DORENE M. GIACOPINI: HERE. 1 2 3 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: THANK YOU. COMMISSIONER LICCARDO? COMMISSIONER SCHAFF? COMMISSIONER SPERING? 4 5 JAMES P. SPERING: PRESENT. 6 7 8 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: WE HAVE A QUORUM. 9 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. YESTERDAY WAS 10 11 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE FLAG WE HAD VETERANS DAY AND IN ACKNOWLEDGING OUR FLAG, I ALSO WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE 12 VETERANS WHO HAVE SERVED OUR COUNTRY. MAY WE HAVE THE 13 14 COMPENSATION ANNOUNCEMENT, PLEASE? 15 16 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: AS AUTHORIZED BY STATE LAW I AM MAKING THE FOLLOWING ANNOUNCEMENT. JAMES P. SPERING: SPERING WILL MOVE IT. 1 2 DAMON CONNOLLY, V. CHAIR: SECOND. 3 4 5 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: OKAY, THE MOTION IS BY COMMISSIONER SPERING, THE SECOND BY COMMISSIONER CONNOLLY. 6 AND MARTHA DO WE HAVE ANY PUBLIC COMMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS 7 8 ITEM TO BE READ INTO THE RECORD? 9 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: THERE ARE NO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH 10 THEIR HAND RAISED, AND THERE WAS NO PUBLIC COMMENT SUBMITTED 11 ON THIS ITEM. 12 13 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: IN THAT CASE MAY WE PLEASE HAVE 14 15 OUR ROLL CALL VOTE? 16 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: YES. 1 2 EDDIE AHN: HERE. 3 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: CANEPA? 4 5 6 DAVID CANEPA: AYE. 7 8 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: FLEMING? LICCARDO? SCHAFF? SPERING? 9 10 JAMES P. SPERING: PRESENT -- AYE. 11 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: PASSES UNANIMOUSLY BY ALL MEMBERS 12 PRESENT. 13 14 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: ITEM 5A WHICH IS THE MTC COMMUTER 15 16 PARKING INITIATIVE, AND STEPHANIE IS GOING TO PRESENT THIS ITEM. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ONLY ITEM. 17 18 STEPHANIE HOM: GOOD MORNING. THIS IS STEPHANIE HOM WITH DESIGN 19 AND DELIVERY. I HAVE A PRESENTATION. I AM GOING TO PRESENT AN 20 UPDATE ON THE COMMUTER PARKING INITIATIVE. I LAST PROVIDED AN 21 22 UPDATE TO THE COMMISSION IN SEPTEMBER 2019 AND SINCE THEN A LOT HAS HAPPENED. SO WE THOUGHT THIS WAS A GOOD TIME TO COME 23 TO THE COMMISSION TO BRING ANOTHER UPDATE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. 24 ASSOCIATION THE COMMUTER PARKING INITIATIVE IS PART OF OUR BAY 25

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BRIDGE FORWARD PROGRAM, WHICH AIMS TO MOVE MORE PEOPLE INTO 1 2 FEWER VEHICLES. AS PART OF THIS PROGRAM, WE CONSTRUCTED THREE 3 COMMUTER PARKING FACILITIES, THE FIRST ONE IS AT 180 IN BUCHANEN, AND TWO IN OAKLAND, 880 FRUITVALE, AND 880 HIGH 4 5 STREET AND THE GOAL OF THESE COMMUTER PARKING FACILITIES IS TO PROVIDE CONVENIENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE TO TRANSFER ON TO 6 TRANSIT OR CARPOOL TO FINISH THEIR TRIP. THESE LOTS ARE IN 7 8 PARTNERSHIP WITH CALTRANS. WE DO HAVE A MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT WITH CALTRANS. WE CONSTRUCT THESE LOTS UNDER, UNDERUTILIZED 9 10 SPACES UNDER FREEWAYS. SO THESE SPACES, LOCATIONS, THEY WERE LOW VALUE, YOU KNOW, NOT A LOT OF OTHER OPTIONS TO DO SO. IT 11 WAS A GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO FIND A HIGH VALUE USE FOR THESE PARK 12 IN ADDITION, THE DELIVERY OF THESE IS A UNIQUE 13 AND RIDE LOTS. PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN BOTH THE DESIGN AND PROJECT DELIVERY UNIT 14 15 AS WELL AS OUR FIELD OPERATIONS AND ASSET MANAGEMENT UNIT AT 16 MTC, WHERE DESIGN AND DELIVERY, WE DID THE PLANNING AND PROJECT DELIVERY FOR THESE SITES IS THEN FIELD ASSET -- FIELD 17 OPERATIONS AND ASSET MANAGEMENT, THEY WILL CONTINUE THE 18 OPERATIONS OF THESE SITES. THESE SITES WILL OPERATE FOR A 19 THREE-YEAR PILOT, WHICH MTC IS COVERING ALL OPERATIONS AND 20 21 MAINTENANCE COST OF THIS. AFTER THE THREE YEAR PILOTS, WE WILL EVALUATE THEIR PERFORMANCE, AND LOOK TO PARTNERSHIP OR 22 SEE OPPORTUNITIES WHERE OTHER AGENCIES SUCH AS THE CITIES OR 23 TRANSIT AGENCIES CAN TAKE ON OPERATIONS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. 24 AS I MENTIONED, ONE OF THE GOALS OF THE PARKING FACILITIES IS 25

