- 15 PIERCE GOULD: THANK YOU. MY NAME IS PIERCE GOULD AND I'M WITH
- 16 MY COLLEAGUE, LYSA. WE LOST SPOKE WITH YOU IN JULY ABOUT OUR
- 17 PLANS FOR CUSTOMER RESEARCH AND OUR DRAFT CONCEPT WHICH IS ON
- 18 THE I-880 EXPRESS PLANES. TODAY WE WANTED TO SHARE WHAT WE
- 19 LEARNED FROM CUSTOMER RESEARCH AND HOW IT SHAPES THE PILOT.
- 20 THERE IS A MEMO IN YOUR PACKET, BUT I WANT TO POINT OUT IT IS
- 21 A LITTLE DATED. IT TURNS OUT WE DIDN'T PRESENT THIS ITEM TO
- 22 BAIFA ON SEPTEMBER 22ND AS WE THOUGHT WE WOULD FOR REASONS
- 23 THAT HAVE NOTHING TO DO WITH THE PILOT. THIS WAS ABOUT THERE
- 24 BEING TOO MUCH STUFF GOING ON IN THE COMMITTEES SO WE PUNTED
- 25 IT UNTIL OCTOBER 13TH. THAT WORKED OUT BETTER BECAUSE IT GIVES



- 1 US A CHANCE TO TALK TO YOU FIRST BEFORE WE GO TO BAIFA. SO, IT
- 2 WILL BE EASIER FOR US TO BRING ANY COMMENTS OR FEEDBACK YOU
- 3 HAVE TO BAIFA. AS WE SHARED, TRANSPORTATION IS THE THIRD
- 4 BIGGEST BUDGET ITEM FOR LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLDS IN THE BAY AREA.
- 5 WE FIGURE IF WE COULD MAKE IT MORE AFFORDABLE AND INCREASE
- 6 ACCESS TO MOBILITY OPTIONS, IT COULD REALLY HELP PEOPLE WHO
- 7 NEED IT HERE. ONE CHALLENGE IS COST IS A BARRIER FOR LOW
- 8 INCOME DRIVERS WHO WANT TO USE EXPRESS LANES. AND TRANSIT,
- 9 WHILE VERY IMPORTANT, MAY NOT ALWAYS BE A VIABLE ALTERNATIVE
- 10 TO DRIVING. AND SO, MTC IS EXPERIMENTING WITH HOW TO ADDRESS
- 11 INEQUITIES BY PILOTING A MEANS-BASED TOLL DISCOUNT WHICH WE
- 12 HOPE WILL EXPAND MOBILITY AND ACCESS TO PUNT FOR INCOME
- 13 OUALIFIED DRIVERS. THE MAP SHOWS THE AUTHORIZED NETWORK OF BAY
- 14 AREA EXPRESS LANES AND OUR PILOT WILL BE ON BAIFA'S 880
- 15 EXPRESS LANES WHICH ARE CIRCLED HERE IN PINK. WE ARE
- 16 LEVERAGING MANY OF THE TOOLS AND RULES AND CONTRACTORS AND
- 17 LESSONS LEARNED FROM CLIPPER START TO HELP US DELIVER THIS
- 18 PILOT OUICKER ON OUR 880 EXPRESS LANES. AND WE ARE APPLYING AN
- 19 EOUITY LENS TO HOW WE DESIGN AND DELIVER THE PILOT. THE GOAL
- 20 IS TO FOCUS ON THE CUSTOMER FOR PILOT DESIGN AND DELIVERY. AS
- 21 A RESULT, TODAY'S PRESENTATION FEATURES THE RESULTS OF
- 22 CUSTOMER RESEARCH COMPLETED IN AUGUST AND HOW IT AFFECTS OUR
- 23 PILOT CONCEPT. NOW I AM GOING TO TURN IT OVER TO LYSA TO TALK
- 24 ABOUT WHAT WE LEARNED AND I WILL COME BACK AND TALK WITH YOU
- 25 SOME MORE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE.

