- 6 IT WAS KNOWN AS A SPOT BILL AND THEN IT WAS AMENDED IN LATE

- 8 HIS BILL LAST YEAR A.B. 1527 THE WAY HE FRAMES THIS IS RIGHT

- 10 YOU KNOW, THERE IS QUITE A LOT OF CONSENSUS AND SUPPORT FOR.
- 11 THERE IS NO DISCUSSION ON KIND OF CHANGES AND HOW DECISIONS
- 12 ARE MADE. SO, YOU KNOW, GOING BACK TO KIND OF THE NETWORK
- 13 MANAGEMENT CONVERSATION, THERE IS NOTHING REALLY DEALING WITH
- 14 THAT. THE BILL KIND OF HAS A FINDING AND DECLARATIONS SECTION
- 15 WITH SOME OF THE CHALLENGES STARTING WITH IN 2017 ONLY 5% OF
- 16 ALL TRIPS WERE MADE ON TRANSIT. RIGHT? THAT'S NOT GOING TO GET
- 17 US TO THE GOALS THAT WE HAVE IN PLANNED BAY AREA. AND NOW OF
- 18 COURSE WITH COVID IT'S GOING TO BE AN UPHILL BATTLE TO GET
- 19 BACK TO THE LEVEL OF RIDERSHIP WE HAD BEFORE THE PANDEMIC.
- 20 I'LL HIGHLIGHT THE ITEMS THAT ARE IN THE BILL NOW THAT REALLY
- 21 FALL INTO THREE MAIN CATEGORIES SPECIFIC TO RELATED TO
- 22 IMPROVING THE EXPERIENCE FOR RIDERS ONE IS FOR MTC TO
- 23 IMPLEMENT BY JULY 1ST OF 2023 A TRANSIT PASS BASICALLY KNOWN
- 24 AS AN A ACCUMULATOR PASS SOMETHING INTEGRATED WHERE YOU'RE
- 25 PAYING ON A PER TRIP BASIS BUT LET'S SAY IT'S A WEEKLY PASS

- 20 MAYBE THERE WOULD BE A SONOMA COUNTY PILOT, SINCE THEY'RE
- 21 TALKING A LOT ABOUT INTEGRATING THEIR SYSTEMS SOLANO COUNTY IS
- 22 ALSO INTERESTED AS IS EASTERN ALAMEDA COUNTY. THE BILL IS IN
- 23 PILOTS BUT BASICALLY SAYS THAT MTC WILL IMPLEMENT THIS SYSTEM
- 24 BY JULY 1ST, 2024 AND IT WILL DEVELOP AN IMPLEMENTATION AND
- 25 MAINTENANCE STRATEGIES FOR THIS AND A FUNDING PLAN FOR





- 1 DEPLOYMENT EVENT DESIGN OF THIS IS A HEAVY LIFT AND A COSTLY
- 2 ENDEAVOR BUT ACTUALLY GOING OUT INTO THE FIELD AND CHANGING
- 3 SIGNS AND CHANGING BUS STOPS AND ALL OF THAT, NOT TO MENTION
- 4 THE DIGITAL ASPECT OF IT SO THAT ALL OF THE INFORMATION IS
- 5 UPDATED AND CAN BE LOADED ON TO MOBILE APPS AND WHAT HAVE YOU,
- 6 THAT IS A COSTLY, BIG ENDEAVOR. SO ONLY A FUNDING PLAN FOR
- 7 THAT, IN THE BILL MANDATES THAT WE HAVE THAT BY A SPECIFIED
- 8 DATE AND ITS THAT TRANSIT AGENCIES HAVE TO USE THIS SYSTEM BY
- 9 JULY 1, 2025 MEANING THEY CAN'T START INSTALLING THEIR OWN

- 18 511, BUT IT REALLY ELEVATES AND REQUIRES THAT OPERATORS
- 19 PRIORITIZE THIS SO THAT RIDERS CAN HAVE BETTER INFORMATION
- 20 WHEN THEY'RE OUT IN THE FIELD. SO THOSE ARE THE THREE LITTLE
- 21 CUSTOMER-FACING PROVISIONS IN THE BILL. THERE WAS A COUPLE
- 22 MORE KIND OF BIG PICTURE STUDY COMPONENTS, AND THE FIRST IS
- 23 MTC, IN CONSULTATION WITH OPERATORS AND COUNTY TRANSPORTATION
- 24 AGENCIES DEVELOP OR IDENTIFY A TRANSIT PRIORITY NETWORKS THAT
- 25 SHOULD, WOULD MOST BENEFIT FROM, YOU KNOW, KIND OF





