



2 COMMENT. 3 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: FOR CONSENT CALENDAR, IS THERE ANYONE FROM 4 5 COMMITTEE OR STAFF THAT WOULD LIKE TO REMOVE ANY ITEM FROM THE CONSENT CALENDAR? I DON'T SEE ANYONE. SO THEREFORE, I WOULD 6 7 ENTERTAIN A MOTION AND A SECOND. 8 9 GINA PAPAN: MOVE APPROVAL. 10 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: MOVED. OKAY. 11 12 FEDERAL D. GLOVER: SECOND. 13 14 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: SECOND BY COMMISSIONER GLOVER. KIMBERLY MAY 15 16 WE HAVE THE ROLL FOR THE CONSENT CALENDAR? 17 CLERK OF THE BOARD: [ROLL CALL VOTE]. 18 19 CLERK OF THE BOARD: THANK YOU. THE MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY. 20 21 22 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU SO MUCH. NEXT ITEM FIVE TRANSITION 23 TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING AT BATA BRIDGES. STAFF WILL GIVE A STATUS REPORT ON THE TRANSITION TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING 24 INCLUDING INTRODUCTION INVOICES ON THE SEVEN STATE OWNED 25



- 1 BRIDGES. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ITEM. SO I WOULD LIKE TO TURN
- 2 NOW TO STAFF, WHO WILL BE PRESENTING THIS.

- 4 LYNN VALDIVIA: GREAT. THANK YOU. THIS IS LYNN VALDIVIA WITH
- 5 BATA STAFF. CAN WE GET THE SLIDES? EXCELLENT. THANK YOU SO
- 6 MUCH. SO I'M PLEASED TO BE HERE TO PROVIDE AN UPDATE ON THE
- 7 ONGOING TRANSITION OF BATA BRIDGES TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING.
- 8 YOU HAVE BEEN HEARING FREQUENTLY FROM US ON THIS TOPIC,
- 9 ESPECIALLY SINCE LAST SPRING, WHEN COVID FORCED THE REMOVAL OF
- 10 CASH TOLL COLLECTION FROM OUR BRIDGES. I KNOW THAT LAST MONTH
- 11 COMMISSIONER WORTH PROVIDED YOU AN UPDATE ON OUR RECENT
- 12 DEPLOYMENT OF INVOICES AND WHILE WE'RE STILL IN THE EARLY
- 13 STAGES, I AM HAPPY TO REPORT THAT EVERYTHING IS ON TRACK, AND
- 14 I'LL WALK THROUGH SOME OF THE SPECIFICS FROM THE PAST SEVERAL
- 15 MONTHS ACTIVITIES. THEN JEFF GERBRACHT WILL PROVIDE DETAILS ON
- 16 THE NEXT PHASE OF THE TRANSITION TO OPEN ROAD TOLLING. OKAY.
- 17 SO CAN YOU MOVE TO THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE? OKAY. SO THIS IS A
- 18 OUICK REMINDER OF WHERE WE HAVE BEEN AND WHERE WE'RE HEADING.
- 19 AS YOU ALL KNOW, BATA BRIDGES WERE ALL CASH COLLECTION UNTIL
- 20 1996 WHEN FASTRAK WAS ROLLED OUT AT THE CARQUINEZ BRIDGE.
- 21 CONVERTING TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING, IT HAS BEEN UNDER
- 22 CONSIDERATION FOR SEVERAL YEARS, AND IN LATE 2018, THIS
- 23 COMMITTEE APPROVED THE TRANSITION WITH THE FIRST BRIDGE
- 24 CONVERTING IN LATE 2022. SO WHILE STAFF WAS WORKING ON ALL THE
- 25 PLANNING, ON GETTING TO THIS CONVERSION, ALONG CAME COVID,