2	LYSA HALE: THANKS, PIERCE. GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYBODY. SO, WE
3	CONDUCTED A TOTAL OF NINE FOCUS GROUPS. THREE IN ENGLISH,
4	THREE IN SPANISH AND THREE IN CANTONESE. THERE WAS A MINIMUM
5	OF SEVEN PEOPLE IN EACH FOCUS GROUP AND A MAXIMUM OF TEN.
6	TODAY WHAT I AM GOING TO BE DOING AND WE ALSO HELD A
7	TELEPHONE TOWN HALL FOR PEOPLE WHO DIDN'T HAVE ACCESS TO
8	COMPUTERS TO BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN OUR ZOOM-BASED FOCUS
9	GROUPS. SO, TODAY I WILL BE PRESENTING TO YOU THE FINDINGS
10	FROM THE FOCUS GROUPS AND THE TOWN HALL. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE.
11	THIS SHOWS THE CENSUS TRACK WHERE 5% OF THE POPULATION SPEAKS
12	THAT LANGUAGE WITH A SPECIAL HIGHLIGHT OF LOW-INCOME TRACKS
13	WITH 20% OR MORE IS LOW INCOME. THERE COULD BE MORE THAN ONE
14	LANGUAGE THAT EXCEEDS THE 5% THRESHOLD BUT ONLY THE POPULAR
15	LANGUAGE IS SHOWN. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS SLIDE SHOWS YOU
16	HOW WE RECRUITED THE FOCUS GROUPS AND ULTIMATELY WHAT THE
17	COMPETITION WAS. IF YOU TAKE A LOOK AT THE BULLETS THE LEFT
18	YOU SEE THE REQUIRED CHARACTERISTICS. THEY HAD TO BE LOW
19	INCOME AND PROVIDE HOUSE OLD SIZE AND WORK OR LIVE IN THE 880
20	CORRIDOR. WE ARE ASSUMING IF YOU LIVED IN THE 880 CORRIDOR
21	THAT YOU DRIVE THERE AS WELL. WE ALSO SOUGHT TO INCLUDE A
22	RANGE OF OTHER CHARACTERISTICS SUCH AS GENDER IDENTITY, AGE
23	AND MULTI-LINGUAL. AT THE BOTTOM YOU SEE THE RANGE OF
24	PARTICIPANTS. WE HAD A TOTAL OF 79 PARTICIPANTS. THIS TABLE
25	APPEARS TO BE SLIGHTLY SKEWED TOWARDS ASIAN AND SPANISH.



- 1 OVERALL, YOU SHOULD SEE A BALANCE -- A RELATIVE BALANCE. YOU
- 2 WILL NOTE WE DID HAVE ABOUT TWICE AS MANY WOMEN AS MEN. THESE
- 3 GROUPS ARE OFTEN DIFFICULT TO RECRUIT. AS I SAID, ABOVE -- WE
- 4 TRY TO GO FOR A RANGE AND HAVE AT LEAST SOME REPRESENTATION.
- 5 THE TELEPHONE TOWN HALL HAD A TOTAL OF 344 PARTICIPANTS AT ITS
- 6 BUSIEST POINT WITH A MAXIMUM OF 75 PARTICIPATING AND ANSWERING
- 7 POLLING QUESTIONS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. WE ASKED ABOUT SEVERAL
- 8 DIFFERENT TOPIC AREAS. THE FIRST ONE WAS JUST ABOUT EXPRESS
- 9 LANES THEMSELVES. PARTICIPANTS EXPRESSED THEY ARE CONFUSED
- 10 ABOUT EXPRESS LANES, THE COSTS ASSOCIATED AND HOW THE
- 11 DISCOUNTS WORK AND WHERE TO LOOK FOR INFORMATION. THE
- 12 PARTICIPANTS WHO USE IT PRIMARILY USE IT FOR COMMUTING AND
- 13 SOME PEOPLE THOUGHT THE LANES WERE EXPENSIVE AND UNNECESSARY.
- 14 SEVERAL PARTICIPANTS INDICATED THEY WOULD BE MORE LIKELY TO
- 15 USE THE EXPRESS LANES IF THEY GOT A DISCOUNT. AND TWO
- 16 INDICATED THEIR LIKELIHOOD WOULD DEPEND ON THE RATE OF THE
- 17 DISCOUNT.SELF PEOPLE RAISED CONCERNS ABOUT EQUITY WITH REGARD
- 18 TO EXPRESENCE LANES IN GENERAL BUT THIS PILOT PROGRAM WOULD BE
- 19 ONE WAY TO EXPRESS THE EOUITY ISSUE. WE ALSO ASKED ABOUT THE
- 20 DISCOUNT ELIGIBILITY. I WANT TO FLAG HERE THAT THE ELECTRONIC
- 21 BENEFITS TRANSFERS SYSTEM, EBT, IS USED IN CALIFORNIA FOR THE
- 22 DELIVERY REDEMPTION AND RECONCILIATION OF ISSUED PUBLIC
- 23 ASSISTANCE BENEFITS SUCH AS CALFRESH, CALWORKS AND OTHER FOOD
- 24 AND CASH AID BENEFITS. CLIPPER START ACCEPTS EBT CARDS HAS
- 25 THESE PROGRAMS ALL USE THE SAME 200% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY



- 1 LEVEL CUTOFF. JUST TO NOTE, CONSISTENCY WITH CLIPPER START HAS
- 2 BEEN A CORE TENET OF THIS PROGRAM SINCE WE STARTED THINKING
- 3 ABOUT IT AND WE PRESENTED THAT TO YOU EARLIER AS PART OF THE
- 4 CONCEPT. AND SO, AS YOU CAN SEE, THE FEEDBACK THAT WE GOT FROM
- 5 PARTICIPANTS IS THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE ELIGIBILITY BASED ON
- 6 OTHER PROGRAMS. PARTICIPANTS DID EXPRESS CONCERN THAT THE
- 7 ELIGIBLE INCOME BRACKETS ARE BELOW THOSE EARNING MINIMUM WAGE
- 8 AND THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT SHOULD NOT USE THE FEDERAL
- 9 POVERTY LEVEL. THAT CALCULATIONS MORE CONTRACT OF THE LOCAL
- 10 COST OF LIVING LIKE AREA MEDIAN INCOME, HOUSING PROGRAMS AND
- 11 FOOD STAMP BENEFIT THRESHOLDS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THEN WE
- 12 ASKED ABOUT DISCOUNT PROGRAM FEATURES. NOW, WHILE SOME
- 13 SUGGESTED DISCOUNTS RANGING FROM 20-40%, MOST SUGGESTED 50-
- 14 75%. IN THE TELEPHONE TOWN HALL, 70% OF THE 49 PEOPLE
- 15 RESPONDING TO THIS OUESTION SAID THAT 50% DISCOUNT WOULD MAKE
- 16 THEM MORE LIKELY TO ENROLL IN THE DISCOUNT PROGRAM.
- 17 PARTICIPANTS IN TWO OF THE DIFFERENT SETS OF FOCUS GROUPS
- 18 SUGGESTED ANNUAL RENEWALS OR BIANNUAL RENEWALS. THEY WERE
- 19 CONCERNED ABOUT THE BURDENSOME RENEWAL PROCESSES AND SUGGESTED
- 20 MAKING THE PROCESS AS SIMPLE AND EASY AS POSSIBLE. THEY DIDN'T
- 21 REACH CONSENSUS ON LIMITS ON THE NUMBER OF TOLL TAGS, WHICH
- 22 WAS ONE OF THE QUESTIONS WE ASKED ABOUT. THEY HAD CONFLICTING
- 23 OPINIONS ON THIS. SO, WE DIDN'T REALLY SEE AN ULTIMATE
- 24 CONSENSUS. MOST OF THE PARTICIPANTS SAID THEY WOULD LIKE SEE
- 25 THE FULL PRICE TOLL COMPARED TO THE TOLL PAID FOR EACH TRIP ON



- 1 THE FASTRAK STATEMENTS AND PIERCE WILL ADDRESS THAT IN A
- 2 LITTLE BIT. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. WE ASKED THEM WHAT THEY
- 3 THOUGHT WOULD BE THE BARRIERS TO PARTICIPATION. WHAT WOULD
- 4 PREVENT PEOPLE FROM APPLYING FOR THIS PROGRAM. AND AGAIN, EVEN
- 5 WITH THE DISCOUNT, THERE WAS CONSENSUS MANAGE THE PARTICIPANTS
- 6 THAT COST WILL BE THE PRIMARY BARRIER, ESPECIALLY IF THE
- 7 INCOME BRACKETS REMAIN. SOME PARTICIPANTS, PARTICULARLY IN THE
- 8 IN LANGUAGE GROUPS QUESTIONED WHETHER OR NOT THIS PROGRAM
- 9 WOULD HELP ENOUGH PEOPLE GIVING THE ELIGIBILITY THRESHOLDS.
- 10 PARTICIPANTS IN THE FIRST TWO SETS OF FOCUS GROUPS EXPRESSED
- 11 CONCERNS THAT THE APPLICATION PROCESS AND INCOME VERIFICATION
- 12 REQUIREMENTS WILL BE CUMBERSOME AND TIME CONSUMING. THIS IS
- 13 SOMETHING THAT HAS COME UP MORE THAN ONCE. AND PARTICIPANTS IN
- 14 THE SAME FOCUS GROUPS SUGGESTED DEVELOPING APPLICATION
- 15 PROCESSES. IN OUR TELEPHONE TOWN HALL, SOME SAID THEY HAD
- 16 CONCERNS ABOUT PROVIDING FINANCIAL INFORMATION. NEXT SLIDE,
- 17 PLEASE. WE ALSO ASKED THEM IF THEY COULD PROVIDE SUGGESTS
- 18 ABOUT HUH WE COULD CONDUCT OUTREACH AND WE GOT A LOT OF GOOD
- 19 FEEDBACK. THEY STARTED OUT WITH TALKING ABOUT HOW WE COULD
- 20 MAYBE LEVERAGE EXISTING CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION USED BY
- 21 ELECTED OFFICIALS, COMMUNITY LEADERS, COMMUNITY-BASED
- 22 ORGANIZATIONS AND SERVICE PROVIDERS AND CENTERS. SOME OF THESE
- 23 IDEAS INCLUDE CHILD CARE CENTERS, THE DMV AND BART STATIONS.
- 24 THEY ALSO MENTIONED USING BILLBOARDS. SPANISH SPEAKING
- 25 PARTICIPANTS REQUESTED THAT IT BE TELEVISED IN PLACES THEY



- 1 FREOUENT LIKE MARKETS, CLINICS, AT NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS,
- 2 LIBRARIES AND SCHOOLS. SPANISH SPEAKERS ALSO SUGGESTED USING
- 3 PRINTED IN LANGUAGE ADVERTISING BY MAIL LIKE A POSTCARD OR
- 4 FLYER AND ADVERTISING THROUGH LOCAL SPANISH NEWS WHERE THE
- 5 PROGRAM IS FULLY EXPLAINED IN SPANISH. THE CHINESE SPEAKING
- 6 PARTICIPANTS ALSO SUGGESTED USING SOME TYPE OF IN LANGUAGE
- 7 LETTERS BY MAIL. THEY ALSO SUGGESTED ADVERTISING IN THE
- 8 CHRONICLE AND OR ON CHANNEL 26. I WILL TURN IT BACK TO PIERCE.

