MAYOR OF 12 NOVATO, MYSELF, MAYOR OF [INDISCERNIBLE] AND MAYOR OF 13 SAUSALITO WENT INTO THE SONOMA COUNTY FACILITY WHERE THEY USE 14 15 PALLETS FOR THE HOMELESS. AND I -- IF PEOPLE HAVEN'T SEEN 16 THIS, I WOULD BE GLAD TO ARRANGE FOR A TOUR. MY EYES WERE OPENED UP. AND IT'S REALLY, I THINK, A GOOD OPPORTUNITY, AND I 17 THINK I'M SPEARHEADING AN EFFORT TO TRY TO GET SOMETHING DONE 18 SOON, TO ALLOW FOR A STAGING OF THOSE THAT ARE IN THE 19 ENCAMPMENT TO, AT LEAST A HARD ROOF OVER THEIR HEAD BEFORE 20 21 THEY GET SUPPORTIVE HOUSING. THE COUNTY DID IT, ACTUALLY IT WAS ON CITY OF SANTA ROSA LAND. THEY THOUGHT IT WAS COUNTY 22 LAND BUT THEY SORT OF MISSED IT A LITTLE BIT. THEY HAVE 60 23 PALLETS, AND THESE ARE, LIKE, TINY HOMES, BUT THEY DON'T HAVE 24 A KITCHEN INSIDE. I'M REALLY IMPRESSED. AND SUPERVISOR RABBIT, 25

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I WAS REALLY VERY PROUD TO BE ABLE TO TOUR IT AND HOPING THAT
 MARIN CAN EMULATE THAT SOON. SO I JUST WANTED TO ENCOURAGE
 PEOPLE IF THEY HAVEN'T SEEN IT, TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS AND I CAN
 PROVIDE THAT CONTACT INFORMATION FOR YOU AND I AM SURE
 SUPERVISOR RABBIT COULD AS WELL.

LIBBY SCHAAF: THANK YOU. IN OAKLAND WE HAVE BEEN USING THE 7 8 SAME MODEL SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT PRODUCT CALLED CALIFORNIA CABIN, WE HAVE BEEN RUNNING THESE FOR MORE THAN 3 YEARS NOW, 9 INCREDIBLY SUCCESSFUL MODEL OF HARM REDUCTION AND RESOLVING 10 VERY DANGEROUS ENCAMPMENTS IN A HUMANE AND DIGNIFIED WAY. 11 THANK YOU FOR SHARING THAT. I'M A HUGE FAN. ANY OTHER 12 COMMITTEE MEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS? ALL RIGHT. HEARING NONE, AND 13 SEEING NO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WISHING TO SPEAK, THE NEXT 14 15 ITEM IS THE CHAIR'S REPORT. SO, AGAIN, THIS IS AN 16 INFORMATIONAL ITEM. I AM SO HONORED AND SO EXCITED TO SERVE AS THE CHAIR FOR THE INAUGURAL, THE VERY FIRST JOINT MEETING OF 17 THE NEW BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY OVERSIGHT 18 COMMITTEE, AND THE ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE, WHICH IS CHAIRED BY 19 THE COMMITTEE STASHED THE NEW BAHFA OVERSIGHT 20 MAYOR WILSON. 21 COMMITTEE TO SERVE AS A COUNT PART TO THE ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE, AND AS OUR AGENCIES PARTNER, MTC AND ABAG TO LAUNCH 22 THE EXPANDED REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO, I AM SO EXCITED THAT 23 MTC HAS ADDED THIS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. THIS JOINT BODY IS 24 GOING TO REALLY GUIDE THE WORK OF MTC AND ABAG, AND BAHFA. MTC 25

TECHNICALLY SERVES AT BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCING AUTHORITY AS 1 WE ENGAGE THIS INCREDIBLY NEW POWERFUL TOOL THAT WAS GIVEN TO 2 3 US BY THE STATE LEGISLATURE. I DON'T NEED TO TELL ANYONE THAT THIS WORK IS MORE URGENT NOW THAN EVER. THE BAY AREA'S UNDER 4 5 LYING HOUSING CHALLENGES HAVE BEEN EXACERBATED BY COVID-19 AND IT'S TURNED A NEW SPOTLIGHT ON THE PERSISTENT RACIAL AND 6 INCOME INEQUALITIES IN OUR HOUSING SYSTEM AND MORE RESIDENTS 7 8 ARE DISPROPORTIONATELY FOLKS THAT HAVE BEEN PUSHED INTO HOMELESSNESS. YET THIS PRESENTS INCREDIBLY POWERFUL NEW 9 OPPORTUNITIES TO SUCCESSFULLY ADDRESS THESE CHALLENGES AND A 10 NEW FEDERAL ADMINISTRATION WITHOUT THAT PARTISAN GRIDLOCK 11 HOPES TO PUT THE KIND OF RESOURCES INTO HOUSING THAT WE HAVE 12 NOT SEEN FOR DECADES. WE HAVE AN UNPRECEDENTED STATE BUDGET 13 SURPLUS ALONG WITH LEGISLATIVE PROPOSALS TO BEGIN TO REFORM 14 OUR HOUSING SYSTEMS OVER THE LONG-TERM. IF YOU HAVE NOT HEARD 15 16 BOTH THE STATE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY HAVE CALLED FOR \$20 BILLION OVER THE NEXT 5 YEARS, \$4 BILLION A YEAR, IN THIS STATE 17 BUDGET, TO ADDRESS HOMELESSNESS. AND I AM FRESH OFF OF A PRESS 18 CONFERENCE WITH THE BIG CITY MAYORS OF CALIFORNIA, A 19 BIPARTISAN GROUP OF MAYORS THAT ADDED OUR VOCAL SUPPORT TO THE 20 21 PROPOSAL THAT HAS COME FROM THE LEGISLATURE. WE ALSO HAVE NEW REGIONAL COLLABORATIONS TO PROBLEM SOLVE WITH LOCAL 22 JURISDICTIONS ACROSS THE BAY AREA. I WANT TO REALLY LIFT UP 23 ALL HOME AND THE REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL, ITS WORK TO END 24 25 HOMELESSNESS AND WE'LL BE HEARING A LOT ABOUT THAT LATER IN

THE AGENDA AND I KNOW MANY MEMBERS OF THIS BOARD HAVE BEEN 1 INVOLVED IN THAT PROCESS. I THINK WE ALL AGREE THAT WE HAVE TO 2 PUSH FOR INCREASED REGIONAL COLLABORATION AND IT IS 3 EXEMPLIFIED BY THE DEEPENING PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN MTC AND ABAG 4 5 INCLUDING JOINT MEETS LIKE THE 1 THAT WE'RE IN RIGHT NOW. MOVING FORWARD, THE ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE AND BAHFA OVERSIGHT 6 COMMITTEES WILL CONTINUE TO MEET JOINTLY ON A QUARTERLY BASIS. 7 8 I AM SO EXCITED TO WORK WITH MAYOR WILSON. WE WILL BE ALTERNATING AS CHAIRS. THE COMMITTEES MAY MEET JOINTLY OR 9 SEPARATELY MORE FREQUENTLY AS THE NEED ARISES AND I LOOK 10 FORWARD TO WORKING WITH EVERYONE, MEETING TOGETHER, AND 11 ESPECIALLY WITH CHAIR WILSON AS OUR 2 COMMITTEES GET TO WORK 12 ON THIS CRISIS THAT WE ALL KNOW IS THE MOST PRESSING ISSUE FOR 13 OUR CONSTITUENTS. OUR AGENDA TODAY HAS 3 MAIN ITEMS, ALL OF 14 WHICH ARE INFORMATIONAL. FIRST WE'RE GOING TO GET AN UPDATE ON 15 16 THE LAST 6 MONTHS OF WORK TO LAUNCH THE EXPANDED REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO AND BAHFA. SECOND WE'LL RECEIVE A 17 PRESENTATION BY ALL HOME OF THE WORK OF THE REGIONAL IMPACT 18 COUNCIL AND ITS AMBITIOUS AND MUCH NEEDED GOAL OF REDUCING 19 UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS BY 75% BY 2024. MANY OF US HAVE BEEN 20 21 DEEPLY ENGAGED IN THAT WORK FOR THIS PAST YEAR. SO IT'S EXCITING TO SEE IT COME TO FRUITION. AND FINALLY WE'LL HAVE A 22 DEEP DIVE PRESENTATION ABOUT SEVERAL INNOVATIVE NEW DATA TOOLS 23 FOR LOCAL JURISDICTIONS DEVELOPED BY MTC AND ABAG STAFF AS 24 25 PART OF ABAG'S NEW REGIONAL HOUSING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

I'M EXCITED TO PROVIDE YOU WITH 16 THIS UPDATE AND WELCOME TO THE MEMBERS OF THE FIRST MEETING OF 17 OUR BAHFA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETING. AS DIRECTOR MCMILLAN SAID, THERE IS A VERY ENTHUSIASTIC STAFF HERE TO SUPPORT YOU 18 IN THE ADVANCES OF OUR WORK. THIS IS A STATUS UPDATE. IT'S 19 BEEN ABOUT 6 MONTHS SINCE WE HAVE PROVIDED YOU A STATS UPDATE. 20 THIS IS THE WORK WE HAVE BEEN DOING OVER THE LAST 6 MONTHS. 21 I'M GOING TO PRESENT YOU WITH THE QUICK SET OF HIGHLIGHTS OF 22 SOME OF THE WORK WE HAVE DONE RECENTLY. AND, CERTAINLY, WOULD 23 TAKE ANY FEEDBACK AND DIRECTION TOWARDS THE END OF THIS. SO IT 24 25 REALLY IS MOSTLY AN INFORMATIONAL ITEM. WE CAN GO AHEAD AND GO

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TO THE NEXT 1. SO JUST A LITTLE BIT, LEVEL SETTING, AFTER 1 BAHFA WAS STASHED BY A.B. 1487 IN 2019 WE WERE ON TRACK TO 2 MOVE FORWARD WITH A REGIONAL REVENUE MEASURE IN 2020, BUT AS 3 WITH MANY THINGS WE HAVE MADE A COVID PIVOT AND PART OF THAT 4 5 PIVOT IS REALLY TO TRY TO FIND WAYS TO DEEPEN THE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN ABAG AND MTC BAHFA, AS WE ADVANCE A COORDINATED 6 HOUSING STRATEGY TOGETHER, ACROSS THE AGENCIES. SO THAT'S 7 8 GOING TO INVOLVE SOME OF THE NEW TOOLS THAT WE HAVE WITH BAHFA BUT ALSO TRYING TO INTEGRATE OTHER TOOLS THAT ALREADY EXIST 9 KIND OF ON THE ABAG SIDE OF THE HOUSING AS WELL AS NEW TOOLS 10 INCLUDING HOUSING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WHICH YOU WILL 11 HEAR ABOUT LATER TODAY. AS PART OF OUR PIVOT WE HAVE A PHASED 12 APPROACH THAT TRIES TO INCREMENTALLY BUILD TOWARD THE 13 TRANSFORMATIONAL IMPACT THAT'S KIND OF AT THE HEART OF THE 14 15 PROMISE OF BAHFA AND ITS PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE AGENCIES. 16 PHASE 1 RESEARCH AND PLANNING, PHASE 2 LAUNCHING EARLY STAGE PILOT ACTIVITIES AND PHASE 3 BUILDING UPON EARLY SUCCESSES AND 17 ACHIEVING SCALE. BEFORE COVID, WE JUMPING TO PHASE 3, I DON'T 18 KNOW IF IT'S A SILVER LINING BUT GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY AND 19 CURRENT ISSUES IT'S THOUGHTFUL AND METHODICAL AS WE MOVE THIS 20 WORK. THESE ARE THE PRINCIPLES THAT WERE ADOPTED BY BOTH THE 21 COMMISSION AS WELL AS THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD TO GUIDE THE 22 WORK THAT YOU'RE UNDERTAKING TOGETHER. SO JUST KIND OF OUICKLY 23 TO TOUCH EACH OF THESE, THE FIRST REALLY AT THE CENTER OF ALL 24 THIS IS A COLLABORATIVE MULTI-AGENCY STRATEGY. BUILDING UPON 25

