

- 2 YOU KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON WITH MY REGULAR UPDATE TO LET YOU
- 3 KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON THE ACCESS AND MOBILITY WORK PLAN. YOU
- 4 REMEMBER LAST SUMMER THE MOBILITY TASK FORCE DEVELOPED A
- 5 TRANSFORMATION ACTION PLAN AND WITHIN THE ACTION PLAN THERE
- 6 WERE FIVE ACCESSIBILITY ITEMS HEAVILY FOCUSED ON PARA TRANSIT
- 7 THAT WE BUNDLED TOGETHER IN THE WORK PLAN. A QUICK REMINDER OF
- 8 WHAT THOSE FIVE ITEMS ARE, THE FIRST ONE IS THAT EACH COUNTY
- 9 WILL DESIGNATE A MOBILITY MANAGER WHO WILL COORDINATE RIDES
- 10 AND FUNCTION AS A LIAISON BETWEEN TRANSIT AGENCY AND OTHER
- 11 PROVIDERS. THE SECOND ONE IS THAT WE'RE GOING TO FUND SOME
- 12 ADDITIONAL SUBREGIONAL ONE-SEAT PARATRANSIT RIDE PILOTS AND
- 13 DEVELOP SOME COST SHARING POLICIES FOR CROSS JURISDICTIONAL
- 14 TRIPS. THE THIRD ONE IS TO INTEGRATE ADA PARATRANSIT WITH
- 15 CLIPPER NEXT GENERATION. THE FOURTH ONE IS TO IDENTIFY KEY
- 16 PARATRANSIT CHALLENGES AND RECOMMEND REFORMS. AND THEN THE
- 17 LAST ONE IS TO ADOPT STANDARDIZED ELIGIBILITY PRACTICES FOR
- 18 PARATRANSIT. AND, SO, WE HAVEN'T OFFICIALLY KICKED OFF THE
- 19 WORK PLAN YET, BUT THINGS HAVE BEEN HAPPENING. SO, LAST MONTH,
- 20 I WAS HERE TO TELL YOU ALL ABOUT IT, AND CHRIS FITZGERALD HAD
- 21 A GREAT SUGGESTION, AND ASKED ME IF I PLANNED TO TALK TO THE
- 22 PARATRANSIT DRIVERS, AND I HADN'T ACTUALLY INCLUDE THAT AS
- 23 PART OF THE WORK PLAN, SO THAT'S OFFICIALLY BEEN INSERTED INTO
- 24 THE WORK PLAN. I ALSO HEARD DURING OUR LAST MEETING FROM A
- 25 MEMBER OF OUR PUBLIC THAT IT WAS IMPORTANT TO INCLUDE



- 1 PARATRANSIT FARES INTO OUR WORK PLAN SO THAT HAS ALSO
- 2 OFFICIALLY BEEN INSERTED. WE ARE ALMOST -- WE'RE GETTING CLOSE
- 3 TO GETTING A CONSULTANT ON BOARD. WE HAD AN ITEM GO TO MTC'S
- 4 ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE ABOUT TWO WEEKS AGO, ON THAT. SO
- 5 WE'RE MAKING PROGRESS THERE. AND THEN THE LAST THING I'LL
- 6 MENTION IS THAT ABOUT TWO WEEKS AGO, I HELPED TO HOST A
- 7 REGIONAL CONFERENCE OF THE PARATRANSIT COORDINATING COUNCILS,
- 8 THE PCC'S AS THEY'RE CALLED, ISSUE COUNTY BASED COMMITTEES
- 9 MADE UP OF RIDERS, TRANSIT AGENCIES, AND NON-PROFIT AGENCIES
- 10 AND ALSO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY STAFF AND THEIR GOAL
- 11 IS TO ENSURE THAT PARATRANSIT AND ACCESSIBLE TRANSPORTATION IS
- 12 BEING DELIVERED IN AN EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE MANNER WITHIN
- 13 THE COUNTY. AND SO OUR CONFERENCE HAD A MIXTURE OF THINGS
- 14 INCLUDED IN THE AGENDA BUT WE HAD SOME SKILL BUILDING AND BEST
- 15 PRACTICES, BUT I ALSO GATHERED INPUT FROM THEM ON THE ACCESS
- 16 AND MOBILITY WORK PLAN. SO THAT'S PRETTY MUCH MY WRAP-UP OF
- 17 ACTIVITIES SINCE I WAS HERE IN MAY. I DO WANT TO THANK FRANK
- 18 WELTE, A MEMBER OF THE SUBCOMMITTEE WHO SENT ME A LIST OF
- 19 ORGANIZATIONS TO BE INCLUDED IN PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT. I AM ALWAYS
- 20 EAGER TO HEAR FROM ALL OF YOU ON WHO YOU THINK I SHOULD BE
- 21 TALKING TO, INDIVIDUALS, AGENCIES, COMMUNITY GROUPS, FOR OUR
- 22 OFFICIAL STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT. SO, PLEASE FEEL FREE TO E-
- 23 MAIL ME CONTACTS AND GIVE ME YOUR IDEAS. AND WITH THAT, I'LL
- 24 STOP AND SO IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS.

