4	KEEPING ME STRAIGHT, AND ALL OF THE TIMES THAT I HAVE CALLED
5	AND SAID I DIDN'T RECEIVE THE E-MAIL WHEN IN FACT I HAD. THANK
6	YOU VERY MUCH FOR ALL YOUR WORK.

8	CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: THE PLEASURE IS MINE. THANK YOU.
9	
10	SCOTT HAGGERTY, CHAIR: AS YOU KNOW, I WILL DISPENSE OF THE
11	PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, NOT BECAUSE I DON'T HAVE RESPECT BUT
12	BECAUSE I'M SICK OF LOOKING AT EVERYONE'S BELLIES. NEXT ITEM
13	WOULD BE THE COMPENSATION ANNOUNCEMENT.
14	
15	CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: AS AUTHORIZED BY STATE LAW I AM MAKING
16	THE FOLLOWING ANNOUNCEMENT. EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD HERE
17	TODAY WILL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE \$100 PER MEETING ATTENDED UP
18	TO A MAXIMUM OF \$500 PER MONTH PER AGENCY. THIS AMOUNT IS A
19	PROVIDED AS A RESULT OF CONVENING A MEETING FOR WHICH EACH
20	MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO COLLECT SUCH AMOUNT.

22	SCOTT HAGGERTY, CHAIR: ALL RIGHT. WITH THAT I'M NOW GOING TO
23	MOVE TO THE CHAIR'S REPORT. THIS IS MY LAST CHAIR'S REPORT,
24	BUT A BIG HONOR FOR ME TO BE VERY HONEST WITH YOU, AND ONE
25	THEY WISH I WAS NOT PRESENTING, BECAUSE I DON'T THINK THE

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VOTERS IN HIS CITY GOT IT RIGHT. AND I KNOW THAT JAKE WILL BE 1 VERY ACTIVE GOING FORWARD. SO THEY'RE PROBABLY GOING TO NOT --2 3 THEY PROBABLY WOULD RATHER HAVE HIM ON THE COUNCIL AS AN ACTIVIST. HE'S GOING TO DO MUCH MORE DAMAGE AS AN ACTIVIST. 4 5 BUT WITH THAT IT IS AN HONOR AND PRIVILEGE TO PRESENT THIS WELL DESERVED RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION WHICH IS NUMBER 4449 6 ON THE OCCASION BY THE DEPARTURE OF OUR ONE TIME LEADER AND 7 8 OUR FOREVER FRIEND JAKE MACKENZIE. GIVEN JAKE'S LONG-TERM OF SERVICE AND LONG LIST OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS IT'S NO SURPRISE THAT 9 THIS IS A VERY LONG RESOLUTION, SO I WILL HONOR JAKE AND OTHER 10 MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION BY SHARING A FEW HIGHLIGHTS, A 11 FRAMED COPY HAS MADE ITS WAY TO THE CITY OF ROHNERT PARK SO 12 USP S IS DOING A GREAT JOB IN ROHNERT PARK AND THAT IS RATHER 13 LENGTHY. IT STATES AS JAKE MACKENZIE STEPPING DOWN FROM 14 15 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION AFTER 12S YEARS OF 16 OUTSTANDING SERVICE REPORTING SONOMA COUNTY AND ITS NINE CITIES JAKE HAS SERVED SINCE 2015, AND IN 2017, JAKE CHAIRED 17 WHEREAS IN HIS TERM JAKE SURVIVED A SENTENCE OF HARD LABOR AS 18 A MEMBER OF THE CASA STEERING COMMITTEE, AND WHEREAS AN IN 19 ADDITION HIS COMMISSION DUTIES JAKE SERVED FOR MANY YEARS AS A 20 MEMBER OF THE SMART BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND HELPED ENGINEER 21 22 SMART'S SUCCESSFUL 2017 LAUNCH OF SERVICE AND AS A MEMBER OF THE STATE ROUTE 37 POLICY COMMITTEE SET THE WHEELS IN MOTION 23 OF MUCH NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE NORTH CORRIDOR AND JAKE 24 DURING HAS TIME AS HEAD OF MTC SPENDING HIS TIME AT 25

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GROUNDBREAKING AND RIBBON CUTTING AND ENCOURAGED THE 1 PARTICIPANTS HAVE A GRAND TIME AS WELL. WHEREAS EVEN BEFORE 2 3 THE ONSET OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND THE SHIFT TO ZOOM MEETINGS, JAKE RAISED THE BAR TO UNPRECEDENTED HEIGHTS FOR THE 4 5 COMMISSIONERS TO BE CLAD IN CASUAL AND COMFORTABLE CLOTHING NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COMMISSION OF MTC THANK 6 JAKE FOR HAS YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMISSION AND TO THE 7 8 PEOPLE OF THE BAY AREA EXPRESS THEIR APPRECIATION FOR HIS ENERGETIC BOLSTERISM FOR ALL THINGS RELATED TO ROHNERT PARK 9 AND SONOMA COUNTY EXTENDING BEST WISHES TO THEM AND HIS WIFE 10 BARBARA AND WISH FOR FINE ADVENTURES IN THE YEARS AHEAD AND 11 LOOK FORWARD TO FOLLOWING THEIR EXPLOITS ON JAKE'S SOCIAL 12 MEDIA ACCOUNT. JAKE WE HOPE THAT YOU HAVE MANY PARTING 13 14 COMMENTS AS YOU LEAVE TODAY.

APPROPRIATE TIME. SO, DO I HAVE -- DO I MAKE THESE SO COGENT

AND SECOND BY WORTH. YOU CAN GO AHEAD AND MAKE YOUR COMMENTS
AND THAT CAN SHOW THE OUTCOME OF THE VOTE DEPENDING UPON WHAT
YOU SAY ABOUT IT.

JAKE MACKENZIE: WELL FIRST OF ALL, I WAS GOING TO START OFF BY SAYING THAT FOR THE PAST 12 YEARS, IT HAS BEEN A HUGE HONOR TO WORK WITH THE STAFF OF BOTH THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION

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COMMISSION AND I CAN NOW SAY THE COMBINED STAFF OF MTC AND 1 ABAG. IT'S BEEN A HUGE PLEASURE, AND I WAS TOLD AT THE VERY 2 3 BEGINNING THAT I WOULD BE AMAZED BY THE QUALITY OF THE STAFF WORK. I CONTINUE TO BE AMAZED. I CONTINUE TO BE THANKFUL, AND 4 CHAIR HAGGERTY MENTIONED THAT, AT THE BEGINNING OF THIS 5 MEETING, A THANK YOU TO KIMBERLY, HEY, DOUBLE DOWN ON THAT 6 KIMBERLY. BUT THE OTHER PERSON WHOSE FACE I'M NOT SEEING HERE, 7 8 IS MARTHA AROUND? 9 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: I DON'T SEE HER AT THE MOMENT. 10 11 SPEAKER: SHE'S HERE. 12 13 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: SHE IS. 14 15 16 JAKE MACKENZIE: HEY MARTHA THESE GUYS DON'T KNOW THAT YOU'RE A RUGBY PLAYER AND I JUST LEARNED THIS A WEEK OR SO AGO SHE 17 PLAYED FOR THE ALAMEDA TIRINGS OR SHARKS? WHAT WERE THEY? 18 19 MARTHA: THE RIP TIDE. 20 21 JAKE MACKENZIE: THANK YOU MARTHA. THIS GOES BACK TO THE PEOPLE 22 WHO HAVE RETIRED OVER THE YEARS BUT THERESE AND THE MANAGEMENT 23 TEAM, AND THE PEOPLE WHO I HAVEN'T BEEN ABLE TO SEE FOR THE 24 25 PAST YEAR, BRANDON AND KIM, AND RON, AND THE FRONT DESK STAFF

