3 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU KIMBERLY, OUR FIRST ITEM IS ITEM TWO OPENING REMARKS. AND I WANT TO THANK EVERYBODY FOR YOUR 4 5 HARD WORK ON THIS. THIS GROUP REPRESENTS OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE BRIDGES THAT WE LOVE, AND TO REALLY BUILD FOR THE FUTURE IN 6 TERMS OF OPERATIONS, FINANCE, AND MAINTENANCE GOALS, AND 7 8 REALLY, YOU KNOW, ENHANCE THOSE. AND, SO, JUST TO RUN A SUMMARY, AT OUR LAST MEETING IN JANUARY, THE WORKING GROUP 9 10 BEGAN TALKING ABOUT OUR RECOMMENDATIONS WHICH WILL FALL INTO TWO MAIN CATEGORIES, THE FIRST CATEGORY AND OUR FOCUS IN 11 JANUARY LAYS OUT STEPS TO STRENGTHEN THE BATA CALTRANS 12 PARTNERSHIP TO ENSURE ROBUST MANAGEMENT AND SETUP A JOINT 13 EXECUTIVE TEAM. AND JOINING US WITH OUR EXPERIENCE AT THE BAY 14 15 BRIDGE WE KNOW THIS WORKS WELL HOPEFUL FOR THAT. AND TODAY 16 FOCUS IS ON SECOND CATEGORY TO PURSUE STRATEGY TO KEEP PROJECTS MOVING FORWARD STRATEGY APPROVED BY BATA AS PART OF 17 THE FISCAL 2022 BUDGET. WE HAVE ADDED A WORKING GROUP MEETING 18 ON APRIL 5TH FOR STAFF TO PRESENT A WRITTEN REPORT ON ALL OF 19 THE RECOMMENDATIONS AND ANDY WILL SHARE THOUGHTS AFTER TODAY'S 20 21 MEETING ABOUT HOW TO APPROACH THE REPORT WITH THE GOAL OF PRESENTING IT TO BATA IN APRIL OR MAY AND THAT WOULD BE A 22 PRELUDE TO THE 2022 BUDGET. THAT'S TO GET A SENSE OF WHERE WE 23 ARE TODAY AND WHERE OUR HOPE IS FOR THE COMING FUTURE. MOVING 24 TO AGENDA 2A WE HAVE APPROVAL OF THE JANUARY 2021st MINUTES. 25

BEFORE WE TAKE THE VOTE, KIMBERLY I WANT TO GO BACK AND 2 3 ASK, I KNOW WE HAVE THE RECORDING BUT DID WE RECEIVE ANY CORRESPONDENCE AHEAD OF THIS MEETING TODAY? 4 5 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: I HAVE RECEIVED NO WRITTEN COMMENTS FOR 6 7 THIS ITEM. 8 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: OUR PRACTICE IS IF WE DO GET ANYTHING AHEAD 9 OF TIME WE DISTRIBUTE IT TO THE COMMITTEE. WITH THAT I'LL 10 ENTERTAIN A MOTION FOR APPROVAL. 11 12 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: MOVE. 13 14 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: DUTRA-VERNACI. AND DO WE HAVE A SECOND? 15 16 DAMON CONNOLLY: SECOND. 17 18 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER DUTRA-VERNACI, 19 AND SECOND BY COMMISSIONER CONNOLY. 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AMY WORTH, CHAIR: ITEM THREE COVID RESPONSE FOR THE BATA TOLL
 BRIDGE REHABILITATION PROGRAM. THERE ARE THREE ITEMS, 3A, AND
 3A AS A RECAP BRIDGE TOLL REHABILITATION PROGRAM AND 3B IS
 SHORT-TERM OUTLOOK AND ACTION PLAN. MAY I TURN TO STAFF FOR
 THOSE ITEMS?

PETER LEE: WAITING FOR THE SLIDES TO COME UP. MY NAME IS PETER 7 8 LEE, BATA STAFF, AND I WILL BE PRESENTING THIS ITEM WITH ROSALYNN AND WE'LL BE TALKING ABOUT THE BATA REHABILITATION 9 PROGRAM. NEXT ITEM. NEXT SLIDE. THIS IS THE AGENDA. NEXT 10 SLIDE. I WANT TO START ON THE PRESENTATION OF THE REHAB 11 PROGRAM FOLLOWING UP WITH THE THREE KEY TAKEAWAYS THAT WE WANT 12 TO PRESENTED TO THE COMMITTEE AS FOLLOW UP. OVERALL WE DID 13 HEAR FROM THE COMMITTEE TO MAINTAIN THE SAFETY OF THE BRIDGES 14 IS OF HIGHEST PRIORITY AND THAT IS THE FOCUS OF THE 15 16 PRESENTATION TODAY. WHILE WE HAVE HAD TO REPRIORITIZE OR RECALIBRATE SOME OF THE WORK WE HAVE BEEN DOING WITH THE WORK 17 OF THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM WE ARE MAKING SURE THE BRIDGES 18 ARE KEPT IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR AND WE'RE MAINTAINING 19 OPERATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES ON THE BRIDGES. AND THEN WE WANT 20 21 TO TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT OUR LOOK AHEAD ON THE PROGRAM LONG-TERM AND SHORT-TERM. IN THE LONG-TERM WE HAVE BEEN WORKING 22 WITH THE BATA FINANCE DEPARTMENT LOOKING CLOSELY AT OUR 23 PROJECTS AS WELL AS THE BATA PLAN OF FINANCE AND WHAT WE HAVE 24 DETERMINED IS, GENERALLY, WE HAVE VERY GOOD CAPACITY IN THE 25

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LONG-TERM TO SUSTAIN THE TOLLING OPERATIONS OF MAINTAINING THE 1 2 BRIDGES IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR AND AS OF LONG-TERM BY THE 3 20 YEAR OUTLOOK, AND CERTAINLY WE'LL HAVE FUNDING AVAILABLE TO MEET THOSE NEEDS. HOWEVER, IN THE SHORT-TERM, WE'LL BE TALKING 4 5 ABOUT HAVING TO MAKE REDUCTION IN OUR REHABILITATION PROGRAM DUE TO THE REDUCTION IN TOLL REVENUE DUE TO COVID-19. AND WHAT 6 WE THINK WITH TRAFFIC STABILIZING AS WELL AS A LOOK AT THE 7 8 RETURN OF TRAFFIC, WE THINK WE HAVE THE ABILITY, RIGHT NOW, TO RECOMMEND A DRAW UPON OUR TOLLING CAPACITY TO MAINTAIN SOME OF 9 THE MOMENTUM ON SOME OF THE PROJECTS THAT WE HAVE HAD TO 10 POSTPONE IN THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM IN THE SHORT-TERM AND 11 BRING US BACK ON THAT POINT. SO I'M GOING TO START WITH A 12 RECAP OF THE TOLL PROGRAM AND THAT END IT OFF TO ROSALYNN TO 13 TALK ABOUT OUR SHORT-TERM PROPOSAL THAT WE WANT TO BRING TO 14 15 THE BATA COMMITTEE IN APRIL OR MAY WITH THE BUDGET PROCESS FOR 16 FISCAL YEAR 2022. NEXT SLIDE. ONE MORE NEXT SLIDE. WE HAVE A 17 LOT OF FILLER SLIDES. SORRY. SO JUST A RECAP, ON THE BATA LONG-TERM -- SORRY -- NEXT SLIDE -- JUST REMINDING YOU THAT 18 THE TOLL BILL REHABILITATION PROGRAM IS OUR MAJOR CAPITAL 19 PROGRAM BATA HAS TO MAINTAIN BRIDGES IN STATE OF GOOD REPAIR 20 21 AND JUST SINCE 2007 BATA HAS SPENT NEARLY A BILLION DOLLARS ON THE PROJECT BRIDGES FOR THAT PURPOSE. NEXT SLIDE. I WANT TO 22 GIVE MORE CLARITY. THIS IS SOME INFORMATION WE HAVE PROVIDED 23 IN A PRIOR MEETING, BUT IN A MORE SUMMARIZED WAY. THIS IS A 24 CHART THAT SHOWS A SIMPLIFIED REPRESENTATION OF OUR PROCESS 25

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FOR THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM. AND THROUGH OUR NORMAL PROCESS 1 WITH CALTRANS WE MEET WITH THEM ON AN ONGOING BASIS TO DEVELOP 2 3 MULTI-YEAR PLANS TO BEST MEET THE NEEDS OF THE BRIDGES. AS YOU CAN SEE HERE, MAINTAINING THE BRIDGES IS A FOREVER 4 5 RESPONSIBILITY FOR BATA AND CALTRANS, WE BASICALLY START WITH THE BROAD KITCHEN SINK OF PROJECTS. WE HAVE IDENTIFIED TWO AND 6 A HALF BILLION DOLLARS OF PROJECTS. THAT LIST IS NOT YET 7 8 OPTIMIZED NOR IS IT REFINED BASED ON THE NEEDS, AS WELL AS THE SCHEDULE OF THE PROJECTS THAT WE HAVE. THE OPTIMIZATION, 9 PRIORITIZATION HAPPENS BETWEEN CALTRANS AND BATA DURING BUDGET 10 AND PLANNING PROCESS WE'RE CURRENTLY IN THE PROCESS FOR FISCAL 11 YEAR 2022. AND TO GO BACK TO LAST YEAR OR THE PRIOR YEAR, 12 PRIOR TO PRECOVID THAT, PLANNING PROCESS RESULTED IN A \$750 13 MILLION PROGRAM THROUGH 2029, THAT WAS PRECOVID. AND THEN WITH 14 15 COVID, WE HAD TO ADOPT A MORE REFINED BUDGET AND WE HAD TO 16 SHARPEN OUR PENCILS OVER THE LAST YEAR THAT PRIORITIZED OUR WORK IN OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE. IT'S A FUNNELING AND 17 NARROWING OF OUR PROJECT THAT WE HAVE IN THE PROCESS. NEXT 18 SLIDE. AS IT RELATES TO THE KITCHEN SINK OF PROJECTS, I WANT 19 TO STEP BACK MAYBE SOME IMPRESSION I HAVE LAST WITH THE 20 21 COMMITTEE OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF MEETINGS ON THE KITCHEN SINK OF PROJECTS, THE TWO AND A HALF MILLION DOLLARS, I MADE THE 22 IMPRESSION THAT THE SKY IS FALLING IN TERMS OF LONG-TERM NEED 23 OF BRIDGES, I WANT TO RESTATE THAT THE BRIDGES ARE IN A STATE 24 25 OF GOOD REPAIR, GENERALLY, WE HAVE SPENT A BILLION DOLLARS IN

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COMMISSION

MAINTENANCE, BUT THE LIST OF PRIVILEGES THAT WILL BE 1 MAINTAINED FOR REHABILITATION OVER THE LIFE OF THE PROJECTS 2 3 ALL PROJECTS THAT WE NEED TO ATTACK AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE KITCHEN SINK PROJECT IN PRIORITY. THE SAN RAFAEL BRIDGE DECK 4 5 REPLACEMENT TWO AND A HALF MILLION DOLLARS BUDGET, HOWEVER THOSE PROJECTS NEED TO BE FURTHER EVALUATED IN TERMS OF 6 CONDITION, FURTHER STUDY AND INSPECTION. IN OUR RECENT TESTING 7 8 IN RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL WITH NON-DESTRUCTIVE TESTING RADAR, SONAR EVALUATION, WE HAVE DETERMINED THE DECK IS IN GOOD 9 CONDITION FOR A 60-YEAR-OLD DECK AND ASIDE FROM JOINT WORK 10 THAT HAD RECENT FAIL YOURS THAT ARE NOW BEING REPLACED, THE 11 BRIDGE DECK IS IN GOOD CONDITION. SO THESE SORTS OF ASSET 12 MANAGEMENT REVIEWS ARE HELPFUL TO DETERMINE A LIFE CYCLE 13 ANALYSIS OF BRIDGES THAT ATTEMPT TO WEIGH THE COST AND 14 15 BENEFITS OF ALL PROJECTS AND LOOK AT WHETHER WE WANT TO 16 REPLACE OR REHAB OR DO MINOR WORK ON THE BRIDGES AND THESE REVIEW HAVE SIGNIFICANT IMPACTS ON THE PROJECTS THAT ARE IN 17 THE TWO AND A HALF BILLION DOLLARS LIST OF NEEDS WE WILL 18 FURTHER REFINE THAT OVER TIME AS WE WORK IN OUR ANNUAL BUDGET 19 CYCLE. LIKE WE HAVE SAID IN PAST MEETINGS WE PLAN TO DO MORE 20 21 ROBUST ASSET MANAGEMENT REVIEWS OF ALL PROJECTS TO NARROW THE LIST OF PROJECTS TO GET A COMPREHENSIVE LIST AT ALL OUR 22 BRIDGES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WHAT WE WANT TO DO IS BRING UP 23 SOME GOOD NEWS, THOUGH, IN THE LONG-TERM. THE BATA FINANCE 24 PLAN HAS CAPACITY, AND TRAFFIC HAS RETURNED TO A CERTAIN 25

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DEGREE ON THE BRIDGES, COMING BACK SLOWLY BUT IT HAS RETURNED 1 AND STABILIZED. GENERALLY WE ARE IN GOOD SHAPE IN THE LONG-2 3 TERM AS NOTED EARLIER AND WITH THOSE PROJECTIONS AND HERE ARE PROJECTIONS BRIAN IS USING, WE GET 2019 TRAFFIC BY 2028 WHICH 4 5 IS A FAIRLY CONSERVATIVE ASSUMPTION BRIAN HAS DETERMINED WE'RE ABLE TO REFUND OUR LONG-TERM REHABILITATION PROGRAM BY FISCAL 6 YEAR 2026 AND POSSIBLE FUNDING FOR FUTURE BRIDGE REPLACEMENTS 7 8 OUT AND INTO THE FUTURE. I WANT TO NOTE, HOWEVER THAT THE PLAN TO FINANCE DOES INCLUDE DISCUSSION OF TOLL INCREASE IN 2027 9 AND THAT'S IRRESPECTIVE OF RM3 BUT IN TERMS OF LONG-TERM NEEDS 10 OF BRIDGES WE FIND PROVIDES EFFICIENT FUNDING TO MAINTAIN 11 BRIDGES AND OPERATE BRIDGES IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR AS WELL 12 AS LOOK FORWARD INTO THE POSSIBLE REPLACEMENT INTO THE FUTURE. 13 SO I KNOW I WENT THROUGH THAT QUICKLY. WE WANT TO GET TO OUR 14 PROPOSAL AND SHORT-TERM NEEDS OF THE BRIDGES. SO IF THERE IS 15 16 ANY QUESTIONS BEFORE I PASS IT ON TO ROSALYNN.

