- 20 INVESTMENTS AND OPERATIONS. IN AUGUST, MTC AND THE TRANSIT
- 21 OPERATORS WILL FULFILL ONE OF OUR KEY RECOVERY GOALS BY
- 22 RUNNING A FULLY MESSAGE TESTED COMMUNICATIONS TAMP AN IN. IN
- 23 YOUR PACKET THERE IS MORE INFORMATION ON THIS AND WE HOPE THIS
- 24 IS GOING BRING PEOPLE BACK TO TRANSIT AND I THINK IT'S GOING
- 25 TO BE A VERY POSITIVE MESSAGE FOR THE REGION. AS WE TACKLE OUR





- 1 TASK FORCE GOALS, THAT RELATE TO THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TRANSIT
- 2 NETWORK, WE REACHED AGREEMENT ON THE BAY AREA'S KEY
- 3 TRANSPORTATION PROBLEMS AND ARE PRIMED TO ANSWER OPTIONS
- 4 BETTER COMING OUT OF COVID. WE'RE ACCELERATING DELIVERY ON
- 5 ONGOING CUSTOMER FOCUSED INITIATIVES. I'M CONFIDENT THAT WE
- 6 ARE IN POSITION TO REACH NUMEROUS AGREEMENT TODAY ON A SET OF
- 7 SPECIFIC NEAR-TERM ACTIONS THAT WILL BUILD MOMENTUM TOWARDS
- 8 THE TRANSFORMATIONAL OUTCOME. THAT'S THAT 27 ITEMS YOU HAVE
- 9 SEEN ON THAT SPREADSHEET. GREAT WORK DONE BY OUR STAFF. AS
- 10 THIS COMMITTEE'S WORK ENDS THE ACTION BEGINS. AND IF YOU WILL
- 11 ALLOW ME A PERCENTAGE REFLECTION, I THINK THE TASK FORCE
- 12 TRIGGERED A NEED OF REVIEW OF COMMISSIONERS OF MTC'S EXISTING
- 13 AUTHORITY. I BELIEVE, I ALSO SPEAK FOR CHAIR PEDROZA THAT WHEN
- 14 I SAY THIS REVIEW WILL SERVE OUR COMMISSION, AND I THINK IT
- 15 WILL SERVE OUR COMMISSION WELL. MTC NEEDS TO SYNC UP THE
- 16 AUTHORITY IT HAS WITH THE INITIATIVES THIS COMMITTEE IS
- 17 BRINGING FORWARD. AND I HOPE YOU ARE AS PROUD OF -- AS PROUD
- 18 AS I AM OF THE STRIDES THAT WE'RE TAKING TO IMPROVE OUR
- 19 TRANSIT SYSTEM, AND THAT YOU ARE AS COMMITTED AS I AM TO THE
- 20 NEXT STAGES OF THIS WORK. AS WE CALL ON MTC TO MOVE FORWARD
- 21 WITH THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT BUSINESS CASE, AND ADVISORY TO
- 22 SUPPORT IT WHICH WE'LL DISCUSS IN ITEM FIVE IN TODAY AGENDA.
- 23 AT THIS POINT I WOULD LIKE TO INVITE OUR STATE REPRESENTATIVE
- 24 ASSEMBLYMEMBER DAVID CHIU AND SECRETARY KIM TO SHARE THEIR
- 25 WORK ON THE TASK FORCE, AND WHAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE COME





- 1 OUT OF OUR WORK TODAY. AND FIRST, ASSEMBLYMEMBER CHU HAS BEEN
- 2 A GREAT PARTNER AND ADVOCATE OF THIS COMMITTEE. COMMENTS FROM
- 3 YOU TODAY?

