FOR SURE. 6 7 8 PAT ECKLUND: BECAUSE I TOOK A TOUR THAT -- OBVIOUSLY PRE-COVID -- ACTUALLY SEVERAL TOURS. I HAPPEN TO KNOW THE DEVELOPER THAT 9 10 PUT THIS TOGETHER, AND LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES, WE HAD A BIG MEETING OUT THERE, POST COVID -- HOPEFULLY IF WE EVER GET 11 THERE. IT WAS SUGGESTED -- YOU CAN'T SEE THIS REALLY -- BUT I 12 REALLY THINK IT'S SOMETHING THAT, ESPECIALLY STAFF, BUT ALSO, 13 I THINK, ELECTED OFFICIALS, TOO, IT WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR US TO 14 15 GO AND TAKE A TOUR OF THAT FACILITY. BECAUSE, I THINK IT IS A 16 PARTIAL -- A PARTIAL APPROACH TO HELP REDUCE THE COST OF HOUSING. AND I WAS PRETTY IMPRESSED WITH WHAT THEY WERE DOING. 17 AND, SO, I JUST THINK THE MORE THAT WE KNOW WHAT PEOPLE ARE 18 DOING, IN THE INDUSTRY, TO HELP REDUCE THE COST, I THINK WOULD 19 BE HELPFUL IN WHAT WE DO. SO -- AND I WOULD BE GLAD TO HELP 20 SET THAT UP, BECAUSE I HAPPEN TO KNOW THE DEVELOPER AND WORKED 21 WITH HIM ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF HAMILTON FIELD, AND THAT'S A 22 HUGE DEVELOPMENT TOO, THAT WE DID IN NOVATO, AND IF PEOPLE ARE 23 INTERESTED TO SEE AND HEAR THE BACKGROUND THAT WE DID ON 24

HAMILTON. I THINK THAT WOULD BE A GOOD OPPORTUNITY AS WELL.

[INDISCERNIBLE] UP NORTH. 2 3 LORI WILSON, CHAIR: THIS IS A QUESTION FOR STAFF F THAT WAS 4 5 SOMETHING WE WANTED TO DO POST COVID, HOW OLD THAT WORK? JUST TO SAY THAT IT'S SOMETHING THAT WE'RE INTERESTED IN? 6 7 8 THERESE MCMILLAN: THERESE MCMILLAN, HAPPY NEW YEAR EVERYONE. IF WE HAD A QUORUM, WE WOULD NEED TO NOTICE IT AS AN EVENT 9 10 OUTSIDE -- AN EVENT OFFSITE, AND OF COURSE, THEN, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC COULD GO WE WOULD HAVE TO HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO 11 PARTICIPATE, ET CETERA, WE COULD MANAGE SOMETHING LIKE THAT. 12 IN THE MEANTIME, THOUGH, BECAUSE I REMEMBER READING THIS IN 13 GOLDEN GATE, A WONDERFUL BOOK, THAT HIGHLIGHTED THE HOUSING 14 CRISIS, HERE IN THE BAY AREA, AND THERE WAS A CHAPTER REALLY 15 16 TALKING ABOUT THAT. SOMETIMES THERE IS A VIRTUAL TOUR THAT THE MANUFACTURES OR FACTORIES PUT TOGETHER IN ORDER TO, YOU KNOW, 17 BE ABLE TO REACH A BROAD AUDIENCE AND WHAT NOT. ONE THING WE 18 MIGHT DO IN THE MEANTIME IS SEE IF SOMETHING LIKE THAT IS 19 AVAILABLE, AND IF A SPOKESPERSON FOR THE FACTORY WOULD PUT 20 21 TOGETHER A PRESENTATION THAT WE COULD, YOU KNOW, PRESENT TO THE GROUP, YOU KNOW, IF THAT'S DESIRABLE FOR THE COMMITTEE FOR 22 US TO LOOK INTO. 23

THE DEADLINE IS 17 APPROACHING JANUARY 12TH FOR COUNTIES AND JURISDICTIONS LARGE 18 ENOUGH TO APPLY TO THE TREASURY TO START THIS MONEY FUNDING. 19 THERE IS A PROVISION THAT SHOULD COUNTIES NOT MAKE THAT 20 21 DEADLINE, THEY MAY NOT RECEIVE PART OF THE 20 PERCENT, PART OF THE \$2.6 BILLION FOR THE STATE, AND KEEP IN MIND IT'S TARGETED 22 TO PEOPLE, 50 PERCENT OF AMI AND EARNING NO MORE THAN 80 23

ON THE BUSINESS PLAN, PROVIDING STRATEGY 13 GUIDANCE FOR FUTURE HOUSING FUNDING PROGRAMS ONCE CAPITAL 14 15 FUNDS ARE SECURED. YOU WILL RECALL WHEN THE PANDEMIC HIT AND 16 WE HAD TO PUT ON THE BACK BURNER EFFORTS TO PURSUE A REGIONAL HOUSING FUNDING INITIATIVE THAT WE WANTED TO TAKE TO THE 17 VOTERS. WHAT WE FRAMED UP, FAIRLY OUICKLY IS WHAT CAN WE DO IN 18 THE MEANTIME UNTIL WE'RE READY AGAIN AS A REGION TO PURSUE 19 THAT, AND THE EXPANDED REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO REALLY IS A 20 21 PLACE THAT CAPTURES THAT STRATEGY. WHAT THE BUSINESS PLAN WILL DO IS -- OH, I MENTIONED WILL PROVIDED STRATEGIC GUIDANCE 22 UNTIL THE CAPITAL FUNDINGS ARE SECURED. AND WE EXPECT TO 23 RELEASE THE RFP FOR BIDS WITHIN THIS MONTH, WHICH WOULD 24

LEVERAGE \$100,000 IN A PRIVATE DONATION TO SUPPORT THIS WORK.

- 5 IS AN ESTIMATE OF THE PDA GRANTS AVAILABLE WITH 800,000 BEING
- 6 THE MAXIMUM GRANT FOR THE PDA PLANNING GRANTS THAT'S FOR
- 7 SPECIFIC PLANS AND THE LIKE, LARGE SCALE PLANNING, AND PDA
- 8 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS UP TO 100,000. AND THOSE ARE BOTH
- 9 COMPETITIVE. AT BOTTOM, YOU SEE WE RELEASED THIS DECEMBER 18TH

- 14 HAVE THE PLANNING STAFF THAT WOULD BE NEEDED FOR A CITY OF
- 15 THAT SIZE. AND SO -- SO, I DON'T KNOW -- IT WAS JUST SOMETHING

- 23 THERESE MCMILLAN: THIS IS THERESE MCMILLAN. I WOULD LIKE TO
- 24 MENTION ANOTHER REALLY IMPORTANT, YOU KNOW, OBSERVATION,
- 25 RELATED TO MAYOR EKLUND'S QUESTION, AND THAT IS, THE PURPOSE



- 1 OF SETTING UP THE REGIONAL TA PROGRAM, THE REGIONAL REAP
- 2 FUNDED PROGRAM, WAS TO PROVIDE THE TYPE OF TECHNICAL
- 3 ASSISTANCE THAT VERY OFTEN IS MOST NEEDED BY OUR SMALLER
- 4 JURISDICTIONS, AND IN FACT, AS WE HAD DISCUSSED AT THE PRIOR