- 10 PIERCE GOULD: THANKS, LYSA. NOW I AM GOING TO TALK MORE ABOUT
- 11 HOW THE PILOT WILL WORK IN THE CONTEXT OF THE FEEDBACK THAT
- 12 LYSA JUST SHARED WITH YOU. WE WANT IT TO BE -- WOULD YOU MIND
- 13 GOING TO THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THANK YOU. WE WANT IT TO BE
- 14 EASY FOR INCOME QUALIFIED CUSTOMERS TO PAY LESS TO USE THE 880
- 15 EXPRESS LANES. THERE'S SOME KEY POINTS TO TELL CUSTOMERS ABOUT
- 16 HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS. FIRST THEY NEED TO GET APPROVED FOR THE
- 17 TOLL DISCOUNT PILOT. THEN THEY NEED TO ACTIVATE THE DISCOUNT
- 18 IN THE FASTRAK ACCOUNT AND IT WILL BE IMPORTANT FOR THEM TO
- 19 KEEP A POSITIVE BALANCE IN THEIR FASTRAK ACCOUNT AT ALL TIMES.
- 20 WHEN USING THE 880 EXPRESS LANES, THEY SHOULD HAVE THE TOLL
- 21 CARD IN THE CAR AND THE DISCOUNT WILL BE GIVEN AUTOMATICALLY.
- 22 NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THE ENROLLMENT PROCESS WILL BE SIMPLE. AND
- 23 WE CONFIRMED IN THE FOCUS GROUPS THAT POTENTIAL CUSTOMERS
- 24 UNDERSTAND HOW IT WILL WORK. AFTER THE CUSTOMERS APPLIES, AN
- 25 ELIGIBILITY VERIFIER WILL REVIEW THEIR APPLICATION. IF THEY






- 1 HAVE AN EXISTING FASTRAK ACCOUNT, THE TOLL DISCOUNT PLAN WILL
- 2 BE APPLIED AUTOMATICALLY BY FASTRAK. IF THE CUSTOMER DOESN'T
- 3 HAVE A FASTRAK ACCOUNT, THE TOLL DISCOUNT PLAN WILL BE APPLIED
- 4 BY FASTRAK WHEN THEY OPEN ONE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, THE
- 5 APPLICATION PROCESS IS THE SAME AS FOR CLIPPER START. ELIGIBLE
- 6 CUSTOMERS CAN APPLY BY COMPUTER, MOBILE PHONE OR ON PAPER AND
- 7 WOULD NEED TO HAVE PROOF OF IDENTITY AND PROOF OF HOUSEHOLD
- 8 INCOME, PLUS HAVE A BAY AREA MAILING ADDRESS AND ANSWER SOME
- 9 SURVEY QUESTIONS RELATED TO DEMOGRAPHICS AND DRIVING HABITS.
- 10 WE CONSIDERED VEHICLE OWNERSHIP AS A POTENTIAL REQUIREMENT FOR
- 11 PILOT PARTICIPATION, BUT DECIDED AGAINST IT SINCE FASTRAK
- 12 DOESN'T HAVE THIS REQUIREMENT. AND THIS MAKES SENSE SINCE A
- 13 PERSON COULD BORROW OR RENT A CAR AND STILL NEED TO USE
- 14 FASTRAK TO PAY TOLLS. THE HOUSEHOLD INCOME THRESHOLD WOULD BE
- 15 200% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL OR LESS WHICH IS THE SAME AS
- 16 CLIPPER START AND OTHER BENEFIT LIKE CALFRESH AND MEDI-CAL.
- 17 STUDENT SUCCESS AS CONTEXT, THIS IS ABOUT \$26,000 FOR A ONE-
- 18 PERSON HOUSEHOLD. AND \$52,000 FOR A FOUR-PERSON HOUSEHOLD PER
- 19 YEAR. WHILE WE RECEIVED FOCUS GROUP FEEDBACK THAT IS THRESHOLD
- 20 IS TOO LOW FOR THE BAY AREA, STAFF THINKS IT IS IMPORTANT TO
- 21 USE THE SAME THRESHOLD AS CLIPPER START TO KEEP THE PILOT
- 22 SIMPLE AND FOR CONSISTENCY WITH OTHER GOVERNMENT BENEFIT
- 23 PROGRAMS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, THERE IS A VARIETY OF
- 24 ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION TO PROVE IDENTITY AND INCOME AND THEY
- 25 ARE THE SAME AS FOR CLIPPER START. FOR COMPUTER AND MOBILE