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TO PROVIDE CONVENIENT USER EXPERIENCE WE STAN INSTALLED A 1 NUMBER OF ENHANCEMENTS TO THESE LOTS WITH CONVENIENCE OF 2 3 STANDARD PARK AND RIDE LOTS INSTALLED REALTIME PARKING OCCUPANCY DETECTION SYSTEM AND USER CAN CHECK WHAT THE PARKING 4 5 SITUATION IS LIKE BEFORE HEADING TO THE SITE. SOMETIMES WE GO TO PARKING LOTS AND SOMETIMES LEAVE AS EARLY AS 5:00 A.M. 6 BECAUSE WE DON'T KNOW THE PARKING SPOT SITUATION. SO THIS 7 8 AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION WILL ALLOW COMMUTERS TO SEE IF THERE IS PARKING AVAILABILITY, IS IT LOOKING LIKE THERE ARE 9 SPACES OR IS IT ALREADY PACKED? AND IT WILL HELP PLAN THEIR 10 TRIP AHEAD OF TIME. THEY CAN THEN DRIVE, WALK, OR BIKE TO THE 11 PARKING LOTS THERE ARE A NUMBER OF ENHANCEMENTS TO ACCOMMODATE 12 THESE DIFFERENT MODES WE WILL HAVE SECURE ELECTRONIC BICYCLE 13 LOCKERS SO PEOPLE CAN FEEL SECURE LEAVING THEIR BIKE AT THE 14 15 LOCATIONS. IN ADDITION WE HAVE EV CHARGERS SO EVS CAN CHARGE 16 THEIR CAR WHILE PARKED AT THE LOT. USERS CAN ALSO PAY FOR PARKING, USING A MOBILE PAYMENT APP, SO YOU DON'T HAVE TO GO 17 TO THE PAY STATION, WORRY ABOUT PUTTING YOUR CREDIT CARD, OR 18 FIGURING OUTPUTTING THAT DOLLAR INTO THE MACHINE, YOU CAN 19 PARK, GET ON YOUR PHONE, PAY FOR PARKING THROUGH THE APP. WE 20 21 WILL OFFER DAILY PARKING AS WELL AS MONTHLY PARKING FOR THE SUPER COMMUTERS WHO WANT TO USE THE LOTS MULTIPLE TIMES A 22 WEEK, AND THEN FROM THERE, YOU CAN HOP ON TO TRANSIT OR 23 CARPOOL. WE HAVE BEEN WORKING WITH AC TRANSIT, AND AC TRANSIT 24 WILL PROVIDE TRANSBAY SERVICE, AS WELL AS THROUGH THE BAY AREA 25