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WHO IT'S ALWAYS BEEN A GREAT PLEASURE WORKING OUT THERE WITH 1 ROSIE AND ALL THE GANG. I HAVE BEEN LOOKED AFTER WELL. I 2 3 REALLY V THE OTHER THING I NEED TO ACKNOWLEDGE IS THE FACT THAT CHAIR HAGGERTY AND I HAVEN'T KILLED ONE ANOTHER OVER THE 4 5 LAST 12 YEARS. I BELIEVE WE'RE THE TWO OUTSTANDING ALPHA MALES ON THE COMMISSION, AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT YOU GUYS ARE GOING TO 6 DO ABOUT THE TWO OF US, SCOTT? I MEAN, WHO IS GOING TO KEEP 7 8 ALL THESE PEOPLE IN LINE? 9 SCOTT HAGGERTY, CHAIR: I THINK THEY'LL BE JUST FINE, JAKE. 10 11 JAKE MACKENZIE: WILL THEY BE FINE? OKAY. ALFREDO, THAT'S YOUR 12 CHALLENGE BECAUSE YOU'RE LOSING THE ALPHA PLUS OF TWO MALES 13 LEAVING THE COMMISSION. BUT THERE ARE OTHER PEOPLE WHO HAVE 14 15 BEEN A HUGE INFLUENCE IN MY TERM AS COMMISSIONER, NUMBER ONE 16 JIM SPERING, WHO I MET 20 PLUS YEARS AGO. I THINK YOU WERE THE MAYOR OF SUISUN CITY AT THIS TIME. AND I STARTED SERVING ON 17 THE ABAG REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE WITH ANOTHER NOTORIOUS 18 SONOMA COUNTY PERSON, WELL-KNOWN TO SOME OF YOU, PAM CARLIOTTE 19 SHE IS AN ALPHA, I BELIEVE, THAT WOULD BE A GOOD DESCRIPTION 20 21 OF TOURLIETTE, WHO HAPPENED TO GO TO HIGH SCHOOL WITH MY DAUGHTER SHEELA ANYWAY. THERE IS ALL THESE WEIRD SMALL-WORLD 22 STORIES. BUT JIM THANK YOU SO MUCH. OVER THESE YEARS, YOU HAVE 23 BEEN MY MENTOR, I WAS GOING TO SAY YOU HAVE KEPT ME ON THE 24 STRAIGHT AND NARROW BUT THAT'S NOT EXACTLY TRUE BECAUSE BY 25

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BEING CHAIR DURING THE TIME OF THE CASA COMPACT RABBIT AS 1 PRESIDENT OF ABAG HE SURVIVED JUST FINE, BUT MY CHAIRING OF 2 3 THE CASA COMPACT MEETINGS SET A DIRECT IMPACT ON MY TERM ON SMART. AND I WAS GOING TO BE THE VICE CHAIR. WELL, I ENDED UP 4 5 BEING THE VICE CHAIR FOR THE SHORTEST TIME EVER IN HUMAN MEMORY OF ANY ORGANIZATION. I THINK THAT LASTED ABOUT 20 6 MINUTES. SINCE MY ROHNERT PARK CITY COUNCIL DIDN'T APPROVE OF 7 8 THE FACT THEY HAD GUIDED THE CASA COMPACTS THROUGH ITS COMPLEX LIFE. SO THERE YOU GO. AND NOW RABBIT IS CHAIR OF SMART AND 9 10 I'M SAYING FAREWELL. HEY, IT'S EYE TOUGH LIFE, ISN'T IT?

AND I WOULD JUST SAY FOR THE PAST YEAR, WE ZOOM 20 AWAY ALL THE TIME, WE'RE TOTALLY ZOOMED OUT, BUT THE HUGE MISS 21 IS THE HUMAN CONTACT AND THE CAMARADERIE AND THE FRIENDSHIPS 22 THAT HAVE BEEN FORGED OVER THESE YEARS, AND I'M GOING TO MISS 23 THAT VERY MUCH WHEN THEY RESUME FOR THE REST OF YOU. BUT MAYBE 24 FROM TIME TO TIME I'LL SHOW UP AND SEE IF I'LL BE ALLOWED INTO 25

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THE GREEN ROOM AGAIN. THANK YOU, MR. CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR THE
 RESOLUTION. AND, MR. RABBIT, A SUPERVISOR IN SONOMA COUNTY IS
 NOW WITH HIS COLLEAGUES GOING TO HAVE TO SELECT MY
 REPLACEMENT. SO MORE POWER TO THEIR ARM. AND I'M PROUD OF MY
 SERVICE.

AND YOU KNOW, 25 THAT WAS MY FIRST EXPERIENCE OF YOU, AND OVER THE PAST YEARS,

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THAT'S LIKE -- THAT WAS MY SECOND AND THIRD AND FOURTH ABOUT 1 HOW YOU WERE A LEADER WHO ALWAYS KIND OF LOOKED AT THE BIG 2 3 PICTURE, AND TOOK THE TOUGH VOTES, BUT NOT ONLY TOOK THE TOUGH VOTES BUT KIND OF WENT OUT AND JUSTIFIED THEM AND STOOD BY 4 5 THEM AND DIDN'T TRY TO DUCK AWAY FROM THEM. I APPRECIATE YOUR MENTORSHIP, JAKE, AND I KNOW WE'RE GOING TO GET INTO LOTS OF 6 7 TROUBLE TOGETHER GOING FORWARD. 8 **JAKE MACKENZIE:** [LAUGHTER] 9 10 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: AND IF I HAD A GOLDEN KILT, YOU WOULD BE 11 SEEING ME IN IT. 12 13 JAKE MACKENZIE: IT'S ALL RIGHT NICK. SPARE THE AIR US. 14 15 16 SCOTT HAGGERTY, CHAIR: FOR SOME REASON MY COMPUTER STARTED TO GO INTO AN UPDATE MODE RIGHT IN THE MIDDLE. JULIE PIERCE? 17 18 JULIE PIERCE: THANK YOU CHAIR. IT'S GREAT TO COME BACK AND SAY 19 HELLO AND SEE ALL MY BUDDIES HERE. I AM SO SORRY, JAKE, TO SEE 20 YOU HAVE TO STEP DOWN FROM MTC. YOU HAVE BEEN A REAL LEADER 21 THERE. I WILL MISS EVEN SOME OF YOUR RAMBLING ROGUE AND -- I 22 THINK MY PROMINENT MEMORY IS WORKING TOGETHER ON FINALIZING 23 THE MERGER DOCUMENT WE GATHERED UPSTAIRS ON THE 8TH FLOOR 24 HAVING AN OFFICIAL SIGNING AND WHILE YOU WEREN'T PART OF THE 25

JAKE, I WILL TELL 12 YOU THAT, AS I HAVE BEEN STRUGGLING TO RECOVER FROM POLITICAL 13 OFFICE, I HAVE SPENT A LITTLE MORE TIME ON ANCESTRY. AND NOW 14 15 THAT I DISCOVER THAT I AM 45% SCOTTISH, AND 11% FROM WALES, I 16 THINK I BETTER INVESTIGATE THAT PART OF THE WORLD A BIT MORE. 17

18 JAKE MACKENZIE: WHEN A GRAND COMBINATION.

JULIE PIERCE: YEAH, WELL, AND THERE IS A LITTLE SWEDEN IN
THERE TOO. SO, ANYWAY. [LAUGHTER] BUT I JUST WANT TO SAY THAT,
LIKE YOU, A BIT OF A POLICY JUNKIE, IT'S NOT EASY TO STEP
DOWN. AND SO I THINK THAT AS THINGS RELAX A LITTLE WITH COVID,
AND WE'RE ALL GETTING OUR VACCINES, IT WILL BE TIME FOR AMY

AND I AM 1 INCREDIBLY GRATEFUL FOR YOUR COURAGE AND THE COURAGE OF OTHERS 2 3 YOU STOOD UP IN A WAY AND SHOWED THE BUSINESS ISN'T ALL ABOUT GETTING ELECTED AND THERE ARE MOMENTS THAT HAVE IMPACT. MANY IN THIS GROUP THAT HEARD ME SAY BEFORE THAT YOU AND I HAVE HAD A 17 BROTHERLY RELATIONSHIP, AND I HOPE THE PUBLIC LISTENING 18 DOESN'T INTERPRET THAT AS, "SEE, THEY BACK EACH OTHER UP. THEY 19 ALWAYS VOTE THE SAME. THEY BEHAVE TOO CLOSELY." NOT BROTHERLY 20 IN THAT SENSE. BROTHERLY IN THE SENSE THAT YOU WERE NEVER 21 AFRAID TO CHALLENGE ME. A COUPLE OF TIMES I CHALLENGED YOU AND 22 PROBABLY REGRETTED IT. BUT THAT SAID, YOU ALSO WERE THERE FOR 23 ME IN THE TOUGHEST TIMES FOR MY FAMILY, ON A PERSONAL BASIS. 24 YOU HAD A WAY OF GETTING ME TO SPEAK UP, EVEN THOUGH I'M A 25

