WITH THAT WE'RE GOING TO SLIDE 23 INTO ITEM NUMBER FOUR WHICH IS GOING TO BE PART OF THE MEAT OF OUR MEETING TODAY. OUR ORIENTATION, AND, AGAIN, I'M GOING TO 24 TURN BACK TO OUR DIRECTOR THERESE MCMILLAN. THANK YOU THERESE. 25

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2 THERESE MCMILLAN: THANK YOU SO MUCH, CHAIR KINMAN. AND, AGAIN, 3 WELCOME TO ALL OF YOU. ONE OF THE THINGS THAT YOU'RE GOING TO DISCOVER SHORTLY IS THAT UNFORTUNATELY VERY OFTEN WE HAVE OUR 4 5 TIME PULLED IN MANY DIRECTIONS AT THE SAME TIME. SO I'M GOING TO BE WITH YOU UNTIL ABOUT 1:30, AND JUST WANTED TO SAY, IT IS 6 NOT FOR LACK OF WANTING TO BE WITH YOU THE ENTIRE TIME, BUT, 7 8 THERE IS A LOT THAT I'M BEING ASKED TO DO TODAY. SO APPRECIATE THE TIME I DO HAVE WITH YOU. 9

11 WENDI KALLINS: I THINK YOU MEANT 2:30.

THERESE MCMILLAN: I'M SORRY. I SAID I CAN WITH BE YOU UNTIL 13 ABOUT 2:00. THEN I'LL NEED TO JUMP OFF. I'M A HALF AN HOUR OFF 14 15 FROM OUR START TIME. IN ANY CASE, I WANTED TO START OUT, 16 BEFORE WE BRING UP THE PRESENTATION, GIVING YOU A SENSE OF WHAT YOU'RE TAKING ON AND HOW IMPORTANT IT IS FOR THE 17 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSIONERS. I WOULD LIKE TO 18 SAY, YOU'RE BOARDING A REALLY BIG SHIP THAT'S SAILING SOME 19 PRETTY BIG OCEANS. AND ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WE HOPE TO 20 21 ACCOMPLISH WITH YOU TODAY IS GIVING YOU A SENSE OF WHAT THAT LANDSCAPE IS THAT THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION OVERSEES AND 22 THE DIFFERENT HATS THAT IT WEARS. FOR EXAMPLE, YOU WILL FIND 23 OUT IT'S ALSO THE BAY AREA TOLL AUTHORITY. IT'S ALSO MOST 24 RECENTLY THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY. AND IT SPEAKS 25

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TO THE IMPORTANT ROLE OF REGIONAL AGENCY IN AN AREA AS DIVERSE 1 AND COMPLEX AS THE BAY AREA. 101 JURISDICTIONS ARE PART OF 2 3 THIS. THE NINE COUNTIES THAT ALL, YOU KNOW, TOUCH THE BAY AT SOME POINT. AND THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL HAS A CRUCIAL ROLE 4 5 IN BEING ABLE TO BRING YOUR PERSPECTIVES, WHETHER YOU'RE REPRESENTING ECONOMIC, SOCIAL JUSTICE, THE RIGHTS OF PEOPLE 6 WITH MORE LIMITED DISABILITIES, SENIORS, YOU KNOW, THE WHOLE 7 8 PALLET OF CONSIDERATIONS THAT WE NEED TO TAKE INTO ACCOUNT RECOGNIZING THIS OUR POLICY IMPACTS ON PEOPLE. AND ONE OF THE 9 THINGS THAT'S EXTREMELY GRATIFYING AND IMPORTANT IS THE 10 COMMISSION AND ABAG, ASSOCIATION OF BAY AREA GOVERNMENTS OF 11 WHICH I AM DIRECTOR WE'LL GET TO BOTH. ADOPTED AN EOUITY 12 PLATFORM TWO YEARS AGO, AND WE HAVE COME A LONG DISTANCE IN 13 SPEAKING TO HOW TO IMPLEMENT THAT PLATFORM WHICH TALKS ABOUT 14 15 DEFINING AND MEASURING WHAT WE MEAN BY EQUITY, LISTENING AND 16 LEARNING TO THOSE MOST IMPACTED BY OUR DECISIONS AND CHOICES, FOCUSSING AND DELIVERING ON IMPROVEMENTS ON THE GROUND THAT 17 REALLY BENEFIT FOLKS WHO NEED THEM MOST. AND TRAINING AND 18 GROWING IN A SPACE WHERE THERE IS ALWAYS SOMETHING NEW TO 19 LEARN AND SOMETHING, YOU KNOW, TO RESPECT IN TERMS OF 20 21 ESTABLISHING THE CONNECTIONS WITH THE COMMUNITIES WE SERVE. THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL, WITH RANDI AS ITS LEAD, HAS BEEN 22 A POINT OF THE SPEAR IN ENSURING THAT EVEN PRIOR TO THE EOUITY 23 PLATFORM THAT EQUITY WAS ON THE TABLE, BUT, CERTAINLY, SINCE 24 THE PLATFORM, REINFORCING HOW WE CAN MAKE IT REAL. SO THERE IS 25

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A LOT OF OTHER THINGS WE'RE GOING TO BE ASKING YOU TO DO AND 1 PARTICIPATE IN, BUT THIS'S ONE PARTICULAR SPACE WHERE YOU ALL, 2 3 AS ADVISERS HAVE AN ADDED IMPACT, AND I EXPECT YOU WILL IN THE FUTURE TOO. SO IF WE CAN BRING UP THE SLIDE PRESENTATION. I'LL 4 5 KICK IT OFF, AND THEN BE HANDING IT TO A NUMBER OF MY COLLEAGUES. HERE WE GO. OKAY. HERE'S OUR BUILDING. 375 BEALE 6 STREET. I GUESS I WOULD SAY, AMONG OTHER THINGS, WE HAVE NOT 7 8 HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEND A LOT OF TIME THERE BECAUSE OF THE COVID PANDEMIC THAT IS IMPACTING ALL OF US. AND TO NO 9 10 SURPRISE, IT HAS HAD A HUGE REACH BOTH FOR US INDIVIDUALLY AND COLLECTIVELY. I WANT TO RECOGNIZE THAT AT THE BEGINNING. NEXT 11 SLIDE. SO WHAT WE WOULD LIKE TO DO IS GIVE YOU AN INTRODUCTION 12 OF THOSE OF US THAT WORK AT MTC. WE'LL START WITH ME. THIS IS 13 ACTUALLY A PICTURE OF MY TIME WHEN I WORKED WITH THE FEDERAL 14 15 GOVERNMENT. ONE OF MY FAVORITE PICTURES OF ALL-TIME WITH 16 PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA. JUST PRESENTING AMAZING OPPORTUNITIES 17 I HAVE HAD IN A LONG AND VARIED CAREER. I WAS BORN IN LOS ANGELES SO THE HOME TURF IS ACTUALLY SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. BUT 18 I, YOU KNOW, AMONG OTHER THINGS WAS INTO DANCE AND MUSICAL 19 THEATRE, IN HIGH SCHOOL, AND DANCE, AND PARTICULARLY IN 20 21 COLLEGE, BUT, YOU KNOW, PUT ASIDE, THOSE ARTISTIC ASPIRATIONS, AND REALLY GOT INTO TRANSPORTATION AND GRAD SCHOOL. AND I 22 SPENT 25 YEARS WITH THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION 23 BEFORE BEING ASKED BY THE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION TO SERVE AS THE 24 DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR OF THE FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION AND 25

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THEN I WAS ALSO THE ACTING ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE HEAD OF THE 1 AGENCY FOR TWO YEARS. I ACTUALLY WENT THERE THE FULL EIGHT 2 3 YEARS. I WAS THERE SIX AND A HALF YEARS BEFORE LEAVING THE ADMINISTRATION AND GOING TO LA METRO, THE THIRD LARGEST 4 5 AGENCY, TRANSIT AGENCY, IN THE COUNTRY. AND, THEN, AGAIN, BACK IN MY HOME SPACE. I WAS ABLE TO GO BACK TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA 6 TO LIVE FOR THREE YEARS WHEN I WORKED WITH LA METRO AND THEN 7 8 BECAME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF MTC AND IN 2019, AS YOU CAN TELL FROM THIS, A BIG CIRCLE. AND IT'S GOOD TO BE HERE AND WORKING 9 WITH MANY OF YOU AGAIN. SO, WHAT I'M GOING TO DO NOW IS HAND 10 IT OFF TO NALUNGO CONLEY. AND, AGAIN, ILL STAY WITH YOU AS 11 LONG AS -- WELL, IT'S 2:00 RIGHT NOW. SO I NEED TO GO TO A 12 MEETING WITH THE DIRECTOR OF CALTRANS, UP IN SACRAMENTO, 13 VIRTUALLY. SO, REALLY ENJOY THE REST OF THIS PRESENTATION, AND 14 15 I LOOK FORWARD TO SEEING YOU IN THE FUTURE, AND IN MANY 16 MEETINGS. SO, NALUNGO, I BELIEVE YOU'RE NEXT.