6	CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: HELLO DRENNEN. ALWAYS GOOD TO SEE YOU. I
7	HAVE A QUICK QUESTION, WHEN YOU CONTACTED THE ORGANIZATIONS
8	ASSOCIATE WITH THE FIXED ROUTE TRANSIT THAT DEAL WITH
9	PARATRANSIT SYSTEM, WHO ARE YOU CONTACTING WITHIN THAT
10	NETWORK? THE REASON THAT I ASK IS, IN OUR CASE, OUR LIAISON
11	THAT HAS WORKED WITH THE CTMA, OUR EXISTING LIAISON HAS LEFT.
12	ERIC IS NOW GONE. AND RICHELLE IS NOW IN PLACE, AS TEMPORARY.
13	
14	DRENNAN SHELTON: YES. I AM IN CONTACT WITH RICHELLE. I WORK
15	PRETTY CLOSELY WITH ALL OF THE ACCESSIBLE SERVICES PARATRANSIT
16	STAFF AT THE TRANSIT AGENCIES. THANK YOU FOR MENTIONING THAT.
17	THAT'S A BIG STAFF CHANGE FOR VTA.
18	
19	CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: I HAVE SEEN FIVE OR SIX CHANGEOVERS BOTH
20	IN MY TIME ON CTA, AND AS A MEMBER.
21	
22	DRENNAN SHELTON: YEAH. I THINK THAT'S RIGHT. LUCKILY THAT
23	REALLY HAS ONLY BEEN THE CASE AT VTA. EVERYONE ELSE IS PRETTY

CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: GOOD. I GUESS. 1 2 3 DRENNAN SHELTON: I KNOW. WE'LL WORK EXTRA HARD TO MAKE SURE THAT --4 5 CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: THANK YOU. 6 7 8 DRENNAN SHELTON: YEAH. THANK YOU. 9 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: HOWARD, I SEE YOUR HAND IS RAISED. 10 11 HOWARD WONG: AT THE LAST MEETING, WE TALKED ABOUT THE POINT 12 THAT VERY FEW OF DISABLED PEOPLE AND SENIORS AND OTHERS USE 13 PARATRANSIT. AND THAT, AS MANY ADVOCATES FOR THE DISABLED 14 15 COMMUNITY WILL SAY, THAT INDEPENDENT LIVING IS ACTUALLY THE 16 PREFERRED DIRECTION THAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE PUBLIC SERVICES AND PUBLIC TRANSIT ADDRESS. SO THAT THE INTERESTING 17 THING, TOO IS TO DO SURVEYS TO DETERMINE ACTUALLY WHAT 18 PERCENTAGE OF DISABILITY, AND DISABLED COMMUNITY OR SENIOR 19 COMMUNITY TRANSIT -- IT'S PROBABLY A SMALL NUMBER OF A VAST 20 21 MAJORITY, I THINK WOULD WANT TO HAVE INTEGRATED EQUITABLE WAY 22 TO BE ABLE TO USE ANY MODE OF TRANSPORTATION TRANSIT. ANY ABLE-BODIED PERSON WOULD WANT TO USE. THERE ARE MANY 23 DISABILITY THAT IS NOT NOTICE MAYBE A BACK INJURY, MUSCULAR 24 25 PROBLEMS, SPEECH, SITE, AND MANY OF THESE PEOPLE WOULD LIKE TO



- 1 USE TRANSIT AS AN ABLE-BODIED PERSON WOULD. SO, I THINK IT'S
- 2 VERY IMPORTANT TO FOCUS ON THE LARGER PERCENTAGE OF THE
- 3 DISABLED AND SENIOR IN OUR ATTEMPTS TO CREATE EQUITABLE
- 4 ACCESS.

