IF SO 6 PLEASE RAISE YOUR LITTLE BLUE HAND. I SEE NO ANNOUNCEMENTS. 7 8 I'M GOING TO GO TO THE CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT. AND WHAT I WOULD LIKE TO DO IS I WANTED TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SAY A VERY 9 SPECIAL THANK YOU TO THREE OF OUR BARC BOARD MEMBERS WHO ARE 10 GOING TO BE TRANSITIONING OUT OF PUBLIC OFFICE. AND WE HAVE 11 PROCLAMATIONS, AND I KNOW THAT SUPERVISOR HAGGERTY, MAYOR 12 PIERCE, AND MAYOR SINKS ALL HAVE WALLS AND WALLS OF AWARDS AND 13 PLAQUES, BUT WE WANTED TO JOIN IN THE CELEBRATION, AND TO 14 REALLY DO A VERY SPECIAL THANK YOU TO EACH ONE OF YOU FOR YOUR 15 16 LEADERSHIP, YOUR ENGAGEMENT, YOUR TENACITY, AND FOR SOME OF YOU, REALLY HELPING SHAPE WHAT BARC HAS BECOME. ACTUALLY E ALL 17 OF YOU, SHAPING WHAT BARC HAS BECOMES AND FOR SOME OF YOU FOR 18 A VERY LONG TIME, IN PARTICULAR, AND I WANT TO RECOGNIZE JULIE 19 FOR HAVING SPEND YEARS HELPING US NOT JUST DREAM ABOUT THE 20 21 FUTURE, BUT MAKE IT SO. SO I WANTED TO GIVE A BIG ROUND OF APPLAUSE TO ALL THESE OF THEM. [APPLAUSE] AND TO SAY, THEY'RE 22 GOING TO BE FANCIER THAN THIS, BUT THAT'S WHAT THEY LOOK LIKE, 23 AND TO SEE IF ANY OF OUR HONOREES WANTED TO SHARE ANY THOUGHTS 24 WITH US. PEARLS OF WISDOM. 25



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1 JAKE MACKENZIE: MADAM CHAIR, IF I MAY INTERJECT, I'M ON MY WAY 2 3 OUT AS WELL, SO YOU CAN ADD ME TO YOUR LIST. EVIDENTLY YOU HAVEN'T PREPARED A PROCLAMATION FOR ME, BUT I WILL BE EXITING 4 5 STAGE LEFT WHEN THE NEW SONOMA COUNTY MTC AND ABAG PEOPLE ARE 6 APPOINTED, PROBABLY IN FEBRUARY. 7 8 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: WELL JAKE, THANK YOU. 9 JAKE MACKENZIE: NO. THAT'S ALL RIGHT. I WISH IT WEREN'T TRUE 10 THEY WAS LEAVING, BUT AS ROBERT BURNS FACTS ARE CHILLS -- I'LL 11 SEND YOU THE TRANSLATION LATER. 12 13 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU JAKE. I'LL MAKE SURE THAT WE 14 FOLLOW UP WITH A PROCLAMATION. DID YOU WANT TO SAY ANYTHING 15 16 ELSE BEFORE I GO TO THE --17 JAKE MACKENZIE: NO. I SAID QUITE ENOUGH. 18 19 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: JAKE THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE. JULIE, 20 DID YOU WANT TO MAKE SOME COMMENTS? 21 22 23 JULIE PIERCE: SURE. I JUST WANT TO SAY THAT THIS IS ONE OF THE BOARDS THAT I TRULY ENJOY SERVING ON. YOU KNOW, IT'S -- IT 24 TAKES A COMPREHENSIVE LOOK AT THE BAY AREA, AND I THINK THAT'S 25



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REALLY NEEDED NOW MORE THAN EVER. ESPECIALLY WITH EVERYTHING 1 THAT IS GOING ON IN FRONT OF US. HOPING WITH COVID HAS BEEN A 2 3 CHALLENGE BUT IT REALLY GIVES US AN IDEA OF WHAT THE FUTURE COULD BE, AND WHAT WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO ACCOMPLISH IF WE'RE 4 5 FORCED TO BE CREATIVE INSTEAD OF JUST DOING THINGS THE SAME OLD WAY. AND I THINK THAT'S WHAT I REALLY APPRECIATE ABOUT 6 THIS PARTICULAR GROUP, IS THAT WE BRING ALL OF OUR DIFFERENT 7 8 AREAS OF EXPERTISE TOGETHER, AND WE DO A LITTLE MORE CREATIVE THINKING. I THINK THE WHOLE BAY AREA NEEDS THAT. THEY NEED TO 9 KNOW MORE ABOUT WHAT WE'RE DOING HERE, AND I WANT TO THANK ALL 10 OF THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN LEADERS ON THIS BOARD, FOR HELPING TO 11 FOSTER THAT. I THINK IT'S A GREAT COLLABORATION. AND I WILL 12 MISS IT. 13

15 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU JULIE. I'M GOING TO GO TO ROD. 16

DIR. ROD SINKS: THANK YOU. WELL, I APPRECIATE THIS GROUP OF 17 18 PEOPLE, AS MUCH AS THE INSTITUTION OF BARC. I THINK DISCUSSIONS WE NEED TO HAVE ARE SO INTERTWINED, HOUSING, 19 TRANSPORTATION, AND THE ENVIRONMENT. AND SO, YOU KNOW, IT'S 20 21 BEEN SUCH A PLEASURE FOR ME TO BE PART OF THE AIR DISTRICT BOARD FOR SIX YEARS. AND I'M MOST APPRECIATIVE OF ALL OF OUR 22 EFFORTS TO WORK TOGETHER ON THESE ENORMOUS PROBLEMS WE HAVE. 23 HOW DO WE COPE WITH CLIMATE CHANGE, WHAT CAN WE DO TO STOP IT, 24 25 AND MAKE THINGS BETTER FOR OUR RESIDENTS, MAKE THIS PLACE MORE



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LIVABLE AS WE APPROACH OUR HOUSING CRISIS, WE FIX 1 TRANSPORTATION, AND MAKE THIS THE KIND OF ENVIRONMENT THAT WE 2 3 KNOW WE NEED. SO, I'M -- I HAVE BEEN BLESSED TO BE PART OF THIS. THIS INSTITUTION, AND THE AIR DISTRICT, I REPRESENT. 4 5 THANK YOU. 6 7 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU ROD. SCOTT DID YOU HAVE A 8 COMMENT? 9 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I WANT TO SAY THANK YOU FOR RECOGNIZING MY 10 COLLEAGUES. I'M AROUND 50 SOMETHING MORE DAYS, 52 MORE DAYS, I 11 GO JANUARY. I DON'T END LIKE, IN DECEMBER, AND I WOULD JUST 12 SAY, I WENT OVER MY BENEFITS WITH SARA, AND I AM CURRENTLY 13 14 LOOKING FOR A JOB. 15 16 **SPEAKER:** [LAUGHTER] 17 KAREN MITCHOFF: YOU NEED TO BE A CONSULTANT SCOTT, THAT'S 18 WHERE YOU'RE GOING TO MAKE ALL YOUR MONEY. 19 20 JAKE MACKENZIE: I CAN SEE HIM IN THE MUSIC BUSINESS IN 21 22 NASHVILLE, HE'LL BE AN EMPRESARIO OF COUNTRY MUSIC. 23 AMY R. WORTH, VICE CHAIR: YEAH, IN HIS RIDE-ON LAWN MOWER HE'S 24 GOING TO BE MOWING ALL THE LAWNS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. 25



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2 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I'M NOT INTO LANDSCAPING, AND BESIDES, I HAVE 3 TO FIX THE BATTERY ON THE LAWN MOWER. 4 5 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THERE YOU GO. 6 JAKE MACKENZIE: CIVIL SERVICE TOUR GUIDE, THERE IS A LOT OF 7 8 CIVIL SERVICE WAR SITES WHERE YOU'RE GOING IN FRANKLIN, BARBARA AND I HAVE BEEN TO SOME OF THEM, AND THAT'S A POSSIBLE 9 10 PART-TIME JOB AS WELL. 11 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I'M GOING TO GO TO MY 12 COLLEAGUES AND SEE IF THERE ARE ANY OTHER COMMENTS. I SEE BLUE 13 HANDS, I'M GOING TO TAKE JOHN, KAREN, AND THEN I'M ALSO GOING 14 TO TAKE AMY AND SAY A SPECIAL THANK YOU TO AMY WHO REMINDED US 15 16 THAT THIS IS THE LAST MEETING. JOHN GIOIA? 17 JOHN GIOIA: ALL FOUR OF THE PUBLIC SERVANTS REPRESENT AN 18 AMAZING AMOUNT OF INSTITUTIONAL KNOWLEDGE. AND I HAVE HAD THE 19 CHANCE TO WORK WITH ALL FOUR OF YOU. ONE WAY OR ANOTHER, 20 21 SCOTT, MY COUNTY PROPERTY ACROSS THE COUNTY LINE, AND JULIE WITH OUR OWN WORK WITH CONTRA COSTA AND ON THE REGIONAL LEVEL 22 23 AND ROD WITH THE AIR DISTRICT WORK THAT YOU HAVE BEEN A GREAT LEADER ON, AND JAKE YOUR WORK IN REGIONAL GOVERNMENT WITH HERE 24 AT BARC, AND I USED TO BE ON ABAG, I THINK WHAT'S REALLY 25



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IMPORTANT, FOR ME TO OBSERVE, IS THAT, YOU KNOW, THREE OF THE 1 FOUR COME FROM CITIES THAT ARE EITHER SMALL OR MEDIUM SIZE 2 3 CITIES, AND YET TOOK ON WEARING THIS REGIONAL HAT, AND IT SHOWS THAT THE RIGHT KIND OF PERSON CAN THINK REGIONALLY, AND 4 5 REALLY THINK ABOUT THE GOOD OF THE WHOLE BAY AREA EVEN THOUGH THEY ARE ELECTED FROM A SMALL TO MEDIUM SIZED CITY, AND OF 6 COURSE, SCOTT, WITH A LARGE COUNTY ALWAYS HAD A REGIONAL 7 8 PERSPECTIVE. SO I GUESS, I CALL ALL FOUR OF YOU REGIONALISTS AND WE NEED MORE PEOPLE LIKE ALL OF YOU TO REALLY SOLVE ALL OF 9 10 THE ISSUES AND PROBLEMS WE HAVE IN THE BAY AREA, SO I'M GOING MISS ALL FOUR OF YOU PERSONALLY, AND PROFESSIONALLY. YOU KNOW, 11 TIME MOVES O AND I GUESS IT MAKES US ALL FEEL OLDER WHEN FOLKS 12 MOVE ON LIKE THIS. BUT, YOU HAVE ALL DONE REALLY GOOD WORK, 13 AND WORK YOU CAN BE PROUD OF. 14

16 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I HAVE FIVE OTHERS WHO WOULD17 LIKE TO SPEAK. I WANT TO GO THROUGH THEM. KAREN THEN AMY.

