THAT MOVES US TO ITEM 4A, THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL FARE COORDINATION AND INTEGRATION 9 10 SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT. ADINA LEVIN IS HERE. 11 ADINA LEVIN: SO THE -- IN YOUR PACKET IS A NOTE ABOUT THE 12 DISCUSSION AT THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL FARE COORDINATION 13 AND INTEGRATION SUBCOMMITTEE COORDINATION AND INTEGRATION 14 SUBCOMMITTEE ON SEPTEMBER 10TH, WHERE WE HEARD THE DETAILED 15 16 DRAFT RECOMMENDATION, AND, SO, THERE -- WE -- THE SUBCOMMITTEE 17 WAS LARGELY SUPPORTIVE OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS, ESPECIALLY THE NEAR-TERM ITEMS. THE PAST, INCLUDING THE PAST AND THE PILOT, 18 AND THERE WERE SOME SUGGESTIONS ABOUT EXTENDING SEASONAL PASS 19 TO INCLUDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING RESIDENTS WHICH I BELIEVE HAS 20 21 GOTTEN INTO THE CURRENT RECOMMENDATION AND THERE WERE A NUMBER OF SUBCOMMITTEE MEMBERS THAT ALSO VOICED SUPPORT FOR A 22 STRONGER AND MORE DEFINED COMMITMENT TO ADVANCED TIER THREE AS 23 WELL AS ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION FOR TIER FOUR, WITH SOME 24 SUGGESTIONS ABOUT THE BENEFITS OF WAYFINDING AND WAYS OF



ADDRESSING THE FINANCIAL INEQUITY ISSUES OF THOSE. THAT IS 1 THAT GROUP CONSISTENT GENERAL SUPPORT FOR WHAT IS BEING PUT 2 3 FORWARD. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 4 5 MICHAEL HURSH, CHAIR: THANKS ADINA. - 22 COMMITTEE ABOUT THE LONG RANGE RECOMMENDATIONS, AS WELL,

AGAIN THIS IS AN INFORMATION 2 3 ITEM SO I'LL MOVE US TO 5A BAY AREA POLICY VISION STATEMENT PROJECTS REPORTS. BILL BACON AND MIKE EISEMAN. 4 5 MICHAEL EISEMAN: YES WE HAVE A POWERPOINT PRESENTATION. AND FINALLY I'LL WRAP UP 14 15 WITH NEXT STEPS. THANKS BILL WE'LL BEGIN WITH THE PROJECT 16 TIMELINE ON THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS TASK FORCE HAS BEEN MEETING SINCE MAY OF 2020 IDENTIFYING A PROBLEM STATEMENT AND 17 SHORT LIST OF POLICY OPTIONS CONDUCTED BUSINESS CASE ANALYSIS 18 AND DEFINE STRUCTURE OF FARE INTEGRATION TIERS. IN SEPTEMBER 19 YOU HEARD DRAFT BUSINESS CASE FINDINGS AND GAVE INITIAL 20 FEEDBACK ON SET OF POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS AND OVER THE LAST 21 22 MONTH AGENCY BOARDS HAVE RECEIVED BRIEFINGS IF EVER YOUR REVIEW AND DISCUSSION. I HAVE ATTACHED IN YOUR PACKET A LONGER 23 DRAFT BUSINESS CASE REPORT AVAILABLE FOR YOUR REVIEW. COMING 24

- 3 THEN THE MONTHS AHEAD THE TASK FORCE WILL BE ASKED TO CONSIDER
- 4 VOTING ON THE ADOPTION OF THE VISION STATEMENT AND FINAL
- 5 ACTIONS. WE HAVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS HERE FOR YOUR INFORMATION
- 6 AND I'LL BRIEFLY RECAP THOSE. NEXT SLIDE. YOU WILL RECALL THAT
- 7 OUR RECOMMENDATIONS REFER TO THE FOUR TIER STRUCTURE TIER ONE
- 8 INCLUDES PASSES AND CAPS AND TIER TWO INCLUDES FREE AND
- 9 DISCOUNTED TRANSFERS BETWEEN AGENCIES. CHANGES IN THESE FIRST
- 10 TWO TIERS CAN BE IMPLEMENTED USING EXISTING DECISION MAKING
- 11 STRUCTURES. TIER THREE REFERS TO STANDARDIZED FARE STRUCTURES
- 12 FOR REGIONAL FARE SERVICES RAIL, FORE AND EXPRESS BUS. TIER
- 13 FOUR INCLUDES STANDARDIZED FARE STRUCTURE SERVICES LOCAL AND
- 14 REGIONAL AND TIER 3 AND 4 WOULD REQUIRE SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO
- 15 HOW FARES ARE MANAGES IN OUR REGION. NEXT SLIDE. HERE AGAIN,
- 16 SUMMARY OF PROJECT TERMS AND RECOMMENDATIONS BEGINNING IN
- 17 CALENDAR YEAR 2022 WE RECOMMENDED PILOTING AN AGENCY
- 18 INSTITUTIONAL AND EMPLOYER TRANSIT PASS. NEXT PHASE BEGIN IN
- 19 FALL OF 2023, THAT'S WHEN WE RECOMMEND REPLACING EXIST
- 20 PATCHWORK OF INTER-AGENCY TRANSFERS WITH DISCOUNTS
- 21 STANDARDIZED OR REDUCED COSTS TRANSFER BY REGION AND FINDINGS
- 22 OF INSTITUTIONAL PASS PILOT PHASE, AND DEPLOYMENT OF ALL
- 23 AGENCY INVESTIGATE BENEFITS AND COSTS FOR CERTIFY FOR REGIONAL
- 24 SERVICES AND ROLE IN THE REGION FUNDING STRATEGY. I'LL TURN IT
- 25 OVER TO BILL.