- 6 DRENNAN SHELTON: IT'S A POINT YOU MADE LAST TIME AND A POINT
- 7 YOU MADE THIS TIME. I AGREE YOU IT'S A VERY SMALL NUMBER OF
- 8 PEOPLE WHO ACTUALLY USE PARATRANSIT REGULARLY. WE HEARD AN
- 9 ENORMOUS OUTCRY ABOUT PARATRANSIT NOT CATCHING UP TO
- 10 INNOVATIONS THAT THE FIXED-ROUTE TRANSIT HAS SEEN, AND SO
- 11 THAT'S WHY THE BLUE RIBBON TASK FORCE TRANSFORMATION ACTION
- 12 PLAN HAS SHIFTED THIS WAY IT'S REALLY A RESPONSE TO THE OUTCRY
- 13 THAT WE HAVEN'T DONE ENOUGH TO IMPROVE PARATRANSIT. BUT POINT
- 14 IS TAKEN. BUT INCLUDED IN THE WORK PLAN, AND I AGREE WITH SOME
- 15 OF THE PARATRANSIT RECOMMENDATIONS YOU WILL SEE IS AN
- 16 INTEGRATION OF THINGS LIKE TRAVEL TRAINING FOR PARATRANSIT
- 17 USERS, AND AN INTEGRATION OF GETTING AN RTC CARD FOR
- 18 PARATRANSIT USERS WHICH WOULD ENABLE A DISCOUNT ON FIXED ROUTE
- 19 SO THERE IS AN AUTOMATIC DOOR OPENING TO FIXED ROUTE SYSTEMS
- 20 BECAUSE YOU'RE RIGHT IT REALLY DOES OPEN UP OPTIONS. WHEN YOU
- 21 ARE LIMITED TO JUST PARATRANSIT, YOU ARE VERY LIMITED IN YOUR
- 22 ABILITY TO TRAVEL AROUND THE REGION. SO IT'S A POINT WELL
- 23 TAKEN. IT'S PINT I HAVE IN MY HEART. BUT I'LL, YOU KNOW, AND
- 24 MAYBE YOU'LL KEEP MAKING THIS POINT TO ME, BUT WE REALLY ARE



TRYING TO DO -- THIS IS A FOCUSED EFFORT FOR PARATRANSIT. BUT, 1 2 THANK YOU. 3 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: DWAYNE? 4 5 DWAYNE HANKERSON: I WANTED TO APOLOGIZE TO THE COMMITTEE. I 6 7 JOINED LATE. 8 9 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: GENAY. 10 GENAY MARKHAM: I AM INTERESTED IN HEARING MORE ABOUT THE INPUT 11 YOU GOT A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO FROM THE COUNTY BASED COMMITTEE, 12 PCC, I WOULD JUST BE INTERESTED IN HEARING MORE ABOUT WHAT 13 KIND OF FEEDBACK THEY GAVE A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO. 14 15 16 DRENNAN SHELTON: THESE ARE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES THAT ARE COUNTY BASED, AND THEY HAVE THEIR FINGER ON THE PULSE OF 17 PARATRANSIT. THEY SEE THE SERVICE REVIEW RECORDS, THE NUMBER 18 OF ADVOCATES, AND THE KIND OF COMPLAINTS THAT IN. SO THEY WERE 19 REALLY HAPPY WITH THE SET OF INITIATIVES WE HAVE IN THE WORK 20 21 PLAN. THEY SEE THEMSELVES AS THE LONE VOICE IN THE WILDERNESS, 22 TALKING ABOUT PARATRANSIT AND WHAT KINDS OF THINGS DO NEED TO 23 CHANGE. AND THEY'RE REALLY THRILLED ABOUT IT. AND YOU WILL HEAR MORE ABOUT THE PARATRANSIT COORDINATING COUNCILS AS WE 24 MOVE THROUGH THIS WORK PLAN.