THE STRENGTHS OF THE DIFFERENT AGENCIES TO MOVE US IN A 1 POSITIVE DIRECTION REGIONALLY ALL TOGETHER. SECOND IS TO 2 ADVANCE THE 3 PS FRAMEWORK, SO PROTECTING OUR EXISTING 3 RESIDENTS FROM DISPLACEMENT PRESERVING EXISTING HOUSING 4 5 AFFORDABLE TO LOW-INCOME RESIDENTS AND PRODUCING HOUSING TO ALL AFFORDABILITY LEVELS AFTER THAT, AN EQUITY FOCUSED 6 OPPORTUNITY TO WORK TOGETHER STARTING WORK WITH EQUITY BAKED 7 8 INTO THE FABRIC OF THE INSTITUTION AND THE WORK. WE HEARD THAT LOUD AND CLEAR FROM THE BOARD AND ARE WORKING HARD TO MAKE 9 10 THAT HAPPEN. NEXT IS A MULTI-SECTOR PARTNERSHIP WHICH IS WE NEED PUBLIC PRIVATE SECTOR NON-PROFIT CORPORATE PHILANTHROPY 11 GOVERNMENT MULTIPLE LAYERS OF GOVERNMENT WORKING TOGETHER THIS 12 IS A REALLY COMPLEX SET OF CHALLENGES THAT WE FACE THAT'S 13 GOING TO REQUIRE CLOSE PARTNERSHIPS ACROSS THE BOARD TO GET 14 15 THE WORK MOVING FORWARD. EMBRACING INNOVATION AND CREATIVITY 16 WE ARE THE BAY AREA AFTER ALL TRYING TO DO WHAT WE CAN THAT IS NEW AND BE CREATIVE AND THOUGHTFUL ABOUT HOW WE LAUNCH NEW 17 PROGRAMS. ADDITIONALLY GIVEN THE CURRENT CIRCUMSTANCES WE'RE 18 AT, ENSURE FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY. THIS IS A COMPLEX TIME 19 WHERE THERE IS A LOT OF PAIN FELT IN LOCAL BUDGETS, AT THE 20 21 SAME TIME THAT THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR SIGNIFICANT NEW INVESTMENT AT THE STATE AND FEDERAL LEVEL. WHATEVER WORK WE 22 TAKE ON WE HAVE HEARD LOUD AND CLEAR FROM OUR POLICY MAKERS WE 23 NEED TO BE CAREFUL TO LAUNCH THIS IN A WAY THAT'S SUSTAINABLE 24 SO THAT WE CAN CARRY THE WORK LONG INTO THE FUTURE AND NOT 25

BITE OFF MORE THAN WE CAN CHIU IN THE BEGINNING. AND TO SCALE 1 WE HAVE TO MOVE INCREMENTALLY KEEPING OUR EYES ON THE PRIZE 2 3 WHICH IS REALLY TRANSFORMATIONAL IMPACT. NEXT SLIDE. UPDATES THAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING. 4 MAIN THINGS I'LL FLAG FOR YOU, 4 5 FIRST IS THE BUSINESS PLAN, SECOND IS THE CONCEPT PAPER THAT WE PUBLISHED RECENTLY, THIRD IS A FUND BEING PLANNED FOR HOW 6 WE'RE GOING TO GO ABOUT TRACKING RESOURCES AND CARRY THE WORK 7 8 FORWARD AND FOURTH QUICK HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PILOTS WE'RE LAUNCHING. FOR THE BUSINESS PLAN WE HAVE LAUNCHED AN RFP FOR 9 10 THE REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO FOR BAHFA THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION IS CLOSED AND WE HAVE RECEIVED A NUMBER OF 11 SUBMISSIONS THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN THE EVALUATION PROCESS. 12 GENERALLY THE PLAN IS ORIENTED TOWARD LAYING FOUNDATION FOR 13 FUTURE PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THIS WORK ONCE WE 14 HAVE SIGNIFICANT RESOURCES. WE'RE TRYING TO PLAN AHEAD FOR 15 16 FUTURE BALLOT MEASURES AND SIGNIFICANT APPROPRIATION AND TO DO THE LEG WORK NOW. WHAT ARE WE ASKING FOR IN THE BUSINESS PLAN? 17 BASED ON THE PRINCIPLES THAT WE HEARD EARLIER THIS, IS THE SET 18 OF TASKS THAT ARE OUTLINED IN THE PROCUREMENT. SO THERE IS A 19 OUICK KICKOFF MEETING BUT THESE NEXT 3, ITEMS 2, 3, AND 4 ARE 20 21 THE CORE OF THE BUSINESS PLAN. SO THE FIRST IS TO DEVELOP A STRATEGIC AND EQUITY FOCUSED FRAMEWORK. AND WE REALLY SEE THAT 22 AS A FOUNDATION FOR THE LATER TASK. THIS WILL BE ABLE TO SET 23 MEASURABLE GOALS, OUTCOMES FOR THE EQUITABLE IMPACT THAT WE 24 HOPE TO ACHIEVE. AND THEN THOSE CAN GUIDE WHICH TYPES OF 25

PROGRAMS AND INVESTMENTS WE'LL BE MAKING IN THE FUTURE. SO 1 AGAIN, I THINK THIS IS JUST A REALLY UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY THAT 2 3 WE HAVE TO BUILD AN INSTITUTION AT THIS TIME WHEN WE'RE COLLECTIVELY HOLDING EOUITY TO THE CENTER OF OUR WORK. SO IT 4 5 LET'S US KIND OF DO THIS IN A NEW WAY. THE NEXT ITEM, NUMBER 3, IS THE MOST CORE PART OF THE BUSINESS PLAN, WHICH IS 6 ACTUALLY IDENTIFYING DESIGNING OUR FUNDING PROGRAM. AND THAT 7 8 INCLUDES A NUMBER OF SUBTASKS THAT YOU SEE HERE BUT THIS IS ACTUALLY TO GET PROPOSALS ABOUT WHAT SPECIFICALLY WE SHOULD DO 9 10 WITH ANY FUTURE REVENUES THAT WE RECEIVE. AND DESIGN PROGRAMS ACROSS ALL 3 PS AS REQUIRED BY THE STATUTE IN A.B. 1487. AND 11 THEN NUMBER 4 IS, IN ORDER TO CARRY OUT THAT WORK, WE 12 RECOGNIZE THAT WE WILL NEED TO HAVE SOME ADJUSTMENTS TO OUR 13 OPERATIONAL STRUCTURE AND STAFFING IN ORDER TO BRING IN THE 14 RIGHT SORT OF EXPERTISE TO RUN THESE HOUSING PROGRAMS AND TO 15 16 SUSTAIN THEM IN THE LONG-TERM. AND TO NOT KIND OF -- TO HOLD IN MIND THE IMPACT ON OUR BUSINESS UNITS THAT WE ACTUALLY NEED 17 TO RUN THESE SORTS OF LARGE-SCALE PROGRAMS FOR DECADES TO 18 COME. AND NUMBER 5 THERE, IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PROPOSERS TO 19 SUGGEST ADDITIONAL IDEAS BRINGING THEIR EXPERTISE AND 20 21 KNOWLEDGE TO THE TABLE. SO WE ANTICIPATE WE'RE CURRENTLY ON TRACK TO BRING A RECOMMENDATION FORWARD FOR APPROVAL FOR 1 OF 22 THE PROPOSERS IN JULY. SO YOU WILL HEAR FROM US AGAIN THEN. 23 WE CAN MOVE TO THE NEXT SLIDE. THE NEXT ITEM IS JUST A QUICK 24 HIGHLIGHT OF THE CONCEPT PAPER THAT WE PUBLISHED. I THINK ALL 25

OF YOU HOPEFULLY AT THIS POINT HAVE SEEN THIS. WE PUBLISHED 1 2 THIS IN FEBRUARY. THIS PAPER WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON FOR A 3 LITTLE WHILE DESCRIBING THE CONTEXT AND ORIGIN OF THE EXPANDED REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO AND BAHFA. IT PROVIDES A 4 5 COMPREHENSIVE PUBLIC BRIEFING TO ENSURE THAT ALL OF OUR STAKEHOLDERS CAN TRACK THE WORK THAT'S GOING ON HERE. WE DON'T 6 WANT THIS TO BE A GAME OF INSIDE BASEBALL. WE WANT THE PUBLIC 7 8 AND OUR STAKEHOLDERS TO BE AT THE TABLE WITHES AND YOU THIS DOCUMENT LAYS THIS OUT IN A ROADMAP AND FINALLY INSPIRE 9 10 PARTNERSHIP INCLUDING ATTRACTING RESOURCES SO WE CAN ADVANCE THE SUBSTANTIVE WORK IN THE NEAR-TERM. SO WE CAN MOVE TO THE 11 NEXT SLIDE. 1 OF THE THINGS THAT WE LAID OUT IN THIS CONCEPT 12 PAPER ARE A NUMBER OF PILOT PROGRAMS THAT WE HAD BROUGHT TO 13 ALL OF YOU PREVIOUSLY LAST FALL. AND SO REALLY WITH THESE 35 14 15 PILOTS WE HAVE IDENTIFIED -- WE'RE TRYING TO DO 2 THINGS, 1 IS 16 IMPACT AN IMPACT NOW WITHIN THE HOUSING SPACE GIVEN THE TREMENDOUS NEED ALL ACROSS OUR REGION. NUMBER 2 IS TO LAY THE 17 GROUNDWORK FOR FUTURE TRANSFORMATIONAL PROGRAMS. RIGHT NOW 18 KNOWING WE DON'T HAVE THE KIND OF RESOURCES THAT WE NEED TO 19 MAKE THAT KIND OF TRANSFORMATIONAL IMPACT IMMEDIATELY BUT WE 20 21 WANT TO SET OURSELVES UP FOR SUCCESS FOR THE LARGER PROGRAMS. YOU CAN SEE THE 5 PILOTS. THE FIRST 1 IS DOORWAY WHICH IS A 22 REGIONAL COLLABORATION TO ENABLE ONLINE PLATFORM TO CONNECT 23 RESIDENTS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES. RIGHT NOW IF 24 25 YOU ARE LOOKING FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING, IT IS AN INCREDIBLY

BYZANTINE PROCESS TO ACTUALLY FIND AND THEN APPLY FOR 1 AFFORDABLE HOUSING. SO THIS IS BUILDING OFF OF SOME TREMENDOUS 2 3 WORK THAT SAN FRANCISCO HAS LED WITH THEIR DAHLIA PLATFORM. CREATING A KIND OF VERSION OF CRAIGSLIST FOR AFFORDABLE 4 5 HOUSING THAT HAS A LOT MORE FUNCTIONALITY THAN THAT. THE SECOND IS TO BUILD AND MAINTAIN AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING PIPELINE 6 DATABASE TO TRACK ALL OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS THAT 7 8 ARE AT VARIOUS STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT. ACTUALLY REALLY HARD INFORMATION TO GET YOUR HANDS ON. IT'S NOT CENTRALLY LOCATED 9 10 SO THIS COULD BE A KEY ROLE FOR BAHFA SO WE CAN GET A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF WHERE WE ARE IN TERMS OF HOUSING THAT'S 11 CURRENTLY IN THE PIPELINE AND TO MAKE A STRONG CASE TO FEDERAL 12 AND STATE PARTNERS ABOUT THE KIND OF RESOURCES THAT WE NEED TO 13 UNLOCK THE OPPORTUNITIES THAT DO EXIST WITHIN OUR PIPELINE 14 15 NOW. THIRD A PRESERVATION STRATEGY FINDING AND USING FINANCING 16 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO SUPPORT GENERALLY REHABILITATE EXISTING HOUSING BUILDING ON SOME WORK ALREADY GOING ON AT THE 17 LOCAL LEVEL AND ANTIDISPLACEMENT SERVICES NETWORK TO 18 COORDINATE IDENTIFY BEST PRACTICES FOR THE EFFECTIVE 19 DEPLOYMENT OF TENANT PROTECTION SERVICES. AT THE CONCEPT PAPER 20 21 STAGE WE DESCRIBED THIS AS A RENTAL ASSISTANCE NETWORK AND WE HEARD FEEDBACK FROM STAKEHOLDERS IDENTIFYING A NEED TO EXPAND 22 THAT TO BE BROADER THAN JUST RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND INCLUDE A 23 NUMBER OF OTHER POTENTIAL SERVICES INCLUDING LEGAL ASSISTANCE 24 25 OUTREACH EDUCATION COUNSELING ET CETERA, AND IN RESPONSE TO