- 1 PHONE-BASED APPLICATIONS, CUSTOMERS WOULD NEED TO SCAN OR
- 2 SUBMIT A PHOTO OF THEIR DOCUMENTATION AND PAPER-BASED
- 3 APPLICATIONS, EXCUSE ME, WOULD NEED TO BE ACCOMPANIED BY
- 4 PHOTOCOPIES. OPTIONS FOR PROOF OF IDENTITY RANGE FROM A
- 5 DRIVER'S LICENSE, TO CITY ID CARD AND OTHER THINGS LISTED ON
- 6 THIS SLIDE AS WELL. AND FOR PROOF OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME, WE WILL
- 7 ACCEPT EVIDENCE OF ELIGIBILITY FOR OTHER PROGRAMS SUCH AS EBT
- 8 CARD, MEDI-CAL CARD, COUNTY BENEFITS LETTER OR A TAX FORM. I
- 9 THINK THERE'S ADDITIONAL THING REFERENCED HERE. THE EQUITY AND
- 10 ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE SUCCINCTS IF SOMEONE IS ALREADY QUALIFIED
- 11 AND WANTS TO ENROLL IN FASTRAK, THEY SHOULD NOT NEED TO
- 12 RESUBMIT DOCUMENTATION FOR PROOF OF INCOME. WE PLAN TO DESIGN
- 13 OUR SYSTEMS TO SUPPORT THIS REQUEST. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS
- 14 IS THE MILLION DOLLARS QUESTION. SINCE THE DAY WE PROPOSED
- 15 THIS PILOT, THE FIRST QUESTION THAT PEOPLE ASK IS WHAT IS THE
- 16 DISCOUNT GOING TO BE? AND SO, WE ARE HAPPY TO FINALLY BE ABLE
- 17 TO HAVE A RECOMMENDATION TO SHARE WITH YOU BASED ON THE
- 18 RESEARCH WE DID. THE GOAL IS TO TRY TO BENEFIT PEOPLE AND HELP
- 19 THEM. THIS TABLE SHOWS OUR STANDARD TOLL RATES ON THE 880
- 20 EXPRESS LANES. THE TOP LINE. AND THE INCOME QUALIFIED TOLL
- 21 RATES FOR THE PILOT IN THE PINK BOX. AS LYSA NOTED, STAFF IS
- 22 PROPOSING A 50% DISCOUNT ON ALL TOLLED TRIPS IN THE 880
- 23 EXPRESS LANES BECAUSE IT HAD THE MOST SUPPORT AMONG FOCUS
- 24 GROUP PARTICIPANTS AND SHOULD ENCOURAGE ENROLLMENT IN THE
- 25 PILOT. THIS AMOUNT WAS SEEN AS EASY TO CALCULATE, ALLOWING





- 1 DRIVERS TO FOCUS ON THE ROAD. AND IT SHOULD ALL BE SIMPLE TO
- 2 MESSAGE IN OUR OUTREACH CAMPAIGN. UNDER THE STAFF PROPOSAL, A
- 3 50% DISCOUNT ON ALL TOLLED TRIPS WOULD RESULT IN THE FOLLOWING
- 4 TOLL STRUCTURE FOR INCOME QUALIFIED DRIVERS. 50% OFF A ONE-
- 5 PERSON TRIP. IF YOU ARE DRIVING ALONE IT IS 50% OFF. AND 75%
- 6 OFF TWO PERSON OR CLEAN AIR VEHICLE TRIPS. THREE-PERSON
- 7 CARPOOLS ALWAYS ARE TOLL FREE WITH FASTRAK SET IN THE PROPER
- 8 POSITION ON THE 880 EXPRESS LANES. THIS STRUCTURE INCENTIVIZES
- 9 CARPOOLS WHICH WAS IMPORTANT TO OUR ADVISORY GROUP MEMBERS IN
- 10 THE PAST. WE HAVE HEARD SOME SUGGESTIONS THAT WAS IMPORTANT.
- 11 SINCE WE PREPARED THE STAFF PROPOSAL, WE HAVE ALSO RECEIVED
- 12 FEEDBACK FROM SOME EXPRESS LANE OPERATORS AND THEY ARE
- 13 CONCERNED OFFERING 75% OFF FOR TWO-PERSON VEHICLES OR CLEAN
- 14 AIR VEHICLES WHICH IS 50% OF THE ALREADY DISCOUNTED TOLL OF
- 15 50% OFF, THAT IT IS MORE COMPLEX TO EXPLAIN TO THE PUBLIC. AND
- 16 THAT IN ORDER TO KEEP MESSAGING SIMPLE, THE DISCOUNT SHOULD BE
- 17 A FLAT 50% OFF THE POSTED TOLL PERIOD. SO, IN THIS CASE, THE
- 18 PUBLIC MESSAGE MIGHT BE SOMETHING LIKE PILOT PARTICIPANTS GET
- 19 50% OFF DRIVE ALONE TRIPS. BUT THE TRADEOFF IS THERE WOULD BE
- 20 NO ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL INCENTIVE TO BE A TWO-PERSON CARPOOL
- 21 OR GET A CLEAN AIR VEHICLE. A THREE-PERSON CARPOOL COULD STILL
- 22 USE THE EXPRESS LANES TOLL FREE AS USUAL. AT THE END OF THE
- 23 PRESENTATION, I WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM THE COMMITTEE ABOUT
- 24 WHICH DISCOUNT APPROACH MAKES MORE SENSE AND WHY, INCLUDING
- 25 YOUR THOUGHTS ON POTENTIAL CONFUSION AROUND MESSAGING AND



