- 14 TO COVER KEY MILESTONES AND TIMING FOR THE RHNA APPEALS
- 15 PROCESS THE REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING AN APPEAL AND THE
- 16 PROCEDURES FOR CONSIDERING APPEALS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. FIRST
- 17 A QUICK RECAP OF WHERE WE ARE IN THE RHNA PROCESS. IN JANUARY
- 18 THE EXECUTIVE BOARD ADOPTED THE DRAFT RHNA METHODOLOGY AND IT
- 19 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND
- 20 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR REVIEW IN FEBRUARY. IN APRIL, HCD
- 21 CONFIRMED THAT THE METHODOLOGY FURTHERS THE RHNA OBJECTIVES.
- 22 AT ITS MEETING ON MAY 20TH THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD WILL
- 23 CONSIDER APPROVING THE FINAL RHNA METHODOLOGY AND THE RELEASE
- 24 OF THE DRAFT ALLOCATIONS. THE RELEASE OF DRAFT ALLOCATIONS
- 25 INITIATES THE APPEALS PHASE OF RHNA, WHICH ABAG WILL CONDUCT





- 1 OVER THE SUMMER AND FALL FOLLOWED BY APPROVAL OF THE FINAL
- 2 RHNA PLAN BY THE END OF THE YEAR. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO
- 3 TURNING TO WHAT THE APPEALS PROCESS WILL LOOK LIKE, HOUSING
- 4 ELEMENT LAW ALLOWS A JURISDICTION OR HCD TO APPEAL A
- 5 JURISDICTION'S DRAFT ALLOCATION. IN PAST RHNA CYCLES ANNE
- 6 APPEAL COULD ONLY BE BROUGHT BY A JURISDICTION FIDUCIARY ITS
- 7 OWN ALLOCATION HOWEVER HCD NOW HAS THE AUTHORITY TO BRING IN
- 8 AN APPEAL AND A JURISDICTION CAN ALSO APPEAL ANOTHER
- 9 JURISDICTION'S ALLOCATION. THE MAJOR STEPS IN THE APPEALS
- 10 PROCESS ARE THAT A JURISDICTION OR HCD HAS 45 DAYS FOLLOWS THE
- 11 RELEASE OF THE DRAFT ALLOCATION TO SUBMIT WRITTEN APPEAL TO
- 12 ABAG. FOLLOWED BY ANOTHER 45 DAY PERIOD WHERE A JURISDICTION
- 13 OR HCD CAN SUBMIT COMMENT ON ANY APPEALS FILED. ABAG MUST
- 14 CONSIDER A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER APPEALS AND FINAL
- 15 DETERMINATION OF JURISDICTION BEFORE FILING. IF ANOTHER
- 16 JURISDICTION IS SUBJECT TO THE APPEAL WILL HAVE OPPORTUNITY TO
- 17 RESPOND TO THE APPEAL DURING THE PUBLIC HEARING. NEXT SLIDE
- 18 PLEASE. THIS SLIDE PROVIDES A DETAIL LOOK AT THE STEPS IN THE
- 19 PROCESS AND THE EXPECTED TIMING FOR EACH. FOLLOWING ACTION BY
- 20 THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD IN LATE MAY, ABAG WILL NOTIFY
- 21 JURISDICTIONS AND HCD ABOUT ADOPTION OF FINAL RHNA METHODOLOGY
- 22 AND THE DRAFT ALLOCATIONS. THE DEADLINE FOR JURISDICTIONS OR
- 23 HCD TO SUBMIT AN APPEAL TO ABAG WILL BE IN EARLY JULY BASED ON
- 24 THE DRAFT PROCEDURES THE DEADLINE WOULD BE JULY 9TH. ABAG WILL
- 25 NOTIFY ALL JURISDICTIONS IN THE REGION AND HCD ABOUT THE