18

19 KAREN MITCHOFF: THANK YOU. YOU KNOW, I WANT TO CELEBRATE THESE
20 FOUR INDIVIDUALS PUBLIC SERVICE. IT'S REALLY EMOTIONAL TO LOSE
21 SUCH FABULOUS PUBLIC SERVANTS. I HAVE KNOWN JULIE SINCE I
22 BEGAN WORKING IN FORMER SUPERVISOR MCPEAK'S OFFICE IN 1987.
23 THAT'S 33 YEARS. SHE'S ALSO BEEN A LEADER IN HER CITY WHICH IS
24 PART OF MY DISTRICT, AND THEY ARE GOING TO MISS HER MORE THAN
25 ANY OF US AT ABAG, AND THE OTHER REGIONAL BODIES WILL KNOW.



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BECAUSE THEIR CITY IS IN TURMOIL. AND, JULIE, I DON'T MEAN TO 1 PUT THAT WORD ON IT, THAT THEY HAVE ELECTED TWO GOOD PEOPLE, 2 3 BUT THEY REALLY ARE VERY UNHAPPY. AND, SCOTT, I HAVE KNOWN FOR 24 YEARS, BECAUSE I USED TO WORK FOR FORMER SUPERVISOR, AND 4 5 ROD, HE AND I CAME BACK ON TO THE AIR BOARD IN 79, AND EVERYBODY IS A DELIGHT, BUT YOU'RE THE CREAM OF THE DELIGHT 6 7 CROP, AND, IT'S VERY HARD ESPECIALLY --

JAKE MACKENZIE: WE'RE ALL WITNESSES TO THAT STATEMENT, BY THE 9 10 WAY.

11

KAREN MITCHOFF: THAT'S FINE. I'LL STAND BY THAT. BUT WITH 12 COVID, THAT WE'RE NOT GOING TO GET TO SEE EACH OTHER, AND I 13 HOPE SCOTT DOESN'T MOVE TO TENNESSEE BEFORE THERE IS AN 14 OPPORTUNITY TO SEE YOU IN PERSON, AT LEAST TO CELEBRATE YOUR 15 16 SERVICE, AND THE OTHER THREE, HOPING YOU WILL BE STILL IN THE BAY AREA. I JUST REALLY THINK, YOU KNOW, WE'RE ALL 17 UNFORTUNATELY, IN THESE COUNTIES, MOVING IN THE WRONG 18 DIRECTION. IT'S NOT BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF LEADERSHIP OF ALL 19 OF YOU, BUT I'M HOPING THAT LATE JANUARY, MAYBE FEBRUARY, THAT 20 21 WE'LL HAVE SOME KIND OF GET TOGETHER. BUT I JUST -- I'M HEARTBROKEN AT THIS POINT, TO THINK THAT WE WON'T AT LEAST SEE 22 EACH OF YOU ON THIS, AND THE MOST IMPORTANT THING TO SAY IS, 23 WE THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE. AND THE PUBLIC WILL NEVER KNOW 24 EVERYTHING YOU HAVE DONE FOR THEM, AND THE SACRIFICES YOU HAVE 25



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MADE FROM YOUR PERSONAL AND FAMILY TIME, AND BE GREAT 1 2 INTELLECTUAL HISTORY AND BANK ACCOUNT THAT WE ARE LOSING WITH YOU. SO, NEVER SAYING GOOD BY, JUST FAIR -- FAREWELL. 3 4 5 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: AMY? 6 AMY R. WORTH, VICE CHAIR: I WANT TO ECHO THE PRAISE AND THANKS 7 8 TO ROD, JULIE, SCOTT AND JAKE. JAKE, I THINK WE WERE HOPING THE VOTE COUNT WOULD BE DIFFERENT. THAT'S CALLED THE WIDEST 9 10 RIVER IN EGYPT. SO, BUT --

11

JAKE MACKENZIE: THE CONSEQUENCE OF DISTRICT ELECTIONS. DON'T 12 EXPECT TO GET A REGIONALIST OUT OF ROHNERT PARK DISTRICT FOUR. 13 I'M GOING TO MISS YOU SO MUCH. MY PARTNER IN CRIME, WE USED TO 14 15 DRIVE OVER THE BRIDGE TO ALL THE MEETINGS, AND I WANT TO THANK 16 YOU THE FOUR OF YOU SO MUCH. WHEN THIS GROUP WAS CREATED OUT OF A LOT OF DISCUSSION, AND SORT OF IN TURMOIL WE FINALLY 17 ACHIEVED THE GOALS OF MERGING ABAG AND MTC STAFFS, BUT I 18 REALLY THINK THIS, BARC WAS CREATED WITH THIS GOAL AND IDEA OF 19 BRINGING ALL OF US TOGETHER FROM THE -- YOU KNOW, THE REGIONAL 20 21 AGENCIES WHICH WE HAVE ALL EXPANDED TO INCLUDE REALLY ALL THE REGIONAL AGENCY IN THE BAY AREA TO REALLY TALK ABOUT THE 22 ISSUES THAT CUT CROSS COUNTY AND CITY AND BAY LINES, SO WE CAN 23 COME TOGETHER, BUT IT'S REALLY ONLY AS GOOD AS THE INDIVIDUALS 24 WHO ARE WILLING TO COMMIT THEIR EXPERTISE AND COMMITMENT AND 25



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INTELLECTUAL ABILITY DO THIS. IT'S GOING TO BE A HUGE LOSS TO 1 THE REGION AS YOU MOVE ON TO YOUR VENTURES, AND IT'S BEEN A 2 3 JOY TO WORK WITH EACH OF EVERY ONE OF YOU ON OUR VARIOUS COMMISSIONS, BUT PARTICULARLY ON BARC, BECAUSE IT DOES TAKE 4 5 INDIVIDUALS, AS JOHN INDICATED, FROM WHATEVER SIZE CITY, IS OUR CITY OF ORIGIN WHO REALLY HAVE A DEEP, DEEP COMMITMENT TO 6 THE BROADER BAY AREA AND WANT TO WORK TOGETHER. SO THE FOUR OF 7 8 YOU HAVE CONTRIBUTED IMMEASURABLY, AND IT WILL BE A HUGE, HUGE, YOU KNOW, VOID, TO FILL, WHEN YOU RETIRE, AND WE WILL 9 10 MISS YOU ALL, BUT ARE INTERNALLY GRATEFUL, AS KAREN SAID, THIS IS JUST A GRATEFUL APPRECIATION FOR YOUR INCREDIBLE WORK. SO 11 THANK YOU. 12

16 ANNE HALSTED: IT'S BEEN A PRIVILEGE TO WORK WITH ALL OF YOU 17 AND IT'S A WONDER TO WATCH HOW YOU HAVE SACRIFICED YOUR TIME 18 AND SOMETIMES YOUR CONSTITUENTS I HOPE THAT YOU WILL REMAIN 19 THAT WAY. THANK YOU FOR ALL THAT YOU HAVE DONE.

5 ALLISON BROOKS: THANK YOU CHAIR. AND I ALSO WANT TO THANK THE DEPARTING GOVERNING BOARD MEMBERS. IT'S BEEN A PLEASURE TO 6 WORK WITH YOU ACROSS THE REGION. GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU EVERYONE. GOOD TO SEE YOU ALL. WHAT 15 16 WE THOUGHT WE WOULD DO TODAY IS SPEND THE BULK OF THE TIME HAVING YOU HAD A GROUP DISCUSSION, BUT TO KICK THINGS OFF 17 ALLISON IS GOING TO PUT SOME THOUGHT INTO SORT OF THE EFFORTS 18 THAT ARE UNDERWAY, AND NEEDED. 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AS THE OUTPUTS OF THIS, YOU KNOW, WE'LL JUST TOUCH ON WHERE WE 1 2 GO FROM HERE, BUT THE THINKING IS THAT STAFF WILL TAKE ALL OF 3 THE GOOD INPUT AND WORK WITH THE CHAIR AND INTEGRATE THE INSIGHTS AND GUIDANCE WE HEAR FROM YOU TODAY, INTO THE WORK 4 5 PLAN, AND YOU WILL BE ABLE TO LOOK AT THAT AT THE JANUARY 6 GOVERNING BOARD MEETING. SO UNLESS THERE IS ANY QUESTIONS, I WILL PASS IT TO ALLISON TO GO AHEAD AND HIGHLIGHT SOME OPENING 7 8 REMARKS TO GET US THINKING ABOUT THESE ISSUES.

AND I REALLY, IN WORKING WITH THE CHAIR, SEE THIS 13 AS JUST THE START OF AN IMPORTANT CONVERSATION WE NEED TO BE 14 15 HAVING AS A BOARD, THINKING THROUGH OUR PRIORITIES FOR THE 16 NEXT YEAR, AND ALSO, OF COURSE, THE EXECUTIVE LEADERS OF THE MEMBER AGENCIES WHO ARE INSTRUMENTAL AND THESE THINGS 17 OCCURRING, AND WHO ARE IMPORTANT PARTNERS IN THIS. SO, IF YOU 18 WOULDN'T MIND, JESS, IF YOU COULD BRING UP THE DIAGRAM THAT 19 WAS -- THAT WE PUT TOGETHER THAT'S IN THE PACKET. JUST HAD AN 20 21 OPPORTUNITY, AND AGAIN, I WANT TO THANK CHAIR CHAVEZ FOR REALLY PUSHING ME AND THE STAFF TO REALLY THINK ABOUT, AND 22 REAFFIRMING -- EXCUSE ME -- WHAT WE'RE DOING HERE TOGETHER, 23 AND REALLY, WHAT IS BARC'S PURPOSE MOVING AHEAD. AND WE HAVE 24 MAJOR CHALLENGES AHEAD OF US, AND MANY OF THEM, NOT ONE AGENCY 25