2	WILLIAM BACON: WE WOULD LIKE TO WALK THROUGH THE TASK FORCE
3	DRAFT POLICY VISION STATEMENT WHICH IS INCLUDED IN YOUR
4	PACKET. BEFORE THE TASK FORCE THIS AFTERNOON FOR YOUR REVIEW
5	AND DISCUSSION IS A DRAFT BAY AREA TRANSIT FARE POLICY VISION
6	STATEMENT. THE VISION STATEMENT IS NOT BEING PRESENTED TODAY
7	FOR TASK FORCE APPROVAL. THE PURPOSE OF THE VISION STATEMENT
8	IS FOR THE TASK FORCE TO START TO ARTICULATE THE POLICY
9	DIRECTION THAT IT SUPPORTS IN PRINCIPLE AND PROVIDE DIRECTION
10	TO THE PROJECT TEAM AS WELL AS AGENCY STAFF ABOUT PRIORITIZING
11	POLICY WORK INCLUDING NEXT STEPS LIKE ADVANCING THE PROPOSED
12	INSTITUTIONAL AVERAGE PASS PRODUCT AND SEEKING POTENTIAL
13	FUNDING TO SUPPORT PILOTS AND FURTHER PROJECT DELIVERY. NEXT
14	SLIDE PLEASE. THE DRAFT VISION STATEMENT BEGINS WITH A
15	STATEMENT ON THE DRAFT STUDY FINDINGS AND ACKNOWLEDGES THAT
16	MORE COORDINATED AND INTEGRATED TRANSIT FARE POLICIES MAY
17	OFFER COST EFFECTIVE OPTIONS FOR IMPROVING THE TRANSIT
18	CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE, PROMOTING TRANSIT RIDERSHIP RECOVERY FROM
19	THE COVID-19 AND REDUCING VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED, GREENHOUSE
20	GAS EMISSIONS, AND TRANSIT TRAVEL TIMES FOR CUSTOMERS. IN
21	ADDITION HELPING TO ADVANCE EQUITY AROUND THE BAY AREA. NEXT
22	SLIDE PLEASE. NEXT, THE VISION STATEMENT INCLUDES FOUR
23	PREREQUISITES TO HELP GUIDE STAFF IN ADVANCING THE TRANSIT
24	FARE POLICY INITIATIVES WHICH FALL ON THE NEXT SLIDE. THESE
25	PREREQUISITES HAVE BEEN INFORMED SORRY WE CAN GO BACK.

