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7 KIMBERLY WARD, CLERK: THANK YOU. WE DID RECEIVE ONE WRITTEN 8 COMMENT FROM MR. ROLAND LEBRON. IT WAS LISTED UNDER ITEM 13 9 AND I HAVE SINCE MOVED IT TO ITEM 5 AT MR. RONEN'S REQUEST. 10 AND I SEE MR. LEBRON HAS HIS HAND RAISED. IF YOU'LL GO AHEAD 11 AND UNMUTE YOURSELF, YOU WILL HAVE TWO MINUTE, MR. LEBRON 12

SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING. THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY. SO I 13 WOULD LIKE TO SPEND A MINUTE OR SO BRINGING YOU UP TO DATE ON 14 THE STATUS OF THE BAT EXTENSION. BASICALLY THE INFORMATION IS 15 16 EXTRACTED FROM THE LETTER OF INTENT FROM THE FDA KNOWN AS LOI. WE CHOSE A TOTAL FUNDING GAP OF \$3.5 BILLION. THE FIRST 1.8 17 COMES FROM THE ORIGINAL APPLICATION WHEN THE ESTIMATED PROJECT 18 OF \$6.9 MILLION. SO IT IS ABOUT A BILLION AND A HALF OF LOCAL 19 THAT PASSED STATE'S PLAN. BUT IT IS DEFINITELY NOT COMMITTED. 20 21 AND THEN THE \$375 MILLION IN THE -- OUR ENTRY. BUT THEN THE FDA INCREASE PROCESS BY \$2.2 BILLION. SO NOW WE HAVE TO FIND 22 ANOTHER \$1.7 BILLION IN LOCAL MATCH. SO IN CLOSING, I HAVE A 23 SET OF RECOMMENDATIONS. AND I'LL PROBABLY COME BACK TO THIS 24 25 LATER WHEN WE HAVE THE BAHFA DISCUSSION. FIRST OF ALL, WE



SHOULD STOP THIS DEP APPLICATION EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY BECAUSE 1 THE SHOOTING US IN THE FOOT BY CAPPING A FEDERAL MATCH TO 25%. 2 AS AN EXAMPLE, RIGHT OF THE ROAD, THE TRANSLATING, JOHN PFIZER 3 AUTHORITY RIGHT NOW, EXPECTING A MATCH BETWEEN 30 AND 50, 5-0 4 5 PERCENT MATCH FROM THE FEDS. BUT THERE ARE OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS. AND IN CLOSING, I'D LIKE EVERYBODY ON THIS 6 COMMISSION TO BE AWARE THAT SAN FRANCISCO ARE GETTING BETWEEN 7 8 4 AND \$7 FOR EVERY SET DOLLARS. THE BTA'S PLAN RIGHT NOW IS A MATCH OF LESS THAN \$1. THIS WILL HAVE TO BE ADDRESSED BY THIS 9 10 COMMISSION. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: ALL RIGHT. THANK YOU. AT THIS POINT, 14 WE'LL MOVE ON TO ITEM 6 ADJOURN THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE 15 16 AUTHORITY MEETING AND CONTINUE WITH THE BALANCE OF THE MTC AGENDA. SO WE'LL MOVE ON TO ITEM 7. I DO WANT TO NOTE THAT 17 WE'RE GOING TO BE ADJOURNING THIS MEETING IN MEMORY OF COUNTY 18 BOARD SUPERVISOR WILMA CHAN. MANY OF YOU HAD THE OPPORTUNITY 19 AND HONOR TO WORK WITH HER. BUT WHAT A LEGACY. AND IT JUST 20 21 REALLY BRINGS TO LIGHT HOW FRAGILE A LIFE IS AND TODAY WE'RE GOING TO, AGAIN, ADJOURN IN HER MEMORY. AND WISHING THE BEST 22 TO HER FAMILY. AGAIN, I KNOW MANY COMMISSIONERS HAD AN 23 OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH HER. I ACTUALLY RECEIVED A CALL FROM 24 25 FORMER CHAIR SUPERVISOR SCOTT HAGGERTY, THE STORIES OF HIS

