUESTIONS IN FURTHER DETAIL. 7 8 RICHARD HEDGES: AS I SEE IT PLAY OUT THIS WEEK IT MAY BE HARDER UP IN AUTHORITY TO GET IT, THERE'S ALWAYS GREAT 9 RESISTANCE IF YOU TRY TO MOVE IT FORWARD. THAT'S ALL I HAVE. 10 THANK YOU. 11 12 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I HAVE RANDI, MICHAEL, AND THEN 13 14 RICK COATES. 15 16 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. ARE YOU ASKING US TO COMMENT ON SPECIFIC STRATEGIES? AND HOW -- >DAVE VAUTIN: THIS IS DAVE 17 VAUTIN, I'M GOING TO JUMP IN ON YOUR OUESTION. I THINK IT'S A 18 GOOD ONE. WE'RE HERE TODAY TO ANNOUNCE AND GET EVERYONE 19 ACOUAINTED WITH WHAT THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN IS, THE FACT THAT 20 21 IT WILL BE GOING ON OVER THE NEXT SIX MONTHS THE NEXT STEP WILL KICK OFF WITH STAKEHOLDER WORKSHOPS IN THE MONTH WE'LL 22 LOOK AT ACTIONS TO PAIR WITH STRATEGIES. THE SLIDE THAT JUST 23 WENT AWAY SHOWS THAT WE'RE REALLY INTERESTED IN, WHO SHOULD WE 24



BRING TO THE TABLE, WHAT CHALLENGES MIGHT WE FACE IN THE SIX
 MONTHS AHEAD, THOSE TYPES OF QUESTIONS.

RANDI KINMAN: OKAY. BECAUSE I THINK IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO 4 5 KNOW WHAT STRATEGIES YOU'RE LOOKING AT TO GAIN OUR INPUT ON. I DON'T KNOW -- I DON'T KNOW WHAT -- I DON'T HAVE THEM 6 MEMORIZED. I DON'T, YOU KNOW, I DON'T HAVE A TOP TEN IN MY 7 8 HEAD. SO THAT WOULD BE REALLY HELPFUL TO AT LEAST HAVE -- I MEAN, FOR INSTANCE, ON SLIDE EIGHT THERE IS AN EXAMPLE OF PER 9 MILE TOLLING ON CONGESTED FREEWAYS, AND INCUBATOR, SO THESE 10 ARE OBVIOUSLY STRATEGIES BUT I KNOW THAT PAGE DOES NOT REFLECT 11 ALL OF OUR STRATEGIES. SO WHAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR RIGHT NOW 12 IS, MAINLY, WHO YOU SHOULD BE CONTACTING, AND EVEN THAT, I 13 WOULD LIKE -- I WOULD HAVE A HARD TIME BREAKING IT DOWN BASED 14 ON NOT KNOWING WHICH STRATEGIES, BUT JUST AS A GENERAL 15 16 OUESTION, ALL OF THE TIME THAT WE DO OUTREACH, AM I CORRECT IN ASSUMING THAT THERE IS A CENTRAL OUTREACH LIST WITHIN THE --17 WITHIN MTC? >DAVE VAUTIN: I WOULD SAY THERE ARE A SET OF 18 DIFFERENT LISTS THAT WE USE, AND OVER TIME, AS WE BRING MORE 19 FOLKS TO THE TABLE, WE TEND TO ADD TO THOSE LISTS, SO WE HAVE 20 21 CONTINUED TO GROW OUR LIST OF FOLKS WHO ARE NOTIFIED ABOUT 22 STAKEHOLDER EVENTS OVER THE COURSE OF THE PLANNING PROCESS SEE WE ARE THREE YEARS IN AND HAVE A MORE ROBUST LIST THAN BEFORE. 23 24

RANDI KINMAN: RIGHT. SO MY OUESTION S WE'RE HAVING THIS 1 CONVERSATION, AND IF WE WERE TO GIVE YOU NAMES OR IF WE WERE 2 ADD TO WHATEVER LIST YOU'RE WORKING OFF OF, DOES THAT GO INTO 3 A CENTRAL LIST SO THAT WE KNOW, FOR INSTANCE, FOR INSTANCE, 4 5 ANNE OLIVIA IS ASKING WHAT -- AND I KNOW SHE HAS DONE A GOOD JOB IN ARENAS WITH PUTTING STAFF TOGETHER APPROXIMATE PEOPLE 6 IN HER COMMUNITY AND COUNTY, BUT IF YOU ALREADY HAVE THAT 7 8 THERE IS NO SENSE IN -- SEE WHAT I'M SAYING? THAT'S KIND OF WHERE -- I DON'T WANT TO START GIVING YOU A BUNCH OF NAMES OR 9 LISTS IF YOU ALREADY HAVE THEM. >DAVE VAUTIN: FAIR POINT. I 10 THINK, THE REALITY IS THERE IS NOT JUST ONE LIST. WE HAVE A 11 DATABASE OF DIFFERENT LISTS DEPENDING ON, TAGGED BY TOPIC 12 AREA, PROJECT, ET CETERA, SO WE TEND TO SEND OUT OUR PLANNED 13 BAY AREA UPDATES TO A SET OF DIFFERENT LISTS. BUT, I THINK, 14 15 YOU KNOW, THIS IS A PLAN ABOUT HOUSING. IT'S ABOUT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, ENVIRONMENTAL RESILIENCE AND TRANSPORTATION. WE 16 HAVE A LOT OF THE TRADITIONAL STAKEHOLDERS ARE ALWAYS LOOKING 17 TO BRING MORE FOLKS TO THE TABLE SO IF YOU KNOW OF 18 ORGANIZATIONS THAT HAVEN'T BEEN ACTIVELY INVOLVED WE'RE ALWAYS 19 OPEN TO HEARING ABOUT THOSE GROUPS. 20

