OUR COMMISSION 17 INCLUDES SEVERAL NEW MEMBERS WHO DID NOT HAVE THE PRIVILEGE OF 18 WORKING WITH HER BUT THOSE WHO DID KNOW OF HER ELEGANCE, AND 19 MAKING THE BAY AREA A BRIGHTER INCLUSIVE PLACE. LET US, TO THE 20 21 BEST OF OUR ABILITIES, CONDUCT THIS MEETING AS ANNE CONDUCTED HERSELF WITH GRACE AND DIGNITY AND WHEN OUR WORK IS COMPLETED 22 TODAY LET US ADJOURN THIS MEETING IN HONOR OF HER. IF YOU 23 COULD ALL JOIN ME IN A MOMENT OF SILENCE IF ANNE OWE HONOR. 24 THANK YOU. I KNOW SOME OF US MAY HAVE SOME WORDS TO SAY. IT 25

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1 WAS DEVASTATING. WE ALL HAVE VERY FOND MEMORIES OF ANNE.

2 COMMISSIONER SPERING?

JAMES P. SPERING: ANNE WAS MY VICE CHAIR AT THE PLANNING 4 5 COMMITTEE FOR MANY YEARS AND I ALWAYS SAT NEXT TO HER AND SHE 6 JUST LOVES SAN FRANCISCO AND ALWAYS PROTECTED SAN FRANCISCO'S INTEREST. BUT SHE REALLY UNDERSTOOD THAT SHE SERVED ON A 7 8 REGIONAL BODY. SHE WOULD PASS ME NOTES DURING THE MEETING, WHISPER SOMETHING TO ME AT THE MEETING AND REALLY HAD A 9 10 CONCERN ABOUT DISADVANTAGED RIDERS, OR UNDERPRIVILEGED AREAS THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE REGION. SO SHE ALWAYS WANTED TO DO THE 11 RIGHT THING FOR THE REGION. AND GOT BLESS HER FOR ALL THE WORK 12 SHE D BUT SHE WAS ONE OF THOSE SILENT LEADERS AT MTC THAT 13 REALLY BROUGHT A LOT OF GOOD ISSUES AND LEADERSHIP TO THE 14 COMMISSION. SO I JUST WANT TO SAY HOW MUCH SHE IS GOING TO BE 15 16 MISSED. JUST A GREAT INDIVIDUAL. THANK YOU MR. CHAIRMAN.

21 AMY R. WORTH: THANK YOU, MR. CHAIR. COMMISSIONER SPERING SAID 22 IT SO WELL. AND FOR THOSE OF YOU WHO WANT TO HAVE A CHANCE, 23 SAM WHITING'S PIECE ON ANNE WAS IN THE CHRONICLE LAST WEEK. IT 24 WAS A BEAUTIFUL ENCAPSULATION OF ALL THE AREAS THAT SHE 25 TOUCHED. AND SHE DID CARE SO DEEPLY ABOUT THE REGION. AND I

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LOVED SERVING WITH HER AND GOT TO KNOW HER WELL THROUGH OUR 1 MUTUAL FRIENDSHIP WITH ELLEN TAUSCHER, AND ONE OF THE THINGS 2 3 ABOUT ANNE, A COUPLE OF, JUST MEMORIES COME TO MIND, ONE, SHE CARED DEEPLY ABOUT THE REGION AS COMMISSIONER SPERING SAID. 4 5 SECOND OF ALL, SHE CARED DEEPLY ABOUT ENCOURAGING AND SUPPORTING WOMEN MOVING INTO ELECTED OFFICE IN THE VERY EARLY 6 DAYS. YOU KNOW, WHEN THERE WEREN'T A LOT OF WOMEN SERVING IN 7 8 REGIONAL, STATE, FEDERAL POSITIONS. SHE WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN SUPPORTING SENATOR FEINSTEIN AND SUPPORTING CONGRESSWOMAN 9 TAUSCHER JUST TO NAME A COUPLE OF THE MANY. SHE CARED VERY 10 MUCH ABOUT MTC AND ABAG I AM MINDFUL OF ONE TIME WHEN SHE GAVE 11 ME A CALL AND WE MET TYPICALLY IN ANNE HALSTED FASHION, 12 SITTING IN THE LOBBY TALKING ABOUT THE MTC STAFF MERGER SHE 13 LOOKED AT ME WITH THESE PIERCING EYES AND SAID AMY, IS THIS 14 15 GOING TO BE OKAY? AND I SAID ABSOLUTELY. I THINK THIS IS A 16 GREAT THING FOR OUR ORGANIZATION. WE TALKED ABOUT ALL THE ISSUES AROUND THE MERGER AND SHE REALLY CARED SO MUCH ABOUT 17 THAT PROCESS. AND REALLY WANTED TO MAKE SURE THAT BOTH 18 ORGANIZATIONS WERE SERVED AND HER EXPECTATIONS AND HER HOPES, 19 OF COURSE, HAVE BEEN FULFILLED BY DOING THAT. BUT THAT, BY, IN 20 21 THE MERGER AND IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STAFF MERGER. BUT 22 I THINK THAT THAT MOMENT REALLY REFLECTED HER DEEP, DEEP PERSONAL COMMITMENT TO REGIONALISM AND TO HAVING THE 23 ORGANIZATIONS THAT WORK. SO BEAUTIFULLY AND OF COURSE HER 24 REGIONALISM TOUCHED BEYOND MTC AND ABAG HER BCDC WORK. I WILL 25