THE STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK WE'RE MAKING A TWEAK TO EXPAND THE 1 PILOT TO BE A LITTLE BIT MORE INCLUSIVE. AND FINALLY HELPING 2 3 TO SUPPORT THE LAUNCH OF THE REGIONAL HOMELESS PREVENTION SYSTEM AND WE'RE GOING HEAR MORE ABOUT THAT IN THE NEXT AGENDA 4 5 ITEMS OF ALL HOME WHO HAVE BEEN LEADING THAT WORK. I WON'T GO INTO THAT IN DETAIL RIGHT NOW. WE CAN MOVE TO THE NEXT SLIDE. 6 SO THAT'S A LOT. HOW ARE WE GOING TO PAY FOR IT? WE HAVE A 2-7 8 STEP FUNDING PLAN TO TRY TO ATTRACT THE RESOURCES WE NEED TO ACTUALLY MOVE THESE PILOTS FORWARD. AND SO I THINK WE'RE 9 TRYING TO HOLD SEVERAL OF THOSE PRINCIPLES FRONT-OF-MIND. 10 ENSURING FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY WE WANT TO MAKE SURE WE HAVE 11 THE RESOURCES TO LAUNCH THE PROGRAMS OVER A NUMBER OF YEARS 12 AND PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP. AS A PART OF THAT WE HAVE A 13 BUDGET REQUEST TO THE STATE GOVERNMENT, AND WE ALSO PLAN TO 14 15 SEEK ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM PARTNERS IN THE CORPORATE AND 16 PHILANTHROPIC SECTORS. SO I THINK IT WAS BACK IN DECEMBER THAT BOTH THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD AND THE COMMISSION APPROVED 17 MAKING THE INITIAL \$18.5 MILLION BUDGET APPROPRIATION REQUEST. 18 AND SO WE CONTINUE TO MOVE THAT FORWARD. AND I KNOW MANY OF 19 YOU, ON THIS CALL, HAVE BEEN IN TOUCH WITH OUR LEGISLATIVE AND 20 21 PUBLIC AFFAIRS TEAM TO HELP DO SOME ADVOCACY TO MOVE THAT FORWARD. SO THANK YOU, YOU ALL FOR THE ONGOING ENGAGEMENT 22 THERE. MOVING TO THE NEXT SLIDE. MORE ABOUT THAT PIECE 23 SPECIFICALLY, BECAUSE THAT'S KIND OF VERY LIVE RIGHT NOW. A 24 25 COUPLE OF QUICK UPDATES, ASSEMBLYMEMBER CHU DID CHAMPION 2 OF

THE 5 PILOT IN A SPECIFIC ASK ON HIS LETTER HEAD HE HAS BEEN A 1 GREAT CHAMPION OF THIS WORK AND AUTHOR OF 1487 SO BEEN ABLE TO 2 LEAD SOME OF THAT WORK. AT THE SAME TIME A LARGE NUMBER OF THE 3 MEMBERS OF THE BAY AREA DELEGATION HAVE SIGNED ON TO THE 4 5 LETTER FOR A FULL \$18.5 MILLION ASK. WE ARE CONTINUING TO PURSUE THAT AMOUNT, AND ARE TRYING TO FIND SUPPORT FROM, KIND 6 OF, ALL CORNERS TO MAKE THAT HAPPEN. 1 THING TO FLAG LEER, AND 7 8 YOU WILL SEE IN YOUR PACKET, THIS HAS BEEN AN AREA WHERE WE HAVE HAD GREAT PARTNERSHIP WITH FOLKS IN THE NON-PROFIT 9 10 SECTOR, A NUMBER OF OUR EXTERNAL PARTNERS HAVE BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH US TO ADVOCATE AT THE STATE LEVEL FOR THESE 11 RESOURCES TO FLOW TO THE REGIONAL GOVERNMENT SO THAT WE CAN 12 MOVE THE WORK FORWARD. SO I THINK WE'RE ALREADY SEEING SOME OF 13 THE BENEFITS OF THIS KIND OF PUBLIC PRIVATE COLLABORATION. AND 14 15 THEN ONGOING STEPS, THE GOVERNOR MAY REVISE WILL COME OUT MAY 16 15TH AND THE BUDGET WILL BE ADOPTED JUNE 16TH. WE ARE IN THE 17 FINAL STRETCHES OF THIS, AND SO IF ANY OF YOU HEAR FROM OUR LEGISLATIVE AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS TEAM ASKING WHETHER THERE IS 18 ANY WAY THAT YOU CAN SUPPORT THIS, YOU KNOW, WE ARE AT A 19 CRITICAL JUNCTURE TO TRY TO MAKE SURE WE GET THIS ACROSS THE 20 FINISH LINE. LAST SLIDE. THIS HIGHLIGHTS SOME OF THE WORK WE 21 HAVE DONE TO DEVELOP THE 5 PILOTS WITH THE EXISTING RESOURCES 22 WE HAVE RIGHT NOW. BECAUSE WE HAVEN'T BROUGHT IN THE RESOURCES 23 IT'S RELATIVELY MODEST IN TERMS OF WHAT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO 24 25 DO, BUT WITH PARTNERSHIPS WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ADVANCE THE

WORK. FIRST REVISIONS TO THE BAY AREA PRESERVATION PILOT 1 PROGRAM, THERE WAS A \$10 MILLION INVESTMENT FROM MTC AND A 2 3 REVOLVING LOAN PROGRAM SO THERE WERE ADJUSTMENTS MADE TO MOVE THAT MONEY MORE SWIFTLY AND EOUITABLY. NEXT WAS TO FLAG THE 4 5 HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION SYSTEM WORK AND KEY UP THE NEXT AGENDA ITEM, THE ALL HOME OUR PARTNERS IN THE NON-PROFIT SECTOR HAVE 6 BEEN LEADING WORK WITH YOU HERE AS WELL AS A NUMBER OF 7 8 STAKEHOLDERS AS PART OF THE REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL TO TRY TO SOLVE THE BAY AREA'S ONGOING CHALLENGE OF PEOPLE EXPERIENCING 9 10 HOMELESSNESS INCLUDING A DESIGN PHASE OF A 3 COUNTY HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION SYSTEM PILOT AND I THINK OUR PARTNERS 11 WILL TALK MORE ABOUT THIS WHEN THEY GIVE THEIR PRESENTATION. 12 BUT IT'S REALLY KIND OF LEANING INTO THE LEADERSHIP THEY HAVE 13 BEEN PROVIDING. WE HAVE BEEN ACCOMPANYING THEM IN THAT WORK SO 14 15 THEY CAN CONTINUE IT. HERE IS MY CONTACT INFORMATION IF YOU 16 HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, I'M HAPPY TO FIELD THEM HERE. CHAIR BACK 17 TO YOU.

DATABASE, AND I THINK THERE SEEMS TO BE CONTROVERSY AMONG THE

NON-PROFITS AS TO WHETHER A DATABASE LIKE THIS IS NEEDED. 1 THAT'S WHAT I HAVE BEEN TOLD. SO HAVE YOU REALLY INVESTIGATED 2 ALL OF THE DIFFERENT DATABASES THAT ARE BEING USED RIGHT NOW? 3 I DON'T KNOW IF MANY PEOPLE ARE USING THE SAN FRANCISCO 1 OR 4 5 NOT. AND IN FACT, 1 OF THE PROVIDERS SAID TO ME THAT THEY THOUGHT THIS WAS KIND OF A WASTE -- THAT THEY HAD HEARD ABOUT 6 THIS BUT REALLY DIDN'T HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE ANY INPUT 7 8 INTO IT AND FELT THAT IT MAY NOT BE THE BEST USE OF LIMITED RESOURCES. SO I WAS JUST KIND OF CURIOUS AS TO WHETHER YOU HAD 9 10 HEARD THAT AS WELL? 11 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: MR. SAVER? 12 13 DANIEL SAVER: TO CLARIFY S THIS WITH RESPECT TO THE DATABASE 14 15 WITH POTENTIAL PROJECTS IN THE PIPELINE OR THE WEB PORTAL FOR 16 FOLKS TO FIND AFFORDABLE HOUSING? 17 **PAT ECKLUND:** YEAH. THERE'S -- YEAH. DEFINITELY, THE LATTER. 18 19 DANIEL SAVER: THE LAST 1. 20 21 PAT ECKLUND: HCD HAS SOME DATA AND I KNOW YOU'RE GOING TO 22 COLLABORATE WITH THEM WITH WHAT THEY HAVE GOT, BUT THE 23 FEEDBACK I GOT WAS ON THIS FINDING AFFORDABLE HOUSING 24

FINDING A 22 PLACE TO LIVE IS A FULL-TIME JOB. IF YOU ARE TRYING TO GET 23 INTO AFFORDABLE HOUSING. SO THEY HAVE TO CALL EACH INDIVIDUAL 24 25 PROPERTY FREQUENTLY AND SUBMIT SEPARATE PAPER APPLICATIONS IN

MANY STANCES EVEN IF THE SAME INFORMATION IS REQUIRED, THERE ARE LISTS THAT INCLUDE OPPORTUNITIES IN A COUNTY BUT NOT ALL OF THEM. AND THEN THERE'S A DIFFERENT LIST THAT INCLUDES OTHERS. IS A 23 LOT MORE WE CAN DO. IT'S NOT JUST A SAN FRANCISCO, OAKLAND 24 25 ISSUE, IT'S A REGIONAL ISSUE. AND WE LOOK AT THESE ISSUES,

WHEN WE COME AND WORK TOGETHER, WE CAN REALLY PROBLEM SOLVE. 1 I'M REALLY EXCITED DANIEL. I KNOW WHEN YOU WORKED IN EAST PALO 2 ALTO, NORTH FAIR OAKS, THE DISTRICT THEY -- THEY REPRESENT AND 3 GREW UP THIS IS WORKING CLASS PEOPLE LIVING 10 TO 12 IN A 4 HOUSING ALL SORTS OF DIFFERENT FAMILIES, AND FOR PEOPLE WHO 5 WERE GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY OF GROWING UP IN DALY CITY OR 6 SURROUNDING AREAS WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THEY HAVE THE 7 8 OPPORTUNITY TO SAY IN THOSE COMMUNITIES. SO, JUST WANT TO THANK YOU, AND FOR THE 11 STAFF. THANK YOU. 12 13 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH COMMISSIONER. 14 15 COMMISSIONER ROMERO? 16 17 CARLOS ROMERO, V. CHAIR: ALL RIGHT. OR WHAT WE ALL 7 8 WANT DONE IN TERMS OF IDENTIFYING AND DESIGNING A FUNDING PROGRAM. I THINK IT'S 65% OF THE RFP, AND I THINK IT'S VITAL 9 THAT WE GET THIS RIGHT. AND I CERTAINLY HOPE THAT WE WILL BE -10 - THAT THE -- OR THE CONTRACTOR THAT GETS SELECTED WILL BE 11 CONSULTING OFTEN WITH BOTH THE SERVICE PROVIDERS AND WITH 12 CITIES ABOUT THE DESIGN OF THESE FUNDING PROGRAMS. AND IN 13 PARTICULAR DEVELOPERS, NON-PROFIT DEVELOPERS, AS WELL AS SOME 14 15 MARKET RATE DEVELOPERS, BECAUSE INDEED WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO 16 FIGURE OUT WAY WHERE IS WE COULD ASSIST BOTH SIDES OF THE MARKET RATE AND THE NON-PROFIT SIDE IN INCREASING OUR 17 CAPACITIES. SO WE HOPE WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE THAT 18 INTERACTION AS WE GO AHEAD AND DEFINE AND DESIGN THIS 19 POTENTIAL FUNDING PROGRAM. THANK YOU. 20

I CERTAINLY DID NOT INTEND 15 16 TO JUMP OVER. HONESTLY, THE REPORT, I WAS MOST LOOKING FORWARD TO. I VERY MUCH APOLOGIZE ITEM 8 IS A REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL 17 OVERVIEW OF A MULTI-STAKEHOLDER GROUP CONVENED BY ALL HOME TO 18 DEVELOP A REGIONAL APPROACH TO END HOMELESSNESS IN THE BAY 19 AREA AND WE CAN DO THIS INFORMATIONAL ITEM. I APOLOGIZE TO MR. 20 21 SAVER AND ALL HOME WHOLE BE GIVING THIS REPORT. 22 DANIEL SAVER: I AM DELIGHTED TO INTRODUCE THE LEADERSHIP TEAM 23

