21 OFFICE AT MTC. I AM BACK BEFORE THIS MEET TO PRESENT THE FINAL
22 CALL EQUITY CONSULTANTS AND STAFF ACTIVITIES FOR
23 QUALIFICATIONS TO PREPARE FOR STEPS FOR THE PROPOSAL REVIEW
24 AND PROCESS FOR PREQUALIFIED REVIEW THE VENDORS. I WILL
25 PRESENT ALL PRIOR ACTIVITIES TO GET US TO THIS POINT. WE

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RECEIVED 30 PROPOSALS FROM PRIME FIRMS MANY OF WHOM HAVE 1 APPLIED FROM MORE THAN ONE SERVICE CATEGORY AND MANY WHO USED 2 3 A VARIETY OF SUBCONTRACTORS TO FORM PROJECT TEAMS. WE ESSENTIALLY RECEIVED 104 PROPOSALS ACROSS ALL THOSE 4 5 CATEGORIES, AND JUST TO REFRESH YOU, THOSE CATEGORIES WERE INTERNAL OPERATIONS, INVESTMENTS AND POLLS COMMUNITY AND 6 PARTNERSHIP ENGAGEMENT INNOVATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE 7 8 AND THERE WAS A CHART WITH A DETAILED BREAK DOWN OF WHICH CONSULTANTS WERE ACCEPTED INTO THEIR RESPECTIVE CATEGORIES 9 WHICH WAS PROVIDED WITH THIS MEMO. SO FIVE SEPARATE EVALUATION 10 11 PANELS COMPRISED OF MTC STAFF FROM ALL SECTIONS OF THE REVIEW PROPOSALS FOR EACH SERVICE ASK CATEGORY VAULTED IN PROPOSALS 12 BASED ON OUTLINED AS FOLLOWS EXPERIENCE OUALIFICATIONS POST 13 STAFF PRESENTATIONS AND COMPLETENESS OF THE 30 WE RECEIVED 20 14 15 WERE ACCEPTED TO THE ON-CALL EQUITY CONSULTANT BENCH. I HAVE A 16 SLIDE, THIS WAS A LIST OF THE 27 PREQUALIFIED CONSULTANT FIRMS THAT WERE ACCEPTED ON TO THE BENCH. THESE FIRMS COMPRISE A MIX 17 18 OF DBE CERTIFIED FIRMS LOCATED THROUGHOUT THE REGION AND THE FIRMS SELECTED HAVE A DIVERSE RANGE OF COMPETENCIES SKILL 19 SETS, DEMOGRAPHICS AND LIVED EXPERIENCES AND POSSESS 20 21 PORTFOLIOS OF PROJECTS THAT ADVANCE EQUITY. SO I HAVE 22 MENTIONED PREVIOUSLY, THE COOPERATIVE LANGUAGE IN THE RFQ 23 WHICH WILL ALLOW OTHER PUBLIC ENTITY TO UTILIZE THE FIRM'S LISTED HERE ON THE EQUITY BENCH FOR THEIR OWN EQUITY PROGRAMS 24 AND PROGRAMS IF THEIR CONSULTANT ALLOWS THEM TO DO SO AND I 25

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HAVE PUT TOGETHER A CONSULTANT CATALOG THAT WILL HIGHLIGHT THE 1 PROJECTS AND SKILLS FOR PROJECTS THAT HAVE BEEN PREQUALIFIED 2 IT WILL MAKE IT EASIER TO USE THIS AS A RESOURCE THAT FINAL 3 DOCUMENT WILL BE AVAILABLE AND UPLOADED ON OUR WEB SITE WITHIN 4 5 THE NEXT COUPLE OF WEEKS WHICH SHOULD BE PRETTY EASY FOR EVERYONE TO ACCESS. NALUNGO CONLEY: WELL I WOULD SAY IT'S PROBABLY PRETTY LIKELY. 4 5 I ALONG WITH SOME OF MY EOUITY PARTNERS AT MTC, WOULD SAY THERE HAS BEEN ENORMOUS INTEREST FROM BOTH MTC AS WELL AS 6 THROUGHOUT THE REGION. I HAVE TALKED TO A NUMBER OF 7 8 TRANSPORTATION AGENCIES BOTH IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA AND OUTSIDE THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA BECAUSE OUR DIRECTOR HAS 9 SHARED THIS INFORMATION SORT OF WITH THE MEGA REGION AND ALSO 10 SHE HAS SORT OF LIKE AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NETWORK AND FOLKS 11 HAVE JUST EXPRESSED INTEREST BECAUSE APPARENTLY MTC IS LEADING 12 IN THIS AREA, AND SO THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF INTEREST. PART 13 OF THE REASON OF PUTTING TOGETHER THE CATALOG IS ALSO, YOU 14 15 KNOW, YOU MAY RECOGNIZE A LOT OF THESE FIRMS BUT WE HAVE A LOT 16 OF FOLKS AT MTC WHO MAY NOT BE SO FAMILIAR SO I THINK GETTING A SNAPSHOT OF THE KIND OF WORK THAT FOLKS DO WILL MAKE IT A 17 LOT EASIER FOR OUR TRANSIT AGENCY PARTNERS AS WELL AS COUNTY, 18 IT'S OPEN TO ALL FOLKS IN OUR REGION, ALL NINE COUNTIES, 101 19 CITIES WHOEVER ALLOWS THAT TYPE OF CONTRACTS AND I THINK WE 20 WILL FIND THAT WE'LL PROBABLY HAVE TO GO OUT TO GET MORE 21 22 CONSULTANTS ON THE BENCH PROBABLY SOONER THAN LATER TO GET 23 INTEREST. AS YOU SEE RIGHT NOW WE HAVE 27 FIRMS. WE HAVE A NUMBER OF SUBCONSULTANTS BUT WITH THE WAY OUR CONTRACTING 24 WORKS WE CAN ONLY CONTRACT WITH THE PRIME. BUT I THINK IT'S 25

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PRETTY LIKELY THAT FOLKS WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE 1 ENGAGED OFF OF THIS BENCH, JUST BECAUSE EQUITY IS ALSO, SORT 2 3 OF THE FOCUS FOR A NUMBER OF DIFFERENT INITIATIVES THAT ARE HAPPENING IN OUR AGENCY RIGHT NOW SO AS I AM SURE YOU ARE 4 5 AWARE, THE BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE, BATA RECOVERY, THERE IS JUST A NUMBER OF OPPORTUNITIES TO ENGAGE 6 AND THIS IS A GREAT STARTING POINT FOR A LOT OF FOLKS WHO MAY 7 8 NOT KNOW EXACTLY HOW DO THAT 9 WALTER WILSON: IT'S A GREAT STARTING POINT THIS IS A GREAT 10 RESOURCE TO HAVE IN ONE PLACE. YOU GUYS HAVE DONE A GREAT JOB 11 OF IT THANK YOU SO MUCH. 12 13 NALUNGO CONLEY: THANK YOU. 14 15 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: FRANK WELTE. 16 17 SPEAKER: I WENT THROUGH THE LIST AND DIDN'T RECOGNIZE A SINGLE 18 NAME ON THERE. AND I'M WONDERING IF ANY OF THOSE FIRMS HAVE 19 ANY SPECIFIC EXPERTISE IN ISSUES OF EOUITY AS IT CONCERNS 20 21 PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES SPECIFICALLY PEOPLE WHO ARE TRANSIT 22 RIDERS WITH DISABILITIES. 23 NALUNGO CONLEY: SO THE PRIME FIRMS FOR WHAT WE ASKED THEM OF 24

25 THE FIVE CATEGORIES THAT THEY APPLIED FOR, THEY HAVE PUT

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TOGETHER A NUMBER OF CONSULTANT TEAMS, SO WHILE IT SEEMS LIKE 1 THE PRIMES MAY NOT HAVE THE MOST EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE IN THAT 2 3 PARTICULAR SPACE, THERE ARE A NUMBER OF SUBCONSULTANTS THAT THEY IDENTIFY TO HELP THEM WITH A BROAD RANGE, I GUESS, OF 4 5 EQUITY FOCUS. I CAN'T RECALL, UNFORTUNATELY, OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD, THE SPECIFIC FIRM. I DO KNOW THAT THERE WERE SEVERAL 6 SUBCONSULTANT FIRMS AND I BELIEVE THEY WERE IN THE COMMUNITY 7 8 PARTNERSHIP ENGAGEMENT AND INNOVATION CATEGORIES THAT DID SPECIFICALLY ADDRESS THOSE WITH DISABILITIES AND HAD WORKED 9 PREVIOUSLY ON PROJECTS THAT HAD AN EOUITY FOCUS. I CAN GET 10 BACK TO YOU ON THAT AND PROVIDE YOU WITH THAT INFORMATION. 11

15 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: TERRY SCOTT, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GO NEXT?

TERRY SCOTT: THANK YOU. TERRY SCOTT. NAPA SENIORS. MY QUESTION RELATES TO, OF THE FIRMS, HOW MANY HUMAN RESOURCES FIRMS DO WE HAVE? AND AMONGST THEM, ARE THERE ANY PLACEMENT AGENCIES THAT DO EXECUTIVE SEARCH OR A SPECIFIC SEARCH?