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VERY PERSONAL PERSON WHEN IT COMES TO THOSE KINDS OF ISSUES. 1 AND IT WAS VERY IMPORTANT THAT THAT HAPPENED AND VERY HELPFUL 2 3 TO ME AND MY FAMILY AND MY EXTENDED FAMILY. AND I WANT PEOPLE TO KNOW THAT ABOUT YOU, TOO. YOU HAVE TREMENDOUS COMPASSION. 4 5 YOU HAVE A WAY OF MAKING PEOPLE BELIEVE ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS, AND COLLECTIVELY, THAT SOMETHING CAN BE DONE, THAT THEY 6 MAY NOT BELIEVE CAN BE DONE, THEMSELVES. I SAW THAT HAPPEN 7 8 OVER 20 YEARS WITH COUNTLESS MAJOR TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS THAT WERE NOT ONLY FUNDED AND APPROPRIATED BUT ARE ACTUALLY 9 10 SERVING PEOPLE NOW. AND YOU LEAVE, OF COURSE, IN YOUR PATH, SOME BIG, BIG PROJECTS THAT I FIRMLY BELIEVE WILL COME TO 11 FRUITION. BECAUSE YOU PLANTED THOSE SEEDS. BUT YOU ALSO MADE 12 ME BELIEVE THAT I COULD DO THINGS THAT I WASN'T SURE I COULD 13 DO. IN FACT, I THINK YOUR WAY OF PUTTING IT WAS, "WATCH WHAT 14 YOU WISH FOR." OR, "I KNOW YOU CAN DO IT, ARE YOU SURE YOU 15 16 WANT TO DO THAT." AND I HAVE RESPECTED YOUR MEASURED APPROACH. 17 YOU'RE NOT A YES MAN. YOU WILL NEVER WILL BE. YOUR QUESTIONS IN A GOOD WAY MAKES INOUIRY SO THAT THE PEOPLE AROUND YOU MAKE 18 GOOD DECISIONS. AND I THINK WE HAVE ALL MADE MUCH BETTER 19 DECISIONS BECAUSE OF YOU OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF DECADES. 20 21 THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND I'M GOING TO GO BACK AND WORK ON HOMELESSNESS AGAIN NOW. WE'RE GOING TO MISS YOU IN THAT 22 BATTLE, BECAUSE THIS'S ONE OF THOSE THINGS THAT I KNOW THAT, 23 IF YOU COULD, YOU WILL BE HERE HELPING US SOLVE IN THE FUTURE. 24 BUT I HOPE YOU DON'T DO THAT, AND I HOPE YOU ENJOY YOUR 25



RETIREMENT IN NASHVILLE AND PATTY AND I ARE GOING TO BE OUT
 THERE LOOKING YOU UP ONCE IT'S SAFE TO DO SO. AND
 CONGRATULATIONS.

20 AMY R. WORTH: I'M GLAD WE'LL CONTINUE THAT INFLUENCE IN
21 SACRAMENTO. THANK DAVE FOR JOINING US. AND NOW IT'S MY
22 PLEASURE TO INTRODUCE OUR STATE SENATOR FROM SAN FRANCISCO,
23 SCOTT WIENER. THANK YOU FOR JOINING US TODAY.

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SCOTT WIENER: THANK YOU AMY. I'M SAD, SCOTT, THAT YOUR 1 2 LEAVING, ALTHOUGH YOU WILL ALWAYS BE HERE IN SPIRIT. I WENT ON TO THE MTC IN 2011 AND ULTIMATELY SPENT 4 5 ABOUT SIX YEARS THERE BEFORE BEING ELECTED TO THE STATE SENATE AND WHEN I GOT THERE IN 2011, I REMEMBER I WAS TRYING TO SIZE 6 UP ALL MY NEW COLLEAGUES AND COMING FROM THE GREAT CITY OF ST. 7 8 FRANCIS AND THIS VERY URBAN LEFTY AREA, AND LOOKING AROUND AND SEEING THE DIVERSITY OF THE BAY AREA, SEEING SCOTT, AND 9 10 LISTENING TO SCOTT, AND BEING LIKE, OH BOY, THIS GUY IS FROM, DEFINITELY, A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE. A DIFFERENT AREA. A 11 DIFFERENT POLITICS IN HIS COMMUNITY. ARE WE GOING TO BE ABLE 12 TO WORK TOGETHER, AND I LEARNED VERY QUICKLY THAT THE ANSWER 13 IS YES. YOU KNOW, SCOTT, THE THING I ADMIT ABOUT YOU SO MUCH, 14 15 IN ADDITION JUST YOUR ABILITIES TO GET THINGS DONE, IS THAT 16 YOU REALLY SHOW THAT WHEREVER SOMEONE LIVES OR REPRESENTS IN 17 THE BAY AREA, THAT WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER, AND THAT URBAN AND SUBURBAN, EAST BAY, WEST BAY, WE ALL HAVE TO WORK TOGETHER 18 OR WE'RE NOT GOING TO SUCCEED. AND THAT WAS REALLY ONE OF THE 19 THINGS THEY LOVED SO MUCH ABOUT BEING ON MTC AND JUST, YOU 20 21 KNOW, WORKING WITH SO MANY GREAT COMMISSIONERS WHO REALLY, REALLY GOT IT IN TERMS OF THE NEED FOR US TO WORK TOGETHER. 22 AND NOT JUST TO BE, YOU KNOW, PROVINCIAL ABOUT OUR OWN CITY OR 23 COUNTY. AND SCOTT, YOU REALLY, REALLY DEEPLY EXEMPLIFIED THAT. 24 AND I THINK YOU AND I, IN PARTICULAR, WERE ABLE TO WORK SO 25

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WELL TOGETHER. AND TO SEE THOSE COMMONALITIES, AND TO 1 UNDERSTAND THAT, FOR THIS REGION, WE DON'T SUCCEED UNLESS WE 2 3 ALL SUCCEED. SO I'M JUST SO APPRECIATIVE FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP IN ALAMEDA COUNTY AND REGIONALLY. I'M SO APPRECIATIVE THAT WE 4 5 HAD THOSE SIX YEARS TO WORK TOGETHER. AND YOU DEFINITELY DESERVE A BREAK. BUT KNOWING YOU, YOUR BREAK IS NOT GOING TO 6 BE RESTFUL. I KNOW YOU'RE STILL GOING TO DO YOUR THING. SO 7 8 CONGRATULATIONS.

SO, THANK 18 YOU FOR TAKING THE TIME. AND, AGAIN, ALL THREE OF YOU 19 SENATORS, I'M JUST AMAZED THAT YOU ARE ON AND I WANT TO THANK 20 YOU SO MUCH FOR TAKE THE TIME, AND WISH YOU TREMENDOUS 21 POLITICAL SUCCESS. I KNOW BEING A STATE SENATOR IS NOT WHERE 22 SCOTT WIENER'S STORY ENDS. 23

AND SPEAKING OF ALUMNI COMMISSION, IS IT SENATOR EMERITUS, SENATOR BEALL WELCOME. WE'RE HONORED TO HAVE 6 7 YOU WITH US TODAY. 8 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: HE MIGHT HAVE JUMPED OFF. 9 10 AMY R. WORTH: OKAY. WE'LL CATCH HIM WHEN WE COMES BACK ON 11 THEN. I KNOW HE WAS HERE. THE NEXT PERSON, IT'S MY PLEASURE TO 12 WELCOME FORMER COMMISSIONER STEVE KINZIE. 24 YOU'RE A REMARKABLE LEADER. YOUR PUGNACIOUS STYLE, AT TIMES,

AND I ALWAYS REMEMBER FONDLY OUR BOTH INSIDE MEETINGS AND 4 5 OUTSIDE MEETINGS, OUR CONVERSATIONS, THEY WERE FREE WHEELING, GREAT EXAMPLES OF FREE SPEECH, VERY CANDID, AND THANKFULLY, 6 NEVER RECORDED. [LAUGHTER] BETWEEN 2025 THE RAMS WILL BE 7 8 PLAYING IN NASHVILLE SO I EXPECT SOME DECENT TICKETS TO COME BY FOR THAT OCCASION. I HOPE THAT YOU CONTINUE TO ENJOY LIFE, 9 SO KEEP HAVING FUN DOWN THERE IN MUSIC CITY. 10

21 YOU IN CONTRA COSTA COUNTY, WE ARE SUPER GRATEFUL FOR YOUR
22 WORK ON THE CALDECOTT TUNNEL AND GRATEFUL FOR THAT
23 PARTNERSHIP. AND WITH THAT, I WANTED TO TURN TO MY COLLEAGUE,
24 AND PARTNER IN THE LITTLE CAR. JULIE PIERCE.