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EXPERIENCES WORKING WITH SUPERVISOR CHAN. SO, AGAIN, IN HER 1 MEMORY WE'LL BE ADJOURNING TODAY. IN ADDITION TO THAT, AND I 2 3 DO JUST WANT TO BRIEFLY FOLLOW UP ON THE WORKSHOP THAT WE HAD LAST MONTH. I WANT TO THANK THE COMMISSIONERS, THE PUBLIC, 4 5 STAFF. I BELIEVE IT WAS A SUCCESSFUL WORKSHOP. AND I APPRECIATE THOSE COMMISSIONERS THAT WERE ABLE TO ATTEND IN 6 PERSON. IT WAS GREAT TO BE BACK IN THE BUILDING. I THINK THE 7 8 ENERGY WAS SO VISIBLE TO HAVE A MEETING IN THE BUILDING TO BE OUR FIRST MEETING BACK IN THE BUILDING AND TO HAVE IT BE THE 9 WORKSHOP I THINK WAS SO APPROPRIATE. AND I JUST WANT TO 10 11 SUMMARIZE SOME OF THE KEY TAKEAWAYS I GLEAM FROM IT. THERE WAS STRONG SUPPORT FOR INITIATING AND ACCELERATING THE ACTION 12 STEPS IN THE TRANSIT TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN. THERE WAS A 13 SENSE OF URGENCY TO ACHIEVE OUTCOMES AND LOOK AT THE AUTHORITY 14 15 OF MTC. THERE WAS CALIBRATION -- COLLABORATION WILL BE THE 16 FOUNDATIONAL TO THE SUCCESS OF THIS EFFORT. THE ENERGY OF ROUND TRANSITIONING FROM CONSENSUS TO COMMITMENT OF ACTION. IT 17 IS A VERY SPIRITED CONVERSATION WE HAD AMONGST COMMISSIONERS. 18 AND I WILL BE CONVENING WITH THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE IN 19 DECEMBER TO GO OVER THERE TO FIND CONSENSUS AND REAFFIRM OUR 20 21 COMMITMENT AS A COMMISSION TO THE NEAR TERM ACTION STEPS. I 22 WANT TO THANK EVERY SINGLE ONE OF YOU FOR BEING COMMITTED TO 23 COMMISSIONER SPERING FOR HAVING THE IDEA TO BRING FOLKS TOGETHER WITH THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE. THIS IS A 24 CULMINATION. THIS IS THE NEXT STEP OF MANY MORE STEPS TO COME. 25

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AGAIN, WE'RE GOING TO KEEP THAT ENERGY GOING FOR THE BENEFIT 1 OF OUR TRANSIT RIDERS. SO NOW, WE DO HAVE A COUPLE OF 2 3 IMPORTANT MTC RESOLUTIONS, SOME INDIVIDUALS ARE RETIRING, UNFORTUNATELY. AND THEY WILL BE LEAVING US WITH MANY DECADES 4 5 OF INSTITUTIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND WISDOM AND, WE UNFORTUNATELY DO HAVE TO ACCEPT THESE RESOLUTIONS, I DID ASK LEGAL COUNSEL 6 COULD WE DENY THESE RESOLUTIONS AND THEY TOLD ME WE COULDN'T. 7 8 THE FIRST RESOLUTION IS 4489 IN APPRECIATION FOR RANDY RENTSCHLER, AFTER 31 YEARS, 31 YEARS, OF SERVICE TO MTC. AND 9 THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS 4494 IN APPRECIATION FOR ROSS, WHO 10 IS RETIRING AFTER 22 YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE COMMISSION. YOU 11 KNOW, AND IT IS SO EASY TO GLOSS OVER THESE NUMBERS BUT THAT 12 IS AN INCREDIBLE CAREER OF IMPACTFUL IMPACTS TO THE REGION. SO 13 THESE RESOLUTIONS ARE GOING TO BE PRESENTED TO RANDY AND ROSS. 14 15 SO I'M GOING TO READ SOME OF THE WHEREAS THAT I WAS MENTIONING 16 BEFORE. WE COULD GO WELL INTO THE AFTERNOON IF WE READ ALL OF THE WHEREASES AND THESE HIGH RESOLUTIONS. SO I'M GOING TO PICK 17 A FEW. AND THE FIRST ONE IS GOING TO BE ROSS BECAUSE MONEY 18 MAKES THE WORLD GO ROUND AND GOING BACK TO THE EARLY DAYS OF 19 HIS CAREER WITH CAL TRANS, ROSS HAS BEEN RECOGNIZED AS AN 20 21 EXPERT IN HOW TO GET PROJECTS FUNDED. SO ITEM 78 IS MTC RESOLUTIONS ASSURED 4494, IN APPRECIATION FOR ROSS ON THIS 22 OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT. WHEREAS ROSS LITERALLY WROTE THE 23 SCRIPT FOR HOW TO TAP STATE TRANSPORTATION DOLLARS DEVELOPING 24 THE INITIAL SPREADSHEET, KNOWN AS A FACT AND FUNDING SHEET. 25