- 1 IMPROVEMENTS TO SPEED UP SERVICE. AND REQUIRES THAT SUCH
- 2 PROJECTS BE CONSIDERED FOR INCLUSION IN CERTAIN FUNDING
- 3 PROGRAMS, AND THEN LASTLY, THAT WE DEVELOP A REPORT
- 4 RECOMMENDING IMPROVEMENTS TO MANAGED LANES. SO YOU'RE ALL
- 5 FAMILIAR WITH OUR EXPRESS LANES AND THE POTENTIAL FOR THEM TO
- 6 REALLY SERVE AS A GREAT NETWORK FOR EXPRESS BUS AND SO THIS
- 7 REQUIRES THAT WE DO A REPORT TO KIND OF TALK ABOUT HOW TO
- 8 ACCELERATE THE DELIVER OF A MANAGED LANE NETWORK THAT WOULD BE
- 9 INTEGRATED WITH BUS AND THAT WE WORK WITH CHP AND CALTRANS ON
- 10 HOW TO DO THAT WITHOUT -- WHILE MINIMIZING ROADWAY EXPANSION.
- 11 SO THOSE ARE REALLY WHAT'S IN THE BILL RIGHT NOW. TALK ABOUT
- 12 TIMING, THE BILL IS GOING TO BE HEARD LATER THIS MONTH. I
- 13 THINK IT'S SET MAYBE THE 27TH FOR A HEARING AND THEN IT NEEDS
- 14 TO PASS THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE BY LATE MAY, AND THEN THE
- 15 ASSEMBLY FLOOR BY JUNE, AND THEN THE WHOLE PROCESS AS YOU KNOW
- 16 REPEATS ITSELF ON THE SENATE SIDE. THE FINAL COMMITTEE ON THE
- 17 SENATE SIDE, THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE IT HAS TO PASS BY
- 18 LATE AUGUST. SO IN TERMS OF HOW THIS SYNCS UP WITH THE BLUE
- 19 RIBBON, AS YOU HEARD THE BLUE RIBBON IS NOT GOING TO CONCLUDE
- 20 ITS WORK UNTIL JULY SO RECOMMENDATIONS COMING THEN COULD STILL

- 1 SOME ADVOCACY PRINCIPLES, AS IT RELATES TO THE BILL IN MARCH,
- 2 WE BROUGHT THEM TO OUR LEGISLATION COMMITTEE. AND THOSE WERE
- 3 APPROVED AND THEY'RE IN YOUR PACKET AS ATTACHMENT A, AND THEY
- 4 REALLY JIVE WELL WITH WHAT'S IN THE BILL NOW, EXCEPT IT
- 5 DOESN'T TALK ABOUT, YOU KNOW, ANYTHING RELATED TO NETWORK
- 6 MANAGEMENT, AND WE DO HAVE SOME PROVISIONS THERE, AND I THINK
- 7 WHERE AS MTC, DISTINCT FROM THE BLUE RIBBON, WE WOULD LIKE TO
- 8 SEE PROVISIONS THAT ENHANCE OUR AUTHORITY TO CERTAINLY NOT
- 9 TRANSFER OUR EXISTING TRANSIT COORDINATION AUTHORITY TO
- 10 ANOTHER AGENCY WE DON'T THINK IT'S A GOOD IDEA TO COMPLETELY
- 11 RESTRUCTURE TRANSIT RIGHT NOW IN THE MIDST OF THE CRISIS THAT
- 12 THE AGENCIES HAVE BEEN GOING THROUGH AND FORMALIZING
- 13 COORDINATION THAT'S BEEN GOING ON WITH OPERATORS DURING COVID-
- 14 19 AND WE DON'T WANT TO JUST TRUST THAT IF YOU WILL SO WE
- 15 THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO INSTITUTIONALIZE THAT AND IN CERTAIN
- 16 AREAS WHERE HOPEFULLY THE BLUE RIBBON CAN REALLY ARTICULATE
- 17 THAT THESE REALLY BELONG IN A SORT OF REGIONAL VENUE TO MAKE
- 18 THOSE DECISIONS THAT THOSE WOULD THEN BE ARTICULATED IN THE

