24	AN ACTION ITEM. IT'S THE FINAL REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS



ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY AND DRAFT RHNA ALLOCATIONS. MS. ADAMS 1 2 WILL GIVE THE REPORT. GO AHEAD, PLEASE, MS. ADAMS. 3 GILLIAN ADAMS: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. IF WE COULD PULL UP THE 4 5 SLIDES, PLEASE? GOOD MORNING EVERYONE I'M GILLIAN ADAMS PROJECT MANAGER FOR THE REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS ALLOCATION AND 6 WE HAVE THE ADOPTION OF THE FINAL METHODOLOGY DRAFT 7 8 ALLOCATIONS THEN THAT WILL BE FOLLOWED BY THE APPEALS PROCESS THAT HAPPENS AFTER THE RELEASE OF THE DRAFT ALLOCATIONS. NEXT 9 SO, THIS SLIDE, HERE, HIGHLIGHTS THE MAJOR 10 SLIDE PLEASE. STEPS IN THE RHNA METHODOLOGY DEVELOPMENT PROCESS. AS YOU WILL 11 RECALL, THE EXECUTIVE BOARD APPROVED THE DRAFT METHODOLOGY IN 12 JANUARY AND IT WAS SUBMITTED TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF 13 HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR REVIEW IN FEBRUARY AS 14 15 REQUIRED BY LAW. IN APRIL HCD CONFIRMED THAT THE METHODOLOGY 16 FURTHERS THE RHNA OBJECTIVES. TODAY WE'RE ASKING RPC AND EXECUTIVE BOARD FOR APPROVAL OF THE FINAL METHODOLOGY DRAFT 17 ALLOCATIONS AT ITS MEETING OF MAY 2020. CONFIRMING THE DRAFT 18 METHODOLOGY IS INCLUDED IN YOUR PICTURE HIGHLIGHTED FINDINGS 19 INCLUDE THE FACT THAT METHODOLOGY LARGELY DISTRIBUTES MORE 20 21 THAN THEIR JOBS TRANSIT RESOURCES AND LEAD TO LONG-TERM IMPROVEMENTS TO LIFE OUTCOMES. HCD APPLAUDED THE SIGNIFICANT 22 WEIGHTING OF ACCESS TO HIGH OPPORTUNITY AREAS AS AN ADJUSTMENT 23 FACTOR AND THE INCLUSION OF THE EQUITY ADJUSTMENT IN THE DRAFT 24

METHODOLOGY. HCD ALSO COMMENDED ABAG FOR ITS ROBUST

- 6 MORTIFICATIONS THIS SLIDE PROVIDES AN OVERVIEW OF THE
- 7 COMPONENTS OF THE FINAL RHNA METHODOLOGY. THE PLAN IN YOUR
- 8 PACKET DETAILS DESCRIPTION OF THE FINAL METHODOLOGY AND THE
- 9 DRAFT RHNA ALLOCATIONS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO IN TERMS OF
- 10 NEXT STEPS, OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD WILL CONSIDER APPROVAL OF
- 11 THE FINAL RHNA METHODOLOGY AND DRAFT ALLOCATIONS AT ITS
- 12 MEETING ON MAY 20TH. THE RELEASE OF ALLOCATIONS INITIATES THE
- 13 APPEALS PHASE OF RHNA WHICH ABAG WILL CONDUCT OVER SUMMER AND
- 14 FALL FOLLOWED BY THE APPROVAL OF THE PLAN IN 2021. LOCAL
- 15 JURISDICTION HOUSING ELEMENTS ARE DUE TO HCD BY JANUARY OF
- 16 2023. THAT COMPLETES MY PRESENTATION, AND I AM HAPPY TO TAKE
- 17 ANY QUESTIONS.