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WHICH SUBSEQUENTLY INVOLVED INTO THE PROJECT PROGRAMMING 1 2 REQUEST FORM AND IS NOW IN ELECTRONIC FORM KNOWN AS AN EPPR 3 FORM FILLED OUT AND SUBMITTED ONLINE FOR EVERY CALIFORNIA TRANSPORTATION PROJECT, SEEKING THE STATE FUNDING. WHEREAS 4 5 ROSS AT THE START OF THE CENTURY WAS LURED TO MTC BY HIMSELF, RANDY RENTSCHLER, AND OTHER ONCE YOUTHFUL EMPIRE BUILDERS 6 IDENTIFIED, ADMIRED AND COVETED ROSS'S INTIMATE KNOWLEDGE OF 7 8 CAL TRAN AND MTC POLICIES PROCESSES AND PROCEDURES. WHEREAS ALSO BENEFITTED FROM ROSS'S OBSESSIVE ATTENTION TO DETAIL 9 WHICH ENSURED ALL FUNDING REQUESTS SUBMITTED BY MTC AND ANY 10 OTHER AGENCY WERE COMPLETED FLAWLESSLY AND FUNCTIONALLY AS 11 WELL AS ROSS'S FIERCELY COMPETITIVE NATURE, WHICH MADE HIM LOW 12 TO LOSE ANY NICKEL TO POSSIBLY ANY OTHER REGION, ESPECIALLY 13 L.A. I THINK THERE'S MORE TO THAT STORY. WHEREAS ROSS NORMALLY 14 15 TRAVELS TO BLACK ROCK CITY IN A FORD EXPLORER THAT HAS REACHED 16 THE AGE WHERE DUST AND DIRT NO LONGER MUCH MATTER, HE PREFERS 17 TO FLY EMIRATES BUSINESS CLASS WHEN TRAVELLING AND BURNING -- SUCH AS FAR LOCATIONS AUSTRALIA, SOUTH AFRICA, FIND, THE 18 EXPERIENCE OF BEING PICKED UP AT HOME, DRIVING TO THE AIRPORT 19 AND LOSING OUITE TO HIS LIKING. SO THEREFORE, THAT THE STAFF 20 21 AND COMMISSIONERS OF MTC THANK ROSS FOR HIS MANY CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE AGENCY AND THE PEOPLE OF CALIFORNIA CONGRATULATE HIM ON 22 HIS WELL DESERVED RETIREMENT. WISH HIM THE BEST TO HIS FAMILY 23 AND REWARDING NEW ADVENTURES STIMULATING BOTH TRAVEL, WARMTH, 24 BRILLIANT AND MANY MORE EXPERIENCES TO COME. ROSS, 25

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CONGRATULATIONS. THANK YOU FOR ALL OF YOUR SIGNIFICANT
 CONTRIBUTIONS. IT IS RARE THAT PEOPLE GET TO HAVE A CAREER.
 BUT WHEN YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE, YOUR LEGACY LIVES ON. SO ROSS,
 CONGRATULATIONS. AND NOW DO YOU HAVE ANY WORDS TO SHARE

AND 19 AFTER 22 YEARS, IT HAS BEEN AN INCREDIBLE HONOR TO WORK WITH 20 SUCH A FANTASTIC GROUP OF PEOPLE. 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POLICIES AND PROCEDURES THAT WE DEVELOP AND IT BECOMES REALLY 1 2 STANDARD PROCESSES FOR THE NATION AND WE -- IT IS JUST A 3 PLEASURE BEING PART OF THAT, IN THE BEGINNING OF THAT, AND DEVELOPING. AND GOING THROUGH ALL OF THE HURDLES AND 4 5 CHALLENGES AND OBSTACLES TO DEVELOP NEW INITIATIVES THAT EVENTUALLY BECOME JUST STANDARD PRACTICE. IT JUST SHOWS A 6 GREAT GROUP OF PEOPLE THE STAFF ARE, BUT ALSO THE 7 8 COMMISSIONERS WHO OFTEN END UP GOING TO THE STATE LEGISLATURE AND EVEN CONGRESS. SO RANDY, I JUST WANT TO PERSONALLY THANK YOU. WHEN I FIRST 22 JOINED THE COMMISSION YOU WERE INSTRUMENTAL IN MY PERSONAL ON 23 BOARDING. ONE THINGS I WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER WHEN I PICKED UP 24 THE PHONE AND CALL YOU, IS WHAT CAN I DO FOR YOU BOSS? YOU DID 25