21 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: HI EVERYBODY. YOU KNOW, I APPRECIATE THE
22 BRIDGES ARE NOT FALLING DOWN, PETER, THANKS FOR SORT OF
23 CLARIFYING THAT, DO YOU HAVE A SENSE OF WHAT PERCENTAGE OF THE
24 BRIDGE ASSETS ARE IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR AND WHAT ARE NOT

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IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR? DO WE HAVE A QUANTIFICATION OF
 STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FOR THESE BRIDGES?

PETER LEE: WE HAVE BROAD CONDITION REPORTS THAT WE GET FROM 4 5 THE DEPARTMENT. ALL OUR BRIDGES ARE VERY LONG LARGE SPAN STRUCTURES WE HAVE AREAS WHERE IT DESERVES MUCH MORE ATTENTION 6 ON THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM AND THERE ARE OTHER AREAS THAT 7 8 DON'T. IT'S SOMEWHAT DIFFICULT TO NARROW IT DOWN TO ONE LITTLE PARTICULAR FACTOR. LIKE ON THE DECK WE HAVE MILES OF DECK ON 9 RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL BRIDGE AND WITHOUT DOING ET A SMALL 10 PERCENTAGE OF THAT DEBT IS ACTUALLY IN BAD SHAPE BASED ON THE 11 CRITERIA THAT THEY USE. BUT SO IT'S GENERALLY IN VERY GOOD 12 SHAPE BUT THERE ARE SMALL PERCENTAGES AND IT'S THE SAME WITH 13 PAINT. WE HAVE MILLIONS OF SQUARE FEET OF PAINT AND IT'S 14 15 DIFFICULT TO BOIL IT DOWN TO ONE NUMBER, IT'S SOMEWHAT 16 DIFFICULT. BUT WE DO GET CONDITION REPORTS ON AN ANNUAL BASIS 17 FROM THE INSPECTION DEPARTMENT AS REQUIRED.

19 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: AS PART OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS GOING 20 FORWARD, WE WILL END UP GETTING IT DOWN TO A NUMBER WHICH IS 21 LIKE ONE PERCENTAGE OF OUR ASSETS THAT ARE IN A STATE OF GOOD 22 REPAIR AND WHAT ARE NOT IN STATE OF GOOD REPAIR AND WE'RE 23 GOING HAVE A PLAN TO GET AS MANY AS POSSIBLE INTO A STATE OF 24 GOOD REPAIR? BECAUSE IT'S REALLY DIFFICULT FOR US AND I THINK 25 ALSO I IMAGINE FOR YOU TOO, TO KNOW HOW MUCH PROGRESS WE'RE



MAKING WHEN SORT OF YOU DON'T HAVE SOME GUIDING LIGHT AROUND 1 THAT. I HAVE SPOKEN ABOUT THIS BEFORE. THAT'S MY -- THANK YOU. 2 3 ANDREW FREMIER: COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ, ANDY FREMIER DEPUTY 4 5 DIRECTOR. I THINK THE POINT YOU HAVE BRINGING UP WITH AN ISO KIND OF MODEL OR MODERN ASSET MANAGEMENT MODEL, WE WILL START 6 TO GET INTO PERCENTAGES OF ELEMENTS, LIKE YOU JUST DESCRIBED. 7 8 SO I THINK THAT'S EXACTLY WHAT WE'RE TRYING TO ACCOMPLISH IN 9 THE ASSET MANAGEMENT WORK. 10 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: THANK YOU. 11 12 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: YEAH. 13 14 PETER LEE: TO FURTHER RESPOND I THINK FROM STAFF PERSPECTIVE 15 16 WHAT WE'RE HOPING TO DO, I DON'T WANT TO PROMISE RIGHT AWAY BUT WE WANT TO COME BACK WITH REGULAR REPORTING ON OUR 17 REHABILITATION PROGRAM TO THE BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE INTO 18 THE FUTURE LIKE YOU SIMILARLY GET FOR THE EXPRESS LANES AND 19 HOW WE USED TO GO ON ALMOST A MONTHLY BASIS ON THE SEISMIC 20 21 RETROFIT PROGRAM AND RM1 WHERE WE MAKE MORE PRESENTATION TO THE COMMITTEE SO THAT'S CERTAINLY A POSSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE 22 YOU'RE BETTER INFORMED ON WHAT WE'RE DOING ON A MONTHLY OR 23 QUARTERLY BASIS ON THE BRIDGES. 24

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AMY WORTH, CHAIR: AND I GUESS, PICKING UP ON THAT, MY SENSE 1 2 IS, TOO, THE GOAL OF THIS COMMITTEE IS TO REALLY HONE IN ON 3 WHAT KIND OF MAINTENANCE OPERATIONAL PLANS WE WANT FOR THE FUTURE, AND THEN FUND THEM, IN RECOGNIZING THAT WE ARE LOOKING 4 5 AT AN INCREASING RESOURCES THAT WILL GO INTO THE BRIDGES. 6 PETER LEE: RIGHT NOW OUR PLAN IS TO MAINTAIN THE OPERATION 7 8 MAINTENANCE EXPENSE AS THE HIGHEST PRIORITY. 9 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: RIGHT. 10 11 PETER LEE: AND THEN TO BRING BACK PUT SOME MOMENTUM BACK INTO 12 THE PROJECT THAT WE HAVE HAD TO SLOW DOWN OR POSTPONE. SO I 13 WILL HAND IT OFF TO ROSALYNN WHO HAS THE SHORT-TERM OUTLOOK AS 14 WELL AS AN ACTION PLAN, TO MOVE FORWARD WITH THAT. NEXT SLIDE 15 16 PLEASE. OR SLIDE AFTER. 17 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: COMMISSIONER WORTH, BEFORE WE MOVE O DO 18 YOU WANT TO TAKE PUBLIC COMMENT ON THAT ITEM? 19 20 21 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: YES. GREAT IDEA. THANK YOU KIMBERLY. I SEE 22 WE HAVE TWO PARTICIPANT COMMENTS THANK YOU KIMBERLY FOR POINTING THAT OUT. 23 24 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: YOU'RE WELCOME. 25

5 SPEAKER: THANK YOU CHAIR AMY WORTH AND MEMBERS, ALETA DUPREE FOR THE RECORD. I'M PROBABLY GOING TO BE COMMENTING MANY 6 TIMES. BUT ON THIS SPECIFIC PIECE, I WOULD LIKE TO THINK THAT 7 8 THE CAPACITY EXISTS FOR US TO DO AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE, HEARING THE GOOD NEWS OF GREATER VACCINE AVAILABILITY COMING ON, 9 POSSIBILITY THAT ALL OF AMERICA SHOULD BE ABLE TO GET 10 VACCINATED BY THE END OF MAY. SHOULD HOPEFULLY RESULT IN US 11 BEING ABLE TO HAVE MORE MOVEMENT IN THE COMMUNITY AND BRING 12 MORE VEHICLES ON TO THE BRIDGES, THAT EVEN WITH NEW NORMALS, I 13 THINK THERE IS STILL A PLACE FOR CARS ON THE BRIDGES BUT I 14 15 HOPE WE'RE NOT MAKING DECISIONS TO CUT PROGRAMS TOO 16 PREMATURELY, BECAUSE I THINK WE ARE ON THE MEND, AND SURPRISINGLY SOONER THAN MANY WOULD THINK. THANK YOU. 17

19 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR COMMENTS. IS
20 OUR NEXT PERSON, ROLAND LEBRUN, WELCOME.

22 SPEAKER: THANK YOU MADAM CHAIR. AND THANK YOU KIMBERLY FOR
23 REQUIRING US. AND MY QUESTION TO THE CHAIR, IS REALLY A
24 QUESTION FOR DIRECTOR JOSEFOWITZ, TECHNICALLY COULD START
25 PROVIDING, PLEASE, INFORMATION ABOUT STRUCTURAL HEALTH

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MONITORING, AS YOUR EXAMPLE SHOWED, SPECIFICALLY WHETHER IT IS 1 IN PLACE ON ALL BRIDGES, IF NOT, WHY NOT? I'M GOING TO CLOSE 2 3 UP WITH AN EXAMPLE. I KNOW THAT HINDSIGHT IS ALWAYS 2020 VISION BUT HOW DO WE HAVE, IN PLACE AT THE TRANSIT CENTER, WE 4 5 WOULD HAVE DETECTED THE PROBLEM LONG TIME BEFORE THE CRACKS STARTED DEVELOPING. THANK YOU. 6 7 8 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: ROLAND, THANK YOU. APPRECIATE YOUR COMMENTS. AND THAT WILL BE GOOD INFORMATION TO INCORPORATE. SO 9 10 APPRECIATE IT. I THINK THE WHOLE IDEA TO THIS IS TO REALLY, AGAIN, LOOK AT THAT LONG-TERM MAINTENANCE PRIORITY IN TERMS OF 11 THOSE LOOKING, YOU KNOW, THE KEY ISSUES. AND I SEE PETER 12 NODDING. SO THAT'S GREAT. SO, THANK YOU. OKAY. THEN IF THERE 13 ARE ANY OTHER COMMISSIONER QUESTIONS ON THIS ITEM? I KNOW 14 15 THESE ARE ALL RELATED. SO FEEL FREE TO JUMP IN AT THIS POINT 16 OR LATER. NEXT ITEM, WOULD YOU LIKE TO TAKE THIS? STAFF, NEXT ITEM? 17 18 PETER LEE: YES STROLL BACK TO THE PRESENTATION, NEXT SLIDE. 19 AND THEN I'LL HAND IT OFF TO ROSALYNN. 20 21 22 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GREAT. THANK YOU.

24 ROSALYNN CHONGCHAIKIT: GOOD AFTERNOON COMMISSIONERS MY NAME IS
25 ROSALYNN CHONGCHAIKIT WITH BATA STAFF I'M GOING REVIEW THE

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SHORT-TERM OUTLOOK AND ACTION PLAN. AS A REMINDER, THE ADOPTED 1 FISCAL YEAR 2021 REHAB BUDGET RECALIBRATED NEAR-TERM PROJECT 2 3 PRIORITIES AND FOCUSED ON FOUNDATIONAL PROJECTS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 FUNDING CONTINUED FOR ONGOING OPERATIONS, 4 5 MAINTENANCE, INSPECTION, COMPLETING PROJECTS AND CONSTRUCTION, AND FUNDING PROJECTS NEAR DELIVERY. NO PROJECTS WERE CANCELLED 6 BUT SOME WERE RESCOPED AND POSTPONES. NEXT SLIDE. SOME OF THE 7 8 BIGGEST ADJUSTMENTS TO PROJECTS WERE DELAY OF OPEN ROAD TOLLING, STATE ROUTE 37 DUE DILIGENCE AND CONTRACTS CAN BE 9 RESUMED OUICKLY IF ADDITIONAL AN FUNDING IS IDENTIFIED. WE 10 HAVE ACTIVE PROJECTS IN HAYWARD RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL PROJECT 11 ALL WITHIN OUR APPROVED 2021 BUDGET. WITH REGARDS TO OPEN ROAD 12 TOLLING I WANT TO POINT OUT THAT THE CURRENTLY ADOPTED BUDGET 13 ALLOWS SOME WORK AND WE NEED BUDGET BATA ON THE OPEN ROAD 14 15 SCHEDULE THAT WAS PRESENTED OF FEBRUARY. NEXT SLIDE. LOOKING 16 FORWARD, WE ARE ABOUT A YEAR IN COVID ENVIRONMENT, AND WE PROPOSE THE FOLLOWING SHORT-TERM ACTION PLAN STARTING IN 17 FISCAL YEAR 2022. WE WANT TO DRAW UPON TOLL CAPACITY FROM 18 PROJECTED RETURN OF TRAFFIC AND RESERVES AS NEEDED TO MAINTAIN 19 MOMENTUM ON CORE BATA BRIDGE SAFETY AND OPERATIONS PROJECTS 20 21 INCLUDING ANNUAL CONTINGENCY FOR EMERGENCY WORK AND OPEN ROAD TOLLING. ANOTHER ACTION IS TO SEEK STATE AND FEDERAL SUPPORT 22 23 IN THE FORM OF PURSUING SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING TO STRETCH TOLL DOLLARS IS UPDATING PARTNERSHIP WITH CALTRANS FOR JOINT 24 DECISION MAKING COMMITMENT TO ROBUST ASSET MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS 25