NALUNGO CONLEY: THANK YOU THERESE. SO, IF WE COULD HAVE THE 18 NEXT SLIDE. THANK YOU. I'LL APOLOGIZE FIRST OFF. I HAVE A BIT 19 OF A COLD. NOT COVID. SO I HOPE YOU ALL CAN UNDERSTAND ME 20 21 CLEARLY. SO, I AM -- MY NAME IS NALUNGO CONLEY, I AM CHIEF OF STAFF FOR DIRECTOR MCMILLAN AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR 22 FOR THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE AT MTC. I JOINED MTC IN 2019, AFTER A 23 SOMEWHAT NON-LINEAR, I GUESS, ENTRY INTO PUBLIC SERVICE. AS 24 25 THE SLIDE SAYS, I GREW UP IN OAKLAND CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY,

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RAISED AT OAKLAND, WENT TO HIGH SCHOOL IN SAN FRANCISCO AND MY 1 MOTHER'S FAMILY IS FROM NEW YORK, AND OF COURSE WHAT 18 YEAR-2 3 OLD WOULDN'T WANT TO SPEND THEIR FORMATIVE YEARS ON THE STREETS OF MANHATTAN SO I ENDED UP AT NYU FOR UNDERGRAD AND 4 5 STAYED THERE FOR A COUPLE OF YEARS. BUT THE SNOW AND THE COLD PUSHED ME RIGHT BACK TO CALIFORNIA, WHICH ISN'T A HARDSHIP. I 6 LOVE IT HERE. THE BAY AREA IS ABSOLUTELY WONDERFUL. AND I CAME 7 8 BACK HERE AND WORKED AT A VARIETY OF NON-PROFITS DEALING WITH ISSUES, WHICH YOU GUYS MAY HEAR ABOUT ON THIS BODY, DIGITAL 9 10 DESIGN, ACCESS TO BROADBAND, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, THIS INCUBATOR PILOT, DID A STINT IN EDUCATION DEVELOPING AND 11 MANAGING TUTORIAL PROGRAMS AND FAMILY CENTERED IN WEST 12 OAKLAND, FOCUSING ON ACTIVITIES BEFORE ENDING UP WITH THE CITY 13 OF OAKLAND IN ABOUT 2008 WORKED THERE IS EIGHT AND A HALF 14 YEARS AND ENDED UP AT THE CITY AND COUNTY SAN FRANCISCO FIRE 15 16 DEPARTMENT WHERE I DID CAPITAL PROJECT MANAGEMENT UNDER THEIR BOND PROGRAM IN 2019 I JOINED MTC IT'S BEEN A WONDERFUL 17 EXPERIENCE AN INTERESTING EXPERIENCE AS I WAS ONLY IN THAT 18 WONDERFUL BUILDING THAT YOU SEE PICTURED FOR ABOUT SEVEN 19 MONTHS BEFORE COVID HIT AND HAVE BEEN REMOTE SINCE. SO IT'S A 20 21 VERY DIFFERENT, SORT OF, LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. RIGHT? LEARNING THE PEOPLE THEY HAVE WORKED AROUND AND LEARNING THE ISSUES OF 22 THE DAY. SO IT'S A WHOLE NEW WORLD OF HOW WE INTERACT WITH ONE 23 ANOTHER. SO THAT'S DEFINITELY BEEN INTERESTING. I SEE HERE, 24 YES, IT MENTIONED I DID GO TO GRAD SCHOOL HERE AT GOLDEN GATE 25

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UNIVERSITY GOT MY MASTERS IN PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION WITH 1 CONCENTRATION IN PUBLIC POLICY. THAT IS, SORT OF, MY 2 3 EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND. AND I WILL JUST CLOSE THAT, OUTSIDE OF WORK, I AM AN AMATEUR HIKER, ALTHOUGH I DON'T DO IT AS MUCH AS 4 I WOULD LIKE, OR I SHOULD, THE BAY AREA IS WONDERFUL FOR 5 HIKING, AS YOU MAY KNOW. AND, GARDENING, I'M NOT VERY GOOD AT 6 IT, BUT I DO ENJOY GROWING PLANTS AND FLOWERS, AND LIKE MANY 7 8 OTHER PEOPLE, I HAVE PICKED UP A PANDEMIC HOBBY OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS WHERE I HAVE LEARNED HOW TO SPIN VARIOUS 9 10 FIBERS INTO YES OR NO WHICH I WEAVE INTO GAR MENTES AND FABRIC. ALIX BOCKELMAN: GOOD AFTERNOON. THANK YOU NALUNGO. MY NAME IS 15 16 ALIX BOCKELMAN, YOU ARE GOING TO MEET 2 OF 3 DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS. I OVERSEE THE POLICY PORTFOLIO, AND THAT INCLUDES A 17 LOT OF THE TOPICS THAT YOU WILL BE PROBABLY HEARING ABOUT AS 18 ADVISERS ALTHOUGH YOU WILL BE HEARING BOTHERS AS WELL BUT IN 19 PARTICULAR, THE REGIONAL PLANNING PROGRAM, THE FUNDING POLICY 20 AND PROJECTS SECTION, AND PROGRAM SECTION, AND THE LEGISLATION 21 AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS SECTION. IN TERMS OF MY PATHWAY, I GUESS, I 22 HAVE BEEN AT MTC FOR A REALLY LONG TIME. I STARTED IN 1998, 23 STRAIGHT FROM GRAD SCHOOL. ACTUALLY IT'S, SORT OF, WHERE I 24 WANTED TO WORK AND I FEEL SO FORTUNATE TO HAVE SPENT OVER TWO 25

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DECADES HERE AT MTC AND I HAVE SEEN A LOT OF CHANGE, DIFFERENT 1 BUILDING LOCATIONS, AND NOW I'M IN MY HOUSE BUT I HAVE BEEN IN 2 3 OAKLAND, SAN FRANCISCO, AND NOW BACK TO HOME UNTIL WE CAN GET BACK INTO THE OFFICE. IN TERMS OF MY BACKGROUND, IT'S HARD TO 4 5 SAY EXACTLY WHERE I'M FROM BECAUSE I ACTUALLY GREW UP IN AN AIR FORCE FAMILY. I WAS BORN IN UPSTATE NEW YORK, LIVED IN 6 OHIO LIVED IN TEXAS, LIVED IN GERMANY, AND BEFORE FINISHING 7 8 HIGH SCHOOL IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. THEN CAME UP TO BERKELEY, AND ACTUALLY DID BOTH UNDERGRAD AND A MASTERS AT BERKELEY, AND 9 10 STARTED OUT IN CIVIL ENGINEERING AND REALLY WANTED TO UNDERSTAND THE BROADER POLICY REASONS FOR A LOT OF THE 11 DECISIONS THAT ARE MADE. SO I STUDIED PUBLIC POLICY AND JUST 12 REALLY ENJOYED ALL OF THE EXCITING MOBILITY AND EQUITY AND 13 HOUSING ISSUES THAT WE'RE GETTING TO TACKLE HERE AT MTC. IN 14 15 TERMS OF WHAT I DO AWAY FROM WORK, I GUESS MORE AND MORE IT FEELS LIKE I SPEND A LOT OF TIME WITH MY OWN FAMILY, AND 16 OUTSIDE, RIGHT? ISN'T THAT HOW YOU ALL FEEL WITH COVID. I 17 THINK I USED TO DO MORE INTERESTING THINGS AND I HOPE TO AGAIN 18 SOON. I LOOK FORWARD TO GETTING TO KNOW ALL OF YOU, AND MORE 19 FROM ME A LITTLE BIT LATER. MAYBE GOING TO THE NEXT SLIDE, I 20 KNOW ONE OF MY COLLEAGUES, IF YOU MOVE TO THE NEXT SLIDE 21 ANDREW F, I BELIEVE HE CANNOT BE HERE BECAUSE HE'S IN THE SAME 22 MEETING THAT THERESE ALLUDED TO WITH SOME OF OUR OTHER STATE 23 PARTNERS, HE'S THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. HE'S OVER IN 24 OPERATIONS PORTFOLIO, HE WORKS ON A LOT OF PROJECTS THAT YOU 25

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USE TO GET AROUND THE REGION, FASTRAK, CLIPPER, LOTS OF FUN
THINGS. BUT THOSE ARE UNDER THE VARIOUS SECTIONS THAT ANDY
OVERSEES. YOU WILL GET TO MEET HIM SOME OTHER TIME. HE'S A
GREAT PERSON, LOTS OF INTERESTING HOBBIES AND THE CLIPPER CARD
WAS ACTUALLY INSPIRED BY HIS GRANDPA. THAT'S KIND OF COOL
HISTORY LESSON HE CAN GIVE YOU SOMETIME. I'LL TURN IT OVER TO
BRAD.