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22 RANDI KINMAN: WELL I JUST WANT TO KNOW IF I HAVE GIVEN YOU A
23 NAME, ABOUT HOW TO REACH INTO THE HOMELESS POPULATION IN SANTA
24 CLARA COUNTY FOR A DIFFERENT PROJECT, THAT YOU CAN
25 AUTOMATICALLY REACH INTO THAT SOMEHOW. >DAVE VAUTIN: YES. SO



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IF YOU HAVE GIVEN US SOMETHING IN THE PAST IT'S IN OUR

DATABASE, BUT AGAIN, IF THERE IS NEW ORGANIZATIONS THAT YOU 2 3 WOULD LIKE TO LET US KNOW ABOUT, THAT'S HELPFUL. 4 5 RANDI KINMAN: OKAY. THANK YOU. 6 7 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: ANYTHING ELSE RANDI? 8 RANDI KINMAN: NO. >DAVE VAUTIN: VEDA, IF I MAY, RANDI ASKED 9 10 ABOUT THE STRATEGIES, WHICH IS A GOOD QUESTION. SO WE DID PRESENT ON THE STRATEGIES TO THE COUNCIL IN SEPTEMBER SO YOU 11 HAVE RECEIVED THOSE BUT WE CAN ALSO SEND OUT WE HAVE CREATED A 12 NICE VISUALLY PLEASING SET OF STRATEGIES THAT WE CAN SEND OUT 13 TO THE SUBCOMMITTEE AFTERWARDS SO THAT EVERYONE HAS A QUICK 14 15 REFERENCE SHEET AND THAT'S WHAT THE FOCUS OF THE NEXT PHASE, 16 LOOKING AT THE PACKET AND THE STRATEGY, WHAT ARE WE DOING TO IMPLEMENT THE FIRST OF THE 35 STRATEGIES. 17 18 RANDI KINMAN: JUST AS A GENERAL POINT OF REFERENCE WHEN YOU 19 BRING SOMETHING TO US AND MONTHS LATER WE'RE HAVING A 20 21 CONVERSATION AND IT REFERS TO SOMETHING LIKE THE STRATEGIES, PLEASE JUST ATTACH THAT RATHER THAN ASSUME I KNOW WHERE TO GO 22 BACK AND FIND THE OTHERS, OR THAT I NEED TO HAVE THAT LIST IN 23 FRONT OF ME. SO EVEN IF YOU JUST LINK IT IN YOUR PRESENTATION, 24 25 HEY, GO LOOK HERE, IT DOESN'T NEED TO BE ON THE SLIDE DECK



BECAUSE GOD KNOWS WE DON'T NEED 37 MORE SLIDES, SO THAT WOULD 1 BE REALLY HELPFUL. THANK YOU. 2 3 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. NOW I HAVE MICHAEL, RICK, AND 4 5 THEN TERRY. MICHAEL, GO AHEAD. 6 MICHAEL LOPEZ: THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRESENTATION IT WAS REALLY 7 8 GOOD. THE QUESTION BY HAND RANDI -- YOUR SLIDE SAYS YOU'RE GOING TO WORK WITH LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS, AND THEN YOU SAY 9 10 BUSINESS INTEREST WHAT DOES THAT MEAN? BIG COMPANIES? LITTLE COMPANIES? CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE. WHO IS INCLUDED IN THAT 11 GROUP? 12 13 CHIRAG RABARI: I THINK SIMILARLY TO THE CONVERSATIONS THAT WE 14 15 HAVE BEEN HAVING ABOUT THESE LISTS THAT WE HAVE, YOU KNOW, I THINK BROADLY SPEAKING, A LOT OF THE GROUPS AND ENTITIES THAT 16 17 YOU -- YOU'RE MENTIONING, ARE INCLUDED IN SOME OF OUR SPECIAL ECONOMIC STAKEHOLDER LISTS THAT WE HAVE, YOU KNOW, I THINK YOU 18 -- YOU KNOW, CERTAINLY COULD THINK OF THE CHAMBERS OF 19 COMMERCE, BAY AREA COUNCIL, THE LEADERSHIP GROUPS, YOU KNOW, 20 21 THOSE BODIES, BUT I KNOW THAT WE HAVE, IN THE PAST, ALSO DISCUSSED HAVING LABOR REPRESENTATION AND OTHERS AS WELL. SO, 22 YOU KNOW, I THINK THE THING WITH THE LISTS, THAT WE PROVIDED 23 ON THE -- IN THE POWERPOINT PRESENTATION, YOU KNOW, THE IDEA 24 WASN'T TO BE, YOU KNOW, LIST EVERY POSSIBLE ENTITY OR 25

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ORGANIZATION, IT WAS JUST TO SORT OF GIVE A FLAVOR OF THE 1 2 TYPES OF GROUPS THAT WE WILL BE REACHING OUT TO, BUT I THINK 3 THE IDEA IS THAT WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HAVE AS BROAD REPRESENTATION AS POSSIBLE. AND I THINK JUST HEARING FROM 4 5 MEMBERS OF THIS BODY THAT, YOU KNOW, MAYBE YOU HAVE PARTICULAR CONCERNS IN MAKING SURE THAT SOMEBODY FROM, YOU KNOW, THIS 6 ENTITY, OR THIS BROAD GROUP OF INTERESTS, YOU KNOW, THAT'S 7 8 HELPFUL FOR US TO HEAR, SO WE CAN JUST KIND OF CROSS REFERENCE THESE LISTS WE HAVE TO MAKE SURE THOSE AREAS ARE COVERED 9 10 APPROPRIATELY.