SORRY. 4 [LAUGHTER] 5 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: THAT'S OKAY. 6 7 8 DIANE DILLON: I, ON BEHALF OF MY CAN'T AND MY CONSTITUENTS, AM GOING TO -- WITH GREAT APPRECIATION FOR ALL THE STAFF WORK 9 THAT'S GONE ON THIS NOT BE ABLE TO APPROVE THIS AND WILL BE 10 VOTING NO. I JUST -- I WANT FOLKS TO UNDERSTAND WHY AND WHAT'S 11 HAPPENING IN PLACES LIKE NAPA COUNTY. THE FORT OF BORT OF 12 FORESTRY IS IN THE PROCESS OF ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS WHICH 13 WILL TAKE HUNDREDS OF ACRES OF LAND OFF THE TABLE FOR HOME 14 15 BUILDING UNLESS YOU IMPROVE YOUR DRIVEWAY AND IF THE PUBLIC 16 ROAD TO YOUR DRIVEWAY IS NOT UP TO STANDARDS YOU HAVE TO PAY 17 TO IMPROVE THE PUBLIC ROADWAY. SO, WE HAVE MANY HILLY ROADS, LITTLE LANES, THAT ARE PUBLIC ROADS. AND NOT EVERYONE -- THERE 18 IS ALL KINDS OF REQUIREMENTS, IT'S A HALF MILE FROM QUARTER 19 ACCESS I CANNOT GO INTO ALL THE DETAILS WITH YOU. YOU WOULDN'T 20 21 WANT ME TO. BUT NOT ONLY PROSPECTIVELY WILL IT JUST MAKE IT PHYSICAL -- FINANCIALLY IMPOSSIBLE TO JUSTIFY BUILDING HOMES 22 IN THESE AREAS BECAUSE OF THE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS, WE ALSO HAVE 23 A HUGE DILEMMA WITH PEOPLE REBUILDING THEIR HOMES. 24 THEY HAVE

TO FIGURE OUT IF THEY'RE GOING TO USE SOME OF THEIR INSURANCE



- 1 TO PAY FOR THE NEW ROAD OR JUST TAKE THEIR INSURANCE AND GO
- 2 SOMEWHERE ELSE AND WE HAVE HAD THOUSANDS OVER THE LAST THREE
- 3 YEARS COME OFF THE BOOKS FROM FIRE. SO THIS IS ANOTHER THING.
- 4 IN ADDITION YOU'RE GOING TO BUY A HOUSE RIGHT NOW IT'S SUBJECT
- 5 TO THESE -- THESE RULES HAVEN'T BEEN ADOPTED BUT THEY'RE
- 6 MOVING FORWARD. YOU'RE NOT GOING TO BUY THAT HOUSE BECAUSE IF
- 7 YOUR HOUSE BURNS DOWN YOU ARE SUBJECT TO THE RULES IF YOU TRY
- 8 TO REBUILD IT. SO, YOU KNOW, PEOPLE ARE ALREADY TALKING ABOUT
- 9 TAKING THIS CASE [AUDIO DIFFICULTIES] [INDISCERNIBLE] WE'LL
- 10 SEE WHAT HAPPENS. BUT, WHEN WE DISCUSSED THIS, AND I BROUGHT
- 11 UP THIS BEFORE, IN THE RHNA COMMITTEE, WHEN WE DISCUSSED THIS
- 12 ISSUE OF AREAS, THEY'RE GOING TO COME OFF THE ROLLS, IT WAS,
- 13 MANY PEOPLE ON THIS COMMITTEE OR MANY PEOPLE COMMENTED AND
- 14 SAID THAT'S A LOCAL ISSUE. IT'S A ZONING ISSUE. IT'S NOT
- 15 FOLKS. IT'S DE FACTO THE STATE, VIA THE BOARD OF FORESTRY,
- 16 TAKING ALL THIS AREA OFF THE MAP. SO I JUST WANT PEOPLE TO
- 17 UNDERSTAND THAT. IT'S VERY CHALLENGING NOW FOR FIRE REBUILD.
- 18 THEY HAVE BUILT INTO THE RULES, AS THE DRAFT AND EXEMPTION, IF
- 19 YOUR HOUSE BURNS DOWN FROM A WILDLAND FIRE, SPECIFICALLY
- 20 BECAUSE OF PEOPLE IN BUTTE COUNTY WENT NUTS OVER THIS, IF YOUR
- 21 HOUSE BURNS DOWN BECAUSE YOU LEFT AN OILY RAG BY THE HEATER,
- 22 YOU'RE SUBJECT TO THESE RULES. THERE ARE 30 COUNTIES THAT HAVE
- 23 CHIMED IN OF FORESTRY. IT'S NOT JUST A NAPA ISSUE. PART OF THE
- 24 CITY OF CALISTOGA IS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSED RULES. I JUST



