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AMENDMENT INCORPORATED AT THAT LOCATION T TECH WAS A CONTRACT 1 EFFECTIVE APRIL 1ST, 2022 ACCORDING TO THE TERMS OF AN ASSET 2 3 PURCHASE AGREEMENT THE SECOND CONTRACT ACTION IS AMENDMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300,000 HOLDING CLIPPERS SERVICES AT THE 4 5 BEHAVIOR CROSSING AT SAN FRANCISCO FERRY BUILDING. GO AHEAD, 11 PLEASES. 12 13 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, AGAIN, CHAIR BOB POWERS AND MEMBERS. ALETA 14 15 DUPREE FOR THE RECORD SHE AND HER THIS IS IMPORTANT WORK. 16 ESPECIALLY AS WE COME OUT OF THE PANDEMIC. IN-PERSON OUTREACH AND CONVERSATION IS ESSENTIAL BECAUSE THERE ARE THINGS THAT 17 YOU CAN GET IN-PERSON THAT YOU CAN'T GET ON WEB SITES NOW. AND 18 EMBARCADERO AND THE FERRY BUILDING ARE VERY IMPORTANT 19 LOCATIONS, ESPECIALLY FOR PEOPLE WHO VISIT THE BAY AREA, 20 ESPECIALLY SAN FRANCISCO AND OAKLAND. IT'S REALLY NO DIFFERENT 21 THAN SELLING OMNI FARE CARDS IN NEW YORK CITY. THEY SHOULD BE 22 SOLD IN PENNSYLVANIA STATION IN GRAND CENTRAL TERMINAL. SO WE 23 WANT TO GET MORE PEOPLE ON CLIPPER, AND AS MUCH AS I WOULD 24 LIKE TO SEE PEOPLE PREPLAN THEIR CLIPPER BEFORE THEY COME, 25

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MANY DON'T KNOW ABOUT IT. THIS IS A WAY THAT WE CAN HOPEFULLY 1 HELP PEOPLE EARLY IN THEIR VACATIONS, THAT THEY CAN DISCOVER 2 3 THAT CLIPPER CAN BE A VERY USEFUL PROGRAM FOR THEM THAT THEY CAN RETURN TO ON SUBSEQUENT VISITS TO THE BAY AREA, RATHER 4 5 THAN WALKING AROUND WITH A POCKET FULL OF MONEY, AND THEY LOSE MONEY ALONG THE WAY. IT DROPS ON THE GROUND, NEVER TO BE FOUND 6 AGAIN, AND REGISTRATION IS VERY IMPORTANT. WE CAN HELP PEOPLE 7 8 GET THESE CARDS REGISTERED. IT'S VERY HARD FOR TOURISTS WHEN THEY LOSE MONEY FOR TRANSIT TICKETS OR IT GETS STOLEN. THEY 9 HAVE NO RECOURSE. CLIPPER GIVES RECOURSE. WE'VE SHOULD PASS 10 THIS ITEM. YOU NEVER KNOW THERE MAY BE A TIME WHEN I NEED 11 ANSWERS TO MY OUESTIONS IN-PERSON. I WANT THEM TO BE THERE FOR 12 ME. VOTE YES. THANK YOU 13

