I WANT TO REPORT LAST DECEMBER THE METROPOLITAN 23 TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION CONDUCTED A LISTENING SESSION ON THE 24 TRANSPORTATION FUNDING NEEDS THE POTENTIAL FUTURE FOR A 25

REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION MEASURE AND I WAS INVITED BY ALFREDO 1 PEDROZA TO PARTICIPATE IN THE LISTENING SESSION I THOUGHT IT 2 3 WAS A REALLY WELL PLANNED DISCUSSION AND I THINK NOT ONLY HEARING FROM STAFF BUT HEARING FROM VARIOUS STAKEHOLDERS 4 5 AROUND THE REGION LAID THE FOUND FOR FUTURE DISCUSSIONS ON TRANSPORTATION FUNDING FOR THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA. AND I 6 INTEND TO CONVENE A SIMILAR LISTENING SESSION ON HOUSING. 7 ADD 8 A DATE TO BE DETERMINED. I THINK SOMEBODY IS -- SUPERVISOR MILEY IS NOT MUTED. OKAY. SO, WE'LL LET EVERYONE KNOW ABOUT 9 10 THE DATE FOR THAT LISTENING SESSION ON HOUSING, SO WE CAN BEGIN THE CONVERSATION AND WORK TOWARDS A POTENTIAL FUTURE 11 REGIONAL HOUSING MEASURE. ALTHOUGH WE'RE MEETING BIMONTHLY 12 THIS YEAR SINCE THE WORK LEADING THE APPROVAL OF THE PLANNED 13 BAY AREA IS COMPLETED BECAUSE OF THE LIMITATIONS OF ASSEMBLY 14 15 BILL 361, WE WILL NEED TO MEET TO ADOPT EMERGENCY FINDINGS AND 16 APPROVE RESOLUTIONS TO CONTINUE TO MEET REMOTELY SO WE WILL HAVE TO CONVENE SPECIAL MEETINGS IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH TO PICK 17 UP THAT BUSINESS HOWEVER OUR NEXT REGULAR MEETING IS ON MARCH 18 17TH. FINALLY I'M PLEASED TO REPORT THIS WAS, I THINK, SAID TO 19 US AS A COMMUNICATION LAST NIGHT, THAT THE STATES DEPARTMENT 20 21 OF HOUSING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT HAS APPROVED OUR REGIONAL HOUSING ALLOCATIONS PLAN. WE RECEIVED A LETTER ON JANUARY 12TH 22 WHICH WAS SENT TO MEMBERS AND INCLUDED IN THE PACKET I WANTED 23 TO THANK YOU ALL FOR THE TIME AND EFFORT THAT YOU PUT INTO 24 THIS IMPORTANT REGIONAL RESPONSIBILITY. ONCE AGAIN I WANT TO 25