NALUNGO CONLEY: ON THE EQUITY BENCH, WE HAVE, I BELIEVE THERE
IS ONE SORT OF IDENTIFIED EXECUTIVE SEARCH, HR FOCUSED,
CONSULTANT, CPS STAFFING. BUT, GENERALLY THAT WAS NOT THE



FOCUS. THEY HAD EXPERIENCE, SORT OF, IN BRINGING IN THAT LENS
 IN THE INTERNAL OPERATIONS CATEGORY BUT THAT WAS THE ONLY FIRM
 THEY CAN THINK OF OFF THE TOP OF HEAD THAT WAS SORT OF AN
 EXECUTIVE RESEARCH FIRM.

TERRY SCOTT: IN THE PAST MEETINGS WE HAVE HAD THE, THE PACT 6 COUNCIL HAS HAD A NUMBER OF DISCUSSIONS ABOUT THE NEED FOR A 7 8 NETWORK MANAGER. AND I WAS KIND OF SURPRISED AND A LITTLE DISAPPOINTED TO KNOW THAT THERE WAS DEFINED JOB DESCRIPTION 9 FOR THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THAT NETWORK MANAGER. AND THAT 10 WOULD COME FROM NORMALLY A PLACEMENT OR HR FIRM. WELL, IF WE 11 HAVE ANY OF THOSE ON THE BENCH, HAS THERE BEEN ANY EFFORT OR 12 DISCUSSION TO ENGAGE THEM IN DEVELOPING A JOB DESCRIPTION SO 13 THAT WE CAN GO AHEAD AND DO A SEARCH FOR CANDIDATES THAT WOULD 14 15 FILL THAT POSITION? A MONTH OR SO AGO, WE WERE TOLD, IN THE 16 PAC COUNCIL MEETING THAT THEY HAD HOPED TO FILL THIS JOB BY THE END OF APRIL. AND I WAS THINKING, YOU DON'T HAVE A JOB 17 DESCRIPTION YET, AND YOU'RE NOT CONTRACTED WITH AN HR OR 18 PLACEMENT FIRM, HOW IN THE WORLD ARE YOU GOING TO BE ABLE DO 19 THAT? AND OBVIOUSLY THEY COULDN'T. IT SEEMS TO ME THAT'S A 20 HIGH URGENCY MATTER. AND I -- AS A FORMER HR GUIDE, I AM GOING 21 TO BE TALKING WITH CHAIR PEDROZA LATER THIS WEEK, AND ONE OF 22 THE THINGS I'M GOING TO ADVISE HIM IS THAT, IF WE EVER WANT TO 23 FILL THIS POSITION, AND HAVE IT BE OF CRITICAL INPUT AND 24

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ASSISTANCE IN WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO, THEN WE NEED TO GET
 STARTED, AND SOONER RATHER THAN LATER.

NALUNGO CONLEY: SO, AS FAR AS THE NETWORK MANAGER GOES, THAT'S 4 5 ACTUALLY, I THINK A LARGER DISCUSSION, AND NOT ONE THAT I'M PREPARED TO TAKE ON RIGHT NOW, BECAUSE THIS IS FOR THE ON-CALL 6 EQUITY BENCH. THE FIRM THAT I MENTIONED, CPS CONSULTING, COULD 7 8 BE HELPFUL IN TERMS OF DOING THAT RECRUITMENT WHEN, I THINK, YOU KNOW, THE AGENCY HAS GOTTEN TO THAT POINT IN TERMS OF 9 HIRING SOMEONE IF THAT IS THE DECISION AND DIRECTION THAT THE 10 AGENCY CHOOSES TO GO IN TERMS OF THE NETWORK MANAGER. BUT YOU 11 KNOW, THAT PARTICULAR ROLE, I MEAN THAT'S SOMETHING THAT'S 12 GOING TO HAVE TO BE DISCUSSED AND AGREED UPON BETWEEN ALL THE 13 TRANSIT AGENCIES AS WELL AS THE BOARD AND -- OR RATHER, THE 14 COMMISSION. YOU KNOW, THERE IS A WAY TO UTILIZE THIS BENCH TO 15 16 HELP WITH THOSE ACTIVITIES BUT SPECIFICALLY THIS BENCH WASN'T ESTABLISHED TO ACTUALLY HELP IN THAT PARTICULAR AREA. 17

19 TERRY SCOTT: RIGHT. AGAIN, MY CONCERN IS, THERE ARE A LOT OF 20 PRELIMINARY STEPS THAT NEED TO TAKE PLACE IN ORDER TO PROPERLY 21 DEFINE THE POSITION AS TO WHAT MTC WANTED TO DO, AND THEN TO 22 CREATE A JOB DESCRIPTION THAT WILL DETAIL EXACTLY THE 23 RESPONSIBILITIES, AND FROM THAT WILL COME THE QUALIFICATIONS 24 OF POTENTIAL CANDIDATES. AND MY POINT IS THAT NONE OF THAT'S 25 BEEN DONE. NONE OF IT WHY ARE WE TALKING ABOUT A NETWORK

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1 MANAGER WHEN NONE OF THE BASIC STEPS TO IDENTIFY

2 RESPONSIBILITIES, WRITE A JOB DESCRIPTION, OR SEEK CANDIDATES3 HAS NOT EVEN STARTED.

4

5 MARTI PASCHAL: EXCUSE ME. THIS IS MARTI PASCHAL, STAFF TO THE 6 COUNCIL IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THE POINT OF CLARIFICATION 7 IS THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT NETWORK MANAGEMENT NOT NETWORK 8 MANAGER, AND I COULD HAVE THERESE GO INTO THIS IS GREATER 9 DETAIL AT THE NEXT MEETING TO CLARIFY WE TALKING ABOUT ONE 10 PERSON ONE JOB DESCRIPTION BUT THE MANAGEMENT ITSELF AS 11 OPPOSED TO MANAGER. THANK YOU.

13 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: ANY OTHER QUESTIONS?

14

15 NALUNGO CONLEY: WERE THERE ANY OTHER QUESTIONS ABOUT THE 16 BENCH?

17

18 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: YES WE DO. MICHAEL LOPEZ.

19

20 MICHAEL LOPEZ: MICHAEL LOPEZ SANTA CLARA COUNTY, I REPRESENT 21 THE SENIORS. I HAVE A QUESTIONS ABOUT THE LENGTH OF THE -- HOW 22 LONG THE LIST GOES FOR. IT SAYS THAT IT GOES FROM JUNE THROUGH 23 2025 WITH AN OPTION TO EXTEND FOR AN ADDITIONAL TWO YEARS IT 24 LOOKS LIKE IT TOOK A LOT OF WORK TO ENSURE TO MAKE THIS LIST 25 AND I'M WONDERING WHAT IT TAKES TO EXTEND IT.

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NALUNGO CONLEY: WE PROBABLY HAVE TO REISSUE THE CONTRACT 2 3 GUIDELINES I THINK THE STANDARD IS THREE YEARS WITH A POSSIBLE TWO YEAR EXTENSION. WE CAN ADD ON A NEW CATEGORY THAT'S 4 5 SOMETHING WE CAN DO BEFORE THE ENDING OF THIS BENCH AND ALSO OPEN IT UP TO ACCEPT NEW CONSULTANTS ON TO THE BENCH. I'M 6 HOPING THAT BY 2027, 5 PLUS YEARS FROM NOW THAT WE WILL HAVE 7 8 LESSONED LEARNED HOW THIS WORKED AND KNOW HOW EFFICIENT IT WAS AND EITHER GO BACK TO DUPLICATE IT OR CHANGE IT OR REVAMP THE 9 ENTIRE PROCESS. I DON'T KNOW BEYOND FIVE YEARS, IT WAS A LOT 10 11 OF EFFORT BUT I DON'T KNOW IF WE WANT TO JUST EXTEND IT OR HAVE THE OPTION OF ACTUALLY DOING SOMETHING DIFFERENT AT THIS 12 POINT. BUT AT LEAST WE HAVE THE TERM LAT. 13 14

15 MICHAEL LOPEZ: THE TERMINATION DATE, IS THAT THE TERMINATION 16 DATE THAT YOU WILL NO LONGER USE THE LIST BUT THE WORK THAT 17 IT'S CONTRACTED FOR CAN CONTINUE.

18

19 NALUNGO CONLEY: ABSOLUTELY. THIS IS FOR THE PREQUALIFIED LIST.
20 AS IT STANDS IF WE NEVER OPEN IT UP TO ADD ANYONE THOSE
21 INDIVIDUALS ON THE LIST WILL BE THE ONES THAT ARE ON THE BENCH
22 UNTIL 2027.