- 1 APPEALS SUBMITTED. AND I WANT TO MENTION HERE THAT WE TOOK
- 2 THIS ITEM TO THE REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE YESTERDAY AND ONE
- 3 OF THE COMMENTS THAT WE RECEIVED WAS A DESIRE FOR GREATER
- 4 EMPHASIS ON PUBLIC COMMENT OPPORTUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE
- 5 PROCESS. AND SO WE WILL BE UPDATING OUR DRAFT PROCEDURES TO
- 6 EMPHASIZE THAT WHEN WE TAKE IT TO THE EXECUTIVE BOARD. SO
- 7 THEN FOLLOWING THAT, THE DEADLINE FOR JURISDICTIONS OR HCD TO
- 8 COMMENT ON ANY OF THE APPEALS SUBMITTED WILL BE AT THE END OF
- 9 AUGUST. ABAG WILL NOTIFY ALL JURISDICTIONS AND HCD ABOUT THE
- 10 COMMENTS RECEIVED. AND, AGAIN, IN RESPONSE TO WHAT WE HEARD
- 11 FROM THE RPC, WE WILL INCLUDE OPPORTUNITIES FOR MEMBERS OF THE
- 12 PUBLIC TO COMMENT AS WELL. IN SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER, ABAG
- 13 WILL CONDUCT THE PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER APPEALS AND ANY
- 14 COMMENTS RECEIVED. ABAG MUST NOTIFY JURISDICTIONS AT LEAST 21
- 15 DAYS PRIOR TO THE APPEAL'S HEARING, AND IN OCTOBER OR
- 16 NOVEMBER, ABAG WILL RATIFY THE WRITTEN FINAL DETERMINATION ON
- 17 EACH APPEAL AND ISSUE FINAL RHNA ALLOCATIONS THAT INCLUDE ANY
- 18 ADJUSTMENTS RESULTING FROM SUCCESSFUL APPEALS. IN NOVEMBER OR
- 19 DECEMBER, THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD WILL CONDUCT A PUBLIC
- 20 HEARING TO ADOPT THE FINAL RHNA PLAN. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO
- 21 TURNING NOW TO DETAILS ABOUT FILING APPEALS. AS I MENTIONED
- 22 PREVIOUSLY ONLY A LOCAL JURISDICTION OR HCD CAN SUBMIT AN
- 23 APPEAL. BUT APPLICANTS CAN FILE AN APPEAL FOR ANY JURISDICTION
- 24 IN THE BAY AREA. HOUSING ELEMENT LAW IDENTIFIES A LIMITED AND
- 25 NARROW SET OF CIRCUMSTANCES WHERE A JURISDICTION OR HCD CAN





- 1 APPEAL A DRAFT ALLOCATION. THE THREE ELIGIBLE BASIS FOR AN
- 2 APPEAL ARE THAT, ONE, ABAG FAIL TO ADEQUATELY CONSIDER
- 3 INFORMATION SUBMITTED AS PART OF THE LOCAL JURISDICTION
- 4 SURVEY. ABAG CONDUCTED THIS SURVEY IN EARLY 2020 AND AS
- 5 REOUIRED BY LAW REOUESTED INFORMATION RELATED TO FACTORS
- 6 IDENTIFIED IN HOUSING ELEMENT LAW THAT MUST BE CONSIDERED IN
- 7 THE RHNA METHODOLOGY AND INFORMATION ABOUT AFFIRMATIVE
- 8 FURTHERING FAIR HOUSING. SECOND, ABAG DID NOT DETERMINE THE
- 9 JURISDICTION'S ALLOCATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH ITS ADOPTED
- 10 METHODOLOGY AND IN A MANNER THAT FURTHERS AND DOES NOT
- 11 UNDERMINE THE RHNA OBJECTIFIES. AND THIRD A SIGNIFICANT AND
- 12 UNFORESEEN CHANGE IN CIRCUMSTANCES HAS OCCURRED IN THE LOCAL
- 13 JURISDICTION OR JURISDICTIONS. THAT MERITS REVISION OF
- 14 INFORMATION SUBMITTED AS PART OF THE LOCAL JURISDICTION SURVEY
- 15 APPEALS ON THIS BASIS CAN ONLY BE BROUGHT BY THE JURISDICTIONS
- 16 AFFECTED BY THE CHANGE IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES. HOUSING ELEMENT
- 17 LAW SPECIFIES CRITERIA THAT CANNOT BE USED AS A BASIS FOR
- 18 REDUCING A JURISDICTION'S ALLOCATION THIS INCLUDES LOCAL
- 19 ORDINANCE POLICY VOTER APPROVED MEASURE OR STANDARD LIMITED
- 20 RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT UNDER PRODUCTION OF HOUSING FROM THE
- 21 LAST RHNA CYCLE AND STABLE POPULATION NUMBERS IN A
- 22 JURISDICTION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. HOUSING ELEMENT LAW ALSO
- 23 REOUIRES THAT AN APPEAL BE BASED ON COMPARABLE DATA AVAILABLE
- 24 FOR ALL AFFECTED JURISDICTIONS AND ACCEPTED PLANNING
- 25 METHODOLOGY BE SUPPORTED BY ADEQUATE DOCUMENTATION INCLUDE A





