MOVING TO ITEM FOUR 1 NOW TIME TO REOPEN CRITICAL FOR THE REGION THAT TRANSIT 2 3 OPERATORS FOCUS ON RECOVERY I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THIS MONTH'S FINAL REPORT TO THE COMMISSION ON THE HEALTHY TRANSIT PLAYING 4 5 DASHBOARD ACCOMPANYING LETTER FROM THE TRANSIT GENERAL MANAGERS, TRANSIT AGENCY TO HAVE ONE LOCATION TO PROVIDE 6 DETAILS AND COLLECTIVE COMMITMENT TO PROVIDE SAFE RELIABLE 7 8 PUBLIC TRANSIT TO THE BAY AREA. THE LETTER NOTES THAT EVEN AS THE STATE AND REGION SHIFTS TO RECOVERY, KEY MEASURES SUCH AS 9 10 MASK WEARING AND IMPROVING VENTILATION REMAIN IN PLACE AS APPROPRIATE. I APPRECIATE THE TRANSIT AGENCY'S COLLABORATION 11 ON THE HEALTHY PLAN. AS COMMISSIONERS ARE TALKING ABOUT THE 12 PLAN, I APPRECIATE THE OPERATORS COMMITMENT TO TRANSPARENCY 13 MAKING SURE THE PUBLIC KNEW THE MEASURES THAT WERE TAKEN INTO 14 15 PLACE. I WANT TO UNDERSCORE ALL OPERATORS, BIG AND SMALL. YOU 16 DEFINITELY STEPPED UP TO THE OCCASION. I WOULD LIKE TO REPORT ON THIS MONTH'S ANNOUNCEMENT, THE 2021 PULITZER PRIZE FOR 17 BREAKING NEWS PHOTOGRAPHY SHINED A LIGHT ON THE WORK DONE BY A 18 MEMBER OF THE EXTENDED MTC FAMILY WHEN NOAH BERGER WAS HONORED 19 AS PART OF PHOTOGRAPHY STAFF OF THE ASSOCIATED PRESS FOR A 20 21 COLLECTION OF PHOTOS FOR MULTIPLE U.S. CITIES THAT CAPTURED THE COUNTRY'S RESPONSE TO THE DEATH, LAST YEAR, OF GEORGE 22 FLOYD, IN MINNEAPOLIS. NOAH WAS FIRST ENGAGED TO MTC BACK IN 23 1999 -- COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ WAS STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL --24 WHEN HIS NAME WAS A STRINGER FOR THEN WHAT WAS THE OAKLAND 25

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TRIBUNE. OVER 22 YEARS, NOAH IS KNOWN FOR SHOOTING HUNDREDS OF 1 2 PHOTOS FOR US, AND ALSO KNOWN FOR RECOGNITION FOR HIS WORK 3 DOCUMENTING WILDFIRES IN THE BAY AREA AND ACROSS THE U.S. NOT ONE TO REST ON HIS LAURELS, NOAH IS ALREADY BACK AT WORK FOR 4 5 MTC CAPTURING IMAGES TO USE IN THE UPCOMING "BACK TO TRANSIT" CAMPAIGN. IT'S UNFORTUNATE THAT THE PULITIZER BOARD DID NOT 6 SEE FIT TO HONOR HIS PHOTOS OF THE COMMISSION. I WANT TO SAY 7 8 CONGRATULATIONS FROM ALL OF US AT MTC FOR THE AWARD-WINNING PHOTOGRAPHER, NOAH, WHO IS ATTENDING TODAY'S MEETING. 9 10 KIMBERLY, I BELIEVE THAT WE HAVE ONE PHOTO THAT WE WOULD LIKE TO DRAW UP. YEAH. I KNOW COMMISSIONER HAGGERTY, WHEREVER HE 11 IS, IN HIS FINER MOMENT. YOU AUTHORED THIS WONDERFUL PHOTO. 12 CONGRATULATIONS. ANY WORDS? 13 14 SPEAKER: THANKS FOR HIRING ME. MTC IS ONE OF MY FAVORITE 15 16 CORPORATE CLIENTS WORKING ON THE BAY BRIDGE WAS A HIGHLIGHT OF MY WORK. AND I WANT TO THANK BRENDA KAHN FOR BRINGING ME ON. 17 18 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: WE APPRECIATE YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS. JOB 19 20 WELL DONE. 21 22 SPEAKER: THANK YOU. 23 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: COMMISSIONER WORTH, I SEE YOUR HAND 24 RAISED. DO YOU WANT COMMENT ON THIS ITEM? 25

