- 16 OUICKLY SHARE IS WE ALL GOT TO SEE THE END PRODUCT OF THESE
- 17 MEETINGS BUT THERE WAS SO MUCH WORK THAT COMMISSIONER SPERING
- 18 DID, LEADING UP TO THESE MEETINGS, TO MAKE SURE THAT WE WERE
- 19 FOCUSED, DISCIPLINED, AND EVERYONE WAS PARTICIPATING. AND
- 20 REALLY GOING ABOVE AND BEYOND TO MAKE SURE THAT EVERYONE WAS
- 21 INCLUDED AND ENGAGED. SO COMMISSIONER SPERING, I WANT TO THANK
- 22 YOU FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP. YOU ALWAYS GET THESE ACCOLADES, AND

- 4 MOMENT TO JUST ACKNOWLEDGE ALL THE PARTICIPANTS FROM THE
- 5 OPERATORS TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO STAKEHOLDERS TO OUR
- 6 STAFF, WE DID A GREAT JOB LANDING THIS PLANE, BUT THERE IS SO
- 7 MUCH ROADWAY FOR US TO GO FORWARD, AND WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE
- 8 TO BE BOLD AND GET UNCOMFORTABLE. I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT THE
- 9 STEPS WE HAVE A LOT TO DO WE'RE GOING TO BE TRANSPARENT AND
- 10 INCLUSIVE STARTING WITH THE ACTION PLAN THAT IS GOING TO GET
- 11 PRESENTED TO THE COMMISSION IN SEPTEMBER. SO THAT ACTION PLAN
- 12 WILL GET PRESENTED TO THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS FOLLOWED BY ALSO
- 13 TALKING ABOUT THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT BUSINESS CASE ADVISORY
- 14 GROUP THAT WE'RE GOING TO BE ESTABLISHING. WE HAD SOME
- 15 DISCUSSIONS AT THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE, AROUND THIS
- 16 ADVISORY GROUP LOOKING AT THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT, EXCLUSIVELY
- 17 THE BUSINESS CASE. THAT IS GOING TO BE TALKED ABOUT AT THE
- 18 COMMISSION MEETING IN SEPTEMBER. AND LOOKING AT THE
- 19 COMPOSITION THAT WE REALLY SPENT TIME BEING REALLY THOUGHTFUL
- 20 OF WHO IS GOING TO BE SERVING ON THAT AND MORE FOCUSED ON THE
- 21 NETWORK MANAGEMENT SIDE, TECHNICAL ASPECT OF IT AND IN OCTOBER
- 22 I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO THE COMMISSION WORKSHOP THAT WE TALKED
- 23 ABOUT WE'RE GOING TO BE HAVING, THE TRANSFORMATION OF THE
- 24 ACTION PLAN ACCELERATED OUTCOMES ON TO ACHIEVE WHEN WE TALK
- 25 ABOUT THE FARE INTEGRATION AND NOT JUST TALKING ABOUT THAT,

- 2 WILL TALK ABOUT THAT WE WANT TO SEE THOSE ACTIONS WE WANT TO
- 3 SEE AND THAT MIGHT LEAD TO ADDITIONAL ADVISORY GROUPS OR
- 4 TECHNICAL GROUPS GETTING CREATED, WANT TO BE INCLUSIVE, WANT
- 5 TO MOVE QUICK AND NIMBLY TOWARDS THOSE OUTCOMES I WANT TO
- 6 ASSURE THE PUBLIC, THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN PARTICIPATING IN THE
- 7 COMMITTEE THERE IS SO MUCH WORK WE WANT TO DO AND THIS IS AN
- 8 INCREDIBLE OPPORTUNITY FOR OUR REGION TO TRANSFORM OUR SYSTEMS
- 9 ACKNOWLEDGING THAT THERE ARE LOTS OF THINGS TO WORK OUT AND SO
- 10 MUCH MORE WE CAN DO. THERE HAS BEEN A LOT OF DISCUSSION IN
- 11 SACRAMENTO AROUND TRANSPORTATION AND I HAVE ASKED STAFF TO
- 12 BRING AN UPDATE TO THIS COMMISSION WHICH WE TALKED ABOUT UNDER
- 13 LEGISLATIVE ITEM 11 A MY GOAL IS DISCUSSION AND COMMUNICATION
- 14 TO THE DELEGATION REINFORCE THE MISSION FOR KEEPING HIGH SPEED
- 15 RAIL ON TRACK AND ALSO TO PLANNED BAY AREA THERE ARE MULTIPLE
- 16 PROJECTS THAT STILL REMAIN A PRIORITY AND THAT WE LOOK AT
- 17 THOSE PROJECTS, BEING ELIGIBLE FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDING AS

- 9 PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AND THIS IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO TRY TO WRAP
- 10 THINGS UP. AND OF COURSE, INVITE ALL OF YOU AND OTHERS TO
- 11 PARTICIPATE IN THAT. EFFECTIVE JULY 1ST, 2021, THE BAIFA
- 12 EXPRESS LANES CENTER INTEGRATED ALAMEDA EXPRESS LANES
- 13 OPERATIONS ON 580 NOW OUR DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS PROVIDES
- 14 EXPRESS LANES ON I 580 AND 680 IN ALAMEDA COUNTY IN ADDITION
- 15 TO THE LANES ON I-880 AND I 680 IN CONTRA COSTA. TRY TO SAY
- 16 THAT REALLY FAST. WE EXPECT TO HAVE EFFICIENCIES AND
- 17 STREAMLININGS COMING OUT OF THIS COORDINATED OPERATIONS. I
- 18 WANT TO FLAG THAT FOR YOU. AS WELL AS WORK ON PLANNED BAY AREA