1 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: THANK YOU. WALTER? 2 3 WALTER WILSON: THANK YOU. GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYONE. I HAVE A 4 5 YOU COUPLE OF COMMENTS AND A OUESTION. YOU SAID THE COMMITTEES ARE COUNTY BASED SO EVEN WHEN THERE IS MULTIPLE TRANSPORTATION 6 7 AGENCIES, CAN'T BASED HOW DOES THIS EXACTLY WORK. ARE ALL THE 8 COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AGENCIES IN THE REPRESENTED? 9 DRENNAN SHELTON: THEY'RE ALL REPRESENTED IT'S A PLACE THEY ALL 10 COME TOGETHER TO TALK ABOUT THEIR PARATRANSIT SERVICE BUT ALSO 11 COMMUNITY PROVIDERS ARE INVOLVED BECAUSE THERE IS LOTS OF 12 ACCESSIBLE SERVICES OUT IN THE COMMUNITY THAT AREN'T PUBLIC, 13 YOU KNOW, TRANSIT AGENCY PROVIDED. SO IT'S A PLACE WHERE THEY 14 ALL TALK ABOUT THE SERVICE WITHIN THE COUNTY BOUNDARIES AND 15 16 HOW THEY'RE COORDINATING AND THE REAL INTENT OF THE PCC'S IS BACK IN THE '70S WHEN THEY WERE SETUP WAS MAKING SURE THEY 17 WERE MAXIMIZING THE DOLLARS THAT THE PUBLIC TRANSIT DOLLARS 18 THAT WERE ACKNOWLEDGE INTO THE AGENCY TO ENSURE THE SERVICE 19 WAS EFFICIENT. 20 21 22 WALTER WILSON: WHAT IS THE NAME OF THE GROUPS? WHAT ARE THEY 23 CALLED PUBLICALLY.



DRENNAN SHELTON: PARATRANSIT COUNCILS ALL BROWN ACTED. THEY'RE 1 EITHER HOSTED BY A TRANSIT AGENCY OR THE COUNTY TRANSPORTATION 2 3 AUTHORITY. IF YOU ALL WANT MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THAT, I CAN SEND A LIST WHERE YOU CAN GET IN CONTACT WITH YOUR COUNTY'S 4 5 PCC. 6 7 WALTER WILSON: THAT WOULD BE GREAT. BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW WHERE 8 THEY ARE IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY AND WE PROBABLY HAVE A LOT TO TALK ABOUT. THE OTHER THING I WANTED TO ASK YOU ABOUT -- GO 9 10 AHEAD. 11 DRENNAN SHELTON: I WAS GOING TO SAY CHRIS IS ON THE PCC. 12 13 CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: [INDISCERNIBLE] YOU ARE WELCOME TO JOIN 14 15 CTMA, COMMITTEE FOR TRANSPORTATION MOBILITY ACCESS OUR LOCAL PCC IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY. BUT CAN VENTURE INTO 20 21 THOSE DISCUSSION TO FIGURE OUT HOW WE CAN DO A DIFFERENT PATH IN THE FUTURE FOR IDEAS YOU MIGHT HAVE. 22 23

WALTER WILSON: HELLO MICHAEL, GOOD TO SEE YOU AGAIN.

I LIKE WALTER'S COMMENT, 20 "NORMALIZED." THAT'S NOT A WORD THAT I HAVE THOUGHT ABOUT, BUT 21 22 THAT'S EXACTLY WHAT I THINK WE SHOULD AIM FOR IN NORMALIZING PARATRANSIT. PARATRANSIT ISN'T JUST THE SHUTTLE THAT YOU 23 RESERVE A DAY OR TWO IN ADVANCE. IT INCLUDES TAX I VOUCHERS 24 WHICH ALSO SOMETIMES REQUIRES SOME WAITING. BUT NORMALIZING 25