- 1 LAST MARCH. AND CALTRANS REMOVED THE TOLL COLLECTORS TO
- 2 PROTECT THEIR SAFETY AS WELL AS THE SAFETY OF THE TRAVELING
- 3 PUBLIC. SO BATA CONVERTED TO CASHLESS TOLLING PRETTY MUCH
- 4 OVERNIGHT WITH DRIVERS NO LONGER STOPPING TO PAY CASH BUT
- 5 INSTEAD RECEIVING A NOTICE FOR TOLL ONLY, IN THE MAIL. SINCE
- 6 THAT TIME STAFF HAS BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH CONDUENT THE
- 7 CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER CONTRACTOR TO DEPLOY A MORE ROBUST ALL
- 8 ELECTRONIC TOLLING SYSTEM USING INVOICES, BASICALLY THE SAME
- 9 AS HAS BEEN AT THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE SINCE 2013. SO THAT IS A
- 10 STEP THAT WAS ACCOMPLISHED LAST MONTH, AND THE NEXT STEP THAT
- 11 WE ARE ALL WORKING TOWARD IS OPEN ROAD TOLLING, WHICH UNDERWAY
- 12 AND WILL BE COVERED LATER IN THIS PRESENTATION BY JEFF. CAN I
- 13 HAVE THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE? OKAY. SO WHAT CHANGED IN JANUARY?
- 14 THE CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER CONTRACTOR ROLLED OUT SYSTEM
- 15 CHANGES TO REPLACE THE CASHLESS NOTICES WITH INVOICES. THE
- 16 INVOICE PROCESS IS MORE STREAMLINED AND WILL REDUCE OUTGOING
- 17 MAIL VOLUMES BY ACCUMULATING A MONTH'S WORTH OF TRANSACTIONS
- 18 ON TO EACH INVOICE. WE ALSO BEGAN PROMOTING MORE TOLL PAYMENT
- 19 OPTIONS, WHICH I'LL TALK ABOUT IN JUST A MOMENT, AND BATA
- 20 RETURNED TO THE PRECOVID PRACTICE OF ASSESSING PENALTIES FOR
- 21 UNPAID TOLLS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. A LITTLE MORE ABOUT THE
- 22 JANUARY DEPLOYMENT, IN ADDITION TO THE CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER
- 23 CHANGES THE TOLL SYSTEM AT THE BRIDGES WAS ALSO MODIFIED
- 24 INCLUDING REPORTS TO INCLUDE INVOICE PAYMENT METHOD, TOLL
- 25 PLAZA SIGNAGE AT THE APPROACHES, AND AT THE TOLL PLAZAS WAS





- 1 CHANGED TO REMOVE MESSAGING ABOUT CASH PAYMENTS AND FASTRAK
- 2 ONLY LANES. WE STILL PLAN TO INSTALL NEW PERMANENT SIGNAGE
- 3 SOMETIME IN THE SPRING, MARCH/APRIL TIME FRAME. AS FOR TOLL
- 4 COLLECTORS, CALTRANS IS MANAGING THEIR TRANSITION AND IS
- 5 LOOKING FOR OTHER OPPORTUNITIES FOR THEM WITHIN THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT. WORK IS UNDERWAY TO SECURE THE TOLL PLAZA AS.
- 7 THESE BUILDINGS WERE BUSTLING WITH ACTIVITY WITH THE TOLL
- 8 COLLECTION ACTIVITIES BUT WILL SOON BE VACATED COMPLETELY SO
- 9 WE'RE WORKING WITH CALTRANS TO SECURE THE BUILDING AND OUR
- 10 TOLL COLLECTION EQUIPMENT WITHIN THE BUILDINGS SO THAT WE'RE
- 11 ABLE TO PROVIDE NECESSARY ACCESS TO THE RIGHT FOLKS WHENEVER
- 12 NEEDED. AND THEN WE LAUNCHED AN OUTREACH CAMPAIGN PROMOTING
- 13 MORE WAYS TO PAY TOLLS, IF YOU HAVE BEEN NEAR A BRIDGE,
- 14 LATELY, SINCE MID-JANUARY, YOU MOST LIKELY HAVE SEEN THE
- 15 BILLBOARDS THAT HAVE BEEN PLACED OUT AT THE APPROACHES OR YOU
- 16 MIGHT HAVE HEARD THE RADIO SPOTS THAT WILL BE AIRING THROUGH
- 17 MID-APRIL. WE ALSO HAVE NEWSPAPER ADS, AND THE RADIO SPOTS AND
- 18 NEWSPAPER ADS ARE ALSO IN SPANISH AND CHINESE. NEXT SLIDE
- 19 PLEASE. SO A LITTLE BIT MORE ON THE WAYS TO PAY TOLLS AT OUR
- 20 BRIDGES. THERE ARE FOUR WAYS, NOW, TO PAY TOLLS AT OUR
- 21 BRIDGES. WE MATCH NOW WITH GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE. WE HAVE THE
- 22 FASTRAK, WHICH IS THE TAGGED ACCOUNTS, THESE ARE FAR AND AWAY
- 23 THE MOST POPULAR WAY OF PAYING WITH 75 PERCENT OF TOLLS BEING
- 24 PAID THIS WAY. THESE TAG ACCOUNTS ARE ALSO THE PAYMENT METHOD
- 25 NEEDED FOR THE REGIONAL EXPRESS LANES. WE ALSO HAVE A LICENSE