JASON WEINSTEIN: THANK YOU CHAIR POWERS. BROADCASTING TEAM. WE 4 5 CAN WAIT FOR A SECOND, PULL THOSE DOWN WHILE I GO THROUGH THIS FIRST PART. ACTUALLY, ATTACHMENT A, ATTACHED TO YOUR MEMO, BUT 6 WE'RE NOT GOING TO PUT ON THE SCREEN, INCLUDES, AS WE DO 7 8 REGULARLY, A STATUS REPORT MONTHLY. IT SHOWS THAT HIGH-LEVEL SCHEDULE RECENTLY COMPLETED ACTIVITIES UPCOMING DELIVERABLES 9 10 AND HIGHLIGHTS. A COUPLE OF THINGS I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT, PILOT TESTING FOR FERRY AND TRAIN PLATFORM READERS AND RETAIL 11 DEVICES ARE ONGOING, SYSTEM INTEGRATION TESTING FOR BUSES AND 12 LIGHT RAIL VEHICLES RESUMING SOON WITH THE -- WITH REGARD TO 13 THE ACCOUNT BASED SYSTEM INTEGRATION, WE'RE CONTINUING AND 14 15 WE'RE GETTING CLOSE TO FINAL DESIGN REVIEW ON THE -- WHICH 16 WE'LL REVIEW TO MAKE SURE OUR COMMENTS HAVE BEEN INCORPORATED 17 AND THEN WE'LL GO FROM THERE. ADDITIONALLY, TO FOLLOW UP ON THE PREVIOUS MEETING, WE'RE INCORPORATING THE CHANGES TO THE 18 SCHEDULE THAT YOU APPROVED LAST MONTH, THAT WERE APPROVED BY 19 THE MTC OPERATIONS COMMITTEE, ALSO, THIS PAST FRIDAY. AND, 20 NOW, INCLUDED, ALSO, ARE A FEW PICTURES -- IF WE COULD PULL 21 THOSE UP? -- THANK YOU. NEXT SLIDE. HERE IS 2 3 WETA IN GOLDEN GATE FERRY PLATFORM READERS, THEY DON'T HAVE THE STICKERS YET BUT WILL SOON. FINALLY, WE HAVE, NEXT SLIDE 4 5 PLEASE -- THIS IS MUNI, LIGHT RAIL VEHICLE. LIGHTING LIGHT RAIL VEHICLE, LV, THIS IS WHAT YOU WILL SEE ON BUSES. THAT'S 6 MY REPORT. I CAN ANSWER QUESTIONS FROM THE PREVIOUS TASK FORCE 7 8 MEETING AND CERTAINLY HERE.

ADINA LEVIN: GOOD AFTERNOON. THIS IS ADINA LEVIN, ALSO WITH --18 ON THE MTC POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL, THOUGH, REPRESENTING 19 MYSELF AND ALWAYS FORGETTING TO LOG OUT TO NOT GET THE 20 21 SEAMLESS NAME. I THINK MOST OF THE PEOPLE HERE HEARD THE QUESTION THEY ASKED IN THE PREVIOUS FARE INTEGRATION TASK 22 FORCE MEETING THAT RELATES TO THIS AGENDA ITEM AND THE 23 SCHEDULE OF THE CLIPPER 2.0 ROLL OUT. AT THE FARE INTEGRATION 24 TASK FORCE THE STAFF GAVE A PRESENTATION ON GETTING STARTED 25

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THINKING THROUGH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FREE AND REDUCED 1 COST TRANSFERS THAT WAS PART OF THE FARE POLICY VISION THAT 2 3 WAS APPROVED BY THE FARE INTEGRATION TASK FORCE IN -- LAST NOVEMBER. AND THE OUESTION FOR THIS AGENDA ITEM IS HOW THAT 4 5 RELATES TO THE ROLL OUT OF CLIPPER 2.0. THE TIMING OF THAT FEATURE IS BEING WORKED OUT TO BE POTENTIALLY ALONG WITH THE 6 CLIPPER 2.0 ROLL OUT HOWEVER THERE IS ANOTHER FEATURE THAT'S 7 8 SUPPOSED TO BE PART OF THE CLIPPER 2.0 ROLL OUT WHICH IS A BASIC IMPLEMENTATION OF OPEN PAYMENT SO THAT PEOPLE ARE ABLE 9 TO USE A DEBIT CARD OR A CREDIT CARD OR AN APP THAT THEY HAVE 10 TO BE ABLE TO PAY IN ADDITION TO THE BLUE PLASTIC CLIPPER CARD 11 AND THE CLIPPER MOBILE APP, AND THAT WOULD BE -- THAT WOULD 12 WORK WITH A SINGLE ADULT FARE. FOR EXAMPLE, IF YOU USE AC 13 TRANSIT OR BART, ONE FARE. BUT THE QUESTION IS, WILL THAT ALSO 14 15 APPLY TO THE FREE AND REDUCED COST TRANSFERS? THAT WOULD BE 16 GOOD TO KNOW WHAT THE SCHEDULE WOULD BE FOR THAT, BECAUSE IT WILL BE CONFUSING FOR RIDERS THAT THEY GET THE FREE TRANSFERS 17 WITH THE BLUE CARD AND NOT WITH THE OTHER PAYMENT METHODS. 18 THANK YOU. 19