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AND CONTINUING OPERATIONS TO LEVERAGE AGENCY DEFINE STAFF AND 1 CONTRACT JOBS. LASTLY, WE WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR ARE THE 2 3 RETURN OF TRAFFIC AND ADJUST PLANS IF NEEDED. NEXT SLIDE. PART OF THE SHORT-TERM ACTION PLAN SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING INCLUDES 4 5 PRIORITIZING BAY BRIDGE FORWARD AND OPEN ROAD TOLLING OR BATA BASED LOCAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM FORMULA FUND ALSO SEEKING 6 STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDING FOR STRUCTURAL PAINTING ON RICHMOND 7 8 SAN RAFAEL AND BAY BRIDGES THAT ARE HIGH DOLLAR TOP PRIORITIES, AND BAY SKYWAY AND STATE ROUTE 37, WHEN IT COMES 9 TO ADVOCATING FOR STATE FUND THERE ARE PRIORITIES MTC WILL 10 NEED TO CONSIDER. WHILE SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS ARE NOT CERTAIN WE 11 ADVISE OPPORTUNITIES FOR FUNDING WHILE WE'RE STILL IN RECOVERY 12 TRAFFIC IS NOT STABLE OR GUARANTEED AND SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS 13 WILL HELP MANAGE RISK. BATA LOSS REVENUE IN THE FEDERAL RELIEF 14 COVID PACKAGE AND SPECIFICALLY TALKS ABOUT LOST TOLL REVENUE 15 16 AND IF WE REVIEW PROJECTS SOONER THEY WILL COST LESS AND WE'LL BE ABLE TO PUT MORE PEOPLE TO WORK. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. ON THIS 17 SLIDE WE WANT TO GO OVER THE FUNDING POSSIBILITIES. IF YOU 18 LOOK CLOSELY, YOU CAN SEE THE SENATE BILL LOCAL PARTNERSHIP 19 PROGRAM FORMULA STATE FUNDS, POSSIBILITY OF OTHER MTC FUNDING 20 21 AND ADVOCACY THAT ARE FEDERAL FUNDS FOR EXAMPLE, FIXED --22 [INDISCERNIBLE] WE HAVE STATE HIGHWAY AND OPERATION PROGRAM THROUGH CALTRANS MIX OF STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDS. WE HAVE 23 FEDERAL COVID RELIEF HIGHWAY FUNDING THROUGH FEDERAL FUND AND 24 25 FEDERAL REAUTHORIZATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDS. MTC HAS CHOICE WITH

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THE LOCAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM FORMULA FUNDS AND OTHER MTC 1 FUNDING THOUGH THERE ARE TRADEOFFS TO CONSIDER. THE STATE HAS 2 3 SOME FUNDS, THE SHOP IN COVID RELIEF FUNDING TO CONSIDER THE COVID FUNDING RELIEF AMOUNTS ARE THOSE DISCUSSED IN DECEMBER 4 5 2020 STATE AND REGIONAL SPLIT ARE UNDERWAY AND ELIGIBILITY ON THE STATE SIDE IS STILL AN OPTION WE HAVE A GOOD LIST OF 6 PROJECTS FOR STATE OWNED FACILITIES LIKE BRIDGE CONTRACT WORK 7 8 AND WE HAVE POTENTIAL FEDERAL FUNDING NOT AUTHORIZED AND WE'LL CONTINUE TO MONITOR FOR ELIGIBILITY OF BATA PROJECTS. OVERALL 9 WE FIND THAT FORWARD SF37 HAVE A VARIETY OF ELIGIBLE SOURCES 10 AND FOR CONTRACTED BRIDGE PAINT PROJECTS WE ARE IN PARTNERSHIP 11 WITH CALTRANS FOR THEM TO USE ELIGIBLE STATE FUNDING SUCH AS 12 SHOP TO ALLOW FOR CALTRANS TO PERFORM WORK SOONER THAN THE 13 CURRENT PLAN RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL AND BAY BRIDGE. NEXT SLIDE 14 PLEASE. HAVING REVIEWED THE OUTLOOK FOR THE BRIDGE NEEDS AND 15 16 FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES BATA STAFF PROPOSES THE FOLLOWING SHORT-TERM PLAN TO GUIDE ACTIVITIES MOVING FORWARD. DECISIONS TO BE 17 MADE AS EARLY AS FALL ON ALLOCATIONS AND JUNE ADOPTION FOR 18 FISCAL YEAR 2022 BUDGET. TO AN EXTENT THIS PLAN BRINGS BACK 19 FUNDING LEVELS THAT WERE REDUCED RESTORING OPEN ROAD TOLLING 20 21 AND CONTINGENCIES FOR EMERGENCY WORK THIS SLIDE IS NOT THE FULL TEN YEAR BUDGET FUNDS WE SEEK TO RESTORE THE PROJECTS 22 THAT WERE DELAYED. IF YOU LOOK, THE PRIORITY PROJECTS WE WILL 23 ADD TO THE CURRENT BUDGET PLAN ABOUT 155 MILLION IN BATA 24 FUNDED CORE FROM TOLLS WE MAY BE ABLE TO FUND SOME OF THIS 25

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FROM DIRECT TOLL REVENUE WHEN TRAFFIC PICKS BACK UP THE 1 REMAINDER WOULD BE TARGETED DRAW FROM RESERVE. IN ADDITION 2 3 NON-TOLL FUNDING ABOUT 79 MILLION FOR BRIDGES TOLL OPERATIONS MAINTENANCE 100 MILLION NEEDED FOR EMERGENCY WORK AND REPAIR, 4 5 AND MAINTENANCE PROJECT PART OF 2020 TOLL BRIDGE REHAB PROJECT FUNDED BY TOLL. WE WOULD SEEK SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR THESE 6 BRIDGE INTEGRITY PROJECTS SUCH AS FROM COVID-19 RELIEF FUNDS 7 8 FOR PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE SUCH AS PAINT ON RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL AND SAN FRANCISCO BAY BRIDGE. THE OPEN ROAD TOLLING 9 PROJECT RECEIVED 76 MILLION OF THAT 62 MILLION FROM TOLL 10 REVENUE SUPPLEMENTED WITH COMMITMENT FROM LOCAL PARTNERSHIP 11 PROGRAM FORMULA FUNDS IN APRIL AND PART OF THAT ACTION IS TO 12 RECOMMEND 5 MILLION IN LOCAL PARTNERSHIP FORMULA FUNDS TO BAY 13 BRIDGE FORWARD. BAY BRIDGE FORWARD FEDERAL FUNDS HAVE YET TO 14 15 BE SECURED THROUGH MTC'S OUICK STRIKE PROGRAM FOR WHICH ACTION 16 IS PLANNED IN APRIL AS WELL. THERE ARE LOTS OF PROJECTS ELIGIBLE FOR THAT PROGRAM AND IF WE DON'T GET THAT FUNDING 17 WE'LL NEED TO REVIEW OPTIONS. WE ARE PIVOTING ON NEEDS AND 18 TOLL BRIDGE NEEDS FROM PRECOVID TO NOW VISUAL OF PAST PRESENT 19 AND FUTURE THE ORANGE LINE DISPLAYS THE BATA RECOVERY PLAN FOR 20 21 THE NEXT NINE YEARS, ADOPTED PRIOR TO COVID, THE FISCAL YEAR 22 2020 ADOPTED BUDGET. YOU CAN SEE HOW THE EXPENDITURES WERE FRONT LOADED IN TRYING TO AVERAGE ABOUT 100 MILLION A YEAR 23 OVER A TEN YEAR PERIOD. THE BLUE LINE SHOWS ADJUSTMENTS NEEDED 24 IN THE ADOPTED FISCAL YEAR 2021 BUDGET FUNDING MINIMAL FIRST 25

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FOUR YEARS AND RETURN TO 100 MILLION A YEAR BY 2029 AND YELLOW 1 LINE IS WHERE WE THINK WE COULD GO WITH FISCAL YEAR 2022 2 3 BUDGET. IT REFLECTS BUDGETS FROM TOLL REVENUE WITH THE DASHED YELLOW REPRESENTING POSSIBLY SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING THE RESULT 4 5 100 MILLION PER YEAR. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. TO CLOSE OUT OUR PRESENTATION, KEY TAKEAWAYS THAT PETER MENTIONED OVERALL BATA 6 IS FOCUSED ON FOUNDATIONAL NEEDS, STATE OF GOOD REPAIR, TOLL 7 8 COLLECTION, MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS, SAFETY OF BRIDGES WILL NOT BE COMPROMISED. LONG-TERM BATA HAS CAPACITY TO SUSTAIN TOLLING 9 OPERATIONS AND MAINTAIN BRIDGES IN A STATE OF GOOD REPAIR. 10 SHORT-TERM ACTION PLAN WE SHARED WITH YOU TODAY, WE WILL DRAW 11 ABOUT TOLL CAPACITY FROM THE PROJECTS RETURN OF TRAFFIC IN 12 RESERVE AS NEEDED AND MAINTAIN CORE BATA OPERATIONS IN BRIDGE 13 14 PROJECTS AND MAINTAIN MOMENTUM ON OTHER PRIORITIES. THANK YOU. 15

16 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GREAT. SO LET ME JUST -- IF I MAY JUMP IN, TAKE THE CHAIR'S PRIVILEGE. YOU KNOW, I'M LOOKING AT THESE 17 NUMBERS, AND I GUESS A COUPLE OF THINGS. I REALIZED WHEN I 18 LOOKED AT THE SHORT FALL BECAUSE OF THE TOLLING, WE LOST TWO 19 AND A HALF YEARS OF OUR PLANNED MAINTENANCE PROGRAM. THAT'S IT 20 LITERALLY. THAT'S DOING NOTHING. SO I GUESS WHAT I WANT TO 21 KNOW IS HOW ARE THESE NUMBERS RELATED TO THE CONE? I LOVE THE 22 CONE. I LOVE ALL THE DIFFERENT GRAPHICS. BECAUSE IT WAS MY 23 UNDERSTANDING THAT WE'RE REALLY LOOKING TO SUBSTANTIVELY 24 INCREASE THE INVESTMENT IN BOTH THESE OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS 25

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THAT NEED TO BE MADE WITH THE ACCELERATION OF THE OPEN ROAD 1 TOLLING, AND THE FORWARDS, AND ALSO TO INCREASE THE 2 3 MAINTENANCE INVESTMENT IN THESE BRIDGES. SO WE DON'T HAVE THESE SURPRISES, LIKE THE FIRE SUPPRESSION IN THE TUNNEL, 4 5 THINGS THAT ARE VERY IMPORTANT TO DO, BUT THAT WE'RE ABLE TO, 6 YOU KNOW, REALLY UNDERSTAND WHAT OUR BEST MAINTENANCE IS. AND, AGAIN, SO I GUESS, WITH THAT, I'M WONDERING HOW THIS RELATES 7 8 TO GETTING TO THAT 2.5 BILLION. I THINK WE STILL SEEM TO BE LOOKING AT WHAT, WHAT, YOU KNOW, WHAT DO WE DO. AND I HATE TO 9 USE THE WORD IDEAL, BECAUSE REALLY IT IS WHAT SHOULD WE BE 10 DOING. NOT THAT WE'RE NOT DOING THINGS, BUT HOW DO WE MAKE 11 SURE WE HAVE -- YOU KNOW, THAT WE REACH THE TARGETS FOR THE 12 GOALS THAT WE NEED? 13 14 15 PETER LEE: MAY I? 16 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GO AHEAD. 17 18 PETER LEE: MY UNDERSTANDING FOR THE PLAN OF FINANCE AT THIS 19 POINT IS THAT THINGS HAVE RECOVERED AND WITH THE PROJECTIONS 20 AND CALCULATIONS THAT BRIAN HAS USED, IS THAT YOU SHOULD HAVE 21 SUFFICIENT FUNDS IN THE LONG-TERM TO MEET OUR TWO AND A HALF -22 - ALL THE PROJECTS IN THAT TWO AND A HALF BILLION DOLLARS 23 LIST, OVER TIME. AND IN FACT, YOU PROBABLY EVEN MORE MONEY TO 24

25 GO OUT WE HAVE THE HUNDRED YEAR MODEL TO FUND THE

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REHABILITATION PROGRAM AS WELL AS THE LONG-TERM REPLACEMENT OF 1 THE BRIDGES AS FINANCING COMES OFF THE BOOKS. THAT'S THE LONG-2 3 TERM LOOK WE FEEL STRONGLY. WHAT HAPPENED WITH COVID WITH THE REDUCTION IN REVENUE, WITH THAT CHART THAT ROSALYNN HAD, THE 4 5 CHART, OUR NEAR-TERM WE HAVE FRONT LOADED THE REHABILITATION PROGRAM QUITE A BIT AND THE CUT FOR COVID WAS SIGNIFICANT FOR 6 US, AND THAT'S WHY PROJECT WITH ORT WERE SOMEWHAT DELAYED AND 7 8 PUSHED OUT. THE SHORT-TERM REALLY WAS THE CHALLENGE WE HAD WHEN WE STEPPED BACK AND EVALUATED WHERE WE ARE, THE SHORT-9 TERM NEEDS WHAT WE WANT TO DO IS MAKE SURE WE CAN FUND AND GET 10 THOSE ORT PROJECTS OUT OF THE WAY AS WELL AS MAKE SURE WE ARE 11 DOING WHAT WE NEED TO DO ON THE BRIDGES. ACCELERATION OF SOME 12 OF THE PROJECTS IN THE TWO AND A HALF BILLION DOLLARS LIST IS 13 NOT NECESSARILY -- IT'S VERY PROJECT DEPENDENT. WE SHOULD 14 15 CONTINUE TO PAINT THE BRIDGES ON AN ONGOING BASIS AS 16 PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE AND WE ARE CONTINUING TO FUND STATE PAINTERS TO PAINT THE BRIDGES, BUT PROJECTS LIKE LET'S REPLACE 17 THE RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL DECK OR BAY BRIDGE DECK YOU DON'T WANT 18 TO START THOSE PROJECTS UNTIL YOU REALLY NEED TO DO IT. IT'S 19 DEPENDENT ON INSPECTION AND LOOKING AT IT. YOU DON'T WANT TO 20 21 START A PROJECT OF THAT MAGNITUDE UNTIL YOU ARE READY. BUT YOU WILL EVENTUALLY HAVE TO DO THINGS LIKE REPLACE A DECK OR 22 RESURFACE THE DECK THAT'S WHY THE KITCHEN SINK PROJECT IS SUCH 23 A LARGE LIST. WE WANT TO MAKE A PROPER ANALYSIS OF ALL OF THE 24 PROJECTS TO DETERMINE WHETHER WE SHOULD REPLACE IT TODAY OR 25