- 1 WHETHER INCENTIVIZING TWO-PERSON CARPOOLS AND CLEAN AIR
- 2 VEHICLE IS IMPORTANT FOR THE PILOT DISCOUNT STRUCTURE OR NOT.
- 3 I WILL COME BACK TO THIS. I AM INTERESTED IN HEARING ABOUT
- 4 THIS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THERE'S A LOT OF INFORMATION ON THIS
- 5 SLIDE. BUT IT IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE IT LAYS OUT KEY PILOT
- 6 FEATURES AND THEIR RATIONALE IS WHICH EITHER FOR CONSISTENCY
- 7 WITH HOW FASTRAK WORKS. THAT IS THE FASTRAK CONSISTENCY COLUMN
- 8 HERE OR BECAUSE THE FEATURE WAS CONFIRMED BY THE FOCUS GROUP
- 9 FEEDBACK WE HEARD, THE COLUMN ON THE FAR RIGHT. WE HAVE PLACED
- 10 CHECKS IN THE BOXES WHERE WE THINK IT LINES UP WITH THE
- 11 PARTICULAR TEACH. AS WE HAVE ALREADY INDICATED, STAFF HAS
- 12 PROPOSED THE DISCOUNT BE 50% OFF FOR BAY AREA RESIDENTS.
- 13 IRRESPECTIVE OF THE ISSUE I JUST HIGHLIGHTED WHICH WE WILL
- 14 TALK ABOUT AT THE END. AS WE HAVE ALREADY INDICATED, STAFF HAS
- 15 PROPOSED THE DISCOUNT BY -- I THINK I JUST SAID THAT. SORRY.
- 16 THE TOLL DISCOUNT WOULD BE ACCOUNT BASED. NUMBER TWO. IT WOULD
- 17 APPLY ON ALL TOLL TAGS AND LICENSE PLATES LINKED TO AN
- 18 ACCOUNT. THE DISCOUNT WOULD BE GIVEN EVEN IF THERE'S NO TOLL
- 19 TAG READ IN THE EXPRESS LANES. ONLY A LICENSE PLATE IMAGE IS
- 20 CAPTURED. THERE WOULD BE NO LIMITS ON THE NUMBER OF TOLL TAGS
- 21 AND LICENSE PLATES REGISTERED TO A FASTRAK ACCOUNT WITH THE
- 22 DISCOUNT PLAN. LYSA MENTIONED WE DIDN'T GET CONSENSUS ON THAT
- 23 FROM THE FOCUS GROUP PARTICIPANTS. SO, WE ARE GOING TO ERR
- 24 TOWARDS A MORE OPEN POLICY AT THIS POINT. AND THEN ON THE
- 25 MONTHLY FASTRAK STATEMENT, WE WOULD SHOW THE STANDARD TOLL AND



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 - 1 A CREDIT FOR THE DISCOUNT FOR EACH TOLLED TRIP MADE IN THE 880
 - 2 EXPRESS LANES WHICH HAD STRONG SUPPORT IN THE FOCUS GROUPS.
 - 3 OTHER FASTRAK POLICIES LIKE TAG DEPOSIT AMOUNTS, MINIMUM
 - 4 ACCOUNT BALANCES AND PROCESSES AND CASH PAYMENT OPTIONS WOULD
 - 5 BE THE SAME AS FOR ALL FASTRAK CUSTOMERS TO KEEP THINGS SIMPLE
 - 6 AND COST EFFECTIVE AT THE FASTRAK CSC. ON THIS POINT WE KNOW
 - 7 THERE'S A LOT OF INTEREST. I WANT TO REMIND YOU STAFF IS
 - 8 WORKING ON A FASTRAK EQUITY ACTION PLAN AND WE ARE PROPOSING
 - 9 SOME INITIAL POLICY CHANGES THAT WOULD COMPLIMENT THIS PILOT
 - 10 BEFORE IT LAUNCHES. I BELIEVE THOSE WILL BE SHARED THIS MONTH
 - 11 IN THE OVERSITE COMMITTEE. THAT IS SOMETHING TO LOOK FORWARD
 - 12 TO. LASTLY, PROGRAM STAFF WILL MONITOR UNUSUAL ACCOUNT AND
 - 13 TRIP ACTIVITY THROUGH REPORTS AND DATABASE QUERIES AS A WAY TO
 - 14 EVALUATE POTENTIAL PROGRAM ABUSE. WE ALSO PLAN TO HAVE A
 - 15 POLICY FOR HOW TO HANDLE ABUSE IN THE EVENT ACTION IS NEEDED.
 - 16 THESE ARE THE FEATURES WE ARE PROPOSING FOR THE PILOT. WE ARE
 - 17 PLANNING A COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION WHICH COULD INFORM FUTURE
 - 18 CHANGES TO THE PILOT IF IT IS TO BECOME A PERMANENT PROGRAM.
 - 19 WE DID TALK WITH YOU ABOUT THE HIGH LEVEL APPROACH TO THAT
 - 20 PERFORMANCE EVALUATION AT OUR LAST MEETING IN JULY. NEXT
 - 21 SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS IS MY LAST SLIDE. THIS IS THE PILOT
 - 22 SCHEDULE UPDATE. I WANT TO JUST CLOSE WITH THIS. WE HAVE
 - 23 COMPLETED PROJECT PLANNING WORK AND HAVE ALL CONTRACTS EITHER
 - 24 EXECUTED OR ON A PATH TO BE EXECUTED TO MEET THE SCHEDULE AT
 - 25 THIS POINT. WE HAVE ALSO COMPLETED INITIAL PILOT DESIGN.