25 SHE AND HER. I SPEAK TO YOU AS SIMPLY AN ORDINARY USER OF

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PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND I'M GOING TO TALK ABOUT THESE 1 READERS. I'M REALLY LOOKING FORWARD TO THE NEW READERS BECAUSE 2 3 THE OLD ONES ARE REALLY SHOWING THEIR AGE IN WHICH THE NUMBERS AND LETTERS, THE BLUE OR BLACK NUMBERS, CHARACTERS ON THAT 4 5 GREENISH SCREEN ARE REALLY FADING AWAY. MOST OF THE TIME I DON'T WORRY ABOUT IT, BECAUSE WHEN IT MAKES THE SOUND, I KNOW 6 THAT IT'S TAKEN. BUT I EMPHASIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF THESE 7 8 READERS, IN WHICH I HAVE USED SIMILAR ONES IN LOS ANGELES AND CHICAGO, WHICH ARE MUCH BETTER DISPLAYS -- I HAD MY TOOTH 9 FILLED THIS MORNING -- THERE IS A QUIRK IN THE SYSTEM THAT 10 REALLY REQUIRES ME TO BE ABLE TO SEE THE DISPLAYS, AND THAT IS 11 USING THE TRANSBAY BUSES ON AC TRANSIT, IN THE DIRECTION OF 12 LEAVING THE EAST BAY AND GOING TO SAN FRANCISCO. I USUALLY USE 13 WHAT'S CALLED THE F-BUS. F, AND IN FRANK, IT GOES THROUGH 14 15 BERKELEY, EMERYVILLE AND OAKLAND. AND I DON'T ALWAYS USE THAT 16 BUS TO GO OVER THE BRIDGE. THE BUS DRIVER HAS A SWITCH TO SELECT PAY TRANSFER OR LOCAL FARE, AND IT'S CERTAINLY THEY SEE 17 THAT INFORMATION BEFORE I TAP MY CARD SO THEY DON'T ACTUALLY 18 GET CHARGED THE TRANSBAY FARE. SO I HOPE WE CAN GET THESE NEW 19 READERS OUT, AND I WOULD DEFINITELY PRIORITIZE THEM ON THE AC 20 21 TRANSIT TRANSBAY ROUTES. THANK YOU.

23 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THANK YOU ALETA.

24

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CLERK, FRED CASTRO: THANK YOU. AND IF STAFF CAN SHOW US THE
 BOARDROOM FOR ANY PUBLIC SPEAKERS? AND I SEE NO PUBLIC
 SPEAKERS IN THE BOARDROOM.

5 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THANKS, FRED. WHY DON'T WE START, JASON, NOT TO PUT YOU ON THE SPOT, BUT THERE WAS A BRIEF DISCUSSION 6 AT THE FARE INTEGRATION MEETING JUST AHEAD OF THIS ONE. AND 7 8 WHY DON'T YOU JUST WALK US THROUGH THE COORDINATION. I GOT TO THINK YOU AND EISEMAN AND BACON, AND YOU ARE CLOSELY 9 10 COORDINATED AND YOU HAVE A PLAN ON HOW THE CLIPPER TWO SCHEDULE AND IMPLEMENTATION CROSSWALKS INTO OUR FARE 11 INTEGRATION PILOT, SO THERE IS, YOU KNOW, THAT FROM A RISK 12 REGISTER, WE'RE MINIMIZING THOSE RISKS THAT ARE KNOWN OUT 13 THERE. SO DO YOU WANT TO TAKE THAT HEAD ON? 14