24 MICHAEL LOPEZ: THANK YOU.

6	ON THE REPORT FOR THOSE ARE USING IT FOR THE NEXT CYCLE

9	NALUNGO CONLEY: THAT IS MY UNDERSTANDING BUT THAT'S ACTUALLY
10	THE ITEM AFTER MINE.

12	RICHARD HEDGES: OKAY.
13	
14	NALUNGO CONLEY: YOU WILL BE RECEIVING A PRESENTATION ON THAT.
15	
16	RICHARD HEDGES: YEAH. I SAW THE PRESENTATION. THANK YOU. SORRY
17	TO DISTURB YOU.
18	
19	NALUNGO CONLEY: NO PROBLEM.
20	
21	VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: AND WALTER WILSON.
22	
23	WALTER WILSON: THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. SO IS IT YOU KNOW,
24	THE I THINK AND I'M NOT SURE IF YOU HAVE HAD ALREADY
25	BUILT IN TO THE PROCESS BUT 2027 IS A LONG TIME, 2025 IS A

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LONG TIME. AND I AM THINKING THERE MUST BE SOME OPPORTUNITIES 1 TO EVALUATE ALONG THE WAY IN TERMS OF SUCCESSES AND 2 3 IMPROVEMENTS AND/OR EVEN FAIL YOUR IN SOME CASES SO YOU DON'T HAVE TO WAIT FOUR OR FIVE YEARS TO SEE THAT. I AM ASSUMING 4 5 THERE MUST BE SOME MECHANISM TO DO SOME PERIODIC ASSESSMENTS OF THE PROGRAM AND WHAT IT'S BEING DONE AND IF IT'S NOT THEN I 6 STRONGLY RECOMMEND YOU DO THAT. IT WILL GIVE YOU OPPORTUNITY 7 8 TO CHANGE ON THE FLY IF YOU NEED TO. AND THE OTHER QUESTION I HAVE IS MANAGER VERSUS MANAGEMENT, I DON'T KNOW WHAT I MISSED 9 THERE. BUT IF SOMEBODY COULD CLARIFY. I THINK MARTI SAID THERE 10 IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO AND I'M NOT SURE IF I GOT LOST 11 IN THE CONVERSATION. 12

MARTI PASCHAL: MARTI PASCHAL STAFF TO THE COUNCIL BECAUSE THIS IS NOT THE AGENDA ITEM I WOULD RATHER NOT GO INTO MORE DETAIL BUT I WILL WRITE THERESA ROMMEL AND ASK HER TO EXPLAIN AT THE NEXT COUNCIL MEETING. AGAIN WE'RE MOVING OFF TOPIC BY, AGAIN, GOING DOWN THAT PATH.

20 WALTER WILSON: I DIDN'T KNOW IT WAS OFF TOPIC. WHEN I HEARD
21 SOMEBODY MENTION IT I THOUGHT IT WAS PART OF THIS
22 CONVERSATION. THANK YOU. I APPRECIATE T.

24 MARTI PASCHAL: YOU'RE WELCOME.

NALUNGO CONLEY: WE'RE WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE CONTRACT 1 DEPARTMENT IN TERMS OF DOING AN ASSESSMENT AND ONE OF THE 2 3 THINGS I WANT TO MAKE SURE WE'RE TRACK SUGGEST DBE AND SBE FIRMS OFF THIS LIST AS WELL AS THE SUBCONSULTANT TO COMPRISE A 4 5 LOT TEAMS THAT THE PRIMES HAVE INDICATED. BUT WE'RE ALSO GOING TO BE CHECKING IN WITH MTC STAFF AS WELL AS OTHERS WHO UTILIZE 6 THIS BENCH TO REALLY CHART HOW IT'S BEING USED, WHICH CATEGORY 7 8 IS ACTUALLY BEING ENGAGED THAN ANY OTHER OR IF THEY'RE ALL BEING ENGAGED AT THE SAME SORT OF FREOUENCY AND SEEING THE 9 SAME DOLLAR AMOUNT THAT'S GOING THROUGH THE BENCH, FREQUENCY 10 OF USE, YOU KNOW, WHAT TYPE OF PROJECTS ARE BEING SORT OF 11 FLOWING THROUGH THIS BENCH. AND WE WOULD BE HAPPY TO BRING 12 THAT INFORMATION BACK. BECAUSE WE HAVE THIS BENCH, WE HAVE 13 THIS RESOURCE, AND NOW, WHAT DOES SUCCESS LOOK LIKE, SO KIND 14 15 OF HAVE TO HAVE THAT BASELINE AND SORT OF START TO TRACK SOME 16 OF THESE METRICS OVER TIME. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT TIME FRAME WILL BE, SINCE IT'S SORT OF AT THE BEGINNING. BUT WE CAN SEE 17 18 WHERE WE ARE IN SIX MONTHS TO SEE IF WE HAVE ANYTHING REPORTABLE AND THEN MAYBE WE MIGHT JUST DO IT ANNUALLY AFTER 19 THAT. BUT I PROMISE YOU WE ARE TRACKING -- WE WILL BE TRACKING 20 21 THINGS OFF THIS BENCH AND WE'LL BE VERY HAPPY TO COME BACK TO 22 YOU.

RAHMON MOMOH. 6 RAHMON MOMOH: THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE PRESENTATION. JUST 7 8 LIKE FRANK, I DO NOT RECOGNIZE ANY. ARE THERE ANY CONSULTANTS LOCATED IN THE EAST BAY? 9 10 NALUNGO CONLEY: I BELIEVE THAT ALL THREE OF OUR COUNTIES ARE 11 REPRESENTED BY INDIVIDUALS ON THIS BENCH. THAT'S ACTUALLY 12 SOMETHING THAT WE'RE GOING TO BE TAKING A CLOSER LOOK AT, SORT 13 OF IN THE SHORT-TERM, IS HOW TO ENSURE REPRESENTATION ACROSS 14 15 ALL OF OUR NINE COUNTIES. BECAUSE THIS'S IMPORTANT, AS WELL, 16 EQUITY LOOKS DIFFERENT DEPENDING ON WHERE YOU LAND WE BELIEVE THAT REPRESENTATION IS REALLY IMPORTANT BECAUSE FOLKS WILL BE 17 THEIR COMMUNITIES AND THE CONCERNS. I SEE KY-NAM HERE ON OUR 18 GRID, WE WERE TALKING ABOUT THAT JUST THE OTHER DAY WE WILL 19 TALK ABOUT STRATEGIES MAYBE NEXT GO AROUND WHEN WE SETUP THE 20 21 BENCH SOONER RATHER THAN LATER TO TARGET THOSE AREAS THAT WE DON'T NECESSARILY SEE ON THIS LIST OR AS ROBUSTLY REPRESENTED 22 ON THIS LIST AS WE WOULD LIKE, JUST SO WE HAVE THAT DIVERSITY. 23 24

25 RAHMON MOMOH: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THANK YOU.

2 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I'LL GO AHEAD WITH MY QUESTIONS 3 NOW, I WAS THINKING ALONG THE SAME LINES AS RAHMON. IT WOULD BE GREAT TO SEE THE BREAK DOWN OF THOSE WITH ORGANIZATIONS 4 5 THAT REPRESENT THE DISABLED, HOW MANY WOMEN RUN ORGANIZATIONS ARE THERE, LATINO ORGANIZATIONS, AND THE LIKE. SO NEXT TIME 6 YOU COME BACK I'M HOPING YOU CAN BRING THOSE NUMBERS TO US AT 7 8 OUR NEXT GO AHEAD. IT'S JUST YOU LAST PRESENTED TO THE EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE, I HAVE BEEN PROMOTING THE OPPORTUNITY 9 10 QUITE A BIT, AND I'M WONDERING IF WE HAVE HAD ANY NEW ORGANIZATIONS ON THE BENCH SINCE WE HAVE -- SINCE YOU LAST 11 CAME TO VISIT US? 12

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NALUNGO CONLEY: ACTUALLY, WHEN I CAME TO YOU IN JANUARY, I 14 15 BELIEVE WE HAD JUST HAD OUR BIDDERS CONFERENCE AND SO IT WAS 16 SORT OF AT THE INFORMATION STAGE, AND WE WERE JUST ABOUT TO OPEN IT UP TO THE RFQ PROCESS. SO AT THE TIME WE DIDN'T 17 ACTUALLY HAVE ANYONE ON THE BENCH BECAUSE WE WERE GOING 18 THROUGH THE PROCESS OF ACCEPTING PROPOSALS, AND SO I KNOW THAT 19 A LOT OF FOLKS WHO CAME TO THE BIDDERS CONFERENCE HAD HEARD 20 21 ABOUT IT THROUGH PROMOTIONS FROM THIS GROUP AND OTHERS, AND IT'S ACTUALLY -- OUR BIDDERS CONFERENCE FELL ON JANUARY 6TH, 22 WHICH YOU MAY ALL KNOW WAS ANOTHER SORT OF INFAMOUS DATE, SO 23 WE ENDED UP EXTENDING THE DUE DATE BY TWO WEEKS JUST TO ALLOW 24 FOLKS TIME -- ADDITIONAL TIME TO APPLY. SO THE FOLKS WE HAVE 25