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2 AMY R. WORTH: YES. AM I UNMUTED? 3 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: YES. 4 5 AMY R. WORTH: GREAT. I WOULD LOVE TO, IF I COULD TAKE THE 6 LIBERTY AND COMMISSIONER SPERING MAY HAVE SOME GEMS TO ADD 7 8 TOO. I WANT TO SAY HOW PROUD WE ALL WERE WHEN WE GOT THE NOTICE ABOUT THE PULITZER PRIZE WINNING. IT'S SO HUGE IN 9 JOURNALISM AND PHOTOGRAPHY TO GET THAT AWARD. AND FOLLOWING 10 NOAH'S CAREER IT'S BEEN SO WELL DESERVED. IT TAKES A LOT OF 11 COURAGE TO TAKE THOSE PICTURES WHETHER IT'S ENGAGING WITH 12 INDIVIDUALS OR BEING OUT IN CHALLENGING SITUATIONS AND ONE OF 13 MY FAVORITE NOAH BERGER MEMORIES WAS WHEN THE TOWERS, BEHIND 14 ME, HERE ARE THE TOWERS, NOAH, HERE YOU GO. AND YOU SEE THAT 15 16 WATER NEXT TO THE TOWERS? WHEN WE INSTALLED THOSE TOWERS, IT WAS AN EXCITING TIME. THEY CAME OVER ON BARGES, THEY WERE 17 BROUGHT UP INDIVIDUALLY, LIKE A CRANE, I MEAN, LITERALLY 18 RAISED UP, AND NOAH, WHO HAD THIS NEW BABY, WAS OUT ON THE 19 20 WATER, LIKE A MOTOR BOAT, HIRED A SPEED BOAT, JUST ONE OF 21 THOSE REGULAR BOATS, TO GET THE CLOSE UP VIEWS OF THE BRIDGE, AND HE WAS STANDING UP ON THE SEAT, AND USING HIS FOOT TO 22 STEER THE BOAT, AND I JUST REALIZED, THIS MAN IS TREMENDOUSLY 23 COURAGEOUS, OR OTHER THINGS IN TERMS OF HIS WILLINGNESS TO DO 24 25 ANYTHING IT TAKES TO GET A PICTURE. AND, OVER THE DECADES, THE

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WORK, NOAH, THAT YOU HAVE DONE FOR MTC HAS JUST BEEN STUNNING. 1 REALLY, REALLY GORGEOUS, BEAUTIFUL WAYS THAT WE HAVE BEEN ABLE 2 3 TO CONVEY TO THE WORLD, THE WORK THAT THIS COMMISSION HAS DONE, IN TERMS OF TRANSPORTATION AND ALL ASPECTS. AND YOU 4 5 KNOW, JUST ON ANOTHER NOTE, YOUR WORK ON THE FIRES, REALLY, WERE SO POIGNANT AND BROUGHT HOME TO ALL OF US IN THE BAY 6 AREA, THE TREMENDOUS DEVASTATION THAT THAT CAUSED, AND THE 7 8 PERSONAL FACE, AND OF COURSE THAT WAS THE THING YOUR PULITZER WINNING PHOTOGRAPH WAS JUST INCREDIBLE. SO POIGNANT AND PART 9 10 OF THAT INCREDIBLE TEAM. I'M SO GLAD, MR. CHAIR, THAT WE HAD A CHANCE TO CELEBRATE NOAH TODAY. I AM GLAD HE WAS FREE. HIS 11 PHONE IS PROBABLY RINGING OFF THE HOOK NOW THAT YOU'RE WORLD 12 FAMOUS BUT YOU TELL THEM YOU GOT YOUR START AT MTC. 13 14 CONGRATULATIONS. 15 16 SPEAKER: IT'S ALWAYS NICE THAT WAS SUPER WARM WE COULD USE A BIG HUG WHEN WE SEE YOU. 17 18 AMY R. WORTH: I REMEMBER THE LITTLE BASS NET THE LAST TIME I 19 SAW THAT BABY. 20 21 22 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: COMMISSIONER SPERING? 23 JAMES P. SPERING: YOU HEART MESSAGE THROUGHOUT MTC PHOTOS, A 24 PICTURE IS WORTH A THOUSAND WORDS AND THE PHOTOGRAPHY THAT HE 25

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HAS DONE REALLY EXPLAINED WHAT WE WERE DOING, AND REALLY 1 DEMONSTRATED THE PROJECT THAT WE WERE DELIVERING, AND EVERY 2 3 PHOTO, JUST AWARD-WINNING, AND YOU FIGURE HOW THE HELL DID HE TAKE THIS PICTURE. GREAT WORK. SOMETHING WE'RE ALL PROUD OF. 4 5 MTC HAS ALWAYS RECOGNIZED FOR HOW TO PORTRAY WHAT WE'RE DOING IN THE BAY AREA THROUGHOUT WORK OF THE PHOTOGRAPHY OF NOAH. 6 SHOULD YOU BE PROUD OF WHAT YOU HAVE DONE, AND VERY REWARDING 7 8 BOTH TO THE COMMISSION AND TO YOURSELF. THANK YOU. 9 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, COMMISSIONER. THIS IS TOO MUCH PRAISE. I 10 HAVE GOT TO LET YOU GUYS GET ON TO RUNNING THINGS. THIS IS 11 REALLY SWEET. THANK YOU. I APPRECIATE THAT. 12 13 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: NOAH WE LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU IN 14 PERSON SO WE CAN CONTINUE TO SEE YOUR TALENTS SHINE AND 15 16 CONTINUE TO TELL THE STORY OF MTC. CONGRATULATIONS ON YOUR AWARD. WE'RE GOING TO MOVE ON TO OUR NEXT ITEM. ITEM FIVE, 17 POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL, RANDI KINMAN? 18 19