15

16 JASON WEINSTEIN: SURE, I CAN DO THAT, AND I CAN ATTEMPT TO 17 ADDRESS THE OPEN PAYMENT QUESTION, AS WELL. AS I AM SURE YOU ARE ALL AWARE AND HAVE DISCUSSED BRIEFLY IN THE LAST MEETING, 18 SO PHASE ONE OF THE, YOU KNOW, PILOT PROGRAM IS SET TO LAUNCH 19 THIS SUMMER. THAT'S GOING TO BE IN OUR CARD-BASED C1 20 21 ENVIRONMENT, AND THE NEXT PHASE OF THE ITEMS THAT WOULD BE ADDRESSED WOULD BE, ONCE WE HAVE THE ACCOUNT-BASED SYSTEM 22 AVAILABLE, SUCH THAT THOSE NEWER FEATURES WOULD BE AVAILABLE 23 TO THE REGION. SO, YOU KNOW, WE'RE IN LINE, AND WE HAVE BEEN 24 IN LINE FOR SOMETIME, AND WE ARE ON OUR OWN PATH IN TERMS OF 25

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GETTING C2 DEPLOYED. AND SO, TO THE EXTENT THAT THERE IS GOING 1 TO BE PRESSURE THERE, THERE WILL, I'M SURE WE'LL FEEL PRESSURE 2 3 FROM THE FARE INTEGRATION TASK FORCE THAT WE MAKE SURE WE GET THEM GOING AT THE SAME TIME. I WANT TO MENTION WITH REGARD TO 4 5 CONTACTLESS OPEN PAYMENTS, THE USE OF ENABLED CONTACTLESS ENABLED CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD, YES, IF YOU REMEMBER IN NOVEMBER 6 OF 2020 IT SEEMED LIKE A LONG TIME AGO, THIS BOARD APPROVED 7 8 THE EXERCISING OPTION TO ACCEPT OPEN PAYMENT AS PART OF NEXGEN CLIPPER, SO EVERYBODY, ALL 22 OF US WILL BE ABLE TO ACCEPT 9 10 CONTACTLESS CREDIT AND DEBIT CARDS WHEN WE LAUNCH TO THE PUBLIC. NOW, AS ADINA MENTIONED IN SOME OF HER COMMENTS, THE 11 CURRENT PLAN, AND WE MENTIONED THIS AS WELL IS WHEN YOU SHOW 12 UP TO OUR SYSTEM, WE DON'T KNOW WHO YOU ARE. WE DON'T KNOW IF 13 YOU ARE ADULT, YOUTH, OR SENIOR, AND WITHOUT REGISTERING IT 14 15 WOULD BE IMPOSSIBLE TON WHO YOU ARE IF YOU JUST CAME TO OUR 16 SYSTEM WITH YOUR CONTACTLESS CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD AND SAID I WANT TO RIDES YOUR SYSTEM. THE WAY IT'S GOING TO WORK IS 17 YOU'RE CHARGED AS THOUGH YOU WERE A FULL FARE ADULT FOR A 18 RIDE. JUST LIKE WHEN YOU WENT TO A STORE, I WENT TO GO BUY A 19 PRODUCT, AND YOU PURPOSE THAT PRODUCT AND IT'S PAY AS YOU GO. 20 21 THE IDEA BEHIND THAT IS THAT, IF YOU WANT ALL THE DISCOUNTS AND TRANSFERS AND EVERYTHING THAT WE'RE OFFERING, CLIPPER IS 22 THE WAY TO GO. USING YOUR CONTACTLESS CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD IS 23 NOT NECESSARILY THE WAY TO GO. AT LEAST INITIALLY. YOU KNOW, 24 25 AND, YES, IT WILL BE A CHALLENGING DISTINCTION. SO, THE IDEA