MICHAEL LOPEZ: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I WAS HOPING THAT THE IS LITTLE GUY, THE LITTLE BUSINESS MAN WAS REPRESENTED IN THAT AS WELL. THANK YOU.

16 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. RICK?

17

RICK COATES: YEAH. I AGREE WITH RANDI THAT WE -- IT WOULD HAVE 18 BEEN VERY NICE TO HAVE THAT LIST OF STRATEGIES IN FRONT OF US. 19 BECAUSE I'M TRYING TO REMEMBER WHETHER CONNECTIVITY WAS 20 21 INCLUDED OR WAS PART OF ONE OF THOSE STRATEGIES. YOU HAVE ASKED ABOUT HIGH PRIORITY IMPLEMENTATION AREAS TO ADDRESS. I 22 DEFINITELY THINK THAT CONNECTIVITY IS ONE OF THOSE, AT THE 23 RISK OF BEING CONSIDERED A JOHNNY-ONE-NOTE HERE TODAY. CAN YOU 24 TELL ME IF THERE IS A STRATEGY THAT SPECIFICALLY ADDRESSES 25

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THAT, AND IF THAT'S CONSIDERED A HIGH PRIORITY IMPLEMENTATION 1 AREA? >DAVE VAUTIN: SO I'LL TAKE THIS QUESTION. YES, THERE ARE 2 3 SEVERAL STRATEGIES THAT ADDRESS CONNECTIVITY. FIRST OF ALL CONNECTIVITY IS ONE OF THE FIVE GUIDING PRINCIPLES OF THE PLAN 4 5 TO MAKE THE BAY AREA MORE CONNECTED. SECOND THERE IS A STRATEGY TO CREATE A SEAMLESS TRANSIT SYSTEM WITH TRIAL 6 TRANSFER HUBS AT KEY LOCATIONS TO IMPROVE CONNECTABILITY AND 7 8 THERE IS SERVICE EXPANSIONS AND NEW RAIL SERVICE DESIGNED TO BETTER CONNECTION THE REGION. SO THERE IS A LOT THERE IN THE 9 TRANSPORTATION SECTION. PLAN. I ENCOURAGE TO YOU TAKE A LOOK 10 AT THOSE STRATEGIES. THE QUESTION FOR EACH OF THEM FOR EACH OF 11 THE IMPLEMENTATION PHASES IS TO INCREASE NETWORK TIME WITH THE 12 TRANSFER HUBS HOW DO WE DO THAT WHO IS INVOLVED WHAT ARE THE 13 NEXT STEPS IN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS. IN THE NEXT SIX MONTHS WE 14 15 WILL GO THROUGH THE QUESTIONS TO ANSWER, WHO, WHAT, WHAT ON 16 EACH STRATEGY OF THE TOPIC.

17

18 RICK COATES: DO I UNDERSTAND YOU TO SAY IT'S ALREADY A HIGH 19 PRIORITY IMPLEMENTATION AREA? >DAVE VAUTIN: NO. SO WHAT I SAID 20 IS, IT'S ONE OF OUR LONG RANGE STRATEGIES. SO THE QUESTION IN 21 THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN IS WHICH STRATEGIES ARE THE HIGHEST 22 PRIORITY, WHICH ONES SHOULD WE BE ADVANCING THE FASTEST. NO 23 DECISIONS HAVE BEEN MADE SINCE WE'RE LITERALLY KICKING OFF THE 24 PROCESS TODAY, BUT IN UPCOMING OUTREACH OVER THE NEXT 2 TO 3



MONTHS WE'RE GOING TO TRY TO DETERMINE WHICH STRATEGIES NEED 1 2 TO BE ACCELERATED AND PRIORITIZED FIRST. 3 RICK COATES: WELL, I GUESS YOU KNOW WHICH ONES I THINK YOU 4 5 SHOULD. THANK YOU. 6 7 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: TERRY? TERRY, WOULD YOU LIKE TO UNMUTE 8 YOUR MIC? 9 TERRY SCOTT: MY QUESTION RELATED TO PARTS 2 AND 3 HERE AND 10 THAT IS BOTH POTENTIAL CONTROVERSY, BUT FOR GOVERNANCE AND 11 PRIMARILY FOR COMMUNICATION, HOW DO YOU INTEND TO REACH OUT 12 TO, FOR EXAMPLE, TO THE HOMELESS POPULATION, WHICH IS IN SOME 13 COUNTIES CONCENTRATED BUT IN OTHER COUNTIES PHYSICALLY 14 DIVERSE. AND OBVIOUSLY THERE ARE, YOU KNOW, THERE ARE 15 16 SIGNIFICANT MORE, MUCH LARGER NUMBER IN SAN FRANCISCO THAN THERE WOULD NUMBER MY COUNTY OF NAPA. >DAVE VAUTIN: SO TERRY -17 - GO AHEAD CHIRAG. 18 19 CHIRAG RABARI: YEAH AND PLEASE FEEL FREE TO JUMP BACK IN DAVE. 20 21 WE HAVE BEEN MEETING WITH OUR PUBLIC OUTREACH TEAM AND 22 STRATEGIZING ABOUT HOW THE PUBLIC OUTREACH PROCESS IS GOING TO PROCEED, STARTING AT THE BEGINNING OF THE NEW YEAR, AND, YOU 23 KNOW, THIS ISSUE OF REACHING THE UNHOUSED POPULATION HAS COME 24 UP AS AN AREA OF FOCUS THAT'S SOMETHING THAT WE WANT TO MAKE 25

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SURE THAT WE ARE ABLE TO APPROPRIATELY CAPTURE. SO, YOU KNOW, 1 I WOULD SAY AT THIS POINT WE'RE STILL AT AN EARLY STAGE EVER 2 3 FIGURING OUT EXACTLY HOW THAT IS GOING TO WORK AND WHAT IT WILL LOOK LIKE, BUT WE WOULD CERTAINLY BE HAPPY TO FOLLOW UP 4 5 WITH MORE INFORMATION. AND YOU KNOW, I DO BELIEVE, ONE OF THE EARLIER ACTION ITEMS, THAT HAD COME UP WAS FOR US TO SHARE 6 SOME OF OUR, YOU KNOW, OUTREACH LISTS, WITH MEMBERS OF THIS 7 8 BODY SO THAT SPECIFIC OUTREACH TO THE UNHOUSED POPULATION CAN BE VALIDATED WITH SOME OF THE EXPERTISE AND RESOURCES WITH 9 10 THOSE THAT EXIST ON THIS BODY.