20 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. I NEEDED TO UNMUTE MYSELF. THANK YOU,
21 CHAIR PEDROZA, AND COMMISSION. THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL MET
22 JUNE 6TH AND FROM OUR BLUE RIBBON TRANSIT RECOVERY TASK FORCE
23 REPORT, THE COUNCIL WANTS TO ADD THEIR VOICES TO THE QUESTION
24 OF HOW IS THIS GOING TO PROCEED AFTER THE TASK FORCE IS
25 DISSOLVED. HOW CAN THE COUNCIL, IN PARTICULAR, REMAIN ENGAGED

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IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NEXT PHASE. AND, FRANKLY, THAT I 1 WANT TO SEE A STEERING COMMITTEE THAT LOOKS A LOT LIKE THE 2 3 EXISTING TASK FORCE. BECAUSE IT WAS A REALLY UNIQUE BLEND. OUR LEGISLATIVE PORTION OF THE MEETING INCLUDED A LOT OF 4 5 DISCUSSION AND OUESTIONS FOR STAFF, AND REQUESTS FOR FOLLOW UP. AND I WANTED TO GIVE A SHOUT OUT TO OUR LEG STAFF BECAUSE 6 OUR MEMBERS AREN'T AS FAMILIAR WITH THE SAUSAGE MAKING THAT IS 7 8 LEGISLATION DEVELOPMENT. SO THERE IS AN EDUCATIONAL PROCESS THAT BOTH GEORGIA AND REBECCA MAKE EASY TO UNDERSTAND. DURING 9 10 THE MAPPING AND WAYFINDING PROJECT DISCUSSION WITH STAFF, OUR BODY WAS CLEARED THAT THIS PROJECT REPRESENTS A CORNERSTONE OF 11 DEVELOPING REGIONAL TRANSIT DELIVERY. WE WANT THIS PROJECT TO 12 DELIVER NOT JUST STATIC WAYFINDING MAPS AND BRANDING, BUT ALSO 13 DELIVER THE NEWER TECHNOLOGY THAT ALLOWS PEOPLE TO ACCESS 14 15 REALTIME INFORMATION. WE WANT TO GROW OUR TRANSIT SYSTEM 16 RATHER THAN WATCH IT CONTINUE TO SHRINK AS IT WAS DOING DURING PREPANDEMIC. WE HAVE TO GIVE PEOPLE THE TOOLS TO ACCESS 17 INFORMATION THEY NEED TO ACTUALLY USE THE SYSTEM. THE LAST BIG 18 19 ITEM ON OUR AGENDA WAS THE DRAFT EIR OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050, AND I WANT TO COMMEND DAVE VAUTIN AND CREW FOR MAKING THESE 20 21 DISCUSSIONS FRUITFUL AND REALLY ENGAGING THE COUNCIL. AND NOW I'M GOING TO PUT MY CHAIR'S HAT ON, AND TALK TO YOU ABOUT THE 22 23 UPCOMING RECRUITMENT POLICY PROCESS FOR THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL HAVING BEEN THROUGH A NUMBER OF THESE PROCESSES, I 24 KNOW IT'S COMPLICATE AND WHILE I DON'T WANT TO MAKE IT ANY 25

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MORE DIFFICULT, I AND THE OTHER COUNCIL MEMBERS FEEL YOU NEED 1 TO HAVE MORE OF AN UNDERSTANDING IN THE BACKGROUND AS 2 3 RECRUITING MEMBERS OF OUR BODY THE POLICY TO STAFF AND ELECTED PHYSICIANS IN THE ORGANIZATION THE TIME THEY DEDICATE OVER A 4 5 FOUR YEAR APPOINTMENT OFF BOOKS IT REQUIRES NEGOTIATING WITH EMPLOYERS WORKING SCHEDULE AROUND MEETINGS. WE HAVE ALWAYS HAD 6 TROUBLE WITH REPRESENTATION AT THE OUTSKIRTS OF THE REGION 7 8 BECAUSE PEOPLE CANNOT TAKE TIME OFF TO ATTEND A TWO HOUR MEETING. WE HAVE ALWAYS EXPERIENCED TURNOVER, AND FOR SOME 9 IT'S A CHANGE IN JOB STATUS, FOR OTHERS IT'S BEEN THE 10 REALIZATION THAT A REGIONAL POLICY BOD IS DIFFERENT THAN 11 ORGANIZING TO PUT A STOP SIGN AT THE END OF YOUR BLOCK IT'S 12 THE CONFLICT BETWEEN WORKING FROM HOME WHETHER IT'S NEW 13 BABIES, DAYCARE OR EXTENDED COMMUTE TIMES. WE DON'T KNOW HOW 14 MANY PEOPLE NEVER APPLIED BECAUSE THEY CANNOT MAKE THE 15 16 MEETINGS WORK WITH THEIR LIVES. THE LAST YEAR AND A HALF, HOWEVER, CHANGED ALL THAT, OUR MEMBERSHIP INCREASED. WE ASKED 17 18 MEMBERS TO EXTEND THEIR TERMS FOR A YEAR TO SEE MULTIPLE PLANNING PROCESSES IN THE PANDEMIC. AND THEY SAID SURE. WE 19 ASKED THEM TO WORK 12 MONTHS INSTEAD OF THE USUAL 11, NO 20 PROBLEM. WE EXTENDED THE MEETINGS. PEOPLE ATTENDED MORE 21 22 MEETINGS OUTSIDE OUR MAIN MEETING WE DIDN'T HAVE TO WORRY 23 ABOUT TRAVELING ON SPARE THE AIR DAYS WE ADDED A NEW SUBCOMMITTEE TO FEED INTO THE FARE INTEGRATION TASK FORCE AND 24 EMPLOYED MEMBERS TO THE AD-HOC WORK ON WITH STAFF ON 25