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WOULD BE FOR, AT LEAST, INITIAL ROLL OUT, IF YOU WANT TO -- IF 1 2 YOU ARE AN INFREQUENT RIDER AND NOT TRANSFERRING ALL OVER THE 3 PLACE AND USING YOUR CONTACTLESS CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD MAKES SENSE, IF YOU WANT TO TRAVEL THE SYSTEM AND HAVE THE BENEFIT 4 5 OF ALL THE TRANSFER DISCOUNTS BECAUSE IT IS COMPLICATED WITH ALL OF THE SYSTEMS THAT WE HAVE INTERPLAYING WITH EACH OTHER, 6 THEN CLIPPER IS THE WAY TO GO. SO, I'LL JUST PAUSE THERE FOR A 7 8 SECOND AND SEE IF THERE ARE ANY FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS. 9 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: NO. GOOD. THAT'S A GOOD REMINDER. 10 11 JASON WEINSTEIN: I ALSO WANT TO SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT WITH 12 REGARD TO APPS. YOU WILL NOT PAY WITH THE APP. THERE IS 13 PAYMENT WITH OUR APP. WE HAVE A MOBILE CLIPPER CARD WHICH IS 14 15 IN YOUR PHONE'S WALLET. IT WILL BE A LITTLE BIT CHALLENGING IN THE FUTURE, BECAUSE IF YOU HAVE A CONTACTLESS CREDIT OR DEBIT 16 CARD IN YOUR MOBILE WALLET, INDEPENDENT OF CLIPPER, YOU COULD 17 USE THAT AS AN OPEN PAYMENT METHOD THAT HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH 18 PAYING WITH AN APP. 19 20

21 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THANK YOU, JASON. LET'S GO TO COMMITTEE 22 MEMBERS COMMENTS OR THOUGHTS FOR JASON? ANYBODY? DENIS, ARE 23 YOU GOOD? OKAY. OKAY. I'M NOT SEEING FOLKS HERE. SO, JASON, 24 WHY DON'T WE MIGRATE OVER TO AGENDA ITEM 4B, WHICH IS THE 25 UPDATE ON THE CLIPPER OPERATIONS AND PERFORMANCE. AND, JASON,

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I THINK YOU'RE GIVING THIS REPORT, AS WELL. JAYS AREAS YEP. IF 1 2 WE CAN PULL UP THE SLIDES FOR THAT, I'LL WALK YOU THROUGH 3 THEM. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. WE SHARED THESE SLIDES WITH YOU LAST MONTH AND WILL CONTINUE TO DO SO FOR THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS 4 5 SO WE CAN KEEP AN EYE ON TRENDS. THE SLIDE SHOWS THE NUMBER OF CLIPPER TRANSACTIONS OVER THE LAST YEAR AND IN APRIL WE 6 PROCESSED OVER 10 MILLION TRANSACTIONS AFTER OUR TYPICAL 7 8 SEASONAL DIP COUPLED WITH OUR, WHAT WE PRESUME TO BE IMPACTS OF COVID-19 IS SLIGHTLY DOWN FROM MARCH THIS PAST YEAR BUT 9 REMAINS RELATIVELY STABLE. SO IT'S GOOD. NEXT SLIDE. THE NEXT 10 SLIDE PORTRAY TOTAL REVENUE BY CLIPPER BY TRANSACTION SLIGHTLY 11 DOWN SETTLED JUST OVER \$20 MILLION IN REVENUE IN APRIL. LET'S 12 GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE. AS WE MENTIONED, I THINK, LAST MONTH, 13 IT'S BEEN OVER A YEAR NOW SINCE WE INTRODUCED THE MOBILE 14 15 CLIPPER CARD, AS WELL AS, AT THE SAME TIME, LAUNCHING 16 SEPARATELY THE CLIPPER APP. THIS SLIDE REPRESENTS HOW MANY MOBILE CARDS HAVE BEEN PROVISIONED SINCE APRIL 15TH OF LAST 17 YEAR, AND AS YOU CAN SEE, WE'RE MAKING SOME GREAT PROGRESS. 18 THE LIGHT BLUE LINE IS NEW CARD ISSUANCE. AND, SO, AS YOU 19 RECALL, WE HAVE A PUSH WHICH I'LL TALK ABOUT IN A SECOND TO 20 GET PEOPLE TO USE MOBILE CARDS. YOU CAN SEE I THINK THAT IT'S 21 HAVING SUCCESS. THE LIGHT LINE IS DIGITAL PROVISIONAL CARDS IN 22 SOMEBODY'S WALLET, AND THE DARK BLUE LINE ARE PLASTIC CARDS 23 THAT HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM PHYSICAL PLAST PICK CARDS TO 24 SOMEBODY'S WALLET. TO GIVE YOU AN IDEA OF SOME OF THE NUMBERS, 25