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MISS HER TERRIBLY. SHE WAS LIKE A GENTLE GIANT WHO USED HER
RESOURCES TO BE ABLE TO MOVE FORWARD SUCH IMPORTANT ISSUES IN
OUR REGION. SO, I, TOO, WILL MISS HER TREMENDOUSLY. WE TALKED
ABOUT HER AT BARC THE OTHER DAY, TOO, AND ALSO NOTED THAT SPUR
AND BCDC KEPT SOME WONDERFUL CLIPS THAT THEY DEVELOPED ON HER
LIFE THAT YOU ALL WOULD ENJOY SEEING TOO. SO THANK YOU MR.
CHAIR.

AND THAT ARE GOING TO KIND OF -- ARE GOING TO BE 23 HER LEGACY FOR THE GENERATIONS TO COME. SO SAD THAT SHE'S NOT 24 25 WITH US.

REALLY APPRECIATE EVERYONE REFLECTING ON 18 ANNE. I LOVED ANNE'S PASSION FOR PUBLIC SERVICE. SHE CARED SO 19 MUCH ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENT, ABOUT ALL THE THINGS. GOOD 20 21 GOVERNMENT, ALL THE THINGS THAT WE'RE WORKING HARD ON. IT WAS 22 AN UNDERSTATED PASSION SHE NEVER WANTED TO BE THE MOST VOCAL PERSON IN THE GROUP AND SHE RESTRAINED AT TIME BUT WHEN SHE 23 DID SPEAK YOU COULD HEAR IT AND PERHAPS YOU HEARD IT LOUDER 24 BECAUSE SHE WAS SO JUDICIOUS IN HER USE AND WEIGHING IN.  WAS DOING AND HAD TO REALLY PULL IT OUT OF HER SHE SHOWED SO
 MUCH GRIT AND COURAGE I ADMIRE GREATLY.

EDDIE AHN: THANKS. AS ANNE'S REPLACEMENT FOR BCDC, I WANT TO 11 RECOGNIZE I AGREE WITH ALL COMMISSIONER COMMENTS ABOUT HER 12 COMMITMENT TO REGIONAL GOVERNANCE PUBLIC POLICY COMMUNITY 13 SERVICE. THE THING I WANT TO FOCUS ON IS HOW MUCH SHE 14 15 UNDERSTOOD THE VALUE OF REACHING OUT TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES 16 OTHER THAN HER OWN. EVERYBODY KNOWS OF HER DEEP COMMITMENT TO TELEGRAPH HILL AND SAN FRANCISCO WATERFRONT BUT THE WAY SHE 17 THOUGHT OF ME SUCCEEDING HER WAS ABOUT ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE 18 AT THEN OF THE DAY AND ENVIRONMENTAL REPRESENTATION THOUGHT OF 19 IN THOSE TERMS IT SEIZE PROPHETIC NOW GIVEN THE WAY OF ANTI-20 ASIAN VIOLENCE THAT'S ROCKING THE COUNTRY AND COMING TO 21 22 REPRESENTATION. IT'S A FUNDAMENTAL PART OF WHO SHE IS. SHE REALLY BELIEVED IN WORKING ACROSS DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES AND I 23 THINK, I'M VERY GRATEFUL TO HER FOR HER CONTINUING TO TEACH ME 24 THAT LESSON IN MY CAREER. THANK YOU. 25