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CAN DO ALONE. SO CONSTANTLY KIND OF THINKING THROUGH, AND 1 REMINDING OURSELVES, THE OPPORTUNITIES TO WORK TOGETHER 2 3 THROUGH CATALYTIC COLLABORATION. SO THINKING ABOUT COLLABORATION AS A FORWARD, WITH FORWARD MOMENTUM. SO, YOU 4 5 KNOW, ACTION ORIENTED, HOW ARE WE ACHIEVING THESE THING WORKING TOGETHER AND DOING THAT THROUGH INTEGRATED PROGRAMS 6 THINKING ABOUT HOW WE'RE SUPPORTING LOCAL POLICY MAKING AND 7 8 LOCAL BEST PRACTICES, AND THINKING MORE AND MORE ABOUT OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE STATE AND STATE LEGISLATION IN TERMS OF 9 10 HELPING US AS A REGION ACHIEVE OUR GOALS, GET THE RESOURCES NECESSARY, HOPEFULLY, TO ACHIEVE A LOT OF THIS IMPORTANT WORK 11 THAT WE'RE DOING TOGETHER. SO, AGAIN, I -- YOU KNOW, JUST 12 REAFFIRMING THAT THAT'S WHAT WE'RE DOING HERE TOGETHER, AND 13 IT'S NOT ALWAYS EASY. IT'S ACTUALLY REALLY HARD. EVERYONE IS 14 15 WELL INTENTIONED, BUT WE'RE ALL FIGHTING AGAINST ALL KINDS OF 16 CHALLENGES THAT MAKE COLLABORATION JUST REALLY DIFFICULT. AND SO CONTINUALLY TRYING TO REFINE THAT AND MAKE THAT MEANINGFUL 17 FOR ALL OF US. AND YOU KNOW, THIS IS WORK THAT, WITH THE 18 EXECUTIVE LEADERS OF THE AGENCIES, YOU KNOW, THINKING THROUGH 19 WHAT THE MOST IMPORTANT PRIORITY AREAS WE THINK ARE -- THAT WE 20 21 COULD DO PICTURE THROUGH BARC A BIG ONE BEING SOCIAL AND RACIAL EQUITY THAT'S A BIG ONE AT THE TOP OF THE DIAGRAM AND 22 23 THAT'S A LENS THROUGH WHICH WE'RE EVALUATING ALL THE WORK WE DO FOCUSING ON BUILDING PARTNERSHIPS AND CAPACITY WITH 24 FRONTLINE COMMUNITY TO BE PARTNER IN THIS WORK AND MAKING SURE 25



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PEOPLE OF COLOR ARE WELL REPRESENTED IN DECISION MAKE IN OUR 1 REGION AND HOW TO DO THAT BEST. AND THEN REALLY LOOKING AT, TO 2 3 ISSUE AREAS WITH CLIMATE CHANGE. SO IS CLIMATE CHANGE A PLACE WHERE WE FEEL LIKE WE CAN WORK TOGETHER TO HAVE REAL IMPACT 4 5 LOOKING BOTH AT CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION AND ADAPTATION. SO WE HAVE BROKE OUT THE TWO CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION AREAS INTO 6 BUILDINGS AND AIR QUALITY AND WORKING WITH THE AB 617 7 8 COMMUNITIES WHICH THE AIR DISTRICT HAS BEEN LEADING ON AND ALSO ALL THE WORK AROUND LAND USE AND TRANSPORTATION, THAT IS 9 10 A FUNDAMENTAL PART OF OUR CROSS AGENCY WORK AREAS, LIKE PLANNED BAY AREA, REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS DETERMINE -- YOU 11 KNOW, NUMBERS, REMOTE WORK, WHICH HAS COME UP, AND HOW TO 12 TRACK THAT OVER TIME, AND COVID, AND THEN THINKING THROUGH SB 13 375 REFORM, AND THE PIECE AROUND ADAPTATION RESILIENCE AND 14 15 ANOTHER YEAR DEALING WITH WILDFIRES AND OTHER RISKS THAT ARE 16 FACING OUR COMMUNITIES AND HOW WE CAN BE OUT IN FRONT AS A REGION, INNOVATORS, THE BAY AREA BEING A PLACE OF CREATIVITY 17 AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP AROUND THESE ISSUES AND BEING A MODEL NOT 18 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE COUNTRY, BUT INTERNATIONALLY SO HOW 19 CAN WE DO THAT IS CONTINUE TO BE A LEADER. THAT I JUST WANT TO 20 21 PUT OUT THERE, AND I'M NOT PUTTING THAT OUT THERE ALONE. THIS HAS BEEN WORK WITH MEMBER AGENCIES IS PARTNERS. I THINK IT'S 22 IMPORTANT. THE PURPOSE OF THIS IS TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERYONE 23 IS ON BOARD WITH THIS, AND THAT WE'RE REFLECT -- THIS REFLECTS 24 THE PRIORITIES AND THAT THIS REFLECTS WHAT YOU ALL VIEW AS THE 25



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PURPOSE OF BARC AND MAKING SURE WE'RE NOT MISSING ANYTHING. SO, WITH 16 THAT, WE CAN CLOSE THE POLL NOW. THANK YOU. SO WE WANTED TO JUST OPEN IT UP AND INVITE YOU TO START HAVING A CONVERSATION 17 ABOUT WHERE YOU THINK THAT FOCUS SHOULD BE. AND I WAS JUST 18 GOING TO HIGHLIGHT, FROM THE SURVEY, THAT THREE PEOPLE 19 RESPONDED TO, THAT THE ADVICE FOR BARC MOVING FORWARD WAS TO, 20 ALL THREE COMMENTS REALLY TIED INTO DISSEMINATING INFORMATION, 21 TO ABAG, MORE BROADLY, AND REALLY, CRYSTALLIZING IDEAS AND 22 REPORTS ACROSS THE AGENCIES ON THE WORK THAT THEY'RE DOING. 23 AND ONE ISSUE FOR THIS UPCOMING YEAR WAS FOCUSED ON 24 25 SUSTAINABILITY, WILDFIRES, CLIMATE, EARTHQUAKES, THAT



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CONTINUING TO COORDINATE ON CLIMATE PLANNING, AND THEN JUST 1 2 THINKING HOW DO WE BETTER ALIGN AND INCLUDE CLIMATE CHANGE, 3 AIR QUALITY, AND THE CHALLENGES OF SEA LEVEL RISE, WITHIN PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. SO LET'S JUST OPEN IT UP TO YOU ALL. 4 5 AND WE REALLY HOPE TO HEAR FROM EVERYONE. AND JUST AS A GENTLE REMINDER, I HAVE THE AGENDA UP, BUT WE'RE INTERESTED IN 6 HEARING YOUR THOUGHTS ARE ON WHAT STRATEGIES SHOULD BE 7 8 ADVANCING ACROSS AGENCIES. ARE THERE GOALS FOR THE REGION THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO SEE IN THESE POLICY AREAS, AND THEN WHAT ARE 9 OPPORTUNITY AND TENSION POINTS. I KNOW SOMEONE HAD ASKED IF WE 10 COULD GET INTO SOME OF THE PRIORITIES. I THINK IT WAS DIRECTOR 11 JOSEFOWITZ, MAYBE? DO YOU WANT TO START? 12

COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: YEAH. I'M GOING TO START WITH -- SO I'M 14 THRILLED THAT WE'RE DOING THIS. I THINK ONE OF THE THINGS THAT 15 16 JUST, AS A -- AND I'M NOT FAMILIAR WITH ALL THE DIFFERENT PLANNING PROCESSES THAT ALL THE DIFFERENT AGENCIES GO THROUGH. 17 SO AS A REP FOR MTC, HERE, I KNOW THAT MTC OBVIOUSLY IS WITH 18 ABAG IS SORT OF PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE FOR PLANNED BAY AREA AND 19 WE HAVE A GOOD 37 DIFFERENT STRATEGIES IN PLANNED BAY AREA 20 21 WHICH I THINK EIGHT OR NINE ARE DIRECTLY CLIMATE IMPACTING, BUT THERE IS PROBABLY A LOT MORE, IF YOU SORT OF LIKE WENT 22 DOWN TO THE STRATEGIES THAT WEREN'T LABELED INTO THE 23 ENVIRONMENT. AND I WONDER IF IT MAKE SENSE THAT THERE WERE 24 25 OTHER DOCUMENTS THAT SIMILAR AGENCIES HAVE, LONG-RANGE



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PLANNING DOCUMENTS AND CROSSWALK ALL THE PLANNING DOCUMENTS 1 2 TOGETHER AND THEN FIND THE INTERSECTION OF THEM ALL. AND YOU 3 KNOW, SO, I THINK SOME OF THE WORK -- SOME OF THE IDEAS THAT YOU PUT FORWARD WOULD PROBABLY BE THAT INTERSECTION BUT I WAS 4 5 WONDERING -- AND I HAVE SOME OTHER THOUGHTS, WHETHER EVERY AGENCY HAD THIS KIND OF PLAN, AND WHETHER THAT WAS SOMETHING 6 7 THAT WOULD BE FEASIBLE TO DO?

GINA BARTLETT: GO AHEAD ALLISON. 9

ALLISON BROOKS: AS WE WERE DEVELOPING THE WORK PLAN FOR THE 11 TWO YEAR PLAN, I WAS GOING TO TOUCH ON THE WORK PLAN IN MY 12 PRESENTATION. I APOLOGIZE. WE DID THAT WE LOOKED AT ALL THE 13 MAJOR PLANNING EFFORTS AND WE CAN SHARE THAT INFORMATION WITH 14 15 YOU, OF THE AGENCIES, AND LOOKED AT WHERE IS THAT OVERLAP AND 16 WHERE IT MADE SENSE -- WHERE IT WAS CLEAR THAT ONE AGENCY NEEDED TO BE INVOLVED IN IMPLEMENTING ANY ONE STRATEGY. SO WE 17 CAN REFLECT BACK ON THAT FOR SURE. 18

COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO KIND OF SHARE 20 21 THAT. SO THEN, SORT OF SPECIFICALLY, I -- I'M THRILLED THAT 22 WE'RE GOING TO WORK ON BUILDING ELECTRIFICATION. I THINK THAT'S INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT. AND ONE OF THE THINGS THAT I 23 THINK SORT OF FALLS BETWEEN A LOT OF OUR AGENCIES, BETWEEN 24 25 MTC, ABAG, AND THE AIR DISTRICT, IS VEHICLE ELECTRIFICATION AS



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WELL, AND I WAS SURPRISED TO NOT SEE THAT ON THE LIST, AND I 1 THINK THAT'S SOMETHING WE COULD REALLY ALL BENEFIT FROM A 2 3 NATIVE COORDINATED APPROACH BOTH ON THE LIGHT DUTY AND HEAVY-DUTY SIZE. I ALSO THINK MAYBE EXPANDING THE WORK-FROM-HOME 4 5 CONCEPT TO SORT OF A BROADER KIND OF SUSTAINABLE TRIPS, TRANSPORTATION DEMAND MANAGEMENT CONCEPT. COMMISSIONER SPERING 6 HAS ADEPTLY MANAGED TO SORT OF, WITH THIS CONVERSATION, AND AT 7 8 MTC, AND I THINK IT WOULD BE, YOU KNOW, A SHAME TO KIND OF --TO HAVE TO REPEAT THAT CONVERSATION HERE, OR NOT TAKE 9 10 ADVANTAGE OF, LIKE, HIS -- WHERE WE SORT OF LIKE SOME OF THE DISCUSSIONS WE HAVE HAD AND WHERE WE HAVE KIND OF MANAGED TO 11 LAND AT. AND SO THAT'S ONE THING I WOULD ADVOCATE FOR. AND 12 THEN, I JUST WANTED TO ASK, WHAT'S SB 375 REFORM ABOUT? I KNOW 13 THAT WE HAD SOME -- LIKE, MTC GOT A PRESENTATION TO THE LEG 14 COMMITTEE ABOUT T BUT THERE IS A LOT OF DIFFERENT SB 375 15 16 REFORM IDEAS COMING OUT THERE, IN THE BUSINESS COMMUNITIES ARE THINKING ABOUT IT IN ONE WAY, AND THERE IS A BUNCH OF EJ 17 GROUPS THINKING ABOUT IT AS YOU CAN IMAGINE THINKING ABOUT IT 18 IN QUITE A DIFFERENT WAY BUT JUST STICKING SB 375 OUT THERE TO 19 SAY WE WANT TO CHANGE IT JUST TO CHANGE IT DOESN'T FEEL LIKE -20 21 - MAYBE WE SHOULD BE MORE SPECIFIC ABOUT WHAT WE ACTUALLY WANT TO REFORM. LIKE TAX REFORM. NOBODY WANTS TO SIGN UP FOR TAX 22 23 REFORM.