11

12 TERRY SCOTT: THERE IS CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT OF OVEREXTENSION 13 HERE WHEREAS WE WERE TALKING ABOUT EARLIER WITH ISSUES WITH 14 BART AND CONCERNS OF HEALTH AND SAFETY WITH BART. A 15 SIGNIFICANT INFLUENCE IN THAT CAN BE OUR UNHOUSED POPULATION 16 WHO ARE -- MAY OR MAY NOT BE SPENDING SIGNIFICANT AMOUNTS OF 17 TIME THERE TO SLEEP OR SEEK SHELTER. AND THIS IS -- YOU KNOW, 18 IT SEEMS TO ME TO BE VERY EXPANSIVE.

19

20 CHIRAG RABARI: YEAH. SO I THINK THAT -- THAT'S VERY GOOD
21 FEEDBACK THAT, YOU KNOW, WE WILL CERTAINLY BE TAKING FORWARD
22 AS AN ISSUE THAT WE SHOULD BE THINKING ABOUT AND PRIORITIZING
23 AS WE MOVE FORWARD.

25 TERRY SCOTT: THANK YOU.



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2 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: OKAY. ANNE OLIVIA.

ANN OLIVIA-ELDRED: I WANT TO CIRCLE BACK HERE. THANK YOU FOR 4 5 ALL THE INFORMATION YOU PROVIDED IT'S REALLY HELPFUL. I HEARD 6 YOU SAY THERE ARE SEVERAL DIFFERENT LISTS THAT ARE COMPILED ON DIFFERENT TOPICS. SO I'M JUST WANTING TO -- I WOULD LIKE TO 7 8 KNOW WHICH OF THESE LISTS YOU'RE GOING TO BE SENDING THIS OUTREACH TO. AND IF WE NEED TO SUGGEST, LIKE, IF WE NEED TO 9 REQUEST, SPECIFICALLY, I'M LOOKING FOR WHAT IS YOUR OUTREACH 10 11 IN THESE GROUPS, I WOULD REQUEST GETTING YOUR LIST FOR LOW INCOME, FOR THE HOUSING GROUPS, FOR THE HOMELESS GROUPS, FOR 12 THE ENVIRONMENTAL GROUPS, FOR THE LABOR GROUPS, AND FOR THE 13 DISABILITY GROUPS, THOSE ARE ALL COMMUNITIES I'M CONNECTED 14 15 INTO QUITE DEEPLY, WHO ARE OFTEN NOT INCLUDED, OR ONLY QUITE 16 SELECTIVELY. AND THE THING THAT HIT MY EARS THERE A MINUTE AGO WAS, WE HAVE TALKED IN THE PAST ABOUT GETTING LABOR -- SO --17 LABORS -- YOU'RE INCLUDING LABOR IN THIS OUTREACH, RIGHT? 18 >DAVE VAUTIN: YES WE ARE. ALL OF THESE TYPES OF GROUPS ARE, 19 YOU KNOW, THEY'RE FOLKS ON OUR PLANNED BAY AREA, AND RAWG AND 20 21 REWG WE'RE MAKING SURE WE'RE NOT MISSING GROUPS THAT MAY BE OF INTEREST TO YOU ALL AT THE TABLE. 22

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ANN OLIVIA-ELDRED: SWEET. I WOULD LOVE TO GET THAT SIX AND SEE 1 WHERE WE CAN SUPPLEMENT THAT AND MAKE SURE THOSE GROUPS GET 2 3 OUTREACH TOO AS WELL. 4 5 CHIRAG RABARI: I WOULD BE HAPPY TO PULL OUR PUBLIC OUTREACH TEAM WHO HELPS MANAGE THESE LISTS, AND JUST GET US ALL 6 7 TOGETHER ON THE SAME PAGE ON THESE ITEMS. 8 CLERK OF THE BOARD: RAHMON, YOU'RE NEXT UP. GO AHEAD AND 9 10 UNMUTE YOURSELF. 11 RAHMON MOMOH: OKAY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE PRESENTATION. 12 I THINK ONE OF THE STRATEGIES THAT YOU PRESENTED LAST TIME WAS 13 THE PER MILE CONGESTION FEES, AND I NOTICES IT'S LOW PRIORITY 14 15 ON THIS ONE, BUT THE FIRST TIME THAT STRATEGY WAS PRESENTED, I 16 BELIEVE ALMOST EVERYBODY ON THE COUNCIL VOICED CONCERN ABOUT THAT. IT WAS REMOVED, AND THEN SUBSEQUENTLY IT WAS BROUGHT 17 BACK IN, AND WE ALSO BROUGHT ATTENTION TO THAT AS NOT A VIABLE 18 OPTION, BUT IT SEEMS LIKE IT'S -- YOU KEPT TALKING ABOUT IT. 19 BECAUSE IN TERMS OF EQUITY, I THINK THAT WILL BE -- TO LOW 20 21 INCOME SO I'M NOT SURE WHY THAT IS BEING BROUGHT BACK EVERY TIME WE TALK ABOUT IT. IT'S LIKE SOMEBODY IS MORE INTERESTED -22 - IS THERE A REASON WHY IT'S KEPT COMING BACK TO THE COUNCIL? 23 >DAVE VAUTIN: I CAN TAKE THIS QUESTION. WE HAVE BEEN TALKING 24 ABOUT THAT STRATEGY FOR TWO YEARS NOW. WE STUDIED IT THROUGH 25