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ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER AHN. 2 3 COMMISSIONER RONEN? 4 5 DIR. HILLARY RONEN: THANK YOU SO MUCH. I JUST WANT TO SAY HOW MOVED I WAS BY ANNE AND BY HER SPIRIT AND GETTING TO KNOW HER. 6 EVEN MORE LISTENING TO THE IMPACT SHE HAD ON ALL OF YOU, WHICH 7 8 WAS VERY SIMILAR TO THE IMPACT THAT SHE HAD ON ME. I WANT TO SHARE THAT WE CLOSED -- OR, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING 9 AND OUR TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MEETING IN THE MEMORY OF 10 ANNE, AND SO MANY OF MY COLLEAGUES ON THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS 11 FELT ABOUT HER, LIKE WE FEEL ABOUT HER AND SHE JUST SEEMS TO 12 HAVE THAT IMPACT ON ANYONE SHE MET IN ANY CONTEXT. SO I JUST, 13 AGAIN, WANT TO WISH HER FAMILY MUCH LOVE AND CONDOLENCES AND 14 15 THANK HER FOR HAVING THE IMPACT SHE HAD ON SO MANY OF US. 16 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER RONEN. I 17 BELIEVE BOARD CHAIR HAGGERTY IS ON, KIMBERLY? 18 19 CLERK OF THE BOARD: HE IS ON, BUT I BELIEVE HIS AUDIO IS STILL 20 21 TRYING TO CONNECT. 22 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: LET'S GO TO COMMISSIONER PAPAN AND 23 WE'LL JUMP BACK OVER TO CHAIR HAGGERTY. 24 25

JULIE PIERCE: WONDERFUL. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THERE WAS NO 3 UNMUTE. SORRY THIS WEBINAR THING IS A DIFFERENT DEAL. YOU 4 5 KNOW, I JUST FELT COMPELLED TO LOG IN TODAY, BECAUSE ANNE WAS THE EPITOME OF A DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVANT, AND A CONS MAT 6 VOLUNTEER. READING HER OBIT THE OTHER DAY I REALIZED I HAD 7 8 WORKED WITH AN FOR MANY YEARS. I DON'T KNOW HOW ONE WOMAN COULD POSSIBLY DO EVERYTHING THAT AN DID AND DO IT ALL SO 9 INCREDIBLY WELL. SHE OFFERED A VERY WARM WELCOME TO ALL OF THE 10 NEW MEMBERS AS THEY JOINED THE BAY AREA REGIONAL SPHERE. IT 11 WAS AN INCREDIBLE HONOR TO SERVE WITH HER, AS YOU ALL KNOW. 12 ANNE'S INFLUENCE WILL BE MISSED BY THE BAY AREA FAR BEYOND 13 THOSE OF US WHO HAVE HAD THE HONOR TO KNOW HER PERSONALLY. HAVING A SET SCHEDULE 15 16 ALLOWS VOLUNTEERS AND STAFF TO PLAN APPROPRIATELY. STARTING THIS MONTH WITH THE SUBCOMMITTEES, THE EQUITY AND ACCESS 17 SUBCOMMITTEE MET MARCH 1ST. THE PRIMARY COMPONENT OF THE 18 MEETING WAS THE EOUITY ANALYSIS FOR PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 AND 19 THE ONGOING DISCUSSION IS HOW OR WHETHER WE SHOULD CHANGE THE 20 METRICS WE CURRENTLY USE AS -- SUCH AS HIGH NUMBERS OF LOW 21 INCOME COMMUNITIES OF COLOR, SENIORS, ET CETERA, TO CREATE 22 GOALS IN SITE SPECIFIC CENSUS TRACKS. 50% OF OUR POPULATION 23 WHO MEET THESE METRICS ARE SCATTERED THROUGHOUT THE REGION AND 24 NOT IN SPECIFIC CENSUS TRACTS. THE DISCUSSION NOW IS DO WE 25

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CHANGE METRICS? IF SO HOW? IF SO HOW DO WE SET THE BENCHMARKS? 1 THE FARE INTEGRATION SUBCOMMITTEE MET MARCH 12TH TO DISCUSS 2 3 THE BUSINESS CASE STUDY FOR THE PROJECT CONSIDERING FARES OPTIONS BASED AND DEVELOPMENT OF ALTERNATIVES THE COMMITTEE 4 5 WILL NEED TO ADD EXTRA MEETINGS TO ALLOW THEM TO FEED INTO THE FARE INTEGRATION TASK FORCE WHICH WILL FEED INTO THE BLUE 6 RIBBON TASK FORCE. THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL MET MARCH 10TH 7 8 TO REVIEW SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS WE HAD LENGTHY DISCUSSION ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. BECAUSE I ATTEND 9 ALL THESE MEETINGS THERE WERE THREE LINES IN THE DISCUSSION 10 THAT BOILED DOWN TO WHO IS GOING TO HAND THEM PROBLEM. AND 11 THAT CAME TO IN SEVERAL AREAS FOR INSTANCE THE IMPLEMENTATION 12 PHASE OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 CALLS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT 13 PRESERVATION AND REHABILITATION OF PARKLAND. DURING THE 14 PANDEMIC WE HAVE SEEN THE ACCESS TO OPEN SPACES A NECESSITY 15 16 BUT ACCESS AS A LOCAL JURISDICTIONAL PROBLEM AND THERE IS NO EOUITY MEASUREMENT WE HAVE ENTITIES THAT OWN REGIONAL HOUSING 17 AND TRANSPORTATION GOALS THERE IS NO PETITION FOR OPEN SPACE 18 PARKS OR MAINTENANCE WHO WILL HELP REGIONAL GOALS THAT HELP 19 FEED LOCAL GOALS BUT ALSO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE FUNDING 20 21 SYSTEM THIS IMPACTS OUR ABILITY TO DEVELOP MULTI-22 JURISDICTIONAL TRAIL SYSTEMS ANOTHER EXAMPLE TO TIE IN BETWEEN 23 TRANSIT AND OUR LOW INCOME RESIDENTS WHO ARE NOT WORKING 9 TO 5 JOBS. AS AN EXAMPLE, OUR REGION DEPENDING ON LOW WAGE 24 HOSPITALITY WORKER WHO CANNOT AFFORD TO LIVE NEAR THEIR JOBS 25