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GINA BARTLETT: MAYBE IF PEOPLE WITH SPEAK TO THE KINDS OF 1 2 IDEAS THEY HAVE AS FAR AS REFORM TO SB 375. 3 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: GINA WE HAVE A LOT OF HANDS UP. DID YOU 4 5 WANT TO CALL ON THEM? OR WOULD YOU LIKE ME TO DO THAT? 6 GINA BARTLETT: I AM HAPPY TO DO THAT. I SEE JULIE, KAREN AND 7 8 JESSE. SORRY. DON'T HAVE ANYONE'S TITLES. I'M GOING TO GO BY 9 YOUR NAME. 10 JULIE PIERCE: JULIE IS FINE. THAT'S WHAT I HAVE BEEN ALL 11 ALONG. I AM GLAD NICK KICKED IT OFF WITH THE COMMENTS HE DID. 12 YOU HEARD MINE I SUBMITTED IN THE SURVEY. I REALLY GET THE 13 FEELING THAT WE'RE -- MAYBE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS ARE 14 WORKING CLOSELY TOGETHER, AND ALLISON, YOU JUST SAID THERE'S A 15 PLAN AND CROSS OVER AND ALL OF THAT, THAT YOU GUYS HAVE TALK 16 ABOUT. WE HAVEN'T HEARD ABOUT THAT YET. MY FEELING AS A 17 COMMISSIONER IS THAT WE'RE STARTING TO GO BACK TO OUR SILOS. 18 AND WE HAVE TO BREAK THOSE SILOS DOWN. WE HAVE TO BREAK THOSE 19 SILOS DOWN. WE CAN'T BE OPERATING PARALLEL BUT SEPARATE 20 21 TRACKS. WE HAVE TO BE WORKING TOGETHER. AND I'M VERY CONCERNED 22 THAT THE WORK WITH -- THAT WE'RE DOING IN ABAG, FOR LAND USE, AND EOUITY, AND ALL OF THAT, IS NOT BEING ABSOLUTELY SYNCED 23 WITH WHAT THE REQUIREMENTS ARE FOR AIR DISTRICT, AND FOR SEA 24 LEVEL RISE, AND TRANSPORTATION. I KNOW WE'RE PUTTING TOGETHER 25



A PLAN, BUT WE'RE BRINGING PARTS AND PIECES AND SLAMMING THEM 1 TOGETHER. I'M NOT SURE WE'RE BEING AS THOUGHTFUL AS WE SHOULD 2 BE, AND THAT I THOUGHT IS WHAT THIS BODY WAS INTENDED TO DO. 3 TO MAKE SURE WE'RE ALL OPERATING COLLABORATIVELY AND NOT IN 4 5 CONFLICT. AND SO, YOU KNOW, I'M GOING TO BE WATCHING, BUT FROM A DISTANCE. I WON'T BE HAVING A BIG SPOT TO PLAY IN THIS, BUT 6 I'M GOING TO TRUST ALL OF YOU TO WORK HARD, TO BRING ALL OF 7 8 THAT BACK TOGETHER. BECAUSE I DO THINK WE'RE LOSING SOME OF THE BIG PICTURE BY JUST FILLING IN THE DOTS AND FILLING OUT OF 9 FORMS AND MEETING THE INDIVIDUAL CRITERIA. WE'RE NOT LOOKING 10 AT THE BIG PICTURE. AND THIS'S WHAT WE HAVE TO DO. 11

15 ALLISON BROOKS: YOU'RE ON MUTE KAREN.

KAREN MITCHOFF: THANK YOU. IT GIVES ME A CHANCE TO RETHINK 17 WHAT I'M GOING TO SAY. I APPRECIATE THE PRIORITY, AND HOW WE 18 SHOULD BE MOVING FORWARD. I WOULD JUST LIKE TO SEE -- AND 19 UNFORTUNATELY, I CAN'T BRING UP THE MEMO. I DON'T KNOW WHAT'S 20 21 GOING ON, ON MY END. SOMETHING IN THERE ABOUT HOW -- WHAT THE ECONOMIC IMPACTS BOTH PRO AND CON ARE TO HOW WE WANT TO MOVE 22 FORWARD ON CLIMATE CHANGE. OBVIOUSLY I REPRESENT A COUNTY THAT 23 HAS -- WELL, FOUR, SOON-TO-BE, PERHAPS TWO, REFINERIES, AND 24 JOHN AND I, AND ROD AND CINDY WORK ON THE AIR BOARD, AND WE 25



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RECOGNIZE THAT WE HAVE TO MOVE TOWARDS CLIMATE CHANGE. BUT I 1 THINK, AS WE'RE THINKING HOW WE WANT TO DO THAT WORK, THERE 2 3 STILL NEEDS TO BE SOMETHING IN THERE AS WE LOOK AT HOW THAT IMPACTS THE REGION'S ECONOMY. DON'T HAVE ANY ANSWERS FOR IT, 4 5 BUT I JUST THINK IT SHOULD BE PART OF THE DISCUSSION MOVING 6 FORWARD. THANK YOU.

8 GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU KAREN. AND I'M GOING TO KEEP GOING. I JUST WANT TO REMIND CHAIR CHAVEZ THAT PART OF THE REASON I'M 9 HERE IS SO THAT YOU CAN ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE. I FORGOT TO SAY 10 THAT. DON'T HESITATE TO PUT YOUR LITTLE BLUE HAND UP THERE. 11

GINA BARTLETT: [LAUGHTER] LET'S SEE. JESSE. 15

JESSE ARREGUIN: I THINK WHAT KAREN IS TALKING ABOUT IS AN 17 IMPORTANT ISSUE, WHICH IS A JUST TRANSITION. IN BERKELEY WHEN 18 WE INTRODUCED OUR BAN ON NATURAL GAS, WE HAD CONVERSATIONS 19 WITH BUILDING TRADES, WHO ARE INVOLVED IN HELPING PUT THAT 20 21 INFRASTRUCTURE INTO EXISTING AND NEW DEVELOPMENT, WHO ARE 22 CONCERNED ABOUT WHAT THAT MEANS FOR THAT, AND WHEN AND WHETHER THEIR MEMBERS STILL WORK, AND I THINK IN ADDRESSING THE 23 CLIMATE EMERGENCY AND ADAPTATION WE NEED TO THINK ABOUT WHAT 24 THAT JUST TRANSITION IS FOR OUR RESIDENT IN THE BAY AREA. I 25



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SUPPORT ALL OF THE PRIORITIES, AND I PARTICULARLY FOCUS ON 1 2 CLIMATE ACTION AND CLIMATE ADAPTATION. I THINK THAT IS THE 3 MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE, BESIDES COVID-19 THAT WE FACE AS A REGION, AS A PLANET. I AGREE WITH NICK'S COMMENTS AND JULIE'S 4 5 COMMENTS AROUND GREATER COORDINATION AROUND REGIONAL PLANNING, AND WHILE THAT MAY BE HAPPENING AT THE STAFF LEVEL, I THINK WE 6 NEED TO HAVE THOSE CONVERSATIONS AT THE POLICY MAKER LEVEL AS 7 8 WELL. BECAUSE SOME OF THE STRATEGIES WE'RE TALKING ABOUT IN PLANNED BAY AREA HAVE A CROSS CUTTING IMPACT TO VARIOUS 9 DIFFERENT REGIONAL AGENCIES. I DEFINITELY SUPPORT NOT JUST 10 LOOKING AT BUILDING ELECTRIFICATION, BUT VEHICLE 11 ELECTRIFICATION, AND HOW WE PROMOTE MORE ELECTRIC MOBILITY. 12 THAT'S NOT JUST SORT OF HOW WE TRANSITION CARS AND TRUCKS, BUT 13 ALSO DIFFERENT MODES OF TRANSPORTATION. BECAUSE I THINK THAT'S 14 REALLY GOING TO BE KEY TO, NOT ONLY MEETING THE GOVERNOR'S 15 GOALS, BUT -- AND STATE GOALS, BUT ALSO THE GOALS THAT WE HAVE 16 AS A REGION TO REDUCE EMISSIONS. YOU KNOW, I THINK WITH THE 17 NEW -- HOPEFULLY, WITH THE NEW FEDERAL ADMINISTRATION, WITH A 18 FOCUS ON IT, HOPEFULLY INFRASTRUCTURE AND CLIMATE ACTION, HOW 19 ARE WE POSITIONED AS A REGION FOR WHAT WE HOPE WILL BE, YOU 20 21 KNOW, BILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN FEDERAL FUNDING THAT COULD BE AVAILABLE FOR, YOU KNOW, RENEWABLE ENERGY, AND CLIMATE CHANGE 22 CLIMATE CHANGE PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES HOW DOES THAT WORK 23 ALIGN WITH THE AGENCIES WITH OUR PRIORITIES, AND YOU KNOW WITH 24 THE BROADER CONVERSATION WE'RE HAVING WITH ADAPTATION. I THINK 25



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WE'RE WELL POSITIONED NOW WITH THE ADMINISTRATION TO PUT FORTH
 SOME PRETTY BOLD INITIATIVES AND TO MAYBE HAVE THINGS THAT
 COULD BE FUNDED, AND COULD HAVE PROOF OF CONCEPT. SO, I JUST
 WANT TO ELEVATE THAT AS WELL.