- 5 DAVID CHIU: THANK YOU, MR. CHAIR. MY COMMENTS ARE GOING TO
- 6 COME IN THE CATEGORY OF TWO THINGS. HUGE THANKS AND
- 7 ENDORSEMENT OF WHERE WE ARE. LET ME START WITH THANKS FOR OUR
- 8 FEARLESS LEADER THANK YOU COMMISSIONER SPERING FOR YOUR WORK
- 9 IN PURSUIT OF THESE COMMON GOALS. WE ALL WONDERED WHERE IT WAS
- 10 GOING TO GO. IT'S BEEN A DIFFICULT TASK. WE KNOW THAT WE HAVE
- 11 MANY COMPETING OBJECTIVES AND MILESTONES THAT WE NEED TO HIT.
- 12 BUT JIM, YOU HAVE DONE AN INCREDIBLE JOB OF HELPING TO BALANCE
- 13 HUGE DIVERSITY PERSPECTIVES AND MOVING US FORWARD. AND I'M
- 14 PERSONALLY GRATEFUL TO YOU FOR DEDICATING SO MUCH TIME AND
- 15 ENERGY AND I THINK ON SPEAK ON BEHALF OF ALL OF US FOR BEING
- 16 GRATEFUL THAT YOU ARE AT OUR HELM. I WANT TO THANK EACH AND
- 17 EVERY MEMBER OF THIS TASK FORCE, AS WELL, WHEN I INTRODUCED
- 18 OUR BILL A FEW YEARS AGO ON SEAMLESS TRANSIT, I DON'T THINK WE
- 19 HAD ANY SENSE OF JUST HOW SIGNIFICANT THE CONVERSATION WOULD
- 20 BECOME. AND THEN COVID HIT, AND THEN EVERYTHING ABOUT PUBLIC
- 21 TRANSIT AND COMMUTE PATTERNS AND PEOPLE'S LIVES GOT COMPLETELY
- 22 UPENDED. AND THIS TASK FORCE REALLY STEPPED IN TO NOT JUST
- 23 HELP TO KICK START A TRANSIT REFORM CONVERSATION, AND A
- 24 TRANSIT IMPROVEMENT CONVERSATION, BUT ALSO, TO CHART A PATH
- 25 FOR HOW WE'RE GOING TO RECOVER. AND I KNOW, YOU KNOW, WE ALL





- 1 KNOW THIS CONVERSATION IS NOT YET OVER, BUT EVERY PERSON ON
- 2 THIS BODY HAS BURDEN SO COMMITTED TO RESTORING TRANSIT AND
- 3 MAKING IT BETTER THAN IT WAS BEFORE COVID HIT. AND I JUST WANT
- 4 TO SAY ON MY OWN PERSONAL BEHALF, THANK YOU ALL FOR INVESTING
- 5 SO MUCH TIME, YOUR ENERGY, THOUGHTS, AND YOUR SPIRIT AND
- 6 COLLABORATION THAT HAS BEEN PART OF THIS. AND THIS GETS TO MY
- 7 ENDORSEMENT PART OF THIS I'M EXCITED FOR THE PART OF OUR
- 8 REPORT OF THE CONSULTANT TEAM. I AM PLEASED AT HOW THOROUGH
- 9 AND HIGH QUALITY THE ASSESSMENTS HAVE BEEN. I BELIEVE WE'RE
- 10 HEAD INTO A STRONGER POSITION IN THE BUSINESS CASE AND I FEEL
- 11 WE'LL BE ABLE TO HAVE A SET OF CREATION CRITERIA TO TACKLE
- 12 WHAT KIND OF NETWORK WE WANT TO SEE IN THE BAY AREA AND I AM
- 13 EXCITED ABOUT THAT. WE'RE GOING TO HAVE PRESENTATIONS TODAY
- 14 ABOUT CONCRETE NEXT STEPS AND ACTION ITEMS TO TAKE TO KEEP THE
- 15 MOMENTUM GOING I HAVE EVERY CONFIDENCE THESE ITEMS WILL BE
- 16 ACCOMPLISHED AND I WANT TO STATE FOR THE RECORD THEY BELIEVE
- 17 THE TRANSPORTATION ACTION PLAN IS A DOCUMENT WE SHOULD ALL BE
- 18 EXTREMELY PROUD OF. IT REFLECTS A YEARS' WORTH OF ACTIVE
- 19 ASSESSMENTS AND DELIBERATIONS BY ALL OF US ABOUT THE
- 20 CHALLENGES WE FACE AND AREAS TO FOCUS ABOUT HOW TO SERVE
- 21 RIDERS FIRST. I HAVE BEEN HONORED TO BE PART OF THIS BODY I
- 22 LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUE TO BE INVOLVED WHERE IT MAKES SENSE
- 23 HOWEVER I CAN HELP, AND LOOK FORWARD TO ALL THE WORK WE'RE
- 24 GOING TO DO TOGETHER. THIS IS THE GROUP THAT WILL MAKE IT
- 25 HAPPEN IN THE COMING MONTHS AND YEARS, AND IT'S BEEN AN HONOR





- 1 TO BE PART OF IT AND I KNOW WE'RE GOING TO KEEP WORKING
- 2 TOGETHER. LOOKING FORWARD TO BEING PART OF THAT RIDE. BACK TO
- 3 YOU, JIM.