BRAD PAUL: I'M BRAD PAUL, DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR LOCAL 9 10 GOVERNMENT SERVICES, WHICH INCLUDES THINGS LIKE BAY ENERGY PROGRAM, SAN FRANCISCO ESTUARY PARTNERSHIP, ADVANCING 11 CALIFORNIA FINANCING AUTHORITY, BAY AREA REGIONAL 12 COLLABORATIVE AND RECENTLY SOME OF OUR HOUSING APPLICATION 13 WORK. I GREW UP ON THE EAST COAST. I STAYED IN ONE PLACE ALL 14 15 OVER MASSACHUSETTS UNTIL COLLEGE. I WENT TO WILLIAMS COLLEGE 16 IN WESTERN MASS. BACK IN THE '80'S I SERVED AS DEPUTY MAYOR OF HOUSING MAYOR ART AGNOS FROM 1980-1992. BEFORE THAT, I LIVED 17 AND WORKED IN THE TENDERLOIN DIRECTOR OF THE PLANNING AGENCY 18 FOR THE PEOPLE WHO LIVED AND WORKED THERE AND I ALSO LIVED AT 19 THE CADILLAC RESIDENTIAL HOTEL ON EDDIE STREET. I JOINED ABAG 20 21 IN 2013 AS THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR THEN SERVED AS ACTING DIRECTOR THE LAST YEAR BEFORE THE CONSOLIDATION. WORKED WITH 22 ALIX AND OTHERS ON CONSOLIDATING THE TWO STAFFS INTO ONE. 23 WHICH IS WHAT WE HAVE NOW, A SINGLE STAFF THAT SERVES BOTH 24 AGENCIES. IN TERMS OF FUN FACTS MY SON JUST LEFT FOR COLLEGE. 25

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1 HE'S JUST FINISHED HIS FIRST SEMESTER AND BEFORE THAT I USED
2 TO GO TO CAR EVENTS ALL OVER THE BAY AREA FROM SAN FRANCISCO
3 TO FREMONT. WITH THAT I'LL TURN IT OVER TO -- REBECCA IS NOT
4 HERE, SO I'LL TURN IT OVER TO RANDI AGAIN.

RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THANK YOU. AND YOU'RE 6 KIND OF GETTING A TASTE OF HOW WE HAVE TO BE A LITTLE BIT 7 8 FLEXIBLE IN OUR DAY THAT'S ASSIGNED TO US. I'LL JUST JUMP IN WITH WHAT THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL CAN AND CAN'T INFLUENCE 9 WITH A PERSONAL ANECDOTE. I JOINED THIS BODY BECAUSE I WAS 10 INVOLVED IN PLANNING WITH MULTIPLE NEIGHBORHOODS, STREETS, 11 SIDEWALKS, TREES, RAMPS, BIKE LANES, THAT RAN ALONG A CORRIDOR 12 THAT INTERSECT -- THAT RAN THROUGH MULTIPLE NEIGHBORHOODS AND 13 GETTING THEM TO ALL AGREE ON THE SAME DESIGN PLAN AND THE SAME 14 15 PLATFORM OF DEVELOPMENT. AND I WAS A LITTLE BIT DISMAYED TO 16 FIND A NEIGHBORHOOD THAT GOT THEIR MONEY AND GOT THEIR PROJECT -- PART OF THE PROJECT FINISHED QUICKER AND I LEARNED THAT MTC 17 HANDED OUT MONEY FOR THESE THINGS. SO I GOT INTERESTED IN WHAT 18 THAT COULD HAPPEN BECAUSE I FIGURED I WOULD GO FIND THAT 19 MONEY. AND WHAT I LEARNED WAS WE DON'T FIND THAT MONEY, BUT 20 21 WHAT WE DO IS WE AFFECT THE POLICIES THAT HAND OUT MONEY, AND TO ME THAT'S AN EVEN BIGGER. THAT WAS JUST EYE OPENING, AND I 22 LOVE THAT PART OF THE WORK MORE, BECAUSE IT MEANS I CAN HELP 23 DIRECT MONEY TO NEIGHBORHOODS THAT REALLY, REALLY NEED IT. SO, 24 THAT'S KIND OF MY WAY OF SAYING, WE COULDN'T HELP YOU GET A 25

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STOP SIGN AT THE END OF YOUR STREET, BUT WHAT WE CAN DO IS 1 2 IMPACT THE POLICIES ON A REGIONAL LEVEL THAT MAKE SURE WE HAVE SAFE STREETS. AND THAT, I THINK, IS REALLY, REALLY IMPORTANT. 3 HOW I WORK FORWARD, THE WORK WE DO WITH STAFF, AND I MEAN THAT 4 5 WE WORK WITH STAFF. THEY'RE NOT HERE -- THOSE OF US WHO HAVE BEEN ADVOCATES HAVE BEEN IN A POSITION WHERE STAFF WERE OUR 6 ADVERSARIES. THAT IS NOT THE CASE IN THIS POSITION. STAFF 7 8 REALLY WANTS YOUR INPUT BASED ON YOUR EXPERIENCE AND WHAT YOU DO. I WORKED WITH STAFF WHO ARE ELECTED OFFICIALS; I AM AN 9 ELECTED OFFICIAL. THIS IS A UNIQUE EXPERIENCE THAT YOU WILL 10 HAVE. IF YOU HAVE UNIQUE QUESTIONS ABOUT WHAT COMES UP ON THE 11 AGENDA, I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT YOU'RE WORKING WITH STAFF TO 12 FIND THE INFORMATION THAT YOU NEED. IF YOU GET A SLIDE THAT 13 SPEAKS OF -- YOU KNOW, THAT REFERENCES SOMETHING THAT YOU 14 15 DON'T UNDERSTAND AND YOU KNOW THERE MUST BE BACKGROUND MATERIAL FOR IT, YOU CAN DO 1 OF 2 THINGS AND THAT IS CONTACT 16 17 THE PERSON WHO IS LISTED ON THE STAFF REPORT, DIRECTLY, OR CONTACT KY-NAM, AND HE WILL PUT OUT PATH TO FINDING THE 18 INFORMATION. STAFF HERE IS ALWAYS VERY, VERY WILLING TO ANSWER 19 OUESTIONS. AND THE MORE YOU CAN FEED INTO YOUR OUESTIONS IN 20 21 BEFORE THE MEETING, THE MORE ROBUST MEETINGS WE WILL HAVE, AND THE BETTER INFORMED YOU ARE, AND STAFF WON'T HAVE TO SAY, I 22 HAVE TO GET BACK TO YOU ON THAT. THERE IS NOTHING MORE 23 FRUSTRATING THAN TO HAVE A QUESTION AND NOT HAVE THAT 24 INFORMATION. KY-NAM IS OUR LEAD STAFF MEMBER AND WILL PROVIDE 25

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YOU WITH THAT DIRECTIVE EITHER HOW TO CONTACT STAFF MEMBERS OR 1 2 IF YOU HAVE IS OTHER QUESTIONS. MARTHA MANAGES OUR BACK IF 3 MARTHA ASKS YOU TO SUPPLY A DOCUMENT, PLEASE DO. CAN I HAVE THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE? THANK YOU. BECAUSE THIS BODY IS 4 5 APPOINTED ALL AT ONCE WHAT HAPPENS IS WE ARE DISBANDED AND THEN RECONSTITUTED EVERY FOUR YEARS. THE LAST TWO COHORTS HAVE 6 HAD TIMELINES ADJUSTED TO MEET THE NEEDS OF MTC. WE HAVE 7 8 EXTENDED OUR TIME EXPERIENCED TODAY SOMETIMES OUR MEETINGS DON'T START WHEN THEY'RE SUPPOSED TO. I WANT YOU TO BE AWARE 9 10 OF THAT. THE REASON WE'RE CHANGING THIS UP, IS YOUR ORIENTATION WAS CONDUCTED OVER THE PERIOD OF TWO OR THREE 11 MONTHS, AND STAFF WAS UP FRONT FACING, WE WANT TO MAKE SURE WE 12 WORK WITH STAFF WE'RE TRYING THIS SYSTEM HERE WHERE ONE OF THE 13 COUNCIL MEMBERS IS ACTUALLY LEADING THE MEETINGS. THE POLICY 14 15 ADVISORY COUNCIL WAS FORMED IN AN EFFORT TO STREAMLINE AND 16 ENHANCE THE ADVISORY BODIES THAT PREVIOUSLY EXISTED. THERE WERE THREE OF THEM AND WHAT THAT MEANT WAS, WHILE WE HAD THE 17 ABILITY TO FOCUS DISCUSSION OF POLICY AROUND SPECIFIC GROUPS, 18 WHETHER IT WAS LOW-INCOME OR SENIORS OR THE DISABLED, THOSE 19 GROUPS MET ON A SEPARATE -- AS SEPARATELY. AND, SO, WHAT WOUND 20 UP HAPPENING WAS STAFF WAS GIVING THE SAME PRESENTATIONS TO 21 MULTIPLE GROUPS. AND IT WAS TIME CONSUMING. NUMBER ONE. BUT 22 WHAT WOUND UP HAPPENING WAS THE LAST GROUP TO HAVE THEIR SAY 23 IN THE MATTER BENEFITTED FROM THE OTHER TWO GROUPS AND THEN 24 THE OTHER TWO GROUPS WOULD SAY WELL WAIT A MINUTE WE WANT TO 25