- 1 STATEMENT AS TO WHY THE REVISION IS NECESSARY TO FURTHER THE
- 2 RHNA OBJECTIVES AND BE CONSISTENT AND NOT TO THE DETRIMENT OF
- 3 THE DEVELOPMENT PATTERN OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. MTC/ABAG
- 4 STAFF HAS DEVELOPED A FORM FOR JURISDICTIONS TO USE TO SUBMIT
- 5 AN APPEAL THAT HIGHLIGHTS SOME OF THESE KEY REQUIREMENTS. A
- 6 SAMPLE OF THE FORM IS INCLUDED IN YOUR PACKET AS AN ATTACHMENT
- 7 TO THE DRAFT APPEALS PROCEDURES. THIS SLIDE SUMMARIZES THE
- 8 EXPERIENCES OTHER COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENT HAVE HAD WITH THE
- 9 APPEALS PROCESS FOR THIS RHNA CYCLE, AS WELL AS ABAG'S
- 10 EXPERIENCE IN THE LAST RHNA CYCLE. YOU CAN SEE THERE WAS A LOT
- 11 OF VARIATION IN THE NUMBER OF APPEALS RECEIVED AND AS A RESULT
- 12 THE AMOUNT OF TIME NEEDED TO CONDUCT THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR
- 13 CONSIDERING APPEALS. FOR HIGHLIGHTS, THE SACRAMENTO REGION,
- 14 LISTED AS SACOG RECEIVED ZERO APPEALS, SANDAG WHICH IS THE SAN
- 15 DIEGO REGION RECEIVED FOUR APPEALS AND PARTIALLY UPHELD ONE OF
- 16 THEM. LOS ANGELES REGION, SCAG, HAD 48 APPEALS AND UPHELD, IN
- 17 PART, TWO OF THOSE, AND THEN IN THE LAST CYCLE ABAG HAD EIGHT
- 18 APPEALS AND UPHELD THREE OF THEM. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. HOUSING
- 19 ELEMENT LAW IS PRESCRIPTIVE ABOUT THE STEPS IN THE APPEALS
- 20 PROCESS AND THE TIMING FOR COMPLETING THEM. BUT THERE ARE
- 21 SIGNIFICANT AREAS WHERE ABAG HAS DISCRETION. ONE OF THOSE
- 22 AREAS IS DETERMINING WHAT BODY WILL CONDUCT THE PUBLIC HEARING
- 23 TO CONSIDER THE APPEALS. STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE EXECUTIVE
- 24 BOARD DELEGATE AUTHORITY FOR FINAL DECISIONS ABOUT THE APPEALS
- 25 TO THE ABAG ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE. IN THE LAST RHNA CYCLE,