- 6 THE KIND WORDS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP WE'RE LOOKING
- 7 FORWARD TO THAT IN THE FUTURE. SECRETARY KIM? COMMENTS?

- 9 DAVID KIM: I WOULD LIKE TO ECHO ASSEMBLY MEMBER CHIU'S
- 10 COMMENTS ON YOUR INCREDIBLE LEADERSHIP BRINGING US ALL
- 11 TOGETHER THESE PAST 14 OR 15 MONTHS, TO HAVE THE GROUP TACKLE
- 12 THESE IMPORTANT ISSUES. THANK YOU FOR YOUR GREAT LEADERSHIP
- 13 AND THANK YOU TO YOU AND OTHERS FOR INVITING ME TO BE A PART
- 14 OF THE TASK FORCE IT'S BEEN AN HONOR TO JOIN YOU IN THIS
- 15 EFFORT, AND I REALLY ADMIRE ALL THE GOOD WORK ALL OF YOU HAVE
- 16 DONE OVER THESE PAST 14 MONTHS TO TACKLE THESE ISSUES, AND
- 17 CHART A PATH FORWARD. I AM IN THE MIDDLE OF READING A BOOK ON
- 18 THE HISTORY OF BART WHICH I AM SURE MANY OF YOU HAVE READ,
- 19 EVERY BART EMPLOYEE AND MEMBER HAS READ T WHAT A FASCINATING
- 20 STORY. AND I AM STRUCK BY THE SEEMINGLY IMPOSSIBLE CHALLENGES
- 21 BART FACED IN THE EARLY DAYS WHEN THE SYSTEM WAS UNDER
- 22 CONSTRUCTION IN THE 1960S. SO MUCH CRITICISM, SO MUCH
- 23 CONTROVERSY, SO MANY NAYSAYERS WHO ARE ABSOLUTELY CONVINCED
- 24 THE SYSTEM WOULD NEVER GET COMPLETED BUT OF COURSE IT DID AND
- 25 IT'S HARD TO IMAGINE THE BAY AREA WITHOUT BART SO I THINK WE





- 1 CAN ADD A CHAPTER TO THAT BOOK AND TALK ABOUT WHAT THIS GROUP
- 2 DID TO LAY THE GROUNDWORK FOR A TRANSFORMATIONAL CHANGE IN
- 3 TERMS OF HOW TRANSIT IS OPERATED IN THE BAY AREA. BECAUSE I
- 4 THINK WE CAN LOOK BACK A DECADE OR TWO FROM NOW AND SAY IT WAS
- 5 THIS GROUP HERE THAT GOT THE BALL ROLLING FOR BAY AREA TRANSIT
- 6 TO RECOVER ECONOMICALLY AND TO TRANSFORM THE SYSTEM. AS A WAY
- 7 TO BEAT THE HEAT IN SACRAMENTO, THIS WAS JULY 4TH WEEKEND, I
- 8 SPEND THE DAY IN SAN FRANCISCO. I TOOK BART I WAS ABLE TO RIDE
- 9 ONE OF YOUR RAIL CARS IT WAS EXCELLENT. GREAT TO SEE RIDERSHIP
- 10 GO BACK UP. DENNIS, I WALKED ACROSS THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGES, I
- 11 HAVE DONE IT MANY TIMES IT'S ALWAYS A THRILL ESPECIALLY WHEN
- 12 IT'S 50 DEGREES COOLER THAN IN SACRAMENTO. IT WAS A GREAT DAY
- 13 THANKS TO ALL MADE POSSIBLE BY TRANSIT. AND THE GROUP
- 14 BENEFITTED FROM THE ACTIVE PARTICIPATION AND PASSION OF
- 15 ASSEMBLYMEMBER CHU YOUR VOICE AND LEADERSHIP HAVE SHARPENED