- 10 WALTER WILSON: HI REBECCA, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THAT

- 12 AT THE END YOU KIND OF TOUCHED ON WHAT MY OUESTION WAS AROUND

- 18 YOU KIND OF TOUCHED ON T BUT I'M NOT SURE WHAT YOU WERE
- 19 SAYING. FIRST IT SOUND LIKE YOU WERE SAYING, WELL, WE HAVE
- 20 BEEN WORKING TOGETHER, AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO DO THAT, AND

- 22 AND MTC'S PROPOSED PRINCIPLES SOUND GREAT, AND I'M REALLY
- 23 EXCITED, BECAUSE IT'S ALL VERY FORWARD THINKING, IS SOMETHING
- 24 THAT'S VERY REFRESHING TO HEAR IS IN THE WORKS. ESPECIALLY
- 25 WHEN TO KNOW THE TIME TRANSFERS AT MAJOR HUBS AND IMPROVING





- 1 THEM, MAKING SURE THEY EXIST, THE TRANSIT PRIORITY LANES AT
- 2 CERTAIN TIMES OF THE DAY ESPECIALLY FOR BUSES, LIKE IT'S

- 2 MTC'S PRINCIPLE FOR WANTING TO SEE MTC MORE STRONGLY AND
- 3 CLEARLY TAKE ON THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY, IN
- 4 TERMS OF EXAMPLES AROUND THE WORLD FOR REGIONS TO HAVE A
- 5 NETWORK MANAGEMENT FUNCTION, THERE IS MORE THAN ONE WAY TO DO
- 6 IT SUCCESSFULLY. THERE IS A REPORT THAT I THINK I PROBABLY

- 9 THAT HAD HIGH RIDERSHIP, WELL COORDINATED SYSTEMS WHICH ARE
- 10 STRONGLY CORRELATED AND THEN HOW WERE THOSE STRUCTURED. AND
- 11 THERE WERE A NUMBER OF REGIONS AROUND THE WORLD THAT HAVE
- 12 NETWORK MANAGEMENT ENTITY THAT'S SEPARATE FROM THE TRANSIT
- 13 OPERATORS, AND DOES NOT REPUBLICAN -- DOES NOT RUN TRANSIT BUT
- 14 HAS THIS STRONG AMBIGUOUS TRANSIT COORDINATION ROLE, BUT THEN
- 15 THEY HAVE OTHER REGIONS THAT HAVE A DEVELOPED COORDINATION
- 16 ROLE THAT BUILDS OFF OF THEIR REGIONAL TRANSIT OPERATORS.
- 17 THERE THEY MAY CONSOLIDATE THEIR REGIONAL TRANSIT OPERATORS
- 18 AND THEN HAVE THAT, A REGIONAL OPERATOR THAT DOES THE NETWORK
- 19 COORDINATION FOR THE REST OF THE SYSTEM. SO, NOT FULL
- 20 CONSOLIDATION, BUT TO HAVE A REGIONAL OPERATOR THAT DOES A --
- 21 THE COORDINATION FOR THE REST OF THE SYSTEM. THOSE ARE LOGICAL
- 22 OPTIONS THAT ARE USED SUCCESSFULLY, EVERYWHERE, IN THE WORLD.
- 23 SO I RECOMMEND LOOKING AT THE REPORT FOR EXAMPLES. AND THE
- 24 COMMENT THEY WOULD MAKE ABOUT THE MTC PROPOSAL IS THAT, IF THE
- 25 ONLY THING THAT IS DONE IS TO SAY MORE FIRMLY, MTC IS -- HAS



