- 4 TOLL SYSTEM INTEGRATOR TO DELIVER AN EXPRESS LANE ON
- 5 INTERSTATE 880 IN SOLANO BETWEEN FAIRFIELD AND VACAVILLE AND
- 6 SECOND TO EXTEND THE OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE CONTRACT ON A
- 7 SOLE SOURCE BASIS. NEXT PAGE. BEFORE I GET INTO THE
- 8 PARTICULARS, I WOULD LIKE TO GIVE BACKGROUND REGARDING THE
- 9 EXPRESS LANE PROJECT IN JUNE 2014 BAIFA APPROVED STAFF'S
- 10 RECOMMENDATION TO AWARD EXPRESS LANE TOLL COLLECTION SYSTEM TO
- 11 TRANSPORT ON EXPRESS LANES INTERSTATE 680 AND 880 AND 80
- 12 CONTRACT WITH TRANSPORT LATER THAT YEAR ORIGINALLY EXECUTED
- 13 CONTRACT STRUCTURED WITH ONE YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION OPTIONS
- 14 THAT WOULD HAVE EXERCISED TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT THROUGH JUNE
- 15 2024. HAD THE CORRIDORS BEEN COMPLETED BY 2017, 2024 WOULD
- 16 HAVE COINCIDED WITH THE END OF USEFUL LIFE OF THE EQUIPMENT
- 17 WHICH IS TYPICALLY CONSIDERED BETWEEN 6 AND 8 YEARS.
- 18 DEPLOYMENT WAS DELAYED WITH ALAMEDA 880 IN 2020, AND NORTHERN
- 19 SEGMENT CONTRA COSTA 680 IN 2021, AND SOLANO 80 EXPECTED TO
- 20 OPEN IN LATE 2024, 7101 WAS ADDED LATER AND EXPECTED TO OPEN
- 21 COMPLETELY IN 2022. A FEW WRENCHES THROWN OUR WAY. ONE SUCH
- 22 WRENCH CALTRANS MEDIAN BARRIER REPLACEMENT PROJECT BETWEEN
- 23 OAKLAND AND FREMONT THAT OCCURRED AROUND THE SAME TIME AS OUR
- 24 PROJECT. WE WORKED WITH CALTRANS TO INCORPORATE PART OF OUR
- 25 INSTALLATION WORK WITH THEIR PROJECT, WHICH CAUSED SOME DELAY





- 1 BUT NOT SIGNIFICANT AS THE DELAY HAD WE WAITED FOR CALTRANS TO
- 2 FINISH BEFORE BEGINNING OUR WORK. A LOT OF 80 WAS PUT ON HOLD
- 3 IN 2018 DUE TO LACK OF FUNDING. A FEW MONTHS AGO, SOLANO 80
- 4 WAS REVIVED. HAD THE ORIGINAL CORRIDORS BEEN COMPLETED BY
- 5 2017, 2024 WOULD HAVE COINCIDED WITH THE END OF USEFUL LIFE OF
- 6 THE TOLL EQUIPMENT. AS YOU CAN SEE BASED ON THE CHART, WITH
- 7 THAT CONTRACT EXTENSION BAIFA WOULD HAVE NO OR LIMITED SERVICE
- 8 WITH THE SYSTEM AT MIDPOINT OF THEIR USEFUL LIVES. NEXT PAGE
- 9 PLEASE. THIS CHART ASSUMES A SIX YEAR USEFUL LIFE COMMON IN
- 10 THE TOLLING INDUSTRY. AT THE END OF THE EQUIPMENT'S USEFUL
- 11 LIFE THAT DOESN'T MEAN WE NEED TO REPLACE THEM RIGHT AWAY BUT
- 12 IT PRESENTS AN INFLECTION POINT WHICH WE COULD SPEND MORE ON
- 13 REPAIRS OR REPLACEMENT. SO, FOR 680 AT THE END OF 2023; 880,
- 14 2026; 680 NORTH 2027; US 101, 2028; AND 180 COMMENCEMENT LATE
- 15 IN 2024 WOULD NEED TO BE REPLACED AROUND 2030 OR '31. NEXT
- 16 PAGE PLEASE. SO IN THE PREVIOUS SLIDE, I HAD MENTIONED THAT
- 17 THE SOLANO 80 PROJECT WAS REVIVED A FEW MONTHS AGO SOLANO WAS
- 18 PART OF THE ORIGINAL PROCUREMENT AND CONTRACT SCOPE HOWEVER
- 19 PUT ON HOLD DUE TO FUNDING OR LACK THEREOF. RECENTLY SOLANO
- 20 TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, STA WAS SUCCESSFUL THIS OBTAINING
- 21 SENATE BILL OR SB1 FUNDING TO PARTIALLY PAY FOR THE SOLANO
- 22 PROJECT. SO BASED ON THAT STS CHARGING FULL-STEAM AHEAD. BAIFA
- 23 SUCCESSFULLY FOUND ADDITIONAL FUNDING OVER THE REMAINING GAP
- 24 THEY'RE WORKING TOGETHER WITH STA TO DELIVER THE SOLANO
- 25 PROJECT. PROJECTED DELIVER DATE END OF 2024. AND BAIFA IS