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HORIZON. YOU'RE CORRECT THAT WE HAVE EXPLORED IT, ALTHOUGH IT 1 WAS NEVER TAKEN OFF THE TABLE. WHAT WE DID IS BASICALLY REFINE 2 3 IT SIGNIFICANTLY TO HAVE MUCH STRONGER EQUITY COMPONENTS TO IT. AND WE WERE ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE IN THE PLANNED BAY AREA 4 5 2050 DRAFT BLUEPRINT THAT THE TOLLS WOULD FALL ALMOST ENTIRELY ON HIGHER INCOME COMMUTERS. ULTIMATELY, THAT STRATEGY WAS 6 ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION IN SEPTEMBER, AS PART OF THE BROADER 7 8 FINAL BLUEPRINT, SO THAT WE NOW HAVE LOCKED IN THOSE 35 STRATEGIES THAT ARE IN THE FINAL BLUEPRINT FOR PLANNED BAY 9 10 AREA 2050, AND THE QUESTION NOW IS HOW DO WE IMPLEMENT, WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS FOR THOSE STRATEGIES. AND OF COURSE WE WANT 11 TO KEEP EQUITY AS A GUIDE YOU PRINCIPLE HERE AS WE THINK ABOUT 12 THOSE NEXT STEPS. WHEN IT COMES TO SOMETHING LIKE PRICING, 13 THERE ARE OBVIOUSLY A LOT MORE STUDY AND ANALYSIS NEEDS TO BE 14 15 DONE AND EVEN WITH EXPLORATION OF ADVERSE IMPACTS AND THAT'S 16 SOMETHING WE DEFINE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION PHASE HOW DO WE DEFINE A STRATEGY IN A WAY THAT ADDRESSES THOSE CONCERNS. 17

19 RAHMON MOMOH: THANK YOU.

20

21 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: RANDI AND THEN RICH.

22

23 RANDI KINMAN: IN THE STRATEGIES, BECAUSE THE VOTE OF THE
24 COMMISSION TOOK PLACE -- AND I MISS THAT PART OF THE MEETING,
25 BUT IS THE WORK-FROM-HOME COMPONENT PART OF THE STRATEGIES

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NOW? >DAVE VAUTIN: GOOD QUESTION. I'LL AUGMENT WHAT I JUST
 SAID. THERE WERE 35 STRATEGIES, 34 OF THEM ARE LOCKED IN. ONE,
 THE TELECOMMUTING STRATEGY IS STILL BEING DISCUSSED. AND WE DO
 ANTICIPATE THE COMMISSION WILL TAKE UP THAT STRATEGY AND MAYBE
 MODIFY IT AT THEIR MEETING LATER THIS MONTH.

RANDI KINMAN: SO THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN SOMETHING TO CIRCLE BACK 7 8 TO US WITH, BECAUSE WE HAVE NO IDEA -- WE WEREN'T PART OF THAT CONVERSATION. SO JUST -- IF THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO DO 9 THAT, THAT WOULD BE GREAT. BUT MY QUESTION THEY JUMPED IN HERE 10 WITH WAS, CAN YOU CHECK AND SEE WHAT OUR OUTREACH IS TO SCHOOL 11 DISTRICTS? SO FOR INSTANCE IN SAN FRANCISCO SCHOOL DISTRICTS 12 RELY ON PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION. SO I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT 13 WE'RE ENGAGING THOSE SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN COMMUNITIES WHERE 14 15 PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, NOT SCHOOL BUSES, ARE USED. THE OTHER ISSUE IS, OUR COMMUNITY COLLEGES, AND OUR FOUR YEAR CAMPUSES, 16 THOSE STUDENTS ARE HEAVILY RELIANT ON TRANSIT AND 17 TRANSPORTATION, AND I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE NOW -- WE 18 HAVE A NETWORK OF CONTACTS WITH THEM. THEIR PIOS OR WHOEVER, 19 CAN PUSH THE INFORMATION INTO THE CAMPUS THROUGH OUR LIST 20 21 SERVES, BUT IT WOULD BE REALLY IMPORTANT, BECAUSE RIGHT NOW WE'RE HAVING THAT CONVERSATION AT THAT LEVEL, BECAUSE WE HAVE 22 LOST CONNECTIVITY. WE HAVE LOST ROUTES, WE HAVE LOST THE 23 ABILITY -- LUCKILY MOST OF US ARE NOT OPEN AND NOT OPERATING 24 25 OUR CAMPUSES, BUT THAT IS A LONG-TERM THING THAT I THINK WOULD