OF ALL HOME WHO WILL PRESENT THIS ITEM THIS IS THEIR SHOWCASE

TOMIQUA MOSS: THANK YOU, DANIEL. THANK YOU CHAIR SHAAF. IT'S A 4 5 PLEASURE TO BE HERE WITH YOU THIS AFTERNOON. HELLO EVERYONE. I AM TOMIQUIA MOSS, AND I AM THE FOUNDER AND CEO OF ALL HOME. 6 I'M JOINED BY MY COLLEAGUE, KEN KIRKEY. HE AND I ARE GOING TO 7 8 WALK YOU THROUGH A PRESENTATION ABOUT THE WORK WE HAVE BEEN DOING WITH MANY OF YOU TO MAKE A REGIONAL COMMITMENT TO ENDING 9 HOMELESSNESS IN THE BAY AREA. AND I THINK STAFF MIGHT BE 10 QUEUEING UP OUR POWERPOINT. I'M GOING TO KICK US OFF HERE. 11 THOSE OF YOU WHO MAY BE LESS FAMILIAR WITH ALL HOME OUR 12 MISSION IS CENTERED AROUND 3 THINGS I THINK MAYOR EKLUND OR 13 SUPERVISOR CANEPA TALKED ABOUT HOW IMPORTANT IT IS TO ADVANCE 14 15 REGIONAL SOLUTIONS. OUR ORGANIZATION IS CENTERED AROUND HOW DO 16 WE ELEVATE REGIONAL SOLUTIONS THAT DISRUPT THE CYCLE OF POVERTY AND HOMELESSNESS. SECOND OUR ORGANIZATION IS FOCUSED 17 ON ADDRESSING THE RACIAL DISPARITIES THAT LEAD TO BLACK AND 18 BROWN AND INDIGENOUS FOLKS DISPROPORTIONATELY EXPERIENCING 19 HOMELESSNESS AND FINALLY WE REALLY WORK AT THE INTERSECTION OF 20 21 HOUSING AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY FOR EXTREMELY LOW INCOME INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES IN THE BAY AREA. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. 22 SO I WANTED TO LEVEL SET FOR THIS BODY, AROUND THE 23 SIGNIFICANCE OF THIS CHALLENGE. EVERY PERSON ON THIS SCREEN 24 25 UNDERSTANDS THE URGENCY AND LIFE AND DEATH CIRCUMSTANCES THAT

WE ARE DEALING WITH IN COMMUNITIES WITH RESPECT TO 1 HOMELESSNESS. SO WE WANTED TO JUST OUTLINE HOW SIGNIFICANT 2 THIS CHALLENGE IS AND WHY THE REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL WHICH 3 MANY OF YOU HAVE BEEN A PART OF, HAS DOUBLED DOWN ON OUR 4 5 COMMITMENT TO REDUCING UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS OVER THE NEXT 3 YEARS. THIS IS A SNAPSHOT OF BOTH THE RACIAL DISPARITIES 6 THAT EXIST AS WELL AS THE PROFOUND NUMBER OF OUR NEIGHBORS WHO 7 8 ARE EXPERIENCING THIS CRISIS ON A DAILY BASIS. NEXT SLIDE, 9 PLEASE. SO, WE HAVE A LOT OF ACRONYMS. YOU ALL ARE NOT 10 OFFENDED BY ALL THE ACRONYMS. SO THE REGIONAL IMPACT COUNCIL IS A BODY THAT ALL HOME ORGANIZED OVER THE LAST YEAR. THE RIC, 11 NINE MEMBERS OF THIS BODY ABAG AND MTC HAVE BEEN DEEPLY 12 ENGAGED WITH US TO THINK THROUGH WHAT IS OUR STRATEGY TO DRESS 13 THE CRISIS AT HAND. AND WE HAVE BROKEN THE WORK DOWN INTO 2 14 15 PHASES AS MAYOR SCHAFF JUST TALKED ABOUT, WE JUST RELEASED OUR 16 PHASE 1 WORK WHICH WE'RE GOING TO DIVE INTO TODAY, WHICH IS OUR REGIONAL ACTION PLAN, OR THE RAP, AND OF COURSE THAT HAVE 17 CENTERED AROUND THE 75% REDUCTION ACROSS THE ENTIRE REGION TO 18 REDUCE UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS OVER THE NEXT 3 YEARS. PHASE 19 TWO WHICH WE WILL BE KICKING OFF IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS 20 IS CENTERED AROUND ADDRESSING THE STRUCTURAL BARRIERS THAT 21 PERSIST AND PERPETUATE HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY IN OUR REGION. 22 UNLESS WE LOOK AT THOUGH THE ROOT CAUSES LIKE STRUCTURAL 23 RACISM, INCOME INEQUALITY AND THE WEALTH GAP WE'RE NOT GOING 24 TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS WHAT WE BELIEVE ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF 25

LARGER ISSUE IN OUR COMMUNITIES. STEP 1 WHAT IS OUR URGENT 1 ACTION AROUND BRINGING FOLKS INDOORS HOUSING AS MANY FOLKS AS 2 WE CAN AND CREATING EXITS WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY FOR THOSE FOLKS 3 AND STEP TO IS LOOKING AT ROOT CAUSES AND STRUCTURAL BARRIERS. 4 5 NEXT SLIDE. THE HEADLINE, WE ARE DEEPLY IN IMPLEMENTATION. WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE DISCUSSION WITH YOU ALL TODAY. KEN IS 6 GOING TO WALK THROUGH THE SPECIFIC DETAILS OF THE FRAMEWORK 7 8 AND HOW WE INTEND TO APPROACH THIS AUDACIOUS GOAL, AND LASTLY, THINKING THROUGH THE COALITION THAT IT'S GOING TO TAKE IN THE 9 POLITICAL AND PUBLIC WILL THAT IT'S GOING TO TAKE US TO REALLY 10 IMPLEMENT THIS PLAN WELL. SO I'M GOING TURN IT OVER TO KEN. 11

SPEAKER: GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYONE. SO GOOD TO SEE ALL OF YOU. I 13 HAVE NOT CHANGED MY NAME SINCE COMING TO ALL HOME. NAHEMA IS A 14 15 WONDERFUL PARTNER OF OURS, AND I AM KEN KIRKEY CHIEF 16 PARTNERSHIP OFFICER WITH ALL HOME. WE'RE COMING UP ON THE 1 YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF THE RIC, AS WE CALL IT, AND IT'S TERRIFIC, 17 TO ME, THAT THAT PRETTY MUCH COINCIDES WITH THE FIRST MEETING 18 OF THESE COMMITTEES, MEETING TOGETHER WITH BAHFA IT SEEMS 19 SERENDIPITOUS. THE COMMITTEE WORKED REALLY HARD COMING UP WITH 20 A PLAN THAT SWINGS FOR THE FENCES. IT'S A SHORT-TERM PLAN IN 21 THAT IT'S GEARED TO THE NEXT 3 YEARS AND IT SETS A BOLD GOAL 22 OF REDUCING UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS BAY AREA BY 75% WITHIN 23 THOSE 3 YEARS THAT IS A BOLD GOAL FOR ANYBODY WHO HAS LIVED 24 HERE FOR ANY DEPTH OF TIME IT COULD SEEM COMPLETELY AUDACIOUS 25

AND MAYBE A LITTLE BIT UNREALISTIC. BUT THE RIC DOESN'T 1 BELIEVE THAT AND NEATH DO WE. IN THE BAY AREA FOR A LONG TIME 2 3 RELATIVE TO HOMELESSNESS WE HAVE BEEN PITTING THINGS THAT ARE BOTH GOOD AGAINST 1 ANOTHER NAMELY INTERIM HOUSING AND 4 5 PERMANENT HOUSING SOLUTIONS. WE BELIEVE THE REGIONAL ACTION PLAN OUTLINES A PLAN THAT WE NEED TO AS A REGION MOVE FORWARD 6 ON BOTH FRONTS WE NEED INTERIM HOUSING SOLUTIONS AND NOT JUST 7 8 FOR ADDITIONAL SHELTERS OR EVEN MERELY TRADITIONAL CONGREGATE SHELTERS BUT NAVIGATION CENTERS TINY HOMES AND NEW 9 10 CONSTRUCTION THAT'S DEVELOPED QUICKLY AND THAT CAN SERVE AS INTERIM HOUSING FOR PEOPLE BROUGHT INDOORS. THERE IS A ROLE 11 FOR UNITS IT TAKES TIME TO BUILD BUT THAT'S NOT THE ONLY THING 12 THAT'S NEEDED FOR PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING, THERE ARE 13 RAPID REHOUSING SOLUTIONS FLEXIBILITY SUBSIDY POOLS AND 14 SIGNIFICANTLY HOUSING VOUCHERS THAT CAN MEET A LOT OF THE NEED 15 16 OF OUR POPULATION THAT IS CURRENTLY OUTDOORS TO REALLY DRIVE THOSE NUMBERS DOWN. AND THEN IN SUPERVISOR CANEPA'S COMMENTS 17 TO SOME DEGREE GOT TO THIS PIECE WHICH IS A SIGNIFICANT PART 18 OF THE PLAN, WE NEED TO PREVENT PEOPLE FROM COMING INTO 19 20 HOMELESSNESS IN THE FIRST PLACE. YOU ALL KNOW, EXTREMELY WELL, 21 THIS IS AN EXTREMELY EXPENSIVE PLACE TO LIVE. AND WE HAVE A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO ARE DOING ALL SORTS OF THINGS TO TRY TO MAKE 22 ENDS MEET, INCLUDING WORKING A COUPLE OF JOBS, INCLUDING 23 DOUBLING AND TRIPLING UP IN HOMES. THEY WILL STILL HAVE 24 25 HICCUPS BECAUSE WE ALL DO IN LIFE. IN THE HOMELESSNESS PROGRAM

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IT'S GEARED TO MEET PEOPLE WHEN THEY HAVE THOSE HICCUPS 1 2 INCLUDING THOSE IN SHORT-TERM RENTAL ASSISTANCE TO KEEP THEM 3 FROM SPIRALING INTO HOMELESSNESS AND ALLOW THEM TO STAY ON TRACK AND KEEP MOVING FORWARD WITH THEIR LIVES WITHOUT 4 5 BECOMING HOMELESS. THE 1 TO 4 ON THIS FRAMEWORK IS A RATIO WHEN WE LOOK AT THE BAY AREA WIDE AND NEEDS OF THE REGION-6 WIDE, AND THE RATIO SUGGESTS THAT FOR EVERY INTERIM HOUSING 7 8 UNIT THERE SHOULD BE 2 PERMANENT HOUSING SOLUTIONS AGAIN THEY'RE VARIED AND 4 PREVENTION INTERVENTIONS, THAT'S GOING TO 9 VARY FROM COUNTY TO COUNTY. SONOMA COUNTY'S HOMELESSNESS 10 DYNAMIC IS DIFFERENT THAN SANTA CLARA'S AND WE INTEND TO WORK 11 WITH THE COUNTIES, WORK WITH THE REGIONAL AGENCIES AS WELL TO 12 MOVE THIS FORWARD. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO AUGMENTING THE 1, 2, 13 4 FRAMEWORK ARE A RANGE OF PRIORITIES AND I'LL TOUCH ON A FEE 14 15 KEY ONES HERE. THIS IS LINKED BACK TO A MIX OF INTERIM HOUSING 16 PERMANENT HOUSING PREVENTION INTERVENTIONS SOME OF THEM ARE OUR PRIORITIES THAT HAVE BEEN LONG-STANDING ISSUES SOME OF YOU 17 ARE FAMILIAR WITH. OUR CURRENT AFFORDABLE HOUSING STRUCTURE 18 DOESN'T PRIORITIZE TO CREATE A PATH FORWARD FOR PEOPLE WITH 19 EXTREMELY LOW INCOMES. THESE FOLKS WHO ARE VULNERABLE AND 20 21 HOMELESS. THAT NEEDS TO CHANGE. WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THAT AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IS ADVANCED AND WITH EXTREMELY 22 LOW INCOMINGS ARE PART OF THE MIX OF UNITS THAT ARE AVAILABLE. 23 A LOT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE REGION IS ADVANCED THROUGH 24 25 COVENANTS RELATED TO DEVELOPMENT. WHEN THEY ARE LAUNCHED THE

25, 35 YEARS, IT MAY SEEM LIKE A VERY LONG TIME, BUT THEY 1 2 STILL EXPIRE. SO WE'RE LOSING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AS WE MOVE FORWARD AND 1 OF THE STRATEGIC PRIORITIES IN THE REGIONAL 3 ACTION PLAN IS TO CHANGE THAT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE NOT 4 5 LOSING EXISTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING AS TIME GOES FORWARD. AND LASTLY, I'LL TOUCH ON 1 OF THE PREVENTION INTERVENTIONS WHICH 6 IS ABOUT ACCELERATING A TARGETED DATA INFORMED REGIONAL 7 8 PREVENTION MODEL. WE HAVE A PILOT AT ALL HOME FOCUSED ON A FEW OF THE COUNTIES AT THIS POINT IN TIME, THAT WOULD REALLY BE 9 BENEFICIAL TO THE REGION OVERALL AND 1 OF THE THINGS THAT'S 10 REGIONAL ACTION PLAN OUTLINES IS THE POTENTIAL FOR THIS 11 BECOMING A REGIONAL FRAMEWORK. AND IT'S SOMETHING THAT COULD 12 BE A POTENTIAL ROLE FOR BAHFA DOWN THE ROAD. AND SO WITH THAT, 13 I WILL TURN IT OVER TOMIQUIA. 14