- 2 PREREOUISITES HAVE BEEN FORMED BY FEEDBACK THE PROJECT TEAMS
- 3 HAVE HEARD FROM TRANSIT AGENCY GOVERNING BOARDS. FOCUSING ON
- 4 OUESTIONS LIKE RESPONSIBILITY AND TRANSIT AGENCY FOR LOCAL
- 5 VOTERS SUPPORTING LOCAL FUNDING MEASURES, FUNDING SOURCES
- 6 SUPPORT THE NECESSITY OF TRANSIT AGENCY GOVERNING BOARD AND
- 7 APPROVAL OF FARE POLICY CHANGES AND CLEAR STATEMENT POLICY
- 8 CHANGE, SHOULD NOT RESULT IN A REDUCTION OF TRANSIT SERVICE
- 9 LEVELS. I'LL WALK THROUGH THE PREREQUISITE IN MORE DETAIL
- 10 SINCE I'M NOT GOING TO READ THROUGH EACH WORD ON THE SLIDES.
- 11 THE FINAL VISION STATEMENT ARE THE FARE POLICY INITIATIVES FOR
- 12 FURTHER DEVELOPMENT THESE FOUR INITIATIVES MATCH THE
- 13 RECOMMENDATION THAT IS THE FIRST PROJECT TEAM BROUGHT TO THE
- 14 TASK FORCE LAST MONTH AND HAS BEEN DISCUSSED WITH TRANSIT
- 15 AGENCY BOARDS IN THE INTERIM. I'M NOT GOING TO READ THROUGH
- 16 EACH BUT TO SUMMARIZE FOCUS ON THE ALL TRANSIT AGENCY
- 17 INSTITUTIONAL EMPLOYER PASS PILOT IN CALENDAR YEAR 2022, AND
- 18 SECOND FOCUSES ON IMPLEMENT LOCAL TRANSFER REDUCED COSTS
- 19 REGIONAL TRANSFER SYSTEM FOR TRANSIT USERS TRANSFERRING
- 20 BETWEEN AGENCIES BEGINNING IN 2023 COINCIDING WITH THE ROLL
- 21 OUT OF THE NEXT GENERATION CLIPPER SYSTEM. THIRD, FOCUSING ON
- 22 POSSIBILITIES EXPANDING TO ALL TRANSIT PASS PRODUCT THAT WILL
- 23 BE AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC AT THE LAUNCH OF THE NEXT
- 24 GENERATION CLIPPER SYSTEM THAT ARE INFORMED BY THE PILOT AS

- 1 AND EXPRESS BUS SERVICES PLEASE REVIEW THE LANGUAGE. FINALLY
- 2 IN THE LAST SECTION I WANT TO TOUCH ON THE PILOT THEN BRIEFLY
- 3 TALK ABOUT NEXT STEPS BEFORE WE OPEN IT UP FOR TASK FORCE
- 4 DISCUSSION. YOU CAN GO ON TO THE NEXT SLIDE. WHILE THE
- 5 PROJECT TEAM IS NOT ASKING THE TASK FORCE TO TAKE ANY ACTION
- 6 THIS AFTERNOON, WE WOULD LIKE TO CALL YOUR ATTENTION AND FOCUS
- 7 ON THE POSSIBILITY OF AN ALL-AGENCY INSTITUTIONAL AND EMPLOYER
- 8 PASS PILOT IN CALENDAR YEAR 2022. AGAIN, WHILE WE'RE NOT
- 9 ASKING FOR THE TASK FORCE TO ENDORSE THIS CONCEPT TODAY IT
- 10 WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR STAFF TO UNDERSTAND IF THERE REMAINS
- 11 ENTHUSIASM FOR THIS PROJECT. WE'RE HAPPY TO REPORT THAT WE
- 12 BELIEVE WE'LL BE LIKELY ABLE TO DELIVER A PILOT IN 2022 SHOULD
- 13 THE TASK FORCE ENDORSE MOVING IN THIS DIRECTION BUT IN ORDER
- 14 TO MEET THAT TIMELINE IN ORDER TO DELIVER THE PILOT IN 2022,
- 15 WE NEED TO BEGIN WORK ON TECHNICAL MODIFICATIONS TO THE
- 16 CLIPPER SYSTEM TO ENSURE A SMOOTH ROLL OUT. IT WOULD BE
- 17 HELPFUL FOR THE PROJECT TEAM TO AT LEAST INFORMALLY EXPRESS
- 18 ENTHUSIASM SO WE CAN IMPLEMENT NEXT STEPS TO START THE PILOT
- 19 NEXT YEAR. WE WILL CONTINUE TO FOCUS ON EDUCATIONAL
- 20 INSTITUTIONS AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND EMPLOYERS AT VARIOUS
- 21 PHASES OF DEVELOPMENT AND INFORMED BY THE INITIAL PHASE A
- 22 SECOND PORTION OF THE PILOT WOULD EXPAND TO A LARGER NUMBER OF
- 23 PARTICIPANT INSTITUTIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS. THIS IS A TOPIC
- 24 THAT WE WILL LIKELY COME BACK TO THE TASK FORCE TO TALK ABOUT
- 25 IN MUCH GREATER DETAIL OVER THE COMING MONTHS SHOULD THE TASK

AGAIN, 17 THAT DRAFT REPORT IS AVAILABLE FOR YOUR REVIEW ATTACHMENT B TO 18 THIS ITEM AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO YOUR OUESTIONS COMMENTS AND 19 FEEDBACK THIS AFTERNOON.