- 1 THE RIGHT TO DO WHAT IT'S ALREADY EMPOWERED TO DO -- THERE'S A
- 2 CHALLENGE RIGHT NOW THAT TRANSIT AGENCIES HAVE A CONFLICTING
- 3 MANDATE. SO IN ORDER NOT TO HAVE CONFLICT, THERE WOULD BE A
- 4 NEED TO DISAMBIGUATE BECAUSE OTHERWISE THERE'S A "YOU'RE NOT
- 5 THE BOSS OF ME PROBLEM" WHERE MTC COULD SAY WE'RE GOING TO DO
- 6 THIS REGIONAL A ACCUMULATOR AROUND THE REGION AND THE AGENCY
- 7 COULD SAY WE DON'T WANT TO THAT'S A STICKING POINT I THINK
- 8 IT'S A COMMENT IN TERMS OF WHAT KINDS OF REFORMS MIGHT BE
- 9 NEEDED TO DISAMBIGUATE WHETHER THROUGH THE MTC PATH OR SOME
- 10 OTHER LOGICAL PATH. AND LASTLY, I WANTED TO TALK, IN THE
- 11 POINT, THAT THERE IS ACTUALLY A POTENTIAL POSITIVE
- 12 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN REGIONAL WAYFINDING AND REGIONAL FARE
- 13 INTEGRATION. BECAUSE, AS WAS POINTED OUT TO ME BY SOMEONE WHO
- 14 IS A PROFESSIONAL IN THIS AREA, IF YOU DON'T HAVE INTEGRATED
- 15 FARES, THEN A WAYFINDING NEEDS TO MAKE AGENCIES EXTREMELY
- 16 PROMINENT. BECAUSE IF YOU HAVE A PASS AND IT ONLY WORKS FOR
- 17 ONE AGENCY, YOU CAN'T GET ON THAT BUS OR TRAIN, YOU KNOW, YOUR
- 18 FARE WILL NOT BE GOOD. SO THE WAYFINDING REALLY NEEDS TO
- 19 EMPHASIZE THE AGENCIES. WHEREAS IF YOU HAVE A FARE SYSTEM THAT
- 20 WORKS ON ALL AGENCIES, THEN YOUR WAYFINDING CAN REALLY FOCUS
- 21 ON THE DESTINATIONS THAT PEOPLE ARE TRYING TO GO TO MORE
- 22 CLEARLY. AND SO THERE IS ACTUALLY A BENEFICIAL RELATIONSHIP
- 23 BETWEEN THOSE PROJECTS. AND THOSE ARE MY COMMENTS.



RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: THANK YOU. RICK COATES AND THEN MICHAEL 1 LOPEZ, AND I JUST WANT EVERYBODY TO DO A TIME CHECK HERE. GO 2 3 AHEAD RICK. 4 5 RICK COATES: YES, SORT OF FOLLOWING ON ADINA'S CONCERN ABOUT THE CONFLICT THERE, MAYBE I SHOULD INDICATE THAT THIS QUESTION 6 IS INFORMED BY MY OWN EXPERIENCE IN DEALING WITH A NUMBER OF 7 8 STATE AGENCIES WHO, IN SPITE OF THE LAW, STILL REFUSE TO FOLLOW IT. ONE CASE I KNOW OF A SITUATION WHERE AN AGENCY HAS 9 BEEN OUT OF COMPLIANCE FOR OVER 30 YEARS HO HAS BEEN ACTUALLY 10 SUED ON THE ISSUE, THE COURT HAS TOLD THEM THEY MUST COMPLY 11 AND IT'S BEEN TEN YEARS SINCE THAT AND THEY STILL HAVEN'T 12 COMPLIED. SO MY QUESTION IS, IS THERE THOUGHT IN INCLUDING IN 13 THIS LEGISLATION SOME SORT OF ENFORCEMENT MECHANISM? BECAUSE I 14 FORESEE SOME RESISTANCE, IF NOT PASSIVE, EVEN ACTIVE 15 16 RESISTANCE BY SOME OF THE AGENCIES. OTHERWISE, I FIND THE ELEMENTS THAT YOU HAVE COVERED SO FAR AS VERY ENCOURAGING. AND 17 I AM VERY ENCOURAGED THAT IT ACTUALLY WOULD BE LEGISLATED 18 RATHER ARE THAN JUST SUGGESTED. BUT I'M STILL WORRIED. AND I -19 - I KNOW IT'S A SENSITIVE ISSUE. THE MOMENT YOU BRING IT UP, 20 YOU WILL HAVE TRANSIT AGENCIES THAT GET THEIR BACKS UP. BUT 21 WITHOUT SOME KIND OF ENFORCEMENT MECHANISM, I JUST WONDER IF 22

YOU WILL BE FIGHTING ALL THE TIME.