6 GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU VERY MUCH JESSE. JAKE?

7

8 JAKE MACKENZIE: EXCUSE ME. YES. I HEARD WHAT DIRECTOR PIERCE WAS SAYING ABOUT WATCHING SOMEWHAT FROM AFAR, YES I'LL BE IN 9 THAT SAME POSSESS, WITH THIS GROUP, BUT I'M HERE TO TELL YOU, 10 IN TERMS OF THE NON-PROFIT SECTOR AND STAKEHOLDERS AROUND THE 11 BAY AREA, I THINK THERE IS A MAJOR TASK, AND I PUT ON MY 12 GREENBELT ALLIANCE DIRECTOR'S CAP HERE, AND I KNOW THAT MAYOR 13 ARREGUIN AND COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ ARE AWARE THAT THE WORK 14 THAT WE'RE DOING IN GREENBELT ALLIANCE TO REDIRECT OUR EFFORTS 15 16 HAS TO DO WITH CLIMATE RESILIENCE. THERE ARE OTHER EFFORTS GOING ON, OBVIOUSLY, THE CLIMATE CENTER OUT OF SANTA ROSA. SO, 17 THIS COORDINATION OF EFFORTS IS GOING TO BE AN EXTREMELY 18 COMPLEX TASK, AND IT'S SOMETHING THAT I'M ALREADY STARTING THE 19 NEXT CHAPTER, IN MY LIFE, AND THAT IS -- AND THAT'S WHAT 20 21 GREENBELT ALLIANCE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TOLD ME, HE SAID, OH, WE'RE AWFULLY SORRY THAT YOU LOST YOUR ELECTION, BUT THAT WILL 22 GIVE YOU MORE TIME TO WORK FOR GREENBELT ALLIANCE. SO I GUESS 23 THAT'S WHAT I'M GOING TO BE DOING. ISN'T THAT RIGHT HALSTED? 24



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ANNE HALSTED: ABSOLUTELY. YOU'RE RIGHT ABOUT THAT. 1 2 3 JAKE MACKENZIE: ANYWAY. THAT'S JUST ONE THOUGHT. SB 375, WELL, I HAD A GREAT FALLING OUT WITH THE CALIFORNIA LEAGUE OF CITIES 4 5 WHEN THAT LEGISLATION WAS BEING DISCUSSED IN THE SUMMER OF WHATEVER YEAR THAT WAS. BECAUSE, THERE WERE CARROTS THAT WERE 6 INVOLVED, YES. THERE IS GOING TO BE MONEY, AND OF COURSE THERE 7 8 HAS NEVER BEEN MUCH MONEY TO ACTUALLY IMPLEMENT IT, AND SECONDLY, NEVER A -- NARY A STICK IN SIGHT, ENFORCEMENT IS A 9 10 DIRTY WORD WITH A LOT OF PEOPLE. BUT FRANKLY, TO MEET THE GOALS OF SB 375 AS A FORMER REGULATOR IT ALWAYS SEEMED TO BE 11 SOME ENFORCEMENT MECHANISMS SO JUST TO LET YOU KNOW, I HAVEN'T 12 CHANGED MY MIND ONE IOTA, AND THESE ARE MY COMMENTS. THANK 13 14 YOU. 15 16 GINA BARTLETT: THANKS. THANKS JAKE. DAVE? 17 DAVE PINE: THANKS. WHEN I THINK ABOUT BARC, I REALLY THINK 18 ABOUT IT FROM KIND OF TWO LENSES. ONE IS, OF COURSE, TO MOVE 19 FORWARD A POLICY AGENDA, FOCUSED ON CLIMATE RESILIENCE. BUT 20 THE OTHER LENS IS TO BUILD A CULTURE OF REGIONALISM AND TO 21 ADVANCE REGIONALISM. SO WHEN I THINK ABOUT OUR WORK GOING 22 FORWARD, YOU KNOW, THAT'S AN ISSUE OF PARTICULAR INTEREST OF 23 MINE, YOU KNOW, WHAT ARE THE BARRIERS TO REGIONALISM. HOW DO 24 WE INFUSE REGIONALISM INTO THE WORK OF ALL THE AGENCIES. 25



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WHAT'S THE RULE OF LEGISLATION IN ACHIEVING THOSE OBJECTIVES.
 SO I JUST WANTED TO SHARE THAT THOUGHT.

GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU. LET'S SEE. I'LL GO TO BRAD, I THINK
IS NEXT. THEN, I'M GOING TO COME TO OTHERS TO SPEAK TO WHERE
YOU WOULD LIKE TO STRATEGICALLY FOCUS BARC WITHIN ITS GOALS
AND MISSION AT THE KIND OF CROSS SECTION OF THESE AGENCIES. GO
AHEAD, BRAD, THEN I'LL GO TO JOHN.

BRAD WAGENKNECHT: THANK YOU. JUST A COUPLE OF THINGS. ONE OF 10 THE THINGS FOR ME IS THAT BARC IS SUPPOSED TO BRING ALL THE 11 SILOS TOGETHER AND I LIKE THE SPREADSHEET THAT BRINGS ALL THE 12 PLANNING DOCUMENTS TOGETHER IN ONE SPREADSHEET, SO WE CAN SEE 13 WHERE WE ARE AND WORK WITH THEM. IN THAT REGARD, I LIKE THE 14 IDEA OF KEEPING BARC CURRENT WITH THE LEADERSHIP OF EACH OF 15 16 THE ORGANIZATIONS. AND PROBABLY TO DO THAT WOULD BE HAVING THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR ON THE BARC FOR EACH OF THOSE AGENCIES. 17 MAYBE MAKING BARC A LITTLE BIT MORE FLUID. BECAUSE I HAVE BEEN 18 ON IT FOR QUITE A WHILE NOW, AND YOU KNOW, I MAY NOT -- I MAY 19 NOT MAKE IT THROUGH THAT -- THAT -- THAT CHANGE, WITH HAVING 20 21 THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. BUT I THINK YOU NEED TO HAVE THOSE 22 PEOPLE IN THERE. BECAUSE THEY'RE GIVING THE LEADERSHIP FOR 23 EACH OF THEIR GROUPS AT -- WHEN THEY'RE IN THOSE ROLES.



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GINA BARTLETT: SO BRAD, JUST TO CLARIFY, ARE YOU SAYING THAT 1 2 YOU WOULD RECOMMEND THAT EACH AGENCY'S CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR BE 3 ON THE BARC BOARD. IS THAT WHAT YOU'RE SUGGESTING. 4 5 BRAD WAGENKNECHT: THAT'S WHAT I WOULD RECOMMEND. YES. 6 7 GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU. GO AHEAD JOHN. 8 JOHN GIOIA: I DON'T WANT TO REPEAT A LOT OF THE GOOD COMMENTS 9 THAT HAVE BEEN MADE. I WANT TO TAKE THREE MAIN IDEAS OR 10 PRINCIPLES AND ONE WAS THE POINT THAT DAVE PINE EMPHASIZED WAS 11 DEVELOPING A REGIONAL CULTURE. I THINK THAT'S, HAVING BEEN 12 AROUND ALMOST FROM THE BEGINNING OF THIS, THAT WAS ONE OF THE 13 PURPOSES IS HOW DO WE MORE EFFECTIVELY SOLVE REGIONAL PROBLEMS 14 WITH A REGIONAL STRATEGY. SO IT'S KEEPING THE PRINCIPLE OF 15 16 REGIONALISM, AND HOW WE THINK ABOUT SOLUTIONS. SECOND, AND BRAD TALK ABOUT IT, IS THE CROSS AGENCY WORK. PART OF THE 17 ISSUE -- SOME OF US SERVE ON MULTIPLE AGENCIES, SOME OF US 18 JUST SERVE ON ONE, AND HAVING MUCH MORE CROSS SECTOR 19 DISCUSSION ABOUT A PROPOSAL AT ONE AGENCY, AND HOW THAT PLAYS 20 21 INTO ACHIEVING AN OBJECTIVE OF ANOTHER AGENCY, INSTEAD OF JUST WORKING IN SILO, YES, WE KNOW THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS OF THESE 22 AGENCIES TALK TO EACH OTHER, BUT THERE IS NO REPLACEMENT FOR 23 HAVING GOVERNING BOARD MEMBERS, SO HAVING CHAIR AND VICE 24 25 CHAIR, I THINK MAKE SENSE, BEING PART OF THIS, THEY USUALLY



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ARE, SOMETIMES THEY'RE NOT, BUT IT'S STRENGTHENING THAT -- NOT 1 2 JUST COMMUNICATION, BUT HOW WE'RE THINKING AND COORDINATES 3 STRATEGIES IN EACH AGENCY. AND I'LL STILL REMEMBER, THIS SAN OLD EXAMPLE, BUT MANY YEARS AGO WHEN THE AIR DISTRICT 4 5 DEVELOPED A SET OF CEQA GUIDELINES THAT ADDRESSED AIR QUALITY ISSUES, IN DEVELOPMENT, THERE -- IT ALSO APPLIED -- YOU HAD TO 6 DO SORT OF AN ANALYSIS ABOUT AIR QUALITY ISSUES, EVEN FOR 7 8 RESIDENTIAL HOUSING. AND THAT RAN CONTRARY TO SOME OF THE ABAG GOALS OF GETTING MORE RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT IN INFILL AREAS 9 NEAR TRANSIT. AND IT SO HAPPENS THAT SOME OF THOSE VERY GOOD 10 LOCATIONS FOR HOUSING NEAR TRANSIT ALSO WERE IN AREAS THAT 11 WERE HIGHLIGHT IMPACTED FROM AN AIR OUALITY STANDPOINT, SO IT 12 CREATED SOME CONFLICT. SO I THINK WE FEED TO THINK THROUGH 13 THOSE KINDS OF THINGS. AND THEN THIRD, REALLY, REALLY, AND YOU 14 ALL -- EVERYONE HAS TALKED ABOUT THIS, IS THE CONTINUED FOCUS 15 16 ON EQUITY. AND IT MAY BE IMPLEMENTED AND PLAY OUT IN DIFFERENT WAYS, WITH DIFFERENT AGENCIES, BUT HOW, TOGETHER, AS A REGION, 17 WE'RE REALLY EMBEDDING EQUITY PRINCIPLES, BECAUSE ALL THE 18 POLICIES THAT WE'RE LOOKING AT, HAVE POTENTIAL EQUITY 19 IMPLICATIONS. AND WE HAVE DISCUSSED THIS WITH THE -- YOU KNOW, 20 21 THE WORK-FROM-HOME. MANY BAY AREA RESIDENTS AND FRONTLINE JOBS, AND MANY PEOPLE OF COLOR AND IN LOW INCOME COMMUNITIES 22 LIKE COMMUNITIES MANY OF US REPRESENT, DON'T HAVE THE 23 OPPORTUNITY TO DO REMOTE WORK. SO, WHAT'S THE IMPACT OF REMOTE 24



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WORK POLICIES ON TRANSIT THAT AFFECT THEM. SO JUST MAKING SURE

2 WE HAVE AN EQUITY LENS EVERY TIME WE HAVE A DISCUSSION. 3 GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU. OTHERS? WE WOULD LOVE TO HEAR -- OH, 4 5 GO AHEAD ROD. 6 DIR. ROD SINKS: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I REALLY APPRECIATED DAVE 7 8 PINE'S REMARKS ABOUT REGIONALISM. IT SEEMS TO ME LIKE A LOT OF OUR PROBLEMS OCCUR BECAUSE AT TIMES WE ALL GET PAROCHIAL ABOUT 9 10 THE PLACES WE REPRESENT. AND IN THE END, I DON'T THINK IT SERVES US VERY WELL. THE FACT THAT WE HAVE OVER TWO DOZEN 11 TRANSIT AGENCIES IN THE BAY AREA, IT OCCURS TO ME THAT, YOU 12 KNOW, I DON'T KNOW IF BARC IS UP TO THE TASK OF TRYING TO WORK 13 TO MAKE US MORE FUNCTIONAL AS A REGION, BUT I THINK WE OUGHT 14 15 TO SERIOUSLY THINK ABOUT HOW WE'RE STRUCTURED, THE ENORMOUS 16 NUMBER OF SPECIAL DISTRICTS AND AGENCIES WE HAVE, PARTICULARLY IN THE TRANSPORTATION SECTOR WHERE, YOU KNOW, WE ALL WANT TO 17 JUST GET AROUND THE BAY AREA. I DON'T NEED A TRANSIT AGENCY IN 18 CUPERTINO AND ANOTHER ONE IN MOUNTAIN VIEW. IT JUST DOESN'T 19 SERVE US VERY WELL. AND MAYBE BARC CAN BE -- CAN 20 21 CONSTRUCTIVELY PROPOSING WHAT WE MIGHT DO, AS WE CONTEMPLATE MAJOR FUNDING MEASURES THAT WE HAVE GOING FORWARD. BECAUSE, AT 22 THE END OF THE DAY, RIGHT, OUR GREENHOUSE GAS GOALS, THE 23 GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS GOALS, OUR HOUSING GOALS, THEY ALL 24