PARATRANSIT WOULD MEAN THAT IT'S ALMOST AS IMMEDIATE AS GOING 1 TO A BUS STOP OR GETTING ON A VEHICLE WHEN YOU WANT TO WITHIN 2 3 A CERTAIN TIME FRAME. LIKE TEN OR 15 MINUTES. SO, SOME OF THE OPTIONS OF NORMALIZING PARATRANSIT IS TO MAKE TAX I VOUCHERS 4 5 ON DEMAND SO THAT ONE COULD CALL AND GET A TAXI. IT COULD ALSO EXPAND RIDE-SHARE, UBER AND LYFT WHERE YOU COULD GET IMMEDIATE 6 SERVICE WITHIN A FEW MINUTES. AT LEAST MOBILITY, LIMITED 7 8 ACCESSIBILITY VEHICLES. THOSE ARE THINGS THAT COULD BE INCLUDED IN THIS PROGRAM. ALSO, RECENTLY IN SAN FRANCISCO, 9 SUPERVISOR GORDON MAR OF THE SUNSET DISTRICT WORKING WITH THE 10 COMMUNITY HAS PROPOSED AN INTERESTING IDEA ON MUNI WHERE 11 SHUTTLE BUSES WOULD BE ABLE TO GO PICK UP PEOPLE AND TAKE THEM 12 THAT LAST MILE TO A TRANSIT STATION OR PERHAPS EVEN FARTHER. 13 HE SAID THAT FUNDING ISN'T AVAILABLE TO DO THAT. BUT THERE 14 15 HAVE BEEN PROGRAMS LIKE THAT, PILOT PROGRAMS. AND I THINK 16 HAVING THEM IMPLEMENT THEM IN SOME CITIES, SO IF THE PARATRANSIT SYSTEM COULD ENCOURAGE ON DEMAND PUBLIC TRANSIT 17 THAT GOES TO THE FRONT DOOR VIA SHUTTLE BUSES THAT ARE -- HAVE 18 DISABILITY ACCESS RAMPS AND SEATS, THAT WOULD BE A REAL GOOD 19 EXPANSION OF PARA-- THE DEFINITION OF PARATRANSIT. THANK YOU. 20 21 22 DRENNAN SHELTON: HOWARD, I DO WANT TO SAY I APPRECIATE YOU'RE -- YOU'RE INCLUDING TAXI VOUCHERS, BUT NOT EVERY PLACE HAS 23 TAXI VOUCHERS. WHEN WE TALK ABOUT ADA'S AND PARATRANSIT IT'S A 24

VERY NARROW SERVICE THAT YOU HAVE TO CALL 24 HOURS IN ADVANCE



SO WE'RE TRYING TO GET THERE. BUT THAT'S OUR BIGGEST CHALLENGE. FOR EXAMPLE, ON 9 FEDERALLY FUNDED PROJECTS, WE'RE ACTUALLY REQUIRED TO USE 10 CERTIFIED DBE FIRMS. SO WE DON'T HAVE THE FLEXIBILITY TO KIND 11 OF CREATE OUR OWN, SORT OF, WAY OF MONITORING AND SAYING, 12 WELL, YOU WOULD BE CERTIFIED IF YOU WENT THROUGH THE PROCESS, 13 BUT YOU'RE NOT, SO WE CAN'T USE YOU. THERE ARE REQUIREMENTS 14 15 THAT WE HAVE TO ADHERE TOO. I DO NOT HAVE A GREAT SOLUTION 16 THAT TELLS YOU WE HAVE ACCESS TO ALL OF THOSE FIRMS AND OPPORTUNITIES. THE BEST WE CAN DO IS PURSUING CONTACTING THEM 17 AND HELPING THEM SEE THERE ARE SOLUTIONS AND RESOURCES THEY 18 CAN USE TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO GET CERTIFIED. 19 20 ANNE OLIVIA ELDRED: I APPRECIATE THE RESPONSE. I'M TRYING TO 21 FIGURE OUT HOW TO NAVIGATE THIS THING MYSELF. AND I WOULD SAY 22 THAT, YOU KNOW, WE ARE ACTIVELY IDENTIFYING THE SMALL 23 BUSINESSES AND THE DISADVANTAGED BUSINESSES, AND MINORITY 24 OWNED BUSINESSES AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESSES AND ALL THE OTHER



