KINMAN, AFTER HER COMMENTS SHE MADE AT THE JULY 14TH PROGRAMMING AND ALLOCATIONS COMMITTEE ABOUT THE NEED TO HAVE A 7 8 LONG-TERM RESILIENCY PLAN FOR WHEN PUBLIC TRANSIT, ESPECIALLY IN THE BAY AREA IS GOING OUT FOR MONTHS AT A TIME BECAUSE OF A 9 TRAGEDY LOSS OF PROPERTY OR LIFE AS WE HAVE SEEN WITH THE VTA 10 SHOOTINGS ON 5/26, I HAVE SEEN TWO STOPS AWAY FROM THE WORLD 11 TRADE CENTER WHEN EFFORTS BOMBED THE WORLD TRADE CENTER 12 BASEMENT ON FEBRUARY 26TH, 1993 MANY INJURED AND WAS ONLY DOWN 13 FOR A WEEK AFTER THE BOMBING. WE NEED THE LONG-TERM RESILIENCY 14 FOR WHEN A TRAGEDY LIKE THIS HAPPENS. I'M LOOKING ESPECIALLY 15 16 AT THE FIRES IN THE NORTH BAY GOING ON RIGHT NOW I'M WONDERING WHAT PLANS MTC HAS FOR LONG-TERM RESILIENCY ANY DISASTER 17 WHETHER NATURAL OR MAN-MADE THAT TAKES OUT THE TRANSIT AGENCY. 18 ANY SUGGESTIONS HOW THAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED LONG-TERM RECOVERY 19 LIKE THE PRESENT RECOVERY PLAN GOING ON RIGHT NOW. 20 21 22 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: THANK YOU. 23

- 15 MEETINGS WHERE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC CAN CONTINUE TO DIAL IN
- 16 AND ZOOM. MTC COVERS SUCH A BROAD GEOGRAPHICAL RANGE THAT THIS
- 17 IS SOMETHING REALLY VALUABLE FOR THE REGION TO BE ABLE TO DO.