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JULIE PIERCE: THANK YOU AMY. SCOTT, THIS IS A TOUGH DAY FOR 1 2 BOTH OF US. BECAUSE WE HAVE WORKED TOGETHER FOR MANY YEARS, 3 REPRESENTING OUR TWO COUNTIES, AND I RETIRED A COUPLE OF MONTHS AGO, AND IT AIN'T EASY, MY FRIEND. IT AIN'T EASY. BUT 4 5 AS YOU RETIRE, I AM WISHING YOU ALL THE BEST, AS AN ELECTED OFFICIAL, YOU HAVE BEEN A TREMENDOUS INSPIRATION. YOU ARE A 6 GREAT LEADER. AND A GENTLEMAN ALWAYS. YOUR FATHER TAUGHT YOU 7 8 WELL, AND YOU NEVER FORGET THAT. NO ONE WILL FIND SOMEONE WITH MANNERS LIKE YOU, ANYMORE. IT'S WONDERFUL. IF FOR YOUR 9 10 COMMUNITY, YOU HAVE BEEN AN AWESOME LEADER. YOU HAVE ALWAYS PUT OTHER'S NEEDS BEFORE YOUR OWN EVEN WHEN IT WASN'T A 11 POPULAR DECISION. YOU CHALLENGED THE STATUS OUO. YOU MADE US 12 ALL THINK OUTSIDE OUR PRECONCEIVED BOXES. YOU NEVER LOST SIGHT 13 OF DOING THE RIGHT THING FOR YOUR FAMILY, YOUR FRIENDS, YOUR 14 COMMUNITY, AND OUR REGION. YOU ARE A TRUE DEFINITION OF A 15 16 LEADER. YOU HAVE LED THE STATE IN CHAMPIONED INNOVATIVE TRANSPORTATION SOLUTIONS FOR THE MEGA REGION. VALLEY LINK WILL 17 HAPPEN. I HOPE WE ALL LIVE THAT LONG. [LAUGHTER] BUT IT WILL 18 HAPPEN, AND IT'S BECAUSE OF YOU. AS A FORMER PRESIDENT OF 19 CALCOG YOU LEAD THE STATES ON TRANSPORTATION POLICY DURING 20 SOME PRETTY TUMULTUOUS TIMES YOUR PASSION FOR SOLID POLICY 21 OVER POLITICAL EXPEDIENCY IS A GREAT EXAMPLE FOR ALL ELECTED 22 OFFICIALS. YOU COULD BE THE TUTOR FOR SOME OF OUR FOLKS COMING 23 OUT. YOU HAVE CHALLENGED US. WE HAVE ALL LEARNED FROM YOU OVER 24 THE MANY YEARS WE HAVE SERVED THE BAY AREA TOGETHER. I 25

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REMEMBER WHEN MARK GREEN APPOINTED ME TO THE REGIONAL PLANNING 1 COMMITTEE. IN MY FIRST COUPLE OF MEETINGS I THOUGHT WHO ON 2 3 EARTH IS THIS GRUFF GUY OVER HERE HE IS REALLY OUTSPOKEN AND HE WAS PRETTY INTIMIDATING. I SOON LEARNED DIFFERENTLY. YOU 4 5 HAVE HAD THE DISTINCTION OF SERVING MULTIPLE TERMS AS CHAIR OF MTC AND AS PRESIDENT OF ABAG. ONE OF THE FEW WHO HAS SERVED ON 6 BOTH AGENCIES, I THINK, FOR PRETTY MUCH YOUR WHOLE CAREER, AS 7 8 A SUPERVISOR. AND WHILE DAVE CORTESE AND I GET A LOT OF THE CREDIT FOR THE MERGER, I HAVE TO SAY, I DON'T THINK IT WOULD 9 HAVE HAPPENED WITHOUT YOU. YOU WERE CRUCIALLY INSTRUMENTAL IN 10 HELPING US TO CREATE THE DESTRUCTION THAT WE HAVE TODAY. I 11 VIVIDLY REMEMBER A VERY HEATED MEETING WHEN WE WERE GETTING TO 12 A POINT WHERE IT WAS GOING TO BLOW UP. AND WE TOOK A BREAK AND 13 WE WENT OFF IN A CORNER, AND WE TALKED AND WE SAID NONE OF 14 THESE OPTIONS WORK FOR US. WHAT CAN WE DO TO FIX IT? AND 15 16 THAT'S WHERE OPTION 7A, THAT MEMORABLE 7A CAME FROM, AND WE BROUGHT IT BACK. WE MADE STAFF ANGRY. WE MADE THE CONSULTANTS 17 ANGRY. BUT YOU KNOW WHAT? IT WORKED. AND IT WAS -- IT WAS 18 BECAUSE YOU WERE WILLING TO THINK OF SOMETHING DIFFERENT THAN 19 WHAT WAS PRESENTED TO US. YOU WERE ABLE TO THINK ABOUT HOW WE 20 SERVE BOTH AGENCIES WELL. AND YOU KNOW, BETWEEN THE TWO OF US, 21 WE SOLD IT. AND THAT REALLY MADE A HUGE DIFFERENCE IN, AND WAS 22 A TURNING POINT. WE HAD TO MAKE SOME INCREDIBLY DIFFICULT 23 DECISIONS ON ABAG AND ON MTC TO GET OUR REGION TO WHERE WE ARE 24 TODAY, TO GET THE TWO AGENCIES WHERE WE ARE, TO GET THE REGION 25

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WHERE WE ARE. AND WE WILL ALL BE EVER GRATEFUL TO YOU FOR 1 MAKING SURE WE NEVER FORGET THE PEOPLE THAT WE SERVE. 2 3 PERSONALLY, YOU HAVE CHALLENGED ME. YOU HAVE MENTORED ME. YOU HAVE ARGUED WITH ME. YOU HAVE TOLD ME OFF. YOU HAVE BEEN ANGRY 4 5 WITH ME. YOU HAVE BEEN SUPPORTIVE. BUT ALWAYS SUPPORTIVE. YOU ALWAYS HAD MY BACK AS A LEADER. AND 20 21 OBVIOUSLY AS WAS SAID, YOU AND I HAVE ENJOYED STORIES AS WELL, AND I APPRECIATE THAT OPPORTUNITY AND THAT SIDE OF YOU. 22 KNOWING THAT WHILE WE'RE ALL PRAISING YOU TODAY ON THE 23 TRANSPORTATION ISSUES THAT YOU HAVE TAKEN THE LEAD ON, THERE 24 IS SO MUCH MORE THAT IS IMPORTANT TO THE WORLD AND TO YOUR 25