- 1 COMMITTED TO THAT DELIVER DATE. STAFF HAS BEEN ENGAGING WITH
- 2 TRANSCORE TO NEGOTIATE COST FOR THIS PROJECT. THE ORIGINAL
- 3 PROPOSED COST WAS A LITTLE OVER \$30 MILLION. WE WERE ABLE TO
- 4 NEGOTIATE THAT COST DOWN TO 23 AND A HALF. SIZABLE REDUCTION
- 5 ORDER CAME AS A RESULT OF AGREEING IN PRINCIPLE TO EXTEND THE
- 6 MAINTENANCE CONTRACT BY THREE ADDITIONAL YEARS MORE ON THAT IN
- 7 A MINUTE. BOTTOM LINE IS GOING WITH OUR EXISTING INTEGRATOR
- 8 MAKES MORE SENSE BECAUSE IT'S COST EFFECTIVE IT'S THE ONLY WAY
- 9 WE CAN DELIVER WITHIN THE EXPECTED TIME FRAME AND WE'LL BE
- 10 WORKING WITH SOMEONE WE KNOW AND TRUST. NEXT PAGE, PLEASE.
- 11 THE CURRENT MAINTENANCE CONTRACT AS I HAD MENTIONED EARLIER
- 12 WITH TRANSCORE EXPIRED JUNE 30TH, 2024, TEST, REPAIR FIELD
- 13 EQUIPMENT AND TO MEET CERTAIN PERFORMANCE INDICATORS SUCH AS
- 14 ACCURACY COMPLETENESS RESPONSIVENESS AMONG OTHER THINGS GIVEN
- 15 USEFUL LIFE IN CORRIDORS WE NEED TO MAINTAIN OUR EQUIPMENT
- 16 UNTIL THEY NEED TO BE REPLACED ESTIMATED COST OF AN EXTENSION
- 17 THROUGH 2027 IS 41 MILLION COST ESTIMATED BASED ON CURRENT
- 18 COST WITH ANNUAL ESCALATION BASED ON CONSUMER PRICE INDEX
- 19 CAPPED AT 5%. FUNDING FOR THIS EXTENSION IS SUSPECT TO THE
- 20 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HER DESIGNEES EXERCISING SUCH OPTIONS
- 21 AND ADOPTION OF THE BAIFA OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGETS IN
- 22 EACH OF THE FISCAL YEAR. NEXT PAGE PLEASE. SO, FOR THESE
- 23 REASONS, STAFF RECOMMENDS OR REQUESTS APPROVAL TO SEEK
- 24 AUTHORIZATION FROM BAIFA FOR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OR HER

- 18 PRESENTATION FOR THIS. THANK YOU. TYPICALLY, PERFORMANCE DATA
- 19 IS SHARED WITH THIS COMMITTEE INCLUDING QUARTERLY REPORT IN
- 20 YOUR PACKET, BUT TODAY I'M HERE IN A UNIQUE SITUATION BECAUSE
- 21 WE ARE RESPONDING TO COMMISSIONERS REQUESTS FOR AN 880 DEBRIEF
- 22 AFTER SIX MONTHS OF OPERATIONS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS MAP
- 23 SHOWS THE EXPRESS LANE NETWORK. AND BAIFA NET LANES ARE SHOWN
- 24 IN COLOR -- IN LANES MANAGED BY OTHER AGENCIES ARE SHOWN IN
- 25 BLACK AND GRAY. TODAY A PRESENTATION IS FOCUSED ON I-880