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ADD ON TO WHAT THEY SAID OR WE DON'T AGREE WITH WHAT -- THIS 1 WORKED OUT A WHOLE LOT BETTER FOR EVERYBODY ALL THE WAY AROUND 2 3 BECAUSE THERE'S VALUE IN HAVING PEOPLE SIT DOWN WITH COMMON ISSUES, AND TALKING TO PEOPLE WHO COME FROM DIFFERENT 4 5 BACKGROUNDS TO GET TO A CONSENSUS. THE COUNCIL IS MADE UP OF 27 MEMBERS FROM NINE BAY AREA COUNTIES. EACH COUNTY HAS AT 6 LEAST TWO REPRESENTATIVES. AND THE AT-LARGE SEATS ARE WEIGHTED 7 8 SO THAT THE MORE POPULATED COUNTIES HAVE MORE REPRESENTATION, HAVE AT LEAST FIVE OF THOSE, NINE AT-LARGE ARE FROM THE FIVE 9 MOST POP COMMUNITIES, BUT IT DOESN'T OVERWEIGH OUR MEMBERSHIP 10 TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE MORE POPULATED COUNTIES. SO SONOMA HAS 11 AS MUCH REPRESENTATION AS SANTA CLARA COUNTY. I LIVE IN A CITY 12 THAT'S BIGGER THAN, I THINK, THREE OF THE COUNTIES. SO WE 13 WANTED TO MAKE SURE, OR THE COMMISSIONS WANTED TO MAKE SURE 14 15 THAT THEIR BODY REPRESENTED A GREAT CROSS SECTION OF PEOPLE 16 FROM DIFFERENT INTEREST, AND DIFFERENT ABILITIES, AND DIFFERENT REGIONS. I CAN'T SPEAK TO SEE HOW THIS ALL WORKS ON 17 THE BACK END, AND MAYBE KY-NAM IF YOU WANT TO GIVE A BRIEF 18 MINUTE OR TWO ON HOW THAT FLESHES OUT ON THE BACK SIDE OF THE 19 APPLICATIONS ONCE THEY HIT THE COMMUNITY -- OR THE COMMISSION? 20 21

TEDDY KY-NAM MILLER: I MEAN, I'LL JUST DISTILL IT TO, YOU
KNOW, WE HAVE 130 FOLKS WHO APPLY AND WE HAVE THESE CRITERIA
TO MAKE SURE THAT'S PROPORTIONAL, BUT WE STRIVE TO GET A



DIVERSITY BOTH GEOGRAPHICALLY AND INTEREST GROUPS. AND HERE WE
 HAVE SUCH A DIVORCE GROUP HERE.

RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: THANK YOU. THE OTHER THING THAT HAPPENS 4 5 IS WE HAVE SUBCOMMITTEES AND WE HAVE COMMITTEES THAT DO THE SAME KIND OF WORK WHEN WE ARE ESTABLISHING THOSE TO MAKE SURE 6 THAT WE HAVE NOT EVERYBODY CLUMPED TOGETHER IN ONE SECTION. DO 7 8 NOT REPRESENT OUR COMMISSIONERS WHICH IS A LITTLE DIFFERENT WHEN YOU SIT ON BODIES WE REPRESENT OUR OWN INTEREST AND OUR 9 10 OWN FEELINGS AND OUR OWN EXPERIENCES. BUT WHAT I WOULD SAY, AND WHAT I WOULD RECOMMEND IS YOU CONTACT YOUR COMMISSIONERS 11 AND ASK THEM IF THEIR STAFF HAVE SOME TIME TO -- OR THE STAFF 12 OF YOUR AGENCIES, TO HAVE SOME TIME TO GIVE YOU JUST AN 13 OVERVIEW OF WHAT THAT I THINK ARE THE ISSUES FACING THEM GOING 14 15 FORWARD. EVERY -- WE HAVE, I THINK, IT IS 27 TRANSIT AGENCIES, 16 AND COVID TOOK ALL OF THEM TO THE EDGE OF THE CLIFF. ABSOLUTELY DECIMATED THROUGH EVERYTHING IN THE BLENDS BLENDER 17 AND WE'RE STILL WORKING ON THAT. IT'S IMPORTANT TO HAVE AN 18 UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT YOUR AREA FACES BUT I WANT YOU TO 19 UNDERSTAND THAT YOU'RE HERE REPRESENTING YOURSELF. NEXT SLIDE, 20 21 PLEASE OF THE. AND THIS SLIDE REPRESENTS HOW MTC RECEIVES 22 INPUT AND WHERE WE ARE IN THAT. AND YOU WILL NOTICE WE AREN'T CONNECTED TO ANYTHING. THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL RESPOND AND 23 REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE COMMISSION AS A WHOLE. WE HAVE ONE 24 STANDING SUBCOMMITTEE THAT IS DEEMED NECESSARY BY THE 25

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COMMISSION AND IT'S CALLED THE EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE. 1 2 AND THAT'S TO ENSURE THAT WE HAD AN EQUITY LENS ACROSS THE 3 BOARD AND ESPECIALLY ON POPULATIONS THAT DON'T FIT INTO EQUITY REVIEW. THERE IS NOTHING IN STANDARDIZED REPORTING THAT SAYS 4 5 HOW ARE SENIORS BENEFITTING FROM YOUR POLICIES. THERE IS NOTHING THAT REALLY ATTRACTS OUR DISABLED COMMUNITIES AND 6 THEIR ACCESS OTHER THAN OUR ABILITY TO MEET ADA STANDARDS 7 8 WHICH EVERYBODY FEELS IS DEFICIENT AND EVERYBODY AGREES NEEDS TO BE BOLSTERED UP. WE HAVE THAT AS A STANDARD COMMITTEE WHERE 9 WE CAN FEED A LOT OF INFORMATION IN AND OUT AND DO A LOT OF 10 BACKGROUND WORK AND LOOK AT POLICIES AND HOW THEY AFFECT 11 THINGS. WE'RE GOING TO TAKE A DEEPER DIVE INTO THE STRUCTURE 12 OF OUR BODY AS IT REPORTS BUT IN GENERAL OUR COMMITTEES BREAK 13 OUT WHETHER THEY ARE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES OR WHETHER THEY 14 15 ARE -- WE HAVE A STUDENTS INTERNSHIP PROGRAM MEET, THEY FLOW 16 BACK INTO OUR COMMITTEE, AND OUR COUNCIL REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE COMMISSION EVERY MONTH IN A REPORT BASED ON THE WORK THAT 17 WE'RE DOING OR ACTIONS WE HAVE TAKEN OR THINGS WE WANT THE 18 COMMISSION TO LOOK AT. AND IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT WHEN WE 19 DO THIS, IF WE TAKE AN ACTION IF WE HAVE A VOTE, IF WE TACK A 20 21 STAND ON SOMETHING THAT WE DON'T, FOR INSTANCE, MARCH ON SACRAMENTO, AND SAY THIS IS WHO WE AND ARE WHAT WE DO. WHAT WE 22 DO IS MAKE SURE YOU HAVE THE INFORMATION SO THAT YOU CAN MAKE 23 THOSE TRIPS, OR YOU CAN MAKE THOSE PHONE CALLS OR YOU CAN MAKE 24 THOSE STATEMENTS, AND YOU HAVE THE BODY THAT HAS DONE THE 25