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COMMUNITY AND TO YOUR COUNTY, AND THE THINGS THAT YOU HAVE 1 2 CHAMPIONED MORE. NOTHING MORE IMPORTANT THAN THE WELFARE, THE 3 MENTAL HEALTH, THE SAFETY MEASURES AND ISSUES THAT ARE SO IMPORTANT AND CLOSE TO HOME. THANK YOU FOR THAT FROM THE 4 5 BOTTOM OF MY HEART BEST OF LUCK TO YOU AND YOUR FAMILY GOING FORWARD CONGRATULATIONS TO YOU MANY OPPORTUNITY EXERCISE 6 CHALLENGES LYE AHEAD GOING FORWARD. AND WHO 2 3 HAVE WATCHED US RAISE CHILDREN WHO LOVE THE BAY AREA, WHO COULDN'T AFFORD TO LIVE HERE. WHO HAD TO LITERALLY FLEE THE 4 5 NEST BECAUSE THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THEM TO AFFORD TO LIVE HERE. AND THAT CHANGED THAT ENTIRE CONVERSATION AROUND FROM 6 DISCUSSING THE PROBLEM TO FINDING THE SOLUTION. AND I REALLY, 7 8 REALLY APPRECIATE SOMEBODY HAVING THE ABILITY TO DO THAT. TO CIRCLE BACK AND DIG DOWN AND START WORKING ON THE SOLUTION. 9 AND YOU HAVE SHOWN US IN THE LAST YEAR. A LOT OF PEOPLE WOULD 10 HAVE TAKEN THEIR LAST YEAR OFF, AND KIND OF COAST THROUGH IT 11 AND WE HAVE SEEN SOME REALLY LAZY POLITICIANS IN THE LAST 12 YEAR. YOU DIDN'T DO THAT. AND I DON'T THINK THE PANDEMIC HAD 13 ANYTHING TO DO WITH T YOU LOOKED AT THE PANDEMIC AS A WAY TO 14 15 SOLVE THINGS IT CREATED A LOT MORE PROBLEMS, BUT THESE WERE 16 PROBLEMS THAT ALREADY EXISTED AND NEEDED TO BE FIXED AND YOU LED THE CHARGE ON HELPING US TAKE A DIRECTION THAT IS GOING TO 17 HELP US SOLVE SOME OF THE SYSTEMIC PROBLEMS WE HAVE IN OUR 18 SYSTEM AND I APPRECIATE THAT AND I JUST WISH YOU ALL THE LUCK 19 IF THE WORLD BECAUSE WHOEVER YOU WIND UP HELPING NEXT IS GOING 20 21 TO BE TOTALLY SURPRISED AND TOTALLY TAKEN ABACK, AND THEN THEY'RE GOING TO BE REALLY APPRECIATIVE OF WHAT YOU DO AND HOW 22 YOU LEAD. THANK YOU. 23

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TELL YOU WHAT YOU MEAN TO ME, AND TO OUR COUNTRY, THAT BEGINS 1 BY SAYING THANK YOU FOR THE WORK YOU DO EVERY DAY. WORK THAT 2 3 IS VITALLY IMPORTANT FOR NATIONAL SECURITY AND TO THE AMERICAN FAMILIES ECONOMIC SECURITY. YOU DO ALL OF THIS IN A POLITICAL 4 5 CLIMATE THAT TOO OFTEN IN RECENT YEARS HAS TREATED YOU LICK A PUNCHING BAG. FOR THE RESOLUTION SAYS, SERVICE AS 23 CHAIR AND SUPPORTING THE FULL COMMISSION PROVIDING LEADERSHIP 24 25 WE NEEDED IN THE LAST FEW YEARS. AND I REMEMBER NOMINATING YOU

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FOR A SECOND TERM YOU HAD RESERVATIONS BUT ONCE YOU BECAME 1 CHAIRMAN SCOTT YOU NEVER LOOKED BACK AND A LOT OF US 2 3 APPRECIATE THAT, THE LEADERSHIP YOU PROVIDED TO THIS COMMISSION. MTC OUT ALL THE AGENCIES I HAVE SERVED ON HAS 4 5 ALWAYS HAD THE RIGHT PERSON AT THE RIGHT TIME AND YOU AND JAKE BOTH FILLED THOSE ROLES. AND SCOTT, A LOT OF THE STUFF THAT 6 YOU HAVE BROUGHT TO THE FOREFRONT, IT'S VERY MUCH APPRECIATED 7 8 AND A LOT OF IT NEEDED TO BE DISCUSSED AT THE TIME. ALL OF THE COMMISSIONERS I HAVE SERVED WITH AND I HAVE PROBABLY BEEN ON 9 THE COMMISSION LONGER THAN ANYONE ELSE I DON'T KNOW OF ANYONE 10 WHO HAS HAD MORE OF A POSITIVE IMPACT ON EVERYONE OF THE LIVES 11 OF THE RESIDENTS OF THE BAY AREA AND THE RESOLUTION REALLY 12 ACKNOWLEDGES ALL OF THOSE ACCOMPLISHMENTS. YOU HAVE 14 ALWAYS LET IT BE KNOWN WHAT COUNTY YOU REPRESENT AND YOU HAVE 15 16 ADVOCATED FOR YOUR RESIDENTS, BUT ONE THING THAT YOU ALWAYS TRIED TO DO IT NEVER AT THE EXPENSE OF ANOTHER JURISDICTION. 17 AND I ALWAYS APPRECIATED THAT. AND I THINK THAT LEADERSHIP 18 REALLY CAME THROUGH. YOU KNOW, AS JULIE SAID, SCOTT, YOU 19 NAVIGATED MTC THROUGH THE ABAG MTC MERGER AND I ALWAYS FELT 20 INSTEAD OF STARTING THOSE MEETINGS OFF WITH A PLEDGE WE SHOULD 21 HAVE STARTED OFF WITH A PRAYER BUT YOU GOT US THROUGH IT AND 22 YOU GOT US TO A PLACE THAT BOTH AGENCIES ARE REALLY WORKING 23 TOGETHER REALLY WELL, AND THE BAY AREA SHOULD BE MOST GRATEFUL 24 TO YOU FOR WHAT YOU HAVE DONE THERE. THAT'S GOING TO SERVE 25

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THIS REGION FOR MANY YEARS TO COME. AND FOR ME, I'M NOT ONLY 1 LOSING A COMMISSIONER, BUT A GOOD FRIEND, ON THE COMMISSION, 2 3 AND YOUR FRIENDSHIP, I WILL ALWAYS CHERISH, YOU HAVE HEARD FROM MANY OF THE PEOPLE WHO HAVE COMMENTED YOU HAVE GOT A LOT 4 5 OF PASSION. YOU VERY THOUGHTFUL PROBABLY ONE OF THE MOST LOYAL FRIENDS I HAVE HAD AND REALLY WANT TO SAY THANK YOU SCOTT. I 6 THINK YOU HEARD THAT FROM MANY OTHER SPEAKERS. I CAN'T WAIT TO 7 8 VISIT YOU IN TENNESSEE, I CAN'T WAIT TO SEE THE RELAXED VERSION OF SCOTT HAGGERTY. WE TALKED ABOUT YOUR FIERCE 9 10 ADVOCACY, I PUT THE B ONE BOTTOM ERR BEHIND ME THAT KIND OF REMINDS ME OF SCOTT HAGGERTY YOU HEAR HIM COMING AND HE LEAVES 11 A HELL OF A PAY LOAD. IT'S CERTAINLY YOUR STYLE, SCOTT. I 12 APPRECIATE IT. WITH THAT, SCOTT, I'M GOING TO TURN IT OVER TO 13 YOU FOR CLOSING COMMENTS IT'S BEEN AN HONOR IS PLEASURE 14 SERVING BOTH OF YOU. THANK YOU SCOTT. 15

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MTC, I HAVE SAID IT MANY TIMES PEOPLE LOOK TO US FOR 1 LEADERSHIP IT'S BECAUSE OF PAST CHAIRS, COMMISSIONERS AND PAST 2 3 EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY IT'S BECAUSE OF THE EXCELLENT STAFF AT MTC, AND WE ARE VIEWED AS LEADERS IN THE 4 5 UNITED STATES. THAT MAN WAS A GREAT FRIEND. ABSOLUTE 11 GREAT FRIEND. AND TAKEN FROM US WAY TOO EARLY IN LIFE. HAD A 12 LOT -- HE HAD A LOT OF JUICE STILL IN THE TANK, AS FAR AS I 13 WAS CONCERNED. BUT HE WAS ONE OF THE FIRST THAT BELIEVED IN MY 14 15 ABILITY TO RUN AN AGENCY AND TOOK ME AROUND HIS WING AT THE 16 AIR DISTRICT AND MOVED ME RIGHT UP THE RANKS AND I CAN'T THANK HIM ENOUGH. I THINK THE OTHER ONE IS SUPERVISOR KANG. I COULD 17 BE HAVING A REALLY BAD DAY ON THE BOARD AND SOMETIMES THINGS 18 WOULD BE LEVELLED AT ME AS FAR AS COMMENTS OR WHATEVER, AND I 19 WOULD GET A NOTE FROM MARY KING, AND I STILL HAVE ONE OF THOSE 20 21 NOTES BASICALLY TELLING ME DON'T WORRY ABOUT IT THIS MEETING WILL BE OVER SOON AND YOU CAN GO HOME TO YOUR FAMILY AND 22 FRIENDS. SHE WAS A WONDERFUL LEADER. AND I THINK, HAVING SAID 23 THAT, COMMISSIONER SPERING, YOU KNOW, I HAD THE GREAT HONOR OF 24 BEING THE CHAIR TWICE FOR MTC HE COULD HAVE BEEN THE CHAIR 25