BE GOOD TO HAVE. SO IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE IN THAT, PLEASE LET 1 2 ME KNOW. 3 CHIRAG RABARI: YEAH. WE CAN CERTAINLY DOUBLE CHECK ON THAT AND 4 5 FOLLOW BACK UP IF NEEDED. 6 7 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. 8 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: RICH HEDGES? 9 10 RICHARD HEDGES: THANK YOU ANNE OLIVIA FOR BRINGING UP LABOR. 11 MY LOCAL UNION IS ABOUT 35,000 MEMBERS IN THE BAY AREA, AND 12 THEY'RE DOING ZOOM MEETINGS, MOST WEEKS, TWICE A WEEK, TO KEEP 13 THE MEMBERS UP TO DATE ON THE PANDEMIC, BECAUSE OUR MEMBERS 14 15 ARE ON THE FRONTLINE. AND I'M -- I THINK I -- I THINK I CAN 16 FACILITATE USING THEIR PROCESSES. WE GOT A VERY BIG IT DEPARTMENT WITH A MANAGER THAT SETS UP THE ZOOM MEETINGS TO 17 NOT ONLY BRING OUR MEMBERS ON, BUT OTHER PEOPLE COULD GET ON 18 BECAUSE THIS WOULDN'T BE AN INTERNAL MEETING. SO IF YOU ARE 19 INTERESTED IN TRYING TO ACCESS GROUPS -- AND OUR MEMBERS HAVE 20 GOOD HEALTH AND WELFARE, GOOD PENSIONS, BUT THEY'RE FAIRLY LOW 21 PAID LOOKING AT 10 TO \$12 AN HOUR, PART OF THEIR SALARY GOES 22 TO SECURING THEIR HEALTH AND WELFARE AND THEIR OLD AGE FUTURE. 23 SO I WOULD SAY PEOPLE ARE MAKE JUST ABOVE MINIMUM WAGE TO 24 25 AROUND 27, \$28 AN HOUR, DEPENDING ON THEIR SKILL LEVEL AND

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1 WHAT DEPARTMENT THEY'RE IN. SO MANY OF THEM WOULD QUALIFY,
2 EVEN FOR THE BART AND OTHER DISCOUNTS. SO WE CAN CONSIDER
3 THEM, I BELIEVE, PEOPLE OF CONCERN, EVEN THOUGH THEY HAVE SOME
4 OF THEIR NEEDS MET, THEY'RE NOT ALL MET. SO I WOULD LIKE TO
5 MAKE IT AVAILABLE TO THEM, AND THEN BRING IN OTHER GROUPS
6 MAYBE TO A WIDE NET THAT WE CAN SPREAD. THAT'S ALL I HAVE. IF
7 YOU NEED MY HELP I'LL TRY TO DO IT.

8

9 CHIRAG RABARI: THANK YOU. APPRECIATE IT.

10

VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. AND MY COMMENTS ARE, 11 WE ARE VERY CONCERNED ABOUT THOSE YOU'RE REACHING OUT TO. I 12 HAVE SEVERAL ORGANIZATIONS THEY WANT TO MAKE SURE ARE ON THE 13 LIST HERE IN MARIN COUNTY, AND FROM THE HOMELESS POPULATION, 14 15 RITTER CENTER, AND HOMEWARD BOUND, YOU KNOW, TWO ORGANIZATIONS 16 THAT HELP WITH THE LOWER INCOME SUCH AS THE COPE CENTER, AND THE VALLEY FARM CENTER AND ST. HELENA IN NAPA COUNTY AS WELL 17 AS IN NOVATO WE HAVE NORTH BAY REGIONAL CENTER THAT HELP THE 18 COMMUNITY NOT ONLY LOW INCOME BUT THE MEDIUM TO AVERAGE INCOME 19 INDIVIDUALS. SO WE'RE INTERESTED IN LOOKING AT YOUR LIST, AND 20 21 I ASSUME THESE ARE THE LISTS THAT URSULA WOULD HAVE, SINCE SHE'S IN CHARGE EVER OUTREACH, IS THAT CORRECT? 22

24 CHIRAG RABARI: YES. THAT'S CORRECT.

25

VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: SO THAT WOULD BE THE SAME LIST. MAYBE WE 1 2 COULD HAVE HER COME BACK TO US ONCE THIS PLAN HAS BEEN LOCKED 3 DOWN. I'M INTERESTED TO KNOW IF ANY OF THE STAKEHOLDER AND PARTNER ENGAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE IN DIFFERENT 4 5 LANGUAGES. >DAVE VAUTIN: THAT'S A GOOD OUESTION. WE DO -- WE ACTUALLY JUST COMPLETED A BIG ROUND OF OUTREACH OF PLANNED BAY 6 AREA 2050 THIS SUMMER AND WE DID TELEPHONE TOWN HALLS IN 7 8 MULTIPLE LANGUAGES AS WE GOING INTO THE FINAL YEAR OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 I DO ANTICIPATE WE'LL HAVE OPPORTUNITY IN OTHER 9 10 LANGUAGES FOR THE FINAL PHASE OF PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AS WELL. YOU KNOW, OUR STAKEHOLDER WORKSHOPS LATER THIS MONTH, YOU 11 KNOW, THOSE WILL BE IN ENGLISH, BUT WE WILL IN 2021 HAVE MORE 12 OPPORTUNITIES FOR MEETINGS IN OTHER LANGUAGES. 13

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VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: WHEN YOU SAY THAT, LIKE RIGHT NOW IS THE 15 16 PLANNING, IS THE PLANNING PHASE. SO SHOULDN'T OTHER LANGUAGES 17 BE INVOLVED IN THE DECISION MAKING PRIOR TO -- >DAVE VAUTIN: WELL WE HAVE A SERIES OF MEETINGS SETUP, SO WE HAVE A COUPLE 18 OF STAKEHOLDER TYPE MEETINGS THIS MONTH, SEVERAL WORKSHOPS. WE 19 DO ANTICIPATE HAVING MEETING IN DECEMBER AS WELL, SMALL GROUPS 20 21 AND ONE-ON-ONES AND OBVIOUSLY IF THOSE MEETINGS NEED TRANSLATION SERVICES, WE HAVE THOSE ON CALL TO ASSIST WITH 22 THAT, AND THEN WHAT I'M TALKING MOST ABOUT IS FOR OUR PUBLIC 23 ENGAGEMENT WHERE WE DO OUR PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT IN MULTIPLE 24 LANGUAGES, WE'RE KEEPING THAT FRONT AND CENTER AS WE DO PUBLIC 25

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ENGAGEMENT FOR THIS PHASE OF WORK WHICH WE ANTICIPATE TO
 HAPPEN IN JANUARY, FEBRUARY TIME FRAME. SO THIS IS A LONG
 PROCESS. THERE IS GOING TO BE DIFFERENT MEETINGS AND STEPS
 ALONG THE WAY BUT YOU KNOW, YOU CAN KIND OF SEE HOW WE'RE
 ENGAGING WITH DIFFERENT FORMATS THROUGHOUT.