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TEN YEARS FROM NOW OR 20 YEARS FROM NOW. AND VERY SIMILAR TO 1 THE WORK WE DID ON RICHMOND, IT REALLY DEPENDS ON WHEN YOU 2 3 PLAN TO REPLACE THE RICHMOND SAN RAFAEL BRIDGE IF THAT'S THE CHOICE WE WANT TO MAKE OR IF THE AGENCY WISHES TO MAKE. THE 4 5 BRIDGE IS REACHING MORE THAN 60 YEARS OLD AND IT WILL PROBABLY TAKE 20 YEARS TO REPLACE, LOOKING AT THE HISTORY WE HAVE WITH 6 THE BAY BRIDGE, AND YOU MAY WANT TO GO FASTER. YOU MAY WANT TO 7 8 GO SLOWER. BUT WE DID FIND WITH THE ASSET MANAGER AT WORK IT IS CHEAPER AND MORE COST EFFECTIVE HONESTLY TO MAINTAIN THE 9 BRIDGE IN ITS CURRENT STATE THAN IT IS TO REPLACE IT JUST 10 BECAUSE IT'S CHEAPER TO MAINTAIN AN OLD CAR THAN IT IS TO GO 11 BUY A NEW CAR. THOSE ARE THE TRADEOFFS THAT WE WANT TO MAKE 12 AND BRING BACK TO THE BOARD AS WE MOVE FORWARD. I WAS SAYING 13 EARLIER WITH THE FUNDING FINANCE WE HAVE CAPACITY TO MEET 14 15 LONG-TERM FUNDING NEEDS. BUT WE WANTED, PRIOR TO COVID, WE 16 WERE VERY COMFORTABLE WITH THE \$750 MILLION PROGRAM THAT WE HAD, AND WITH THE CUT THAT WE EXPERIENCED DUE TO COVID, YOU 17 KNOW, WE FELT IT WAS IN OUR PART TO BRING BACK A PROGRAM OF 18 SIMILAR SIZE AND START THERE. LOOK, WE CAN ALWAYS USE MORE 19 MONEY THAT, IS. [LAUGHTER] WE CAN ALWAYS TRY TO SPEND MORE 20 21 MONEY THAT'S NOT A PROBLEM. BUT IN THE LONG-TERM WE'RE FINE. 22

23 ANDREW FREMIER: COULD I ADD?

24

25 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: SURE.

ANDREW FREMIER: ONE OF THE KEYS IN THE WORK WE'RE TALKING 2 3 ABOUT I KNOW WE KEEP REPEATING TERMS BUT I THINK IT'S BECAUSE IT'S SO IMPORTANT BUT THAT IS THE \$2.5 BILLION ESTIMATE IS 4 5 REALLY BUILT OFF A COUPLE OF THINGS. IT'S A LIST OF PROJECTS THAT HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED OVER THE YEARS THROUGH THE BRIDGE 6 INSPECTIONS THAT ARE ACTUALLY VERY HARD TO DETERMINE HOW REAL 7 8 THEY ARE IN TERMS OF WHEN THEY MIGHT CROP UP AS BEING NEEDED THAT'S SORT OF THE TALK THAT PETER WAS MAKING OF THE DECK 9 REPAIR. IF WE CAN GET BETTER AT ASSET MANAGEMENT AND THAT IS 10 THE FOCUS OF A LOT OF OUR EFFORTS, WE'RE GOING TO HAVE A 11 BETTER IDEA ABOUT WHAT FORECAST WORK WE REALLY NEED TO DO AND 12 WHEN WE NEED TO DO IT, AND I THINK THAT GIVES US MORE 13 ASSURANCE ON THE REALITY OF THE 2.5 BILLION AND WHAT IT NEEDS 14 TO BE INVESTED IN TO BE CORRECT. I THINK THE FACT THAT WE HAVE 15 16 TRADITIONALLY FRONT LOADED THE TEN YEAR PLAN IS THAT WE DO NEED BILLION DOLLARS TO KEEP THE BRIDGE IN SHAPE AND WE HAVE 17 THE NAVIGATION OF THAT PATH BECAUSE. CONSISTENCY IN REVENUE 18 THE WAY WE ARE SURE THE 2.5 BILLION MAKES SENSE IS LOOKING AT 19 THE PROJECTS IDENTIFIED AND COMPARING TO BRIAN'S STATISTICAL 20 MODELS AND THEY ROUGHLY MANAGE BUT WE WOULD LIKE TO GET BETTER 21 THAN THAT SO THAT WE'RE NOT KIND OF STILL BUMPY AND WE'RE ABLE 22 23 TO STAY IN FRONT OF THE PROBLEMS BEFORE THEY BECOME EMERGENCIES. WHICH HOPEFULLY THAT'S A LITTLE BIT MORE. 24

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AMY WORTH, CHAIR: THAT'S PERFECT. AND THE WAY TO UNDERSTAND IS THAT THE WAY WE'RE GOING TO FINANCE WHAT WE INTENDED TO, IS WO-WAYS. WE NEED TO GET THIS OTHER MONEY, NON-TOLL REVENUE MONEY, AND WE NEED TO DIP INTO OUR SAVINGS A LITTLE BIT. AND WE CANNOT DO THESE THINGS WITHOUT THAT INDEPENDENT MONEY.

ANDREW FREMIER: CORRECT. NOT IN THE PACE WE'RE THINKING. AND 7 8 WHAT BRIAN'S MODEL SHOWS IS THAT IF WE'RE PATIENT WE'LL PROBABLY HAVE TO PAY MORE EITHER BECAUSE AS ROSALYNN 9 10 MENTIONED, THE COST OF PROJECTS GOES UP OVER TIME BUT ALSO WHAT SHE DIDN'T MENTION THAT WE TACKED -- TALKED ABOUT BEFORE 11 IS THAT DETERIORATION BECOMES MORE EXPENSIVE IF YOU DON'T MAKE 12 THE REPAIR, NOT ONLY MORE EXPENSIVE BUT THE PROJECT SCOPE 13 14 GROSS.

15

16 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: WE HAD THIS \$250 MILLION HOLE AND BRIDGES 17 ARE RUSTING AS WE SPEAK. SO WE NEED TO BE DOING THE WORK WE 18 NEED TO DO. NICK?

19

20 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: YEAH, I MEAN, SORT OF BUILDING ON WHAT I 21 THINK YOU'RE GETTING AT, CHAIR, I -- YOU KNOW, I FEEL LIKE WE 22 HAVE GONE THROUGH LIKE 20 HOURS OF MEETINGS AT THIS POINT. WE 23 HAVE ESTABLISHED THAT WE HAVE A BIG BUDGET HOLE AND NOW WE'RE 24 JUST SAYING WELL, WE'LL FIX IT WE'LL KIND OF, YOU KNOW, 25 WHATEVER, WE'LL DEAL WITH THIS LATER. YOU KNOW, WE'LL TRY TO

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GET A LITTLE BIT OF FUNDING TO PLUG A LITTLE HOLE BUT WE STILL 1 END UP WITH A BIG BUDGET HOLE, WE ARE STILL DELAYING CRITICAL 2 3 SAFETY PROJECTS WHICH ARE ONLY GOING TO GET MORE EXPENSIVE AS YOU WAIT FOR THEM NOT JUST BECAUSE CONSTRUCTION COSTS ARE 4 5 GOING TO GO UP BUT BECAUSE THE ASSETS THEMSELVES ARE GOING TO DETERIORATE. WE'RE NOT GETTING ANY REAL COMMITMENTS AROUND HOW 6 WE'RE GOING TO IMPROVE OUR ASSET MANAGEMENT OTHER THAN WE'RE 7 8 JUST GOING TO IMPROVE T SO I'M NOT LEAVING THIS -- WE DON'T HAVE ANY COMMITMENTS AROUND HOW WE'RE GOING TO ROLL OUT, KIND 9 10 OF, FORWARD PROJECTS, BOTH TO THE FORWARD PROJECT, BOTH OF THE BRIDGES WE'RE CURRENTLY ADDRESSING NOW AND THE FOR THE REST OF 11 THE BATA BRIDGES, CONGESTION IS CONTINUING TO GETTING WORSE, 12 MUNI BUSES ARE DELAYED 20% MORE THAN THEY WERE PRECOVID. I'M 13 NOT COMING OUT OF THIS FEELING LIKE WE GOT A REALLY KIND OF 14 15 AGGRESSIVE PLAN TO DEAL WITH THE CHALLENGES THAT ARE IN FRONT OF US. AND I HATE TO SAY THAT, BECAUSE, LIKE, I THINK WE HAVE 16 17 HAD A LOT OF INTERESTING CONVERSATIONS, BUT I WOULD HAVE HOPED THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO COME OUT OF THIS WITH A PLAN WHICH IS 18 MUCH MORE SPECIFIC ON THE ASSET MANAGEMENT, WHICH WAS REALLY 19 LOOKING AT BRINGING THAT TOLL INCREASE FORWARD SO WE COULD GET 20 21 THESE PROJECTS GOING NOW, WHEN WE REALLY NEED THEM. A PLAN AROUND HOW WE'RE GOING TO KIND OF EXPAND AND DELIVER ON OUR 22 FORWARD PROJECT. AND THEN MY THING, WHICH EVERYBODY HAS GOING 23 ON ABOUT FOREVER WHICH IS REAL GIVEN THIS BATA PLAN, THE 24 RECOVERY TASK FORCE, DEAL WITH THE ISSUE OF KIND OF FINES AND 25

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FEES AND THE SORT OF THE 3 MILLION TOLL PAYERS OR 3 MILLION 1 TOLL TRANSACTIONS THAT ARE CURRENTLY IN SORT OF COLLECTION OF 2 3 SOME POINT AND ACCRUES INCREASE FEES WHICH AFFECT THE MAJORITY OF LOW INCOME PEOPLE. I WAS JUST HOPING FOR SOMETHING WHICH 4 5 WAS MUCH MORE SIGNIFICANT COMING OUT OF THIS PROCESS. AND I HOPE NOTHING THEY HAVE SAID HERE IS GOING TO BE A SURPRISE TO 6 ANYONE BECAUSE IT'S STUFF I HAVE REPEATED ALMOST EVERY MEETING 7 8 AND I'M NOT CLEAR WHERE WE HAVE KIND OF GONE THROUGH THIS WHOLE PROCESS AND BASICALLY ENDED UP WITH, WE'RE FIND WE'LL 9 10 JUST KEEP GOING.

11

ANDREW FREMIER: COMMISSIONER I CAN TAKE A OUICK STAB AT IT. 12 ONE, I DON'T DISAGREE WITH WHAT YOU SAID, I THINK FROM THE 13 STANDPOINT OF THE FOLKS WORKING ON THE BRIDGES WE HAVE 14 PROBABLY GONE FROM A RED LIGHT TO A YELLOW LIGHT AND WHAT I 15 16 THINK WE'RE TALKING ABOUT IN 2022 IS A STABILIZATION OF A BIG HOLE WE SAW KIND OF DESPERATE RESPONSES TO. SO I THINK THE 17 FACT THAT WE ARE, YOU KNOW, CONTINUING TO PURSUE EFFICIENCIES, 18 IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT IN THE DISCUSSION, WHICH IS REALLY SORT 19 OF THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PIECE, AND SOME OF THE SMALLER PARTS 20 21 THAT WE'RE DOING. I HAVE TO ADMIT A LITTLE BIT THAT THE FACT THAT WE ARE KEEPING OUR PROJECTS MOVING THROUGH A TOLLING AND 22 SOME OF THE CONCEPTS OF THE FORWARDS MOVING TO US IS ACTUALLY 23 A VICTORY. SO I'M KIND OF HAPPY THAT YOU'RE NOT THINKING THAT 24 25 THAT'S ENOUGH. BECAUSE I WOULD LIKE TO TRY TO CONTINUE TO DO

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MORE IN THAT ENVIRONMENT. I THINK WE TAKE THAT CHARGE. I THINK 1 THE BOTTOM LINE, THOUGH, IS WE'RE OFFERING STABILITY IN 2022, 2 3 THAT MAYBE BUYS US SOME TIME TO CONTINUE THE DISCUSSION THAT'S PROBABLY BROADER THAN THIS AD-HOC RECOVERY GROUP. AND THAT IS 4 5 WHETHER OR NOT THE COMMISSION WANTS TO ATTACK AN EARLIER TOLL INCREASE TO DEAL WITH REHABILITATION. AND I THINK WHERE YOU 6 NEED OUR HELP IS THE ASSET MANAGEMENT WORK. AND I KNOW THAT 7 8 YOU INDICATED THAT THAT SEEMS TO BE JUST SORT OF, YOU KNOW, SOFT INFORMATION, BUT I'M HOPEFUL THAT YOU REGULAR THE WORK 9 THAT WE DID OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS IN THE RICHMOND SAN 10 RAFAEL BRIDGE AS AN EXAMPLE OF HOW WE WOULD LIKE TO MOVE 11 FORWARD. THAT WAS A DEEP DIVE AND TECHNICAL DISCUSSION THAT 12 WENT OVER SEVERAL BATA OVERSIGHT MEETINGS WHERE WE SHOWED THE 13 KINDS OF TOOLS THAT WE THINK CAN IMPROVE OUR LOOK AT THE 14 15 INVENTORY. WE HAD QUITE A BIT OF RESISTANCE FROM, REALLY, EVEN 16 THE DEPARTMENT ON HOW TO JUMP INTO THAT GAME APPROPRIATELY, AND IT KIND OF TOOK US A WHILE TO GET STARTED. I THINK THE 17 RESULTS THAT WE PRODUCED ON THE RICHMOND PROJECT WERE BOTH 18 COMFORTING FROM THE DEPARTMENT'S POINT OF VIEW AND OURS, THAT 19 THAT IS THE PLACE TO START DOING SOME REAL WORK ON KEEPING AN 20 EYE ON THE CONDITION OF THE ENTIRE INVENTORY. AND WHILE AT 21 22 SEVEN CROSSINGS IT'S ACTUALLY ABOUT 11 BRIDGES AND A WHOLE BUNCH OF OTHER SUPPORT STRUCTURES SO THAT INFORMATION TO YOUR 23 POINT, WE NEED TO DO SOME WORK IN THAT ARENA TO GIVE YOU SOME 24 CREDIBILITY AS TO WHY WE NEED MORE. I THINK THAT WILL TAKE A 25