- 1 APPEALS WERE HEARD BY AN AD-HOC COMMITTEE OF THE EXECUTIVE
- 2 BOARD MEMBERS. HOWEVER USING THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE
- 3 LEVERAGES ONE OF ABAG'S CENTRAL COMMITTEES WITH BROAD
- 4 AUTHORITY AND AS AVOIDS THE NEED FOR ABAG BOARD MEMBERS TO
- 5 IDENTIFY A SITE OF APPEALS AND BECAUSE THE COMMITTEE IS A
- 6 MANAGEABLE SIDE WHILE ENSURING DIVERSITY. MOST COMMITTEE
- 7 MEMBERS HAVE SERVED ON THE HOUSING METHODOLOGY COMMITTEE OR
- 8 THE REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE AND ARE ALREADY FAMILIAR WITH
- 9 THE WORK TO DATE. LASTLY ALL DECISIONS MADE ON APPEALS BY THE
- 10 ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE WOULD BE FINAL AND NOT BE REVIEWED BY
- 11 THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD. GRANTS AUTHORITY TO THE
- 12 ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE FOR FINAL DECISIONS WOULD AVOID
- 13 POTENTIAL LEGAL ISSUES RELATED TO DUE PROCESS IF THE EXECUTIVE
- 14 BOARD HAD FINAL AUTHORITY AND DECIDED TO CHANGE AN
- 15 ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.
- 16 THE STATUTE SPECIFIES THAT THE APPEALS BE CONSIDERED IN A
- 17 SINGLE PUBLIC HEARING. HOWEVER IT'S POSSIBLE THAT ABAG COULD
- 18 RECEIVE ENOUGH APPEALS THAT THE HEARING WOULD NEED TO BE
- 19 CONTINUED OVER SEVERAL DAYS OF THE FOR THIS REASON STAFF
- 20 RECOMMEND THAT IS THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE CONSIDER THE
- 21 APPEALS FOR EACH JURISDICTION SEQUENTIALLY AND ISSUE A

- 20 VOTE ON THE APPEAL. I MENTIONED PREVIOUSLY THIS WOULD BE A
- 21 PRELIMINARY VOTE THAT WOULD THEN BE RATIFIED AT A COMMITTEE AT

- 23 SLIDE PLEASE. IF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE DECIDE IN FAVOR

- 1 THE REGION. HOUSING ELEMENT LAW STATES THAT IF THE ADJUSTMENTS
- 2 TOTAL 7% OR LESS OF THE REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS DETERMINATION
- 3 WHICH IS ABOUT 30,000 UNITS THEN ABAG WOULD DISTRIBUTE THE
- 4 ADJUSTMENTS PROPORTIONATELY TO ALL JURISDICTIONS. IF THE TOTAL
- 5 IS GREATER THAN 7% THE STATUTE ALLOWS ABAG TO DEVELOP ITS OWN

- 13 APPROACH IN A PREVIOUS RHNA CYCLE. APPLICANTS WHOSE APPEALS
- 14 ARE UPHELD WOULD NOT BE EXCLUDED FROM THE REDISTRIBUTION OF
- 15 UNITS. THIS ENSURES A JURISDICTION'S APPEAL OF RELATIVELY
- 16 SMALLER NUMBER OF UNITS IS NOT EXEMPT FROM TAKING
- 17 RESPONSIBILITY FOR ITS SHARE OF UNITS FROM OTHER APPEALS THAT
- 18 ARE UPHELD ALSO CONSISTENT TO THE STATUTORY LANGUAGE THAT
- 19 APPEALED UNITS SHOULD BE DISTRIBUTED TO ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.
- 20 LASTLY, IF THE FINAL DETERMINATION INCLUDED ADJUSTMENTS TO THE
- 21 ALLOCATION OF A JURISDICTION THAT WAS NOT SUBJECT OF THE
- 22 APPEAL, THESE ADJUSTMENTS MAY BE EXCLUDED FROM THE
- 23 ACCUMULATIVE TOTAL TO BE REALLOCATED PROPORTIONATELY TO ALL
- 24 JURISDICTIONS IN THE REGION. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO THAT

- 8 MEETINGS WITH THE EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE FOR MORE THAN
- 9 A YEAR AND THE FULL-BLOWN POLICY COUNCIL FOR OVER A YEAR. THE
- 10 RECOMMENDATION COMES WITH A LOT OF WORK BEHIND IT. CHANGING
- 11 THE NAME DOESN'T SOLVE THE PROBLEMS BUT IT PRESENTS A BETTER
- 12 SPACE WHEN REACHING OUT OF AND ALLOWS US TO DO MINOR
- 13 REBRANDING AS WE DO REACH OUT CHANGING THE NAME DOESN'T ALTER
- 14 ABILITY TO TARGET GEOGRAPHIC AREAS AS WELL AS BROAD BASED
- 15 EOUITY ISSUES. THE FRAMEWORK NEEDS TO BE RUN THROUGH AN

- 1 WORKING GROUPS TO HELP ALL OF THE 70 PLUS JURISDICTIONS IN THE


