

ITEM FOR TODAY IS TO CONSIDER ACTION ON A ENDORSING A 17 POLICY VISION STATEMENT. NEXT SLIDE. BILL AND I HAVE BRIEF 18 REMARKS FOR YOU TODAY. I'LL START BY RECAPPING ONCE AGAIN OUR 19 STUDY RECOMMENDATIONS. BILL WILL REVIEW THE PROPOSED VISION 20 21 STATEMENT. THE STATEMENT IS SIMILAR TO A DRAFT VERSION YOU SAW 22 AT LAST MONTH'S MEETING BASED ON INPUT FROM MEMBERS. I'LL WRAP 23 UP BY OUTLINING POTENTIAL NEXT STEPS POLICY PROPOSALS SHOULD 24 TASK FORCE VOTE TO ENDORSE. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE.

SO, WE'LL BEGIN WITH A RECAP OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS.



- 1 ACTUALLY, NEXT SLIDE. SO, TASK FORCE MEMBERS ARE NOW FAMILIAR
- 2 WITH THIS FRAMEWORK WITH OUR FOUR TIERS OF INTEGRATION. TIER
- 3 ONE WHICH HAS OVERLAYS TO THE EXISTING FARE STRUCTURE SUCH AS
- 4 PASSES AND CAPS, TIER TWO, WHICH ADDS FREE AND REDUCED COST
- 5 TRANSFERS TO REDUCE BARRIERS BETWEEN AGENCIES. TIER THREE
- 6 WHICH INCLUDES A COMMON FARE STRUCTURE FOR REGIONAL SERVICES,
- 7 REGIONAL RAIL, FERRY, AND EXPRESS BUS. TIER FOUR INCLUDES A
- 8 COMMON FARE STRUCTURE FOR ALL SERVICES BOTH REGIONAL AND
- 9 LOCAL. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THIS PROJECT HAS MADE A BUSINESS
- 10 CASE FOR ADVANCING SPECIFIC STRATEGIES IN TIERS 1 THROUGH 3,
- 11 SUBJECT TO CERTAIN LIMITS AND CONDITIONS. PROJECT
- 12 RECOMMENDATIONS ARE OUTLINED HERE ACROSS THOSE THREE PHASES
- 13 AND IMPLEMENTATION. BEGINNING IN CALENDAR YEAR '22 THE
- 14 PROJECT RECOMMENDS PILOTING AN ALL AGENCY INSTITUTIONAL AND
- 15 EMPLOYER TRANSIT PASS. NEXT PHASE BEGIN IN FALL OF 2023 WITH
- 16 CLIPPER TWO WHICH IS WHEN WE RECOMMEND REPLACING THE EXISTING
- 17 PATCHWORK OF INTER-AGENCY TRANSFER DISCOUNTS WITH FREE OR
- 18 REDUCED COST INTER-AGENCY TRANSFERS REGION-WIDE. SECOND PHASE,
- 19 WE RECOMMEND CONTINUING EXPLORING OPTIONS FOR INDIVIDUAL PASS
- 20 PRODUCTS AND/OR CLIPPER START FARE CAP. FINALLY ON THE RIGHT
- 21 IS LONG-TERM RECOMMENDATION, PROJECT RECOMMENDS CONTINUING TO
- 22 INVESTIGATE THE COST AND BENEFITS OF A SHARED FARE STRUCTURE
- 23 FOR A REGIONAL SERVICE AS PART OF A BROADER ASSESSMENT POST
- 24 PANDEMIC RIDERSHIP ROLE IN THE REGION AND FUNDING STRATEGY



WITH THAT I'LL TURN IT OVER TO BILL TO REVIEW THE POLICY 1 2 STATEMENT. 3 WILLIAM BACON: THANK YOU MIKE. I'LL WALK THROUGH THE DRAFT 4 5 FARE POLICY VISION STATEMENT INCLUDED AS ATTACHMENT A TO THIS ITEM. ITEM 4A IN YOUR PACKET. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. BEFORE THE 6 TASK FORCE THIS AFTERNOON FOR YOUR REVIEW AND APPROVAL IS THE 7 8 DRAFT FARE POLICY VISION STATEMENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE VISION STATEMENT FOR TASK FORCE TO BEGIN TO ARTICULATE POLICY 9 DIRECTION THAT SUPPORT PRINCIPLE IMPORTANTLY PROVIDING 10 DIRECTION TO THE PROJECT TEAM AS WELL AS AGENCY STAFF ON HOW 11 TO PRIORITIZE UPCOMING WORK INCLUDING NEXT STEPS FOR ADVANCING 12 PILOT PROJECT AND ACTIONS OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS. THE 13 POLICY VISION STATEMENT ALSO IMPORTANTLY SIGNALS TO OUTSIDE 14 15 STAKEHOLDERS A VISION FOR CUSTOMER-CENTERED FARE POLICY 16 ACTIONS IN THE BAY AREA AND MAY STRENGTHEN THE CASE FOR NEW FUNDING INCLUDING POSSIBLY RECENTLY PASSED FEDERAL 17 INFRASTRUCTURE AND INVESTMENT AND JOBS ACT. AT TASK FORCE 18 MEETING LAST MONTH STAFF PRESENTED AN INITIAL DRAFT VERSION OF 19 THE POLICY STATEMENT HAVING A FEW CHANGES. I'LL HIGHLIGHT 20 THOSE IN THE FOLLOWING SLIDES. THE DRAFT VISION STATEMENT 21 22 BEGINS WITH A STATEMENT ON THE DRAFT STUDY FINDINGS AND 23 ACKNOWLEDGES THAT MORE COORDINATED INTEGRATED FARE POLICY MAY OFFER COST EFFECTIVE OPTIONS FOR IMPROVING THE TRANSIT 24

CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE PROMOTING TRANSIT RIDERSHIP RECOVERY FROM



- 1 THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC REDUCING REGIONAL VEHICLE MILES TRAVELED
- 2 GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS AND OVERALL TRANSIT TRAVEL TIMES FOR
- 3 CUSTOMERS. NO CHANGES HAVE BEEN MADE TO THIS INTRODUCTORY
- 4 STATEMENT OF FINDINGS SINCE THE DRAFT PRESENTED LAST MONTH.
- 5 NEXT SLIDE. NEXT PIECE OF THE VISION STATEMENTS ARE THE
- 6 TRANSIT FARE POLICY INITIATIVES FOR FURTHER DEVELOPMENT. THESE
- 7 FOUR INITIATIVES MATCH THE PROMOTION FROM THE PROJECT TEAM
- 8 BROUGHT FORTH IN OUR BUSINESS CASE REPORT. I'M NOT GOING TO
- 9 REACH THROUGH EACH BUT SUMMARIZE THE FOUR SHOWN HERE FIRST
- 10 FOCUSING ON ALL TRANSIT AGENCY INSTITUTIONAL AND EMPLOYER PASS
- 11 PILOT CALENDAR YEE 2022 SECOND FOCUSES ON IMPLEMENTING NO COST
- 12 LOCAL TRANSFER AND REDUCED COST REGIONAL TRANSFER PRUSHTH U
- 13 PRODUCT FOR TRANSIT USERS TRANSFERRING BETWEEN DIFFERENT
- 14 TRANSIT AGENCIES STARTING IN 2023 AFTER THE LAUNCH OF THE NEXT
- 15 GENERATION CLIPPER SYSTEM. THE THIRD FOCUSES ON EXPANDING AND
- 16 OFFERING AN ALL TRANSIT AGENCY PASS PRODUCT THAT WILL BE
- 17 AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC, AGAIN, AFTER THE NEXT
- 18 GENERATION CLIPPER SYSTEM IS AVAILABLE. AND, FINALLY, THE
- 19 FOURTH FOCUSES ON REFINING A VISION FOR A COMMON FARE
- 20 STRUCTURE, EITHER DISTANCE OR ZONE BASED FOR REGIONAL RAIL
- 21 FERRY BUS SYSTEM AFTER FUTURE LUNCH OF THE NEXT GENERATION
- 22 CLIPPER SYSTEM THIS SECTION OF THE POLICY VISION STATEMENT WAS
- 23 MOVED FROM THE END OF THE STATEMENT DOCUMENT TO BECOME THE
- 24 SECOND SECTION OF THE DOCUMENT SINCE LAST MONTH'S DRAFT THIS
- 25 CHANGE WAS MADE IN ORDER TO HAVE THE POLICY VISION LEAD WITH A



- 1 FORWARD LOOKING ACTION ORIENTED SET OF LANGUAGE. YOU CAN GO ON
- 2 TO THE NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. FINAL SECTION OF THE VISION
- 3 STATEMENT INCLUDES FOUR COMPLEMENTARY AND NECESSARY
- 4 OBJECTIFIES TO FACILITATE DELIVERY OF THE TRANSIT FARE POLICY
- 5 INITIATIVES PREREQUISITES THAT WERE IN THE DRAFT PRESENTED
- 6 LAST MONTH THERE ARE ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE ADDED TO THE
- 7 INTRODUCTORY SECTION SPOTLIGHTING IMPORTANCE OF COLLABORATION
- 8 AND ECONOMIC CHALLENGES FACING BAY AREA TRANSIT OPERATORS.
- 9 THESE COMPLEMENTARY AND NECESSARY OBJECTIVES HAVE BEEN
- 10 INFORMED BY FEEDBACK THAT THE PROJECT TEAM HAS HEARD FROM
- 11 TRANSIT AGENCY GOVERNING BOARDS, DISCUSSIONS WITH TASK FORCE
- 12 MEMBERS, AGENCY STAFF, AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS. AGAIN, I'M NOT
- 13 GOING TO READ THROUGH EACH OF THESE PREREQUISITES IN FULL, BUT
- 14 THEY FOCUS ON QUESTIONS LIKE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF TRANSIT
- 15 AGENCY BOARDS HAVE TO THEIR LOCAL VOTER WHO IS HAVE SUPPORTED
- 16 LOCAL FUNDING MEASURES. A NEED TO SEEK FUNDING SOURCES TO
- 17 SUPPORT THIS WORK NECESSITY OF TRANSIT AGENCY GOVERNING BOARD
- 18 APPROVAL OF POLICY CHANGES AND STATEMENT THAT FARE POLICY
- 19 CHANGES SHOULD NOT RESULT IN REDUCTION OF TRANSIT SERVICE
- 20 LEVELS. I'M GOING TO NOW TURN IT BACK OVER TO MIKE WHO WILL
- 21 CONCLUDE THE PRESENTATION FOR US.
- 23 MICHAEL EISEMAN: THANKS BILL. WE CAN MOVE TO THE FINAL SLIDE,
- 24 PLEASE. SO, LAID OUT HERE IS POTENTIAL STAFF WORK THAT WE
- 25 HAVE PROPOSED TO CONTINUE, SHOULD THE TASK FORCE APPROVE THE