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BENEFIT TIME AND I AM HOPEFUL THAT STABILIZING IN 2022 VERSUS 1 RED AS WE WERE LOOKING AT IT WHEN WE WERE BUILDING THE 2021 2 3 BUDGET WILL ALLOW US THAT OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE YOU MORE INFORMATION WITHOUT REALLY LOSING TRACK OF THE CONDITION OF 4 5 THE BRIDGES. BECAUSE THEY DON'T DETERIORATE OVERNIGHT. I DO TRY TO REMIND FOLKS THAT IT'S A SLOW CURVE IN A LOT OF WAYS, 6 WITH SOME OF THESE LARGE REHAB PROBLEMS THAT WE HAVE, AND IF 7 8 YOU IGNORE IT YOU HAVE A REAL PROBLEM. IF YOU START PAYING ATTENTION TO IT, WE THINK WE CAN MAKE SOME PROGRESS. SO I'M 9 NOT DISAGREEING WITH WHAT YOU'RE SAYING. BUT I AM SUGGESTING 10 THAT GETTING TO YELLOW IN THIS YEAR IS PROBABLY A GOOD PIECE 11 OF WORK AND CONTINUING TO USE THE FULL BATA OVERSIGHT 12 COMMITTEE ON THIS BIGGER QUESTION ABOUT WHETHER WE NEED TO DO 13 MORE, REALLY SHOULD GET FED SOME MORE ENGINEERING DATA TO SORT 14 OF SUPPORT WHAT YOU'RE ASKING. AND I DON'T THINK WE HAVE LOST 15 16 SIGHT OF ANY OF THE ITEMS THAT WE THINK ARE IMPORTANT RELATIVE TO THE EQUITY CONCERNS THAT YOU HAVE MENTIONED. AND I THINK WE 17 ARE UNDERWAY WITH TRYING TO FEED THE PROPER INFORMATION TO 18 MAKE THE PROPER DECISIONS. I GUESS THE OTHER THING I WOULD 19 MENTION MAYBE IN CLOSING IS WHAT WE WERE ALSO HOPING TO DO IS 20 21 GET A GOOD SORT OF STABLE OF COMMISSIONERS THAT WERE BRIEFED ON THE VERY DETAILS THAT YOU TALKED ABOUT IN THE 20 HOURS OF 22 MEETINGS BECAUSE IT'S VERY HARD TO KEEP THE ENTIRE BATA 23 OVERSIGHT COMMISSION OR BATA AUTHORITY AS EDUCATED AS YOU ALL 24

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1 ARE NOW. I'M SORRY IF THAT FEELS LIKE IT'S SHORT BUT WE DO 2 FEEL WE HAVE MADE SOME PROGRESS IN RELATIVELY LIMITED TIME. 3

COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: YOU KNOW, I THINK IF YOU -- IF THE 4 5 RECOMMENDATIONS COMING OUT OF THIS COMMITTEE WAS A CLEAR TIMELINE FOR WHEN WE WERE GOING TO KIND OF, WITH SPECIFICS OF 6 WHAT YOU JUST SAID, SO, OVER THE NEXT YEAR WE'RE GOING TO 7 8 IMPLEMENT THIS TYPE OF ASSET MANAGEMENT SO THAT BY JUNE WE'RE GOING TO HAVE THE ISO CERTIFICATION WE'RE GOING TO KNOW WHAT 9 10 OUR NEEDS ARE, AND THEN WE'RE GOING TO MAKE A DECISION AND WE'RE GOING TO BRING TO THE COMMISSION IN JUNE, OR WHATEVER, 11 START A PROCESS IN JUNE, TO EXPLORE WHETHER WE WANT TO 12 INCREASE TOLLS TO FUND SOME OF THESE PROJECTS EARLY. AND IF IT 13 WAS JUST LIKE, IF THE REPORT-OUT WAS JUST A LOT CLEARER ABOUT 14 15 WHAT YOU JUST SAID ANDY WITH TIMELINES AND SPECIFICS, I DON'T 16 EXPECT US TO MAKE ALL OF THE DECISIONS HERE. I JUST WANT MORE CLARITY AND SPECIFICITY OF WHAT'S GOING HAPPEN IN THE FUTURE, 17 AND NOT JUST LIKE IN THE FAR FUTURE, BUT WHAT ARE WE GOING TO 18 DO OVER THE NEXT TWO YEARS, OR YEAR AND TWO YEARS TO BE ABLE 19 TO GET US INTO A POSITION TO BE ABLE TO DECIDE AS A 20 21 COMMISSION, AS A REGION IF WE WANT TO ACCELERATE SOME OF THIS WORK WHETHER IT'S ON THE BRIDGE REHAB ON THE FUNDING ON THE 22 TOLL ON THE FORWARD PROJECTS, FOR THESE BRIDGES FOR THE OTHER 23 BRIDGES THAT DON'T HAVE PROJECTS, TO DO THE WORK. THAT'S WHAT 24 I WANT TO SEE OUT OF THIS. I'M NOT SEEING THIS HERE. I THINK 25

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1 IT'S IN SOMEONE'S HEAD, AND I THINK WE NEED TO HAVE IT WRITTEN 2 DOWN. AND SORT OF COLLECTIVELY BE ABLE TO GRAPPLE WITH THIS AS 3 AN AD-HOC COMMITTEE AND TO BE ABLE TO FORWARD THAT ON IN VERY 4 SPECIFIC TERMS TO THE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND THE COMMISSION. 5

ANDREW FREMIER: THAT'S A FAIR JUDGMENT AND I AM HOPEFUL THAT 6 7 THAT'S WHAT WE'RE PROPOSING WHEN WE SUBMIT A WRITTEN REPORT 8 THAT YOU GUYS WILL HOPEFULLY BLESS. I THINK I JUST NEED TO SORT OF, AGAIN, REITERATE THE FACT THAT, AT THE START OF --9 10 WHEN WE WERE BUILDING OUR BUDGET LAST YEAR, BOTH CALTRANS AND MTC, BATA, WE WERE NOT ANTICIPATING COVID. COVID CREATED QUITE 11 A CRISIS. WE HAVE DONE, I THINK, SOME PRETTY INCREDIBLE THINGS 12 WITH THE CONVERSION TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING, CONTINUING TO 13 COLLECT THE TOLL REVENUE, REALLY GETTING INTO THE NUTS AND 14 15 BOLTS OF THE PARTS AND PIECE OF THE REHAB PROGRAM, AND OUR JOB 16 NOW IS TO DO EXACTLY WHAT YOU DESCRIBED. AND I AM HOPEFUL THAT WE'RE GOING TO BE ABLE TO PUT THAT TOGETHER WITH THE KIND OF 17 DETAIL THAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR. 18

20 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: IF I CAN ADD TO THAT. NICK, ARE YOU
21 FINISHED?

22

23 COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: NO. I APPRECIATE THAT ANDY. AND I THINK24 YOU HAVE DONE A GREAT JOB RESPONDING TO COVID, AS YOUR TEAM25 BUILDS ON THAT.

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AMY WORTH, CHAIR: YEAH. I THINK THAT'S IT I AGREE WITH THE 2 3 SCHEDULE. I THINK IT WOULD BE REALLY IMPORTANT. I THINK WE HAVE TWO THINGS. WE'RE GOING TO FILL UP THE HOLE THAT CAME 4 5 BECAUSE OF COVID, THE LOST REVENUE. COVID HAS ACCELERATED AND POINTED OUT ISSUE IN SO MANY DIFFERENT AREAS TRENDS THAT WERE 6 ALREADY HAPPENING AND ACCELERATED. WE NEED TO LOOK AT 7 8 COMPREHENSIVE PIECES AND LOOK AT REFORMS THAT WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT THE CAL CORPORATIVE AGREEMENTS THE NEW SETTING UP THE 9 MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE THE CALTRANS PARTNERSHIP THE FACT THAT WE 10 HAVE DECISIONS THAT ARE MADE AT THE LOCAL DISTRICT LEVEL AND 11 DECISION THAT IS MADE AT THE STATE LEVEL AND THE FACT THAT WE 12 WANT EVERYBODY TO COME TOGETHER LIKE WE DID WITH THE BAY 13 BRIDGE AND I SEE DR. MULRONI ON THE PHONE HERE JOINING US 14 15 TODAY, WHAT A TREAT. I THINK WHEN YOU LOOK AT WHAT THAT DID 16 MOVING FORWARD, WE HAVE NOT ONLY THE MONEY PIECE AND IDENTIFIED WE NEED ADDITIONAL FUNDS BEYOND THE TOLLS AND 17 THAT'S THE FAIR THING TO DO LIKE THE CMAS AND THE COOPERATIVE 18 AGREEMENT, AND ALSO THE MANAGEMENT, SO DECISION MAKING MOVING 19 FORWARD. WE CAN DO THIS. AND I AGREE WITH NICK ON THE URGENCY, 20 21 WE HAVE HAD A COUPLE OF YEARS TO GET THIS DONE, AND TO SET A TEMPLATE FOR THE FUTURE. LET ME, NEXT, LET ME SEE IF THERE ARE 22 ANY OTHER OUESTIONS. IF NOT, I WOULD LOVE TO TAKE PUBLIC 23 COMMENT, TOO. WAIT A MINUTE. I SEE WE HAVE TWO MEMBERS OF THE 24 25 PUBLIC THAT WANT TO COMMENT. ANY OTHER COMMISSIONERS HAVE

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1 QUESTIONS? I KNOW WE HAVE KIND OF MIXED QUESTIONS AND 2 COMMENTS. ANY OTHER COMMISSIONERS WHO WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK. LET 3 ME TURN THEN TO THE PUBLIC. WELCOME, AGAIN, ALETA DUPREE.

5 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, CHAIR AMY WORTH. ALETA DUPREE FOR THE RECORD. I'M SEEING MIXED SIGNALS HERE. AT THE OVERSIGHT 6 7 COMMITTEE MEETING WE WERE PLANNING TO WRAP UP OUR OPEN ROAD 8 TOLLING BY FISCAL YEAR 2026. BAY BRIDGE WOULD BE THE LAST. AND NOW I'M SEEING FISCAL YEAR '29. I CERTAINLY WOULD LIKE TO SEE 9 SPECIFICITY IN THE TIMELINE OF WHERE EACH OF THESE SEVEN 10 PROJECTS ARE GOING TO FALL, ESPECIALLY BECAUSE THE THREE 11 NORTHERN BRIDGES HAVE HAD THEIR PROJECTS APPROVED, AS FAR AS I 12 CAN TELL. INTEREST RATES ARE STILL LOW, AS FAR AS I CAN TELL, 13 WHICH ALLOW FOR US TO TRY TO REFINANCE SOME MORE BEFORE 14 INTEREST RATES POSSIBLY GO BACK UP. BUT COMPARED TO SOME OTHER 15 16 VERY LARGE PROJECTS SUCH AS THE FLORIDA TURN PIKE OR THE NEW YORK STATE THOR WAY, I THINK OUR WORK IS SMALLER. I UNDERSTAND 17 18 THE BAY BRIDGE WILL HAVE TO BE LAST BECAUSE IT'S A LARGE 19 COMPLEX FACILITY BUT I WOULD LIKE TO THINK THAT THE THREE MAIN NORTHERN BRIDGES AND TWO SOUTHERN BRIDGES I HOPE COULD BE DONE 20 BY 2023. OPEN ROAD TOLLING ISN'T JUST ABOUT A BETTER WAY TO 21 22 COLLECT MONEY AND PUT UP GANTRIES AND NEW EQUIPMENT BUT IT'S A 23 SAFETY ISSUE. TWO CRASHES ON THE JERSEY TOLL PIKE IN TOLL BOOTHS LAST MONTH. I THINK WE SHOULD CLARIFY OUR SCHEDULE AND 24



CONTINUE TO PRIORITIZE THIS VISION ZERO SAFETY PROJECT. THANK
 YOU.

AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GREAT. ALETA THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR
COMMENTS. NEXT SPEAKER IS ROLAND LEBRUN.

SPEAKER: THANK YOU, MADAM CHAIR. SO, FIRST OF ALL, I 100% 7 8 AGREE WITH PETER AND ANDY, THAT THE LAST STRUCTURE, THE EIFFEL TOWER WILL LITERALLY LAST FOREVER IF IT'S MAINTAINED PROPERLY. 9 WITH REGARD TO REVENUES AND TOLLS, I THINK WE HAVE GOT A HIGH 10 URGENCY TO COME UP WITH RM3. I WOULD LIKE TO CIRCLE BACK ON 11 WHY WE COULD GET IT FUNDED. WE ALL KNOW THERE IS AN EARTHOUAKE 12 COMING AND IT'S GOING TO BE A BIG ONE WE DON'T KNOW WHEN IT'S 13 GOING TO HAPPEN TOMORROW OR IN 20 YEARS BUT WHERE THIS COMES 14 IN, IS RIGHT AFTER THE EARTHOUAKE, YOU WILL KNOW IMMEDIATELY 15 16 WHICH BRIDGE NEED INSPECTING, NOT ONLY WHICH BRIDGES, BUT WHICH SECTIONS OF WHICH BRIDGES NEED INSPECTING. SO IN 17 18 CLOSING, I THINK WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO GO TO THE FEDS AND IMPRESS ON FEMA, THAT IF THEY COULD COME UP WITH A FUNDING FOR 19 FHM IN THE BAY AREA, IN THE AREA OF BRIDGES WE COULD MAKE 20 21 SUBSTANTIAL SAVINGS RIGHT AFTER AN EARTHQUAKE BY IMMEDIATELY 22 IDENTIFYING SPECIFICALLY WHICH BRING NEED ATTENTION. THANK 23 YOU.



AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GREAT. ROLAND, THANK YOU. THANK YOU VERY 1 2 MUCH. 3 ANDREW FREMIER: COULD I ADD A COUPLE MORE? 4 5 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: YES ANDY. 6 7 8 ANDREW FREMIER: COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ, I REALLY DO TAKE TO HEART WHAT YOU SAID, I HOPE I'M BEING SUPPORTIVE OF WHAT YOU 9 SAID BECAUSE FRANKLY I WOULD LIKE TO DO EXACTLY WHAT YOU ARE 10 ARTICULATING. YOU HAVE GOT THREE SETS OF PROJECTS THAT I THINK 11 WE'RE FOCUSED ON IN THIS DECISION. AND IT'S BECAUSE IT'S 12 BROADER THAN JUST BATA AT THE END OF THE DAY, THE FIRST IS THE 13 HEALTH AND CONDITION OF THE BRIDGE STRUCTURE ITSELF. AND THE 14 15 SECOND IS HOW THE BRIDGE OPERATES, WHICH IS SORT OF THE ORT 16 ENVIRONMENT, AND THEN THE APPROACHES, WHICH MATTER VERY MUCH 17 IN HOW THE SYSTEM WORKS, IS SORT OF A THIRD LAYER. WHEN WE CAME TO YOU AT THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR, AND REALLY STARTED 18 TALKING ABOUT OUR CONCERNS, WE WERE CONCERNED WE WERE NOT EVEN 19 GOING TO BE ABLE TO KEEP UP WITH THE BRIDGES THEMSELVES, THAT 20 21 WE WERE GOING TO FALL BEHIND DRAMATICALLY. WE WERE ABLE TO KEEP THE OPEN ROAD TOLLING PROJECTS AND THE FORWARD PROJECTS 22 MOVING BECAUSE OF FUNDS NOT SECURED IN THIS BUDGET BUT FUNDS 23 THAT HADN'T BEEN EXPENDED IN THE PREVIOUS BUDGET. AND THAT 24 SAVED US SOME TIME THAT WE DIDN'T ACTUALLY HAVE TO SHUT THEM 25

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DOWN AND SHELF THEM FOR A WHILE SO WE WERE ABLE TO KEEP THEM 1 GOING. BRIAN'S ANALYSIS HAS SHOWN THAT REVENUE AND TOLL 2 3 TRAFFIC HAS BEEN COMING BACK AND WE HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL TO MANAGE THE ALL ELECTRONIC ENVIRONMENT HAS SECURED THAT REVENUE 4 5 GOING FORWARD QUITE A BIT -- WITH MORE CONTENT AND THAT THEN ALLOWED US TO BRING THE OPEN ROAD TOLLING PROJECTS BACK INTO 6 REALLY THE IMMEDIATE BUDGET DISCUSSIONS SUCH THAT WE CAN KEEP 7 8 THEM ON TRACK AND I'M ALSO MINDFUL OF MS. DUPREE'S COMMENTS THAT WE SHOULD BE ABLE TO GO FASTER. BUT REMEMBER, WE WERE 9 MAKING ESTIMATES ON A LOT OF THESE DATES AND TIMES BASED ON 10 NOT REALLY ANY REVENUE TO KEEP THEM GOING. AND SO I DO THINK 11 SOME TIME TO KIND OF REEVALUATE WHERE WE ARE BASED ON 12 RELATIVELY NEW INFORMATION FROM THE TRAFFIC COMING BACK AND 13 SUCCESS OF THE CONVERSION TO ALL ELECTRONIC TOLLING, AT LEAST 14 15 SO FAR, GIVES US A LOT MORE AMMUNITION TO PLAY WITH. A LOT 16 MORE TOOLS TO PLAY WITH, AND A LOT OF THE CONCEPTS THAT ARE BEING OVERLAID ARE, I THINK, EXTREMELY HELPFUL, IN NAVIGATING. 17 I THINK ALSO THE STATE HAS TO ACKNOWLEDGE SOME RESPONSIBILITY, 18 ESPECIALLY AS WE GO FURTHER FROM THE BRIDGE. SO THIS IDEA OF 19 THE FORWARD PROJECTS IS IMPORTANT, NOT ONLY TO THE REGION, BUT 20 21 ALSO TO THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA. AND I DO CONTINUE TO HOPE THAT BY GOING AFTER AVAILABLE FUNDS FROM FEDERAL OWNED STATE 22 SOURCES AND APPLYING THEM IN AREAS THAT ARE ELIGIBLE IS 23 ANOTHER WAY TO BUY US SOME ENERGY TO MAYBE FOCUS ON 24 ACCELERATION OF PROJECTS THAT YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT. AND AGAIN 25

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THE EFFICIENCY THING I DON'T THINK CAN BE LOST BECAUSE WHILE 1 IT'S NOT A LARGE NUMBER AT THE END OF THE DAY A LOT OF THE 2 3 WORK WE'RE TALKING ABOUT DOESN'T TAKE LARGE NUMBERS TO BE SUCCESSFUL. SO IF WE COULD SAVE SEVERAL MILLION DOLLARS A YEAR 4 5 BY MAKING ADMINISTRATIVE ADJUSTMENT, TO WHAT WE SEND BACK TO THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, WE CAN ACCELERATE THE ASSET 6 MANAGEMENT WORK THAT GIVES US A BETTER IDEA OF WHAT'S 7 8 HAPPENING IN THE OTHER TEN STRUCTURES THAT WE HAVEN'T REALLY STARTED TO WORK ON. SO I GUESS I TEND TO THINK YOU HAVE 9 PLANTED SOME GOOD SEEDS HERE, BUT YOU ALSO HAVE GOT TO GIVE 10 THEM SOME TIME TO GROW. 11

AMY WORTH, CHAIR: SO IT SOUND LIKE, ANDY, YOU'RE THINKING IN 13 TERMS OF A SCHEDULE, ALSO, AND MAYBE ARTICULATING THAT WOULD 14 BE HELPFUL, EXACTLY WHAT YOU SAID. IN ADDITION THE -- YOU 15 16 TALKED ABOUT THE MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE, THE CO-OP AGREEMENT. I 17 WOULD RATHER SPEND A MILLION DOLLARS ON PAINT, THAN ON COMMUNICATIONS BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN HERE AND SACRAMENTO AND 18 WHO IS IN CHARGE AND THAT. YOU HAVE GOT GOOD PEOPLE DOING THE 19 WORK, BUT, LIKE, LET'S PUT EVERYBODY IN THE SAME ROOM, AND 20 21 LET'S, YOU KNOW -- BECAUSE I THINK THAT'S ONE OF THE 22 CHALLENGES. I WASN'T AROUND WHEN YOU GUYS MADE THE BRILLIANT DECISION TO PUT TOGETHER THE WORKING GROUP FOR THE BRIDGE. 23 BUT. [LAUGHTER] YOU KNOW, WHEN YOU SAW THE RESULTS OF THAT, IT 24 WAS PHENOMENAL. AND I SAW IT APPOINTED IN CRISIS. I SAW IT 25

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WORK SO WELL AT THE TIME WHEN WE HAD THE BOLT FAILURE WE HAD 1 THIS STRUCTURE IN PLACE WHERE ALL THE PEOPLE WERE IN THE ROOM 2 3 TOGETHER TO SAY HERE'S THE ISSUE WHAT'S PROBLEM AND HOW DO WE SOLVE T AND I THINK WE COULD DO, WE CAN ENHANCE THE WORK WE 4 5 CAN DO, THAT'S THE OTHER THING, THE CO-OP AGREEMENT AND THE MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE THAT YOU TALKED ABOUT FOR DECISION 6 MAKING, MOVING FORWARD AROUND THE BRIDGES. BECAUSE WE ARE 7 8 PROBABLY THE ONLY PLACE IN THE WORLD WHERE YOU HAVE GOT ONE ENTITY THAT HAS THE MONEY, AND THE OTHER ENTITY THAT OWNS THE 9 PROPERTY. AND IT'S LIKE WE KIND OF NEED TO -- AND WE SORT OF 10 ENGAGED BUT WE REALLY NEED TO SORT OF MARY THOSE PARTNERSHIPS 11 MUCH MORE CLOSELY. IT SEEMS THOSE ARE ONE OF THE THINGS YOU 12 IDENTIFIED MOVING FORWARD. 13

ANDREW FREMIER: THE FACT THAT YOU ALL ARE PAYING ATTENTION TO 15 16 IT AND THAT COMMISSIONER EL-TAWANSY IS ALSO INVOLVED IS A WAY TO SHARE HOW MUCH WE ALL BELIEVE THE ACCELERATING PROJECT 17 DELIVERY IS A KEY GOAL ACROSS THE REGION. AND I LOVE THE FACT 18 THAT WE'RE GETTING PRESS TO GO FASTER. I THINK THAT'S 19 IMPORTANT. AND I THINK WE HAVE TRIED TO ARTICULATE AT A HIGH 20 21 LEVEL SO FAR WHERE SOME OF THOSE RESTRICTIONS ARE. I THINK WE 22 CAN ADD SOME VERY SPECIFIC INFORMATION ABOUT HOW THESE PROJECTS ARE SCHEDULED TO PLAY OUT, THAT WILL ANSWER SOME OF 23 THE QUESTIONS THAT YOU ASKED, COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ. I DO 24 25 THINK THAT THE ASSET MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION SORT OF PLAYS INTO

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ROLAND LEBRUN'S OUESTION ABOUT MODERATING. I DON'T DISAGREE 1 WITH HIM AS A SUBJECT BUT THE QUESTION IS WHAT IS YOUR SCOPE? 2 3 WHEN YOU LOOK ACROSS THE WORLD THERE ARE BRIDGES INSTRUMENTED TO THE NTH DEGREE THAT ARE PROBABLY PUMPING OUT MORE 4 5 INFORMATION THAT YOU COULD EVER DIGEST THEY ALSO HAVE TO BE MAINTAINED BUT THE STRUCTURAL HEALTH MONITORING WHICH WE DON'T 6 HAVE ON THE BRIDGES I AGREE THERE NEEDS TO BE ADDITIONAL WORK 7 8 DONE THERE IT NEEDS TO BE THE RIGHT AMOUNT SO THAT WE'RE FEEDING INFORMATION THAT WE CAN TURN IN TO REAL HEALTH 9 MONITORING SPECIFIC ELEMENTS AND THAT'S A SPECIFIC GOAL OF THE 10 ASSET MANAGEMENT WORK. HOW CAN WE MAKE SURE THAT THE SEISMIC 11 DETAILS LIKE THE BEARINGS, AND THE DAMPERS, THAT WE KNOW 12 WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THEM, SO THAT WE DON'T FIND OUT THAT THE 13 DAMPERS ARE LEAKING AND OIL RUNNING INTO THE STREET IN SAN 14 15 FRANCISCO THAT WE HAVE INFORMATION TELLING US WE SHOULD HAVE 16 THOSE PARTICULAR ELEMENTS THAT WILL HELP US DRIVE THE PROPER REPAIR AND SOLUTIONS. SO I APPRECIATE YOU'RE COMMENTS, AND I 17 THINK WE CAN GO A LONG WAYS TOWARDS ADDRESSING SOME OF THEM IN 18 THE REPORT THAT WE'RE FEVERING TO, WITH SOME OF THE 19 SPECIFICITY THAT YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT. 20

CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: I APPRECIATE THIS CONVERSATION BECAUSE IT 4 5 STARTED MONTHS AGO WHERE WE WERE GIVEN DEEP DIVE DETAILS THAT STAFF WAS FACING SO THE RESULT WAS THE TASK FORCE AND WE'RE 6 SUPPOSED TO COME BACK TO THE FULL COMMISSION WITH WHAT 7 8 APPEARED TO BE AT THE TIME SOME MAGICAL SOLUTION, AND AS WE'RE BEING TALKED ABOUT TODAY, THERE IS NO MAGICAL SOLUTION, BUT WE 9 CERTAINLY DO NEED TO COME BACK WITH SOMETHING. AND I 10 APPRECIATE THAT WE'RE GOING QUANTIFY IT IN TERMS OF TIMELINES. 11 AND BECAUSE IT'S THE SAME THING WITH ANY KIND OF BUDGET OR 12 SITUATION. IT'S LIKE, RAISE MORE REVENUE AND DECREASE 13 EXPENSES. AND IN THIS CASE, OR MORE EFFICIENT USE OF REVENUE 14 15 WE HAVE, WHICH IN THIS CASE WE'RE TALKING ABOUT ASSET 16 MANAGEMENT. SO I APPRECIATE ALL OF THIS BECAUSE WE DON'T HAVE THE BANDWIDTH TO HAVE A FULL COMMISSION LISTEN TO THESE 20 17 HOURS OF CONVERSATIONS. SO I APPRECIATE THE PART OF THE GROUP 18 THAT HAS DONE THIS, AND I HAVE STARTED TO TALK TO FOLKS AND I 19 HEAR THEM SAYING YOU KNOW WHAT BRIDGE DON'T LAST FOREVER SO 20 21 WE'RE HAVING CONVERSATIONS ABOUT WHAT TO DO ABOUT THAT. SO 22 IT'S BEEN VERY DELICATE.