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RESEARCH ON THESE ISSUES TO GO BACK TO YOUR COMMUNITY AND MAKE 1 2 THOSE STANDS. OUR SOLE RESPONSIBILITY IS TO REPORT TO THE 3 COMMISSION. AND THAT -- WITH THIS, I'M GOING TAKE A QUICK BREAK HERE AND SEE IF ANYBODY HAS ANY OUESTIONS ON WHAT'S 4 5 GOING ON. IF YOU DO, RAISE YOUR HANDS. AND I'LL CALL ON YOU IN 6 ORDER. AND I SEE WALTER WILSON HAS HIS HAND UP FIRST. GO 7 AHEAD, WALTER. 8 WALTER WILSON: HELLO. GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYONE. AND HAPPY NEW 9 10 YEAR. THANK YOU, CHAIR, I APPRECIATE BEING RECOGNIZED. I'M IN MY CAR, SO EXCUSE ME IF I DON'T COME THROUGH CLEARLY. A COUPLE 11 OF THINGS THAT I WANTED TO SAY -- [AUDIO DIFFICULTIES] 12 13 RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: DID WE LOSE YOU, WALTER? 14 15 16 CLERK, MARTHA SILVER: WALTER, YOU MUTED YOURSELF. WALTER, TRY 17 AGAIN 18 WALTER WILSON: YEAH I'M STILL HERE. A COUPLE OF THINGS. IN AS 19 MUCH AS WE DO REPRESENT OURSELVES AND OUR OWN VIEWS AND IDEAS, 20 21 LIKE MYSELF, FOR EXAMPLE, I'M A COMMUNITY ACTIVIST AND I REPRESENT SEVERAL OTHER GROUPS AND I ADVOCATE FOR THOSE GROUPS 22 AND THIS FORUM THIS, COMMITTEE, IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL OF 23 US TO BE ABLE TO DO THAT AS WELL, NOT JUST REPRESENT YOUR OWN 24 VIEWS, BUT ALSO, IF YOU SEE THINGS THAT ARE DEFICIENT IN TERMS 25



OF PEOPLE YOU WANT TO REPRESENT, THE HANDICAP, DISABLED, 1 2 PEOPLE OF COLOR, OTHER ISSUES -- AND I STRONGLY RECOMMEND THIS 3 TO EVERYBODY, ESPECIALLY THE NEW MEMBERS, PLEASE FEEL FREE TO SPEAK UP. BECAUSE IF YOU ARE NOT HEARD THEN PEOPLE WILL NEVER 4 5 KNOW WHAT YOU'RE VIEWS ARE. I DO THAT. I SPEAK UP FOR ISSUES THAT I THINK ARE IMPORTANT THAT I THINK MTC SHOULD BE TOUCHING 6 ON AND SHOULD BE ADVOCATING FOR. THAT'S ONE THING THAT'S 7 8 IMPORTANT. THE OTHER THING IS, IT WOULD BE GOOD TO KNOW, AND MAYBE STAFF -- OR THE CHAIR CAN GIVE US SOME INSIGHT ON, IS, 9 WHAT IS OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH ABAG BECAUSE YOU MENTIONED 10 STAFFING, BOTH ABAG AS WELL AS MTC. WHAT IS THIS COMMITTEE'S 11 RELATIONSHIP WITH ABAG F ANY? THANK YOU VERY MUCH. 12

14 RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: AND JUST FOR EVERYBODY'S KNOWLEDGE, STAFF
15 WILL BE PRESENTING ON THAT AS WE GO THROUGH THIS PROCESS.
16 WE'RE TRYING TO GIVE EVERYBODY A BIG LARGE HIGH OVERVIEW AND
17 WORK OUR WAY DOWN THROUGH THE STRUCTURE OF MTC AND HOW IT
18 INTERACTS. I HAVE HOWARD UP NEXT. AND THEN VEDA.

HOWARD WONG: THANK YOU. I LIKE THE ASPECT OF OUR ROLE WHERE WE
CAN ACTUALLY CONTACT STAFF REGARDING REPORTS AND OTHER
MATTERS. THE ONLY QUESTION I HAD WAS WHEN A COUNCILMEMBER
CONTACTS A STAFF MEMBER AND RECEIVES INFORMATION, SHOULDN'T
THAT INFORMATION SOMEHOW BE COMMUNICATED TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE
COUNCIL? OTHERWISE ONE MEMBER MAY RECEIVE SOME, YOU KNOW,

RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: IT ACTUALLY DOES. IF STAFF RECEIVES 4 5 QUESTIONS, THEY WILL RELAY THAT TO US EITHER AT THE MEETING, THEY WILL SUPPLEMENT THEIR STAFF REPORT OR WHATEVER REPORT 6 THEY'RE WORKING ON. IF YOU HAVE OUESTIONS THAT ARE ASKED 7 8 DURING A MEETING, STAFF GETS ALL OF THOSE WRITTEN DOWN, AND EVERYTHING BECOMES PART OF THE ONGOING DISCUSSION THAT 9 EVERYBODY HAS ALL OF THE SAME INFORMATION. DOES THAT HELP? 10 OKAY. THANK YOU. VEDA? 11

VEDA FLOREZ: GOOD AFTERNOON COUNCIL MEMBERS AND CHAIR KINMAN. 13 SO I JUST WANT TO WELCOME EVERYONE TO THE GROUP. AND I SEE SO 14 MANY NEW FACES. IT'S VERY EXCITING TO HAVE A NEW COHORT TO 15 16 MOVE FORWARD. AND I DO WANT TO SAY THAT THE EOUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE IS A GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL OF US TO HAVE A 17 LITTLE DEEPER DIVE ON THE INFORMATION THAT WE WOULDN'T 18 NORMALLY GET AS A GENERAL PUBLIC ADVISORY COUNCIL. SO IF YOU 19 ARE INTERESTED IN A LITTLE DEEPER DIVE IN SOME OF THE EQUITY 20 21 PIECES. I HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU ASK CHAIR KINMAN OR KY-NAM 22 THAT -- AND LET THEM KNOW THAT YOU ARE INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING WITH US. AND IN THE PAST, I HAVE BEEN THE CHAIR 23 OF THE EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE, AND THERE IS GREAT 24 OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU THERE, AND I WOULD REALLY LIKE TO GIVE 25

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ANOTHER SHOUT OUT TO STAFF. STAFF IS AVAILABLE FOR US FOR THE 1 EXTRA CONVERSATION AND PIECES OF INFORMATION. AND IF YOU FIND 2 3 SOME -- HAVE A QUESTION THAT YOU WOULD -- THAT YOU THINK IS IMPORTANT FOR THE REST OF THE COUNCIL, YOU COULD ASK STAFF TO 4 5 SHARE THE INFORMATION WITH THE REST OF THE COUNCIL. I MEAN, THIS'S A REALLY IMPORTANT PIECE THAT WE COULD EDUCATE EACH 6 OTHER AS WE MOVE THE NEEDLE FORWARD. AND NOT ONLY IS STAFF 7 8 ACCESSIBLE, BUT ALSO THE COMMISSIONERS ARE ACCESSIBLE, AS WELL. SO I HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU HAVE AN APPOINTMENT WITH 9 YOUR COMMISSIONER. GET TOGETHER WITH THE OTHERS FROM YOUR 10 COUNTY TO TALK TO THEM AND MAKE SURE THAT YOU'RE ON THE SAME 11 12 PAGE. THANK YOU.

14 RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: THANK YOU. AND, JUST SO EVERYBODY KNOWS,
15 WE'LL GO THROUGH THE LIST OF AD-HOC COMMITTEES THAT ARE
16 CURRENT. WE WILL RECONSTITUTE THE EQUITY AND ACCESS
17 SUBCOMMITTEE. AND WE'LL BE GETTING MORE INFORMATION ON THAT AT
18 THE NEXT MEETING. CHRISTINA GOTUACO?

20 KRISTINA GOTUACO: THANK YOU EVERYONE. I WANT TO SECOND WHAT
21 WALTER TALKED ABOUT THIS IS A FORUM FOR US TO HEAR EACH
22 OTHER'S VOICES AND IF PEOPLE DON'T SPEAK UP THEN IT'S KIND OF
23 A MISSED OPPORTUNITY. I WAS NEW ON THIS BODY JUST TWO YEARS
24 AGO, AND SOMETIMES I HAVE MISSED THE OPPORTUNITY TO THROW IN A
25 COMMENT THAT I HAD ON MY MIND. IT'S JUST SOMETIMES THE ITEM



NEVER GETS CIRCLED BACK TO BECAUSE EACH AGENDA ITEM HAS ITS
 DEDICATED TIME IF YOU HAVE A THOUGHT RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY
 IT JUST SO THE REST OF US CAN LEARN FROM EACH OTHER'S
 EXPERIENCE.

6 RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: THANK YOU CHRISTINA. ANY OTHER COMMENTS
7 OR QUESTIONS FROM COUNCIL MEMBERS? WE'RE GOING TO START
8 UNDERSTANDING A LITTLE BIT BETTER WHAT A REGIONAL
9 TRANSPORTATION AGENCY DOES AND I'LL TURN THAT BACK OVER TO
10 ALIX BOCKELMAN. ALIX?