- 1 PLATE ACCOUNTS THAT ARE PAY AS YOU GO, AS WELL AS ONE TIME
- 2 PAYMENT ACCOUNTS, WHICH ARE BASICALLY SHORT-TERM LICENSE PLATE
- 3 ACCOUNTS TARGETED AT VISITORS AND INFREQUENT BRIDGE USERS.
- 4 BOTH OF THESE WERE INTRODUCED BACK WHEN GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE
- 5 TRANSITIONS TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING IN 2013, AND WE ARE NOW
- 6 PROMOTING THESE PAYMENT METHODS AT OUR BRIDGES AS WELL. AND
- 7 FOR ANY DRIVERS WHO DON'T HAVE A FASTRAK ACCOUNT OR A LICENSE
- 8 PLATE ACCOUNT, OR A ONE TIME PAYMENT ACCOUNT, THEY WILL
- 9 RECEIVE AN INVOICE IN THE MAIL FOR TOLL ONLY, AND AGAIN THESE
- 10 INVOICES WILL ACCUMULATE TRANSACTIONS AND BE SENT OUT ON A
- 11 MONTHLY BASIS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO THE CUSTOMER SERVICE
- 12 CENTER, DURING COVID. WORKING IN THE COVID ENVIRONMENT HAS
- 13 BEEN A CHALLENGE FOR OUR CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTER CONTRACT. ON
- 14 TOP OF MANAGING THE REGULAR WORK SUPPORTING OUR PROGRAM, THE
- 15 LEADERSHIP TEAMS ALSO HAD THE ADD RESPONSIBILITY OF CONSTANTLY
- 16 MONITORING FOR COMPLIANCE AND DEALING WITH NEW
- 17 RESPONSIBILITIES SUCH AS CONTRACT TRACING AND ENSURING THAT
- 18 THEY'RE KEEPING EMPLOYEE MORAL AND IMPLEMENTING A SET OF
- 19 SAFETY PROCEDURES TO KEEP STAFF SAFE INCLUDING SOCIAL
- 20 DISTANCING HEALTH SCREENINGS AND CLEANING UP THE FACILITIES
- 21 THEY WERE IMMEDIATELY ABLE TO SHIFT SOME SUPPORT STAFF BACK IN
- 22 MARCH TO REMOTE WORK. THESE WERE PRIMARILY IN QUALITY
- 23 ASSURANCE AND FINANCE TEAMS. CUSTOMER-FACING ROLES LIKE CALL
- 24 CENTER AGENTS TOOK A BIT LONG TORE ROLL OUT TO WORK-FROM-HOME,
- 25 DUE TO PRIVACY CONCERNS. CURRENTLY, OUR CONTRACTOR HAS ABOUT






- 1 100 STAFF OR ABOUT A QUARTER TO 30 PERCENT OF THEIR STAFF
- 2 WORKING FROM HOME, WHICH HAS BEEN VERY, VERY HELPFUL IN
- 3 ALLOWING FOR THE EXTRA SPACE FOR SOCIAL DISTANCING AT THE
- 4 LOCATIONS WHERE STAFF NEED TO WORK ON-SITE. AND LIKE MANY
- 5 OTHER BUSINESSES, THE CONTRACTOR HAS BEEN IMPACTED BY SEVERAL
- 6 THINGS, PRIMARILY HIGH ABSENTEEISM, AS WELL AS DIFFICULTIES
- 7 HIRING AND TRAINING NEW STAFF. THESE CHALLENGES ARE REFLECTED
- 8 IN SOME OF THE PERFORMANCE MEASURES, WHICH I WILL SHOW ON THE
- 9 NEXT SLIDE. PLEASE. THANK YOU. OKAY. SO AS YOU CAN SEE IN THIS
- 10 FIRST CHART IMPACTS FROM COVID SHOW UP IN LONGER WAIT TIMES
- 11 FOR CALLERS IN THE SUMMER AND IN THE FALL AS BRIDGE TRAFFIC
- 12 INCREASES, AND AT THE SAME TIME UNFORTUNATELY ABSENTEEISM
- 13 INCREASED. AVERAGE WAIT TIMES SHOT UP FROM 16 TO 20 MINUTES
- 14 WITH SOME OF THE BUSIEST TIMES OF DAY REACHING 40 MINUTE WAIT
- 15 TIMES. THE GOOD NEWS THOUGH IS THAT THROUGH INCREASES IN
- 16 STAFFING LEVELS, ESPECIALLY THE ADDITION OF EXPERIENCED CALL
- 17 CENTER STAFF COMING OFF OF ANOTHER TOLLING PROGRAM, THE CALL
- 18 WAIT TIMES HAVE DROPPED SIGNIFICANTLY TO ABOUT AVERAGE OF
- 19 SEVEN AND A HALF MINUTE IN DECEMBER, AND SIX MINUTES IN
- 20 JANUARY. SO WE STILL HAVE A WAYS TO GO, BUT THE TREND IS
- 21 DEFINITELY MOVING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION. I ALSO WANT TO NOTE
- 22 THAT THE CUSTOMER SERVICE CENTERS IS ALSO LOOKING AT WAYS TO
- 23 REDUCE SOME OF THE CALL VOLUME WITH THINGS LIKE PROMOTING THE
- 24 BENEFITS OF SIGNING UP FOR A FASTRAK ACCOUNT OR A LICENSE
- 25 PLATE ACCOUNT AND WE HAVE CALLERS ON THE PHONE, AND ALSO