- 1 ALTHOUGH MORE DETAIL DESIGN WILL BE DONE AS PART OF TECHNICAL
- 2 ASSISTANCE WORK WHICH I THINK IS THE THIRD ROW DOWN. IN THE
- 3 NEXT 1-3RD MONTHS WE AIM TO KICK OFF AN AMENDMENT TO OUR TOLL
- 4 ORDINANCE TO GIVE THE DISCOUNT ON THE 880 EXPRESS LANES AS
- 5 WELL AS CHANGES NEEDED TO ALIGN WITH THE FASTRAK EQUITY ACTION
- 6 PLAN THAT I WAS JUST MENTIONING. IN PARTICULAR, CHANGES TO
- 7 VIOLATION PENALTY AMOUNTS. WE ARE CURRENTLY PLANNING TO LAUNCH
- 8 THE PILOT IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF 2022. IT WOULD NOT BE
- 9 SOONER THAN MAY. MAY OF 2022. BUT THERE ARE RISKS TO THE
- 10 SCHEDULE. THE MAIN RISKS ARE COMPETING PRIORITIES FOR SOME OF
- 11 OUR CONTRACTORS, AS WELL AS LINING UP THE TOLL ORDINANCE WITH
- 12 CHANGES FROM THE FASTRAK EQUITY ACTION PLAN. SO, WE ARE GOING
- 13 TO BE CONTINUING TO TRACK THESE RISKS AND TRY TO KEEP OUR
- 14 PROJECT FROM HERE ON OUT ON SCHEDULE. ASIDE FROM GOING TO
- 15 BAIFA IN OCTOBER, TO SHARE THE RESULTS OF CUSTOMER RESEARCH
- 16 AND ASK THEM TO SUPPORT A STAFF RECOMMENDATION ON THE
- 17 DISCOUNT, THE DISCOUNT AMOUNT, WE ARE GOING TO RETURN TO BAIFA
- 18 IN ABOUT FOUR MONTHS FOR FEEDBACK ON OUR DRAFT EVACUATION PLAN
- 19 AND OUR DRAFT OUTREACH PLAN. WE WILL BE COMING TO THIS GROUP
- 20 OF COURSE BEFORE WE GO TO BAIFA FOR THAT. OVERALL, WE ARE
- 21 LOOKING FORWARD TO THE DAY WHEN THE PILOT IS UP AND RUNNING SO
- 22 WE COULD START LEARNING FROM IT. THIS IS THE END OF THE
- 23 PRESENTATION. WE ARE HAPPY TO GET FEEDBACK AND ANSWER ANY
- 24 OUESTIONS. BUT WE ARE PARTICULARLY INTERESTED IN HEARING YOUR
- 25 IDEAS ABOUT THE STAFF RECOMMENDATION FOR THE DISCOUNT RELATIVE

- 24 NORTHERN CALIFORNIA RIGHT THERE IN EAST OAKLAND. SO, YOU HAVE
- 25 EIGHT BLACK PEOPLE IN YOUR FOCUS GROUP. I WOULD BE VERY



- 1 SURPRISED IF THIS PRESENTATION THAT YOU JUST DID STANDS
- 2 SCRUTINY OF A LAWSUIT BECAUSE IT IS NOT REPRESENTATIVE OF OUR
- 3 COMMUNITY AT ALL. AND IT IS VERY UPSETTING TO ME. HOW YOU GOT
- 4 EIGHT BLACK PEOPLE ON THIS THING AND IT RUNS RIGHT THROUGH THE
- 5 HEART OF THEIR COMMUNITY, IT IS THE NUMBER ONE TRANSPORTATION
- 6 MODE, FREEWAY MODE IN THEIR COMMUNITY. YOU GUYS GOT EIGHT
- 7 BLACK PEOPLE? SERIOUSLY? REALLY? SO, OKAY. OKAY. SO, YOU
- 8 UNDERSTAND WHAT MY CONCERN IS, NUMBER ONE. BUT I DON'T KNOW
- 9 HOW YOU GUYS SAT IN A ROOM AND SAID WE ARE GOING TO PUT EIGHT
- 10 BLACK PEOPLE ON THIS FOCUS GROUP IN EAST OAKLAND. I MEAN
- 11 REALLY. IT IS A MYSTERY TO ME HOW YOU GUYS GOT TOGETHER AND
- 12 DECIDED THIS.