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ON THIS BENCH ARE THE ONES THAT WERE APPROVED THROUGH ADMIN 1 2 COMMITTEE IN MARCH. WE ACTUALLY HAD TO DO A LITTLE BIT OF A 3 CORRECTION IN APRIL, AND SO NOW IT'S FINALIZED. SO THESE ARE THE FOLKS WHO HAVE MADE IT. THESE 27, AND WE MAY FIND, AS I 4 5 MENTIONED BEFORE, THAT WE HAVE TO OPEN IT UP AGAIN AND ADD ADDITIONAL PEOPLE ON, BUT WHEN WE GET TO THAT POINT, WE'LL BE 6 SURE TO COME BACK AND LET YOU KNOW, SORT OF WHAT PRECIPITATED 7 8 THAT ACTION. TO YOUR FIRST POINT INCLUDED IN THE MEMORIAL OFFICE A BREAK DOWN OF THOSE FIRMS THAT OUALIFY FOR DBE, SBE, 9 WE CURRENTLY DON'T V I THINK, THE BREAK DOWN THAT GOES A 10 LITTLE BIT FURTHER IN TERMS OF MINORITY OWNED OR WOMEN OWNED 11 OR DISABILITY OWNED, SIMPLY BECAUSE OUR SYSTEM -- YOU KNOW, I 12 THINK MICHAEL BRINTON CAME TO YOU AND DID A PRESENTATION ABOUT 13 INCREASING OR MODIFYING OUR SBE PROGRAM AT THE AGENCY WHICH 14 15 WOULD ALLOW TERMS IF THEY HAVE BEEN CERTIFIED IF THEY'RE IN A 16 SEARCHABLE DATABASE TO OUALIFY AS AN SBE FIRM WHEN THEY'RE APPLYING FOR THESE TYPES OF CONTRACTS OR RFQS AND SO CURRENTLY 17 WE JUST HAVE THE BREAK DOWN IF THEY'RE DBE OR SBE. I DON'T 18 KNOW IF WE'RE OUITE DOWN TO THE NUANCE SPECIFICALLY OF THAT 19 STEP DOWN CATEGORY BUT I CAN WORK WITH MICHAEL AND HIS TEAM 20 21 AND CONTACTS TO SEE IF THAT'S INFORMATION THAT WE CAN GATHER SINCE THEY WILL BE REGISTERED IN OUR SYSTEM AS VENDORS GOING 22 FORWARD. AND AS I SAID, I PROMISED MR. WELTE, I WILL IDENTIFY 23 THOSE WHO SPECIFICALLY HAVE A DISABILITY EQUITY LENS AND GET 24 BACK TO YOU WITH THAT INFORMATION. 25

[INDISCERNIBLE] [AUDIO DIFFICULTIES] BENCH ORGANIZATIONS OR CONTRACTED ORGANIZATIONS, SPECIFICALLY ON THE 4 5 WEB SITE SO THAT PEOPLE CAN SEE OF THE GREAT WORK THAT WE ARE DOING HERE AT MTC. SO, IF THERE IS NO -- [AUDIO DIFFICULTIES] 6 7 8 CLERK OF THE BOARD: SHE GLITCHED OUT AGAIN. I THINK SHE WAS GOING TO SEE IF THERE ARE NO FURTHER COMMENTS OR OUESTIONS ON 9 THIS ITEM. THANK YOU. WE'RE GOING TO MOVE ON TO OUR NEXT ITEM. 10 DID SHE BECOME UNGLUED? 11 12 NALUNGO CONLEY: NOT YET. 13 14 CLERK OF THE BOARD: SHE IS CAUGHT INSIDE THE MATRIX. COLLEGE MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS NO LONGER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM BUT A 1 TRUE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM WE'RE ALSO GOING TO TALK ABOUT THE BAY 2 3 AREA SUMMER ACADEMY FOR HIGH SCHOOL AND ALL THAT. THE PILOT CLASS THAT WE'RE GOING TO HAVE THIS SUMMER WAS TARGETING 5 TO 4 5 10, MENTES, WE WILL HAVE SIX THIS SUMMER. OBVIOUSLY I WOULD LIKE TO GROW THAT IN THE COMING YEARS. FOR THIS PILOT PROGRAM 6 GIVEN THAT WE WILL BE REMOTE SIX IS THE NUMBER WE'LL HAVE THIS 7 8 SUMMER STARTING ON JUNE 14TH. THE TARGET STUDENTS WILL BE 10 FROM HISTORICALLY UNDERREPRESENTED AND UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES 11 WORKING WITH ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS CANTO AND BASED ON YOUR 12 SUGGESTIONS CHAPEL COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND MARIN STATE COLLEGES 13 AND SAN JOSE STATE I'LL BE RUNNING CURRICULUM IN JUNE FOR 14 ANYONE THAT'S BECOMING A MENTOR TO GO OVER THE CURRICULUM AND 15 16 I'LL BE PROVIDING A MENTEE CAREER WRITING WORKSHOP FOR THEIR EIGHT WEEKS WITH US AND ALSO BE GUIDING TO THE REGIONAL 17 GOVERNMENT SEMINARS. OUESTIONS BEFORE WE GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE? 18 OKAY. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. KY-NAM DO YOU WANT TO GIVE THE 19 UPDATE ON THIS PART? 20

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SERVING. JOHN AND I HAVE BEEN COLLABORATING WITH MEMBERS OF 1 THE YOUTH GROUP WHAT'S KNOWN AS THE BAY AREA SUMMER ACADEMY, 2 3 THAT GROUP INCLUDES POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS CYNTHIA MURRAY AND KRISTINE GOTUACO, DEVELOPING THE BRIDGE BACK TO THE 4 5 ENHANCED HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAM WHEN WE CAN BE IN PLACE BY NEXT SUMMER WITH REAL LIFE INTERNSHIP BUT THIS SUMMER IT'S A 6 PILOT PROGRAM AND ITS FOCUS IS ON CENTERING EOUITY AND SERVICE 7 8 TO UNDERREPRESENTED YOUTH. THE AIM OF THE PILOT IS TO PROVIDE A SAFE AND BENEFICIAL SEMINAR SERIES THAT CAN FUNCTION AS A 9 LEARNING MODULE AND THE IDEA IS IT EVENTUALLY INTEGRATES THE 10 SEMINAR SERIES INTO THE REGULAR INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE WHEN IT 11 RETURNS NEXT SUMMER AS A BOOK END TO THAT EXPERIENCE. THE 12 PROGRAM'S DESIGNED TO PROVIDE AN ON-BOARD EXPERIENCE REGIONAL 13 GOVERNMENT 101 INTRODUCTION TO BAY AREA REGIONAL GOVERNMENT, 14 15 FUNCTIONS, PURPOSE, AND CRUCIALLY THE IMPACT AT THE 16 NEIGHBORHOOD LEVEL. THE FOUR PARTNER AGENCIES ARE MTC AND ABAG ALONG WITH THE BAY AREA AIR OUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT AND 17 THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION. 18 ALL THE REGIONAL AGENCIES ARE HEADOUARTERED AT 375 BEALE WE'RE 19 GOING TO PRESENT THE RESPECTIVE WORK AS WELL AS DEEP DIVES 20 INTO INTERESTING TOPIC AREAS LIKE HOW THE BAY AREA IS PLANNING 21 TO ADAPT TO SEA LEVEL RISE WHERE RESIDENTS WILL LIVE AND HOW 22 TO GET AROUND IN 2050 WHEN ASSUMING MORE PEOPLE WILL BE LIVING 23 IN THE NINE COUNTIES HOW STUDENTS CAN INFLUENCE DECISIONS 24 IMPACTING THE AIR THEY BREATHE AND COASTLINE NATURAL RESOURCES 25

AND PATHWAYS TO DIFFERENT TYPES OF JOBS FOUND IN THE BAY AREA 1 PUBLIC AGENCIES. STUDENTS WILL FINISH OFF THE SUMMER ACADEMY 2 3 WITH A PRESENTATION BASED ON ONE OF THE DEEP-DIVE ISSUES COVERED AND DELIVERED OVER A VARIETY OF PLATFORMS INCLUDING 4 5 SHORT VIDEOS, ONLINE PETITIONS, LETTERS TO THE EDITOR, POETRY RECITATION, PROFESSIONAL POWERPOINT PRESENTATIONS, AND A 6 PANOPLY OF PLATFORMS. STUDENTS ARE GOING TO RECEIVE A 7 8 CERTIFICATE UPON COMPLETION AND OUR COLLEAGUES AT THE AIR DISTRICT ARE FIGURING OUT A WAY TO PROVIDE SOME AMOUNT OF 9 10 COMPENSATION FOR THEIR TIME. AND OUR TARGET, WHEN WE SETUP TO DO THIS WAS TO GET A 25 TO 35 STUDENTS FROM ALL NINE COUNTIES. 11 AS OF TODAY, WE HAVE 27 APPLICANTS IN FROM SEVEN OUT OF THE 12 NINE COUNTIES, WE'RE STILL LOOKING FOR APPLICANTS FROM SONOMA 13 AND NAPA COUNTIES. SO WE EXTENDED THE DEADLINE ONE LAST TIME 14 UNTIL SUNDAY MAY 9TH. AND FOR OUR COLLEAGUES WHO HAVE CONTACTS 15 16 IN THOSE TWO COUNTIES, SONOMA AND NAPA, WE WOULD APPRECIATE 17 YOU SPREADING THE WORD. BUT EVERYONE, WE APPRECIATE THE PARTICIPATION. 18

