STILL REQUIRED FACE COVERINGS AND 24

SIGNAGE REQUIRING EMPLOYEES TO GET VACCINATED. THE FACE

- 15 ON THE HYBRID ENVIRONMENT FOR MTC AND THE RETURN AND
- 16 REFINEMENTS I GUESS THERE IS AN IMPORTANT ANALOGY FOR OUR
- 17 BOARD MEMBERS, ALSO TO HAVE THAT WOULD BE IN PLACE, BY

1 2 NICK ROETHEL: WE DID INSTALL EQUIPMENT SEVERAL YEARS AGO THAT 3 ALLOWS FULL HYBRID REMOTE MEETINGS FOR BOTH MAIN ROOMS, THE BOARD AND YERBA BUENA BUT THERE IS TWO MONITORS FOR EVERY TWO 4 5 BOARD MEMBERS IN THE BOARDROOM AND THE REASON IS ONE SIDE IS FOR VIDEO CONFERENCE IF SOMEONE IS SPEAKING REMOTELY YOU WILL 6 SEE THEIR FACE APPEAR RIGHT IN FRONT OF YOU AND THE OTHER 7 8 SCREEN IS FOR POWERPOINTS THAT'S BEING SHOWN AND IT'S DESIGNED FOR THE PURPOSE OF HYBRID MEETINGS.
