



GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS DIRECTORS REBECCA LONG DIRECTOR OF GOVERNMENT 17 RELATIONS. THIS ITEM IS IN RESPONSE TO THE WORK OF THE TRANSIT 18 RECOVERY TASK FORCE, THE BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK 19 FORCE THAT MTC HAS CONVENED AS WELL AS ASSEMBLY MEMBER CHU'S 20 ANTICIPATED LEGISLATION THAT'S GOING TO BE REINTRODUCED IN THE 21 22 NEXT FEW WEEKS. THIS IS BUILDING ON THE HEELS OF HIS BILL FROM LAST YEAR, A.B. 5027 AS WE'RE PARTICIPATING AS A MEMBER OF THE 23 BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE ON AN ENGAGEMENT 24

PROCESS WE FEEL IT'S IMPORTANT TO BE TRANCE PART AND GET OUT






- 1 EARLY WHAT OUR PRIORITIES ARE ON THIS LEGISLATION THERE ISN'T
- 2 GOING TO BE A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF TIME THROUGH THE HEARING
- 3 PROCESS THIS YEAR THE HEARING PROCESS IS CONSTRAINED WITH
- 4 COVID-19 WE WANT TO PUT OUT THERE PRIORITIES THAT HELP US IN
- 5 CONVERSATIONS WITH THE TRANSIT OPERATORS AND STAKEHOLDERS. I'M
- 6 GOING TO WALK THROUGH THE PROPOSED PRIORITIES WHICH WOULD COME
- 7 TO THE COMMISSION LATER THIS MONTH. AND THEN AGAIN THERE WILL
- 8 BE A BILL IN PRINT MOST LIKELY AT THE END OF THIS MONTH OR IN
- 9 APRIL THAT WE WOULD COME BACK TO YOU FOR FURTHER DISCUSSION
- 10 ON. SO LOOKING AT ATTACHMENT A, IN THE MEMO, THE FIRST
- 11 PRINCIPLE IS TO PROVIDE TANGIBLE NEAR-TERM BENEFITS TO RIDERS.
- 12 WE HAVE A -- WE'RE OPERATING IN A SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT
- 13 ENVIRONMENT RIGHT NOW, OBVIOUSLY, DUE TO COVID-19 AND WE WANT
- 14 TO BRING RIDERS BACK SAFELY AND AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE IN THE
- 15 RECOVERY. AND PART OF THAT IS GOING TO BE MAKING TRANSIT MORE
- 16 ATTRACTIVE, MORE CONVENIENT, AND MORE AFFORDABLE. AND SO THE
- 17 FIRST ITEM THERE THAT HAS BEEN TALKED ABOUT A LOT AND THAT
- 18 WE'RE DOING AN EXTENSIVE STUDY O THE INTEGRATED FARE STUDY
- 19 WOULD BE TO SEEK SOME PROVISIONS IN THE BILL THAT STEM FROM
- 20 THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THAT INTEGRATED FARE STUDY TO PROVIDE A
- 21 SIMPLIFIED TRANSIT FARES. AND AGAIN, THOSE WOULD BE DEVELOPED
- 22 BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMING OUT OF THE INTEGRATED FARE
- 23 STUDY BUT ONE THAT SEEMS TO BE RISING TO THE TOP IN POPULARITY
- 24 IS THIS IDEA OF A PASS WHERE YOU'RE PAYING THE STANDARD FARE
- 25 BUT IT CAN ONLY REACH A CERTAIN AMOUNT. SO IT'S A CAP, A FARE