11

REBECCA LONG: I THINK ALIX WAS DOUBLE BOOKED. I KNOW IT'S A 12 BUSY TIME RIGHT NOW. SO I AM HAPPY TO TAKE IT FROM HERE. HI 13 EVERYBODY. MY NAME IS REBECCA LONG AND I AM THE ACTING 14 DIRECTOR OF LEGISLATION AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS. WELCOME TO THE NEW 15 16 COUNCIL MEMBERS AND NICE TO SEE THOSE OF YOU WHO ARE RETURNING. SO, THIS SLIDE REALLY IS JUST KIND OF A BIG PICTURE 17 SLIDE. JUST TO ORIENT YOU TO THE JURISDICTION OF MTC AND HOW 18 LARGE IT IS AND HOW COMPLEX IT IS FROM A TRANSPORTATION 19 STANDPOINT. SO, WE ARE THE NINE COUNTIES OF THE SAN FRANCISCO 20 BAY AREA. FROM A CENSUS STANDPOINT, AND THIS ALSO AFFECTS SOME 21 22 OF THE BUCKETS OF FUNDING THAT WE RECEIVE. THERE IS 12 DIFFERENT URBANIZED AREAS. SO, AGAIN, THAT'S A CENSUS 23 DESIGNATION. THERE ARE 101 CITIES AND TOWNS POPULATION ALMOST 24 8 MILLION AND WE HAVE 27 DIFFERENT INDEPENDENT TRANSIT 25

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AGENCIES. I KNOW YOU'RE ALL FROM ALL ACROSS THE REGION. WE 1 HAVE SEVERAL MULTI-COUNTY TRANSIT AGENCIES LIKE BART, AC 2 3 TRANSIT, BUT, YOU KNOW, MANY OF THEM ARE JUST COUNTY-SPECIFIC, AND SOME CITY-SPECIFIC. NEXT SLIDE. SO OUR GOVERNANCE IS SET 4 5 IN STATE LAW. MTC IS ACTUALLY JUST TURNED 50 OVER THE LAST YEAR OR SO, AND WE HAVE A STATUTE THAT SPECIFIES EXACTLY HOW 6 MANY COMMISSIONERS WE HAVE, AND, SORT OF, WHERE DO THEY COME 7 8 FROM. SO WE HAVE 16 COMMISSIONERS THAT REPRESENT THE LOCAL JURISDICTIONS. AND THE WAY IT WORKS OUT IS THERE IS TWO FROM 9 10 ALL OF THE LARGER POPULATION COUNTIES. SO ALAMEDA, SAN FRANCISCO, CONTRA COSTA, SAN MATEO, AND SANTA CLARA, AND THEN 11 ONE FROM EACH OF THE FOUR NORTH BAY COUNTIES, WHICH HAVE A 12 SMALLER POPULATION. HOWEVER, THERE WAS A CHANGE MADE A FEW 13 YEARS AGO TO ALSO ADD A DIRECT REPRESENTATION FROM THE CITY OF 14 15 OAKLAND, APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR, AND FOR THE CITY OF SAN JOSE 16 APPOINTED BY THAT MAYOR. AND THEN IN BOTH CASES, WE DO HAVE 17 THE MAYOR OF SAN JOSE, AND THE MAYOR OF OAKLAND, THEY APPOINTED THEMSELVES AND SO THEY DO SIT ON MTC. WE ALSO HAVE A 18 SEAT FOR ABAG WHICH, YOU KNOW, IS INTERESTING. BECAUSE WE ALSO 19 SERVE ABAG DIRECTLY. BUT THERE HAS LONG BEEN A RECOGNITION 20 21 THAT LAND USE IS INTEGRAL TO TRANSPORTATION. AND SO THE GOVERNANCE OF MTC DOES INCLUDE A SEAT FOR ABAG THAT IS A 22 VOTING SEAT AND A SEAT FOR THE BAY CONSERVATION AND 23 DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION BCDC THEN WE HAVE A NUMBER OF STATE AND 24 FEDERAL AGENCIES ONE IS CALIFORNIA STATE TRANSPORTATION AGENCY 25

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ALSO REFERRED TO AS CALSTA, AND THEN ONE REPRESENTING THE 1 HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT AGENCY, HUD AND ONE REPRESENTING 2 3 THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. OUR LEADERSHIP CHAIR IS SUPERVISOR ALFREDO PEDROZA NAPA COUNTIES BOARD OF 4 5 SUPERVISORS AND THEN OUR VICE CHAIR NICK JOSEFOWITZ APPOINTED BY SAN FRANCISCO'S MAYOR HE'S ACTUALLY OUR ONLY NON-ELECTED 6 OFFICIAL WHICH IS, SORT OF, A HISTORY THAT SAN FRANCISCO 7 8 APPOINTEE HAS OFTEN NOT BEEN ELECTED IT'S KIND OF, JUST, UNUSUAL, BUT HAS ALSO BEEN THE CUSTOM FOR SAN FRANCISCO. A 9 TINY NUANCE THE WAY THE TWO COUNTIES THAT HAVE THE TWO REPS, 10 ONE IS ALWAYS FROM THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REPRESENTATIVE AND 11 THE OTHER IS A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE CITY. SO THEY HAVE THE 12 "CONFERENCE OF CITIES" THEY GET TOGETHER AND DECIDE WHO IS THE 13 CITY REP THAT IS GOING TO BE FOR THAT COUNTY, WHEREAS FOR THE 14 15 COUNTIES THAT ONLY HAVE ONE THERE IS ONE FOR THE BOARD OF 16 SUPERVISORS. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO FOR MTC ITSELF IS ALSO SOMEWHAT COMPLEX. YOU HAVE HEARD THAT WE ALSO SERVE AS THE 17 STAFF TO ABAG. HOWEVER, ABAG IS A SEPARATE GOVERNING BODY. SO, 18 ABAG HAS A BOARD OF ABOUT 36 DIFFERENT LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS 19 AND THEY REALLY ARE A SEPARATE ENTITY. MTC WEARS A NUMBER OF 20 21 DIFFERENT HATS SO IN ADDITION BEING ON MTC YOU'RE ON THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL WE'RE ALSO THE BAY AREA TOLL 22 AUTHORITY, SAME BOARD SAME STAFF BUT A DIFFERENT SET OF 23 RESPONSIBILITIES THAT WAS CREATED IN STATUTE TO HELP WITH THE 24 WHOLE SEISMIC RETROFIT PROGRAM OF THE STATE OWNED TOLL BRIDGE. 25

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I HAVE GOT THE BAY BRIDGE IN MY VIRTUAL BACKGROUND HERE, AND 1 WE COLLECT THE TOLLS THERE. WE ADMINISTER ALL OF THAT TOLL 2 3 REVENUE AND WE ADMINISTER FASTRAK AS YOU PROBABLY KNOW. THEN A FEW YEARS AGO, I HAD THE PRIVILEGE OF WORKING ON LEGISLATION 4 5 TO CREATE ANOTHER HAT WHICH IS THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY, OR BAHFA. AND THAT IS A NEW ROLE FOR MTC WHERE 6 WE'RE GOING HAVE THE ABILITY TO ASK THE VOTERS TO APPROVE NEW 7 8 TAX INCREASES FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING. AND THIS WAS AN IDEA THAT CAME OUT OF A LOT OF DISCUSSION SEVERAL YEARS AGO THAT WE 9 HAVE REGIONAL FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION BUT WE DON'T HAVE 10 THAT FOR HOUSING. AND SINCE HOUSING IS SUCH A REGIONAL ISSUE 11 IT WAS REALLY A GAP IN THE FUNDING PORTFOLIO. AND THEN, 12 LASTLY, THERE IS SOMETHING CALLED SAFE, AND THAT IS ANOTHER 13 KIND OF ENTITY THAT WE SERVE AS WHERE WE CREATE THE FREEWAY 14 15 SERVICE PATROL. AND IF YOU HAVE BEEN FORTUNATE, IF YOUR CAR IS 16 BROKEN DOWN ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND A TOW TRUCK HAS JUST ARRIVED, THEY OFTEN GET WONDERFUL THANK YOU NOTES AS THEY'RE 17 GUARDIAN ANGELS, BUT WITH TAXPAYER FUNDS WE ARE ABLE TO 18 PROVIDE THESE TOW TRUCKS AND STATE ENTITY IT'S ADMINISTRATORS 19 ALSO SERVE MTC. NEXT SLIDE. THIS LISTS KEY PARTNERS. OF 20 21 COURSE, THE FEDERAL AND STATES TRANSPORTATION AGENCIES, CALTRANS IS THE STATE'S TRANSPORTATION AGENCY. THE HIGHWAY 22 PATROL. THERE ARE ALL OF THESE COUNTY LEVEL TRANSPORTATION 23 AGENCIES THAT USUALLY ARE ALSO THE ONES THAT ADMINISTER A 24 VOTER APPROVED SALES TAX. WE A VOTER APPROVED SALES TAX SOME 25