- 23 IN THE JUNE SESSION. IN THE JUNE SESSION WE PRESENTED TWO
- 24 CHOICES. THE FIRST CHOICE, AND OUR CHOICE FOR WHAT WE CALL
- 25 CHOICE FRAMEWORK IS WHAT WE THINK IS THE MOST SALIENT AND





- 1 IMPORTANT CHOICE YOU NEED TO MAKE IS BETWEEN MANAGEMENT AND
- 2 MANAGER OPTIONS. IF YOU LOOK AT FIGURE TWO ON PAGE FOUR OF THE
- 3 REPORT YOU WILL SEE HIGHLIGHT OF CONTINUUM OF NETWORK
- 4 RESPONSIBILITIES AND THAT CONTAINS FROM WAY FINDING TO RAIL
- 5 AND EVERYTHING IN BETWEEN. THE EASIER NETWORK MANAGEMENT
- 6 RESPONSIBILITIES CAN BE ACHIEVED THROUGH EXISTING STRUCTURES,
- 7 AND THE HARDER ONES REQUIRE MORE -- RAIL INCLUDES TASK FORCE
- 8 MANAGEMENT AND THAT REQUIRES AUTHORITY BECAUSE OF ISSUES. AND
- 9 WERE SOME IN TEEN BUS TRANSIT PRIORITY AND FARES AT A
- 10 PROGRAMMATIC LEVEL ARE CHALLENGING BUT THERE MAY BE INDIVIDUAL
- 11 COMPONENTS THAT ARE EASIER TO DO UNDER ONE STRUCTURE. EASY
- 12 ENOUGH TO DO UNDER ONE STRUCTURE THAN THE OTHERS. THE
- 13 MANAGEMENT LIFT WHAT WE WANT TO DO IN THE LEGISLATION AND
- 14 ORGANIZATION STRUCTURES THE MANAGER REPRESENTS A BIGGER
- 15 IMPLEMENTATION IN TERMS OF LEGISLATIVE THEMES REQUIRES A LOT
- 16 MORE EFFORT BUT THAT IS TO DELIVER MORE SINGULAR AUTHORITY
- 17 THAT CAN DELIVER ON THE MORE CHALLENGING NETWORK MANAGEMENT
- 18 RESPONSIBILITIES. THROUGH OUR WORK WE HAVE SEEN TWO BASIC
- 19 CHOICES ONE IS TO UNDERTAKE THAT WITH THE MTC FAMILY AND
- 20 ORGANIZATION OF POLICY OVERSIGHT AND THE OTHER IS TO CREATE AN
- 21 INDEPENDENT ORGANIZATION, OR INDEPENDENT POLICY OVERSIGHT
- 22 ASIDE THE MTC AND THE PURPOSE OF THAT IS TO SPECIALIZE IN THE
- 23 FUNCTION ON THAT SCALE. ONE CHANGE WE MADE FROM THE FRAMEWORK
- 24 IS THE MANAGEMENT OF TWO TRANSIT ALTERNATIVES YOU REMEMBER THE
- 25 BROADER COUNCIL COMPOSITION COUNCIL AND OPERATOR, WE





- 1 GOVERNANCE WORK FOCUSING ON CLARIFYING DOMAINS OF
- 2 ACCOUNTABILITY AND WHAT WE A SET FROM OPERATOR ONE IS MINIMUM
- 3 CAPABILITY TO ACHIEVE SOME OF THE TOUGHER NETWORK MANAGEMENT
- 4 RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER PRIORITIZATION FUNDING, AND FEE
- 5 CALCULATION BECAUSE THERE WAS NOT A NETWORK POLICY WHAT WE
- 6 HAVE DONE IS TO MERGE THOSE TWO MANAGEMENT MODELS INTO ONE
- 7 FRAMEWORK. ONE BROAD SET OF MODELS AND, TO HAVE AN OPERATOR
- 8 BASED COUNCIL WHO BRINGS THE OPERATOR KNOW HOW AND EXPERTISE
- 9 AS ONE MODEL FOR PROVIDING NETWORK MANAGEMENT OVERSIGHT AND
- 10 THE OTHER BEING BROADER THAT BRINGS INTO IT REGIONAL DECISION
- 11 MAKING WE ALIGNED BOTH OPTIONS UNDER THE ASSUMPTION THAT BOTH
- 12 WOULD HAVE A REGIONAL BODY ACCOUNTABLE THAT THEY REFER TO. WE