16 TOMIOUIA MOSS: DANIEL MENTIONED THIS IN HIS AND KEN REFERRED 17 TO IT. ALL HOME WAS REALLY FOCUSED ON PREVENTION WHEN WE LAUNCHED ALMOST TWO AND A HALF YEARS AGO, AND PARTLY BECAUSE 18 WHEN I WAS A PROVIDER, WORKING ON FAMILY HOMELESSNESS IN THE 19 BAY AREA, FOR EVERY FAMILY THAT I HOUSED, 3 MORE WOULD BECOME 20 21 HOMELESS DURING THE SAME PERIOD OF TIME. SO WE REALLY HAVE TO BE LOOKING AT INFLOWS. SO WE WANTED TO FIGURE OUT HOW WE MIGHT 22 SETUP A REGIONAL HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION SYSTEM THAT PROVIDED 23 OPPORTUNITIES FOR JURISDICTIONS TO REALLY DO DEEP TARGETING, 24 WHO ARE THE FOLKS MOST AT RISK OF BECOMING HOMELESS. BECAUSE 25

IT'S NOT EVERYONE. EVERYONE WHO MAY HAVE HAD A COVID RELATED 1 JOB LOSS, EXAMPLE, MAY NOT END UP BEING HOMELESS. SO WE WANT 2 3 TO MAKE SURE THAT THE REGIONAL PREVENTION, HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION SYSTEM, FIRST, IS DATA INFORMED. WE HAVE BEEN 4 5 WORKING WITH PARTNERS IN NEW YORK AND LOS ANGELES TO REALLY CREATE A DATA INFORMED ASSESSMENT TOOL THAT CAN BE USED ACROSS 6 THE ENTIRE BAY AREA TO REALLY UNDERSTAND WHO, IN FACT, IS MOST 7 8 AT RISK. WE HAVE CREATED A DATA PLATFORM THAT ALLOWS JURISDICTIONS NON-PROFITS PROVIDES WHO ARE CONTRACTED WITH 9 10 THEIR CITIES AND COUNTIES TO PLUG INTO THE SYSTEM AND HAVE A STREAMLINE DATA EXPERIENCE FOR THE USER FOR THE PEOPLE 11 APPLYING FOR THE HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION RESOURCES AS WELL AS 12 FOR THE PROVIDER'S HAVING EASY ACCESS TO THE STREAMLINE DATA 13 PLATFORM. I THINK SOMEONE TALKED ABOUT THIS EARLIER. WE 14 15 UNDERSTAND THAT HOUSING ASSISTANCE DOLLARS IS ONLY 1 PART OF 16 OUR HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION INTERVENTIONS, WE NEED TO BE LOOKING AT LEGAL SERVICES AND CASE MANAGEMENT. AND WE HAVE 17 REALLY AMAZING EXAMPLES OF THIS WITH PEOPLE WHEN HOUSED WITH 18 SANTA CLARA COUNTY'S HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION SYSTEM SO WHAT 19 WE'RE DOING IS BUILDING ON THE EXPERTISE AND BRILLIANCE THAT'S 20 21 ALREADY IN THE FIELD AND WE'RE LAUNCHING A PILOT THAT IS UNDERWAY WITH SAN FRANCISCO, FREMONT, OAKLAND, CONTRA COSTA 22 COUNTY WILL BE COMING ON-BOARD. SO OVER THE NEXT 3 YEARS, IT'S 23 OUR GOAL TO BRING ALL 9 COUNTIES ON TO THE PLATFORM AND REALLY 24 25 HELP FOLKS ENGAGE IN A REGIONAL HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION

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NETWORK AND THESE ARE SOME OF THE COMPONENTS THAT WE THINK ARE 1 KEY IN ALLOWING US TO LEVERAGE THE PUBLIC RESOURCES THAT HAVE 2 3 COME FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TOWARD RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND BRINGING IN PRIVATE RESOURCES TO AUGMENT THOSE, SO THAT WE CAN 4 5 ACTUALLY SCALE THE DOLLARS THAT WILL BE AVAILABLE TO PEOPLE WHO NEED THEM MOST. AND SO FAR, WE HAVE RAISED \$22 MILLION, 6 PRIVATELY, TO SEED THIS FUND, AND WILL BE ABLE TO AUGMENT 7 8 THOSE RESOURCES WITH ALL OF THE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE TOWARD RENTAL ASSISTANCE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, WE 9 HAVE TALKED A LOT ABOUT THE 1, 2, 4, FRAMEWORK, WE WANTED TO 10 GIVE YOU A SENSE OF WHAT IT'S GOING TO TAKE FOR US TO 11 IMPLEMENT THIS WORK. WHAT WE INTEND TO DO -- AND WHEN I SAY 12 "WE" I MEAN THE ALL HOME TEAM AND OUR PARTNERS. THIS IS NOT 13 JUST MY STAFF THIS IS OUR TECHNICAL COMMITTEE MEMBERS WHO ARE 14 15 PART OF THE RIC, THIS IS CITY AND COUNTY LEADERSHIP WHO WE 16 HAVE BEEN MEETING WITH TO REALLY TALK ABOUT WHAT THEY NEED TO WORK TOWARD THESE GOALS SO OUR FIRST STEP WILL BE TO EVALUATE 17 WHAT COUNTIES AND CITIES ARE SPENDING RIGHT NOW, AND WHAT THE 18 EXISTING RESOURCES ARE AVAILABLE. AND WE HEARD THIS A LOT FROM 19 OUR RIC MEMBERS, RIGHT? WHAT ARE WE MOST EFFECTIVELY UTILIZING 20 OUR OURSELVES RIGHT NOW. AND THEN THE SECOND PIECE OF THAT IS 21 THEN ALIGNING THOSE EXISTING RESOURCES AGAINST THIS FRAMEWORK. 22 AND AS KEN SAID, THE RATIOS WILL VARY. AND WE HAVE MODELING 23 FOR EVERY COUNTY THAT, BASED ON THE POINT IN TIME COUNT THAT 24 25 WE HAVE AVAILABLE THAT GIVES JURISDICTIONS A SENSE OF HOW MUCH

INTERIM, HOW MANY PERMANENT AND HOW MANY PREVENTION INTENTIONS 1 MIGHT BE NEEDED TO GET TO THAT 75% REDUCTION. AND THEN LASTLY, 2 3 WE ARE TAKING THE LEAD FROM MANY OF YOU ALL WHO HAVE BEEN DOING TREMENDOUS ADVOCACY AROUND NEW RESOURCES. WE UNDERSTAND 4 5 THAT WE HAVE A GAP IN WHAT WE NEED TO SOLVE HOMELESSNESS AT SCALE. SO WE WANT TO BETTER UNDERSTAND WHAT THOSE GAPS ARE AND 6 THEN COLLECTIVELY ORGANIZE OURSELVES AS A REGION TO FIGHT FOR 7 8 THOSE RESOURCES AT EVERY LEVEL OF GOVERNMENT, FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL. SO, THAT IS THE PROCESS OF IMPLEMENTATION FOR THE 9 10 1, 2, 4, FRAMEWORK. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. NOW IS THE TIME FOR US TO ENGAGE WITH MANY OF YOU. THESE ARE QUESTIONS FOR 11 DISCUSSION. WE WOULD LOVE TO HEAR YOUR REACTION TO BOTH THE 12 AUDACIOUS GOAL AND WOULD LOVE SOME OF OUR RIC MEMBERS TO KIND 13 OF TALK ABOUT WHY THEY BELIEVE THAT THIS IS THE WORK AHEAD OF 14 15 US. ALSO, IS THIS SOMETHING FOLKS CAN SUPPORT? AND WHAT ELSE 16 DO PEOPLE NEED IN ORDER TO ACCOMPLISH THIS AUDACIOUS GOAL? SO, 17 MADAM CHAIR, I'LL TURN IT BACK OVER TO YOU FOR DISCUSSION.

19 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. AND I WOULD BE REMISS TO SAY 20 THAT TOMIQUIA MOSS, FOUNDER AND CEO IS 1 OF THE MOST VISIONARY 21 AND POWERFUL PUBLIC SERVANTS I'VE EVER HAD THE PLEASURE OF 22 WORKING WITH. IT'S A PLEASURE TO BE WORKING WITH YOU ON THIS. 23

24 SPEAKER: THANK YOU MA'AM.

LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: LET ME START BY ASKING IF THERE ARE ANY
 DISCUSSION BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEES ON THIS ITEM? I'LL
 START BY CALLING ON COMMISSIONER RONEN.

5 DIR. HILLARY RONEN: THANKS FOR THAT PRESENTATION. THIS IS REALLY EXCITING. AND THE FIRST TIME I HAVE EVER SEEN IT. SO 6 IT'S NEW TO ME, AND, THANK GOODNESS I'M SEEING IT SO I CAN 7 8 BRING IT BACK TO THE WORK WE'RE DOING IN SAN FRANCISCO. I'M A LITTLE WORRIED THAT IT'S THE FIRST TIME I HAVE SEEN IT OR 9 HEARD OF IT. AND SOMEHOW THAT INFORMATION ISN'T GETTING BACK 10 TO US ON THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. BUT, THERE IS ALWAYS THE 11 FIRST, AND WE CAN FIGURE THIS OUT AND WE CAN MAKE IT HAPPEN. 12 BUT A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS. I LOVE THE 1-2-4 FRAMEWORK, IT 13 MAKES COMPLETE SENSE TO ME. AND I'M JUST WONDERING, HOW THAT 14 15 FRAMEWORK IS RESONATING IN ALL OF THE LOCAL COUNTIES, FOR 16 EXAMPLE, IN SAN FRANCISCO, WE JUST HAD A MEASURE THAT, 17 THANKFULLY, PROBABLY DIED IN COMMITTEE. [LAUGHTER] BUT THAT WOULD HAVE REOUIRED A TEMPORARY HOUSING OPTION FOR EVERY 18 HOMELESS PERSON SLEEPING ON THE STREET AND THAT WOULD HAVE 19 UPENDED A 1-2-4 FRAMEWORK. SO I'M WONDERING -- AND THAT IS 20 COMING FROM SO MUCH PRESSURE FROM HOUSING NEIGHBORS WHO DON'T 21 WANT TO SEE PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS ON THE STREET AND 22 SO KNOWING THAT, THAT PRESSURE IS PROBABLY IN EVERY COUNTY, 23 JUST HOW, HOW YOU DEAL WITH THOSE -- THOSE TYPES OF MEASURES 24 ON THE LOCAL LEVEL THAT TRY TO UNDERMINE THIS FRAMEWORK AND 25

HOW THAT'S -- THAT'S THOUGHT OF. AND THEN MY SECOND QUESTION 1 IS, JUST KNOWING THE AMOUNT OF MONEY THAT IT TAKES TO BUILD 2 3 PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING. WELL, TO BUILD THE TEMPORARY. [LAUGHTER] THE TEMPORARY SPACES. THE NUMBERS ARE OBSCENE IN 4 5 SAN FRANCISCO, ESPECIALLY, BUT I'M SURE THAT WE'RE NOT ALONE. WHAT EFFORTS AND DISCUSSION IS HAPPENING ON THE FEDERAL LEVEL? 6 BECAUSE OUR REGION CANNOT FUND OUR WAY OUT OF HOMELESSNESS 7 8 ALONE. AND, YOU KNOW, KIND OF THE ROOTS OF THE PROBLEM IS THAT, THAT OUR STATE TAKES UP SUCH A LARGE BURDEN OF THE 9 10 UNHOUSED POPULATION IN THIS COUNTRY, AND YET, WE HAVE TO DEAL WITH IT WITHIN OUR STATE AND WITHIN OUR LOCAL BUDGETS. AND WE 11 NEED THE KIND OF FEDERAL INVESTMENT THAT CAN REALLY ALLOW US 12 TO ACHIEVE THESE AMBITIOUS GOALS, WHICH I LOVE, AND I'M SO 13 GRATEFUL THAT THAT'S THE FRAMEWORK THAT YOU'RE WORKING IN. 14

16 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER RONEN. I KNOW, CERTAINLY IN OAK, WE'RE GOING TO REQUEST THIS PRESENTATION TO 17 BE SCHEDULED TO OUR CITY COUNCIL WITH HOPEFULLY AN ENDORSEMENT 18 SO EVERY JURISDICTION COULD CERTAINLY BRING THIS BEFORE THEIR 19 BODY FOR AN ENDORSEMENT, AND I DON'T KNOW IF YOU ALL WANT TO 20 21 ANSWER THE QUESTION ABOUT THE -- WHAT'S GOING ON IN THE FEDERAL LEVEL, BUT WE JUST SAW 1 OF THE LARGEST AMOUNTS OF A 22 PROPOSAL FOR FEDERAL DOLLARS, RECOGNIZING THAT HOUSING IS 23 INFRASTRUCTURE. SO LET US CELEBRATE THAT. MS. MOSS, OR MR. 24

SAVER, PLEASE, IF YOU HAVE RESPONSES TO THE QUESTIONS RAISED.
 AND THEN I'LL BE CALLING ON MY CO-CHAIR COMMISSIONER WILSON.