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COUNCIL AND UNDERSTANDING THE NEEDS OF EMPLOYERS. AND 1 EMPLOYERS ARE, THEY CAN USE THE LOTS FOR THEIR EMPLOYER 2 3 SHUTTLES, AS WELL. SO, NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, WHAT WE HAVE BEEN UP TO SINCE WE LAST PROVIDED AN UPDATE IN SEPTEMBER 2019. 4 5 OBVIOUSLY, LIKE ALL THE OTHER PROJECTS IN THE REGION, AND JUST IN GENERAL, THIS PROJECT WAS IMPACTED BY COVID-19. WE 6 ORIGINALLY PLANNED TO OPEN THE LOT LAST SUMMER, IN SUMMER 7 8 2020, AND WE WERE PRETTY MUCH READY TO GO. BUT EVERYTHING HAS BEEN ON HOLD DUE TO COVID. FINAL CONSTRUCTION ENDED UP 9 COMPLETING IN EARLY 2019, SO IT'S ALL DONE. WE HAVE CLOSED 10 OUT. IF YOU DRIVE BY, THEY LOOK LIKE FULL FUNCTIONING PARKING 11 FACILITIES. AND WE HAVE HAD CONTRACT IN PLACE SINCE EARLY 12 2020. SO ALL CONTRACTS FOR PARKING OPERATIONS, THE ELECTRIC 13 VEHICLE CHARGERS, THE BIKE LOCKERS, OUR PARKING OCCUPANCY 14 15 SYSTEM AND VIRTUAL PARKING PERMIT SYSTEM, THEY HAVE ALL BEEN 16 READY TO GO. IN ADDITION, DURING THAT TIME, WE HAVE ALSO PARTNERS WITH THE CITY OF OAKLAND AND THE UNITY COUNCIL TO 17 IDENTIFY BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO THE FRUITVALE LOT, 18 IN PARTICULAR. THIS STARTED OUT AS A QUICK BUILD PROJECT WHERE 19 WE WERE GOING TO IDENTIFY ENHANCEMENTS THAT COULD BE INSTALLED 20 21 PRETTY QUICKLY. BUT THE CITY OF OAKLAND WAS ACTUALLY INTERESTED IN MORE PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS, AND THIS WOULD 22 ALIGN WITH THEIR FRUITVALE ALIVE PROJECT. SO WE EXPLORED MORE 23 PERMANENT DESIGN OPTIONS. WE WORKED WITH THE LOCAL COMMUNITY 24 AND LOCAL BUSINESS LEADERS IN THE AREA TO REALLY UNDERSTAND 25

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WHAT THEIR NEEDS ARE, WHAT THEIR INTERESTS ARE, AND WE HAD OUR 1 VIRTUAL SITE VISIT, AS WELL AS SEVERAL STAKEHOLDER MEETINGS TO 2 3 GET THEIR INPUT. IN THE END, WE LANDED ON A PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE, AND WE ARE WORKING WITH THE -- OR WE CONTINUE TO 4 5 WORK WITH THE CITY OF OAKLAND TO LOOK FOR WAYS TO ADVANCE THIS ALTERNATIVES ESPECIALLY AS FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES BECOME 6 AVAILABLE. SO, CURRENT STATUS, WITH CURRENT CONGESTION COMING 7 8 BACK ON THE BAY BRIDGE CORRIDOR AS WELL AS SUPPORTING TRANSIT COMING BACK WE MADE A DECISION TO MOVE FORWARD WITH OPERATIONS 9 OF TWO OF THE THREE LOTS, WE WILL BE OPENING THE BUCHANEN 10 STREET LOT AND THE FRUITVALE AVENUE LOT THIS DECEMBER THEY 11 WILL BE BRANDED AS PIVOT POINT COMMUTER HUBS. BOTH LOTS WILL 12 ACCOMMODATE AC TRANSIT, TRANSBAY SERVICE. THE BUCHANEN LOT 13 THERE, IS AN EXISTING LA LINE THAT WILL ADD AN EXISTING STOP 14 15 TO OUR LOT, AND THE FRUITVALE AVENUE LOT THERE IS AN EXISTING 16 ON. LINE NEARBY. WE ARE MOVING AHEAD WITH OPENING ONE PARCEL AT THIS TIME AND WHEN DEMAND INCREASES WE CAN OPEN THE OTHER 2 17 LOTS. HIGH STREET LOCATION THIS WAS ONE OF OUR PROMISING 18 LOCATIONS WHEN WE FIRST STARTED THIS PROJECT, BUT, 19 UNFORTUNATELY, DUE TO -- DURING THE PANDEMIC, THIS LOT HAS 20 21 BEEN VULNERABLE TO A LOT OF THEFT AND VANDALISM AND ILLEGAL 22 DUMPING. WE HAVE INVESTED A LOT OF RESOURCES SO FAR JUST TO DO MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS AND UNFORTUNATELY WE JUST DON'T HAVE 23 THE RESOURCES TO CONTINUE OPERATIONS OF THIS LOT. 24 ADDITIONALLY, THERE ARE A FEW OTHER FACTORS. THERE IS NO AC 25