- 1 OPERATORS WE BELIEVE THAT AT THIS LEVEL OF ANALYSIS THESE ARE
- 2 THE KEY ONES TO COVER. THROUGH OUR ANALYSIS HAVE DECIDED TO
- 3 DEFINE WHAT WE THINK ARE A HANDFUL OF KEY AND DECISION
- 4 RELEVANT CRITERIA THAT SHOULD DRIVE THE ESSENTIAL CHOICES AND
- 5 FIRST AROUND EXTENT. SHOULD IT BE MANAGEMENT OR MANAGER WITHIN
- 6 THE ACHIEVEMENT OF NETWORK MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES. THE

- 11 THE EVALUATIVE CRITERIA AROUND THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE MANDATE
- 12 OF THE ORGANIZATION IS ENABLED THROUGH THE AUTHORITIES THAT
- 13 ARE POSSIBLE AND FINALLY WHETHER IT'S POLITICALLY SUPPORTABLE.
- 14 THOSE ARE THE KEY ONES. AN IMPORTANT FOOTNOTE FOR US IS AROUND
- 15 FINANCIAL RELATED MATTERS. YOU SEE THOSE NESTED IN THREE
- 16 DIFFERENT LOCATIONS FIRST IS UNDER SYSTEM OUTCOMES WE'RE
- 17 LOOKING AT THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT OPTION
- 18 CAN REALLY SUPPORT THE GENERATION OF NEW FUNDING TO AND
- 19 UNDERTAKE THAT ADVOCACY TO GENERATE THE FUNDING TO MOTIVATE
- 20 PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR SYSTEM EXPANSION. ON THE ASSUMPTION THAT
- 21 THOSE MORE ADVANCED NETWORK MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES ARE

- 2 COVERING READINESS IS GETTING OFF THE GROUND, HOW EASY IS IT
- 3 FUNDABLE OR IS THERE EXISTING ORGANIZATION TO RESOURCE IN THE
- 4 NEAR-TERM. NEXT SLIDE. WHAT WE WOULD LIKE TO DO IN THIS IS
- 5 JUST OUICKLY RUN THROUGH AT AN OVERVIEW LEVEL THE KEY
- 6 PARAMETERS OF THE ASSESSMENT AND THE KEY FINDINGS. AND JUST IN
- 7 TERMS OF OUR ASSESSMENT MODELING REFLECTING ON WHAT I JUST
- 8 SPOKE ABOUT WHAT WE'RE ASSESSING IS THE END STATES. WE HAVE

- 15 HEARD OF THE NEAR-TERM PRIORITIES, OUR BELIEF IS THAT UNDER

- 18 STEVE KINSEY: YEAH, BUT AS THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SAID, IT'S
- 19 GOING TO BE USEFUL TO HAVE THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS FINAL FORM AND
- 20 CREATE SOME OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL PARTIES THAT ARE INTERESTED TO
- 21 HAVE A FURTHER DISCUSSION ABOUT THE IMPLICATIONS OF IT SO THIS
- 22 IS BY NO MEANS A ONE TIME OPPORTUNITY. AND WITH THAT, I THINK
- 23 CHAIR SPERING, IF YOU WANT TO TAKE COMMENTS, THIS WOULD BE THE
- 24 TIME TO SORT OF MANAGE THOSE WHO WOULD WISH TO SPEAK.
- 25 COMMITTEE MEMBERS RAISE YOUR HANDS. THANK YOU THERESE FOR





- 1 CLARIFYING. IT'S ADJUSTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS THAT ARE COMING
- 2 FORWARD TO THE MTC OR ADVISORY COMMITTEE YOU'RE GOING TO HAVE
- 3 OPPORTUNITY TO LOOK AT ALL OPTIONS WITH THESE CONSIDERATIONS.
- 4 COMMITTEE MEMBERS, IF YOU WANT TO RAISE YOUR HAND. WALLY, I
- 5 DON'T SEE ANY HANDS RAISED. IAN GRIFFITHS. GO AHEAD.