25 REALLY DO INTERCONNECT, AND I THINK THAT ALL OF THESE AGENCIES



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PLAY A ROLE IN TRYING TO COME UP WITH SOLUTIONS, AND THEY --1 2 YEAH, THEY TRANSCEND THINGS. AND IF WE CAN'T GET MORE 3 REGIONALLY AND TO GET SOME PEOPLE TO REPRESENT REGIONALLY, AS THEIR LEADERS, I THINK THE BAY AREA IS GOING TO STRUGGLE TO 4 5 FIX ITS PROBLEM. SO I DON'T -- I JUST WONDER IF, YOU KNOW, BARC IS THE VEHICLE FOR US TO HAVE THESE DISCUSSIONS. ALSO 6 APPRECIATE THE COMMENTS OF SEVERAL OF YOU ON EQUITY. AND I'LL 7 8 LEAVE IT THERE. THANKS. 9 GINA BARTLETT: THANKS SO MUCH ROD. I'LL GO TO AMY. 10 11 AMY R. WORTH, VICE CHAIR: THANK YOU, GINA. THANK YOU. FIRST OF 12 ALL, I REALLY APPRECIATE THE OPPORTUNITY THAT ALLISON AND 13 CINDY HAVE SETUP TO HAVE US AND BROADER THINKING ABOUT MOVING 14 FORWARD. MANY OF YOU REGIONALISTS, AND I KNOW JESSE KNEW HIM 15 16 WELL, FROM BEING IN BERKELEY, BUT THAT WAS OF THE GOAL OF ABAG WAS TO CREATE THIS ABILITY FOR CITIES AND COUNTIES TO COME 17 TOGETHER AND WORK REGIONALLY, AND OBVIOUSLY OVER TIME, THE 18 ORGANIZATIONS GREW IN TERMS OF THE VARIETY OF REGIONAL 19 AGENCIES. I THINK THAT'S WHAT'S GREAT ABOUT BARC, IT KIND OF 20 21 BRINGS ALL THESE GROUPS TOGETHER. SO I WOULD CONCUR. I THINK PROMOTING SORT OF A REGIONAL LOOK AT ALL OF THESE ISSUES IS A 22 REALLY IMPORTANT PART OF THE WORK WE DO. YOU KNOW, WHEN I 23 JOINED THE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, BOB MCCREARY TOOK ME 24 AROUND TO VISIT ALL THE COUNTIES, TO SEE THEIR PROJECTS, TO 25



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SEE THE GEOGRAPHY, AND I REALLY THINK THAT'S ONE OF THE THINGS 1 2 THAT'S GOING TO BE PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT AS WE MOVE FORWARD, 3 IS FOR ALL OF US PARTICIPATING TO UNDERSTAND THE ISSUES AND PRIORITIES OF ALL OF OUR SORT OF OUALITY AREAS AND COUNTIES. 4 5 BECAUSE ONE OF THE CHALLENGES FOR REGIONALISM IS THE ABILITY TO SAY, OKAY, UP HERE, UP ON THE TOP, UP ON THE TOP OF THE 6 MOUNTAIN, WE KIND OF KNOW WHEN'S BEST FOR EVERYBODY, AND THESE 7 8 ARE OUR IDEAS. SO I THINK IT'S AS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT, IS TO IDENTIFY KIND OF BROADLY WHAT OUR GOALS ARE, HOW WE MOVE 9 THIS REGION FORWARD, BUT DOING IT IN A WAY, THINGS LIKE THE 10 EQUITY LENS, THE GEOGRAPHIC, IN CULTURAL EQUITY LENSES OF ALL 11 OF OUR DIFFERENT COUNTIES. THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF DISCUSSIONS 12 WITH THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE, WE'RE LOOKING AT -- WE'RE 13 VERY CONCERNED ABOUT THE FUTURE OF TRANSIT, AND HOW BEST TO 14 15 POSITION THAT. I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO KEEP IN MIND THAT 16 TRANSIT IS IMPORTANT TO EACH ONE OF OUR AREAS. SO, WE -- YOU KNOW, WE NEED TO BALANCE THAT, YOU KNOW, QUALITY OF LIFE, 17 SERVICES AT THE LOCAL LEVEL WITH REGIONAL PRIORITIES. SO I --18 AND I REALLY THINK, TOO, FROM A PRACTICAL STANDPOINT, IT WOULD 19 BE VERY HELPFUL FOR US TO TAKE THAT COMPREHENSIVE LOOK AT, YOU 20 21 KNOW, SB 375, THE IDEAS THAT ARE COMING FORWARD. BECAUSE, I CAN TELL YOU, I WOULD MUCH RATHER HAVE THAT DISCUSSION WITH 22 THIS GROUP THAN UP IN THE HALLS OF SACRAMENTO, FIGHTING ABOUT 23 DETAILS. AND I THINK THIS GROUP UNIQUELY HAS THE ABILITY TO 24 25 UNDERSTAND HOW SB 375 IMPACTS, YOU KNOW, ALL OF THESE



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DIFFERENT AGENCIES, HOW WE'RE WORKING WITH IT DIFFERENTLY. AND 1 2 I THINK THAT WOULD BE A GOOD STEP. YOU KNOW, IT'S KIND OF THE 3 SAME WITH CEQA. CEQA TENDS TO GET IN THE WAY OF A LOT OF THE GOALS THAT WE'RE TRYING TO ACCOMPLISH, WHICH STARTED OUT AS AN 4 5 ENVIRONMENTAL, HISTORIC EFFORT, HAS TURNED INTO AN ENTITY, OR A LAW THAT HAS DIFFERING IMPACTS. PROBABLY UNINTENDED 6 CONSEQUENCES IN SOME AREAS. BUT I DO BELIEVE, WITH JULIE, I 7 8 FEEL WE REALLY NEED TO KEEP WORKING ON THAT REGIONAL FOCUS. AGAIN, BECAUSE I THINK THIS GROUP HAS THAT ABILITY TO SHARE 9 10 OUR PERSPECTIVE AND EXPERTISE. SO. THANK YOU.

11

GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU AMY. WE WOULD REALLY LIKE TO HEAR 12 FROM EVERYONE AND INVITE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS ALSO TO SHARE 13 THEIR POINTS OF VIEW OF HOW THEY THINK BARC CAN PLAY A ROLE IN 14 ADVANCING YOUR AGENCY'S WORK, AS WELL AS THE CROSS SECTION 15 16 AROUND CLIMATE RESILIENCE, OR CROSS CUTTING ELEMENT AROUND 17 CLIMATE RESILIENCE. AND THEN TO CONTINUE TALKING, WE WOULD LOVE TO ALSO HEAR, HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO BEST USE BARC, YOU 18 KNOW, TO EXPLORE THESE ISSUES. LIKE AMY'S EXAMPLE AROUND SB 19 375, LIKE USING BARC AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO DO THAT KIND OF AN 20 21 ANALYSIS. AND THEN DEVELOPING AN APPROACH TO REFINE. DEPENDING ON WHERE YOU LAND WITH THAT, THAT YOU WOULD ALSO SPEAK TO AND 22 CARRY FORWARD. SO THOUGHTS FROM OTHERS ON GOALS, STRATEGIES 23 YOU WOULD LIKE TO HAVE BARC FOCUS ON, AND/OR SPECIFICALLY HOW 24 25 YOU WOULD LIKE TO SEE BARC ADDRESS THESE ELEMENTS, OR HOW YOU



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WOULD LIKE TO SEE THEM BROUGHT TO FRUITION IN YOUR MEETINGS
 AND THAT KIND OF THING? THERESE?

THERESA BARRETT: THANK YOU. I WANT TO BE RESPONSIVE TO WHAT 4 5 AMY WORTH JUST SAID. YOU KNOW, I DO THINK THE CHALLENGE IN BARC IS THAT WE ARE NOT ALL OF ONE SIZE AND ONE SIZE DOES NOT 6 FIT ALL. AND YOU KNOW, WHAT WAS JUST SAID ABOUT CEOA IS ALMOST 7 8 180 DEGREES ABOUT WHAT I THINK ABOUT CEQA. I DO NOT SEE CEQA AS AN IMPEDIMENT AT ALL. AND IN FACT, I THINK IT IS CRITICAL, 9 ESPECIALLY AS WE LOOK AT SOLVING THESE PROBLEMS. BECAUSE WE 10 WANT TO DO THIS IN AN ENVIRONMENTALLY, AND A SOCIALLY JUST 11 WAY. AND I AM NOT IN ANY -- HAVE -- I DON'T THINK YOU SOLVE 12 CLIMATE ISSUES. I DON'T THINK YOU SOLVE SOCIAL JUSTICE ISSUES, 13 UNLESS YOU ALSO DEAL WITH CEQA ISSUES. AND I HAVE NO INTEREST 14 15 IN ROUGH RIDING OVER CEQA, IN ORDER TO SOLVE OTHER PROBLEMS. 16 AND I DO BELIEVE WE NEED TO LOOK AT WHAT FITS IN ONE AREA DOES NOT FIT IN ANOTHER AREA, BUT HOW DO WE SOLVE THOSE PROBLEMS 17 FOR THOSE OTHER AREAS AND STILL LOOK AT WHAT THOSE -- WHAT 18 THOSE AREAS ARE. AND NOT LOOKING TO THAT WILL BE THE DEATH OF 19 20 THIS.

GINA BARTLETT: YOU CAN TALK ABOUT THE GEOGRAPHIC REFERENCE?
AND IF THERE ARE OTHER THOUGHTS YOU HAVE ABOUT GIVEN THESE
DIFFERENT VIEWPOINT ABOUT HOW BARC CAN BRING TO THESE BROADER
ISSUES.



