- 8 LEGISLATURE PROPOSED TO MAKE SIGNIFICANT ADDITIONAL

- 2 BAY AREA 2050 TO TRY TO ACHIEVE THOSE GOALS. SO THAT'S REALLY
- 3 ENCOURAGING. THERE IS PROBABLY, AT THIS POINT, 2,000 PAGES OF
- 4 LEGISLATIVE TEXT IN BOTH OF THESE SUBJECT AREAS, OR IN THE
- 5 SUBJECT AREA SO I'M NOT GOING TO DIG INTO ALL OF THAT WITH YOU
- 6 ON THIS MEETING FOR THE SECOND TIME. BUT DO YOU HAVE A LOT OF
- 7 MATERIALS BOTH IN YOUR PACKET AND THAT WILL BE FORTHCOMING
- 8 SUMMARIZING WHAT THE DIFFERENT PROPOSALS ARE AND HOW THEY
- 9 TRACK WITH MTC AND THE BAY AREA'S PRIORITIES. TOP LINE WHAT I
- 10 WOULD LIKE TO SHARE IS THAT, YOU KNOW, EVEN THOUGH WE ARE
- 11 REALLY ENCOURAGED BY THE STARTING POINT OF WHERE THESE BILLS
- 12 AND PROPOSALS ARE AT, THE DEVIL IS ALWAYS IN THE DETAILS. SO A
- 13 COUPLE OF THINGS TO CALL OUT ARE WHAT WE'RE SEEING ON THE
- 14 GROUND IS THAT ANY TRANSPORTATION PROPOSAL, WE WOULD EXPECT,
- 15 WE HAVE BEEN RUNNING THE NUMBERS, WE WOULD EXPECT TO BRING AN
- 16 INCREASE IN RESOURCES TO THE -- IN THE FLEXIBLE HIGHWAY MONEY
- 17 THAT MTC PROGRAMS THROUGH OBAG SO THAT IS A POSITIVE THING FOR
- 18 US. ANOTHER THING WE WOULD EXPECT TO SEE, AND THIS IS WHAT
- 19 WE'RE LOOKING AT ACTUALLY ON THE HOUSE SIDE, WE SAW THAT THE
- 20 HOUSE PROPOSED TO BRING A HUGE INFLUX IN RESOURCES TO TRANSIT,
- 21 AND IN PARTICULAR TO THOSE TYPES OF AREAS WHERE THERE IS HIGH
- 22 RIDERSHIP, A LOT OF TRANSIT FREQUENCY, BIG STATE OF GOOD
- 23 REPAIR NEEDS AND CAPITAL NEEDS FOR THE BAY AREA WHAT THAT
- 24 WOULD MEAN IS WE WOULD SEE AN 80% INCREASE IN ANNUAL FEDERAL
- 25 RESOURCES COMING TO THE BAY AREA, SO THAT WOULD BE HUGE. THE

- 2 POSITIVE STEP FORWARD FOR US IS, THERE ARE A LOT OF PROJECTS
- 3 IN PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 THAT ARE REALLY LARGE-SCALE PROJECTS
- 4 THAT WE WOULD HAVE TROUBLE FUNDING JUST ON OUR OWN TYPICALLY
- 5 WE LOOK TO THE FEDS TO HELP CLOSE FUNDING GAPS ON MULTI-
- 6 BILLION DOLLARS PROJECTS, THE FEDS ARE PROPOSING A NUMBER OF
- 7 DIFFERENT PROGRAMS INCLUDING THE CAPITAL INVESTMENT GRANT
- 8 PROGRAM THAT WE TYPICALLY USE TO FUND BIG TRANSIT PROJECTS BUT
- 9 LOOKING AT A NUMBER OF FEDERAL PROGRAMS THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE
- 10 TO POTENTIAL COMPETE FOR TO CLOSE THOSE FUNDING GAPS FOR MEGA