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BOTH TIMES IF HE WOULD HAVE ACCEPTED IT. AND TO MY VICE CHAIR, OR NOW CHAIR, YOU KNOW, I TRY 11 TO INCLUDE HIM IN AS MUCH AS I COULD. BECAUSE WHEN I WALKED 12 AWAY FROM BEING THE CHAIR, I WANTED HIM TO BE READY. AND 13 BELIEVE ME, HE WAS READY FROM THE DAY HE WALKED INTO THE VICE 14 15 CHAIRMANSHIP. HE IS ONE OF THE YOUNGEST POLITICIANS I HAVE 16 EVER MET IN MY LIFE AND THERE IS GREAT THINGS AHEAD FOR THIS MAN WHATEVER HE WANTS TO DO AND I WOULD JUST SAY TO NICK, LET 17 HIM BE CHAIR AND YOU'LL HAVE IT NEXT TIME. HE'S GOING TO LEAN 18 ON YOU, AND YOU LENA HIM, AND HE WOULD ALWAYS SUPPORT ME IN 19 THE MEETINGS AND BACK ME UP, BUT IF I WAS WRONG HE WOULD LET 20 21 ME KNOW AFTER THE MEETING. SO IT ALL OF YOU THANK 24 YOU, THANK YOU TO ADRIENNE FOR TAKING THE TIME TO COME ON, TO 25

MOTION 4 5 PASSES UNANIMOUSLY. 6 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: GREAT THANK YOU. AND THANK YOU TO 7 8 COMMISSIONER HAGGERTY FOR SECONDING THAT MOTION AND TRYING TO 9 THROW ME OFF. ITEM 12 LEGISLATION COMMITTEE. 10 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: CHAIR, I THINK THERE IS AGENDA ITEM 11E 11 BAY AREA TRANSIT OPERATOR FINANCIAL UPDATE. 12 13 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: LET'S GO BACK TO THAT. JOSEFOWITZ. 14 15 THEN I'LL TURN IT OVER TO STAFF TO MAKE THE PRESENTATION. 16 THERESA ROMMELL: THIS IS THERESA ROMMELL WITH MTC'S POLICY AND 17 PROGRAMING SECTION. GOOD ALMOST AFTERNOON. NOTED, AS WE SAID 18 WE WOULD AT PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS MEETING EARLIER THIS 19 MONTH, STAFF HAS PREPARED FOR YOU OVERVIEW OF TRANSIT OPERATOR 20 21 AND FINANCIAL SERVICE STATUS AND HOPEFULLY SOMEBODY IS 22 BRINGING UP THE PRESENTATION. THE INTENT OF THIS PRESENTATION 23 IS TO PROVIDE SOME CONTEXT AHEAD OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF REMAINING COVID RELIEF FUNDING. AS WELL AS PROVIDE SOME 24 DETAILS SURROUNDING HOW OPERATORS ARE COPING WITH THE IMPACTS 25

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OF THE PANDEMIC AND THEIR BUDGET AND SERVICE PLANNING EFFORTS. 1 GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. FIRST OFF, THE NUMBER ONE IMPACT 2 3 OF THE COVID PANDEMIC HAS BEEN THE DRAMATIC LOSS OF RIDERSHIP WITH THE ONSET OF THE SHELTER-IN-PLACE ORDERS THERE WAS AN 4 5 IMMEDIATE PLUNGE IN RIDERSHIP THAT HAS ENDURED TODAY FOR THE MOST PART. THE SHARPEST DECLINES ARE AMONG OPERATORS THAT 6 DISPROPORTIONATELY CARRIED PEAK HOUR COMMUTERS PRE-PANDEMIC 7 8 SUCH AS BART, CALTRAIN, GOLDEN GATE AND WETA. SMALL BUS OPERATORS THAT SERVED AND CONTINUE TO SERVE TRANSIT DEPENDENT 9 10 RIDERS HAVE SEEN GREATER RIDERSHIP RECOVERY. HOWEVER, ON AVERAGE RIDERSHIP WAS DOWN 80% FROM APRIL THROUGH NOVEMBER OF 11 2020 COMPARED TO THE SAME TIME PERIOD IN 2019. NEXT SLIDE. ONE 12 PHENOMENON THAT WE HAVE SEEN SINCE THE PANDEMIC IS THE SHIFT 13 IN RIDERSHIP SHARES BY OPERATOR. WHILE AT ONE TIME BART AND 14 SFMTA HAD THE LION'S SHARE OF RIDERSHIP IN THE REGION, TODAY 15 16 AC TRANSIT IS CARRYING MORE RIDERS THAN BART. THIS IS REVEALING IN THAT IT TELLS US SOMETHING ABOUT EACH SYSTEM'S 17 SHARE OF TRANSIT DEPENDENT RIDERS GIVEN THAT PRETTY 18 UNIVERSALLY ANYONE WHO IS RIDING TRANSIT TODAY IS LIKELY TO BE 19 A TRANSIT DEPENDENT RIDER. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WE HAVE BEEN 20 21 HEARING A LOT BOTH AT OUR COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION MEETINGS AS 22 WELL AS AT BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE MEETINGS THAT SCHOOL SERVICE IS AN ESSENTIAL FACTOR IN THE RIDERSHIP NUMBERS FOR MANY 23 OPERATORS BUT HOW BIG OF A FACTOR AND FOR WHICH OPERATORS. WE 24 CAN SEE HERE THAT PREPANDEMIC SCHOOL TRIPS ACCOUNT FOR 25

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APPROXIMATELY 8 MILLION TRIPS A MONTH ON AVERAGE AND THEIR 100 1 SCHOOL AND SUPPLEMENTAL ROUTES THAT TARGET STUDENTS. 15% OF 2 RIDERS WERE K THROUGH 12 STUDENTS. FOR SYSTEMS SHOWN ON THE 3 RIGHT OF THE BOX ON THE SLIDE STUDENTS ACCOUNT FOR 20% OR MORE 4 5 OF TOTAL RIDERSHIP. THE PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS FROM SOME SYSTEMS CAN BE AS HIGH AT 40%. FOR REASONS SHOWN ON THIS SLIDE 6 THERE IS NO WAY THAT SYSTEMS CAN FULLY RECOVER UNTIL STUDENTS 7 8 GO BACK TO FULL IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION AND MANY PARENTS WILL ALSO NOT BE ABLE TO RETURN TO WORK. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. -- --9 DESPITE THE DRAMATIC PLUNGE IN RIDERSHIP WE HAVE SEEN SOME 10 SYSTEMS REINSTATING SERVICE TO ACCOMMODATE THE ONGOING NEED 11 FOR TRANSIT DEPENDENT FOR LOCAL TRIPS FREOUENCIES FOR SUMMER 12 2020 AND NOW COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN INCREASED IS MOST 13 PRONOUNCED FOR MUNI WHICH PUT BACK A LOT OF ROUTES THEY HAD 14 INITIALLY SUSPENDED NEXT SLIDE. THIS IS A RIDERSHIP HEAT MAP 15 16 FOR AC TRANSIT WHICH SHOWS WHICH ROUTES HAVE RETAINED THE MOST RIDERSHIP PRE AND POST PANDEMIC MTC'S RIDERSHIP FELL BY SIX% 17 BETWEEN FEBRUARY AND AUGUST THE GREATEST LEVELS OF RIDERSHIP 18 RETAINED HAVE ABOUT IN THE COMMUNITIES OF RICHMOND SAN PABLO 19 AND OAKLAND. NEXT SLIDE. SIMILARLY SAMTRANS WHICH SAW A 63% 20 DROP IN RIDERSHIP OVER THE SAME TIME PERIOD HAS SEEN THE 21 22 GREATEST RETAINMENT OF RIDERSHIP ALONG EL CAMINO REAL AND DALY 23 CITY RECREATIONAL RIDERSHIP DECREASING FALLEN BY A GREATER PERCENTAGE A LOT OF OPERATORS FIND THE NEED TO PROVIDE EXTRA 24 SERVICE TO COMPLY WITH SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIREMENTS. NEXT 25