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WE'RE ABOUT 300 -- A LITTLE LESS THAN 340,000 TOTAL FOR CARDS 1 2 THAT HAVE BEEN PURCHASED INDIRECTLY TO SOMEBODY'S WALLET, AND 3 246,000 WHICH HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM PLASTIC SO A LITTLE OVER 550,000 TOTAL. THIS SLIDE INDICATES NUMBERS USING MOBILE 4 5 CARDS YOU CAN SEE IT'S GREAT OVERALL. AND I THINK THAT'S REALLY ALL I WANT TO SAY HERE. IT'S GOOD PROGRESS TO SEE SINCE 6 THAT JANUARY DIP. NEXT SLIDE. FINALLY WE HAVE THIS TABLE THAT 7 8 SHOWS THE COMPARISON ON THE LEFT SIDE WE HAVE SINCE THE APRIL 2021 LAUNCH BY EVERY OPERATOR, NUMBER USING THE CLIPPER CARDS 9 MOBILE CARD WE HAVE TOTAL PERCENTAGE SINCE LAST YEAR OUR 10 PERCENTAGE KEEPS TICKING UP, WE'RE AT ABOUT 11% TOTAL TRIPS 11 SINCE APRIL OF 2021 BUT JUST APRIL ALONE OF 2022, THAT'S THE 12 RIGHT SIDE, YOU CAN SEE WE'RE CONTINUING TO MAKE PROGRESS. I 13 THINK LAST MONTH WE WERE AROUND 50% OF TOTAL TRIPS MADE BY 14 15 MOBILE AND YOU CAN SEE THIS MONTH WHERE IT'S 16% ON THE BOTTOM 16 RIGHT THERE. AND I'LL JUST PAUSE THERE AND SEE IF WE HAVE ANY 17 QUESTIONS ABOUT THAT.

19 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: JASON, IS THIS THE END OF YOUR REPORT?
20 OR ARE THERE MORE SLIDES HERE?

21

JASON WEINSTEIN: NO MORE SLIDES. BUT I HAVE A COUPLE OF OTHER THINGS. IN TERMS OF THE MOBILE CARD FEE I WANT TO LET YOU KNOW, AS YOU'RE ALL AWARE WE BEGAN THIS PILOT IN MARCH SO WE'RE JUST APPROACHING TWO MONTHS OF HAVING THE CARD BE FREE

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AGAIN. YOU WILL LIKELY BE SEEING ADDS IF YOU HAVE THAT 1 ALREADY, IN BOTH DIGITAL AND PRINT MEDIA PROMOTING THE USE OF 2 3 THE MOBILE CARDS AND THE CAMPAIGN BEGAN IN EARLY APRIL TO PROMOTE THAT. AND WITH REGARD TO THAT, WE HAD MENTIONED 4 5 CLIPPER AND OPERATOR STAFF HAVE MET WITH OUR CONTRACTOR ALL --[INDISCERNIBLE] ALTERNATIVES ANOTHER SUBCONTRACTOR TO GATHER 6 MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THE UPCOMING TITLE SIX ANALYSIS 7 8 REGARDING THE CARD FEE DIFFERENTIALS THAT WILL BE COMING BACK IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS AND FINALLY IN TERMS OF C1 9 OUARTERLY FARE CHANGE DEADLINES A REMINDER AGAIN FROM LAST 10 MONTH CUBIC REQUESTED THAT WE GIVE THEM QUARTERLY FARE CHANGE 11 REQUESTS TO HELP THEM MANAGE THE WORK ON THE NEW DEVICE 12 MANAGEMENT AND DEVELOPING NEXGEN SYSTEM. SO, FOR JULY 1ST THE 13 DEADLINE IS PASSED, BUT FOR OCTOBER 1ST FARE CHANGES, THE 14 DEADLINE IS JULY 1ST. THAT IS MY REPORT. AND HAPPY TO ANSWER 15 16 ANY QUESTIONS.

18 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. THANKS JASON. LET'S GO BACK TO19 FRED. FRED, PUBLIC COMMENT?