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JOHN KANNEGIESER: IMPORTANT UPDATES FOR THE COLLEGE PROGRAM,
WE'RE POSTING THE POSITIONS ON WEDNESDAY, THIS WEDNESDAY,
CINCO DE MAYO, AND THE GOAL WILL BE TO HAVE THE MENTES HIRED,
ASSIGNED, WITH THEIR MENTOR BY MAY 28TH. IT'S A RELATIVELY
QUICK PROCESS. THE POST DATE WILL ONLY BE A WEEK AND A HALF OF
POST DATE TIME. WE KNOW WE WILL GET A LOT OF INTEREST AND WE

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ONLY HAVE SIX SLOTS. WE DON'T WANT TO HAVE A PLETHORA OF 1 CANDIDATES GIVEN WE ONLY HAVE SIX SLOTS. WE ARE WORKING 2 3 EXTENSIVELY WITH STUDENTS FROM RISING ABOVE, AND HOPING FOR THE UNDERPRIVILEGED COMMUNITIES THEREFORE THAT'S WHY WE'RE 4 5 HAVING A RELATIVELY SHORT PROCESS. THE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM WILL BEGIN JUNE 14TH AND COMMENCE ON AUGUST 13TH AND AFTER THAT 6 WE'LL BE DOING ASSESSMENT OF HOW THE FIRST MENTORSHIP PROGRAM 7 8 WORKED WITH SURVEYS WITH THE MENTES AND TALK ABOUT FUTURE PLANNING HOW WE WANT TO ROLL IT OUT NEXT YEAR WITH HOPEFULLY 9 MORE MEMBERS ON BOARD AND FUTURE OTHER TYPES OF PROGRAMS LIKE 10 REGULAR INTERNSHIPS AND ENHANCED MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS. KY-NAM 11 DO YOU WANT TO TALK ABOUT THE HIGH SCHOOL NEXT STEPS. 12

14 KY-NAM MILLER: IN AUGUST WE'LL SEE HOW SUCCESSFUL IT'S BEEN 15 WE'RE GOING TO SURVEY THE STUDENTS WHAT WORKED AND WHAT COULD 16 BE IMPROVED FOR THEM. AND PROJECT OUT FOR THE NEXT STEP WHAT 17 WE WILL NEED TO SUCCESSFULLY RELAUNCH THE FULL BORE INTERNSHIP 18 PROGRAM HOPEFULLY WE'LL HAVE A SENSE OF WHAT'S BEEN APPROVED 19 BY MTC AT THE START OF THE BUDGETARY COMMITMENT TO MAKE THIS 20 HAPPEN AGAIN.

22 JOHN KANNEGIESER: NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. QUESTIONS FOR EITHER KY-23 NAM OR MYSELF?

24

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VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: I'M NOT SEEING ANY HANDS RIGHT NOW BUT 1 I'LL START WITH MY QUESTIONS. THIS IS A VERY WELL THOUGHT 2 3 THROUGH PROGRAM. IT'S SO WONDERFUL. AND I'M WONDERING IF YOU ARE STILL TAKING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS OTHER THAN FROM THE TWO 4 5 DESIGNATED NECESSARY COUNTIES? 6 KY-NAM MILLER: ABSOLUTELY, YEAH WE'RE NOT CLOSING OFF ANY. 7 8 WE'RE AT 27 NOW, WE CAN PLAN FOR NORTH OF 50, ASSUMING SOME ATTRITION. SO I WOULDN'T DISCOURAGE YOU FROM PUSHING IT 9 10 THROUGH YOUR NETWORK WITH ALL COUNTIES. 11 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THAT SOUNDS GREAT. WE'LL START WITH 12 MICHAEL LOPEZ. 13 14 MICHAEL LOPEZ: YES, THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRESENTATION. I JUST 15 16 HAVE A QUESTION. WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A MENTORSHIP 17 AND INTERNSHIP? 18 JOHN KANNEGIESER: GOOD QUESTION. WHAT WE WANT TO FOCUS ON, IN 19 THE PAST IT'S BEEN WHAT CAN THE STUDENT DO FOR US WHAT JOB 20 21 ASSIGNMENTS, BUT NOW WE WANT TO ASK WHAT CAN WE DO FOR THEM. HOW CAN WE HAVE REGULAR CHECK INS WITH OUR MENTES AND TALK 22 ABOUT THEIR CAREERS, THEIR INTEREST HOW CAN WE INTRODUCE THEM 23 TO VARIOUS LEADERS THROUGH THE MTC AND NOT JUST FOCUS ON THE 24 WORK, LIKE THE COLLEGE WORKSHOP I'M GOING TO HAVE THEM ATTEND, 25



THE SEMINARS AT THE HIGH SCHOOL ASKING THEM TO CHECK IN TO 1 TALK ABOUT THEIR CAREER AND INTEREST SO IT'S NOT JUST THE WORK 2 3 THEY'RE DOING WITH US IT'S REALLY AY IS SIP CAL RELATIONSHIP. 4 5 MICHAEL LOPEZ: OKAY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 6 JOHN KANNEGIESER: IT WAS A GOOD QUESTION THOUGH. WHAT'S THE 7 8 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN AN INTERN AND A MENTEE? IT'S A SLIGHT 9 DIFFERENCE. 10 MICHAEL LOPEZ: DO YOU HAVE A SPECIFIC MENTOR FOR EACH STUDENT? 11 12 JOHN KANNEGIESER: WE ASK THE STUDENTS WHEN THEY GO OUT TO 13 IDENTIFY ONE MENTOR. HOWEVER THERE WILL BE INSTANCE WHERE IS 14 15 THERE WILL BE AN ASSIGNED MENTOR BUT THERE WILL BE PEOPLE 16 COMING IN TO ALSO BE A PART OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MENTEE. 17 MICHAEL LOPEZ: GREAT. THANK YOU. 18 19 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: WALTER. 20 21 22 WALTER WILSON: THANKS GUYS. GREAT PRESENTATION. THIS IS A 23 WONDERFUL PROGRAM THAT YOU GUYS HAVE PUT TOGETHER HERE. I AM VERY IMPRESSED WITH THE GOAL AND PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM, AND 24 PARTICULARLY SINCE YOU'RE REACHING OUT TO KIDS WHO OTHERWISE 25

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1 WOULDN'T HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO EVEN KNOW THAT THESE
2 OPPORTUNITIES EXIST. AND SO, KIND OF MY QUESTION IS, HOW DO WE
3 HELP YOU EXPAND THIS PROGRAM? WHAT PLANS DO YOU HAVE? AND WILL
4 YOU HAVE -- ARE THERE TARGETS OR RESOURCES THAT WE CAN HELP
5 YOU TARGET TO, FROM OUR VARIOUS COUNTIES THAT COULD ASSIST IN
6 HELPING YOU TO GROW THE PROGRAM?

8 JOHN KANNEGIESER: THAT'S A GREAT QUESTION. A COUPLE OF THINGS. IT'S DETERMINED BY WHAT WE GET IN THE BUDGET THIS YEAR, IN 9 10 JULY, WE'RE GOING TO ENHANCE OUR INTERNSHIP PROGRAM NEXT YEAR OR MENTORSHIP PROGRAM, AND KY-NAM SAID WE'RE HOPEFULLY GOING 11 TO BE HAVING THE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS. WE'RE HOPING TO GET THE 12 NUMBERS UP, FOR THE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM HOPING TO GET TO TEN 13 PLUS, NEXT YEAR FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM PROBABLY WE CAN DO 14 15 20 TO 30. BUT THIS WILL BE SOMETHING -- IN TERMS OF GOING 16 BEYOND THAT, WE WOULD PROBABLY HAVE TO HAVE A LOT MORE INFRASTRUCTURE WITHIN MTC TO MAKE SURE THAT HAPPENS 17 SUCCESSFULLY, AND I'M CERTAINLY OPEN TO SUGGESTIONS, BUT FOR 18 THE INFRASTRUCTURE THAT WE HAVE HERE, THAT'S PROBABLY WHAT WE 19 WOULD BE ABLE TO DO, AT LEAST AT THIS POINT. 20

WALTER WILSON: ARE THOSE CONSIDERED -- SORRY -- I HAVE A
FOLLOW UP. THE FUNDING SOURCE IS THAT CONSIDERED WORKFORCE
MONEY TRANSPORTATION MONEY DEVELOPMENT MONEY EDUCATION MONEY
ALL OF THE ABOVE? AND THE EXPANSION PROGRAM, WAS A REQUIREMENT