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PERMANENT SOME TEMPORARY IN EVERY REGION IN THE COUNTIES 1 EXCEPT FOR SOLANO COUNTY. THEY HAVE TRIED ABOUT THREE TIMES 2 3 AND THEY CAN'T QUITE SURPASS THAT TWO THIRD'S VOTE REQUIREMENT. THEN WE DO HAVE, AS I MENTIONED, OVER TWO DOZEN 4 5 TRANSIT AGENCIES AND A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. NEXT SLIDE. I THINK I HAVE ALREADY GONE OVER 6 THESE. SO WE CAN GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE. SO, YEAH, JUST SOME 7 8 STATISTICS ON ALL THE DIFFERENT, SORT OF, INFRASTRUCTURE RELATED TO TRANSPORTATION. I THINK I MENTIONED WE HAVE 7.8 9 MILLION PEOPLE. OVER SIX AND A HALF MILLION CARS. YOU KNOW, A 10 SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF TRANSIT VEHICLES THAT ARE REALLY 11 IMPORTANT TO MAINTAIN, AND MANY OF THEM NEED TO BE REPLACED. 12 20,000 MILES OF LOCAL STREETS AND ROADWAYS, 1400 MILES OF 13 HIGHWAY, 340 MILES OF CARPOOL LANES AND EIGHT TOLL BRIDGES. 14 15 GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE IS ITS OWN SEPARATE ENTITY. MTC HAS NO 16 DIRECT AUTHORITY OVER THE GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE BUT IT IS THE 8TH TOLL BRIDGE IN THE REGION. NEXT SLIDE. THIS IS ALWAYS SOMEWHAT 17 DEPRESSING. LOOKING AT THE COMMUTE SHARE FOR THE BAY AREA. 18 THIS IS BASED ON THE CENSUS DATA, THE EXTENDED FORM IS WHERE 19 PEOPLE FILL OUT INFORMATION ABOUT THEIR COMMUTE. SO I THINK 20 THIS IS -- I DON'T BELIEVE THIS IS FROM -- YEAH, THIS IS 2016, 21 FROM THE TRAVEL SURVEY, BUT IT DOES GET UPDATED ANNUALLY. SO 22 IT'S A SAMPLE, BUT IT'S ABOUT TWO THIRDS OF MOTORISTS DO DRIVE 23 ALONE FOR COMMUTING. AND THEN YOU HAVE ABOUT 10% CARPOOLING, 24 WHICH IS NOT MUCH LESS THAN THE SHARE TAKING TRANSIT, 12%. 25

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THIS IS A -- AGAIN THIS, IS THE NINE COUNTIES, IF YOU THINK OF 1 HOW DIVERSE OUR REGION IS, HOW RURAL IT IS IN THE NORTH BAY 2 3 HOW SUBURB AN IT IS IN PARTS OF THE EAST BAY IF YOU LOOK AT SAN FRANCISCO AND SOME TOWNS IN THE EAST BAY IT'S VERY 4 5 DIFFERENT SOME OF AVERAGES, SAN FRANCISCO, DRIVE ALONE RATE WITHIN THE CITY IS FAR LOWER THAN THIS. AND YOU KNOW, 6 OBVIOUSLY THIS IS NOT UP-TO-DATE WITH 2022, THE WORK-FROM-HOME 7 8 IS 6% SO COVID HAS JUST COMPLETELY BLOWN THIS WHOLE THING WIDE OPEN AS FAR AS HOW WE'RE GOING TO BE GETTING AROUND. I THINK 9 IT'S EXCITING WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT HOW MUCH WE CAN SHRINK 10 THERE DRIVE ALONE WITH THE WORK-FROM-HOME BUT WE ALSO HAVE A 11 LOT OF CONCERNS THAT WE WANT TO HAVE PEOPLE ON TRANSIT. 12 BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT TRANSIT IS SO VITAL TO THE REGION. SO WE 13 ALSO WANT TO GROW THAT 12%. NEXT SLIDE. THIS SLIDE JUST WANT 14 15 REALLY GIVES AN ILLUSTRATION OF OUR EVOLUTION AS AN AGENCY 16 OVER TIME. SO AS I MENTIONED, WE WERE ESTABLISHED IN 1970 REALLY WITH A FOCUS ON BEING KIND OF A PLANNING AGENCY, WITH 17 SOME FUNDING ROLES. BUT THEN THIS DID EVOLVE TO GIVE US MORE 18 OPERATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES. SO, THE CIRCLE AT THE BOTTOM OF 19 THE SECOND COLUMN IS THE FREEWAY SERVICE PATROL AND THEN YOU 20 HAVE GOT THE EVOLUTION TO INCLUDE THE BAY AREA TOLL AUTHORITY 21 ROLE, AND FASTRAK AND EXPRESS LANES, AND THEN IN THIS LAST 22 COLUMN, ILLUSTRATING OUR NEW ROLE IN HOUSING. AND AS WELL AS 23 POTENTIALLY ADMINISTERING TOLLS ON STATE ROUTE 37 WHICH IS 24 SOMETHING THAT WE ARE GOING TO BE WORKING ON THIS YEAR, 25

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LEGISLATIVELY. NEXT SLIDE. SO, YOU KNOW, ONE OF THE MOST 1 CRITICAL AND LABOR INTENSE THINGS WE DO EVERY FOUR YEARS IS WE 2 3 ADOPT A SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY STRATEGY WHICH IS THE SAME THING AS A LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN. IT'S SOMETHING THAT'S 4 5 REQUIRED IN BOTH STATE AND FEDERAL LAW. THEY SET SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT RULES BUT IT'S ONE PLAN. AND THE PLAN THAT WE JUST 6 ADOPTED LAST YEAR IS PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. IT IS A VERY 7 8 INTEGRATED PLAN. IT INCLUDES NOT JUST TRANSPORTATION, INVESTMENT STRATEGIES, AND PROJECTS, AS WITH FUNDING CONNECTED 9 10 TO THOSE, BUT ALSO HAS A VERY DETAILED IT LAND ASSUMPTIONS FOR 11 THAT. SO A FORECAST OF WHERE PEOPLE ARE GOING TO BE LIVING, ALSO, WHAT IS THE OPTIMAL PLACE WHERE GROWTH IS GOING TO BE 12 HAPPENING. MTC AND ABAG DON'T SET LAND USE POLICY WE CAN'T 13 REQUIRE ZONING BUT WE DO HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO STATE LAW TO 14 ENVISION WHAT WOULD BE THE MOST SUSTAINABLE AND OPTIMAL LAND 15 16 USE AND THEN WE CAN USE INCENTIVES THROUGH THE FORM OF FUNDING AND OTHER STRATEGIES TO DRIVE GROWTH IN THAT DIRECTION AND 17 ENCOURAGE LOCAL JURISDICTION WHO IS DO HAVE THE LAND USE 18 AUTHORITY TO DO THEIR OWN ZONING IN ALIGNMENT WITH OUR LONG-19 RANGE PLAN. THE PLAN INCLUDES OUITE A LOT OF ECONOMIC 20 21 STRATEGIES WHICH WE HAVEN'T REALLY DONE IN THE PAST. IT'S NOT 22 REQUIRED, PER SE, BUT IN OUR OUTREACH, YOU KNOW, THEY'RE OBVIOUSLY ARE A LOT OF CHALLENGES IN OUR REGION AS IT RELATES 23 TO EQUITY, AS IT RELATES TO HOMELESSNESS. SO WE HAVE 24 INCORPORATED SOME PRETTY BOLD IDEAS RELATED TO UNIVERSAL BASIC 25

