



KNOW, THAT I THINK THE CHANGES THAT ARE BEING CONTEMPLATED BY 1 THE JPB THIS MONTH THEY ADDRESS ONGOING CHALLENGES CALTRANS 2 3 FACES IN THE NEXT FEW YEARS AND ALONGSIDE OF THAT MTC IS BEING LOOKING AT SOME REGIONAL RAIL AS WELL AS NETWORK MANAGEMENT. 4 5 IT'S IMPORTANT THAT JPB CAN CONTINUE TO ASSESS LONGER TERM STRUCTURAL CHANGES IN THE REGION CONTEXT TO BETTER FACILITATE 6 AND IMPROVE GOVERNANCE. REALLY THE SECOND CONDITION REALLY 7 8 WOULD BE A INCLUSION OF POLICY STATEMENT AFFIRMING THAT JPB AGREEMENT DOES NOT PRECLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS FORTHCOMING FROM 9 THE NETWORK MANAGEMENT BUSINESS CASE OR THE REGIONAL RAIL 10 STUDY AND A CONDITION OF ANY FUTURE VALUATION OR RECONVENING 11 AROUND THE GOVERNANCE PROCESS WOULD INCLUDE CONSULTATION ABOUT 12 THE STATUS OR ANY RECOMMENDATIONS THAT WOULD HAVE BEEN 13 FORTHCOMING FROM THOSE TWO PROCESSES. AND THE FINAL SLIDE LAYS 14 OUT THE RECOMMENDATION, WHICH, AGAIN, IS TO APPROVE THE 19.6 15 16 MILLION TO SAMTRANS TO RETIRE THE PRINCIPLE BALANCE FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE CALTRAIN RIGHT OF WAY AND THAT IT ALSO LAYS 17 OUT THAT WE WOULD RETURN WITH SPECIFIC PROGRAMMING AND 18 ALLOCATIONS ACTIONS THIS CALENDAR YEAR WITH A GOAL OF COMING 19 BACK IN THE NEXT SIX MONTHS. SORRY IF THAT WASN'T BRIEF. 20