SO IF TEXAS AND 10 LOUISIANA CAN FIGURE IT OUT, I'M CERTAIN THAT CALIFORNIA CAN. 11 THAT WAS THE FIRST THING TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT. THE SECOND 12 THING IS YOU HAVE BEFORE YOU LATER ON THE NEW LIST OF PROPOSED 13 POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL. AND ALONG WITH THAT COMES A BUMP IN 14 15 OUR STIPEND AND ADDITIONAL MEETING OUALIFICATIONS. I WOULD 16 THOROUGHLY SUPPORT THIS. IT WILL ALLOW US TO RECRUIT AND MAINTAIN A MUCH MORE ROBUST AND MUCH MORE DIVERSE GROUP OF 17 PEOPLE BECAUSE OUR GROUP IS NOT PAID TO BE ADVISERS OTHER THAN 18 OUR STIPENDS AND WE JUGGLE DAY CARE, WE JUGGLE TAKING CARE OF 19 FAMILY MEMBERS WE JUGGLE ARGUING WITH OUR BOSSES HOW LONG WE 20 21 CAN TAKE FOR THIS WHOLE MTC THING. SO THAT'S MY REPORT. THANK 22 YOU

KIMBERLY ANY PUBLIC COMMENT ASSOCIATED 3 WITH THIS ITEM? 4 5 KIMBERLY WARD, CLERK: WE HAVE NOT. AND I SEE NO MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HAND RAISED 6 7 8 ALFREDO PEDROZA, CHAIR: ALL RIGHT. RANDI THANK YOU FOR YOUR REPORT. MOVING ON TO ITEM 9 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT. THERESE 9 10 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, MR. CHAIR. AND I HAVE TO START WITH 11 PERSONAL THOUGHTS FOR BOTH RANDY AND FOR ROSS. THEY BOTH 12 WORKED DIRECTLY FOR ME FOR A BIG CHUNK OF THE -- MY FIRST 25 13 YEARS WITH THE AGENCY. SO IT WAS CLEARLY DELIGHTFUL TO 14 15 RECONNECT WITH BOTH OF THEM PROFESSIONALLY. YOU KNOW, AS IN MY 16 ROLE NOW AS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. SO ROSS, YOU KNOW, YOU TAUGHT ME THIS INVALUABLE LESSON THAT YOU SHOULD NEVER JUDGE A BOOK 17 BY ITS COVER. AND SO I -- YOU KNOW, I JUST WANT THE GLOBAL 18 REGIONS OF BURNING MAN TO STAMP YOUR ADVENTURE WITH ALL OF THE 19 ADVENTURE THAT YOU DESERVE. AND THANK YOU FOR THAT LESSON THAT 20 21 I CARRIED WITH ME FOR MANY MANY YEARS. AND RANDY, I THINK I WOULD JUST HAVE TO SAY AMONG ALL OF THE OTHER ACCOLADES THAT 22 YOUR UNSEIZING PURSUIT TO UP END THE CONVENTIONAL OR EXPECTED, 23 AT THE VERY LEAST KEPT US ON OUR TOES AND BROADENED OUR 24 PERSPECTIVES. I HOPE THAT A REAL OR VIRTUAL MOTORCYCLE IS 25

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ALWAYS AT THE READY FOR YOUR ROAD WHEREVER IT MAY LEAD. SO, 1 YOU KNOW KUDOS TO BOTH OF YOU FOR ALL OF THE INCREDIBLE WORK 2 3 THAT YOU'VE DONE FOR THE AGENCY. AND LOOK FORWARD TO STAYING IN TOUCH IN THE YEARS AHEAD. IN TERMS OF BIG THINGS THAT HAVE 4 5 BEEN HAPPENING IN THE LAST MONTH, I WANT TO POINT TO A COUPLE. AT THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON NOVEMBER THE 12TH, WE HAD 6 UPDATED COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND NOW I'M UPDATING ALL OF YOU ON 7 8 SOMETHING I'M SURE YOU'RE AWARE OF THAT THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR HAD TAKEN A POSITION CHALLENGING THE STATE OF 9 CALIFORNIA'S PENSION PROGRAM AS DEFINED IN PEPRA AS VIOLATING 10 THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING RIGHTS OF TRANSIT AGENCY EMPLOYEES 11 WHOSE PENSION PLANS WERE GUIDED BY PEPRA. AND AS A RESULT 12 FEDERAL GRANTS TO THOSE AGENCIES ARE AT RISK PENDING FINAL 13 DETERMINATIONS EITHER LEGALLY IN FEDERAL COURT, AND OR 14 ADMINISTRATIVELY AT USDLL. THAT'S A SHORT CENSUS OF A 15 16 COMPLICATED SITUATION. IN FACT, IT REVISITS CIRCUMSTANCES THAT FIRST MANIFESTED THEMSELVES IN 2018, THAT I REMEMBER VERY WELL 17 BECAUSE I WAS AT THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION AT THE 18 TIME. SO WE'RE TRACKING THIS INCREDIBLY CLOSELY FAST 19 DEVELOPING CIRCUMSTANCES. WE HAVE AND CONTINUE TO BE IN CLOSE 20 21 COMMUNICATION WITH U.S. D.O.T., PARTICULARLY AND SPECIFICALLY THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION ON STEPS THAT OUR TRANSIT 22 AGENCY PARTNERS NEED TO TAKE IN THIS EVOLVING AND SHIFTING 23 SPACE. AND WE WILL KEEP THE COMMISSIONERS ADVISED AS NEEDED ON 24 THE SITUATION. ON THE OTHER THING I'D LIKE TO MENTION AND IT 25