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TERESA BARRETT: ABOUT HOW THESE WORK IN THE DIFFERENT 2 3 GEOGRAPHIC REGIONS. MS. WORTH SAID SOMETHING ABOUT HAVING HAD A TOUR OF THE ENTIRE AREA WHEN SHE STARTED OUT AT MTC, AND YOU 4 5 KNOW, I THINK THAT THAT'S A VERY IMPORTANT THING. BUT, YOU KNOW, WHAT YOU SEE, WHEN YOU GO SOMEWHERE ELSE DEPENDS A LOT 6 7 ON WHO YOUR GUIDE IS. IF YOU'RE NOT REALLY FAMILIAR WITH THAT 8 AREA. SO, YOU KNOW, WHAT -- AND I JUST THINK THERE NEEDS TO BE ATTENTION PAID TO THIS SO THAT WHEN AN IDEA IS PUT FORWARD, 9 YOU KNOW, WE LOOK AT HOW THAT WOULD WORK. I COME FROM SONOMA 10 11 COUNTY, AND WE ARE A LOW PUBLIC TRANSIT USE AREA. I THINK WE SHOULD BE A HIGHER PUBLIC USE TRANSIT AREA. BUT HOW DO WE MAKE 12 THAT HAPPEN IN OUR AREA? WHEN I WOULD ARGUE THIS MTC SHOULD 13 DIVERT AS MUCH MONEY TO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AS THEY'RE 14 PUTTING INTO AUTOMOBILES, AND, YOU ABOUT I WANT TO DO THAT IN 15 16 A WAY THAT SERVES SONOMA COUNTY AS WELL, AND USE SOME OF THAT EFFORT TO EDUCATE THE PEOPLE WHO AREN'T USING PUBLIC TRANSIT 17 ABOUT WHY IT IS THE WAY WE WANT TO GO. AND ABSOLUTELY, MUST 18 GO, GOING FORWARD. 19 20 GINA BARTLETT: THANK YOU FOR THAT. 21

23 **TERESA BARRETT:** OKAY.



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GINA BARTLETT: ANYONE ELSE WHO HASN'T CONTRIBUTED WHO WANTS TO 1 SHARE SOME THOUGHTS. I KNOW THAT THEY'RE WELCOME. 2 3 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THE PROCESS -- SORRY --4 5 JAMES P. SPERING: JIM SPERING. YOU KNOW, JUST OBSERVING, FROM 6 MY PERSPECTIVE WHAT'S HAPPENING TO BARC IS WE ARE NOW HEADED 7 8 IN A DIRECTION TO BECOME ANOTHER REGIONAL AGENCY, WHICH WE DON'T NEED. I THINK THE RESILIENCE PROGRAM IS A GOOD FOCUS OF 9 SOMETHING THAT OTHER AGENCIES ARE DEALING WITH. IT'S LIKE THE 10 LAST COMMENT THAT BOARD MEMBER BARRETT MADE, AND OTHER PEOPLE 11 MAKE. THEY MAKE COMMENTS LIKE, MTC SHOULD PUT MORE MONEY INTO 12 TRANSIT. MTC HAS PUT INTO OR \$400 BILLION INTO THE 13 14 TRANSPORTATION PLAN. IT DOMINATES ALL OF OUR INVESTMENTS. IT'S 15 TREMENDOUS, AND TO HAVE BOARD MEMBERS MAKING COMMENTS LIKE 16 THAT, IT'S VERY CONFUSING TO THE PUBLIC. AND THE OTHER THING ABOUT -- EVERYBODY SAYS REGIONALISM. ALL OF THE PEOPLE ON THIS 17 CALL REGIONALISM IS A GOOD THING BUT TO THE PUBLIC IT'S NOT. 18 THE PUBLIC WANTS TO COORDINATE OUR SYSTEMS AND COOPERATE, BUT 19 THEY WANT LAND USE CONTROLLED. TAKING ON THE ISSUES THAT SORT 20 OF CONFLICT. YOU KNOW, I REALLY -- AN EXAMPLE THAT BOARD 21 MEMBER JOSEFOWITZ JUST MENTIONED, IT'S LIKE THIS 22 TELECOMMUTING. I MEAN, ALL THE PUSH BACK THAT MTC IS TAKING ON 23 THIS, AND THEN FOR BARC NOT TO EVEN HAVE WEIGHED IN ON THAT 24 ISSUE, SAYING IT'S GOOD, BAD, IS SOMETHING THAT REALLY SHOULD 25



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BE PROMOTED. I THINK THAT'S WHAT BARC'S ROLE IS GOING TO BE, 1 TO OVERSEE -- NOT OVERSEE, BUT TO LOOK AT THE STRATEGIES THAT 2 3 ARE COMING FORWARD, THAT OVERLAP THAT, WE CAN SUPPORT, THAT WE CAN HELP PROMOTE, AND REALLY HELP MEET THE GREENHOUSE GAS 4 5 THRESHOLDS. AND SO, I JUST GET CONCERNED THAT, YOU KNOW, WE'RE TAKING ON ANOTHER ROLE. IT'S LIKE THE EQUITY ISSUE. WHAT ARE 6 WE -- YOU KNOW, ALLISON, IT WOULD BE REALLY NICE IF YOU WOULD 7 8 EXPLAIN THAT. ARE YOU GOING TO BE OVERLOOKING EVERYTHING THAT MTC IS DOING? EVERYTHING THAT THE AIR DISTRICT IS DOING? I 9 MEAN -- HOW ARE YOU -- ARE WE GOING TO HAVE THOSE CONFLICTS? 10 AND YOU KNOW, IT'S LIKE THE PUBLIC OUTREACH THAT MTC HAS JUST 11 DONE, MTC, WITH THE BAY PLAN HAS DONE THE MOST EXTENSIVE 12 OUTREACH THAN ANY REGIONAL AGENCY IN THE HISTORY OF THE BAY 13 AREA, I MEAN JUST SPENDING MILLIONS OF DOLLARS, AND YOU HEAR 14 15 PEOPLE CRITICIZE THAT EQUITY WASN'T ADDRESSED BY MTC. THAT'S 16 JUST LUDICROUS. AND I JUST HATE TO SEE US DUPLICATING THESE EFFORTS OR LEAVING THE IMPRESSION THAT WE'RE OVERSEEING WHAT 17 THE AIR DISTRICT IS DOING, WHAT MTC IS DOING, WHAT ABAG IS 18 DOING. AND I THINK WE HAVE TO BE CAREFUL WITH THAT. AND I 19 AGREE WITH JULIE, I THINK WE HAVE GOTTEN SILOED A LITTLE MORE 20 21 THAN WE SHOULD BE. AND THIS IS A REAL GOOD PROCESS AND I APPRECIATE YOU CINDY BRINGING THIS FORWARD. IT'S GREAT 22 DISCUSSION. AND THE LAST THING ON THE EQUITY ISSUE, WE ALL 23 HAVE WHAT WE THINK IS JUST OF THE GREATEST THING TO DO. IT'S 24 25 LIKE THE NATURAL GAS, YOU KEEP ASKING THE QUESTION, WHAT



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HAPPENS WHEN YOU LOSE THESE TRANSMISSION LINES, YOU LOSE 1 ELECTRICITY FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME? DO PEOPLE GO WITHOUT 2 HOT WATER? DO THEY GO WITHOUT TRANSPORTATION? DO THEY GO 3 WITHOUT FOOD. I THINK THESE ARE OUESTIONS THAT NEED TO BE 4 5 ADDRESSED AND THEY'RE NOT. AND I HAVE SAID ENOUGH BUT I JUST FEEL LIKE WE HAVE TO BE CAREFUL THAT BARC DOESN'T BECOME 6 7 EITHER REGIONAL AGENCY THAT IS DEALING WITH DUPLICATED ISSUES. 8 THANK YOU MADAM CHAIR.

10 GINA BARTLETT: YES. I THINK THE OTHER KERNEL THAT I'M TAKING 11 FROM YOUR COMMENTS IS THAT TO USE BARC AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO 12 CONSIDER. LIKE YOU SAY, THE WORK MTC IS DOING ON REMOTE WORK 13 AND TO USE THIS TO CROSS POLLINATE AROUND THE AGENCIES. 14 ALLISON. GO AHEAD.

15

16 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: ALLISON, BEFORE YOU DO, I WANT TO DO A TIME CHECK WITH MY COLLEAGUES. I HAVE YOU ALL UNTIL 12:30 AND 17 18 WE NEED TO GO IT PUBLIC COMMENT. WHAT I WANT TO DO IS, AFTER ALLISON SPEAKS, IF THERE IS ANYBODY WHO WANTS TO SPEAK, WE 19 DON'T HAVE TO WRAP IT UP TODAY, THIS IS REALLY AN OPPORTUNITY 20 FOR US TO LISTEN. THERE IS ONE ISSUE THEY WANT TO BRING BACK 21 22 SOONER RATHER THAN LATER BUT TODAY WAS FOR US REALLY TO HEAR. ALLISON, GO AHEAD THEN WE'LL GO TO THERESE, AND IF ANYBODY 23 ELSE DIDN'T SPEAK, THEN WE'RE GOING TO GO TO PUBLIC COMMENT. 24



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ALLISON BROOKS: BROOKS IT REALLY IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO LISTEN. 1 AND I APPRECIATE EVERYONE'S COMMENTS. I THINK AS SOMEONE WHO 2 3 IS TRYING TO MANAGE BARC WHAT I'M HEARING FROM YOU, THESE ARE ALL PERSONALITY ISSUES, DISTINGUISHING THOSE PLACE WHERE IS 4 5 AGENCIES NEED TO COME TOGETHER TO WORK THROUGH IT, TENSION POINTS OR THESE CROSS CUTTING ISSUES, IS HOW BEST IT USE YOUR 6 TIME AND THE TIME OF THIS MEETING, AND THE STAFF'S TIME TO 7 8 KIND OF WORK THROUGH THIS. AND I'LL GIVE AN EXAMPLE, ON THE REMOTE WORK. I MEAN ONE OF THE THINGS I THOUGHT WOULD BE 9 HELPFUL IS TO COLLECT THE DATA ON REMOTE WORK SO WE'RE MAKING 10 INFORMED DECISIONS AROUND POLICY MAKING. AND SO THAT WORK IS 11 ONGOING SO I GUESS IN THINKING THROUGH, IS BARC MORE OF A 12 THINK TANK KIND OF PLACE WHERE WE ARE IDENTIFYING THOSE PLACES 13 AND DOING SOME ANALYSIS IS BRINGING THAT FORWARD TO YOU AND TO 14 15 THE AGENCIES TO THINK THROUGH NEXT STEPS, AND HAVING THESE 16 CONVERSATIONS? AND TO THE POINT ON THE EOUITY ISSUES IT'S JUST IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT IT IS A PLACE WHERE ALL THE AGENCIES 17 ARE WORKING ON EQUITY, IN REALLY IMPORTANT WAYS, TRYING TO 18 MAKE GREAT STRIDES ON THAT, AND JUST AGAIN, TO MAKE SURE THAT 19 WE'RE OPTIMIZING EACH OTHER, AND USING GOOD GOVERNANCE IN A 20 WAY MAKING SURE THAT WE'RE NOT, YOU KNOW, REPEATING EFFORTS, 21 OR REUSING RESOURCES WHEN WE COULD BE BRINGING RESOURCES ARE 22 TOGETHER TO HAVE THE GREATEST IMPACT. WHEN I THINK ABOUT 23 REGIONALISM IS HOW WE DON'T HAVE FOUR OR FIVE AGENCIES DOING 24



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SEPARATE THINGS BUT REALLY USING RESOURCES TO THE BEST OF OUR
 ABILITY TO GREATEST IMPACT.