FOR ADDITIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE AT THE MTC LEVEL HOW WOULD WE GO 1 ABOUT ADDRESSING THAT OR LOOKING AT THAT OR REQUESTING IT? 2 3 JOHN KANNEGIESER: I GUESS WHAT MAYBE WOULD BE WORTH DOING IS 4 5 TO SIT DOWN AND SAY, OKAY, WHAT NUMBERS DO WE REALLY WANT TO HAVE, WHAT WOULD BE OUR GOAL. DO WE REALLY WANT TO GO TO 50 6 STUDENTS A YEAR. DO WE WANT IT TO BE AN OVERALL PROGRAM 7 8 PROBABLY QUESTIONS TO BE ANSWERED FIRST BEFORE WE GO TO FUNDING, DO WE WANT INTERNSHIP AND APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS DO 9 WE WANT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM TO BE YEAR ROUND OR SUMMER DO WE 10 WANT TO BE ON A QUARTER SYSTEM. SOME UNIVERSITIES HAVE QUARTER 11 SYSTEMS. WE WOULD HAVE TO CHECK APPETITE AND FUNDING FOR THAT 12 TO HAPPEN. 13 14 WALTER WILSON: WOULD YOU DO THAT AT A COUNTY LEVEL? 15 16 JOHN KANNEGIESER: FROM MY PERSPECTIVE IT WOULD PROBABLY BE 17 INTERNAL, THE ONLY THING WE HAVE DONE AT THE COUNTIES LEVEL 18 WAS THE HIGH SCHOOL INTERNSHIP WHERE IS WE PLACED PEOPLE IN 19 VARIOUS AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE BAY AREA. WHICH WE HOPED TO GO 20 BACK TO NEXT SUMMER. BUT FROM THE COLLEGE PERSPECTIVE IT WOULD 21 22 PROBABLY BE AT LEAST AT THE MTC LEVEL.

FROM THE COLLEGE PROGRAM, THEIR 13 ONLY QUOTE UNQUOTE REQUIREMENT IS THAT YOU'RE CURRENTLY 14 15 ENROLLED IN AN UNDERGRADUATE OR COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROGRAM WHAT 16 WE HAVE DONE, WHEN THE INTERNSHIP OR MENTORSHIP GETS POSTED ON WEDNESDAY, THERE WILL BE QUESTIONS TO TALK ABOUT YOUR 17 18 EXPERIENCE AND TALKING ABOUT THINGS YOU'RE LOOKING TO DO AND MAYBE SOMETHING A LITTLE ABOUT HOW YOU MANAGE COLLEGE IN YOUR 19 PERSONAL TIME, THOSE TYPES OF OUESTIONS SO WE CAN HELP PEOPLE 20 21 WHO HAVE HAD DIFFICULTIES OR CHALLENGES WITH COLLEGE SEEING HOW WE CAN HELP THEM WITH THIS MENTORSHIP PROGRAM. IT'S NOT 22 GOING TO BE BASED ON GPA OR WHAT SCHOOL YOU WENT TO IT'S GOING 23 TO BE BASED ON HOW THEY ANSWER THOSE QUESTIONS IN OUR ONLINE 24 25 APPLICATION.

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TERRY SCOTT: I ASSUME THAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR STUDENTS WITH A 2 3 DEGREE OF INTEREST IN, ARE WE TALKING ABOUT GOVERNMENT? RELATIONS, ET CETERA. 4 5 JOHN KANNEGIESER: YES, ABSOLUTELY, AND THINGS LIKE FINANCE. 6 THEY MAY NOT BE AWARE THAT WE HAVE A FINANCE MENTORSHIP WE'RE 7 8 HAVING THIS SUMMER IN TERMS OF REGIONAL FINANCE SOMETHING FOR THEM TO EXPLORE. 9 10 TERRY SCOTT: THE REASONS FOR ONE OF MY QUESTIONS, I KNOW FROM 11 PERSONAL EXPERIENCE HERE IN NAPA, THAT WE HAVE A SHORTAGE EVER 12 LAND USE PLANNERS IN THE COUNTY, IN OUR HUMAN RESOURCES, AND 13 OUR PLANNING DEPARTMENTS. AND IT SEEMS TO BE DIFFICULT TO FIND 14 15 THESE FOLKS, ALTHOUGH WE HAVE SOME GOOD SCHOOLS THAT HAVE 16 MAJORS IN THAT, SONOMA -- WHAT'S IT --17 JOHN KANNEGIESER: STATE? IS IT STATE? 18 19 TERRY SCOTT: SONOMA STATE HAS A GOOD PROGRAM, AND I HAVE BEEN 20 TO A COUPLE OF THEIR SEMINARS. BUT WHEN WE APPROACH A 21 POTENTIAL CANDIDATE FOR THIS, THEY'RE GOING TO ASK US 22 OUESTIONS, AND I'M NOT SURE WHERE WE DRAW THE ANSWERS FROM. 23 WHAT KIND OF CRITERIA IS AVAILABLE TO US TO RESPOND TO 24



QUESTIONS AND TO TRY TO HELP FOLKS DETERMINE IF THIS IS AN

JOHN KANNEGIESER: GOOD OUESTION. FIRST OF ALL, YOU CAN ALWAYS 4 5 REFER THEM TO ME IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO. SECONDLY, WE ONLY HAVE THE REQUEST FROM PARTICULAR DEPARTMENTS THIS SUMMER, SO WE 6 DON'T HAVE ALL DEPARTMENTS FROM MTC THEY'RE ASKING FOR A 7 8 COLLEGE MENTEE, WE HAVE SOME FROM PLANNING, SOME FROM FPP, AND FINANCE THOSE ARE THE PRIMARY. THOSE ARBITRATE PRIMARY AREAS 9 WE HAVE REQUESTED THIS SUMMER. SO WE COULD CERTAINLY ELABORATE 10 11 ON THOSE DEPARTMENTS AND SOMETHING WHERE WE WILL BE LOOKING FOR THOSE INDIVIDUALS TO BE DOING. BUT IT WAS SENT TO ALL COUNCIL MEMBERS WHEN WAS ORIGINALLY NOTICED AND THEN WHEN THE DEADLINE WAS EXTENDED. 4 5 KY-NAM MILLER: I DO HAVE A FLYER, A PDF THAT HAS THE MAY 9TH 6 DATE, AND COULD SHARE THAT WITH HAVE BEEN. 7 8 RAHMON MOMOH: THAT WOULD BE GREAT. YES. THANK YOU. 9 10 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. MICHAEL BALDINI? 11 12 MICHAEL BALDINI: THANKS FOR THE PRESENTATION. I MISSED A 13 LITTLE BIT OF IT. BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW 20 IF IN THE FUTURE IT WILL BE REMOTE OR BACK IN THE OFFICE OR 21 MAYBE A HYBRID. BUT ABSOLUTELY, IF YOU HAVE REFERRALS, WE'LL 22 SEND YOU THE LINK WHEN THE JOBS GET POSTED FOR THE COLLEGE 23 PROGRAM ON WEDNESDAY, IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DISSEMINATE THAT, 24 25 YOU ARE CERTAINLY WELCOME TO DO SO. AND ANOTHER THING IS, THE

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MORE MARKETING WE DO, THE MORE DISAPPOINTED WE'RE GOING TO 1 MAKE SOME STUDENTS BECAUSE WE ONLY HAVE SIX OPENINGS. THAT'S 2 3 THE ONLY DRAWBACK OF OVERMARKETING, BUT I CERTAINLY APPRECIATE AND UNDERSTAND WHY WE WOULD WANT TO GET IT OUT THERE TO AT 4 5 LEAST AS MUCH OF THE NINE COUNTIES AS POSSIBLE. 6 7 MICHAEL BALDINI: THANK YOU. 8 JOHN KANNEGIESER: THANK YOU. 9 10 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: WALTER WILSON. 11 12 WALTER WILSON: WHEN YOU ARE INTERESTED IN EXPANDING THE 13 PROGRAM PLEASE LET ME KNOW. I WOULD LIKE TO SEE I CAN ASSIST 14 TO ENSURE WE LEAVE AS FEW KIDS AS POSSIBLE HAPPY ABOUT BEING 15 16 ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM. 17 JOHN KANNEGIESER: THANK YOU. 18 19 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: TERRY SCOTT? 20 21 22 TERRY SCOTT: MY QUESTION WAS RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF CANDIDATES THAT WE HAVE. JOHN KANNEGIESER: IT WOULD BE GOOD TO HAVE DIVERSITY FROM EACH
 COUNTY, EACH KIND REPRESENTED. WE CERTAINLY MAY NOT GET IT,
 BUT WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE REPRESENTATION FROM EACH COUNTY, FOR
 BOTH COLLEGE AND HIGH SCHOOL.