WANT PEOPLE TO UNDERSTAND WHAT IT'S LIKE OUT THERE ON THE 1 2 GROUND. THANK YOU. 3 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. AND I'M LOOKING AT SLIDE 4 5 FIVE. I'M ASSUMING THAT NAPA COUNTY AND OTHERS IN THE PREDICAMENT YOU'RE IN, AND THAT SEEMS TOO LIGHT OF A WORD, ARE 6 GOING TO BE APPEALING YOUR RHNA NUMBERS. 7 8 DIANE DILLON: YES, WE ARE. AND ALSO, BECAUSE OF THE HIGH 9 10 OPPORTUNITY AREAS. THE HIGH OPPORTUNITY AREAS, ON THE MAPPING, WERE EXACTLY THESE PLACES. THE HILLSIDES. YES. AND THE EQUITY 11 ISSUE, YES. THESE ARE WHERE THE MAJORITY OF PEOPLE WHO LIVE IN 12 THESE PLACES ARE, ARE WHITE, AND MIDDLE CLASS AND ABOVE. THERE 13 IS NO LOW-INCOME HOUSING IN MANY OF THESE HILLSIDE AREAS THAT 14 15 WERE IDENTIFIED AS HIGH OPPORTUNITY AREAS. SO IT'S JUST --16 THEY'RE NOT HIGH OPPORTUNITY AREAS, ANYWAY. WE HAVE A PLETHORA OF REASONS TO OPPOSE THIS. THANK YOU. 17 18 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. APPRECIATE THE 19 20 EXPLANATION. DO I HAVE ANY OTHER COMMENTS? YES. SUPERVISOR 21 BROWN. 22 MONICA BROWN: I APPRECIATE EVERYTHING DIANE IS GOING THROUGH. 23 SOLANO KIND OF TOUCHES NAPA. HERE'S MY CONCERN. WHAT HAPPENS 24

EXPLAINABLE TO ME. IT'S ASSEMBLY BILL -- OR SENATE BILL 35? I 1 CAN NEVER REMEMBER WHICH ONE IT IS. THAT SAID IF WE DON'T DO 2 IT, THEN THE DEVELOPERS GET TO IN. SO I'M JUST -- I'M JUST NOT 3 REAL CLEAR. SO IF SOMEONE COULD JUST EXPLAIN THAT TO ME. IF WE 4 5 DON'T DO IT -- BECAUSE I'M LOOKING AT THE NUMBERS OF SOLANO COUNTY, AND I SEE THE MAYOR FROM VALLEJO ON, I'M SURE ROBERT 6 WILL BE TALKING. OR LET ALONE BENICIA WHICH IS MY AREA, BEING 7 8 ABLE TO BUILD THERE IS, LIKE, NO LAND IN BENICIA MY CONCERN IS IF WE DON'T DO IT, THEN WHAT? WE LOSE LOCAL CONTROL? IT SOUND 9 10 LIKE I'M IN AN ALLEY WITH NO ESCAPE. IF SOMEONE COULD EXPLAIN THAT, PLEASE, BEFORE I VOTE. 11 12 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: OKAY IF MATT AND STAFF, AND GILLIAN, 13 YOU WILL BE TAKING THESE QUESTIONS DOWN, LET'S GO THROUGH ALL 14 15 THE QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS AND THEN CIRCLE BACK TO THAT. - 6 NUMBERS WITHIN ITS OWN AREA?

- 12 LITTLE BIT ON WHAT YOU MEAN BY "IT." IF YOU DON'T PASS A
- 13 HOUSING ELEMENT THAT'S CERTIFIED BY HCD IF YOU'RE LIKE I DON'T
- 14 WANT TO DO THE HOUSING PROCESS THEN YOU LOSE ACCESS TO GRANTS
- 15 AND YOU DO LOSE LOCAL LAND USE AUTHORITY IF THAT CASE IF YOU
- 16 DON'T HAVE A CERTIFIED HOUSING ELEMENT IF A DEVELOPER PROPOSES
- 17 A PROJECT THAT MEETS THE HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS, YOU
- 18 KNOW, BUILDING CODE, THEN THE CITY IS REQUIRED TO APPROVE IT,
- 19 IRRESPECTIVE OF WHAT THE GENERAL ZONING OR PLAN SAYS. THAT'S
- 20 IF YOU DON'T WANT HAVE A HOUSING ELEMENT THAT'S CERTIFIED. IF
- 21 YOU DO HAVE A HOUSING ELEMENT THAT'S CERTIFIED, IF YOU PLAN
- 22 FOR YOUR RHNA, THEN YOU'RE HOME FREE, ACTUALLY. YOU KNOW, IT'S
- 23 TRUE THAT IF THE HOUSING DOESN'T GET BUILT, THAT YOU BECOME