- 16 WALTER WILSON: LET ME FINISH. I KNOW YOU SAID SOMETHING ABOUT
- 17 ASIANS AND LATINOS. THE MAJORITY OF BLACK PEOPLE LIVE RIGHT
- 18 THERE WHERE YOUR FASTRAK IS RUNNING THROUGH. AND THIS OTHER
- 19 THING ABOUT 200% LOWER THAN THE FEDERAL POVERTY LINE. REALLY
- 20 THAT IS ELIMINATES VIRTUALLY ALMOST ANYBODY WHO IS POOR IN
- 21 CALIFORNIA. ESPECIALLY IN THE BAY AREA. AND CHANCES ARE THEY
- 22 PROBABLY DON'T EVEN HAVE A CAR IF THEY ARE MAKING \$50,000 A
- 23 YEAR. AND FORGET ELECTRIC VEHICLES. THAT IS OUT COMPLETELY. I
- 24 SEE SOME MAJOR PROBLEMS WITH THIS, YOU GUYS. I AM JUST TELLING
- 25 YOU STRAIGHT UP. THIS IS MY -- WHAT YOU GUYS NEED TO HEAR FROM



- 1 ME BECAUSE YOU WILL HEAR MORE OF THIS NOT JUST FROM ME BUT
- 2 OVERS IN THE COMMUNITY. THANK YOU.

- 4 LYSA HALE: CAN I ADDRESS YOUR COMMENT ABOUT THE FOCUS GROUPS.
- 5 IF YOU WANT TO PULL THE PRESENTATION BACK UP, IF YOU DON'T
- 6 MIND. AND GO TO THE SLIDE THAT HAS THE BULLETS -- KEEP GOING.
- 7 ONE MORE. THERE YOU GO. OKAY. SO, WHAT WE WERE FOCUSED ON WAS
- 8 MAKING SURE THAT WE CAUGHT PEOPLE WHO WERE LOW INCOME WHO FIT
- 9 THAT CRITERIA AND PROVIDED THEIR HOUSEHOLD SIZE SO WE COULD
- 10 KIND OF CALCULATE WHETHER OR NOT THEY FIT THE CRITERIA FOR THE
- 11 PROGRAM. AND THAT THEY LIVE IN THE 880 CORRIDOR AND THAT THEY
- 12 DRIVE IN THE 880 CORRIDOR. AND WHAT WE WERE LOOKING FOR WAS A
- 13 RANGE OF RACE, GENDER IDENTITY, AGE, MULTI-LANGUAGISM,
- 14 EMPLOYED AND NOT EMPLOYED, BANKED AND UNBANKED AND PEOPLE WHO
- 15 HAVE FASTRAK AND DON'T HAVE FASTRAK. THAT IS A LOT OF
- 16 DIFFERENT FACTORS WE NEED TO KEEP TRACK OF. THIS IS NOT A
- 17 SURVEY. IT IS NOT SUPPOSED TO BE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE AREA.
- 18 IF 50% OF THE AREA IS A PARTICULAR ETHNIC GROUP THIS IS NOT
- 19 GOING TO BE 50%. OUR GOAL WAS MAKING SURE WE HAD KIND OF THE
- 20 BREADTH OF REPRESENTATION FOR ALL THE DIFFERENT GROUPS THAT
- 21 MIGHT LIVE IN THIS CORRIDOR. IF YOU COULD GO BACK ONE SLIDE.
- 22 THERE YOU GO. IF YOU TAKE A LOOK AT THIS, THE LANGUAGES THAT
- 23 ARE SPOKEN, WE NEEDED TO MAKE SURE THAT WE INCLUDED CHINESE
- 24 AND SPANISH. IF YOU COULD TAKE AT THAT GREEN, TEALISH GREEN
- 25 AND THAT CORAL COLOR THAT YOU SEE THROUGHOUT THE PARTICULAR



- 1 TARGET AREA, THAT WAS WHY WE DEDICATED SEPARATE FOCUS GROUPS
- 2 TO THE CANTONESE AND SPANISH. JUST AS A MEANS OF PROVIDING YOU
- 3 WITH A LITTLE BIT OF BACKGROUND FOR WHAT OUR APPROACH WAS FOR
- 4 THE FOCUS GROUPS.

- 6 WALTER WILSON: I APPRECIATE THAT. BUT YOU KNOW WHAT, IF YOU
- 7 DID THE SAME THING FOR BLACK PEOPLE HERE, THAT WHOLE AREA
- 8 WOULD BE WHATEVER THAT COLOR IS. THE WHOLE AREA WOULD BE. THAT
- 9 JUST DOESN'T -- THAT DON'T WORK FOR ME.

- 13 WALTER WILSON: BECAUSE THE TRUTH OF THE MATTER, MA'AM, THOSE
- 14 PEOPLE IN THOSE FOCUS GROUPS, HE SAID IT THEMSELVES. THEY GAVE
- 15 YOU INFORMATION ABOUT WHERE THEY ARE, WHAT THEIR OPINIONS ARE

WHEN THEY ARE TOLLING, IT 6 BECOMES CONGESTED, THE TOLLS INCREASE AS A WAY OF MANAGING 7 8 DEMAND. OUR DATA WE HAVE COLLECTED OVER TIME, IT SHOWS THERE'S ALWAYS BETTER PERFORMANCE IN THE EXPRESS LANES THAN IN THE 9 NEIGHBORING GENERAL PURPOSE LANES BECAUSE OF FACT WE ARE USING 10 PRICE AS A WAY OF MANAGING THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE THAT USE THAT 11 LANE. 