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WHETHER AT WINERIES CONVENTION CENTERS HOTELS ARE GREAT AT 1 PICKING UP PAYING GUESTS AT AIRPORTS [INDISCERNIBLE] EACH 2 3 TRANSIT AGENCY IN EACH JURISDICTION DOES THEIR PART LOCALLY BUT THE COORDINATION OF HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION BETWEEN 4 5 JURISDICTIONS WILL BE AN EVER GROWING PROBLEM. NEXT MONTH ALONG WITH EVERYTHING ELSE WE WILL BE REVIEWING THE 6 LEGISLATIVE ISSUES ON YOUR AGENDA TODAY TIMING DID NOT ALLOW 7 8 FOR US TO PREVIEW OR COMMENT IN ADVANCE. ON YOUR AGENDA TODAY IS CONFIRMATION OF AN APPOINTMENT TO OUR BODY WHILE THIS 9 10 LEAVES US STILL SHORT REPRESENTATIVES FROM SAN FRANCISCO AND SAN MATEO, I WANT TO THANK THE COMMISSION FOR CONTINUING TO 11 SUNDAY DEDICATED INFORMED PEOPLE AND KEEPING OUR BOARD FULL 12 WAS REALLY SMART, FOLKS. AND THAT ENDS MY REPORT. 13

REPORT. SEEING NO QUESTIONS FROM COMMISSIONERS. RANDI, THANK
YOU VERY MUCH. WE'RE GOING TO MOVE ON TO AGENDA ITEM FOUR
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORTS TURNING IT OVER TO THERESE
MCMILLAN.

21 THERESE MCMILLAN: THANK YOU CHAIR PEDROZA JUST LET ME START 22 WITH THE WORDS THAT ARE ALWAYS INADEQUATE. ANNE HALSTED WAS MY 23 FRIEND ONE OF MY STRONGEST CHAMPIONS AND HER SUPPORT WAS UN-85 24 CAL. AND WE'RE MOVING FORWARD FROM GRIEF TO EVERLASTING 25 GRATITUDE THAT SHE DID FOR US. AND I WILL FOCUS ON THE LAST

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FORM OF MY REPORT APOLOGIES IT WAS GIVEN TO YOU LATE LAST 1 NIGHT OR TODAY. I URGE YOU TO TAKE THE TIME TO TAKE A LOOK AT 2 3 IT. IN PARTICULAR, BECAUSE WHAT I HAVE INCLUDED IS MY PERSPECTIVE ON THE TOP FIVE FOCUS AREAS FOR 2021. AND THE 4 5 REASON I DID THAT WAS THE INCOMING NEW COMMISSION LEADERSHIP AND THE COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS THAT I'M REALLY EAGER TO WORK 6 WITH ALL OF YOU IN THE SEATS OF INFLUENCE AND ADVICE THAT YOU 7 8 WILL BE GIVING US, YOU KNOW, ALSO PROVIDED ME AN OPPORTUNITY AS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO LOOK BACK OVER WHAT CAN ONLY BE 9 DESCRIBED AS AN EXTRAORDINARY YEAR. AND LOOK FORWARD WITH AN 10 EYE NOT ONLY TO MANAGING THIS SWEEPING, AND I HAVE TO SAY 11 DAUNTING PORTFOLIO OF THIS AGENCY, BUT AMONG EVERYTHING THAT 12 WE'RE DOING, TO TRY TO SPOTLIGHT A FEW KEY AREAS, FROM MY 13 PERSPECTIVE, RISE TO THE TOP OF OUR LEADERSHIP AGENDA. AND IN 14 15 PARTICULAR, THIS LIST, AND IN ATTACHMENT TO YOUR REPORT, 16 REFLECTS MY CHARGE TO LEAD A COMBINED STAFF SERVING BOTH MTC 17 AND ABAG, AND THE COMMITMENT OF CHAIR PEDROZA AND PRESIDENT JESSE ARREOUIN TO GOVERN TO THE BENEFIT OF OUR SHARED 18 CONSTITUENTS WHICH IS EVERYONE WHO LIVES IN THE SAN FRANCISCO 19 BAY AREA. VERY TOP LINE, JUST TO GIVE YOU A SENSE OF THE FIVE 20 AREAS. THE FIRST IS, YOU KNOW, LEADING THE BAY AREA THROUGH 21 THE TRANSPORTATION PANDEMIC RECOVERY. IT'S NOT DONE YET. AND 22 IT IS GOING TO BE SHAPING WHAT WE HAVE GOING FORWARD. THERE IS 23 CRITICAL THINGS THAT WE HAVE ALREADY ADVANCED IN TERMS OF 24 REBUILDING -- OR FISCAL STABILIZATION CLEARLY WHICH IS A 25