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DEVELOPING THINGS LIBRARY THE PILOT PROGRAMS AND INTERNSHIP 1 PROGRAM. OUR EFFICIENCY GREW OUR MEMBERS WERE BETTER ENGAGE 2 3 SAID HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN UP FRONT POLICY WORK RATHER THAN WAITING FOR STAFF REPORTS. I HAVEN'T WORRIED ABOUT OUORUMS AND 4 5 LIKE ALL EXPERIENCE DURING THE IS SHUTDOWNS OUR PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT GREW. OUR 10 11 COMMITTEES MEET THE SAME TIMES YOURS DO WHICH IN THE PAST MEANT ANYBODY WHO WANTED TO PARTICIPATE IN OUR EOUITY AND 12 ACCESS DISCUSSIONS NEEDED TO TRAVEL TO BEALE STREET. THE LAST 13 TWO MONTHS COMMISSION MEETINGS HAVE RUN LONG REQUIRING THE 14 POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL TO DELAY AND CUT SHORT AGENDA ITEMS. 15 16 IF WE WANT TO DEVELOP A FULL THREADED EQUITY PLATFORM THEN PUBLIC PARTICIPATION WHETHER COUNCIL OR GENERAL PUBLIC NEEDS 17 TO BE ASSURED WITHOUT REOUIRING A PHYSICAL PRESENCE WE NEED TO 18 ABOUT PROACTIVE IN DEVELOPING A LONG-TERM STRATEGY FOR OUR 19 BODY TO CONTINUE TO MEET IN A FLEXIBLE MANNER. THE SUSPENSION 20 OF THE BROWN ACT ATTENDANCE RULES HAS BEEN A BOON TO OUR 21 22 ATTENDANCE AND EFFICIENCY WHILE INCREASING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION WE ASK THE LEG TEAM TO FOLLOW LEGISLATION IN 23 THIS AREA BUT WE ALSO WANT MTC TO TAKE A LEADERSHIP POSITION, 24 JUST AS MTC HAS TAKEN A LEADERSHIP POSITION IN OTHER EQUITY 25

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MATTERS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME, AND THAT CONCLUDES MY
 REPORT.

THERESA ROMMELL: IN TERMS OF TAKE-AWAY'S STAFF BELIEVES THAT DISCUSSIONS AT THE WORKSHOP REINFORCE ARP DISTRIBUTION GUIDING PRINCIPLES FUNDS SHOULD BE USED TO PROVIDE MEANS WITH WHICH TO IMPLEMENT SERVICE INCREASES TO ENSURE TRANSIT IS THERE ARE FOR