SPEAKER: YES I'M HAPPY TO TAKE THOSE OUESTIONS. THANK YOU 4 5 SUPERVISOR RONEN. IT'S GREAT TO SEE YOU. WE HAVE BEEN IN CONVERSATION WITH PRESIDENT WALTON ABOUT BRINGING THIS -- THE 6 PLAN TO THE BOARD. SO WE ARE JUST BEGINNING THESE BRIEFINGS 7 8 WITH -- WE MET WITH CONTRA COSTA COUNTY JUST YESTERDAY. SO OUR INTENT IS TO BRING THE RAP AND HAVE THESE DISCUSSIONS AT YOUR 9 10 BODIES, SO IT'S JUST A MATTER OF WORKING WITH OUR TEAM TO GET 11 THEM SCHEDULED. WE ARE PREPARED TO DO THAT. AND, JUST FOR YOUR REFERENCE, MAYOR BREED HAS BEEN A PART OF THE REGIONAL IMPACT 12 COUNCIL, SO WE HAVE BEEN WORK WILLING THE ADMINISTRATION AS 13 WELL IN -- -- FORMULATING THESE RECOMMENDATIONS. TO YOUR 14 OUESTION ABOUT THE RECEPTIVITY OF THE 1-2-4 FRAMEWORK HAVE 15 16 BEEN VERY POSITIVE FEEDBACK. WE HAVE ENGAGED IN COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND CITY AND COUNT LEADER IN DEVELOPING 17 THE PLAN SO WE DIDN'T WANT A FRAMEWORK THAT WAS UNREALISTIC IN 18 TERMS OF HOW WE'RE EVALUATING THEIR HOMELESSNESS SYSTEM AND 19 WHAT YOU SAID RELATIVE TO LOCAL JURISDICTIONS AND BUSINESS 20 21 BEFORE AND HOW THEY PIVOT TO REALLY EMBED THEIR POLICY AND STRATEGIES AND RESOURCES TOWARD THIS FRAMEWORK WITH THE 22 STRATEGY OF IMPLEMENTATION LEANING INTO COUNTIES WE HAVE 23 RESOURCES TO BE ABLE TO PROVIDE STAFF CAPACITY TO COUNTIES TO 24 25 BE ABLE TO ASSEMBLE DATA TO REALLY UNDERSTAND WHO IS THE

POPULATION AND WHAT ARE THEIR NEEDS SO WE CAN CUSTOMIZE THESE 1 INTERVENTIONS APPROPRIATELY. I THINK IT'S GOING TO TAKE TIME 2 3 TO SOCIALIZE THE MODEL BUT ALSO TO LEAN IN AND UNDERSTAND WHAT THE NEEDS ARE AND IMPEDIMENTS ARE TO REALLY GETTING TO THE 4 5 GOAL. THE LAST THING I WOULD SAY ABOUT THAT IS FOLKS ARE EXCITED ABOUT TAKING A STAND ON REDUCING UNSHELTERED 6 HOMELESSNESS. IT IS CRIPPLING TO OUR ENTIRE ECOSYSTEM OF THE 7 8 BAY AREA. AND SO IT HAS BEEN AN INCREDIBLY REFRESHING TO HEAR PEOPLE'S EXCITEMENT AND THIRST. WE HAVE HEARD FROM REGULAR 9 CITIZENS AFTER WE RELEASED THE RAP WHO ARE JUST SO EXCITED 10 THAT THERE IS A PLAN. THERE IS MO MENT UM. WE HAVE AN 11 EXTRAORDINARILY OPPORTUNITY RIGHT NOW FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 12 DECADES, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS NOT JUST SORT OF TURNING 13 ITS EYES TO PAYING ATTENTION TO HOUSING IT'S PUTTING ITS MONEY 14 15 WHERE ITS MOUTH IS AND SO WE HAVE DOING A TON OF FEDERAL 16 ADVOCACY WITH OUR PARTNERS IN DC TO DIRECT THOSE RESOURCES TO 17 THE RIGHT INTERVENTIONS. FOR RENTAL ASSISTANCE FOR EXAMPLE, WE GOT A TON OF MONEY AND NOW WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THOSE DOLLARS 18 ARE GOING TO OUR ELI HOUSEHOLDS THAT THEY'RE GOING TO MOM AND 19 POP LANDLORDS WHO REALLY NEED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO MAINTAIN 20 21 THEIR PROPERTIES AND KEEP PEOPLE HOUSED. SO WE THINK THERE IS RESOURCES BUT THE MORE IMPORTANT WORK IS DIRECTING THOSE 22 RESOURCES TOWARD OUTCOMES AND THAT'S THE WORK THAT WE LOOK 23 FORWARD TO DOING WITH ALL OF YOU. BECAUSE IF YOU HAVE ALL THE 24 MONEY IN THE WORLD AND YOU'RE NOT SPENDING IT TOWARD REDUCING 25

UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS AS AN EXAMPLE, THEN WE'RE NOT BEING
 EFFECTIVE.

4 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. CO-CHAIR WILSON?

5

LORI WILSON, CHAIR: THANK YOU. MS. MOSS, I REALLY APPRECIATE 6 THE PRESENTATION, AND KEN KIRK, AS WELL. THE FRAMEWORK IS 7 8 GREAT. AND THE AUDACIOUS GOAL IS AUDACIOUS AND 1 THAT IS VERY MUCH NEEDED. ASSUME IS BUILT ON THAT PRECOVID NUMBER, THE 75% BASED ON A
NORMAL TIME? OR IS IT FACTORED IN WHAT WE'RE EXPERIENCING NOW?
I KNOW WE'RE HAVING THESE MORATORIUMS AND ALL THESE THINGS IN

8 SPEAKER: YEAH. GREAT QUESTIONS. THE 1-2-4 FRAMEWORK USED DATA FROM THE 2019 PICK COUNTS. BECAUSE OF THE POINT IN TIME COUNTS 9 WERE SUSPENDED IN MOST JURISDICTIONS IN THE BAY AREA IN 2020, 10 WE ANTICIPATE THAT THOSE NUMBERS WILL VARY BASED ON, YOU KNOW, 11 A REALTIME ASSESSMENT OF THE HOMELESSNESS MANAGEMENT 12 INFORMATION SYSTEM OR HMIS, IN EACH OF THE JURISDICTIONS. SO, 13 YOU KNOW, 1 OF THE THINGS THAT REMEMBER IS THAT THIS IS A 14 15 DYNAMIC MODEL. SO WHEN WE DO THE ANALYSIS WITH JURISDICTIONS, 16 IT REALLY WILL BE USING DATA AS REALTIME AS POSSIBLE TO SET THOSE RATIOS MOST APPROPRIATELY. SO I THINK YOUR POINT IS WELL 17 TAKEN. THERE HAVE BEEN SOME PROJECTIONS THAT THERE BEING HAVE 18 BEEN AT LEAST A 20 TO 30% INCREASE IN HOMELESSNESS ACROSS THE 19 NATION, AND CERTAINLY, WE ANECDOTALLY KNOW THAT MORE OF OUR 20 NEIGHBORS HAVE BEEN NEGATIVELY IMPACTED BY COVID. SO, WE CAN 21 ADJUST THE MODEL BASED ON REALTIME DATA. AND THAT, I THINK, IS 22 THE WORK AHEAD AS WE LEAN INTO JURISDICTIONS. 23

LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I SEE THAT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR 1 2 THERESE MCMILLAN HAS RAISED HER HANDS. DIRECTOR M, DO YOU HAVE 3 SOMETHING YOU WANT TO ADD BEFORE I CONTINUE CALLING ON COMMISSIONERS? 4 5 THERESE MCMILLAN: NO. I CAN WAIT. 6 7 8 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: YOU WILL WAIT YOUR TURN, LIKE VACCINATION. MAYOR PAT EKLUND. 9 10 PAT ECKLUND: MS. MOSS, GREAT PRESENTATION, AND FROM YOUR WHOLE 11 TEAM. I DON'T KNOW IF YOU HAVE TALK WITH ANYBODY IN MARIN 12 COUNTY BUT IT SURE WOULD BE HELPFUL TO KNOW IF YOU HAVE, WHO 13 YOU HAVE TALKED WITH, SO WE CAN APPLY THAT INFORMATION. BUT I 14 15 WOULD LIKE TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR YOU TO COME TO MARIN 16 COUNTY TO TALK TO SOME OF THE PROVIDERS THAT WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH, AT LEAST IN THE CITY, BUT THEN ALSO TALK TO THE 17 MAYORS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS AND THE COUNTY AS WELL, AT THE 18 ELECTED LEVELS, AND, BECAUSE WE MEET ONCE A MONTH. SO WOULD 19 LOVE TO YOU HAVE COME. I GUESS MOST OF THE CITIES THAT I --20 THAT I'M FAMILIAR WITH, IN THE BAY AREA, ARE LIKE NOVATO, 21 WHERE WE DON'T GET MONEY FOR HUMAN AND HEALTH SERVICES. SO WE 22 DON'T GET MACHINE TO DO INTERIM HOUSING FOR THE CRITICAL 23 HOMELESS FOLKS THAT ARE IN THE ENCAMPMENTS. WE DON'T GET MONEY 24 25 TO DO ANY OF THAT. PERMANENT HOUSING SOLUTIONS, WE DON'T GET

MONEY FOR THAT EITHER. WE HAVE TO APPLY FOR GRANT MONEY OR 1 HOME KEY MONEY OR SOMETHING LIKE THAT. BUT, FOR ME, FOR --2 BECAUSE EACH COUNTY HAS THEIR OWN PHILOSOPHY ON HOW TO WORK 3 WITH THOSE THAT ARE UNSHELTERED, AND IT'S HARD TO SOMETIMES 4 5 CHANGE THAT APPROACH WITHOUT A MAJOR EFFORT. SO HOW -- WHAT CAN WE DO WITH THIS CONCEPT OF INTERIM HOUSING TO GET MORE 6 MONEY TO CITIES THAT CAN DO SOME INTERIM HOUSING, INNOVATIVE 7 8 THINGS, LIKE WHAT OAK HAS DONE, OR PALLETS, OR TINY HOMES, SO THAT WE CAN GET THOSE THAT ARE CHRONICALLY HOMELESS UNDER A 9 REAL ROOF SO THAT THEN THEY CAN START GOING THROUGH SOME CASE 10 MANAGEMENT DISCUSSIONS TO, HOPEFULLY, GET INTO A MORE 11 PERMANENT HOUSING OPTION. BECAUSE I -- THERE -- WE HAVE NO 12 WE'RE THE POOREST PROPERTY TAX CITY IN MARIN COUNTY. 13 MONEY. WE ONLY GET \$0.07 ON THE DOLLAR MOST OTHER CITIES GET BETWEEN 14 15 15 AND \$0.28 ON THE DOLLAR. WE ONLY GET \$0.07. AND WE HAVE A 16 STRUCTURAL DEFICIT. SO I DIDN'T SEE, IN THE PRESENTATION, 17 WHERE MONEY CAN BE MADE AVAILABLE, AT LEAST TO PURCHASE, LIKE, THE PALLETS OR THE TINY HOMES, OR WHATEVER THESE THINGS ARE 18 CALLED, AND THEN WORK WITH THE COUNTY TO START PROVIDING CASE 19 MANAGEMENT. AND THE COUNTY KEEPS SAYING THEY NEED MORE FUNDS 20 FOR CASE MANAGEMENT. SO, CAN YOU HELP ME UNDERSTAND HOW THAT 21 FIRST STEP WOULD BE FUNDED? 22

24 **KEN KIRKEY:** I THINK COMMISSIONER SCHAFF CAN RELATE TO THIS AS 25 WELL, THIS IS FRANKLY 1 OF THE THINGS THAT DON'T WORK WELL IN

THE REGION TO THE VARYING DEGREES AROUND THE BAY AREA. THIS IS 1 2 LARGELY A COUNTY FUNDING ISSUE. CITIES ARE TASKED, HOWEVER, AS 3 YOU ARE PROBABLY ACUTELY AWARE OF DEALING WITH THE ON THE GROUND PROBLEM. AND PART OF WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO DO THROUGH 4 5 THE PLAN IS TO FOSTER COORDINATION AMONG COUNTIES WHICH IS REALLY IMPORTANT AND NOT JUST SUPPORTING THE COUNTIES IN THE 6 TOUGH JOB THAT THEY HAVE, THE RAP IS ATTEMPTING TO DO THAT, 7 8 BUT ALSO MORE COORDINATION WITHIN COUNTIES. AS WE GO AROUND THE REGION WE SEE IN DIFFERENT COUNTIES AND DIFFERENT PLACES 9 SOME HAVE A HIGHER LEVEL OF CONVERSATION AMONGST THEIR CITIES 10 AND COUNTY GOVERNMENT THAN OTHERS, AND THAT'S SOMETHING WE 11 THINK CAN BE A POSITIVE, BECAUSE WE HAVE MODELS WORKING 12 SOMEWHAT BETTER, AND IN MARIN FOR FOLKS YOU WOULD LIKE US TO 13 BE TALKING WITH WE WOULD BE HAPPY TO REACH OUT DIRECTLY AND 14 15 ENGAGE WITH THEM.