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NECESSITY PARTICULARLY FOR OUR TRANSIT OPERATORS, BUT ALSO THE 1 2 WORK COMMISSIONER AMY WORTH HAS BEEN LEADING WITH THAT AND SHE 3 GAVE YOU A SENSE OF THAT TODAY. BUT THAT WOULD BE FOLLOWED BY SYSTEM REBUILDING, AND THAT'S A HUGE OPPORTUNITY. I MEAN, 4 5 COVID IS A TRAGEDY ON MANY LEVELS BUT IT HAS PRESENTED THIS SILVER LINING OF THE ABILITY TO MOBILIZE AND TAKE ADVANTAGE OF 6 CHANGE. THE WORK THAT COMMISSIONER SPERING HAS BEEN LEADING AT 7 8 THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE IS CLEARLY ONE OF THOSE A LOT OF WORK IN THAT REGARD. BUT ALSO READYING OURSELVES FOR ADVOCACY 9 AND TAKING ADVANTAGE OF STIMULUS FUNDING THAT WE BELIEVE WILL 10 BE COMING FROM THE NEW BIDEN HARRIS ADMINISTRATION FOR BOTH 11 HIGHWAY AND CAPITAL TRANSIT PROJECTS. OUR EXPRESS LANE I 12 BELIEVE IS ANOTHER AREA WHERE THE DEVELOPMENT COORDINATION 13 14 EPITOMIZED BY THE STRATEGIC PLAN THAT WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON 15 THAT WE'RE NOW GOING TO HAVE TO PUT ON THE GROUND AS ANOTHER 16 EXAMPLE OF ADVANCING A NEW WAY OF DOING THINGS. AND THEN FINALLY I THINK WE NEED TO KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR WHEN WE RESET 17 FOR A NEW GENERATION OF REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION REVENUE 18 MEASURES. THE ECONOMY WILL COME BACK AT SOME POINT. AND WE 19 NEED TO BE THINKING AHEAD AS TO HOW THAT MIGHT FIT INTO OUR 20 21 WORK. THE SECOND AREA THAT COMMISSIONER LIBBY SCHAAF POINTED 22 OUT CONTINUING TO TACKLE THE HOUSING CHALLENGE. THIS IS EVERYTHING FROM URGENT SUPPORT AT THE STATE AND FEDERAL LEVEL 23 ON MANY LEVELS. ROOTING OUR REGIONAL HOUSING PORTFOLIO. THIS 24 25 IS CRITICAL WORK THAT WE HAVE BEEN -- THAT ABAG HAS BEEN