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RIDERS AND ALSO MECHANISM OF MULTIPLE TRANCHES OFFERING 1 DISTRIBUTION TO DEAL WITH REMAINING UNCERTAINTY ENSURING FUNDS 2 3 ARE PROVIDED FOR CUSTOMER DEMAND MAKE SURE FUNDS ARE USED AND SUSTAINED IN GROWTH SERVICE WHERE IT'S NEEDED MOST. SECONDLY 4 5 ONGOING UNCERTAINTY IN THE VARIABLE IMPACTS THE PANDEMIC HAS HAD ON OPERATORS IN THE REGION HIGHLIGHTED CONTINUED 6 IMPORTANCE OF NEEDS BASED FUNDING DISTRIBUTION FRAMEWORK. 7 8 TRYING TO ALIGN DISTRIBUTION OF ARP FUNDS TO BE PROPORTIONATE WITH THE LEVEL OF SERVICE PROVIDED BY OPERATORS IN A GIVEN 9 URBANIZED AREA CONFLICTS WITH FINANCIALLY SUSTAINING BAY AREA 10 11 OPERATORS IN THIS EMERGENCY-DRIVEN ENVIRONMENT. UNLIKE OUR NORMAL FEDERAL FORMULA TRANSIT FUNDING USED FOR MOSTLY STATE 12 OF GOOD REPAIR NEEDS, COVID RELIEF FUNDING WAS INTENDED TO 13 PROVIDE FINANCIAL RELIEF TO SUSTAIN PUBLIC TRANSIT AND RETAIN 14 OPERATOR JOBS IN THE NEAR-TERM AS A TOP PRIORITY. ARP 15 16 DISTRIBUTION POLICY SHOULD STRONGLY CONSIDER THIS INTENT. LASTLY, GIVEN SUPPORT EXPRESSED FOR USING A PORTION OF THE ARP 17 18 FUNDING TO IMPROVE THE CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE, THROUGH THE 19 ADVANCEMENT OF BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE INITIATIVES, STAFF RECOMMENDS TARGETING A PERCENTAGE OF OVERALL ARP FUNDS TO BE 20 SET-ASIDE FOR THESE INITIATIVES. AND I THINK 4 5 THE RECOMMENDATIONS, WE HAVE A BROAD, DIVERSE GROUP THAT'S ON THE COMMITTEE, UNANIMOUSLY SUPPORTED ON THESE INITIATIVES, AND 6 I REALLY THINK TO KEEP FAITH WITH ALL THE WORK THAT'S TAKING 7 8 PLACE IS MTC NEEDS TO INVEST IN THESE RECOMMENDATIONS. SO I REALLY WANT TO ENCOURAGE THE COMMISSION TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF 9 10 THIS OPPORTUNITY, FUND THESE INITIATIVES, AND THE RECOMMENDATIONS COMING OUT OF BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEE, AND 11 REALLY SHOW OUR COMMITMENT THAT CHANGE IS NEEDED. AND AS 12 TRANSIT RECOVERY COMES BACK BETTER. IN THE POLLS WE'RE CLEAR 13 14 ON WHAT THE RIDERS ARE LOOKING FOR HIGHER LEVEL OF COORDINATION, COOPERATION, WAYFINDING, ALL OF THE THINGS WE'RE 15 16 BRINGING FORWARD ARE SUPPORTED BY THE PUBLIC BY 80 TO 90% IN THESE POLLS IT'S NOT JUST MARGINAL SUPPORT IT'S SOLID SUPPORT 17 FOR THE CHANGER IN OPPORTUNITY AND WE REALLY NEED TO TAKE 18 ADVANTAGE. I ENCOURAGE THE COMMISSION TO SUPPORT THE 19 ALLOCATION FOR THE WORK THAT THE BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEE IS 20 21 DOING AND THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS. THANK YOU, MR. 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NUMBER ONE TALKS ABOUT THAT RELATIVE TO THE UZA DISCUSSION. 1 AND I APPRECIATE COMMISSIONER SPERING BRINGING THAT UP DURING 2 3 THE WORKSHOP, BUT, I GUESS, FOR ME, I FEEL THAT BRINGING FOLKS -- BRINGING AGENCIES BACK TO SERVICE LEVELS IS TOP PRIORITY, 4 5 AND SO, TO SOME EXTENT, I SEE A BIT OF A CONFLICT WITH THAT, AND PUTTING MONEY ASIDE FOR TASK FORCE WORK. WE HAVE BEEN REALLY CLEAR, ALL ALONG, THAT THE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF 3 THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE AND FUNDING THE RECOMMENDATIONS 4 5 THAT ARE COMING OUT OF THAT SUPPORT THE AGENCIES AND DON'T DETRACT FROM THE AGENCIES. THIS ALLOWS US TO BUILD ON THE 6 COORDINATED EFFORTS THAT AGENCIES ENTERED INTO DURING THE 7 8 EMERGENCY, AND TO BILL A BETTER INTEGRATED SYSTEM THAT SERVES EVERYBODY. ON WHAT'S BEEN INTERESTING IS TO SEE THE STATISTICS 9 COMING OUT THAT IF YOU DO A, YOUR RESULT IS B, C, AND D, WHICH 10 IS ALSO A CONTINUED GROWTH IN RIDERSHIP, BOTH LOCALLY AND 11 REGIONALLY. SO TO BUILD BACK BETTER AND TO CONTINUE TO GROW 12 RIDERSHIP ON ALL SYSTEMS, WE REALLY FEEL THAT THESE 13 INITIATIVES NEED TO BE FUNDED AND FULLY FUNDED. THANK YOU. 14 15 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: THERE ARE NO -- SORRY -- NO ADDITIONAL 16 SPEAKERS, MR. CHAIR. 17 18 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU KIMBERLY. BRINGING IT BACK 19 20 TO THE COMMISSION. COMMISSIONER WORTH? YOU'RE STILL MUTED, 21 COMMISSIONER. 22 AMY R. WORTH: THANK YOU, SIR. YOU KNOW, I WANT TO PICK UP ON 23 RANDY'S COMMENTS. FIRST OF ALL LOOKING AT THE COST, I THINK 24

25 IT'S ABSOLUTELY VITALLY IMPORTANT THAT WE PROVIDE THE FUNDING

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FOR OUR OPERATORS TO INCREASE SERVICE AS RIDERSHIP INCREASES. 1 AT THE SAME TIME, I THINK THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BLUE 2 3 RIBBON TASK FORCE HAVE THIS SIGNIFICANCE OPPORTUNITY TO INCREASE RIDERSHIP ON ALL OF OUR SYSTEMS. AND WHEN YOU LOOK AT 4 5 THE TRENDS, PRIOR TO THE COVID, WE WERE SEEING A LOT OF THE AGENCIES WERE SEEING, YOU KNOW, SHIFTS DOWNWARD IN TERMS OF 6 RIDERSHIP, AND I THINK OUR GOAL IS TO REALLY INCREASE THE 7 8 RIDERSHIP AND THE SERVICE TO RIDERS. AND SO I THINK, GIVEN WHAT THE, POTENTIALLY, WHAT THE ALLOCATION TO THE BLUE RIBBON 9 TASK FORCE WOULD CONTINUE TO LEAVE MOST ALL THE FUNDS FOR 10 DIRECT OPERATIONS. BUT I THINK THAT THESE EFFORTS ARE ALL 11 BEING DONE, TOO, IN CONCERT WITH THE AGENCIES, SO THIS 12 COOPERATIVE ELEMENT OF ALL OF THE TRANSIT AGENCIES WORKING 13 TOGETHER I THINK WILL BE BENEFICIAL AND WILL RESULT IN 14 IMPROVEMENTS TO SERVICE, FLEXIBILITY, AND IMPROVEMENT TO, IN 15 16 THE RIDERSHIP NUMBERS. SO I WOULD CONCUR WITH COMMISSIONER SPERING IN TERMS OF HIS COMMENTS EARLIER. 17 18 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER WORTH. 19 COMMISSIONER SPERING THEN COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ. 20

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22 JAMES P. SPERING: I CAN WAIT.