- 1 CAP THAT WOULD APPLY ACROSS MULTIPLE OPERATORS OVER EITHER A
- 2 DAY, A WEEK, A MONTH. SO AGAIN THAT'S SOMETHING BEING LOOKED
- 3 AT BY THE FARE STUDY. AND WE WOULD WANT THE BILL TO HAVE SOME
- 4 IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINES ON THAT. SECONDLY, THE REGIONAL
- 5 TRANSIT MAPPING AND WAY FINDING STUDY THAT MTC HAS BEEN
- 6 CONDUCTING. AGAIN, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE OPERATORS, WE
- 7 THINK THIS HAS A TREMENDOUS PROMISE TO MAKE TRANSIT MORE
- 8 SEAMLESS IN THE REGION SO THAT WE DON'T HAVE DIFFERENT
- 9 TERMINOLOGY, DIFFERENT LOOK, DIFFERENT FEEL, DIFFERENT MAPS,
- 10 AND IT WILL JUST MAKE THE WHOLE SYSTEM EASIER TO USE ACROSS
- 11 MULTIPLE OPERATORS AND WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE BILL INCLUDE
- 12 SOME IMPLEMENTATION DIRECTION ON THAT. AND LASTLY REALTIME
- 13 TRANSIT INFORMATION. THE REGION IS SOMEWHAT SPOTTY IN THE
- 14 RELIABILITY, AND THE AVAILABILITY OF REALTIME TRANSIT
- 15 INFORMATION, AND WE THINK WE CAN DO BETTER THERE. AND THAT
- 16 WOULD BE HELPFUL TO HAVE LEGISLATION REQUIRING THAT EVERY
- 17 OPERATOR USE KIND OF OPEN-DATA STANDARDS, BEST PRACTICES SO WE
- 18 CAN MAKE SURE THAT RIDERS HAVE RELIABLE INFORMATION. SO THAT'S
- 19 THE FIRST RECOMMENDATION THERE. THE NEXT ONE IS ON INCREASING
- 20 THE PRIORS PRIORITY OF SERVICE COORDINATION AND WE INCLUDE
- 21 EXAMPLES OF IDEAS THIS ONE REALLY NEEDS TO BE VETTED MORE
- 22 THOROUGHLY AT THE BLUE RIBBON TO KNOW WHAT SHOULD GO INTO
- 23 LEGISLATION. WHAT WE'RE INTERESTED THIS IS FIGURING OUT A WAY
- 24 TO BUILD ON THE TREMENDOUS COLLABORATION AND COORDINATION
- 25 THAT'S HAPPENING NOW AMONG THE OPERATORS TO DO GREATER





- 1 COORDINATION. EXAMPLES OF CHANGES THAT HAVE HAPPENED DURING
- 2 COVID ARE, ALLOWING OPERATORS SUCH AS SAMTRANS, TO PICK UP
- 3 PASSENGERS IN SAN FRANCISCO WHICH HAD NOT BEEN ALLOWED
- 4 PREVIOUSLY. SO WE'RE NOT HAVING A FORCED TRANSFER JUST BECAUSE
- 5 OF ENTERING INTO ANOTHER JURISDICTION. LIKEWISE GOLDEN GATE
- 6 BRIDGE BUS SYSTEM IS ABLE TO PICK UP PASSENGERS NOW IN SAN
- 7 FRANCISCO SO THOSE ARE THE KIND OF THINGS WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE
- 8 MAINTAINED AND HAVE LEGISLATIVE DIRECTION TO DO SO. THE THIRD
- 9 ITEM IS SOMETHING THAT THE TRANSIT OPERATORS THEMSELVES HAVE
- 10 RAISED A LOT. AND THAT IS GIVING TRANSIT GREATER PRIORITY ON
- 11 LOCAL ROADS AND HIGHWAYS. YOU KNOW, THE VAST MAJORITY OF OUR
- 12 TRANSIT PRIORITIES ARE BUSES AND THEY CAN ONLY MOVE AS FAST AS
- 13 THE ROADWAYS SERVE AND TO PROVIDE A MORE ATTRACTIVE AND
- 14 COMPETITIVE OPTION AND ATTRACT MORE RIDERS BACK TO TRANSIT WE
- 15 DO NEED TO SEE ENHANCED ABILITY TO PRIORITIZE TRANSIT ON OUR
- 16 LOCAL ROADS AND HIGHWAYS. AND THEN THE FOURTH ITEM DEALS WITH
- 17 DECISION MAKING AND TRANSIT NETWORK MANAGEMENT. SO THE BLUE
- 18 RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE HAS TALK OUITE A BIT ABOUT
- 19 THE CONCEPT OF A TRANSIT NETWORK MANAGER. THERE HAS BEEN
- 20 CONVERSATIONS ABOUT CREATING POTENTIALLY A NEW ENTITY. AND I
- 21 THINK WHERE WE ARE AT, AT THIS TIME, IS THAT WE OPPOSE
- 22 ESTABLISHING A NEW AGENCY THAT WOULD SERVE AS A TRANSIT
- 23 NETWORK MANAGER. WE THINK THAT IN THIS TIME OF COVID, AND JUST
- 24 THE IMMENSE STRESS THAT OPERATORS ARE UNDER, AS WELL, IT MAKES
- 25 THE MOST SENSE TO BE ENHANCING THE COLLABORATION, AND THE