4 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU ALLISON. I'M GOING TO GO BACK
5 TO THE FOLKS WHO HAVEN'T SPOKEN YET AND GET THEIR COMMENTS,
6 THEN PUBLIC COMMENTS. THERESE AND THEN JOHN.

7

8 THERESE MCMILLAN: THANK YOU MADAM CHAIR, ON THAT. I'LL BE BRIEF. AND I DON'T WANT TO SPEAK FOR MY FELLOW EXECUTIVE 9 DIRECTORS, BUT I KNOW THERE WAS A REQUEST FOR -- I THINK THIS 10 IS INCREDIBLY HELPFUL. BUT I WOULD JUST SAY THE COLLABORATIVE 11 WORK WE HAVE DONE AT THE AGENCY LEADERSHIP LEVEL HAS PRODUCED 12 SOME REALLY IMPORTANT COLLABORATIONS AND INTERSECTIONS, IS 13 MAYBE PART OF WHAT WE HAVEN'T NECESSARILY DONE, AS WELL, IS 14 15 LIFT THAT UP AND ADVANCE IT TO SHOW HOW THESE INTERSECTIONS 16 ARE WORKING IN ORDER TO BETTER COORDINATE EFFORTS. I THINK ONE REALLY IMPORTANT EXAMPLE HAS BEEN THE WORK WE HAVE BEEN DOING 17 TO HELP SHAPE THE NATURE OF LEGISLATION THAT HAS BEEN AROUND 18 CLIMATE CHANGE AND RESILIENCE. AND WE HAVE WORKED VERY 19 CAREFULLY, AS THE THREE AGENCIES, TO HELP ENSURE THAT THE 20 21 LANGUAGE -- I BELIEVE IT WAS THE MULLINS BILL, I DON'T HAVE THE NAME RIGHT OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD -- BUT OUR AWARENESS OF 22 HOW WE WOULD BEST WORK TOGETHER, NOT AT ODDS WITH EACH OTHER, 23 ACTUALLY HELPS SHAPE THAT LANGUAGE. AND SO, THAT'S JUST ONE OF 24 SEVERAL POINTS WHERE ACTUALLY THERE HAS BEEN SOME VERY 25



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IMPORTANT, POSITIVE, OUTCOMES RELATED TO IDENTIFYING WHERE THE 1 2 INTERSECTIONS OF OUR WORK CAN EVIDENCE THEMSELVES IN TERMS OF 3 PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS ALIKE. THE WORK, FOR EXAMPLE, JUST REALLY OUICKLY, ON EOUITY, WE KNOW THAT CERTAIN NEIGHBORHOODS, 4 5 EAST PALO ALTO, OR WEST OAKLAND, OR, YOU KNOW, RICHMOND, OUR DIFFERENT AGENCIES HAVE DIFFERENT FOOTPRINTS IN THOSE 6 7 COMMUNITIES. AND YET WHEN WE REACH OUT TO THE COMMUNITIES, IF 8 WE'RE ALL DOING IT SEPARATELY, THAT IS, ONE, CONFUSING TO THEM, AND TWO, WE MAY NOT BE SERVING THEM AS BEST WE CAN. SO 9 WE HAVE BEGUN IDENTIFYING WHERE WE BRING OUR COLLECTIVE 10 EFFORTS WHETHER IT'S REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION ISSUE, A HOUSING 11 ISSUE, ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ISSUE, SAY IN THE CITY OF RICHMOND 12 AND BEGIN TALKING WITH THAT COMMUNITY ON ALL OF THE IMPACTS 13 NOT IN SEPARATE LITTLE SILOS. SO I THINK THERE IS A LOT OF 14 15 OPPORTUNITY, AND PERHAPS WE JUST NEED TO REALLY FOCUS ON 16 MAKING SURE THAT, AT THE BOARD LEVEL, YOU ARE, YOU KNOW, PROVIDING A MORE EXPLICITLY, AND INTENTIONALLY, THE GUIDANCE 17 OF WHERE WE NEED TO GO, AND WE'RE LIKEWISE GIVING YOU THE 18 POSITIVE OUTCOMES THAT WE ACHIEVE FOR ONGOING COORDINATION. 19 20 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. IS THERE ANYBODY ELSE? JOHN. I 21 22 SAW YOUR HAND UP. AND I DON'T KNOW IF YOU TOOK IT DOWN ON

TIME CHECK, DO WE HAVE TWO MINUTES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT? 9 10 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: YES. PLEASE. 11 12 SPEAKER: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MY NAME IS JED HOLTZMAN SENIOR 13 POLICY ANALYST FOR 350 BAY AREA UNFORTUNATELY THAT IS NOT MY 14 CAT. I THINK THIS IS MY THIRD BARC MEETING BUT AS A REGIONAL 15 16 POLICY NERD, I APPRECIATE THIS DISCUSSION. IN SCHOOL PROJECTS, I THINK TEN PERCENT OF THE PEOPLE DO 90 PERCENT OF THE WORK 17 AND I THINK PUBLIC OVERSIGHT IS THE SAME IN OUR NINE CITIES 18 AND COUNTIES SO I THANK YOU FOR NOT JUST SPENDING YOUR EXTRA 19 TIME ON ONE JOB BUT MULTIPLE. I WOULD SAY I REALLY APPRECIATED 20 BOARD MEMBER SINKS COMMENT ON BARC SERVING AS A BODY TO KIND 21 OF INTERCONNECT THE BAY AREA AND MAKE IT MORE FUNCTIONAL. I 22 KNOW THAT MEMBER SPERING WAS KIND OF SPEAKING AGAINST THAT 23 MODEL. BUT I THINK, YOU KNOW, KIND OF SERVING AS A LAFCO FOR 24 THE NINE COUNTIES, AND HELPING TO COORDINATE THE PARTS OF 25



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COORDINATING AMONG THE NINE COUNTIES THAT ARE NOT CONFLICTUAL, 1 WOULD BE A GREAT IDEA. I THINK THERE IS -- YOU KNOW, MY MAIN 2 3 POINT, WE'RE A CLIMATE ADVOCACY COORDINATION CLIMATE JUSTICE ADVOCACY, AND I THINK THERE IS A DISCORDANCE BETWEEN AMBITION 4 5 AND THE CLIMATE VISION FOR THE AIR DISTRICT'S CLEAN AIR PLAN. AND I THINK THE AIR DISTRICT'S LEVEL OF UNDERSTANDING AND 6 7 COMMITMENT ON EMISSIONS REDUCTION, AROUND PM AND GREENHOUSE 8 GASSES IS KIND OF A BEAR MINIMUM REQUIREMENT FOR MEETING ANY OF YOUR PRIORITY GOALS. I WOULD HIGHLIGHT THAT AS MY PRIMARY 9 COMMENT. I COULDN'T ACCESS THE MEMO BUT IN TERMS OF THE FOCUS 10 AREAS THAT WERE MENTIONED IN THE STRATEGY AGENDA, I COULD 11 DEFINITELY SEE FOUR SUBPARTS I WOULD BACK UP JOSEFOWITZ ON THE 12 NEED TO ADD VEHICLE ELECTRIFICATION AND WOULD CERTAINLY 13 SUGGEST OTHER MITIGATION LIKE THE DIESEL FREE BY "33 14 INITIATIVE PM REDUCTION OVERALL, IT WOULD BE THE DEADLIEST 15 16 POLLUTANT OUTSIDE OF 617 COMMUNITIES AND EXPANDING BUILDING ELECTRIFICATION SECTION BEYOND TITLE 24. THE AIR DISTRICT SAID 17 THEY'RE GOING TO BE MOVING FORWARD ON CONSTRUCTION LIKELY BUT 18 DEFINITELY ENCOURAGE MORE COORDINATION ABOUT --19 20

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LITTLE SCRATCHY BECAUSE PART OF HOW WE'RE GOING TO GET TO 1 WHERE WE WANT TO BE IS TO BE ABLE TO BE VERY UPFRONT ABOUT THE 2 3 THINGS WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE AND WHERE THERE IS LEVELS OF DISCOMFORT AND HOW WE PROCEED. I WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT ONE THING 4 5 THAT WAS RAISED. AND THAT IS THE ISSUE ABOUT HOW WE WORK TOWARD BOARD APPOINTMENTS THAT CAN ASSIST WITH THE 6 COLLABORATIVE COMPONENT OF THE -- OF, YOU KNOW, THE 7 8 COLLABORATION OF BARC. SO ONE THING I WOULD LIKE TO DO IS ASK THE SUBCOMMITTEE THAT'S LOOKING AT THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR 9 10 PERSONSHIP, IF THEY COULD ALSO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION ABOUT, HOW TO APPOINT FOLKS WHO BOTH HAVE AN INTEREST. ARE COLLEAGUES OKAY IF WE 15 16 GIVE THAT BODY OF WORK TO AMY, JESSE AND KAREN TO KICK AROUND AND BRING BACK FOR DISCUSSION? OKAY. IS THE COMMITTEE OKAY 17 WITH THAT? AMY, GOOD. AND THE SECOND THING I WANT TO SAY I'LL 18 ASK AMY AS THE VICE CHAIR, TO JOIN IN DISCUSSIONS WITH ALLISON 19 AND GINA ABOUT HOW THIS CONVERSATION IS CONTINUED INTO 20 21 JANUARY. 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DIVE INTO THIS, BUT I THINK THIS WAS A REALLY GOOD BEGINNING. 1 SO I WANT TO THANK YOU ALL FOR THAT. SCOTT? I HAVE ONE HAND 2 3 UP. MR. HAGGERTY? 4 5 SCOTT HAGGERTY: YEAH. I'M JUST A LITTLE CONFUSED ABOUT SOMETHING. MAYBE, DID YOU SAY SOMETHING ABOUT DELEGATING 6 7 SOMETHING TO A COUPLE OF PEOPLE ABOUT LOOKING AT THE CHAIRS 8 AND VICE CHAIRS SERVING ON THIS COMMITTEE? 9 CINDY CHAVEZ, CHAIR: YEAH JUST TO HAVE A DISCUSSION SO THEY 10 CAN MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE FULL BOARD. 11 12 SCOTT HAGGERTY: I DON'T UNDERSTAND THAT. 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SUPERVISOR HE APPOINTED BARC AND WHOEVER COMES INTO THE AIR
 DISTRICT, THEY MAKE THE APPOINTMENTS. SO I DON'T UNDERSTAND
 WHY WE NEED TO GET MARRED IN A WONKY DISCUSSION WHEN IN FACT
 THEY'RE THE ONES THAT MAKE THE DECISIONS.