- 7 IAN GRIFFITHS: THANK YOU FOR THE EXCELLENT ANALYSIS. AND I IS
- 8 SUPPORT. BRINGING TOGETHER OPTIONS 1 AND 2 MAKES SENSE TO ME.
- 9 I AGREE WITH THAT AND THINKING OF IT THAT WAY HELPS TO MAKE
- 10 THOSE SIMILAR CONCEPTS EASIER TO UNDERSTAND. MY MAIN COMMENT
- 11 ON THIS IS I SORT OF DON'T QUITE UNDERSTAND THE DIFFERENCES
- 12 SHOWING UP BETWEEN OPTIONS 3 AND 4, WITH RESPECT TO THE
- 13 EVALUATION. I MORE OR LESS AGREE WITH THE DISTINCTIONS BETWEEN
- 14 DRAWING BETWEEN NETWORK MANAGEMENT OPTIONS AND RELATIVE
- 15 ADVANTAGES OF 3 AND 4. BUT, I THINK ONE OF THE CRITERIA THAT'S
- 16 LISTED WHERE THREE IS SIGNIFICANTLY LESS STRONG THAN FOUR IS,
- 17 IS FINANCIAL COST EFFECTIVENESS, AND THE DISCUSSION IS, YOU
- 18 KNOW, IMPLYING IT'S A WHOLE SUITE OF NET NEW STAFF EVEN
- 19 THOUGH, YOU KNOW, I DON'T QUITE SEE WHY THAT'S A NECESSARY
- 20 OUTCOME UNDER THREE BUT NOT FOUR WHEN IN REALITY IN 3 AND 4,
- 21 YOU'RE GOING TO BE REPURPOSING SOME NUMBER OF STAFF FROM
- 22 EXISTING AGENCIES, YOU KNOW, AND THEY MAY RESIDE WITHIN MTC OR
- 23 OUTSIDE MTC BUT I'M NOT UNDERSTANDING WHY THREE REQUIRES
- 24 SIGNIFICANTLY MORE RESOURCES THAN FOUR. AND I ALSO THINK THAT
- 25 THREE DOESN'T FULLY -- IT'S DISCUSSED IN THE TEXT THAT A



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- 1 VARIANT OF THREE WOULD BE AN OPERATOR LED NETWORK MANAGER. SO
- 2 AN EXISTING OPERATOR OR PERHAPS MERGER OF REGIONAL OPERATOR,
- 3 BECOME INSTITUTE NETWORK MANAGER IS ONE OF THE POSSIBLE
- 4 VARIANTS OF OPTION THREE. AND THAT'S SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT
- 5 FROM A STANDALONE ENTITY THAT'S NOT -- THAT'S LIKE A 28TH
- 6 ORGANIZATION IN THE BAY AREA. SO I DON'T KNOW IF THAT
- 7 JUSTIFIES SPLITTING APART OPTION A INTO 3A, AND 3B FOR A
- 8 DIFFERENT EVALUATION COMING OUT SLIGHTLY DIFFERENTLY ON THOSE
- 9 OR IT REQUIRES MORE NUANCE IN THE EVALUATION. MAYBE THERE IS A
- 10 RANGE OF POSSIBLE CIRCLES ON THAT DEPENDING ON THE RANGE THE
- 11 VARIANT. AND THE IDEA OF HAVING AN OPERATOR LED NETWORK
- 12 MANAGER THAT BOTH MANAGES THE NETWORK AND OPERATES THE
- 13 REGIONAL SYSTEM ITSELF IS ON ADAPTABILITY WHERE, I THINK THERE
- 14 IS THE POTENTIAL THAT AS PURPOSE BUILT NETWORK MANAGER, THAT
- 15 IS ALSO AN OPERATOR COULD BE HIGHLY ADAPTABLE AND THAT IT'S
- 16 MAKING POLICY DECISIONS ABLE TO IMPLEMENT THEM IMMEDIATELY ON

- 20 CIRCLE ON ADAPTABILITY, OPTION FOUR IS TAKING ON SO MANY
- 21 FUNCTIONS, OPTION FOUR MIGHT BE LESS ADAPTABLE THAN A PURPOSE
- 22 DRIVEN THREE. THOSE ARE MY COMMENTS. THANK YOU FOR THE GREAT
- 23 ANALYSIS.