6

7 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: I WOULD LIKE TO SEE YOUR INITIAL 8 STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENTS IN DIFFERENT LANGUAGES TO HAVE THAT INITIAL INPUT RATHER THAN JUST HAVING LANGUAGE OPPORTUNITIES 9 ONLINE. SO I'M HOPING THAT FOR, YOU KNOW, THE NEXT PLANNING 10 SESSION, YOU CAN ENGAGE THOSE IN OTHER LANGUAGES SOONER IN THE 11 PROCESS. SO THAT'S MY SUGGESTION. I ALSO HEARD YOU MENTION 12 THAT JUST BECAUSE WE ADD AND SUGGEST AN ORGANIZATION, YOU MAY 13 NOT USE IT, JUST TO MAKE SURE THERE IS ENOUGH COVERAGE. HOW 14 15 CAN WE ENSURE THAT SOME OF THE ORGANIZATIONS THAT WE SUGGEST 16 ARE BEING REACHED OUT TO? >DAVE VAUTIN: LET ME -- MAYBE I CAN CLARIFY THERE. FIRST OF ALL IF YOU GIVE US AN ORGANIZATION 17 THAT YOU WANT US TO REACH OUT TO IN TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT, WE 18 WILL ADD THEM TO THE LIST, THEY WILL BE INVITED TO EVENTS AND 19 SUCH. SO WE CAN COMMIT TO THAT, WITH THE COMMUNITY-BASED 20 21 ORGANIZATION WORK, THERE IS A COMPETITIVE ASPECT TO THAT. 22 THESE WERE REVIEWED AND FOLKS THAT WERE INTERESTED IN THE WORK AND INTERESTED IN BEING FUNDED TO ENGAGEMENT HELP US WITH 23 ENGAGING WITH THE COMMUNITY AND WE CREATE A BENCH OF THOSE 24 ORGANIZATIONS EVERY FEW YEARS OBVIOUSLY GIVEN THAT WAS A 25



COMPETITIVE PROCESS THE GROUP OF COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS
 WE'RE WORKING FOR THIS PLAN CYCLE IS SET, BUT WHEN WE START
 THE NEXT IN A COUPLE OF YEARS PERHAPS THERE WILL BE NEW GROUPS
 OR OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOU TO SUBMIT OR REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO
 PARTICIPATE IN THAT THROUGH THE OFFICIAL PROCESS.

VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: OKAY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. YOU KNOW, IN 7 8 THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS I'M HOPING THAT YOU CAN REACH OUT TO SOME MULTI-LINGUAL ORGANIZATIONS IS CREATE STAKEHOLDER GROUPS 9 10 THAT ARE JUST IN THAT ONE LANGUAGE. SO, I THINK THAT'S A LITTLE PIECE THAT NEEDS TO BE EXPLORED AND IT WOULD BE GREAT 11 OF THE FACTS CYCLE IF YOU COULD COME BACK TO THIS COMMITTEE OR 12 THE PACK IN GENERAL AND LET US KNOW, SO THAT WE CAN HAVE, 13 REACH OUT TO OUR PEOPLE AND SAY THIS PROGRAM IS HAPPENING, 14 15 PLEASE FILL OUT A CONTRACT AND WORK WITH MTC A LITTLE BIT 16 CLOSER. AND FINALLY I'M WONDERING IF THE ELECTION AND ANY LOCAL MEASURES WILL CHANGE AND GUIDE THROUGH ANY OF THE 17 CONTROVERSIES THAT YOU MAY HAVE. SO HAVE YOU FACTORED IN THE 18 NEW ELECTION, I KNOW IT HASN'T BEEN CERTIFIED YET BUT THAT'S 19 AN AREA TO REFER TO. >DAVE VAUTIN: WE CAN SHARE THE LIST WE 20 21 HAVE IN THE PAST WE HAVE SEVERAL COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS ON CONTRACT ALREADY WHO HAVE DONE ENGAGEMENT WITH US IN OTHER 22 LANGUAGES. FOR EXAMPLE, WE WORKED WITH A SAN FRANCISCO BASED 23 ORGANIZATION IN WHICH WE DID ENGAGEMENT IN CHINESE, AND I 24 BELIEVE IT'S CALL THE SOUND OF HOPE RADIO, WE WORKED WITH THEM 25

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TO ENGAGE CHINESE ACROSS THE BAY AREA AND WE HAVE BEEN DOING 1 THAT KIND OF ENGAGEMENT THROUGHOUT THIS PROCESS THAT'S TO GIVE 2 A SENSE OF SOMETHING THAT'S ACTIVE NOT PERSPECTIVE. WITH 3 REGARDS TO THE ELECTION, I WOULD SAY CERTAINLY, AS WE GO INTO 4 5 THE NEXT YEAR, THERE MAY BE OPPORTUNITIES TO ACTUALLY ADVANCE SOME OF THESE IMPLEMENTATION IDEAS MORE ACTIVELY. THERE MAY BE 6 A GREATER APPETITE ON THE FEDERAL LEVEL FOR INFRASTRUCTURE 7 8 FUNDING. THERE MAY BE A GREATER WILLINGNESS TO EXPLORE ACTION ON CLIMATE RESILIENCE ON THE NATIONAL STAGE, WHICH HAS NOT 9 BEEN THE CASE IN THE PAST FOUR YEARS. SO THERE ARE -- THERE 10 ARE SOME OPPORTUNITIES TO DEVELOP STRATEGIES CAN FEED INTO 11 ADVOCACY AND WE CAN PURSUE POTENTIAL FUND FIGURE THAT BECOMES 12 AVAILABLE IN THE YEARS AHEAD FOR THINGS THAT MAYBE WERE LOWER 13 PRIORITIES ON THE FEDERAL LEVEL IN THE PAST FOUR YEARS. 14