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24 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ? 25 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION Meeting Transcript

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CINDY CHAVEZ: THANK YOU. JUST A COUPLE OF OBSERVATIONS THEY 1 WOULD LIKE TO MAKE. ONE IS THAT, ON ITEM TWO, THIS MAINTAIN 2 3 NEEDS-BASED FRAMEWORK, I THINK THAT WE HAVE TO BALANCE THIS IDEA OF RETURN TO SOURCE TO THE WAY THAT EACH INSTITUTION IS 4 5 SITUATED, CURRENTLY, AND I THINK THAT IS SOMETHING YOU ALL HAVE ACKNOWLEDGED ESPECIALLY AS IT RELATES TO VERY SUBURBAN, 6 OR MORE SUBURBAN AREAS. IN FACT WE TOOK ACTIONS EARLIER THAT 7 8 REALLY ARE GOING TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO THEM. AND I THINK THAT'S THE RIGHT THING TO DO. I THINK THE CHALLENGE, THOUGH, 9 IS THAT SOME OF US ARE AT A CRITICAL POINT AS TO WHETHER OR 10 NOT WE'RE ABLE TO PROVIDE BASIC SERVICES TO THE REGIONS WE 11 REPRESENT. AND SO, I JUST WANT TO SAY, ON ITEM TWO, I DO HAVE 12 A CONCERN THAT WE DON'T CONFUSE THE DEBATE WE'RE HAVING OVER 13 RETURN TO SOURCE. ALTHOUGH THAT'S CERTAINLY A DEBATE I'M 14 15 WILLING TO HAVE, BUT ALSO BASED ON NEED. BECAUSE I DO THINK WE 16 HAVE TO BE THINKING ABOUT NEED IN A BALANCED WAY. AND THEN ON ITEM THREE, THIS IS REALLY MORE OF A QUESTION FOR STAFF. AS WE 17 LOOK AT THE ARP FUNDS FOR POTENTIALLY UNDERGIRDING THE 18 REGIONAL ACTIONS, ARE THERE OTHER FUNDS THAT ARE BEING 19 CONSIDERED, ALSO, THAT STAFF IS GOING TO BE RECOMMENDING? 20 21

THERESA ROMMELL: THIS IS THERESA. THERE IS NOT A SPECIFIC FUND SOURCE, YOU KNOW, IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE FOR BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE INITIATIVES. I THINK, AT THE TASK FORCE MEETING ON MONDAY, THERE WILL BE SOME DISCUSSION ABOUT WHAT WE COULD DO

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WITH EXISTING FUNDS OR WHAT POTENTIAL THERE IS COMING DOWN THE
 ROAD FOR EITHER A NEW INITIATIVE OR STATE AND FEDERAL
 BUDGETING. THAT'S ALL THAT THAT MEANT. WE DON'T HAVE ANYTHING
 SPECIFIC IN MINDS.

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CINDY CHAVEZ: ONE OF THE REASONS I WAS ASKING IS THAT, I KNOW 6 AT A STATE AND FEDERAL LEVEL, THAT ALL OF US ARE BUSY LOBBYING 7 8 TO GET MORE RESOURCES COMING DOWN FROM THOSE SOURCES AND I JUST DIDN'T KNOW IF WE KNOW ENOUGH ABOUT THE FRAMEWORK OF THE 9 STATE'S FINAL, WHERE THEY ARE IN THEIR PROCESS AND WHERE THE 10 FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS IN THEIR PROCESS, IN TERMS OF HOW 11 RULEMAKING MIGHT IMPACT FUNDS THAT ARE MORE AROUND INNOVATION, 12 OR THAT ACTUALLY ADDRESS THE VERY DIRECT NEEDS WE'RE TALKING 13 ABOUT AND RESOURCES THAT ARE GOING TO ADDRESS EQUITY. I 14 RECOGNIZE THIS IS A WORK IN PROGRESS. AND IN MY OPINION, IT 15 16 WOULD BE REALLY IMPORTANT FOR US TO BETTER UNDERSTAND WHAT OTHER POSSIBLE SOURCES THAT ARE -- THAT ARE ACTUALLY BUILT IN, 17 TO BE RESPONSIVE, NOT JUST TO COVID, BUT, REALLY, TO THE KEY 18 INITIATIVES THAT THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE IS ASKING FOR THE 19 BOARD TO INVEST IN. THANK YOU, COLLEAGUES. 20

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ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU CINDY. I SEE COMMISSIONER
JOSEFOWITZ, AND THEN COMMISSIONER AHN, AND THEN COMMISSIONER
SPERING.