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LEADING, BUT AS WE POINTED OUT, THE NEW BAHFA OVERSIGHT 1 COMMITTEE WILL BE HELPING TO ADVANCE THAT. THIS INCLUDES A 2 3 REQUEST TO HAVE \$18.5 MILLION COME PERHAPS FROM THE STATE BUDGET TO HELPING US TO GET LAUNCHING THE REGIONAL HOUSING 4 5 PORTFOLIO OFF THE GROUND. ALSO INCLUDED THIS IS IMPORTANT TO PRESIDENT JESSE ARREQUIN, IS WHAT CAN WE DO IN THE REGION OF 6 HOMELESSNESS WHICH IS AFFECTING EVERY SINGLE COUNTY IN THIS 7 8 REGION. AND IT'S SOMETHING THAT WE NEED TO THINK THROUGH IN TERMS OF PARTNERING EFFORTS THERE. ON THE THIRD AREA, WRAPPING 9 UP PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. I WILL SIMPLY SAY THAT THAT PLAN HAS 10 PROVED TIME AND AGAIN TO BE A GUIDING LIGHT TO WHERE WE HAVE 11 TO GO IN, ON EVERY SINGLE LEVEL OF TRANSPORTATION, HOUSING, 12 ENVIRONMENT, AND THE ECONOMY. THE WORK WE'RE DOING WITH THE 13 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN WILL BE A FOCAL POINT FOR OUR 2021, AND 14 WE'LL PROVE THAT THIS WILL NOT BE JUST SOMETHING THAT SITS ON 15 A SHELF, BUT MOTIVATES REAL CHANGE. THE FOURTH AREA IS -- AND 16 WE HAVE BEEN HEARING ABOUT THIS, IS DRILLING DOWN ON PROJECT 17 DELIVERY, AND PARTICULARLY, THE BIG PROJECTS. THE THREE BIG 18 ONES AT THE REGIONAL LEVEL, CLIPPER TWO, ALL ELECTRIC TOLLING, 19 AND THE PREPARATION FOR OPEN ROAD TOLLING. AND BRIDGE 20 21 REHABILITATION. WE HAVE GOT TO FOCUS ON DELIVERING EFFECTIVELY AND EFFICIENTLY ON ALL OF THOSE AREAS. BECAUSE OUR 22 INFRASTRUCTURE IS REALLY THE SKELETON UPON WHICH MOBILITY IS 23 BUILT. BUT IN ADDITION THAT, WE HAVE KEY PARTNERSHIPS WITH 24 LOCALLY SPONSORED PROJECTS AND THIS IS WHERE, YOU KNOW, 25

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CONTINUED WORK WITH CALTRANS, WITH OUR COUNTY TRANSPORTATION 1 AUTHORITIES AND THE LIKE, WILL BE REALLY ESSENTIAL. AND I'M 2 3 COMMITTED TO WORKING CLOSELY WITH MY PEER COLLEAGUES IN THIS AREA. THE DOWNTOWN EXTENSION IN SAN FRANCISCO, DIRIDON 4 5 STATION, CALTRAIN ELECTRIFICATION, HIGHWAY 37, ARE EXAMPLES ARE WHERE CONTINUED FOCUS WORK ON DELIVERING FOR THE PUBLIC 6 FOR THESE MEGA PROJECT IS ESSENTIAL. I'LL END WITH THE FIFTH 7 8 AREA AND THIS IS A NEW JOINT MTC/ABAG PROPOSED INITIATIVE. WHICH WOULD BE REGIONAL GOVERNMENTAL PARTNERSHIP FOR LOCAL 9 ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND REBOUND. IN ADDITION THE AREAS THAT I 10 HAVE HIGHLIGHTED ABOVE, THE COVID IMPACTS ON THE HEALTH AND 11 RESILIENCE OF THE BAY AREA ECONOMY WILL DIRECTLY IMPACT THE 12 SECTORAL HEALTH OF TRANSPORTATION AND HOUSING. THEY ARE 13 INEXTRICABLY LINKED AND WHAT VALUABLE ROLE MIGHT MTC PLAY IN 14 15 THIS SPACE? THERE IS CLEARLY AN AREA WHERE WE HAVE ALWAYS LED 16 WHICH IS DEPLOYING OUR EXISTING TRANSPORTATION LAND USE AND HOUSING AUTHORITIES TO ASSIST IN AN AREA OF OUR STRENGTH, 17 WHICH IS INFRASTRUCTURE DELIVERY, AS LOCAL STIMULUS, BOTH IN 18 TRADITIONAL WAYS BUT ALSO IN EMERGING WAYS. THERE IS A LOT OF 19 CONVERSATION ABOUT BROADBAND AND HOW THAT MIGHT COME TO THE 20 21 FORE. BUT BEYOND THAT, IS THERE SOMETHING MORE THAT WE CAN DO? AND I HAVE SPOKEN WITH CHAIR PEDROZA AND VICE PRESIDENT 22 ARREGUIN AND IN FACT THEIR IDEA OF A LISTENING TOUR OF SORTS 23 OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND OUR PRIVATE SECTOR PARTNERS TO GET A 24 BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE DEPTH AND NATURE OF ECONOMIC 25