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LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: I'LL ASK MY STAFF TO REACH OUT AS WELL, 17 IN OAKLAND, WE PRIVATELY FUND RAISED THE START UP COST FOR THE 18 5 OR 6 COMMUNITY CABIN SITES WE HAVE AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 19 KIDS DID BAKE SALES TO RAISE ENOUGH MONEY TO PURCHASE 1 OF THE 20 CABINS. IT'S ABOUT 22,500 PER BED HALF THE COST OF THE SAN 21 FRANCISCO [INDISCERNIBLE] CENTER, AND WE HAVE THE SAME EXIT 22 RATE. I WOULD BE HAPPY TO FOLLOW UP WITH YOU PRIVATELY. THIS 23 IS A CONVERSATION THAT WE ALL SHOULD BE HAVING. ABE-KOGA? 24 25

DIR. MARGARET ABE-KOGA: I COME FROM SANTA CLARA COUNTY AND
 ACTUALLY WATCHING YOUR PRESENTATION REMINDED ME OF LAST YEAR
 WE ACTUALLY PASSED A COUNTY-WIDE COMMUNITY PLAN TO END
 HOMELESSNESS OUR TARGET IS 2025. MY QUESTION IS HOW DO YOU
 COORDINATE WITH COUNTY THAT MAY HAVE EXISTING PLANS?

TOMIQUA MOSS: THANK YOU VERY MUCH COMMISSIONER FOR THAT 7 8 COMMENT AND QUESTION. DESTINATION HOME ACTUALLY IS 1 OF MY COFOUNDING PARTNERS OF ALL HOMES. SO WE HAVE BEEN IN DEEP 9 PARTNERSHIP WITH DESTINATION HOMES IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY FROM 10 OUR INCEPTION. WHAT'S BRILLIANT ABOUT DOING THIS WORK 11 REGIONALLY IS WE DON'T ACTUALLY HAVE TO REINVENT THE WHEEL. WE 12 HAVE A LOT OF REALLY FANTASTIC WORK THAT IS GOING WELL, THAT 13 IS SHOWING OUTCOMES THAT WE CAN BUILD ON. SO WE'RE ACTUALLY 14 15 MEETING WITH THE COC IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY TOMORROW TO REALLY 16 TALK ABOUT, HOW DO WE TAKE THAT COMMUNITY PLAN AND ACCELERATE THE WORK THAT THEY'RE TRYING TO DO WITH OUR STRENGTHENED 17 NUMBERS. AND THIS IS ACTUALLY WHAT I WAS GOING TO SAY TO MAYOR 18 EKLUND. WE CAN ACTUALLY DO MORE WHEN WE ARE ORGANIZED AS A 19 REGION. AND SO SANTA CLARA COUNTY DOESN'T HAVE TO DO SOLE 20 21 ADVOCACY ON ITS OWN TO THE STATE AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. WE CAN DO THAT AS A REGION BECAUSE WE CAN ALIGN AROUND THE 22 COLLECTIVE GOALS THAT EACH OF THE JURISDICTIONS ARE DOING. SO 23 WE REALLY ARE BUILDING ON WHAT THE COUNTIES AND CITIES HAVE 24 25 ALREADY DONE. OAKLAND HAS A PATH PLAN. YOU KNOW, BERKELEY IS

WORKING, YOU KNOW, MAYOR ARREGUIN'S LEADERSHIP. SO WE JUST
 WANT TO BE AN ACCELERATOR, AND AN ORIENTATION TO OUTCOMES.
 AND SO THAT, I THINK, IS GOING TO BE SORT OF THE COMPLEMENTARY
 NATURE IN WHAT THE RAP IS TRYING TO DO.

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6 LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. DEFINITELY STRENGTHENING
7 NUMBERS WINS CHAMPION SHIPS. YOU'RE SHOWING YOUR DUB NATION.
8 BEFORE I CALL ON MAYOR ARREGUIN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, MCMILLAN,
9 DID YOU WISH TO SPEAK NOW?

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THERESE MCMILLAN: SURE. AND IT'S JUST BECAUSE TOMIQUIA IS SUCH 11 A BRILLIANT MIND SHE TOOK ON WHAT I WAS GOING TO BRING UP. BUT 12 MAYBE I CAN CHARACTERIZE IT A DIFFERENT WAY. I WAS REFLECTING 13 ON THE COMMENTS AND OBSERVATIONS, BOTH WITH YOUR PRESENTATION, 14 15 TOMIQUIA, AS WELL AS DANIEL'S WHEN WE WERE TALK BY THE TIME 16 EXPANDED REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO. AND REALLY TRYING TO ADVANCE THE PILOTS. AND YOU KNOW, REFLECTING AS WELL, ON THE 17 REALITY THAT HOUSING AND HOMELESS GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE REALLY 18 HAS BEEN DIRECT AT A VERY LOCAL LEVEL, AT THE CITY AND COUNTY. 19 AND THAT, OUITE FRANKLY WE PROBABLY SHOULDN'T BE SURPRISED IN 20 21 THAT SOME ARE VESTED IN HOW THEY HAVE DONE THINGS LOCALLY TO DATE. BUT WE KNOW THAT THE PROBLEM IS NOT LOCALIZED AND 22 DOESN'T, YOU KNOW, RESPECT JURISDICTIONAL BORDERS, RIGHT? AS 23 MANY OF OUR REGIONAL ISSUES ARE. I GUESS WHAT I WAS GOING TO 24 ASK, AND I THINK YOU ANSWERED IT, IS THAT AS WE'RE IN THIS 25

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PILOT PHASE, YOU KNOW, HOW DO WE THINK ABOUT WORKING WITH THE 1 2 WILLING, RIGHT, TO REALLY ADVANCE THE FACT THAT WE CAN DO 3 THINGS DIFFERENTLY AT A REGIONAL LEVEL AND BY VIRTUE OF THAT, BUILD A FOUNDATION FOR THIS REGIONAL APPROACH, IN THIS PILOT 4 5 WINDOW THAT WE HAVE. AND MAYBE THIS'S LESS A QUESTION, AS MUCH AS AN ARTICULATION OF THE CHALLENGE WE HAVE, PARTICULARLY WITH 6 YOU ALL AS LEADERS OF HOW WE SORT OFFING TO NELL THAT SPACE. 7 8 SO I DON'T KNOW -- -- TOMIQUIA IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO COMMENT ON THAT, BUT THAT WAS WHERE I WAS HEADED. 9

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TOMIQUA MOSS: SURE. THROUGH THE CHAIR. I MEAN I COMPLETELY 11 AGREE THAT WE WANT TO DEMONSTRATE WINNINGS. WE WANT TO WORK 12 WITH FOLKS WHO BELIEVE THAT THIS IS POSSIBLE. I MEAN, THE 13 BIGGEST OBSTACLE IN MY MIND, OF REACHING OUR GOALS, IS THE 14 15 SKEPTICISM THAT IT'S POSSIBLE. AND SO WE, ABSOLUTELY, NEED TO START WITH PILOTS AND PARTNERSHIPS THAT ARE ALREADY HAPPENING, 16 PLACES WHERE WE KNOW WE CAN GET SOME MOMENTUM GOING. AND 17 THIS'S BEEN THE FUN THING ABOUT LEADING ALL HOME, I HAVE TO 18 SAY, IS BECAUSE YOU CAN LEAN INTO THE PEOPLE WHO ARE, LIKE, 19 YES! AND THEN YOU KIND OF GO FOR IT. WE'RE MEETING WITH 20 HAYWARD NEXT WEEK, AND THEY'RE, LIKE, FOR EXAMPLE, GET US IN, 21 OUR CITY IS READY TO SIGN UP AND GET 75% REDUCTION. IT'S KEY 22 TO THE REGIONAL STRATEGY TO WORK MACRO AND MICRO IN ORDER TO 23 FACILITATE THE OUTCOMES THAT WE WANT. 24

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LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: GREAT. THANK YOU. AND NOW THE CHAIR OF
 ABAG, MY FAVORITE NEXT DOOR NEIGHBOR, MAYOR ARREGUIN.

JESSE ARREGUIN: THANK YOU VERY MUCH CHAIR SCHAFF. I AM REALLY 4 5 EXCITED BY THIS JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE OPPORTUNITIES DEEPEN THE PARTNERSHIP WITH MTC AROUND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF BAHFA 6 AND ADDRESSING THE ISSUES AROUND HOMELESSNESS AND HOMELESSNESS 7 8 PREVENTION. I THINK SUPERVISOR CANEPA SAID THIS EARLIER THAT HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS IS A REGIONAL PROBLEM. AND 9 UNFORTUNATELY UP UNTIL RECENTLY THERE HASN'T BEEN THE LEVEL OF 10 DISCUSSION AND COLLABORATION ON A REGIONAL LEVEL ABOUT 11 DEVELOPING A PLAN AND SOLUTIONS THAT WE CAN IMPLEMENT WITH ALL 12 OF THE 101 CITIES AND TOWNS AND 9 BAY AREA COUNTIES. I AM SO 13 INCREDIBLY EXCITED ABOUT THE REGIONAL ACTION PLAN. REALLY 14 15 PROUD TO BE ON THE STEERING COMMITTEE, WITH MANY EVER MY 16 COLLEAGUES HERE. AND I JUST WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THE IMPORTANCE OF A REGIONAL APPROACH. AND I THINK, GOING BACK TO SOMETHING 17 MS. MCMILLAN SAID, YOU KNOW, DIFFERENT CITIES, DIFFERENT 18 COUNTIES HAVE THEIR WAYS OF SORT OF DELIVERING SERVICES SO 19 WHAT IS THE ROLE FOR A REGIONAL ENTITY TO KIND OF HELP 20 21 COORDINATE SERVICES AND PROGRAMS? YOU KNOW, ON AN ISSUE WE'RE GOING TO COME OUT ON THE NEXT ITEM, THE REGIONAL EARLY ACTION 22 PROGRAM. WE RECEIVED MONEY FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA AND 23 HAVE BEEN ABLE TO DEVELOP AN INCREDIBLY EFFECTIVE PROGRAM TO 24 25 PROVIDE SERVICES TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO HELP THEM UPDATE

THEIR HOUSING ELEMENTS. AND I HEAR FROM PLANNING DIRECTORS AND 1 LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS THROUGHOUT THE BAY AREA HOW 2 3 GRATEFUL THEY ARE THE WORK THAT ABAG HAS DONE. AND THAT SHOWS HOW ABAG AND MTC CAN DELIVER A REGIONAL PROGRAM AND PROVIDES 4 5 AN OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO BUILD ON IN THE AREA OF HOMELESSNESS. I WOULD LIKE TO CALENDAR A DISCUSSION TO ADOPT THE REGIONAL 6 ACTION PLAN AS A FRAMEWORK TO GUIDE THE WORK THAT WE'RE DOING. 7 8 AND TO REALLY HAVE A CONVERSATION, HERE, AROUND WHAT IS OUR ROLE AS ABAG AND MTC, PARTICULARLY WITH THE NEW BAY AREA 9 HOUSING FINANCING AUTHORITY TO PLAY A ROLE NOT JUST WITH THE 10 HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION WORK BUT MAYBE BEING A RECIPIENT OF 11 FEDERAL FUNDS AND I THINK WE'RE NEED TO TALK ABOUT A FEDERAL 12 ASK. BECAUSE AS YOU SAID WE HAVE THIS ONCE IN A LIFETIME 13 OPPORTUNITY WITH A NEW ADMINISTRATION AND DEMOCRATIC MAJORITY 14 IN CONGRESS TO ASK FOR SOME OF THE RESOURCES FOR CALIFORNIA 15 16 FOR THE BAY AREA TO BUILD AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND PRESERVE AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND PREVENT HOMELESSNESS. I HOPE WE'LL HAVE 17 A CONVERSATION ABOUT THAT AND WITH BAHFA TO BECOME A RECIPIENT 18 OF SOME OF THAT FUNDING. THANK YOU FOR THE WORK. AND I 19 APPRECIATE THE PRESENTATION. 20

LIBBY SCHAAF, CHAIR: THANK YOU FOR THAT EXCITEMENT. VICE CHAIR
OF THE COMMITTEE AMY WORTH.