- 2 COMMENT?

- 4 ADINA LEVIN: ADINA LEVIN SPEAKING ON BEHALF OF RANDI KINMAN OF

- 9 WALLY CHARLES, CLERK: THANK YOU. NEXT RICHARD HEDGES. PLEASE
- 10 SPEAK. HEDGES.

- 12 SPEAKER: THIS HAS BEEN QUITE AN UNDERTAKING. FOUR IS THE BEST
- 13 BUSINESS CASE FOR A REGIONAL MANAGER AND BEST AT CREATING
- 14 REGIONAL MANAGEMENT THAT REALLY WORKS TO MANAGE ALL OF OUR
- 15 FACILITIES REGIONALLY. I WAS INTRIGUED BY JIM WUNDERMAN'S
- 16 SUGGESTION OF THREE AND A HALF. I'M NOT WHETTED TO FOUR,
- 17 OBVIOUSLY, BUT INTERESTED IN HAS IDEA. I WILL SAY THIS,
- 18 WHATEVER SYSTEM WE HAVE HAS TO TAKE STRONG INTEREST IN
- 19 REGIONAL ISSUES BUT NOT DELVE INTO THE LOCAL ISSUES FOR LOCAL
- 20 TRANSIT ORGANIZATIONS. I THINK THAT WOULD BE A BIG MISTAKE
- 21 BOTH POLITICALLY AND MANAGEMENT-WISE, AND I'LL SAY, FINALLY,
- 22 IN CONCLUSION, THAT IT'S GOT TO BE A SYSTEM THAT TAKES ALL OF
- 23 OUR ASSETS INTO CONSIDERATION. LET ME GIVE AN EXAMPLE. I USED
- 24 TO USE 511 TO FIND A WAY TO REGIONAL TRANSIT AND IT WOULD TELL
- 25 ME TO WALK HALF A MILE TO THE BART STATION WHICH IS ABOUT 25





- 1 MILES FROM MY HOUSE AND TAKE IT AROUND THE HORN TO SAN
- 2 FRANCISCO TO GET INTO SAN FRANCISCO. I STUMBLED ACROSS
- 3 COMMUTE.ORG YEARS AGO WHICH TOLD ME TO WALK ACROSS THE STREET

- 7 EXCITING TO HEAR SECRETARY KIM ANNOUNCE HIS DEDICATION TO THIS

- 9 INSTITUTIONAL COMMITMENT IN MODIFICATION TO THESE, THERE IS A

- 19 COMMUNITY SERVING ROUTE SCHEDULES AND SERVICES THOSE ARE
- 20 REALLY IMPORTANT ALONG WITH HOW THE HUBS FUNCTION WITHIN A
- 21 CONNECTED NETWORK DURING THE COURSE OF YOUR TASK FORCE YOU SAW
- 22 AN OUTSTANDING PRESENTATION FROM SONOMA COUNTY ABOUT WORK THEY
- 23 HAVE BEEN DOING TO INTEGRATE SERVICES AMONG SOME OF THEIR
- 24 SMALLER OPERATORS AND YOUR ACTION PLAN INCLUDES PROVIDING
- 25 FINANCIAL INCENTIVES TO BOTH SOLANO AND SONOMA WHERE THEY HAVE





- 1 A NUMBER OF OPERATORS WITHIN THEIR COUNTY TO HELP THEM
- 2 INTEGRATE THOSE OVER THE NEXT PERIOD OF TIME. THIS ALSO

- 23 AS WELL AS YOUR OWN COMMENTS GIVEN THE LIMITED TIME THAT WE
- 24 HAD TO WORK ON THE SPECIFIC ACTIONS AS A TASK FORCE, THE
- 25 INFORMATION WE RECEIVED FROM OTHERS WHO HAVE BEEN FOLLOWING





- 1 THE PROCESS AND CONTRIBUTING, HAS CAUSED US TO ADD SOME
- 2 ADDITIONAL ACTIONS TO THIS. ONE IMPORTANT THING TO NOTE IS