BUSINESSES THAT WE CARE ABOUT, IDENTIFYING WHO ARE NOT YET 1 CERTIFIED. AND, SO, TRYING TO FIND A WAY TO HELP FOLKS GET 2 3 INTO THE PIPELINE TO GET THAT CERTIFICATION, SO ANY RESOURCES ON THAT FRONT WOULD BE WELCOME. 4 5 LUZ CAMPOS: I WAS ABOUT TO SAY THAT. NORCO, PTAC IS A PROGRAM 6 FUNDED BY THE STATE AND THEY HAVE SERVICES WHERE THEY ACTUALLY 7 8 HELP THE SMALL BUSINESSES FILL OUT THE APPLICATIONS AND TAKE THEM THROUGH THE WHOLE PROCESS. VTA HAD LIZ BRAZIL WHO WAS A 9 10 CERTIFIED AGENT BUT NOW IS WORKING FOR NORCO, PTAC, NOW THEY HAVE A SMALL BUSINESS, WE HAD SOMEONE THAT HAS A PROPOSAL FOR 11 A PROJECT AND WE HELPED THEM GET THROUGH THE PROCESS CONNECTED 12 THEM WITH STAFF TO HELP THEM GET THE CERTIFICATION. THE STATE 13 GIVES CERTIFICATION WITHIN 72 HOURS WHENEVER YOU'RE LOOKING 14 15 FOR RESOURCES TO GET A CERTIFICATION LIKE MICHAEL SAID WE'RE 16 NOT A CERTIFYING AGENCY WE HAVE REALLY CLOSE CONTACT WITH THOSE SERVICES IS THEY'RE FREE OF CHARGE. SO REACH OUT TO ME 17 AND I'LL BE ABLE TO GIVE YOU A DIRECT CONTACT FOR THOSE 18 BUSINESSES THAT YOU SAID ARE IN THE REGION THAT CAN GET 19 CERTIFIED. AND WE'LL JUST STREAMLINE THE PROCESS FOR THEM. 20 21 BECAUSE WE UNDERSTAND HOW STRESSFUL AND LENGTHY IT COULD BE. 22 THANK YOU. 23 ANNE OLIVIA ELDRED: THAT'S AWESOME. I DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE 72 24

25 HOUR THING. THANK YOU SO MUCH.





1 2 LUZ CAMPOS: ABSOLUTELY. 3 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: WALTER? 4 5 WALTER WILSON: HEY, LUZ, HOW ARE YOU DOING? GOOD TO SEE YOU 6 AGAIN. LISTEN, MINORITY BUSINESS CONSORTIUM OUR BUSINESS SPACE 7 8 WE WORK IN AND WE WORK AS ADVOCATED. SBES IF YOU MAKE \$37 MILLION OR LESS, GROSS, YOU COULD 13 BE AN SBE, IT INCLUDES A WHOLE LOT OF PEOPLE MOST OF WHICH ARE 14 15 VERY PROMINENT WHITE OWNED GROUPS. 37 MILLION OR LESS, THE DBE 16 IS 1.3 MILLION OR LESS, MAYBE THE COST OF A HOME OR SOMETHING I DON'T THINK THEY INCLUDE THAT BUT THIS IS WHAT YOU NEED TO 17 UNDERSTAND THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DBE, AND SBE. THE DIFFERENCE 18 BETWEEN SBE, YOU CAN ACTUALLY GET APPROXIMATE A DAY, 72 HOURS, 19 YOU CAN GO ONLINE AND DO IT YOURSELF PRETTY OUICKLY. DBE CAN 20 BE ANYWHERE FROM 45 TO 90 DAYS. LOCAL WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS, AND SO THAT IT'S ON OUR 1 RADAR TO TRY TO GET THERE, BUT FOR RIGHT NOW, NO, NEITHER OUR 2 3 SBE OR OUR DBE PROGRAM GETS INTO INFORMANT LEVEL OR HIRING PRACTICES. 4 5 HOWARD WONG: SO A HIRED FIRM MAY BE HEADQUARTERED OUTSIDE OF 6 7 THE REGION? OR OUTSIDE OF THE AREA OF THE PROJECT? 8 MICHAEL BRINTON: YES THIS'S CORRECT. WE DO NOT HAVE ANY 9 GEOGRAPHIC LIM LIMITATION. 