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CHALLENGES AND POSSIBLY WHAT THE REGION MIGHT BRING FORWARD TO 1 HELP ADVANCE SOME RESPONSES TO GET BACK ON TRACK. AND I WOULD 2 3 END THAT THERE IS A CLEAR AND STEADY EYE ON THE EQUITY CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES IN THIS SPACE, IN PARTICULAR, 4 5 THAT WE NOT FORGET THAT THE ECONOMIC HARDSHIPS LAND MOST HEAVILY ON OUR MOST VULNERABLE COMMUNITIES AND AT EVERY TURN 6 WE NEED TO CONTINUE TO REMIND OURSELVES OF HOW THAT ECONOMIC 7 8 RECOVERY WILL NOT LEAVE THEM BEHIND. SO WITH THAT, HOPE THAT INSPIRES YOU TO THINK OF SOME, YOU KNOW, WORK WE'LL DO 9 TOGETHER IN THIS SPACE. IT DOESN'T MEAN THAT THE REST OF THE 10 OUR PORTFOLIO ISN'T EQUALLY IMPORTANT. BUT THESE ARE THE TOP 11 FIVE, IN MY VIEW, THAT'S GOING TO BE DRIVING A LOT OF OUR WORK 12 IN THE ENSUING MONTHS. SO THANK YOU FOR ALLOWING ME THE TIME 13 TO SHARE THAT. AND WE WILL BE BRINGING FORWARD REPORTS ON A 14 15 REGULAR BASIS TO YOU. THANKS.

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REGIONAL GOVERNMENTAL PARTNERSHIP FOR LOCAL ECONOMIC REBOUND. 1 I KNOW THAT -- I SUSPECT LIBBY I KNOW HAS HAD THESE 2 3 CONVERSATIONS WITH THE SAN FRANCISCO FOUNDATION AND SILICON VALLEY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION. I KNOW THERE ARE OTHERS INVOLVED 4 5 IN TRYING TO CONVENE, SEVERAL MAYORS TO BE TALKING ABOUT WITH THE VARIOUS REBOUND ECONOMIC RECOVERY PLANS THAT WE HAVE PUT 6 TOGETHER IN OUR OWN SUBREGIONS, AND IDENTIFYING WHAT'S COMMON 7 8 AMONG THEM AND SEEING HOW WE CAN ALL PUSH TOGETHER. AND I WOULD ENCOURAGE MAYBE SOME CONVERSATION FROM THE SAN FRANCISCO 9 10 FOUNDATION, I SUSPECT, WILL BE A FRUITFUL SYNERGY. ANYWAY. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 11

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ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER LICCARDO. ANY
OTHER COMMISSIONER WISHING TO COMMENT ON THIS ITEM? VICE CHAIR

WHICH MAYBE 20 21 DESERVES A CALL OUT, AS PART OF THE MEGA PROJECTS THAT ARE MAYBE STRUGGLING, THAT WOULD HAVE A BIG IMPACT ON OUR REGION. 22 AND THEN, YOU KNOW, ITEM 3B TALKS ABOUT AN SB 375 REFORM 23 EFFORT. I'M NOT SURE WHAT THAT IS. AND THAT SEEMS LIKE 24

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SOMETHING WHICH, IF WE ARE GOING TO BE TRYING TO LEAD, IS,
 WOULD BE VERY CONSEQUENTIAL. HAVE I MISSED THAT? LIKE, WHAT'S?
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THERESE MCMILLAN: THAT IS INCLUDED IN OUR LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM 4 5 FOR 2021. AND WHAT, YOU KNOW, THE REASON IT SURRENDER PLANNED 6 BAY AREA 2050 IS THAT, AS YOU ALL RECALL, GETTING TO OUR GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION TARGET WAS A HUGE LIFT. AND IT SIMPLY 7 8 UNDERSCORED THAT THE SYNERGIES BETWEEN AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND WHERE WE PUT IT, CONGESTED IN HOW WE DO IT, HOW WE MANAGE OUR 9 TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM AND HOW ALL THAT IS DRIVEN BY ECONOMIC 10 FORCES OUT OF OUR CONTROL, REALLY, YOU KNOW, HAS JUST SHOWN A 11 SPOTLIGHT ON THE FACT THAT IF WE DON'T HAVE THOSE POLICIES 12 INTEGRATED AND INCLUDING AT THE STATE LEVEL, IT'S REALLY HARD. 13 AND SO THAT WAS REALLY THE BASIS, AND AGAIN, AS -- YOU KNOW, 14 15 WE CAN REFRESH ON THE WORK WE PUT FORWARD, IN OUR LEGISLATIVE 16 PROGRAMS, SIMPLY TO SAY THAT WE WANT TO WORK WITH OUR STATE 17 PARTNER, NOT TO SAY THAT GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION ISN'T 18 IMPORTANT, OF COURSE IT IS. BUT THAT HOW WE GET THERE, PROBABLY NEEDS A REFRESH TEN YEARS AFTER SB 375 WAS PASSED. 19 AND I WOULD SAY THAT EVERY OTHER REGION IN THE STATE, MY 20 COLLEAGUES AT SACOG, AND SANDAG, AND SCAG AND THE LIKE ALL 21 NEED TO TAKE A FRESH LOOK HOW TO BE BETTER PARTNERS BOTH AT 22 THE STATE LEVEL AS WELL AS IN OUR RESPECTIVE REGIONS. 23

NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I HAVE NO PROBLEM WITH SORT OF REFORM, 1 2 BUT I THINK, YOU KNOW, MY READING OF IT AND MAYBE I'M WRONG, 3 WAS THAT WE WERE GOING TO HAVE A -- THAT WHAT WAS -- THAT --ANYWAY, I'LL FOLLOW UP WITH YOU SEPARATELY ABOUT THIS. BUT I 4 5 WOULD BE REALLY CONCERNED IF THIS COMMISSION WAS LEADING THE CHARGE TO REDUCE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS TARGETS OR TO TRY 6 AND KIND OF LIKE, YOU KNOW, SORT OF, DO ANYTHING THAT WOULD 7 8 UNDERMINE THE STATE AN ABLE TO KIND OF MEET OUR COLLECTIVE GREENHOUSE REDUCTION GOALS. 9

AND 22 IN ORDER TO BE SUCCESSFUL IN TERMS OF IMPLEMENTING THESE PRINCIPLES, AS THEY MOVE FORWARD IN THE FRAMEWORK OF 23 LEGISLATION AS WELL AS POLICIES, THAT THIS REALLY DOES -- AND 24 I REFLECT THAT BROAD REGIONAL SUPPORT OF WORKING TOGETHER. IT 25

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OFFERS SOME VERY EXCITING INITIATIVES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR US 1 TO INCREASE THE ACCESS AND THE FUNCTIONALITY OF RIDES AND OUR 2 3 TRANSIT SERVICES TO OUR TRANSIT RIDERS ACROSS THE REGION, WHETHER THEY'RE SCHOOL TRIPS OR GRANDMOTHER IS GOING TO THE 4 5 GROCERY STORE, OR EMPLOYEES TRAVELING THE LONG DISTANCES ON THE EXPRESS BUSES. AND I THINK, YOU KNOW, WE'RE ALREADY 6 HEARING ABOUT INITIATIVES WHEN THE STATE SECRETARY KIM TALKED 7 8 ABOUT THE INITIATIVES LAST WEEK. HE REALLY HIGHLIGHTED A NUMBER OF THE THINGS THAT ARE COMPLETELY TIED IN THAT THE 9 STATE IS DOING THAT ARE TIED IN WITH THESE INITIATIVES SO 10 AGAIN, I REALLY WANT TO THANK STAFF FOR BRINGING THESE 11 PRINCIPLES BEFORE US, AND AS YOU CAN SEE FROM THE OTHER LEG 12 BILLS THAT ARE ON -- THAT ARE MOVING FORWARD, THESE ARE VERY 13 CONSISTENT AND ENABLE US TO, WITH THOSE BILLS, ENABLE US TO BE 14 EFFECTIVE ADVOCATES NOT ONLY WITH CURRENT LEGISLATION BUT 15 16 LOOKING TO THE FUTURE IDENTIFYING WHAT KINDS OF LEGISLATIVE TOOLS WE NEED TO WORK TOGETHER. SO THANK YOU. 17

BASICALLY 14 15 WHAT I'M GOING TO DO IS A SEGUE OF THE COMMENT I MADE EARLIER 16 ON THE KIND OF QUALITY OF DELIVERABLES THAT MTC STAFF ARE PRODUCING. AND WHAT I'M RECOMMENDING HERE IS THAT WE HIRE A 17 CONSULTANT WHO IS GOING TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS PARTICULAR 18 AREA AND WILL REACH OUT TO INTERNATIONAL COMPANIES, I'M 19 TALKING ABOUT OUTSIDE THE U.S.WHO ARE FAMILY WITH NOT JUST 20 21 DELIVERING MEGA PROJECTS, BUT HOW THEY WENT TO THE PROJECT INITIATION AND DESIGN. I THINK AT THE END OF THE DAY THIS IS 22 HOW WE'RE GOING TO ADDRESS VICE CHAIR JOSEFOWITZ'S CONCERNS 23 ABOUT THESE PROJECTS OUT OF OUR CONTROL. BECAUSE THESE PEOPLE 24 ARE GOING TO BE ABLE TO TELL US HOW IT WORKS IN EUROPE, IN 25

CERTAINLY 16 TO TRY TO TIE ALL THIS TOGETHER WILL BE HELPFUL TO ME BECAUSE TRANSIT CAN TAKE A WHILE WHEN YOU TRAVEL AND COMMUTE ON A 17 REGIONAL BASIS, USING MULTIPLE SYSTEMS.