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INCOME. WE HAVE NO AUTHORITY TO REOUIRE THAT, BUT THAT'S 1 SOMETHING THAT WE HAVE KIND OF SAID THAT WE THINK IS A GOOD 2 3 IDEA TO EXPLORE, AS WELL AS ENVIRONMENTAL STRATEGIES. THE PLAN IS VERY EXPLICITLY TIED TO CLIMATE CHANGE. WE HAVE TO ACHIEVE 4 5 CERTAIN GOALS OF REDUCING THE GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS ASSOCIATED WITH TRANSPORTATION. THAT'S A MANDATE BY THE STATE. 6 IT'S ALL MODELED, AND YOU KNOW, WE DON'T FULLY CONTROL, OF 7 8 COURSE, HOW PEOPLE TRAVEL, WHAT VEHICLE THEY TRAVEL IN, BUT WE ARE REOUIRED TO COME UP WITH BOTH THE INVESTMENTS, AS WELL AS 9 THE POLICIES THAT CAN, IN OUR FORECAST, BRING THOSE EMISSIONS 10 DOWN OVER TIME. NEXT SLIDE. SO, THIS IS A PIE CHART 11 ILLUSTRATING THE RANGE OF FUNDING SOURCES THAT THE REGION HAS 12 FOR TRANSPORTATION. THIS IS OVER 30 YEARS, BASICALLY, AND, SO, 13 IT'S A LOT OF FUNDING. IT'S A TOTAL PORTFOLIO OF \$1.4 14 TRILLION, WHICH IS CRAZY. THAT'S FOR THE ENTIRE PLAN, OVERALL, 15 16 AND 570 BILLION OF THAT IS FOR TRANSPORTATION. THOSE NUMBERS JUST SOUND INSANE. BUT THERE YOU ARE. BUT THE LARGEST SHARE IS 17 ACTUALLY LOCAL. AND THAT, PRIMARILY, IS LOCAL SALES TAX. YOU 18 KNOW, THE SALES TAX DOES GENERATE A SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF 19 FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION. SOME OF THAT IS THE VOTER APPROVED 20 MEASURES THEY DESCRIBED BELOW THAT ARE ADMINISTERED BY THE 21 COUNTIES. IT ALSO INCLUDES DEDICATED FUNDING FOR TRANSIT THAT 22 COMES FROM, LIKE, A STATEWIDE TAX KNOWN AS THE "TRANSPORTATION 23 DEVELOPMENT ACT." SORRY MY PHONE IS RINGING AND DISTRACTING 24 ME. THEN THERE IS THE STATE FUNDING PRIMARILY GAS TAX ALSO 25

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INCLUDES CAP-AND-TRADE FUNDING ALSO FORECAST OF OTHER STATE 1 GRANTS. REGIONAL PRIMARILY BRIDGE TOLLS WHICH IS SIGNIFICANT 2 3 GOING INTO THE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM. WE HAVE TO PLOW THE BRIDGE TOLLS INTO MAINTAINING AND OPERATING THE BRIDGES BUT WE 4 5 HAVE A NUMBER OF REGIONAL MEASURES THREE THAT THE VOTERS HAVE APPROVED TO FUND TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS BOTH ROADWAY 6 RELATED AND TRANSIT AND ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION. AND THEN 7 8 FEDERAL IS A VERY IMPORTANT PART OF THE PORTFOLIO BUT WHEN YOU LOOK AT IT HERE, IT'S ONLY 11%. BUT WHAT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE 9 THERE IS THAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS A CRITICAL PARTNER 10 WHEN IT COMES TO OUR LARGE INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS ESPECIALLY 11 12 TRANSIT. SO, FOR EXAMPLE, EXTENDING BART TO SAN JOSE, OR CALTRAIN ELECTRIFICATION. BART'S CORE CAPACITY NEEDS THERE, 13 THEY'RE GOING TO BE A PARTNER TO THE TUNE OF BILLIONS AND 14 BILLIONS OF DOLLARS, AND THEN IT'S THE LOCAL AND REGIONAL 15 16 MONEY THAT SERVES AS THE MATCH. WHEREAS, YOU KNOW, ON THE HIGHWAY SIDE, WE GET MORE FORMULA MONEY THAT COMES. AND SOME 17 18 OF THAT COMES DIRECTLY TO MTC FOR PROGRAMMING. NEXT SLIDE. THIS IS JUST GOING A LITTLE BIT DEEPER IN ALL OF THE CUSTOMER-19 FACING PROGRAMS THAT WE'RE INVOLVED IN. SO I HAVE MENTIONED 20 21 FASTRAK AND THE EXPRESS LANES, THE CLIPPER CARD, I AM SURE YOU ALL KNOW WHAT THAT IS. BUT THAT'S THE TRANSIT SMART CARDS THAT 22 WE INITIATED MANY YEARS AGO THAT CREATES THAT SEAMLESSNESS AT 23 LEAST FROM THE FARE PAYMENT SIDE OF RIDING TRANSIT. THERE'S 24 THE CLIPPER START PROGRAM WHICH IS THE DISCOUNT PROGRAM FOR 25

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TRANSIT. 511 TRAVELER INFORMATION. WE WERE KIND OF CUTTING-1 EDGE THERE, BUT HAVE REALLY SHIFT THAT PRIMARILY TO GOOGLE AND 2 3 OTHERS THAT, YOU KNOW, ARE PROVIDING, YOU KNOW, EXCELLENT, DIRECT-INFORMATION TO CONSUMERS, BUT WE STILL HAVE A ROLE 4 5 THERE AND WE HELP FEED THE TRANSIT INFORMATION FROM THE OPERATORS TO THE 555 PROGRAM THROUGH GOOGLE SO WE ARE THAT 6 DIRECT INTERFACE FOR USERS. THEN WE HAVE THE BAY WHEELS 7 8 BIKESHARE PROGRAM OPERATED BY LYFT BUT WITH A CONTRACT WITH MTC. NEXT SLIDE. SO I THINK THIS MIGHT BE THE LAST SLIDE IT'S 9 JUST A SUMMARY OF ALL THE DIFFERENT RESOURCES THAT ARE 10 AVAILABLE TO YOU TO LEARN MORE ON OUR WEB SITE THE PLANNED BAY 11 AREA LINK, OUR LIBRARY IS A GREAT RESOURCE. WE ACTUALLY HAVE A 12 FULL-TIME LIBRARIAN. YOU KNOW, IT'S NOT AS INTERESTING FOR HER 13 WITH EVERYBODY HOME, INCLUDING HER, DURING COVID, BUT SHE DOES 14 GREAT RESEARCH AND KEEPS OUR INFORMATION UP-TO-DATE. AND THEN 15 16 IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY SUBSCRIBED TO OUR HEADLINES, I HIGHLIGHT RECOMMEND THAT. WE HAVE STAFF WHO COMB THROUGH ALL 17 OF THE REGION'S KEY NEWSPAPERS AND SELECT TRANSPORTATION AND 18 HOUSING RELATED AND OTHER RELEVANT NEWS STORIES OF THE DAY AND 19 SEND THOSE OUT. AND THEN WE ALSO HAVE A BLOG THAT YOU CAN 20 FOLLOW. SO, WITH THAT, I THINK THAT'S THE LAST SLIDE. JUST GO 21 ONE MORE AND MAKE SURE. THERE YOU GO. SO, BACK TO YOU, CHAIR 22 23 KINMAN.

I WOULD SAY THAT WE'RE VERY 12 ENGAGED IN CONVERSATION WITH OUR LOCAL PARTNERS, BUT, YOU 13 KNOW, WE DON'T HAVE A, SORT OF, APPROVAL ROLE IF THEY'RE 14 15 PUTTING TOGETHER THEIR EXPENDITURE PLAN. SO, NOT OFFICIALLY. 16 RANDI KINMAN, CHAIR: THANK YOU. KRISTINE FITZGERALD? 17 18 CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: QUICK QUESTION. VOICE OVER GETS IN MY 19 WAY. SO OUICK OUESTION, I KNOW THAT IT WAS SPOKEN ABOUT THE 20 EQUITY AND ACCESS SUBCOMMITTEE, IS THERE A LIKE ENTITY FOR THE 21 NEW HOUSING ELEMENT? AND IF SO, I WOULD BE VERY INTERESTED IN 22 JOINING THE EQUITY AND THE ACCESSIBILITY, BUT ALSO LOOKING AT 23 THE HOUSING, AS WELL. 24

 YOU KNOW, WE NEED THIS MUCH MONEY, AND WE NEED THIS MANY
 UNITS, AND IT'S GOING TO COST X. SO IT'S DEFINITELY NOT, LIKE,
 AN INVESTMENT PROGRAMMING DOCUMENT, SO MUCH AS A LONG RANGE
 PLAN, IF THAT HELPS.

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BERKELEY, REBECCA LONG, SHE WENT TO BERKELEY HIGH. I WENT TO 1 BERKELEY HIGH WENT TO COLLEGE, LAW SCHOOL SPENT TIME IN LIVING 2 3 IN LONDON, HANOI AND WASHINGTON, D.C. BEFORE RETURNING TO THE EAST BAY TO RAISE MY FAMILY HERE IN EAST OAKLAND. IT WOULD BE GOOD IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN SERVING IF YOU LOOK AT PAST MEETINGS AND AGENDAS 17 THAT ARE ACCESSIBLE ON THE WEB SITE AND I'LL SHARE THAT 18 19 INFORMATION WITH YOU AS WELL, AND YOU WILL HAVE MARCH TO SUBMIT YOUR NAME FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE NEWLY ELECTED CHAIR. 20 21 LET'S SEE.