TRANSIT SERVICE THAT STOPS NEARBY, AND WHEN WORKING WITH THE 1 BAY COUNCIL, WHILE EMPLOYERS WERE INITIALLY INTERESTED IN THIS 2 LOT, THEY HAVE SINCE CITED SAFETY CONCERNS AND ARE NO LONGER 3 INTERESTED. AND SO FOR THOSE REASONS, WE ARE NOT MOVING 4 5 FORWARD WITH OPERATING THIS LOT AS A COMMUTER PARKING FACILITY. AND SO, AGAIN, WE DO PLAN TO OPEN THE BUCHANEN AND 6 THE FRUIT VALLEY AVENUE LOTS THIS DECEMBER STARTING A PERIOD 7 8 OF THREE YEARS. SO WE ARE VERY EXCITED ABOUT THAT. AND WITH THAT, I AM HAPPY TO TAKE ANY OUESTIONS OR COMMENTS. 9

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11 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU SO MUCH MARTHA -- NOT 12 MARTHA -- STEPHANIE, I'M SORRY. I WAS LOOKING DOWN AT MY 13 PAPER. I DO SEE DOREEN WITH HER HAND UP. LET'S GO TO SEE WHAT 14 SHE'S GOT. YES, MA'AM?

16 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: HI. I WAS JUST WONDERING ABOUT THE
17 OPTIONS AVAILABLE FOR PEOPLE WHO HAVE DISABILITIES WITH REGARD
18 TO, FOR EXAMPLE, PARKING IN HANDICAPS STALLS, THERE IS A
19 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN VAN ACCESSIBLE STALLS AND REGULAR BLUE ZONE
20 STALLS. AND YOU KNOW, IN ANY OTHER OPTIONS THAT YOU CAN TELL
21 US ABOUT FOR FOLKS WITH VARIOUS DISABILITIES, AS PART OF THIS
22 PROGRAM?

24 STEPHANIE HOM: THESE LOTS ARE DESIGNED WITH ADA STANDARDS SO
25 WE DO HAVE APPROPRIATE NUMBER OF HANDICAPPED STALLS THERE IS



ALSO A PARKING ATTENDANT THERE SO ANY ASSISTANCE NEEDED, THEY
 CAN HELP WITH THAT. AND AC TRANSIT SITE ARE DESIGNED UP TO
 STANDARDS I BELIEVE THE REQUIREMENT IS THEY SHOULD BE
 ACCESSIBLE AS WELL. I BELIEVE WE'RE OPEN TO ANYTHING THAT YOU
 MAY HAVE INPUT ON IN TERMS OF HOW WE CAN POSSIBLY UPGRADE
 THESE SITES TO MAKE THEM MORE ACCESSIBLE.

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8 DORENE M. GIACOPINI: WHAT I MEANT WITH REGARD TO PARKING IS, YOU WERE TALKING ABOUT BEING ABLE TO FIND OUT IF THERE WERE 9 PARKING SPACES AVAILABLE, AND, FOR SOME PEOPLE, REGULAR 10 PARKING SPACES ARE NOT, YOU KNOW, USABLE. AND SO I WAS 11 WONDERING IF THERE IS ANY KIND OF FURTHER BREAKDOWN INTO THE 12 TIME OF PARKING SPACES AVAILABLE? THERE IS ALSO ISSUES WITH A 13 LOT OF SAN FRANCISCO PARKING GARAGES THAT DON'T ACCOMMODATE 14 CERTAIN VANS BECAUSE THEY'RE TOO HIGH. THAT'S THE KIND OF 15 16 THING I'M TALKING ABOUT.

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STEPHANIE HOM: OKAY. THE AIR SPACES -- FOR YOUR ACCESSIBILITY 18 AND ACCOMMODATION VANS, I DON'T KNOW THERE WOULD BE A PROBLEM 19 WITH CLEARANCE FOR ACCESSIBLE VANS F THAT ADDRESSES YOUR 20 21 QUESTION, FOR THE AVAILABILITY OF ADA HANDICAP PARKING SPACES, OUR PARKING DETECTION SYSTEM IT'S PRETTY SIMPLIFIED AND IS 22 GOING TO COUNT CARS COMING IN AND OUT IN ALGORITHM AND 23 IDENTIFY THE NUMBER OF PARKING SPACES. SO UNFORTUNATELY AT 24 THIS TIME WE WON'T BE ABLE TO IDENTIFY THE NUMBER OF ADA 25



SPACES AVAILABLE AT THIS TIME BUT THAT'S SOMETHING WE CAN KEEP
 IN MIND. ONE OF THE REASONS WE CHOSE THE PARKING OCCUPANCY
 DETECTION SYSTEM THAT WE DID IS BECAUSE IT CAN BE FLEXIBLE TO
 CHANGE OUT AS NEEDED SO AS TECHNOLOGY IMPROVES, WE CAN PUT IN
 MORE UPGRADED TECHNOLOGY THAT WILL HOPEFULLY KIND OF
 ACCOMMODATE THOSE TYPES OF ENHANCEMENTS.