16 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. ARE THERE ANY OTHER 17 COMMENTS FROM OUR SUBCOMMITTEE MEMBERS? SEEING NONE, LET'S GO 18 TO THE COMMENT FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC. I SEE A COMMENT FROM 19 PATRICIA PIRES. MARTHA?

21 CLERK OF THE BOARD: GO AHEAD AND UNMUTE YOURSELF PAT.

22

23 SPEAKER: OKAY. THANK YOU. ACTUALLY A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS, IF I
24 MAY, AND ONE GOING BACK TO THE VERY BEGINNING OF THE

25 PRESENTATION, MATERIALS, THERE WAS A REFERENCE TO THE ACTION

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PLAN FROM THE PLANNED BAY AREA 2040, AND CASA WAS MENTIONED, 1 WHICH MAY OR MAY NOT BE THE BEST EXAMPLE OF TRYING TO GET 2 3 SOMETHING ACCOMPLISHED, BUT IS THERE A DOCUMENT OR SOMETHING THAT'S AVAILABLE THAT PEOPLE CAN SEE, "HERE IS THE ACTION 4 5 PLAN" SO WHERE ARE WE? WHAT HAPPENED? IN THE LATTER HALF OF WHAT WOULD BE THE IMPLEMENTATION PERIOD OF THAT ACTION PLAN, 6 HOW ARE WE DOING, WHAT ARE WE DOING, WHAT'S HAPPENING. SO 7 8 THAT'S THE FIRST QUESTION. IS THERE SOMETHING THAT PEOPLE CAN SEE WHERE WE ARE? >DAVE VAUTIN: THAT'S A GOOD OUESTION. I'LL 9 10 TAKE THIS ONE. SO WE DID PRODUCE A PROGRESS REPORT ON THAT, I BELIEVE, IN LATE 2018, EARLY 2019 TIME FRAME. WE CAN DIG THAT 11 UP. BUT WE CERTAINLY WILL TAKE ANOTHER LOOK AT WHICH ACTIONS 12 HAVE BEEN ACCOMPLISHED AND WHICH NOT SO MUCH. AT A HIGH LEVEL 13 IF YOU GO BACK TO THE ACTION PLAN YOU CAN SEE A GOOD DEAL OF 14 PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE ON THE ACTION PLANS. AS CHIRAG 15 16 MENTIONED CAS A BUT LOOK AT WHAT HAPPENED IN THE LEGISLATURE ON HOUSING IN 2019, THE CREATION OF BAHFA THE NUMBER ISSUES 17 UNDER HOUSING CATEGORY, THERE IS PROGRESS. I THINK WHAT THIS 18 SPEAKS TO IS THE ACTION PLAN PROGRESS LAST TIME WAS COMPLETELY 19 UNRESTRAINED IN TERMS OF STAFF RESOURCES THERE WERE MORE 20 21 ACTIONS LISTED THERE THAN STAFF, SO AS WE GO INTO THE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN TO MAKE IT A STRONGER PROCESS WE'LL FACTOR 22 IN STAFFING AT MTC TO IMPLEMENT THE PLAN SO THAT WE DON'T 23 OVERCOMMIT IN TERMS OF ACTIONS. THAT'S SOMETHING WE WANT TO 24 25 IMPROVE THIS TIME.

2 SPEAKER: GOOD. AND BASICALLY, THE WHOLE REALITY CHECK CONCEPT 3 IS SOMETHING THAT PRE DATES SB 375. EVERY TIME THERE HAS BEEN AN RTP, THERE HAS BEEN A OUESTION, SO WHAT ARE WE DOING AND 4 5 HOW ARE WE DOING AND IT'S IMPORTANT FOR THE PUBLIC TO KNOW HOW WE'RE DOING AND WHAT WE'RE DOING. SO YEAH IF YOU COULD DIG OUT 6 THAT -- OR SEND OUT A CONTACT -- YOU KNOW, WHERE TO FIND THE 7 8 PROGRESS, AND MAYBE LOOK AT IT YOURSELVES, AND SEE HOW YOU'RE DOING. [LAUGHTER] THAT WOULD BE A GOOD ONE. THE SECOND 9 10 QUESTION IS, ON THE LIST OF ORGANIZATIONS AND POTENTIAL PARTNERS ET CETERA, THERE WAS SOMETHING UNDER HYBRID THAT WAS 11 CALLED A REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL. WHAT IS IT? WHEN DO THEY 12 MEET? AND WHERE ARE THEIR AGENDAS AVAILABLE? A LITTLE BIT MORE CLARIFICATION ON THAT FOR YOU. MY 17 UNDERSTANDING IS THAT THIS IS A RECENTLY CONVENED BODY THAT, I 18 THINK, HAS A FOCUS ON HOMELESSNESS AND THE UNHOUSED. BUT I DO 19 -- I DO APOLOGIZE. I DON'T RECALL EXACTLY, YOU KNOW, WHEN THAT 20 21 CAME TO MY ATTENTION. BUT I -- IT IS SOMETHING THAT I THINK HAS TO DO WITH HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS. AND I BELIEVE IT'S A 22 FAIRLY NEW EFFORT.