THIS IS A MARVELOUS 20 21 REINVENTION OF WHAT WE HAVE HAD IN THE PREVIOUS YEARS, AND THE 22 PAC IS ESPECIALLY INTERESTED IN THIS PROGRAM SO I JUST REALLY WANT TO GIVE YOU A [AUDIO DIFFICULTIES] [INDISCERNIBLE] MAKING 23 IT HAPPEN FOR STUDENTS. SO THANK YOU. ARE THERE ANY WRITTEN 24 COMMENTS? OR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK? 25

ANUP 17 TAPASE WILL PRESENT THIS ITEM FOR YOUR INFORMATION AND NO 18 ACTION IS REQUIRED FROM THE SUBCOMMITTEE. WELCOME BACK ANUP. 19 20 ANUP TAPASE: THANK YOU VEDA. IT'S NICE TO BE HERE. GOOD 21 AFTERNOON COUNCIL MEMBERS. COULD WE ASK OUR TECH TEAM TO PULL 22 UP THE SLIDES PLEASE? THANK YOU. AGAIN MY NAME IS ANUP TAPASA, 23 A PLANNER IN THE LONG-RANGE PLANNING TEAM HERE AT ABAG. I AM 24 25 HERE TO SHARE OUR PRESENTATION IN RECONSIDERING OUR LANGUAGE

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WITH RESPECT TO THE COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN FRAMEWORK THAT WE 1 HAVE SHARED OFTEN. I HAVE SHARED OUT ON THIS ITEM TWICE BEFORE 2 3 IN DECEMBER AND IN EARLY MARCH, AND AT THE REGIONAL EQUITY WORKING GROUP TO WHICH SOME OF YOU ATTENDED IN APRIL. SO THIS 4 5 ITEM TODAY IS SOMETHING WE HAD PLANNED TO TAKE TO THE FULL POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING NEXT WEEK ALONG WITH THE MTC 6 ABAG JOINT PLANNING ADMIN COMMITTEE. BUT WE WERE REQUESTED TO 7 8 BRING IT HERE ONE MORE TIME HERE TO THE SUBCOMMITTEE PRIOR TO THOSE MEETINGS. MUCH OF THE CONTENT ARE THINGS I HAVE ALREADY 9 SHARED BEFORE SO I'LL GO THROUGH THIS OUICK SO WE HAVE TIME 10 FOR DISCUSSION. NEXT PAGE PLEASE. STARTING OFF WITH SOME 11 BACKGROUND, COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN DESIGNATED GEOGRAPHIES, 12 CENSUS TRACTS THAT HAVE HIGH CONCENTRATIONS OF UNDERSERVED 13 POPULATIONS BASED ON CALCULATED THRESHOLDS FOR DEMOGRAPHIC 14 FACTORS INCLUDING RACE AND INCOME. THESE ARE UPDATED EVERY 15 16 PLAN CYCLE WITH THE MOST RECENT CENSUS DEMOGRAPHIC DATA. NEXT PAGE PLEASE. I WANT TO USE SOME PICTURES HERE, NOT TO 17 SPECIFICALLY POINT TO ANY COMMUNITIES, BUT REALLY TO PAINT A 18 PICTURE THAT COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN ARE NOT SOME SORT OF 19 MONOLITHIC TYPE OF COMMUNITIES. THESE COMMUNITIES ARE DIVERSE 20 21 AND VIBRANT, RICH WITH CULTURE AND HISTORY, TIGHTLY KNIT 22 COMMUNITIES MANY WITH NOT SO GREAT A HISTORY OF DISINVESTMENT 23 AND THE UNPRIORITIZED. THESE COMMUNITIES ARE RACIALLY AND ETHNICALLY DIVERSE. SOME ARE URBAN RICH IN TRANSIT, GREAT 24 ACCESS TO JOBS, SOME ARE RURAL, AGRICULTURAL, AUTO DEPENDENT. 25

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THESE COMMUNITIES GRAPPLE WITH VARIOUS ISSUES, RISING HOME 1 2 PRICES LEADING TO GENTRIFICATION AND DISPLACEMENT, AIR 3 POLLUTION FROM PORTS AND REFINERIES, RISK OF FLOODING FROM RISING WATER LEVELS, POOR LEVELS OF INFRASTRUCTURE LIKE PARKS 4 5 ROADS. POLICIES CONCENTRATION OF POVERTY, HIGHER CRIME RATES, AND POLICE BRUTALITY. AND LET ME PROVIDE BACKGROUND. WE USE 6 CROSS PROGRAMMING PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT FOR ALL EFFORTS AND BEYOND 7 8 MTC AND ABAG THIS IS USED BY SEVERAL CITY AND COUNTY AGENCIES. WITHIN PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 THE COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN IS 9 INFORMING FOR EXAMPLE, IN PLANNED STRATEGIES. WE HAVE SPECIFIC 10 STRATEGIES THAT ARE -- THAT REFER TO COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN 11 SUCH AS SUPPORT COMMUNITY-LED TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT, 12 PROVIDING TARGETED RENTAL AND MORTGAGE ASSISTANCE, INVESTING 13 IN HIGH SPEED INTERNET AND PRIORITIZATION OF VARIOUS 14 15 STRATEGIES, OUR INCUBATOR PROGRAMS ARE PART IF OUR 16 INITIATIVES. IN OUR ENGAGEMENT, 70% OF POP-UP WORKSHOPS ARE IN COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN THIS TIME, AND OUTREACH IS PRIORITIZED 17 IN COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN WHEN YOU DO IT THROUGH COMMUNITY-18 BASED ORGANIZATIONS. AND FINALLY EQUITY ANALYSIS FOR THE PLAN 19 AND WE MEASURE ALL DISPARITIES FOR COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN FOR 20 21 THE REST OF THE REGION TO SHOW DISPARITIES IN THE PLAN OWE --OUTCOMES. THE YEAR 2020 WAS OPPORTUNITY FOR RECKONING IN OUR 22 23 REGION AND BEYOND. AND IN 2020 WE BEGAN RECONSIDERING THE NOMENCLATURE COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN. AFTER SUFFICIENT INTERNAL 24 CONSENSUS THAT THIS EXISTING NAME WAS ANTIQUATED, IT'S 25

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PATERNALISTIC, EMPATHY EVOKING AND KNOW COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN 1 CONCERNS WHO? WE CONSULTED WITH THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL, 2 3 REGIONAL EQUITY WORKING GROUP AND REACHING OUT TO UNDERREPRESENTED COMMUNITIES AND WE DID THIS THROUGH SMALL 4 5 GROUP DISCUSSIONS FACILITATED BY COMMUNITIES BASED ORGANIZATIONS IN THE PAST COUPLE OF MONTHS. I SHARED THIS AT 6 OUR PREVIOUS MEETING IN MARCH. I'LL GO OVER THIS OUICKLY, 7 8 ACROSS THE BOARD -- NEXT PAGE -- ACROSS THE BOARD WHEN WE REACHED OUT TO COMMUNITIES THERE WAS A RESOUNDING DESIRE TO 9 USE A DIFFERENT NAME. I'M NOT SURE IF MY ZOOM IS FREEZING OR 10 NOT, BUT I STILL DON'T SEE THE NEXT PAGE. OKAY. I SEE IT NOW. 11 THE COMMUNITIES WE ENGAGED WITH FELT THE NAME WAS PROBLEMATIC 12 DEMEANING, NEGATIVE, AND PASS APPROXIMATIVE AND THAT I WANT 13 THE TERM TO BE EMPOWERING, FORWARD LOOKING, COMMUNICATING 14 15 PRIORITY, AND WE ALSO KNOW THESE COMMUNITIES ARE MARGINALIZED 16 AND WE SHOULD BE TALKING ABOUT WHAT WE'RE GOING TO DO ABOUT IT. NEXT PAGE PLEASE. NEXT PAGE PLEASE. OKAY. PERHAPS MY 17 ZOOM IS SLOW. I'M NOT SEEING THE NEXT PAGE, I'LL CONTINUE 18 TALKING. I WANT TO PROVIDE CONTEXT ON NOMENCLATURE THAT OTHER 19 AGENCIES USE, AND I HAVE SHARED THIS BEFORE TOO. IN LOS 20 21 ANGELES, THE TERM USED, COMMUNITIES ARE CONCERN AND IN 22 SACRAMENTO MESSAGES IN THESE COMMUNITIES IN AREAS OF CONCENTRATED POVERTY, METRO USES AND WASHINGTON, D.C. USES 23 EQUITY EMPHASIS AREAS. PROVIDING A CROSS SECTION OF WHAT OTHER 24 AGENCIES USE. COMING TO OUR RECOMMENDATION HERE ON PAGE NINE, 25