- 1 EDUCATING CALLERS ON THE SELF-SERVICE FEATURES OF THE WEB
- 2 SITE. SECOND CHART ON THIS SLIDE IT SHOWS INCOMING MAIL
- 3 VOLUMES WHICH HAVE DOUBLED SINCE PRECOVID. THIS IS DUE TO
- 4 REMOVAL OF THE CASH COLLECTORS AND NOW SENDING ALL OF THE
- 5 CASHLESS NOTICES AND ALSO INVOICES. THE CONTRACTOR HAS BEEN
- 6 ADDRESSING THIS SURGE IN MAIL VOLUMES BY ADDING MORE MAIL
- 7 PROCESSING EQUIPMENT, AND A SECOND EVENING SHIFT SINCE SPACE
- 8 IS LIMITED IN THE BUILDINGS DUE TO THE SOCIAL DISTANCING, AND
- 9 THEY HAVE BEEN ABLE TO KEEP UP WITH THE PROCESSING OF THE
- 10 MAIL. THIS IS AN AREA THAT WE MONITOR VERY CLOSELY BECAUSE WE
- 11 WANT TO BE SURE THAT PAYMENTS ARE PROCESSED IN A TIMELY
- 12 MANNER. SO ALTHOUGH THIS TRANSITION TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING
- 13 WAS UNEXPECTEDLY ACCELERATED, IT'S GENERALLY GONE VERY WELL,
- 14 AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE SECOND MAJOR PHASE OF THE
- 15 TRANSITION TO OPEN ROAD TOLLING. SO, AT THIS POINT, I WILL
- 16 TURN IT OVER TO JEFF GERBRACHT WHO WILL GO MORE INTO MORE
- 17 DETAIL ABOUT THE OPEN ROAD TOLLING.
- 19 JEFF GERBRACHT: THANK YOU LYNNE. AND GOOD MORNING
- 20 COMMISSIONERS, JEFF GERBRACHT, BATA STAFF. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 21 SO, AS LYNNE SAID NOW THAT AT IS IMPLEMENTED I'LL GIVE YOU AN
- 22 UPDATE ON WHAT COULD BE NEXT FOR BATA OPEN ROAD TOLLING OR
- 23 SIMPLY ORT I'M GOING TO USE THAT ACRONYM OUITE A LOT IN THE
- 24 NEXT FEW MINUTES THIS PRESENTATION WAS DESIGNED TO EXPLAIN
- 25 WHAT IS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT ORT THE WORK THAT'S ALREADY






- 1 UNDERWAY AND THE TOLL OPERATIONS CHANGES AT THE SEVEN TOLL

- 5 SLIDE DIAGRAM. ALL TOLL BOOTHS WOULD BE REMOVED AND FOR THE
- 6 SEVEN ARE CANOPIES THEMSELVES ARE BUDGETED FOR DEMOLITION THE
- 7 SECOND CHANGE WOULD BE TO PROCURE AN OPEN ROAD TOLLING SYSTEM
- 8 WITH STATE-OF-THE-ART EQUIPMENT HIGH RESOLUTION CAMERAS WILL
- 9 BE PURCHASED TO CAPTURE OUALITY IMAGES EVEN IN HIGHER SPEED
- 10 AND LOWER LIGHT. ONE ADVERSE IS VEHICLE DETECTION WITH WIDE
- 11 OPEN ORT LANES SMART LOOPS AND OVERHEAD LASERS WOULD BE
- 12 NECESSARY TO DETECT VEHICLES COUNT AXLE AND TO CREATE
- 13 TRANSACTIONS. AND ALL OF THIS DATA WOULD BE SENT TO THE



- 14 OBSTACLES. WE DO SEE HIGHER SPEEDS TO THE TOLL PLAZAS UNDER
- 15 AET, SIMILAR TO WHAT GOLDEN GATE HAS EXPERIENCED SINCE THEY
- 16 CONVERTED TO AET BACK IN 2013. REMOVING THE TOLL BOOTHS IS THE
- 17 NUMBER ONE SAFETY CONSIDERATION AND WE ARE CERTAINLY AWARE
- 18 THAT BOOTH REMOVAL IS AN IDEA WHICH HAS BEEN CHAMPIONED BY

THAT WORK IS UNDERWAY 12 NOW AND WILL DEFINITELY INFLUENCE THE GEOMETRIC ALIGNMENT JEFF 13 14 IS TALKING ABOUT. 15 16 COM. 