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8 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THAT ANSWERS THAT. AMY WORTH?

AMY R. WORTH: THANK YOU, CHAIR. IT IS A PLEASURE TO BE PART OF 10 THIS DISCUSSION. I REALLY WANT TO THANK STAFF FOR THEIR WORK 11 ON THESE PARK AND RIDE LOTS. ONE OF THE THINGS, THIS TIES IN 12 WELL WITH OUR WORK OF THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE, AS WELL AS 13 OUR TRANSIT PRIORITY INITIATIVES, AND, YOU KNOW, THE BRIDGE 14 15 FORWARDS PROJECTS. AND IF WE -- SINCE WE ARE -- YOU KNOW, ONE 16 OF OUR MAIN GOALS IS TO ENCOURAGE -- YOU KNOW, IS TO INCREASE CARPOOL USE OF THESE BRIDGES, AS A SIGNIFICANT WAY TO REDUCE 17 CONGESTION. SO, YOU KNOW, I'M PARTICULARLY EXCITED ABOUT THE 18 BUCHANEN LOT, WHICH WILL BE REALLY -- WILL BE REALLY HELPFUL 19 ON THE RICHMOND BRIDGE. AND AS YOU KNOW, 60% OF THE COMMUTERS 20 21 ON THE RICHMOND BRIDGE COME FROM THE EAST BAY EITHER ALAMEDA OR CONTRA COSTA COUNTY. SO THIS SLIDE IS WELL POSITIONED TO BE 22 ABLE TO ACCOMMODATE INDIVIDUALS THAT WANT TO CARPOOL ON THAT 23 BRIDGE. SO I JUST REALLY WANT TO THANK STAFF. AND WE BEGAN 24 THIS INITIATIVE WAY BEFORE THE COVID, AND KNOWING THAT THAT --25



YOU KNOW, HAVING PARKING TO ACCOMMODATE CARPOOLS IS REALLY AN
 IMPORTANT ELEMENT, AND WE'RE FINDING, NOW, HOW FORTUNATE WE
 ARE, BECAUSE THE BRIDGE FORWARD INITIATIVES WILL REALLY BE
 WELL-SERVED BY THESE LOTS. SO I WANT TO THANK STAFF

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CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU FOR THE REMINDER AND 6 7 IMPORTANCE OF HOW WE TIE IN WITH EVERYTHING. I DON'T SEE ANY 8 OTHER COMMISSIONERS WITH HANDS UP. AND I HAVE A QUESTION BEFORE WE CHECK WITH OTHER FOLKS. I NOTICED IN THE 9 10 PRESENTATION, AS FAR AS BICYCLES GO FOR THE BICYCLE LOCKERS, YOU MENTIONED THEREFORE THE ELECTRIC BICYCLES, NOW IS THERE 11 GOING TO BE SIGNAGE AS SUCH? BECAUSE I'M THINKING THAT OTHER 12 FOLKS THAT DON'T HAVE ELECTRONIC BICYCLES MAY WANT TO PUT 13 14 THEIR BIKES INTO THOSE LOCKERS?

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16 STEPHANIE HOM: I WANT TO CLARIFY THAT THEY'RE ELECTRONIC BICYCLE LOCKERS, SO THEY'RE NOT JUST FOR ELECTRIC BIKES. SO WE 17 CONTRACTED WITH A COMPANY CALLED E-LOCK. THEY HAVE BIKE 18 LOCKERS, CALLED BIKE LINK, THEY HAVE BIKE LOCKERS AT BART 19 STATIONS IN OAKLAND, AND EVEN SOME SHOPPING CENTERS, THEY ARE 20 BASICALLY A METAL BOX AND THERE IS A LOCK ON THERE AND YOU CAN 21 PUT YOUR BICYCLE IN THEM THEY'RE NOT JUST FOR ELECTRIC 22 BICYCLES, BUT THE LOCKER THEMSELVES IS ELECTRIC. 23



CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: OKAY. I MISUNDERSTOOD THAT. THANK 1 2 YOU FOR THE CLARIFICATION AM FAMILIAR WE DO HAVE THOSE LOCKERS 3 HERE AT OUR UNION CITY BART STATION. THANK YOU. I DON'T SEE ANY COMMISSIONER HANDS UP. MARTHA DO WE HAVE ANY PUBLIC 4 5 COMMENTS FOR THIS ITEM? WRITTEN, THAT IS. 6 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: THERE IS NO WRITTEN CORRESPONDENCE 7 8 RECEIVED ON THIS ITEM, AND THERE IS ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND RAISED. HOW MUCH TIME WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE 9 10 THEM? 11 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: TWO MINUTES BECAUSE WE HAVE A BIG 12 DAY IN FRONT OF US. 13 14 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: OKAY. FIRST UP IS ALETA DUPREE. GO AHEAD 15 16 AND UNMUTE YOURSELF. YOU HAVE TWO MINUTES. 17 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, CHAIR, DUTRA-VERNACI AND MEMBERS. ALETA 18 DUPREE FOR THE RECORD, SHE AND HER. GOOD PRESENTATION. I KNOW 19 WHAT IT'S LIKE TO DEAL WITH THE DIFFICULTIES OF PAID PARKING. 20 AND THERE ARE MANY WHO HAVE CARS, AND THIS WILL HELP THEM WITH 21 22 THE LAST MILE PLAN THAT THEY DON'T HAVE TO DRIVE INTO SAN FRANCISCO. IT'S KIND OF HARD GETTING AROUND NEW YORK CITY IN A 23 CAR. I HAVE DONE IT MANY TIMES. I CERTAINLY THINK THERE HAS 24 TO BE CLARIFICATION WITH THE ALLOTMENT AND NOTIFICATION OF 25

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SPACE AVAILABILITY. THAT DIVIDES OUT THE ADA SPACES FROM THE 1 GENERAL PUBLIC SPACES. BECAUSE IF YOU SAY YOU HAVE 100 SPACES, 2 AND YOU HAVE TEN THAT ARE ADA, WELL, THERE IS REALLY ONLY 90 3 SPACES AVAILABLE FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC. AND SO WE DON'T WANT 4 5 TO HAVE AN OVERLAP SITUATION WHERE AN ADA CUSTOMER DOESN'T HAVE SPACE, OR A GENERAL PUBLIC CUSTOMER WHO FIND THAT THEY 6 DON'T HAVE A SPACE. I THINK WITH THE SOFTWARE CHANGE WE CAN 7 8 FIX THAT. BECAUSE SPACE IS INTENDED FOR DIFFERENT POPULATIONS, NEED TO BE CLARIFIED. AND I NOTICED THAT THIS FRUITVALE 9 LOCATION IS NEAR BART SO WE CAN ALSO HIGHLIGHT THAT BART IS 10 AVAILABLE IS THEY RUN SEVEN DAYS A WEEK. AND IT'S NOT THAT FAR 11 AWAY. SO I THINK WE'RE DOING SOMETHING GOOD HERE. WE CAN'T 12 MAKE HIGH SHEET WORK UNFORTUNATELY BUT THERE ARE OTHERS PEOPLE 13 WHO HAVE CARS NEED TO HAVE A WAY TO GET TO TRANSIT SO THEY 14 DON'T HAVE TO DRIVE ALL THE WAY INTO THE CITY, WITH THE MOBILE 15 16 PAYMENT CASH VENDING MACHINES IS AN ACCIDENT WAITING TO HAPPEN, WE HAVE TO KEEP IT SECURE CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT IS 17 A PROBLEM. I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO OPENING UP AND STREAMLINING. 18 THANK YOU. 19

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21 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU. I DON'T SEE ANY OTHER 22 ATTENDEES WITH THEIR HAND UP. THIS IS AN INFORMATION ONLY 23 ITEM. WE'RE GOING TO MOVE TO ITEM SIX WHICH IS GENERAL PUBLIC 24 COMMENT. MARTHA DO WE HAVE ANY GENERAL WRITTEN PUBLIC COMMENT 25 RECEIVED BY 5:00 YESTERDAY?

TECHNOLOGY IS CHANGING. POLICY HAS TO KEEP UP WITH 23 THAT. THANK YOU.