- 1 AUTHORITIES OF OUR EXISTING INSTITUTIONS, INCLUDING MTC. AND
- 2 THE LEGISLATURE HAS GIVEN US A VERY IMPORTANT ROLE BOTH IN
- 3 DISTRIBUTING FUNDING BUT ALSO IN COORDINATING TRANSIT
- 4 OPERATORS AND WE THINK THAT THIS SUBSEQUENT LEGISLATION
- 5 AUTHORED BY ASSEMBLY MEMBER CHU, WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE THAT IT
- 6 ENHANCES THAT ROLE IN CLOSE COORDINATION WITH THE AUTHORS SO
- 7 THAT ANY RECOMMENDATIONS, FOR EXAMPLE, RELATED TO SERVICE
- 8 COORDINATION, FARES, ARE COMING THROUGH A BODY THAT HAS THE
- 9 EXPERTISE OF THE TRANSIT OPERATORS AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS
- 10 MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS TO MTC. SO THAT'S THAT ITEM. AND THEN I
- 11 WOULD NOTE, IN 4D, WE HIGHLIGHT THAT WHILE TRANSIT
- 12 COORDINATION, AGAIN, ISN'T CORE MTC FUNCTION, OUR CURRENT
- 13 RESOURCES REALLY DON'T SUPPORT US TAKING A SUBSTANTIALLY
- 14 GREATER ROLE. AND WE'RE TAKING A LOS LOOK AT THAT RIGHT NOW.
- 15 YOU KNOW, WHAT WOULD IT TAKE, HOW MANY ADDITIONAL STAFF WOULD
- 16 WE NEED TO EFFECTIVELY SERVE IN THIS ROLE. AND SO TO -- THERE
- 17 IS ANOTHER NEED IN THE LEGISLATION TO THE EXTENT THAT WE ARE
- 18 BEING GIVEN GREATER AUTHORITY FOR ADDITIONAL RESOURCES. AND
- 19 THEN THE FIFTH ITEM HAS TO DO WITH TRANSIT HUBS, IMPROVING
- 20 ACCESS. THIS IS MORE PROSPECTIVE THINKING ABOUT NEW STATIONS.
- 21 NEW EXPANSION. WE NEED TO DO BETTER AS A REGION. THERE ARE A
- 22 MYRIAD OF EXAMPLES WHERE THE DESIGN OF STATIONS HAS NOT
- 23 PRIORITIZED THE RIDER. THEY'RE FORCED TO WALK EXCESSIVE
- 24 DISTANCES, YOU KNOW, HAD IT BEEN DESIGNED IN A MORE RIDER
- 25 FOCUSED WAY WE WANT TO SEE MORE DIRECTION BOTH TO THE



- 1 OPERATORS AND TO MTC WHEN WE'RE MAKING SIGNIFICANT ALLOCATIONS
- 2 OF FUNDING, REALLY PUT THE RIDERS FIRST, AND THE DESIGN OF
- 3 THOSE TRANSIT HUBS. LASTLY AVOID RUSHING COMPLEX ITEMS THAT
- 4 REQUIRE MORE EVALUATION. I THINK THIS IS KIND OF COMMON SENSE.
- 5 BUT THE TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE HAS BEEN LOOKING AT A LOT
- 6 OF IDEAS, OR AT LEAST, THERE IS INTEREST IN LOOKING AT SOME
- 7 REALLY BIG CONCEPTS SUCH AS MEGA PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION. HOW
- 8 DO WE REDUCE THE COST OVERRUNS AND MEGA PROJECTS. JOINT
- 9 PROCUREMENT. NEW MOBILITY. IS THERE A ROLE FOR A NETWORK
- 10 MANAGER IN RELATION TO ALL THE DIFFERENT PRIVATE MOBILITY
- 11 OPTIONS, ET CETERA. AND WE THINK SOME OF THESE IDEAS ARE
- 12 DEFINITELY WORTH MORE CONVERSATION BUT THEY SHOULDN'T BE
- 13 RUSHED. AND SO WE THINK THAT THE LIST THAT WE HAVE JUST WALKED
- 14 THROUGH IS PROBABLY AMBITIOUS ENOUGH FOR THIS YEAR. CERTAINLY
- 15 WE'RE OPEN TO WHERE THE CONVERSATION GOES WITH THE BLUE RIBBON
- 16 TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE, BUT TO THE EXTENT THAT THERE ARE
- 17 REALLY IMPORTANT ITEMS THAT PEOPLE WANT TO SEE HAPPEN, BUT WE
- 18 DON'T HAVE TIME, WE THINK THOSE SHOULD BE FLAGGED POTENTIALLY
- 19 IN THE BILL POTENTIALLY FOR FURTHER STUDY. THAT'S MY RUN
- 20 THROUGH OF THESE PROPOSED ADVOCACY PRINCIPLES WHICH WOULD THEN
- 21 GO TO THE COMMISSION FOR FINAL SUPPORT. AGAIN NOTE THIS IS A
- 22 WORK IN PROGRESS SO WE CAN ENGAGE THOUGHTFULLY WITH THE
- 23 LEGISLATURE AND ASSEMBLY MEMBER CHU ON THIS BILL AND
- 24 STAKEHOLDERS. THANK YOU.