- 15 JUST WANT TO SEE A BREAK DOWN OF EACH PROCUREMENT AND HOW MUCH
- 16 MONEY IS SPENT ON EACH ONE. BECAUSE, IF WE'RE -- THE GOAL IS
- 17 TO HELP DISADVANTAGED BUSINESSES AND SMALL BUSINESSES, I THINK
- 18 IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT TO BE ABLE TO LOOK AT ALL OF THAT
- 19 INFORMATION SO THAT WE CAN JUST HAVE MORE DETAIL AND BE ABLE
- 20 TO ANALYZE THE INFORMATION. ALSO, IN TERMS OF -- SO, I KNOW
- 21 MTC DOESN'T DO THE CERTIFICATION, AND I THINK THAT THERE
- 22 SHOULD BE A PUBLIC PLACE WHERE FOLKS CAN GO TO DO FIND OUT

- 18 MICHAEL BRINTON: OKAY AS FAR AS GETTING YOU THE DISAGGREGATED
- 19 DATA I'LL MAKE SURE YOU'RE ADDED TO THAT E-MAIL. IN TERMS OF
- 20 ADDING MORE INFORMATION OR BETTER INFORMATION TO OUR WEB
- 21 SITES. ONE OF THE THINGS WE MENTIONED IS WE'RE CURRENTLY
- 22 LOOKING AT OUR WEB SITES TO TRY TO FIGURE OUT HOW WE CAN
- 23 IMPROVE AND THAT'S ONE THING WE CAN ADD TO OUR LIST. WE DO A
- 24 LOT OF SEARCHING OF OUR PEER WEB SITES, YOU KNOW, SMART

- 5 PROCUREMENT, SO IT WILL SAY NO PROGRAM, ON PAGE 3 AND 4, SO,
- 6 WHAT WERE THOSE FUNDS USED FOR? THAT'S ONE OF MY QUESTIONS.
- 7 AND MY SECOND QUESTION IS, FOR THE NEW FOLKS, WHICH I'M ONE
- 8 OF, WHAT IS SOLE SOURCE.

- 10 MICHAEL BRINTON: ALL RIGHT. SO TYPICAL GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT
- 11 IS THAT YOU WANT TO PUT CONTRACT OPPORTUNITY OUT TO THE PUBLIC
- 12 TO ALLOW THEM TO COMPETE FOR IT. TO ALLOW FOR BUSINESSES TO GO
- 13 THROUGH A COMPETITIVE PROCESS TO WIN THE CONTRACT. THERE ARE
- 14 TIMES WHERE IT'S JUSTIFIED TO SKIP THAT COMPETITIVE
- 15 PROCUREMENT PROCESS AND TO JUST PICK A COMPANY AND ENTER INTO

- 9 MICHAEL BRINTON: I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU AN EXAMPLE, IF A
- 10 PROJECT IS NOT FEDERALLY FUNDED THEN OUR DBE PROGRAM DOES NOT
- 11 COME INTO PLAY NOW WE HAVE OUR SPRAWL ENTERPRISE PROGRAM THAT
- 12 WE WOULD ATTEMPT TO APPLY. LET'S SAY IT'S AN ARCHITECTURAL AND
- 13 ENGINEERING PROJECT, THE LAW AROUND ARCHITECTURAL AND
- 14 ENGINEERING BOTH FEDERAL AND STATE LAW REQUIRE YOU PICK FROM A
- 15 FIRM PURELY BASED ON OUALIFICATIONS. SO WE CAN'T APPLY A SMALL
- 16 BUSINESS PREFERENCE PROGRAM TO AN ARCHITECTURAL AND

- 22 IN A VARIETY OF REASONS OVER A NUMBER OF YEARS IN DIFFERENCE
- 23 LAWSUITS BUT IT'S A WAY TO ENSURE THAT NOTHING BUT PICKING THE
- 24 MOST QUALIFIED ENGINEER IS RELEVANT. THAT'S WHY OUR SBE
- 25 PROGRAM CAN'T BE APPLIED. WHEN YOU SEE A PROGRAM THAT'S NO



- 1 STATS THERE ARE SITUATIONS WHERE THERE ARE NO FEDERAL FUNDS
- 2 AND FOR SOME REASON WE WEREN'T ABLE TO APPLY OUR SBE PROGRAM
- 3 TO THE CONTRACT AS WELL.