THANK THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSING METHODOLOGY COMMITTEE AND 1 ABAG ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE WHO HORRID 28 APPEALS AND WE 2 3 WERE PLANNING ON HAVING AN IN-PERSON EVENT TO THANK THE MEMBERS OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE FOR YOUR WORK, BUT 4 5 OBVIOUSLY DUE TO THE OMICRON VARIANT WE NEED TO HOLD OFF ON THAT BUT WHEN IT IS SAFE WE WILL HAVE AN EVENT TO THANK YOU 6 PROPERLY FOR NOT ONLY THE MANY HOURS OF PREPARATION AND WORK 7 8 THAT YOU PUT IN TO CONSIDER THESE APPEALS SO I JUST WANT TO LET EVERYONE KNOW ABOUT THAT. AND I JUST ALSO WANT TO ADDRESS 9 ANOTHER ISSUE RELATED TO RHNA. AT OUR LAST EXECUTIVE BOARD 10 MEETING WE MENTIONED WE WOULD LIKE TO CALENDAR A DISCUSSION OF 11 A LIST OF POLICY TOPICS CORRECTED DURING THE APPEALS HEARINGS 12 AND TO HAVE AN OVERALL DISCUSSION OF THE RHNA PROCESS TO 13 INFORM FUTURE ADMINISTRATION AND POTENTIAL POLICY CHANGES. 14 15 FOLLOWING THE DECEMBER MEETING ABAG MTC PLANNING STAFF REQUEST 16 THAT WE POSTPONE THIS DISCUSSION TO AT LEAST THE FEBRUARY MEETING SO STAFF CAN BE PREPARED TO PRESENT AND DISCUSS. 17 THEREFORE THIS ITEM DOES IS NOT APPEAR ON TONIGHT'S AGENDA BUT 18 WE WILL BE COMING FORWARD WITH A DISCUSSION OF THAT LIST AND A 19 THE RHNA PROCESS AT A FUTURE MEETING. AND I WILL ASK STAFF TO 20 21 SEND A LIST OF POLICY ISSUES PRIOR TO THE MEETING SO WE CAN BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS. THAT CONCLUDES MY REPORT AND I WOULD BE 22 HAPPY TO TAKE QUESTIONS. THERESE MCMILLAN: THANK YOU, PRESIDENT ARREGUIN, AND YOU 10 TOUCHED ON THE MAJOR ELEMENT THAT WAS IN MY REPORT, WHICH WAS 11 THE REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS ALLOCATION, AND, AGAIN, THE LETTER 12 WAS ATTACHED THERE, AS WELL, SO WE WANTED TO MAKE SURE THAT WE 13 KIND OF CLOSED THAT DOOR WITH A NOTE OF COUNSEL ON THAT DATE 14 15 AND WE'LL FOLLOW UP ON. THERE WAS A HUGE ACCOMPLISHMENT, 16 CLEARLY FOR STAFF AND ALL THE WORK THEY PUT INTO IT, BUT REALLY ALL ABOUT THE DEDICATED WORK THAT YOU ALL DID. YOU 17 KNOW, EVERY EIGHT YEAR REQUIREMENT THAT WE NEED TO DO, AND IS 18 ESSENTIAL TO PLANNED BAY AREA 2050. SO KUDOS AND MUCH 19 GRATITUDE TO ALL OF YOU FOR YOUR WORK AND DEDICATION. IN 20 21 ADDITION TO THAT, JUST A NOTE THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION APPROVED A '22/'23 BUDGET OF OVER \$47 MILLION FOR 22 BAYREN THAT WILL GO TO UNDERWRITE AND SUPPORT A NUMBER OF 23 ENERGY EFFICIENCY RETROFIT INCENTIVES. SO OUR BAYREN PROGRAM 24 CONTINUES TO BE RECOGNIZED AS A STATE MODEL ON A NUMBER OF 25

WAYS. SO MANY KUDOS TO JENNY BERG AND HER STAFF FOR KEEPING US 1 AT THE FRONT END OF THAT. AND, THEN, ALSO TO NOTE, AS BAYREN 2 IS PULLING TOGETHER THE BUSINESS PLAN, THEY'RE CONSIDERING A 3 NEW WORKFORCE PROGRAM AIMED AT JOB TRAINING AND PLACEMENT FOR 4 5 YOUTH IN LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES RELATED TO THEIR PORTFOLIO. WHICH IS VERY EXCITING, AS, YOU KNOW, CONTINUING ELEMENT OF 6 OUR BROAD SCOPE EQUITY PLATFORM, AND, AGAIN, DOING OUR BEST, 7 8 LARGE AND SMALL, TO HELP ADVANCE COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE BAY AREA THAT, YOU KNOW, OTHERWISE ARE VULNERABLE TO A NUMBER 9 OF BENEFITS AND BURDENS THAT WE SEE. KUDOS AGAIN TO THE 10 CREATIVITY OF STAFF THERE, AND WITH THAT MR. PRESIDENT, I WILL 11 TURN IT BACK OVER TO YOU. 12

JESSE ARREGUIN, PRESIDENT: OKAY. THANK YOU SO MUCH MS.
MCMILLAN. I WOULD LIKE TO RECOGNIZE COUNCILMEMBER GIBBONS?