- 1 REBECCA LONG: RIGHT. SO IF I COULD ADD, OR RESPOND TO THAT,
- 2 OUICKLY. I THINK THIS IS ONE OF THE REASONS WHY WE THINK IT'S
- 3 IMPORTANT THAT MTC HAVE A KEY ROLE IN THIS NETWORK MANAGEMENT
- 4 PROCESS BECAUSE WE ARE THE FUNDING AGENT FOR MANY SOURCES OF
- 5 REVENUE THAT THE TRANSIT OPERATORS RECEIVE. SO THE STATE
- 6 TRANSIT ASSISTANCE REVENUE, FOR INSTANCE, STATE LAW ALREADY
- 7 SAYS THAT WE CAN SET THE CONDITIONS FOR THOSE FUNDS. AND IF
- 8 OPERATORS DON'T COMPLY WITH THOSE CONDITIONS, THEN WE CAN
- 9 WITHHOLD THOSE FUNDS. AND THAT APPLIES TO THE REVENUE BASED
- 10 FUNDS AS WELL AS THE POPULATION BASED. SO WE'RE TALKING
- 11 HUNDREDS OF MILLIONS OF DOLLARS, REGION-WIDE. AND WE, YOU
- 12 KNOW, GENERALLY HAVE NOT WITHHELD FUNDS BECAUSE IT'S NOT FUN
- 13 TO DO, BUT, YOU KNOW, CLEARLY, THERE IS AN ENFORCEMENT
- 14 MECHANISM THERE, AND YOU KNOW, I THINK WE NEED TO THINK ABOUT
- 15 WHETHER THE LANGUAGE NEEDS TO BE CHANGED TO DIRECT US A LITTLE
- 16 BIT MORE STRONGLY SO IT'S NOT JUST THAT WE HAVE THE AUTHORITY
- 17 THAT WE HAVE TO WITHHOLD THE FUNDS IF THEY'RE NOT IN
- 18 COMPLIANCE. THERE ARE SOME MECHANISMS. DEFINITELY APPRECIATE
- 19 THE COMMENT.

- 24 MICHAEL LOPEZ: YES, THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRESENTATION. AND
- 25 CERTAINLY WHEN IT COMES TO PRINCIPLES I'M IN SUPPORT OF ALL OF



- 1 THEM BUT I HAVE A OUESTION ON THE TRANSIT NETWORK MANAGEMENT

- 9 REBECCA LONG: THERE ARE NETWORKS OUT THERE THAT WOULD CREATE A
- 10 NEW AGENCY YOU HAVE MTC AND ITS ROLE AND MAYBE THERE WOULD BE
- 11 A NEW AGENCY THAT MIGHT BE A NETWORK MANAGER OR YOU WOULD TRY
- 12 TO MERGE A NUMBER OF TRANSIT AGENCIES AND EMPOWER THEM WITH A
- 13 CERTAIN RESPONSIBILITY, WHICH MAYBE MTC HAS ALREADY, SO I
- 14 THINK WE'RE SAYING LET'S NOT GET IN THE WAY LET'S NOT LET THE
- 15 PERFECT GET IN THE WAY IN LEGISLATION IS GOING TO PROPOSE TO
- 16 COMPLETELY CHANGE THE WAY THE BAY AREA GOVERNMENTS WORK IN THE

- 14 I MEAN THIS IS ALL COMING OUT OF MTC SO IT'S LIKE THERE IS A
- 15 STRUGGLE GOING ON IN THERE, BUT IT SEEMS TO ME, IF THERE IS A
- 16 NETWORK MANAGER AS TO OPPOSED TO MTC BEING CONCERNED ABOUT
- 17 LOSING SOME OF ITS AUTHORITY I THINK IT SHOULD BE MODELED IN A
- 18 WAY IF IT BECOMES AN AGENCY IT SHOULD BE AN AGENCY UNDER MTC
- 19 NOT AN AUTONOMOUS AGENCY ON ITS OWN I WOULD THINK IT HAS TO
- 20 EXIST UNDER AN AGENCY THAT HAS LONG-STANDING ABILITY AND WITH
- 21 ALL TO MANAGE IT. I THINK THE NETWORK SHOULD BE SOMETHING
- 22 AUTONOMOUS IN AND OF ITSELF. SO TO ME IT JUST SEEMS THAT IT
- 23 MAKES SENSE THAT WE IF WE ARE GOING HAVE A NETWORK MANAGER
- 24 IT'S GOING TO HAVE TO BE UNDER MTC THAT'S ALWAYS BEEN MY
- 25 THOUGHT. SO THE IDEA TO SAY WE DON'T SUPPORT IT THAT COULD BE