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CIRCLED IN PURPLE. AND FOR THE SAKE OF TIME TODAY I'M ONLY 1 GOING TO TALK ABOUT THE 880 LANE PERFORMANCE. I WANT TO POINT 2 3 OUT THE I 680 CONTRACTS ARE IN ORANGE ON THE MAP AND THE SOUTHBOUND EXTENSION OF THESE LANES SHOWN IN ORANGE ABOVE THE 4 5 ORANGE CIRCLE WILL BEGIN TOLLING AUGUST 20TH OF THIS YEAR. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. BAIFA'S EXPRESS LANE PRIMARY GOAL IS TO 6 PROVIDE MANAGED LANES FOR AND HIGH-OCCUPANCY VEHICLES THAT 7 8 MOVE FASTER THAN THE GENERAL PURPOSE LANES AND THAT DO NOT FEEL CONGESTED AND THAT THOSE CONDITIONS CAN BE EXPECTED TO BE 9 RELIABLE ON A REGULAR BASIS THE 880 LANES ARE DOING THE JOB AS 10 11 THEY HAVE CLEARED UP CONGESTION AND OFFER A FASTER TRIP THAN GENERAL PURPOSE LANES BUT SHOWING OPERATIONAL ASPECTS THAT WE 12 NEED TO WORK ON WHICH IS EXPECTED. - 14 BECAUSE WE KNOW THERE ARE LIMITATIONS WITH THE TECHNOLOGY AND
- 15 FOOTPRINT. WE WOULD LOVE TO COME BACK.

- 21 BARBARA LAURENSON: LET ME BRING UP MY -- I'M VERY SORRY. NEXT
- 22 SLIDE PLEASE. THE DATA I'M GOING TO TALK ABOUT TODAY ARE
- 23 TRAFFIC SPEED, VEHICLE THROUGHPUT, VEHICLE OCCUPANCY, AND
- 24 VEHICLE TYPE, AS OBSERVED BY FIELD STAFF, AND VEHICLE
- 25 OCCUPANCY AS DECLARED BY DRIVERS VIA THEIR TOLL TAG SETTINGS.





- 1 THE TOP TWO ARE THE MOST RELIABLE DATA SOURCES. VEHICLE
- 2 OCCUPANCY AND VEHICLE TYPE DATA WERE COLLECTED BY MANUAL
- 3 VISION OBSERVATION. THE FIELD STAFF DOING THE OBSERVATION WERE
- 4 CONSISTENT, TRAINED, AND EXPERIENCED. BUT BEING ABLE TO SEE
- 5 INTO VEHICLES CAN BE CHALLENGING. SO THIS DATA IS LIKELY LESS
- 6 RELIABLE THAN THE TOLL SYSTEM DATA. FINALLY, THE DATA
- 7 ANALYSIS USES THE TAG SETTINGS REPORTED BY THE TOLL SYSTEM,
- 8 WHILE THE TOLL SYSTEMS REPORTINGS ARE RELIABLE DRIVERS MAY BE
- 9 SETTING THEIR TAGS IN WAYS THAT WOULD LOWER THEIR TOLLS. THE
- 10 ANALYSIS I WILL PRESENT IN THE NEXT SLIDE MOSTLY COMPARES DATA
- 11 TO AUGUST OF 2020 BEFORE THE START OF TOLLING TO DATA FROM
- 12 MARCH 2021 AFTER LANES WERE OPERATIONAL FOR FIVE AND A HALF



- 8 GOOD TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT TOOL REGARDLESS OF WHETHER AN EXPRESS
- 9 LANE OR HOV LANE OR FREEWAY BECAUSE YOU'RE TRYING TO MINIMIZE
- 10 THE NUMBERS THAT HAPPEN IN THAT PARTICULAR ZONE. WE DO HAVE
- 11 OPENINGS WHERE THE EXITS ARE IMPORTANT AND WHERE IT MAKES
- 12 SENSE. THEY'RE NOT DESIGNED TO LIMIT YOU TO MISS AN EXIT BUT
- 13 REMEMBER THE EXPRESS LANES ARE DESIGNED TO GET THROUGH TRAFFIC

- 21 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI: IF THAT'S THE CASE, DO WE HAVE ONLINE A
- 22 MAP THAT SOMETHING CAN LOOK AT TO UNDERSTAND WHERE THOSE
- 23 DOUBLE WHITE LINES ARE OR NOT? BECAUSE THIS IS -- I CAN RECALL
- 24 ONE OTHER INSTANCE LAST MONTH, WHERE IT WAS THE SAME THING, UP
- 25 AND AROUND THE 238 AREA, YOU KNOW, YOU'RE USING THE EXPRESS





- 1 LANES BECAUSE YOU WANT TO SAVE TIME TO GET WHERE YOU'RE GOING,