24 DAMON CONNOLLY: I CONCUR WITH THAT. I THINK COMMISSIONER
25 JOSEFOWITZ LAID OUT WHAT WE ALL AGREE IS THE POSTURE RIGHT

8 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: YEAH. OKAY. GREAT. YEAH I CONCUR WITH THAT. AND, AGAIN, I THINK THE MESSAGE IS, THE COMMISSIONERS ARE 9 10 SUPPORTING A STRONG MOVING FORWARD. WE HAVE THIS CRISIS, WE HAVE A MOMENT IN TIME. AND IT'S ALWAYS SO CHALLENGING TO MAKE 11 INSTITUTIONAL CHANGES, OR TO DO THINGS DIFFERENTLY. HOW DO WE 12 APPROVE IT. IT WAS INTERESTING, I HEARD A TALK YESTERDAY AT 13 BERKELEY A HISTORY PROFESSOR THEY WERE TALK BY THE TIME 14 15 PANDEMIC IMPACT IN INSTITUTIONAL DECISION MAKING AND THEY 16 TALKED ABOUT THE ROMANS IN 380AD THEY HAD A PLAYING AND IT RESULTED IN SIGNIFICANT DECISION MAKING CHANGES BY THE ROMAN 17 EMPIRE. I THINK WE CAN SAY, I THINK WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY 18 RIGHT NOW TO REALLY MOVE THIS FORWARD. AND NOT BE SHY ABOUT 19 IT, BUT REALLY BE BOLD. AND BECAUSE I FIRMLY BELIEVE IF WE'RE 20 21 GOING TO ULTIMATELY NEED TO GO BACK TO OUR TOLL PAYERS FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS, WE HAVE GOT TO HAVE THE BASIS FOR, A PLAN, 22 AND ASSET MANAGEMENT, AND ALSO THE MANAGEMENT KIND OF 23 STRUCTURAL DECISION MAKING ELEMENTS IN PLACE SO THAT WE CAN 24 SAY TO THEM, YES YOUR THERE IS GOING TO BE SPENT PRUDENTLY AND 25

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EFFECTIVELY AND THIS SHOULD WHAT IT'S GOING TO DO. I KNOW THAT 1 WE DID TWO THINGS. ONE, WE'RE LOOKING AT THE GAP, THE \$250 2 3 MILLION GAP. HOW DO WE MAKE THAT UP, BUT THEN THE OPPORTUNITY IS TO LOOK MOVING INTO THE FUTURE, ISSUES THAT WE KNEW WERE 4 5 PROBLEMS THAT NEED TO BE RESOLVED, WE CAN DO THAT ALSO. AND RECOGNIZING, ANDY, WHAT YOU HEAR YOU SAYING, AND I THINK YOUR 6 SUMMARY WAS GOOD, YOU KNOW, AND KNOWING WHAT THE TIMELINE IS 7 8 GOING TO BE FOR THAT. SO THAT WAS GREAT. AND I THINK THIS POINTS OUT THE FACT THAT THIS IS A REALLY IMPORTANT 9 PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN BATA AND CALTRANS. BECAUSE WE DO -- WE ARE 10 IN THIS TOGETHER. AND WE SERVE THE GOALS OF THE REGION AND THE 11 FOLKS THAT ARE DRIVING ACROSS THE BRIDGES, EVERY DAY. SO I 12 THINK EVERYBODY IN THIS WORLD TAKES THIS PERSONALLY, TOO, IN 13 TERMS OF WANTING TO DO WHAT'S BEST FOR THE BRIDGES, AND THE 14 15 TOLL PAYERS. SO LET'S SEE. WE ARE NOW -- WE ARE NOW MOVING TO 16 ANDY. YOU HAD NEXT STEPS. YOU MAY HAVE ALREADY DELIVERED NEXT STEPS IN RESPONSE TO THE QUESTIONS. BUT YOU -- HOPEFULLY YOU 17 HAVE A FEELING -- YOU HAVE RECEIVED THE MESSAGE THAT YOU HAVE 18 A VERY SUPPORTIVE GROUP OF COMMISSIONERS HERE WHO WANT TO 19 SUPPORT WHAT YOU'RE DOING AND SAY, KEEP GOING. YOU KNOW. 20 21 [LAUGHTER] DON'T -- BE BOLD, AS THEY SAY.

ANDREW FREMIER: I'M ALSO MINDFUL. I AM READING THE EMPIRE AND 3 THE HUDSON WHICH IS THE BOOK STEVE GAVE TO ME ABOUT THE NEW 4 5 YORK PORT AUTHORITY AND THEY SLOWLY GRABBED MORE AND MORE AUTHORITY. SO MAYBE THAT'S WHAT YOU'RE ASKING US TO REALLY 6 CONSIDER. BUT IT DID TAKE DECADES FOR THEM TO GET THAT. I DO 7 8 TAKE TO HEART THAT WE PROBABLY WEREN'T THINKING AS DIRECTLY ABOUT GIVING YOU SPECIFICITY AROUND PROJECT DELIVERY SCHEDULES 9 AND SOME ASSUMPTIONS AND SOME OTHER KINDS OF IDEAS THAT WE'RE 10 TALKING ABOUT. SO WE WILL CERTAINLY WORK ON THAT. I DO THINK, 11 AGAIN, THAT I KIND OF WALKED INTO THIS DISCUSSION THINKING, 12 GOING FROM RED TO YELLOW WAS A GOOD THING. YOU'RE SAYING YOU 13 WANT US TO KEEP PUSHING TOWARDS GREEN, AND I THINK THAT'S GOOD 14 15 ADVICE THAT WE'LL TRY TO INCORPORATE WITH DISCUSSION. I DO 16 THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO RECOGNIZE, THOUGH, THAT THE SHORT-TERM OUTCOME, IT'S ALL ABOUT TOLL REVENUE AT THE END OF THE DAY, I 17 KNOW MR. MAYHEW GETS MORE IS MORE CONCERNED AS WE MOVE FURTHER 18 AWAY FROM THE BRIDGES. IF WE COULD USE LOCAL BATA MONEY TO 19 DELIVER MOVING FORWARD WE COULD SHAVE OFF A YEAR BECAUSE THERE 20 IS LITTLE FEDERAL INVOLVEMENT BUT THAT'S NOT AN EASY EQUATION 21 SO THERE MIGHT BE OPPORTUNITY IN THE COMING MONTHS TO DO WHAT 22 WE HAVE TRIED TO DO WHICH IS MARRY THE BLUE RIBBON DISCUSSION 23 WITH THE SEAMLESS DISCUSSION AND BATA RECOVERY DISCUSSION. I 24 THINK WE HAVE FORECAST THAT ALLOWS US TO DIG DEEPER INTO THE 25

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HARD DECK TO SOLVE SOME OF THE IMMEDIATE PROBLEMS IS REALLY 1 BIG. I THINK THE FACT THAT YOU ALL ARE SUPPORTING BEING 2 3 AGGRESSIVE ABOUT GOING AFTER FEDERAL AND STATE MONEY COULD BACKFILL THAT \$250 MILLION OF MISSING MONEY IS ALSO VERY 4 5 POSITIVE. SO WHILE MAYBE WE DIDN'T GO AS FAR AS YOU WOULD LIKE US TO GO, YOU HAVE GIVEN US QUITE A BIT OF LEASH THAT WE'RE 6 LOOKING FORWARD TO TAKING ADVANTAGE OF, AND WE WILL CONTINUE 7 8 TO TAKE THE AGGRESSIONS OF ADVICE ON HOW TO DO BETTER. I THINK I HAD A COUPLE OF SLIDES. I DON'T -- I THINK WE CAN PUT THEM 9 UP AND I CAN GO RIGHT TO THE LAST ONE. IF THE TEAM COULD DO 10 THAT FOR ME. YEAH, SO THIS REHASH -- THERE YOU GO. THAT LAST 11 ONE. SO COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ, I HOPE THIS SORT OF AT LEAST 12 GIVES YOU THE HIGH LEVEL IT'S JUST A POWERPOINT SLIDE BUT WE 13 ARE EXPECTING THE REPORT THAT COMES BACK TO YOU, IN APRIL, 14 15 EARLY APRIL, WILL HELP US GET READY NOT ONLY FOR THE COME 16 BUDGET EXERCISES THAT YOU START IN MAY, BUT THE ADOPTION OF THE BUDGET IN JULY THAT ALLOWS US SOME RUNNING ROOM FOR THE 17 FISCAL YEAR, TO REALLY MAKE SOME PROGRESS IN THE SUBJECT 18 MATTER THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT. THAT HOPEFULLY DOES PRODUCE 19 MORE OF THAT EXPLICICITY THAT YOU'RE LOOKING FOR, BUT IN 20 21 SIMPLE TERMS I THINK WE HAVE GOTTEN A LOT OF SUPPORT AROUND MAKING SURE WE GET MORE SYNERGIES OUT OF THE VARIOUS 22 COMMISSIONS WITH THE TRANSIT PRIORITY TOLLING, PRICING 23 OPERATIONS AND THAT'S BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND BAIFA 24 WHETHER WE ALIGN THEM IN A DAY OR BETTER DEFINE TO GET THOSE 25

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THREE COMMITTEES AND AUTHORITIES ALL ON THE SAME PAGE WILL BE 1 IMPORTANT. I THINK WE HAVE MADE A GOOD TIE THERE. THE 2 3 COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WAS GOING TO BE A GOOD CHALLENGE NOW WE'RE TALKING ABOUT A DOCUMENT THAT IS WRITTEN AGREED TO BY 4 5 POLICY MAKERS IN THE DEPARTMENT AND STATE OF CALIFORNIA WHO OWN THE BRIDGES IN BATA. WE HAVE COME UP WITH SOME IDEAS THAT 6 ARE IMPORTANT BUT I HAVE NEVER FOUND A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT 7 8 WITH SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES HAPPENING VERY QUICKLY. SO THAT MAY BE A PLACE WHERE WE CAN SOLICIT SUPPORT FROM YOU ALL BECAUSE 9 THOSE CAN BE A CHALLENGE. THERE HAS GOT TO BE A DIRECT 10 RELATIONSHIP TO WHAT THE LAW SAYS AND THEN THERE IS 11 FLEXIBILITY ABOUT WHAT THE PARTNERS ARE WILLING TO EXCHANGE 12 MOVING FORWARD. WE DO NEED TO BUILD ON THOSE IDEAS AND WE HAVE 13 NOT HAD TIME TO DO THAT YET, BUT THAT IS SOME SPECIFICITY THAT 14 15 IS REQUIRED. WE DO THINK THAT LEGISLATIVE CHANGES TAKE A 16 COUPLE OF YEARS TO GET RESOLVED. HOWEVER, ONE OPPORTUNITY IS IN FRONT OF US. THERE IS A BILL ON THE BAY BRIDGE, THE BONTA 17 BILL THAT MAY BE AN OPENING TO DO SOME THINGS. I HAVE NO IDEA 18 IF WE CAN DO SOME THINGS TO MOVE FORWARD OUICKLY ENOUGH, BUT 19 THAT IS A VEHICLE THAT WILL GIVE US MORE FLEXIBILITY SOONER 20 WHICH IS ULTIMATELY WHAT YOU'RE ASKING FOR. AND LAST IS TRYING 21 TO MAKE SURE WE FUND THE MOST CRITICAL SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS AND 22 AS ANOTHER REMINDER, THIS YEARS'S FISCAL BUDGET DID NOT HAVE 23 THE REPAIR THAT IS NECESSARY AT YBI ISLAND OR THE TUNNEL OR 24 SOME OF THE DIRECTOR ORDERS THAT HAVE POPPED UP IN RECENT TIME 25

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INCLUDING THE WORK WE STILL NEED TO DO AT RICHMOND WITH THE 1 LOWER DECK JOINTS. SO THAT'S A BIG WIN ALL BY ITSELF, THAT 2 3 NEXT YEARS' BUDGET IS GOING TO KEEP US A BUNCH OF THE EMERGENCIES THAT WE HAVE IDENTIFIED BETWEEN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET 4 5 AND LAST YEAR'S BUDGET AND THE CONVERSATION ABOUT HOW TOLL INCREASES TAKE PLACE AND THE POINT YOU MADE WHETHER CPI IS 6 USED FOR A AND B WHICH IS REHAB AND SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTMENTS 7 8 OR RELATIVE TO SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTS I THINK THAT'S A KEY TO MOVING FORWARD. WE DEFINITELY APPRECIATE THE INFORMATION 9 PRESENTED BACK TO US FROM YOU ALL, AND THE INDICATION ABOUT 10 WHETHER OR NOT WE'RE MOVING IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION. 11

COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I THINK THIS IS A GOOD START. IF YOU 15 16 WOULDN'T MIND JUST PUTTING IT BACK UP SO THEY CAN -- BUT, I THINK, YOU KNOW, TO ME, THE -- YOU KNOW, I HOPE THAT THIS 17 REPORT COMES BACK WITH SORT OF MORE SPECIFICITY ON WHAT WE CAN 18 EXPECT FROM THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AND ON WHAT TIME 19 FRAME. BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, I'M -- COMMITTING TO A ROBUST ASSET 20 21 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IS REALLY DIFFERENT TO SAYING, LIKE, BY JUNE, WE'RE GOING TO V YOU KNOW, THIS TYPE OF ASSET MANAGEMENT 22 PROGRAM IN PLACE, AND WE'LL BE KIND OF ON TRACK TO GET ISO 23 CERTIFICATION OR WHATEVER IT IS RIGHT? AND THAT VERY MUCH --24 AND I THINK YOU KNOW, THE ASSET MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IS BOTH 25