- 1 JESSE ARREGUIN, ABAG: I WANT TO SAY I JUMPED THE GUN IN
- 2 ANNOUNCING COMMISSIONER LICCARDO'S IMPENDING APPOINTMENT TO
- 3 THIS COMMITTEE I AM SO EXCITED HE'S GOING TO BE SERVING IN
- 4 THIS CAPACITY. WE'LL BE DOING THAT IN MTC THIS MONTH AND SO I
- 5 WILL WITH HIM. COMMISSIONER LICCARDO.

- 7 SAM LICCARDO, VICE CHAIR: WE BE ASSEMBLING THE FORCES, AND I
- 8 KNOW THE VICE CHAIR SLOT IS SO COVETED. THANK YOU. I HAD A
- 9 QUESTION ABOUT THE SCHEDULE FOR THE SERVICE COORDINATION. AND
- 10 I AGREE WITH ALL OF THESE ELEMENTS. I THINK THEY'RE ALL REALLY
- 11 GOOD AND POSITIVE DEVELOPMENTS THAT WE COULD INTEGRATE INTO A
- 12 BILL AND APPRECIATE ASSEMBLY MEMBER CHU'S LEADERSHIP ON THIS.
- 13 BUT IT SEEMS TO ME THAT MOST AGENCIES REVISE THEIR SCHEDULES
- 14 EVERY -- TWICE A YEAR, TYPICALLY, AT LEAST THAT'S THE WAY IT
- 15 WORKS AT VTA, I'M TOLD, AND AT OTHER PLACES -- AND IT WOULD BE
- 16 SUPER HELPFUL IF WE ALL AGREED ON THE SAME TWO DATES IN WHICH
- 17 SCHEDULES AND ROUTES WOULD BE REVISED SO THAT EVERYBODY IS
- 18 MAKING THOSE CHANGES TOGETHER IN A MORE INTEGRATED WAY. IS
- 19 THAT SOMETHING YOU WOULD CONSIDER REBECCA?

- 21 **REBECCA LONG:** YEAH. ABSOLUTELY. AND I BELIEVE THE OPERATORS
- 22 HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT THIS, AGAIN, DURING COVID, WITH THEIR
- 23 VARIOUS NEW MEETINGS THAT HAVE A HAVE BEEN HAVING, AND I THINK
- 24 IT'S REFERRED TO AS SIGN-UPS, SO COORDINATING THE SIGN-UP IS
- 25 SOMETHING THAT, AGAIN, HAS BEEN TALKED ABOUT. I THINK WHETHER



IT MAKES SENSE TO PUT THAT IN LEGISLATION THAT IT SHALL BE 1 EVERY SIX MONTHS OR WHAT HAVE YOU, I THINK THAT NEEDS MORE 2 3 THOUGHT BUT THAT'S EXACTLY THE TYPE OF THING THAT WE WOULD LIKE TO SEE. 4 5 SAM LICCARDO, VICE CHAIR: OKAY. AND THEN IN TERMS OF OUR 6 7 CAPITAL PROGRAM AND OUR PROJECT, I KNOW THAT'S NOT THE FOCUS 8 HERE, BUT I'M SURE THAT THERE ARE SOME REALLY HIGH PRIORITY, A HALF DOZEN PLACES, AT LEAST, WHERE SOME SIGNIFICANT CAPITAL 9 INVESTMENT COULD MAKE A HUGE DIFFERENCE TO RIDERS IN GETTING 10 FROM ONE SYSTEM TO ANOTHER AND REALLY DRAMATICALLY IMPROVING 11 COORDINATION AND RIDERSHIP.