- 1 BUSINESS STATEMENT TODAY ALONG WITH SOME SUPPORTING
- 2 INFORMATION. FOR PHASE A INSTITUTIONAL PASS PILOT, WE HAVE
- 3 ALREADY ESTABLISHED A SPECIAL WORKING GROUP OF STAFF FROM
- 4 SEVERAL AGENCIES TO ASSIST ON PLANNING FOR DESIGN DEVELOPMENT
- 5 AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT FOR POTENTIAL PILOT. THERE IS SOME
- 6 TECHNICAL CHANGES NEEDED IN THE CLIPPER SYSTEM, WHICH IS READY
- 7 TO BEGIN AND COULD COMPLETE IN JULY, WE BELIEVE. I'LL NOTE
- 8 THAT IN THEIR OCTOBER WORKSHOP MTC COMMISSION HAS EXPRESSED
- 9 INTEREST IN PROVIDING SOME FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE PILOT THOUGH
- 10 THEY HAVE NOT YET TAKEN ANY FORMAL ACTION. WE HAVE IMPORTANT
- 11 REMAINING QUESTIONS ABOUT THE APPROPRIATE SCALE OF THE PILOT
- 12 AND DEGREE OF POTENTIAL REVENUE RISK IF ANY IF IT SHOULD
- 13 TOLERATE. WE WOULD CONTINUE PAYMENT PLANS AND PROJECT
- 14 MANAGEMENT PLANS TO REPORT BACK TO THIS TASK FORCE IN JANUARY
- 15 FREE AND REDUCED COST INTER-AGENCY TRANSFERS WITH YOUR
- 16 ENDORSEMENT TODAY STAFF WOULD CONTINUE WORKING TO DEVELOP
- 17 RECOMMENDATIONS AND RETURN IN JANUARY WITH PROPOSED NEXT
- 18 STEPS. A FEW REMAINING OUESTIONS, OF COURSE INCLUDE REVENUE
- 19 AND FUNDING FRAMEWORK ENDORSEMENT ON THE POLICY VISION TODAY
- 20 DOESN'T ENTAIL COMMITMENT TO ANY SPECIFIC REVENUE FUNDING PLAN
- 21 SIGNIFICANT WORK REMAINS ON THAT FRONT AND WOULD ULTIMATELY BE
- 22 CONTINGENT ON THE AGENCY BOARD ACTIONS. LOOKING AHEAD PROJECT
- 23 TEAM ANTICIPATE SEEKING TASK FORCE APPROVAL FOR THE FINAL
- 24 PROJECT IN EARLY 2022, AND ONCE THE FORMAL PROJECT HAS
- 25 CONCLUDED THE PROJECT TEAM RECOMMENDS THAT THE TASK FORCE



CONSIDER CONTINUE TO MEET ON A LESS FREQUENT BASIS TO PROVIDE 1 PROJECT DIRECTION AND OVERSIGHT OF THE DELIVERY OF THE PRODUCT 2 3 RECOMMENDATIONS. WITH THAT I'LL HAND IT BACK OVER TO THE CHAIR 4 5 MICHAEL HURSH, CHAIR: THANK YOU, MIKE, AND BILL, GREAT PRESENTATION. I'M GOING TO HAND IT OVER TO THE TASK FORCE 6 MEMBERS FOR OUESTIONS, COMMENTS, THOUGHTS? I DON'T SEE ANY 7 8 HANDS RAISED. THERE WE GO. KATE MILLER 9 KATE MILLER: THANK YOU. I APPRECIATE THE WORK THAT STAFF IS 10 DOING ON THIS. MY QUESTION IS, WHEN WILL THE FORMAL OUTREACH 11 TO PUBLIC BOARDS BEGIN? SO WE'RE AVAILABLE TO PRESENT TO ANY OF YOUR 19 AGENCY BOARDS IF YOU ARE INTERESTED, PLEASE JUST LET US KNOW, 20 21 AND WE'LL MAKE OURSELVES AVAILABLE. 22 23 KATE MILLER: GREAT.