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ABOUT SORT OF LIKE DOING THE ASSET MANAGEMENT BETTER, 1 GENERATING THE CONFIDENCE IN ALL OF US AND OUR CONSTITUENCIES 2 3 THAT WE'RE DOING THE ASSET MANAGEMENT AS WELL AS WE COULD, AND GENERATING THE INFORMATION OUT OF THAT ASSET MANAGEMENT 4 5 PROGRAM THAT IS GOING TO ALLOW US TO MAKE BETTER DECISIONS ABOUT SORT OF FUNDING ALLOCATION IN PARTICULAR. AND I THINK, 6 YOU KNOW, I WOULD REALLY LIKE TO GET SOME CERTAINTY ON WHEN, 7 8 HOW THAT IS GOING TO PROCEED, WHAT ARE GOING TO BE THE DATES, BECAUSE THAT REALLY, SORT OF LINKS UP TO THE ISSUE OF WHEN ARE 9 WE GOING TO GO OUT AND TRY TO GET THIS TOLL INCREASE. OR WHEN 10 ARE WE GOING TO GO OUT AND GET THIS TOLL INCREASE IS IT GOING 11 TO BE IN 2027, 2024 OR LATER. TO ME THERE WAS NO MAGIC IN 2027 12 THAT WAS THE DATE IN BRIAN'S MODELS. BUT MY INCLINATION IS, 13 SHOULD IT BE SOONER? MAYBE IT NEEDS TO BE LATER BUT THERE 14 15 NEEDS TO BE A DECISION MAKING STRUCTURE INFORMATION TO HELP US 16 WITH THAT AND I DON'T FEEL COMFORTABLE THAT I REPORTING BACK THAT WE'RE JUST GOING TO KEEP TRACK OF 2027 TOLL INCREASE I 17 DON'T HAVE INFORMATION THAT THAT'S THE BEST TIME TO DO IT. AND 18 IT RELATES NOT ONLY TO ASSET MANAGEMENT BUT TO ALL THE THINGS 19 IN NUMBER ONE. OR IN THAT FIRST BULLET. AND I DON'T KNOW 20 21 EXACTLY WHAT YOU MEAN THERE, BECAUSE PROMOTE SYNERGY THROUGH COMMITTEE STRUCTURE, I DON'T KNOW IF THAT'S -- IF THE ACTION 22 ITEM THERE IS THAT WE HAVE A DIFFERENT COMMITTEE STRUCTURE AT 23 MTC OR IF THE ACTION ITEM IS THAT WITHIN A YEAR WE'LL HAVE A 24 FUNDING PLAN FOR OUR TRANSIT PRIORITY PROJECTS AND A PLAN HOW 25



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TO ADDRESS INEQUITIES AND TOLLING VIOLATION POLICIES I THINK A
 SPECIFICITY ABOUT THAT IN PLANNING WOULD BE GOOD.

ANDREW FREMIER: I THINK THOSE ARE GREAT OBJECTIVES AND GOALS, 4 5 AND BACK TO DR. MARRONY, THE REASON WE BROUGHT IT BACK IS TO HELP US WITH THE SPECIFICITY IN ASSET MANAGEMENT RELATED TO 6 BRIDGES THAT'S BRIAN'S EXPERTISE AND WE'RE GOING TO TAKE 7 8 ADVANTAGE OF HIS WILLINGNESS TO WORK WITH US. I THINK HIS OUESTION ABOUT THE SYNERGIES IS IN THE COMMISSION'S COURT AND 9 WE CAN ADOPT TO EITHER WAY THAT IT GOES WE HAVE PROVIDED SOME 10 11 OPTIONS FORWARD FOR YOU ALL TO CONSIDER. AND THE EQUITY MEASURES WHICH YOU AND I HAVE TALKED ABOUT AND WE HAVE TALKED 12 ABOUT OVERSIGHT WE HAVE A PLAN OVER THE COURSE OF THE SPRING 13 TO BRING SOME REAL INFORMATION FORWARD THAT SHOULD HELP YOU 14 15 JUDGE WHAT ARE THE PROPER CHANGES TO MAKE TO DEAL WITH THAT 16 SECOND BULLET. SO I THINK THERE IS MORE THAN ONE SLIDE THAT WE HAVE ACTUALLY THOUGHT ABOUT, BUT ONE SLIDE IS WHAT WE HAVE 17 18 PRESENTED.

20 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: GREAT. THANK YOU. BEFORE I MAKE ANY CLOSING 21 COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS, CAROL OR DAMON, LET ME JUST TURN TO THE 22 TWO OF YOU TO SEE IF YOU HAVE ANY ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS.

I DON'T SEE ANYBODY, ANY HERE. AND I THINK THAT --6 7 8 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: WE DID NOT TAKE COMMENT FOR ITEM FOUR. 9 AMY WORTH, CHAIR: LET ME ASK IF THERE IS ANY PUBLIC COMMENT ON 10 THIS ITEM? I DON'T SEE ANY. SO I WILL CLOSE THE PUBLIC COMMENT 11 AND COME BACK. AND I REALLY, FIRST OF ALL, YOU CAN GO BACK, 12 PULL BACK UP THAT FINAL SLIDE, ANDY, THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL. 13 THE SUMMARY SLIDE THAT YOU HAD. SO I CAN LOOK AT THAT AGAIN. I 14 15 THINK WE TALKED ABOUT A TIMELINE. I THING IS A GOOD TIMELINE. 16 YOU KNOW MY FEELING IS I THINK WE NEED TO PROVIDE THE ASSETS, THE MONEY TO DO THE WORK THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE BOTH IN TERMS 17 OF MAINTENANCE AS WELL AS OPERATIONS. AND I DO THINK IT'S 18 ABSOLUTELY APPROPRIATE FOR US TO BE LOOKING AT THE FORWARD 19 INITIATIVES GO ON THE FREEWAY FARTHER OUT IF WE CAN HAVE @BART 20 21 ON RM3 WE CAN LOOK AT THOSE BRIDGE FORWARD INITIATIVES. AND I DO. AND I GUESS THE OTHER THING IS I WOULD LIKE TO PICK UP ON 22 ANDY'S SUGGESTION ABOUT ANY EXISTING LENGTH THAT WE MIGHT BE 23 ABLE TO UTILIZE -- TO BE ABLE TO TRY TO ACCOMPLISH SOME OF 24 25 THESE GOALS THAT WE HAVE. BECAUSE I WOULD LOVE TO, INSTEAD OF

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2 TO 3 YEAR, MOVE THAT INTO THE NEXT YEAR CATEGORY, THE 1 2 LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES. BECAUSE, AS YOU USE IT IN 3 EXAMPLE ANDY, THE IDEA THAT IF YOU COULD JUST CHANGE SOME OF THE PIECES OF THE CO-OP AGREEMENT OR CHANGE A LITTLE ABOUT THE 4 5 LEGISLATION, WE CAN ACCELERATE SOME OF THESE FORWARD INITIATIVES BY A YEAR. THAT'S A LOT OF TIME. AT THE SAME TIME 6 OUR TRANSIT IS IN REAL CRISIS AND ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WE'RE 7 8 GOING TO ABSOLUTELY NEED TO DO TO GET PEOPLE BACK ON THE BUSES IT'S A GOOD DEAL. IT'S BETTER. YOU'RE GOING TO GET PEOPLE 9 ACROSS THE BRIDGE FASTER ON A BUS OR YOU'RE GOING TO GET TO 10 WHERE YOU NEED TO GO. I THINK WE NEED TO BE ASSERTIVE ABOUT 11 THE SCHEDULE. PEOPLE START TO EXPERIENCE THIS, OH THINGS ARE 12 NORMALIZING, AND WE LOSE THE MOMENTUM. I WOULD BE RELUCTANT TO 13 START TALKING ABOUT A TOLL INCREASE UNTIL WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED 14 15 THESE OTHER THINGS IN TERMS OF GETTING THE MONEY FROM THE 16 APPROPRIATE -- YOU KNOW, THE OTHER SOURCES. I JUST -- I THINK THAT WE HAVE GOT TO GET THE BRIDGES, DESERVE THEIR FAIR SHARE 17 OF THE STATE AND FEDERAL MONEY AND WE NEED TO LOOK AT COT OP 18 AGREEMENT AND THE MANAGEMENT, THE OWNERS AND THE FUNDERS 19 TOGETHER, AND DO THESE, SOME OF THIS WORK. AND JUST SEEMS LIKE 20 21 WE'RE ALL REALLY EAGER TO DO IT NOW AND RECOGNIZING THAT WE'RE, IN THE PAST, WE'RE USED TO MOVING AT A LITTLE BIT 22 SLOWER PACE, AND I THINK IT SOUND LIKE THE STAFF, COMMITTEE 23 STAFF AND THE COMMISSIONERS REALLY, THAT WE RECOGNIZE THAT, 24 LET'S SEIZE ON THE OPPORTUNITY TO MOVE AS DELIBERATIVELY AS WE 25

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CAN. AND I THINK WE'LL HAVE SUPPORT. THE OTHER POINT -- ONE 1 OTHER FINAL POINT ON THE MONEY. AND I KNOW I KEEP FOCUSING ON 2 3 THE ADDITIONAL SOURCES OF FUNDING THAT WE'RE GOING TO PURSUE. I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT TO GET THE MESSAGE ACROSS, THAT IF WE 4 5 CAN'T GET THIS ADDITIONAL MONEY, SHORT OF THE MAINTENANCE STUFF, WE CAN'T DO IT. I MEAN, I -- I THINK WE NEED TO REALLY 6 PRESS THE POINT THAT WE NEED THE SB1 FUNDS. WE NEED THE 7 8 FEDERAL FUNDS, WHATEVER, TO DO THIS WORK. BECAUSE I THINK, WHERE AS YOU SAID, WE'RE TAKING IT OUT OF -- SOME OUT OF 9 10 SAVINGS, WE'RE TAKING IT, YOU KNOW, WE'RE -- SOME OF OUR REVENUE IS RESTORED, BUT WE'RE LOOKING AT ADDITIONAL COST. I 11 MEAN, WE DIDN'T HAVE THE OPEN ROAD TOLLING INVESTMENTS LAST 12 YEAR, IN THE TIME FRAME IT IS. SO THAT'S THE OTHER PIECE. I 13 REALLY THINK WE HAVE TO MAKE THE COMPELLING ARGUMENT NOT ONLY 14 TO OUR OWN COMMISSIONERS, BUT TO THE STATE, AND THE CALIFORNIA 15 16 TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION, WHOEVER IS ALLOCATING THOSE DOLLARS, THAT THIS IS -- THESE ARE VERY, VERY IMPORTANT. AND 17 THE OTHER THING IS, IN THIS FEDERAL REAUTHORIZATION IF THERE 18 IS LANGUAGE THAT WE NEED TO MAKE SURE IS IN THE FEDERAL 19 REAUTHORIZATION TO PROVIDE THE FUNDING FOR APPROACHES AND 20 BRIDGE CORRIDORS WE HAVE A BRILLIANT LEGISLATIVE TEAM AT MTC I 21 THINK THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO MAKE SURE WE GET WHAT WE NEED 22 IN THESE BILLS THAT ARE ALREADY MOVING. SO WITH THAT, I WANT 23 TO THANK EVERYONE FOR YOUR COMMENTS. NEXT ITEM, WE MOVE TO 24 PUBLIC COMMENT FOR -- ASK IF THERE ARE ANY PUBLIC COMMENTS FOR 25



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ITEMS THAT ARE BEFORE THIS COMMITTEE, BUT POTENTIALLY NOT ON
 THE AGENDA. AND ALETA DUPREE, WELCOME.

SPEAKER: THANK YOU CHAIR AMY WORTH AND MEMBERS. ALETA DUPREE 4 5 FOR THE RECORD. YOU KNOW, I LOVE A GOOD PUBLIC MEETING. CAN'T SEEM TO GET ENOUGH OF THEM. AND THIS IS A TIME TO REACH, AND 6 CRISIS OFTEN DEFINES IT. I REMEMBER THE FISCAL CRISIS OF 1975 7 8 IN NEW YORK, AND THE BRIDGE FAILURE IN CONNECTICUT, IN '83 AND IN UPSTATE NEW YORK IN '87 AND THE CONSTRUCTION GOING ON AND 9 NEW THE CHALLENGES OF TODAY AND TOLL INCREASES AND I 10 APPRECIATE THE FACT THAT THIS AGENCY IS PROBABLY DOING MORE 11 PRODUCTIVE DISCUSSION ABOUT THIS TYPE OF WORK THAN PROBABLY 12 JUST ABOUT ANYBODY. AND SO THANK YOU FOR BRINGING THIS FORWARD 13 INTO THE PUBLIC REALM. I THOUGHT ABOUT BEING A TOLL COLLECTOR 14 ONCE, OUT OF HIGH SCHOOL, AND NOW THAT'S GOING INTO THE PAST, 15 16 AND I DON'T REGRET IT. MOVING ON. BUT MORE SO, I APPRECIATE THE FACT THAT THE PUBLIC COMMENT PROCESS ALLOWS TO BE A PART 17 OF THE CONVERSATION RATHER THAN SITTING IN A BOOTH AND 18 COLLECTING MONEY ALL DAY. LOOKING FORWARD TO YOUR NEXT MEETING 19 AND THE OTHER BATA GROUPS CONTINUING THEIR WORK THIS MONTH. 20 21 THANK YOU.

AND I REALLY WANT TO THANK, AGAIN, THIS ALL STARTED 16 WITH STAFF IDENTIFYING THAT HERE WE WERE FACING A CRISIS OF 17 OUR, YOU KNOW, THE TOLL REVENUE THAT WE RELY ON TO DO THE 18 MAINTENANCE WORK, AND THEN REALLY A DEEPER ANALYSIS AND DIVE 19 INTO WHAT POTENTIALLY CAN WE DO MOVING FORWARD. YOU KNOW, AS 20 THE SUNRISES, AND WE WANT TO CONTINUE TO TAKE CARE OF THESE 21 BRIDGES IN THE BEST WAY POSSIBLE BOTH FROM A MAINTENANCE 22 STANDPOINT AS WELL AS OPERATIONAL STANDPOINT. SO, AGAIN, I 23 WANT TO THANK STAFF, AND THANK THE COMMITTEE, AND WE WILL LOOK 24