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COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I THINK COMMISSIONER SPERING HAD HIS

2 HAND UP BEFORE ME. 3 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: DO YOU WANT TO GO, COMMISSIONER 4 5 SPERING? 6 JAMES P. SPERING: YEAH, I K. WHAT I WAS GOING TO SAY IS, YOU 7 8 KNOW, IN THE ALLOCATION FOR THE BLUE RIBBON, ONE OF THE INITIATIVES IS BUS PRIORITY. IF WE CAN GET THOSE BUSES OUT OF 9 10 CONGESTION, THAT IS PROBABLY ONE OF THE BIGGEST IMPROVEMENTS WE CAN DO FOR TRANSIT. AND THAT'S PART OF THIS INITIATIVE. BUT 11 I WANT TO REMIND EVERYONE, YOU KNOW, THE COMMISSIONERS HAVE 12 BEEN AROUND FOR SOMETIME, AND SOME WILL KNOW THIS STORY. THIS 13 IS VERY SIMILAR TO CLIPPER. MOST OF THE TRANSIT OPERATORS 14 15 OPPOSED US GOING FORWARD WITH CLIPPER AND MTC HAD THE COURAGE 16 AND FORESIGHT TO MOVE FORWARD WITH THAT INITIATIVE AND I DON'T KNOW OF ANY ONE THING THAT HAS MADE THIS SYSTEM MORE SEAMLESS 17 AND THAT IS CLIPPER. THIS IS ONE CATEGORY THAT THE COMMISSION 18 HAS TO SEE THINGS AS THEY CAN BE, NOT AS THEY ARE TODAY. WE 19 CAN'T JUST SOLVE THE PROBLEMS THAT WE'RE FACED WITH TODAY. WE 20 21 HAVE GOT TO GET INITIATIVES FORWARD THAT WILL MAKE THIS SYSTEM BETTER AND THE BLUE RIBBON RECOMMENDATIONS DOES THAT. AND I 22 JUST HOPE THAT THE COMMISSIONERS CAN SEE IT IN THAT LIGHT. 23

24 THESE ARE INITIATIVES THAT HAVE TO TAKE PLACE TO MAKE TRANSIT



BETTER, AND THE PUBLIC IS DEMANDING IT. SO THOSE ARE MY
 COMMENTS, MR. CHAIRMAN.

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ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER SPERING.
5 COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ, AND THEN COMMISSIONER AHN?

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COM. NICK JOSEFOWITZ: I KNEW IT WAS A GOOD IDEA TO LET 7 8 COMMISSIONER SPERING GO FIRST. I WAS GOING TO SAY A LOT OF WHAT HE WAS SAYING. ESPECIALLY WHEN IT COMES TO TRANSIT 9 10 PRIORITY, BUSES STUCK IN TRAFFIC, NO MATTER HOW MANY BUSES YOU HAVE STUCK IN TRAFFIC THEY'RE STILL GOING TO BE STUCK IN 11 TRAFFIC THEY'RE NOT GOING TO BE GETTING PEOPLE WHERE THEY NEED 12 TO GO AND THEY'RE NOT GOING TO BE A GOOD OPTION FOR PEOPLE TO 13 PROACTIVELY OPT INTO IF THEY HAVE OTHER OPTIONS. THE BLUE 14 15 RIBBON TASK FORCE PRIORITIZES GETTING BUSES OUT OF TRAFFIC AND 16 THAT IS ESSENTIAL TO -- TO SORT OF TRANSIT RECOVERY FOR ALL 17 AGENCIES. AND I ALSO WANT TO COMMENT BEYOND THAT. I THINK, KIND OF, THE PRINCIPLE THAT IS, KIND OF, THE, WHAT WE ARE, 18 SORT OF LOOKING AT, WITH REGARD TO THE KIND OF DISTRIBUTION OF 19 ARP FUNDS FOCUSED ON ENSURING ADEOUATE SUPPORT CENTERING 20 21 AROUND THE NEEDS OF DEPENDENT RIDERS. WE CAN ALWAYS GET CAUGHT UP IN POLITICAL BOUNDARIES, AND WHERE THE DOLLARS FALL ON 22 WHICH SIDE OF WHICH ARBITRARY POLITICAL BOUNDARY, BUT I THINK 23 ULTIMATELY, OUR JOB HERE IS TO TRY AND KIND OF MAKE SURE THAT 24 25 THOSE WHO ARE MOST RE-LIONEL ON TRANSIT, WHO ARE MOST