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IF WE COULD GO TO THE NEXT PAGE PLEASE, WE ACKNOWLEDGE THAT 1 THERE IS POWER IN LANGUAGE AND WE RECOMMEND CHANGING THE 2 3 NOMENCLATURE FROM "COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN" TO "EQUITY PRIORITY COMMUNITIES" THIS RECOMMENDATION STEMS FROM FEEDBACK WE HAVE 4 5 RECEIVED FROM THE COMMUNITIES AS WELL AS FEEDBACK RECEIVED FROM ALL DISCUSSION GROUPS. WE HAVE RECEIVED A WIDE RANGE OF 6 NAMES INCLUDING THOSE YOU SEE AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE AND IT 7 8 WAS CLEAR TO US THAT WE NEED A NAME THAT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS, EMPOWERING, EQUITY PRIORITY, AND ACTION. AT THE 9 10 LAST SUBCOMMITTEE WE HAD IN MARCH, AND INTO APRIL, THE COMMUNITY RECEIVED A GOOD AMOUNT OF PRAISE THERE WAS CONVEYED 11 INTEREST OF SOME MEMBERS OF THIS GROUP TO ADVOCATE FOR ACTION 12 COMMUNITIES OR ACTION FOCUSED COMMUNITIES, FROM WHAT WE HEARD 13 FROM ALL THE GROUPS WE SPOKE WITH DURING OUR OUTREACH 14 15 ESPECIALLY THE COMMUNITIES THEMSELVES WE FEEL THOSE TERMS DO 16 NOT COMMUNICATE PRIORITY SUFFICIENTLY. THERE IS POTENTIAL FOR THE WORD FOCUS OR ACTION TO BE -- [INDISCERNIBLE] BUT THE WORD 17 PRIORITY SENDS OUT A MESSAGE THAT THE REASON THESE COMMUNITIES 18 WERE LEFT BEHIND, WE ARE ACKNOWLEDGING THEY ARE PART OF 19 PLANNING PROGRAMMING AND PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT. FURTHER, NOT THAT 20 21 THIS IS WHAT WE'RE SEEKING BUT IT IS NICE THAT THE WORD PRIORITY IS CONSISTENT WITH OTHER TERMS WE USE SUCH AS 22 PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREAS, PRIORITY PRODUCTION AREAS. NEXT 23 PAGE PLEASE. ON PAGE TEN -- STILL APPEARS TO BE PRESIDING. 24 BEYOND THE NOMENCLATURE, WE WANT TO RECOGNIZE THAT DEFINING 25

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AND MEASURING IS A CONTINUOUS ONGOING EFFORT AS WE ENVISION OR 1 EQUITY PLATFORM. WITH PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 WE'RE LOOKING AT 2 3 REVISING THE NOMENCLATURE AND AUGMENTS THE EXISTING FRAMEWORK ON THE BASIS OF DISPARITY GEOGRAPHY AND POPULATION. LOOKING AT 4 5 REVISING THE FRAMEWORK TO BE MORE ISSUE SPECIFIC GIVEN THE DIVERSITY OF COMMUNITIES HIGHLIGHTING EOUITY IN COMMUNITIES 6 BUT HIGHLIGHTING DISPLACEMENT PRESSURE. THERE ARE KNOWN GAPS 7 8 IN THE METHODOLOGY THAT WE AS A GROUP HAVE TALKED ABOUT BEFORE SUCH AS DEFINITIONS OF LOW INCOME OR HOW CONCENTRATIONS OF 9 SOME POPULATIONS WHICH HAVE DROPPED BECAUSE OF DISPLACEMENT 10 AND HOW DO WE CAPTURE THOSE POPULATIONS AT A HIGHER LEVEL 11 RECOGNIZING THIS IS A PLACE-BASED FRAMEWORK AND RECOGNITION OF 12 SENIORS, AND THOSE WITH DISABILITIES ARE A SPECIFIC COMMUNITY 13 AND PEOPLE OF COLOR LIVE OUTSIDE OF THESE COMMUNITIES. NEXT WEEK WE ARE 15 16 LOOKING TO TAKE THIS ITEM TO THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL AS WELL AS JOINT MTC PLANNING COMMITTEE AND ABAG ADMIN COMMITTEE 17 TO RENAME COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN AS EQUITY PRIORITY 18 COMMUNITIES TO BE USED ACROSS ALL OUR WORK PRODUCTS AND 19 PROJECTS. WITH THAT I'LL TURN IT OVER TO VEDA FOR OUESTIONS. 20 21 THANK YOU.

THAT'S ALL. 9 10 VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: THANK YOU. WALTER WILSON, PLEASE. 11 WALTER WILSON: THAT'S A REALLY GOOD REPORT. I'M PLEASED TO SEE 12 THAT REALLY THIS EFFORT IS BEING LED BY THE COMMUNITY, AND THE 13 FOUNDATION, THE FORMAT OF YOUR RESEARCH IS ALL COMMUNITY-BASED 14 15 AND COMMUNITY DRIVEN, WHICH IS BEAUTIFUL, ACTUALLY, AND AS I LOOK AT IT, BECAUSE I'M ENGAGED WITH REVISIONING EFFORTS IN 16 PARTICULAR LAW-ENFORCEMENT AND SOME OTHER AREAS AROUND SANTA 17 CLARA COUNTY AND I CAN SEE SOME REAL PARALLEL IN YOUR FORMAT 18 THAT YOU HAVE DEVELOPED. I DO HAVE ONE CONCERN. I THINK YOU 19 SAID THAT THIS IS PLACE-BASED. AND YOU KNOW, AND THERE ARE 20 PLACES WHERE PLACE-BASED DOESN'T WORK PARTICULARLY FOR PEOPLE 21 WHO ARE MOST DESPAIRING MOSTLY IN THE CASE OF BLACK PEOPLE 22 STATISTICALLY THAT IS A FACT, AND PROGRAMS WHERE WE TRIED TO 23 DO THAT IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY AND THE PEOPLE WHO ARE MOST 24 DISPARAGED AFRICAN AMERICANS WERE LEFT OUT OF PROCESSES AND 25

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EDUCATION AND OTHER PLACES. I WOULD LIKE TO CAUTION TO YOU 1 2 TAKE A HARD LOOK AT PLACE-BASED AND HAVE A BROADER PERSPECTIVE 3 IN TERMS OF HOW YOU ADDRESS IT IN PARTICULAR IF YOU ARE TRYING TO ADDRESS ISSUES OF EQUITY. ONE OF THE REASONS FOR THAT IS 4 5 THAT IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY THERE IS NO AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY, THERE IS NO PLACE, BUT THERE IS A WHOLE LOT OF 6 SPOTS WHERE YOU FIND POOR AND DISADVANTAGED AND 7 8 UNDERREPRESENTED AND BLACK PEOPLE WHO LIVE IN MANY DIFFERENT PLACES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY AT THE SAME POVERTY LEVELS. SO, I 9 JUST WANT TO SAY THAT. BUT GREAT REPORT. THANK YOU. 10

VEDA FLOREZ, CHAIR: ANUP WOULD YOU LIKE ON ADDRESS THAT? IT WAS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THIS WAS NOT PLACE-BASED BECAUSE WE WERE TALKING ABOUT A COMMUNITY WHERE LGBTQ COMMUNITY THAT DOESN'T NECESSARILY LIVE IN ONE COMMUNITY. IF YOU COULD GIVE US YOUR THOUGHTS WE WOULD APPRECIATE IT. ANUP?

ANUP TAPASE: THE COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN FRAMEWORK AS WE HAVE 18 IT RIGHT NOW ARE WHAT YOU'RE ACTUALLY CALLING EOUITY PRIORITY 19 COMMUNITIES FRAMEWORK IS PLACE-BASED FRAMEWORK IN THAT WE LOOK 20 21 AT CONCENTRATIONS FROM DIFFERENT DEMOGRAPHICS GROUPS WITHIN 22 CENSUS TRACTS BASED ON CENSUS DATA AND IDENTIFY PARTICULAR 23 CENSUS TRACTS IN COMMUNITIES. AND PART OF OUR REEXAMINATION OF FUTURE FRAMEWORK RECOGNIZING THIS IS ONLY ONE DIMENSION OF 24 EQUITY THERE ARE MANY PEOPLE OF COLOR THAT DON'T LIVE IN THESE 25

 TRACTS. SO WE WANT TO DIRECT OUR REEXAMINATION TO RECOGNIZE
 THAT WE SHOULD RELY ON PLACE-BASED FRAMEWORK [INDISCERNIBLE]
 TO USE OTHERWISE. BUT I COMPLETELY UNDERSTAND THE COMMENTS
 THAT WERE MADE AND I APPRECIATE THEM.

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KNOW 29%. GROCERIES HAVE GONE UP 25% IN THE LAST YEAR. SO JUST 1 THE ESSENTIALS OF LIFE, NOT COUNTING THE MAIN ESSENTIAL, 2 3 ESSENTIAL RENT. LET ME GIVE YOU AN EXAMPLE. A GROUP OF HOMES WILL GO DURING WORLD WAR II FOR BLUE-COLLAR WORKERS, ONE THAT 4 5 WAS A THOUSAND SOUARE FEET JUST SOLD FOR \$1.5 MILLION, AND THE PEOPLE THAT BOUGHT IT ARE ADDING A THOUSAND SQUARE FEET, WHICH 6 WILL PROBABLY COST THEM A MILLION, MILLION AND A HALF. 7 8 DEPENDING ON WHETHER THE PEOPLE ARE FILING OBJECTIONS TO IT. SO BY GETTING THESE EXAMPLES I'M SAYING WE NEED TO HAVE SOME 9 REAL BROAD BASED PROGRAMS TO TRY TO FIX THIS. BECAUSE I'M 10 ACTUALLY GETTING A LITTLE DEPRESS SAID.