THANK 12 YOU. 13 14 15 KAREN MITCHOFF, CHAIR: THANK YOU. MELISSA I SAW YOU RAISING 16 YOUR HAND. 17 SPEAKER: MELISSA JONES, WITH THE COALITION BAY AREA PUBLIC 18 HEALTH DEPARTMENTS WE FOCUS ON IMPACT OF HEALTH DIFFERENT THAN 19 WHAT WE SEE IN THE DOCTOR'S OFFICE. WE HAVE BEEN IN AN 20 21 INCREDIBLE PRESSURE POINT ON HOUSING FOR A LONG TIME IN THE BAY AREA. AND THAT PRESSURE POINT HAS SEEN OUR HOMELESSNESS 22 INCREASE. IT HAS SEEN MORE AND MORE FAMILIES LIVING ON THE 23 EDGE OF WHAT IS AFFORDABLE. AND SO THE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT 24 25 METHODOLOGY, ABOUT FIGURING OUT WHAT KIND OF HOUSING WE NEED



- 1 FOR THE BAY AREA IS EXCEPTIONALLY IMPORTANT SO IN ADDITION

- 17 FOLLOWING THIS PROCESS, MANY OF OUR COMMUNITY LEADER IN THEIR
- 18 INDIVIDUAL COMMUNITIES WATCHING IT AND LOTS OF DISCUSSION AND
- 19 REALLY RECOGNIZED CONCERNS IN TERMS OF MARIN, SONOMA, SOLANO,
- 20 AND SONOMA COUNTY, NAPA, AND KNOWING THAT, KNOWING WHAT THE
- 21 ISSUES ARE, WE STILL FEEL, AND LOOKING AT THIS, THAT THIS WILL
- 22 -- THIS IS A GREAT PLAN, NOT PERFECT, BUT A GREAT WAY TO MOVE

JESSE? 5 6 JESSE ARREGUIN: THANK YOU MADAM CHAIR FOR GIVING ME ONE MORE 7 8 OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK. I'M GOING TO SPEAK AS THE PRESIDENT OF ABAG NOW. WE FACED A SIGNIFICANT SHORTAGE OF HOMES 19 PARTICULARLY HOMES FOR AFFORDABLE LOW, VERY LOW AND MODERATE 20 21 INCOME HOUSEHOLDS IN THE REGION AND WHAT WE'RE DOING WITH BAHFA IN THE BAY AREA FINANCING AUTHORITY HOPEFULLY THAT WILL 22 PROVIDE SIGNIFICANTLY MORE RESOURCES TO GOVERNMENTS TO SUPPORT 23 YOUR WORK AND BUILDING AFFORDABLE HOUSING TO MEET YOUR 24

19	WHICH THE [INDISCERNIBLE] COULD FOLLOW SUIT. THANK YOU.

1	THE PREVIOUS SPEAKER NOTED WE ARE CONCERNED BECAUSE THE BANE
2	BASELINE FOR RHNA AND THE PLANNED BAY AREA DEVELOPMENT PATTERN
3	AND LAST ROUND ADJUSTMENTS TO BAY AREA RESULTED IN AN
4	EXCEPTIONALLY HIGH CONCENTRATIONS IN HOUSING IN THE URBAN CORE
5	ESPECIALLY IN SAN FRANCISCO WE'RE CONCERNED ABOUT DISPLACEMENT
6	OF LOW INCOME COMMUNITIES OF COLOR WHICH WOULD WORK AGAINST
7	OUR GOALS ON FAIR HOUSING. WE DO SHARE THE GOALS OF USE LAND
8	USE PLANNING AND REDUCTION OF GREENHOUSE GAS AND WE KNOW
9	PUTTING HOUSING CLOSE TO TRANSIT IS NOT THE ONLY WAY GET TO



- 19 OF A JURISDICTION OR HCD APPEALS ANOTHER JURISDICTION'S
- 20 ALLOCATION IN THIS CASE THE PROCEDURES HAVE TO ALLOW FOR THE
- 21 SUBJECT OF THE APPEAL TO RESPOND TO THE INITIAL ARGUMENTS AND

- 4 METHODOLOGY FOR REDISTRIBUTING THE APPEALED UNITS TO OTHER
- 5 JURISDICTIONS IN THE REGION. HOUSING ELEMENT LAW STATES THAT
- 6 IF THE ADJUSTMENT'S TOTAL SEVEN% OR LESS OF THE REGIONAL
- 7 HOUSING NEED DETERMINATION WHICH WILL EQUAL ABOUT 30,000 UNITS
- 8 THEN ABAG WILL RECEIVE THE ADJUSTMENTS PROPORTIONATELY TO ALL
- 9 LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IF THE TOTAL IS GREATER THAN SEVEN% THE
- 10 STATUTE ALLOWS ABAG TO DEVELOP ITS OWN METHODOLOGY TO
- 11 DISTRIBUTE THE AMOUNT GREATER THAN SEVEN% TO LOCAL
- 12 GOVERNMENTS. STAFF RECOMMENDS USING THE SAME APPROACH FOR