DEPENDENT ON IT FOR THEIR LIVES AND LIVELIHOODS ARE KIND OF 1 2 BEING PRIORITIZED IN OUR FUNDING ALLOCATIONS. 3 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ. 4 5 COMMISSIONER AHN? 6 EDDIE AHN: BRIEFLY BUILDING ON WHAT COMMISSIONER JOSEFOWITZ 7 8 TALKED ABOUT, I WANT TO EMPHASIZE MY OWN SUPPORT FOR A NEEDS BASED FRAMEWORK THIS WAS ESTABLISHED IN THE PRINCIPLES TO 9 ENSURE WE'RE PROGRAMMATIC TO FINANCIAL NEEDS I THINK OUR STAFF 10 11 IS ON THE RIGHT TRACK IN THAT REGARD AND I ALSO APPRECIATED COMMISSIONER SPERING'S EARLIER COMMENTS ABOUT MAKING SURE WE 12 CAN LEVERAGE, PERHAPS IS THE BEST WORD FOR IT, THE BEST 13 RESULTS FROM THE BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEE. SO LOOKING FORWARD TO 14 15 SUPPORTING THOSE EFFORTS, AS WELL. 16 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU COMMISSIONER AHN. 17 18 AND WE CAN ALWAYS APPRECIATE COMMISSIONER SPERING FOR GIVING HIS INSTITUTIONAL HISTORIC POINT OF VIEW. IT'S SO NEEDED IN 19 THESE POINTS IN TIME. I APPRECIATE ALL THE COMMENTS 20 21 COMMISSIONER ABE-KOGA AND COMMISSIONER CHAVEZ COMPLETELY 22 UNDERSTAND THOSE ARE FAIR COMMENTS AND CONCERNS TO MAKE AND WE NEED TO INCORPORATE THAT BUT THIS IS A MOMENT ABOUT NOT GOING 23 BACK TO WHERE WE WERE BUT GOING A PLACE WHERE WE WANT TO BE 24 AND WE CAN ALL POINT TO THOSE TRANSIT SYSTEMS IN OTHER PARTS 25

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OF THE WORLD AND STATES, THE FUNCTION FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE 1 USERS. THESE INITIATIVES ARE BOLD AND ARE FOR THE BENEFIT OF 2 3 OUR USERS AND OPERATORS, BUT IT'S MAKING THOSE TOUGH DECISION AND I THINK THESE ARE THE TOUGH DECISIONS THAT SOME DAY 4 5 SOMEONE WILL LOOK BACK AND SAY THAT WAS A DEFINING MOMENT WHERE WE CHOSE TO CHANGE THE REGIONAL MAKE UP OF OUR TRANSIT 6 SYSTEM. APPROXIMATE THIS IS AN EXCITING TIME FOR US. WE'RE 7 8 GOING TO BE HAVING A WORKSHOP IN A COUPLE OF MONTHS OR A MONTH WHERE WE'RE GOING TO HAVE IN DEPTH CONVERSATIONS ABOUT WHAT IT 9 MEANS. THANK YOU COMMISSIONERS FOR ALL YOUR THOUGHTFUL INPUTS. 10 AT THIS TIME, SEEING NO OTHER COMMISSIONERS RAISING THEIR 11 HANDS. THERESA THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRESENTATION, AND TO THE 12 BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEE THANK YOU FOR YOUR INCREDIBLE WORK, AND 13 TO OUR STAFF. WE'RE MOVING TO ITEM 11 PUBLIC COMMENT. I WILL 14 15 ASK THE CLERK TO READ ITEMS RECEIVED UNDER PUBLIC COMMENT 16 ASSOCIATED WITH THIS ITEM, PUBLIC COMMENT AT INFO AT BAY AREA METRO.GO. I WOULD ASK ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC IF YOU HAVE 17 PUBLIC COMMENT AT THIS TIME. KIMBERLY. 18

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20 CLERK, KIMBERLY WARD: I SEE ALETA DUPREE.

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22 SPEAKER: CHAIR PEDROZA AND MEMBERS, ALETA DUPREE, FOR THE 23 RECORD, SHE AND HER. THIS IS ABOUT PEOPLE, AND I FOUND OUT 24 ABOUT MTC THROUGH CLIPPER PROMOTIONAL MATERIAL. I GOT MY 25 CLIPPER CARD ABOUT TEN OR 11 YEARS AGO, AND I MAINTAIN THE

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IMPORTANCE OF BUILDING TOWARDS SYSTEMS OF TRANSIT THAT RUN 1 100% ON CLIPPER. AND WE MUST NEVER UNDERESTIMATE THE ABILITY 2 3 OF EQUITY COMMUNITIES TO FULLY PARTICIPATE. AND THERE ARE POWERFUL INTERESTS THAT ARGUE AGAINST THAT, BECAUSE THERE ARE 4 5 POWERFUL INTERESTS THAT WANT TO HOLD PEOPLE BACK. I, CERTAINLY, WOULD NOT WANT TO BE HELD BACK, AND I DON'T THINK 6 ANYBODY SHOULD BE HELD BACK. SO I ASK, AS I KNOW YOU TO BE A 7 8 FORWARD THINKING BODY, TO CONTINUE YOUR STRONG ADVOCACY IN IMPRESSING UPON THE AGENCIES THAT OPERATE TRANSIT TO PUSH 9 TOWARDS SYSTEMS THAT OPERATE 100% ON CLIPPER, AND CLIPPER 10 START. BECAUSE, THE IDEA, THIS HALLMARK OF FULL 11 PARTICIPATION. AND, SO, MTC HAS ALWAYS BEEN THERE FOR ME. 12 THESE PROGRAMS HELP ME WHETHER IT BE CLIPPER, OR BATA OR BEING 13 ABLE TO RIDE BUSES ON THE BRIDGE. SO, I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO 14 15 JULY, WHEN WE PROGRAM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN MONEY. AND I ASK THAT, IN YOUR PRINCIPLES, TO REMEMBER THE IMPORTANCE OF 16 REWARDING GOOD STEWARDSHIP. THANK YOU. 17