LIZ GIBBONS: THANK YOU, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. I WANTED TO ASK 17 YOUR ADVICE AND HELP ON THIS. AS MANY OF OUR CITIES ARE IN THE 18 MIDDLE OF THEIR HOUSING ELEMENTS STRUGGLING TO GET THE LAND 19 USE MAPS DONE PRIOR TO BEGINNING THE CEOA PROCESS, THERE IS A 20 LOT OF COMMUNITY PUSH BACK ON THE RHNA NUMBERS. SO, I HAVE 21 BEEN ASKED THAT -- TOLD THAT THERE IS SEVERAL -- THERE ARE 22 SEVERAL LAWSUITS OUTSTANDING ON THE RHNA NUMBERS, AND ALSO, 23 THERE IS A LEGISLATIVE AUDIT GETTING UNDERWAY ON THE RHNA 24

NUMBERS PROCESS. IS THERE ANY HELP YOU CAN GIVE ME WITH THAT?
 OR GIVE US WITH THAT?

THERESE MCMILLAN: I'M NOT EXACTLY SURE WHICH ASSISTANCE YOU'RE 4 5 SEEKING. IF IT'S CLARITY AS TO WHAT'S GOING ON IN THOSE TWO SPACES, THE STATUS OF IT, WHATEVER IMPACT OR REACH IT HAS FOR 6 US, YOU KNOW, FROM WHERE WE SIT, WE HAVE DONE WHAT WE HAVE 7 8 DONE, HCD HAS BLESSED IT, WE NEED TO MOVE AHEAD ACCORDING TO STATE REOUIREMENTS. BUT IN TERMS OF JUST BEING ABLE TO TRACK 9 10 WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THOSE PARTICULAR ARENAS, I THINK PARTICULARLY THE LAST ONE IN TERMS OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUDIT, I 11 DON'T THINK IT'S SURPRISING THAT IN OUR REGION AND PERHAPS IN 12 THE STATE THERE IS JURISDICTIONS THAT MAY BE UNHAPPY WITH THE 13 ULTIMATE OUTCOME, BUT THAT IS NOW AN OFFICIAL OUTCOME THAT WE 14 ARE BOUND TO CARRY OUT. SO, YOU KNOW, I CAN CONSULT WITH 15 16 PRESIDENT ARREGUIN IF THERE IS ANYTHING ELSE THAT WOULD MAKE SENSE FOR US TO DO. BUT IN -- I THINK THE MOST IMPORTANT THING 17 IS, I WOULD ENCOURAGE ANY CITY THAT IS FEELING STRESSED, IN 18 TERMS OF DEVELOPING THEIR HOUSING ELEMENT, WE HAVE AN 19 INCREDIBLY RICH TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM THAT OUR STAFF 20 HAS DESIGNED AND SETUP, AND THEY ARE MORE THAN WILLING TO WORK 21 WITH ANY JURISDICTION IN THE REGION TO GIVE THEM AS MUCH 22 ASSISTANCE AS THEY CAN. SO THAT WOULD BE, I THINK, THE 23 PROACTIVE AND HELPFUL RECOMMENDATION I WOULD BRING, IS THAT, 24 25 WE NEED TO STEP FORWARD AND DO WHAT WE NEED TO DO, BUT WE ALSO

KNOW IT'S GOING TO BE HARD FOR A NUMBER OF JURISDICTIONS AND
 WE HAVE RESOURCES TO HELP. SO, I DON'T KNOW, PRESIDENT
 ARREGUIN IF THERE IS ANYTHING YOU WOULD LIKE TO ADD?

5 JESSE ARREGUIN, PRESIDENT: I THINK THE LOSS YOU'RE REFERRING TO IS FROM THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA COG. THEY'RE CHALLENGING 6 THEIR RHNA DETERMINATION. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE STATUS OF THAT 7 8 LAWSUIT IS OR WHAT THE OUTCOME OF THAT LITIGATION WOULD BEAR ON OUR PROCESS UNLESS THERE IS AN ACT OF LEGISLATURE OR HCD 9 VOLUNTARILY AGREES TO ADJUST THE TIMELINES WE'RE BOUND BY, THE 10 TIMELINES PRESCRIBED BY STATUTE, BUT I'M CURIOUS IF MS. LONGER 11 ON MS. BOCKELMAN YOU HAVE ANY INFORMATION ABOUT THIS POTENTIAL 12 OR ONGOING AUDIT OF THE RHNA PROCESS OR RHNA STATUTE? 13