AMY R. WORTH: I AM GRATEFUL WE'RE ALL WORKING TOGETHER AND 1 THERE ARE PEOPLE WHO ARE DEDICATED TO THIS EFFORT AND TOMIQUIA 2 3 CARRIED THE MESSAGE TO SO MANY VENUES. WHEN KEN KIRKEY RETIRED FROM MTC WE WERE JUST DEVASTATED AND THEN I SAW HIM AT A 4 5 RETREAT AND I SAID KEN WE MISS YOU AND HE SAID DON'T WORRY I'M DOING GREAT WORK AND I'M NOT GOING TO TELL YOU WHAT IT IS, BUT 6 OBVIOUSLY WE ARE THRILLED. I PICKED UP ON SOME OF THE 7 8 COMMENTS, YOU PRESENTED TO OUR CONTRA COSTA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THIS WEEKEND AND THEY WERE SO IMPRESSED AND HAVING 9 10 TALKED WITH SUPERVISOR MITCHOFF AND REALLY UNDERSTANDING WHAT OUR COUNTIES, AND SOME OF THE LARGER CITIES DO THE HEAVY 11 LIFTING ON THE HOMELESSNESS ISSUE, AND WE ARE 19 CITIES 12 WORKING TOGETHER ON THESE ISSUES. SO I THINK PICKING UP ON THE 13 POINT ABOUT THE REGIONAL COORDINATION, I KNOW THERE IS A LOT 14 15 OF HUGE EFFORT THAT'S GONE ON SINCE -- I GO BACK TO THE JUNIOR 16 DAYS WHEN WE STARTED THE SAINT EPISCOPAL SANCTUARY THAT TELLS 17 YOU HOW LONG AGO, LOOKING AT THE REGIONAL APPROACH ADVOCACY FUNDING LOOKING AT CONCEPT OF BEST PRACTICES FINDING PILOTS 18 THAT ARE WORKING AND SHARING THE GOOD NEWS PROVIDING FUNDING 19 SO THAT THEY CAN BE IMPLEMENTED ACROSS THE REGION. AND I KNOW 20 21 WE'RE GOING TO BE WORKING ON THIS DEVELOPING THE ONGOING COMMUNICATION PLAN WHERE WE CAN REACH OUT TO ALL 101 CITIES, 9 22 COUNTIES, BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, I THINK, FOR EXAMPLE, CONTRA 23 COSTA, THERE ARE 19 CITIES, SOME ARE SMALL, SOME ARE LARGE, 24 AND THAT'S A RELATIVE TERM. AND I DO THINK IT WOULD BE VERY 25

HELPFUL FOR US TO LACK AT THESE KINDS OF PRESENTATIONS TO ALL 1 2 OF OUR MAYORS IN 1 ROOM. BECAUSE PEOPLE ARE REALLY DESPERATELY LOOKING FOR TOOLS. AND, AGAIN, I JUST AM SO GRATEFUL THAT, YOU 3 KNOW, FOR ASSEMBLYMEMBER CHU, YOU KNOW, WHEN WE WERE GOING 4 5 THROUGH THE PROCESS OF NEGOTIATING THE BILL, HE -- WE -- IT WAS KIND OF A FAITH, A FAITH ON HIS PART. SPEAKER: THANK YOU EVERYONE. IF I COULD PLEASE GET THE SLIDES. 4 5 THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE WHAT WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON FOR LOCAL PLANNING STAFF BY WAY OF REGIONAL DATA 6 TOOLS. THIS IS A JOINT EFFORT OF MY TEAM, THE HOUSING AND 7 8 LOCAL PLANNING TEAM, AS WELL AS THE DATA VISUALIZATION TEAM THAT MIKE WILL BE HELPING. NEXT SLIDE. AND FINALLY, FOCUSED ON THE REGIONAL PRODUCTS COHORTS WORK GROUPS AND 4 5 TRAININGS. FINALLY ON THE SIDE YOU HAVE AN EXCEL WORK 11 BOOK WITH SOME OF THE UNDERLYING DATA INCLUDING ADDITIONAL, IN 12 ADDITION TO THE 45 IN THE WORD DOCUMENT ANOTHER 20 RECOMMENDED 13 TABLES TO HELP LOCAL JURISDICTIONS TELL THEIR STORY. EACH TAB 14 15 OF THE EXCEL WORK BOOK IS A DIFFERENT TABLE AND ACCOMPANYING 16 FIGURE SO FOLKS CAN CHANGE UP THE GRAPHICS TO TAYLOR TO THEIR LOCAL JURISDICTION AND INCLUDES DETAILED SOURCE NOTES SO THEY 17 UNDERSTAND WHERE THE DATA IS COMING FROM AND WHAT IT'S SAYING. 18 IF YOU GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE, WE'LL TRANSITION INTO OUR SECOND 19 PRODUCT THE HOUSING ELEMENT SITE SELECTION TOOL. NEXT SLIDE. 20 21 LOCAL NEED HERE IS THAT HOUSING ELEMENT LAW REQUIRES A SITE INVENTORY OF LANDS SUITABLE AND AVAILABLE FOR NEW HOUSING TO 22 ACCOMPANY RHNA BY INCOME LEVEL OUR RESPONSE IS A WEB-BASED 23 TOOL IDENTIFYING SECTIONS AND POTENTIAL SITES THAT MEET 24 25 REQUIREMENTS AND FORWARDS REGIONAL AND LOCAL GOALS. KEY PRODUCT FEATURES HERE PROVIDES A WEALTH OF DATA FOR 1 2 EVERY PARCEL IN EACH JURISDICTION AND ALLOWS USERS TO FILTER 3 SITES BASED ON SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTICS, ALLOWING USERS TO EDIT THE DATA TO ENSURE THEY'RE GETTING THE MOST OUT OF TOOL 4 5 AND THAT IT'S ACCURATE. YOU CAN SCREEN OUT SITES WITH ENVIRONMENTAL OR INFRASTRUCTURE CONSTRAINTS FROM THE GET-GO 6 AND CATEGORIZE POTENTIAL SITES THAT REQUIRE SPECIFIC ANALYSIS 7 8 OR ACTION BY LOCAL JURISDICTIONS IN ORDER TO MEET HCD REQUIREMENTS. AND FINALLY AUTO POPULATES THE SITE INVENTORY 9 10 FORM THERE IS A SPECIFIC FORM THAT HCD NOW REQUIRES THIS SECTION OF THE HOUSING ELEMENT TO BE SUBMITTED IN IT WILL 11 ACTUALLY PREFILL THAT FORM IN WITH ALL DATA ASSOCIATED WITH 12 YOUR SELECTED PARCELS WITH THE RELATIVE DATA AUTOMATICALLY. 1 13 MORE SLIDE. AND 20 21 FINALLY MAKE IT POSSIBLE FOR TO EXPORT ALL OF THE DATA THAT WE HAVE YOU IN WANT TO REVIEW THIS ON YOUR OWN. ONCE THAT BASE 22 DATA HAS BEEN UPDATED, WE WANTED TO ALSO MAKE IT REALLY EASY 23 THAT AS YOU'RE REVIEWING THE SITES THAT YOU HAVE SELECTED OR 24 25 THAT I YOU'RE REVIEWING FOR POSSIBLE SELECTION, YOU MIGHT SEE

SOME OF THE UNDERLINED DATA IS INCORRECT. NOW WE'RE BUILDING 1 TOOLS IN TO MAKE SURE THAT AS YOU'RE SCROLLING THROUGH AND 2 3 SEEING THE UNDERLYING DATA NOW IT'S SIMPLE A MATTER OF SELECTING DROP DOWNS AND CHECKING BOXES TO UNDERLIE THE 4 5 INFORMATION AND AS YOU DO THAT, THAT INFORMATION IS STORED IN OUR SYSTEM AND IS UPDATING THE CATEGORIES THAT ALL SITES ARE 6 PLACED N MAKING IT A LOT EASIER TO GENERATE YOUR FINAL REPORT. 7 8 AND THAT HOPEFULLY WILL BE VERY USEFUL FOR JURISDICTIONS GOING FORWARD. BUT AGAIN VERY SIMILAR TO MICROSOFT 13 EXCEL YOU CAN SEE A LOT OF THESE FIELDS ARE PREPOPULATED WITH 14 15 HCD VALUES THAT THEY HAVE APPROVED. VERY EASY TO COME IN 16 UPDATE, CHANGE, SELECT, UNTIL THIS REPORT MATCHES WHAT YOU 17 THINK IT NEEDS TO BE AND SIMPLY CLICKING ON EXPORT ALLOWS YOU TO DOWNLOAD THAT REPORT IN THIS. CD FORM. SO, AGAIN A LOT OF 18 FOCUS ON EASE OF USE, SIMPLICITY AND THAT IS THE DRIVING FORCE 19 20 FOR ALL THE TOOLS WE HAVE DEVELOPED. WITH THAT I'LL HAND IT 21 BACK TO SOMAYA.

WE HAVE UPCOMING PRODUCTS WE'RE HOPING TO 1 2 PUSH OUT OVER THE SUMMER, FIRST IS AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHERING 3 FAIR HOUSING PRODUCTS ASSISTING WITH THE ASSESSMENT OF FAIR HOUSING, THAT IS ANOTHER REQUIREMENT OF THE HOUSING ELEMENT 4 5 TOPICS RELATED TO SEGREGATION AND DISTRIBUTION PATTERNS ADDRESSING POVERTY AND DISPARITY AND ACCESS TO OPPORTUNITY AND 6 DISPROPORTIONATELY HOUSING NEED AND DISPLACEMENT RISK ALL DONE 7 8 IN A WAY THAT'S COMPLEMENTARY TO ROBUST DATA THAT HCD HAS PROVIDED AS OPPOSED TO DUPLICATION THINKING ABOUT WHAT WOULD 9 BE MOST USEFUL TO JURISDICTIONS IN FILLING IN GAPS. I WANT TO SAY 14 15 BRIEFLY HOW MUCH I HAVE HEARD FROM OUR CITY PLANNING STAFF WAS 16 AROUND OUR COUNTY HOW DEEPLY APPRECIATIVE THEY ARE OF THESE 17 TOOLS. AS YOU KNOW THE RHNA NUMBERS ARE VERY DIFFERENTIATE THAN THEY WERE 8 YEARS AGO AND ALL OF OUR CITIES ARE HUSTLING 18 TO HIRE THE CONSULTANTS AND TO DO THE WORK. OVERALL, OVER AND 19 OVER AGAIN, I KEEP HEARING FROM OUR CITY PLANNING DIRECTORS 20 21 HOW MUCH THE WORK THAT ABAG HAS DONE, NOT ONLY THE TOOLS, BUT THE WILLINGNESS TO SIT DOWN AND MEET WITH OUR PLANNING 22 DIRECTORS AND CITY MANAGERS TO REALLY UNDERSTAND HOW THESE 23 TOOLS WORK AND TO PROVIDE THE TECHNOLOGY AND THE TECHNICAL 24 25 ASSISTANCE THAT GOES WITH T SO I JUST -- THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

 RESOURCES. SO PARTICULARLY THIS IS REALLY INVALUABLE. THANK

I HOPE THAT WE ALL RECOGNIZE THAT WE ARE OPERATING IN A 9 DIFFERENT WORLD NOW THAT WE DON'T HAVE REDEVELOPMENT 10 RESOURCES, AND SO THE NEED FOR A BALLOT MEASURE TO HELP ALL OF 11 OUR JURISDICTIONS MEET THE NEW RHNA REQUIREMENTS, I HOPE, WILL 12 HAVE MORE RESONANCE WITH LOCAL JURISDICTIONS AT THIS TIME. 13 WITH THAT, I DON'T SEE ANY OTHER PUBLIC COMMENTS OR 14 15 COMMISSIONERS OR COMMITTEE MEMBERS WITH THEIR HANDS RAISED. IT 16 IS MY GREAT PLEASURE TO ADJOURN THIS INAUGURAL JOINT MEETING. OUR NEXT JOINT MEETING OF THE ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE AND THE 17 BAHFA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE WILL TAKE PLACE -- OH, IT WILL BE 18 ANNOUNCED. IT HAS NOT YET BEEN SCHEDULED, BUT THE NEXT SPECIAL 19 MEETING OF THE ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE IS ON MAY 13TH, 2021. 20 THE JOINT MEETING, THE INAUGURAL JOINT MEETING OF THE ABAG 21 HOUSING COMMITTEE AND THE BAHFA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE IS HEREBY 22 23 ADJOURNED.