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IS REALLY SORT OF AN OPENER FOR MORE INFORMATION THAT WILL BE 1 FORTHCOMING TO YOU IN DECEMBER, IS THAT STATE STATUTES 2 3 GOVERNING REGIONAL MEASURE 3 MANDATE IMPOSITION ON JANUARY 1ST, 2022 OF THE SECOND OF THREE DOLLARS OF BRIDGE TOLL 4 5 INCREASES APPROVED BY THE VOTERS. AND SO THAT IS A MAJOR MILESTONE THAT IS RAPIDLY COMING UP. IN PREPARATION FOR THAT 6 ACTION, STAFF HAVE BEEN TAKING A SERIES OR PLANNING TO TAKE A 7 8 SERIES OF BOTH OPERATIONAL AND PUBLIC OUTREACH EFFORTS. AND WE WILL BE PRESENTING A FULL DESCRIPTION OF THAT SET OF ACTIONS 9 TO THE BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON DECEMBER 8TH AT THE REGULAR 10 MEETING. SO, AGAIN, JUST WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT THAT, SINCE WE'LL 11 GET STARTED BEGINNING DECEMBER THE 1ST. I'D LIKE TO CLOSE WITH 12 SOME OBSERVATIONS OF ANOTHER RECENT AND SIGNIFICANT EFFORT 13 THAT HAS BEEN BROUGHT BEFORE THE BATA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE AND 14 15 BATA AS A WHOLE, WHICH IS THE FAST TRACK EQUITY ACTION PLAN. 16 WE HAD A VERY LIVELY DISCUSSION WITH A LOT OF INCREDIBLE AND VALUABLE INPUT FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS AT THE MEETING THAT WAS 17 JUST LAST WEEK THAT BATA CHAIR AMY WORTH OVERSAW. AND IT 18 PROVIDED A LOT OF INPUT AND RICH DISCUSSION AND THE STAFF, 19 INCLUDING MYSELF, ARE TAKING ALL OF THAT, AND WORKING THROUGH 20 21 DECEMBER, TO PULL TOGETHER SORT OF AN OVERALL PRIORITY GAME PLAN TO DEVELOP AND FUND -- ON HOW WE CAN DEVELOP, FUND AND 22 SEQUENCE THE VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS THAT WERE PROPOSALS BROUGHT 23 FORWARD. WE WILL REPORT ON PROGRESS ON PULLING THAT ALL 24 TOGETHER IN JANUARY. BUT I JUST WANTED TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT WE 25

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RECEIVED A LOT OF INSIGHTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ON THINGS THAT 1 THE COMMISSIONERS IN YOUR ROLE AS THE AUTHORITY WOULD LIKE TO 2 3 SEE IN THE SPACE OF EQUITABLE IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE TOLL PAYING CUSTOMERS. TO THAT END, I ALSO WANT TO NOTE THAT I 4 5 PARTICIPATED IN A MEETING ON NOVEMBER 9TH AND KUDOS TO RANDI KINMAN WHO IS HERE WHO PARTICIPATED AS WELL IN THIS MEETING 6 WITH AFRICAN AMERICAN AFFILIATED COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION 7 8 S THAT ARE SITUATED ALONG THE EXPRESS LANE CORRIDORS. AND THEY HAD SOME VALUABLE FEEDBACK. YOU KNOW, ON THE EFFICACY AND 9 INCLUSION OF OUR OUTREACH EFFORTS AND HOW ENGAGEMENT SHOULD BE 10 BETTER STRUCTURED AROUND THE EXPRESS LANE TOLL DISCOUNT PILOT 11 AND PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION. YOU'LL BE HEARING MORE ABOUT THAT 12 TODAY.