YOU KNOW, I 15 HAVEN'T HEARD THAT TERMINOLOGY OF A LEGISLATIVE AUDIT, BUT I 16 AM AWARE OF A BILL, A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO THAT REQUIRED THAT 17 HCD DO KIND OF THEIR OWN ANALYSIS OF THE RHNA PROCESS AND MAKE 18 SOME RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO THAT AND I DON'T BELIEVE THAT 19 STUDY HAS YET BEEN COMPLETED I CAN POKE AROUND SEEING IF I 20 COULD TRACK IT DOWN. -- I WOULDN'T BE SURPRISED, IT'S PROBABLY 21 CERTAIN THERE WILL BE BILLS INTRODUCED THIS YEAR THAT DEAL 22 WITH RHNA BUT AS HAS BEEN STATED FOR NOW, YOU KNOW, THE LAW IS 23 THE LAW. AND, YOU KNOW, WE'RE BOUND BY IT. THANKS. 24

THE TOTAL SURPLUS FOR THE 14 PROGRAMS WAS 1.19 MILLION FOR THE PERIOD THROUGH OCTOBER. 15 THE 16 ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM COLLECTED 2.2 MILLION WHICH IS 90% OF 17 THE 2.4 MILLION TOTAL MEMBERSHIP REVENUES REPORTED. THE FINANCIALS SHOW US SIGNIFICANT YEAR TO DATE SURPLUS OF 1.26 18 MILLION EXPENSE IS 28% OF THE PROPOSED -- PARDON ME -- OF THE 19 APPROVED BUDGET JUST A FEW PERCENTAGE POINTS OVER 25. WE ALL 20 21 KNOW HOW THAT GOES. IN DECEMBER 2021 THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION AUTHORIZED ITS STAFF TO RETURN THE 22 FISCAL YEAR 2021 SURCHARGE AND THE FISCAL '21 AND '22SSO --23 AND I'M SO SORRY -- I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT S BUT IT'S PART OF 24 25 OUR RENT, AS I UNDERSTANDS -- ASSESSMENT PAYMENT MADE BY ABAG

SO THE TOTAL REFUND ESTIMATE AT \$925,000 IN ADDITION ABAG WILL 1 NOT BE REQUIRED TO MAKE THE \$530,000 SURCHARGE. AND WE HAVE 2 3 ASKED STAFF TO DRAFT A LETTER FOR PRESIDENT ARREGUIN AND MYSELF TO SEND TO MTC AND TO ALL THE COMMISSIONERS THAT ARE 4 5 CURRENTLY ON THIS MEETING, AND OTHERS, THANKING THEM SO MUCH FOR DOING THIS FOR US. BAYREN EXPENSES WERE 5.3 MILLION AS OF 6 OCTOBER 31ST AND 22% OF THE APPROVED BUDGET. THE SAN FRANCISCO 7 8 ESTUARY PROJECT EXPENSES, AS OF OCTOBER, WERE 1.6 MILLION. EXPENSES AS USUAL ARE RUNNING A BIT LOWER THAN THE BUDGET AT 9 13% BECAUSE OF GETTING GRANT DOLLARS AND EXPENSES. THE SAN 10 FRANCISCO BAY TRAIL IS A NEW NON-PROFIT ENTITY THAT HAS NOT 11 YET STARTED TO INCUR EXPENSES. ON THE CONTRACTS AND PURCHASE 12 REQUISITIONS, BETWEEN 20-200,000, WE APPROVED A CONTRACT 13 AMENDMENT FOR 107,000 TO PEAK DIGITAL LLC FOR WEB SITE SUPPORT 14 15 SERVICES. AND A CONTRACT FOR \$182,430,000 TO HEALTHY 16 OUTCOMES, INC. FOR PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT WEB BASED TOOLS. ON OUR INVESTMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED OCTOBER 2021, THE TOTAL FUNDS 17 UNDER ABAG MANAGEMENT ARE JUST OVER \$114.5 MILLION. THIS 18 CONCLUDES THE COMMITTEE REPORT. 19