- 1 A KILLER IN AND OF ITSELF. I'M A DBE CONSULTANT IN SANTA CLARA
- 2 COUNTY FOR BART AND A LOT OF PEOPLE IN THE COUNTY THINK A
- 3 NETWORK MANAGER IS INEVITABLE, IT'S ESSENTIAL. I THINK THE
- 4 FARE COULD KILL THIS THING UNLESS IT'S ADDRESSED AND THE THING
- 5 ABOUT THE NETWORK MANAGER, TO ME, AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT
- 6 ANYBODY ELSE THINKS, BUT I ALWAYS THOUGHT NETWORK MANAGER
- 7 WOULD BE UNDER MTC. OH, AND ONE LAST THING. WHAT CAN WE DO IN
- 8 OUR COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS AND REGIONAL AREAS TO SUPPORT THIS
- 9 BILL? THANK YOU.

- 11 REBECCA LONG: SO, JUST IN DIRECT RESPONSE TO THAT QUESTION, I
- 12 THINK WHATEVER ORGANIZATIONS YOU BELONG TO, OR JUST AS
- 13 INDIVIDUALS, I THINK CALLING YOUR LEGISLATORS, YOU KNOW,
- 14 SENDING IN A LETTER TO THE COMMITTEES, YOU CAN, YOU KNOW CALL
- 15 INTO COMMITTEES, TESTIFY AND SUPPORT. IDEALLY IT'S MORE
- 16 POWERFUL TO DO THAT AS AN ORGANIZATION THAN JUST AS AN
- 17 INDIVIDUAL BUT I THINK LETTING -- CALLING YOUR LEGISLATORS IS
- 18 HELPFUL. SO ALL OF THOSE THINGS, I THINK WOULD BE GREAT JUST
- 19 TO HELP THE BILL MOVE ALONG. THANK YOU.

- 23 TERRY SCOTT: THANK YOU. I WOULD LIKE TO FIRST SUPPORT AND I

- 25 RICK HAS SEEN, SPECIFIC STATE LAWS THAT HAVE BEEN IGNORED FOR

- 7 REASONABLE TIME FRAME. I THINK I AGREE WITH WHAT ASSEMBLY
- 8 BILL 629 IS TRYING TO ACCOMPLISH, AND I DON'T SEE HOW IT CAN
- 9 BE DONE EFFECTIVELY WITHOUT THE NETWORK MANAGER POSITION AND
- 10 INCUMBENT. AND, YOU KNOW, WE HAVE GOT TO TAKE CERTAIN STEPS TO
- 11 GET THERE, AND THE LONGER IT TAKES TO TAKE THOSE INITIAL STEPS
- 12 THE LONGER IT'S GOING TO BE BEFORE WE HAVE A FUNCTIONAL
- 13 POSITION AND A FUNCTIONAL INCUMBENT. AND A LOT OF WHAT WE NEED
- 14 TO DO GOING FORWARD, AND WORKING WITH THE VARIOUS COUNTY

- 3 THEN MAYBE I SHOULD JUST NOT RIDE AND TAKE TRANSIT. SO I THINK
- 4 AS THE BIKE SPEEDS ARE MOVING UP AND ARE CAPABLE FOR LONGER
- 5 DISTANCING IF WE WANT TO BE ABLE TO CAPTURE THAT RIDER TO USE
- 6 TRANSIT, THEN THEY'RE GOING TO NEED A LITTLE BIT MORE REALTIME
- 7 INFORMATION AND BETTER CONVERSATION TO -- OR WE'LL LOSE THOSE
- 8 RIDERS COMPLETELY.

- 23 BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE, WHICH WAS -- WILL BE REPORTED OUT TO
- 24 MTC ITSELF. SO, I WOULD STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU TALK TO