- 5 CHAIR, ILAF ESUF: THANKS MICHAEL. AND I JUST WANTED TO SAY FOR
- 6 THE FOLLOW-UP RESOURCES THAT YOU ARE GOING TO BE SENDING FOLKS
- 7 IF YOU CAN SEND IT TO KY-NAM AND KY-NAM CAN SEND IT TO THE
- 8 SUBCOMMITTEE SO WE ALL HAVE ACCESS.

- 25 THAT PARTICULARLY ON ZOOM IT SHOULD BE EASIER WHERE YOU HAVE



- 1 SOME ZOOM MEETINGS WHERE YOU CAN ACTUALLY DEAL WITH, OKAY,
- 2 THIS IS WHAT IT TAKES TO WIN A CONTRACT, THIS IS WHAT IT TAKES
- 3 TO WIN THAT KIND OF CRACK, THIS KIND OF CONTRACT, AND SOMEBODY
- 4 GETS TURNED DOWN ON A CONTRACT, OR MISSES OUT ON A CONTRACT,
- 5 YOU AUTOMATICALLY MAKE THEM AVAILABLE ABOUT THIS PROGRAM

- 12 THE PRESENTATION SHE MENTIONED THAT IN THE SECOND HALF OF THIS
- 13 FISCAL YEAR, WE'RE GOING TO BEGIN DOING INFORMATION SESSIONS
- 14 ON PROJECT-SPECIFIC INFORMATION RELATED TO MTC OR ABAG. SO A
- 15 LOT OF TIMES WHEN YOU GO TO THE LARGER GROUP PRESENTATIONS,
- 16 THERE IS NOT ENOUGH TIME TO DIVE IN ON A PROJECT BY PROJECT
- 17 BASIS OF WHAT IT TAKES. SO, THAT'S WHAT WE WERE WORKING

- 10 PROCUREMENT COOS IS MORE SPECIFIC TO OUR DBE AND SBE. BUT I
- 11 CAN COMMIT THAT I CAN COME UP WITH SOME LANGUAGE THAT WE CAN

- 19 MICHAEL BRINTON: 504, SO WE'RE LOOKING AT PUTTING SPECIFIC
- 20 LANGUAGE ABOUT REQUIRING OUR CONTRACTORS TO ENSURE THEIR WORK
- 21 PRODUCTS COMPLY WITH SECTION 504. RIGHT NOW WE HAVE A BROADER
- 22 STATEMENT THAT WE REQUIRE THEM TO COMPLY WITH ALL LAWS,
- 23 REGULATIONS AND CODES BUT WE WANT TO BE MORE SPECIFIC ABOUT
- 24 THAT ACCESSIBLE. THE LANGUAGE PIECE I CAN DEFINITELY WORK ON,
- 25 AND I'LL FOLLOW UP WITH YOU ON THAT. THE CHALLENGE OR NEXT



- 1 ITERATION OR STEP OF THAT WOULD BE, YOU KNOW, HOW DO YOU

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- 1 HOWARD WONG: QUICK IDEA, STIMULATED BY CHRIS'S COMMENTS AND
- 2 MICHAEL'S COMMENTS. IN THE RFP PROCESS WHERE MULTIPLE FIRMS
- 3 COMPETE, THERE IS A SCORING PROCESS, THERE COULD BE BONUS
- 4 POINTS LOCAL COMMUNITY HIRING, AND BONUS POINTS FOR HAVING
- 5 TEAM MEMBERS WHO ARE DISABLE. FOR INSTANCE, 60 MINUTE HIS A
- 6 SHOW ABOUT A BLIND ARCHITECT IN SAN FRANCISCO WHO HELPED
- 7 DESIGN THIS ACCESSIBILITY FOR THE TRANSBAY TERMINAL. IT'S VERY
- 8 INTERESTING. SO, ANYWAY JUST SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT BONUS POINTS.