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SLIDE. THIS SLIDE SHOWS SOME OF THE VARIATION IN HOURS OF 1 SERVICE PROVISION BY OPERATOR THEY JUST SPOKE ABOUT WHILE SOME 2 3 OPERATORS ARE OPERATING AT 80 TO 90% OF PREPANDEMIC LEVELS OTHERS HAVE DROPPED TO ABOUT 30%. NEXT SLIDE. IN COMPARISON 4 5 THIS SLIDE SHOWS THE VARIATION AMONG OPERATORS OF RIDERSHIP AS A PERCENTAGE OF PREPANDEMIC RIDERSHIP THE RANGER OF 6 PREPANDEMIC RIDERSHIP OF SOME SYSTEMS IS 5 TO 50% DECLINE NEXT 7 8 SLIDE. THIS SLIDE COMPARES BY OPERATOR THE PERCENTAGE OF PREPANDEMIC SERVICE BEING PROVIDED WITH THE PERCENTAGE OF 9 PREPANDEMIC RIDERSHIP ON AVERAGE REGION-WIDE OPERATORS ARE 10 SERVING 20% OF PRECOVID RIDERSHIP WITH ABOUT 60% OF PRECOVID 11 SERVICE. NEXT SLIDE. THERE HAS ALSO BEEN A LOT OF INTEREST AND 12 CONCERN ABOUT THE PHENOMENON OF PASS UPS THESE OCCUR PRIMARILY 13 WHEN DRIVERS BYPASS STOPS EVEN WHEN PASSENGERS ARE WAITING 14 BECAUSE THE VEHICLE IS TOO FULL TO ACCOMMODATE ADDITIONAL 15 16 PASSENGERS DUE TO SOCIAL DISTANCING REOUIREMENTS. NEXT SLIDE. TURNING TO OPERATOR BUDGETS I WANT TO TOUCH ON THE IMPACTS THE PANDEMIC HAS HAD ON OPERATING 4 5 REVENUE BAY AREA OPERATORS ARE FUNDED WITH A VERY DIVERSE MIX OF OPERATING REVENUES WITH DIFFERENT VULNERABILITIES DOWNTURNS 6 AND CATASTROPHIC EVENTS LIKE THE ONE WE'RE IN NOW. TRANSIT 7 8 OPERATING REVENUE THAT EXISTS IN FISCAL YEAR 20202 THIRDS LESS IN EQUAL PARTS FROM COMBINATION OF FARE BOX REVENUE EITHER 9 COUNTY TAX OR TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT TAXES REST 10 INCLUDES STREET TRANSIT ASSISTANCE GENERAL FUND PARKING 11 REVENUE PROPERTY TAX BRIDGE TOLLS FEDERAL FUNDS AND A VARIETY 12 OF OTHER SOURCES HAVING LOST 1.1 BILLION IN REVENUE BETWEEN 13 MARCH AND DECEMBER 2020 WITH FARE REVENUES BEING SEVERELY 14 IMPACTED. STANDING TO LOSE 1.3 BILLION OVER A TELL MONTH 15 16 PERIOD A THIRD OF PREPANDEMIC OPERATING REVENUES. NEXT SLIDE. DUE TO THE VARIED MIX OF OPERATING REVENUES REVENUE IMPACTS 17 HAVE VARIED GREATLY BY OPERATOR AS WELL. REVENUE LOSSES 18 BETWEEN MARCH AND DECEMBER OF 2020, AS A PERCENTAGE OF FISCAL 19 YEAR 2019 BUDGETS, RANGE FROM THE SINGLE DIGITS TO 57%. THE 20 IMPACTS HAVE BEEN MOST SIGNIFICANT ON OUR OPERATORS THAT ARE 21 22 HEAVILY RELIANT ON FARE PARKING AND TOLL REVENUES MAINLY BART CALTRAIN GOLDEN GATE SFMTA AND WETA. WITH SFMTA THEY HAVE ALSO 23 BEEN HIT PARTICULARLY HARD WITH SALES TAX LOSSES DESPITE THE 24 FACT THAT SALES TAXES IN THE REST OF THE REGION HAVE NOT BEEN 25

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NEARLY AS BAD BUT THEY HAVE BEEN PRETTY BAD IN SAN FRANCISCO. 1 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ON THE EXPENSE SIDE, OPERATORS HAVE BEEN 2 3 WORKING TO REDUCE EXPENDITURES TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE -- I'M SORRY GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE. I THINK I COVERED THIS ONE 4 5 ALREADY. ON THE EXPENSE SIDE OPERATORS HAVE BEEN WORKING TO REDUCE EXPENDITURES TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE KEEPING IN MIND 6 THAT ONE OF THE EXPRESS INTENTS OF FEDERAL COVID RELIEF HAS 7 8 BEEN TO AVOID STAFF LAYOFFS AND FURLOUGHS. ACROSS ALL OPERATORS TOTAL STAFF LEVELS HAVE DECREASED BY OVER A THOUSAND 9 EMPLOYEES FOR A 6% OF PRECOVID STAFFING. THIS DECREASE IS 10 RELATED TO THE FACT THAT NEARLY ALL OPERATORS HAVE IMPLEMENTED 11 EITHER A HIRING FREEZE OR WAGE FREEZE AS WELL AS PLACING 12 LIMITS ON OVERTIME EXPENSE INCLUDE EARLY RETIREMENT PROGRAMS 13 AND SHIFTS OF STAFF FROM OPERATIONS TO CAPITAL PROJECTS CHART 14 15 ON THE RIGHT SIDE SHOWS RELATIVE CHANGES AND STAFFING LEVELS 16 FOR SELECT OPERATORS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. BAY AREA TRANSIT OPERATORS ARE PROJECTED TO LOSE 1.3 BILLION OVER THE FIRST 12 17 MONTHS OF THE PANDEMIC. THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS ALLOCATED 18 2.2 BILLION IN RELIEF FUNDING TO THE BAY AREA. WE PLANNED TO 19 DISTRIBUTE REMAINING 80 MILLION IN COVID-19 RELIEF WHEN WE 20 21 COME TO PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS COMMITTEE NEXT MONTH, IN 22 MARCH. THERE IS STILL UNCERTAINTY RELATED TO WHEN RIDERSHIP WILL COME BACK AND AT WHAT LEVEL. OPERATORS FACE A DIFFICULT 23 CHOICE IN DECIDING WHEN TO INCREASE SERVICE TO MEET CURRENT 24 DEMAND IN THE FUTURE NOT KNOWING WHAT THE FUTURE REVENUE 25

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LEVELS WILL LOOK LIKE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ONE VERY IMPORTANT 1 OUESTION THAT WE NEED TO THINK ABOUT IS HOW READY OUR SYSTEMS 2 3 WILL BE ONCE RIDERS ARE READY TO RETURN. TRANSIT OPERATORS FACE IMPORTANT DECISIONS OVER THE NEXT FEW MONTHS RELATED TO 4 5 THEIR RETURN OF RIDERSHIP IS HOW SOON THEY'LL NEED TO PULL THE TRIGGER ON INCREASING SERVICE LEVELS TO ACCOMMODATE DEMAND. 6 SOME OUESTIONS FACING TRANSIT OPERATORS INCLUDING HOW TO 7 8 APPROACH THE BUDGETS INCLUDE RATE OF VACCINE ROLL OUT AND 9 CUSTOMERS. AND HOW SHOULD THE PANDEMIC BE FACTORED INTO BUDGET DECISIONS. LEAD TIME FOR MANY OPERATORS TO CHANGE SERVICE 10 ROUTING OR FREQUENCY VARIES FROM 1 TO 9 MONTHS ESTABLISHED ON 11 PROCESSES AND LABOR CONTRACTS AND REOUIREMENTS INVOLVED WITH 12 ADJUSTING SERVICE INCLUDE PLANNING COORDINATION WITH PARTNER 13 AGENCIES OUTREACH PUBLIC HEARING TITLE SIX ANALYSIS AND OF 14 COURSE BOARD APPROVAL. MANY RIDERS LIKELY WON'T COME BACK TO 15 16 PUBLIC TRANSIT WITHOUT SUFFICIENT SERVICE LEVELS AND CONFIDENCE THAT TRANSIT WILL BE THERE FOR THEM. AND THIS 17 18 CREATES KIND OF A CHICKEN AND EGG PROBLEM. DO OPERATORS WAIT FOR DEMAND RETURN BEFORE INCREASING SERVICE OR RISK INCREASING 19 SERVICE ADD EXPENSE IN ANTICIPATION OF DEMAND SO AS NOT NO 20 LOSE POTENTIAL RIDERS. NEXT SLIDE. LAST ONE. IN CLOSING I WANT 21 22 TO THANK NEW STAFF TERENCE LEE AND BILL BACON FOR PULLING ALL 23 THIS INFORMATION TOGETHER FOR THIS PRESENTATION. AND I WANT TO GIVE A NOD TO THE TRANSIT AGENCIES THAT WORKED WITH US TO 24 PROVIDE THEIR DATA PERSPECTIVES AND PARTICULARLY AC TRANSIT 25

ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH THERESA FOR THAT

THERESE MCMILLAN: SURE. AND THANK YOU MR. CHAIR. AS YOU ALL 11 MAY REMEMBER LAST MONTH, WE HAD MADE THE INITIAL ALLOCATION OF 12 MONEY FROM THE CRRSAA FUND, THIS NEXT WAVE OF COVID RELIEF, 13 AND, BUT WITH THE INTENT THAT ALMOST ABOUT 80% OF IT OR SO IS 14 15 -- OR 70%, STILL NEEDS TO BE ALLOCATED. AND OUR CONCERN -- AND 16 THIS IS SHARED BY THE TRANSIT OPERATORS -- THIS IS SUFFICIENT TO GET US THROUGH THE END OF THIS FISCAL YEAR BUT THEN BY THE 17 NEXT FISCAL YEAR WE ARE GOING TO HAVE TO BE MAKING, 18 COLLECTIVELY, AS A REGION, SIGNIFICANT DECISIONS ON HOW ANY 19 ADDITIONAL REVENUE THAT MAY BE MADE AVAILABLE FROM WASHINGTON 20 21 THERE IS YET ANOTHER COVID PACKAGE BEING DISCUSSED WE DON'T KNOW THE OUTCOME OF THAT, BUT AT SOME POINT THIS ELUSIVE NEW 22 NORMAL NEW STABLE POSITION HAS GOT TO BE REALIZED. AND THE 23 NEXT FISCAL YEAR WILL, FOR THE TRANSIT OPERATORS, AND 24 ESTABLISHING THOSE BUDGETS, HINGES IN LARGE PART ON REVENUE 25

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ALLOCATION DECISIONS THAT YOU ALL WILL BE MAKING AS THE 1 COMMISSION. SO THE FUND ESTIMATE ITEM THAT WE SAW EARLIER IS A 2 3 CRITICAL PART IN THIS LARGER CIRCLE OF FACTORS THAT WE NEED TO CONSIDER IN TOTAL. YOU KNOW, THE MORE THAT INFORMATION WE GET 4 5 THE MORE DATA POINTS WE HAVE ON HOW THESE DECISIONS, SERVICE 6 LEVELS WITH RIDERSHIP, WITH WHO IS COMING BACK AND WITH WHAT LEVEL, WHAT OTHER, YOU KNOW, CIRCUMSTANCES DO THE TRANSIT 7 8 OPERATORS THEMSELVES NEED TO ADDRESS IN TERMS OF THEIR OWN UNIOUE OPERATING CIRCUMSTANCES, IS JUST A SERIES OF IMPORTANT 9 CONSIDERATIONS THAT WILL BE BEFORE THE COMMISSION, BETWEEN NOW 10 AND THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR, IS SO WE WANTED TO MAKE SURE 11 THAT WE WERE PROVIDING YOU WHAT NEW INFORMATION WE KNOW ABOUT 12 WHERE THINGS ARE TODAY AND CONTINUE BUILDING ON THAT AS THESE 13 14 SUBSEQUENT DECISIONS WILL BE COMING BEFORE YOU.

16 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH THERESE.

17 COMMISSIONER PAPAN?

19 GINA PAPAN: CLARIFICATION. FISCAL YEAR? IS EVERYONE ON THE20 SAME FISCAL YEAR AND WHAT IS THAT TIME FRAME, PLEASE?

THERESE MCMILLAN: SO THE FISCAL YEAR 2021 IS WHAT WE'RE IN RIGHT NOW, THAT ENDS END OF JUNE. SO THEN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR WILL BE JULY, YOU KNOW, AND THAT WILL BE THE '21/'22 FISCAL YEAR. TO CLARIFY MY POINT, THE CRRSAA MONEY, THAT'S A HORRIBLE

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1 ACRONYM BUT THAT'S WHAT WE HAVE, THE SECOND WAVE THE COVID 2 ASSISTANCE, YOU KNOW, WE BELIEVE, AND WE'LL BE BRINGING BACK 3 RECOMMENDATIONS NEXT MONTH TO YOU, AS TO HOW TO DO THAT AND 4 THAT IN LARGE PART WILL HELP US GET THROUGH THE CURRENT FISCAL 5 YEAR. THAT'S THE ANALYSIS THAT WE HAVE RIGHT NOW. IT'S THE 6 FOLLOWING FISCAL YEAR THAT'S YET ANOTHER SIGNIFICANT DECISION 7 POINT. SO THAT'S THE INFORMATION WE HAVE FOR YOU.

9 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU THERESE AND THANK YOU
10 COMMISSIONER PAPAN. KIMBERLY SEEING NO OTHER COMMISSIONERS. DO
11 WE HAVE ANY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO WISH TO COMMENT AND HAVE
12 WE RECEIVED ANY WRITTEN COMMUNICATION?

14 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: I HAVE RECEIVED NO WRITTEN

15 COMMUNICATION, AND I HAVE ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR 16 HAND RAISED. MR. ROLAND LEBRON YOU HAVE TWO MINUTES.

SPEAKER: THANK YOU. I WOULD LIKE TO COMMENT ON TWO AGENCIES AT 18 19 COMPLETE OPPOSITE ENDS OF THE SPECTRUM. YOU HAVE CALTRAIN AND SAMTRANS AND CALTRAIN IS THE OTHER ONE THAT CHANGED SERVICE 20 21 RATHER THAN CHANGING FREQUENCY OF THE SERVICE. IN CALTRAIN'S 22 CASE IT WAS A CATASTROPHE. BECAUSE WHATEVER SAMTRANS MANAGEMENT DID, THEY ACHIEVED SOCIAL DISTANCING ON EVERY 23 SINGLE TRAIN THAT WE ARE OPERATING AT OVER 100% CAPACITY THESE 24 WHERE THE TRAINS ARE RESPONSIBLE [INDISCERNIBLE]. THEY RAN OUT 25

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OF CARES ACT FUNDING AT THE END OF DECEMBER RIGHT NOW THEY'RE 1 GOING AFTER THE CAPITAL MARKET TO BORROWER \$15 MILLION AGAINST 2 MEASURE R REVENUES. MOVING ON TO VTA. THE VTA CUT SERVICE SO 3 MUCH THAT AT THE END OF DECEMBER, THEY HAD \$125 MILLION LEFT 4 5 IN CARES ACT FUNDING AFTER THEY ACCOUNTED FOR THE REVENUE LOSSES FROM TAX INCOME. AND THE RESULT OF THAT, THEY ENDED UP 6 LEAVING LET ME WRAP UP ON THAT RIGHT NOW THE PROJECTIONS ARE 7 8 AT THE END OF JUNE THEY WILL HAVE LESS THAN \$9 MILLION OF CARES ACT SURPLUS LEFT OVER THEY END UP LEAVING HUNDREDS OF 9 PEOPLE ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD EVERY DAY AND SOME OF THESE 10 PEOPLE STARTED PICKING UP BRICKS AND SMASHING WINDOWS OF BUSES 11 AS THEY WENT BY. THOSE ARE MY TWO CENTS AND HOPEFULLY WE'LL 12 ADDRESS THIS MOVING FORWARD. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 13