CLERK, FRED CASTRO: THERE ARE NO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH

AND I'M JUST CURIOUS, CAN YOU DO CLIPPER START WITH THE CLIPPER MOBILE 9 10 AS WELL, AND IF SO WHAT PERCENTAGE OF CLIPPER START ARE YOU USING FOR CLIPPER MOBILE. IF YOU COULD GET THAT FOR THE 11 FUTURE, THAT WOULD BE HELPFUL. 12

JASON WEINSTEIN: YES, LISA IS TALKING TO ME IN THE BACKGROUND,
SAYING YES. OF COURSE, WE CAN BRING STATS FOR FUTURE MEETINGS
TO THIS GROUP. YOU CAN TRANSFER YOUR PLASTIC CLIPPER START
CARD TO YOUR MOBILE PHONE.

19 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. ANY OTHER BOARD MEMBERS, COMMITTEE 20 MEMBERS COMMENTS, OBSERVATIONS FOR JASON ON THIS TOPIC. NOT 21 SEEING ANY. OF THE. JASON AS A HEADS UP FOR ME AS THE 22 COMMITTEE CHAIR AT SOME POINT I MIGHT WANT ANDY FREMIER HERE 23 WITH YOU TO WALK US THROUGH WHERE WE ARE WITH CARDS. AS A 24 REGION WE'RE TRYING TO ENCOURAGE FOLKS TO GO TO CLIPPER, SOME 25 FORM OF CLIPPER CARD OR, YOU KNOW, IN YOUR WALLET O YOUR

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PHONE, BUT, YOU KNOW, CARD AVAILABILITY. I TOOK A BRIEFING ON, 1 AS IT RELATES TO A LOT OF AVAILABILITIES, IT'S NOT JUST UNIQUE 2 3 TO THE CLIPPER CARD, BUT, YOU KNOW, EVERYTHING FROM, YOU KNOW, FROM REBAR TO, YOU KNOW, CEMENT, TO -- THERE IS A LOT OF 4 5 CHALLENGES IN THE -- IN THAT DELIVERY SPHERE. AND I'M HEARING THAT IT'S -- THE CLIPPER CARDS ARE NOT IMMUNE TO THAT. SO I 6 DON'T KNOW IF IT'S THE NEXT MEETING OR THE FOLLOWING MEETING. 7 8 I JUST WANT TO GIVE YOU A HEADS UP SO YOU'RE NOT SURPRISED ABOUT THAT. AND THERESE AND ANDY WORK TOGETHER, AND THIS ROLLS 9 YOU WILL UNDER THERESE ON THE COMMITTEE AND I DIDN'T WANT TO 10 MIX THE TWO, SO ANYWAY HOW EVER THAT SHAKES OUT. 11 12 JASON WEINSTEIN: CHIP SHORTAGE IS REAL, AND WE CAN CERTAINLY 13 BRING AN UPDATE TO THIS BOARD. 14 15 16 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: SHOULDN'T IT BE UNDER THIS ITEM? 17 JASON WEINSTEIN: YEAH. I MEAN, IT'S -- SURE. YES. I WOULD 18 AGREE. IT'S TOTALLY A PART OF OUR CURRENT OPERATIONS. WE'LL 19 HAVE ISSUES WITH REGARD TO, AS YOU MAY BE AWARE, PRETTY SOON 20 WE'RE GOING TO BE GOING OUT WITH A PROCUREMENT FOR THE NEXT 21 GENERATION CARDS. BUT, IN EITHER CASE, WE NEED CHIPS FOR ALL 22 23 OF THEM.

ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: TOTALLY. AGREE 100%. ANYWAY JUST WANT TO 1 2 GIVE YOU A HEADS UP. NO SURPRISES FROM ME AS THE CHAIR. 3 JASON WEINSTEIN: SURE. WE'LL GET THAT IN THE NEXT ONE. 4 5 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THANK YOU. THAT WRAPS UP 4A AND 4B. WHY 6 DON'T WE GO TO 4C NOW AND MIGRATE TO EDWARD. AND EDWARD IS 7 8 GOING GIVE A REPORT ON WHERE WE ARE WITH OUR MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. ED, I'LL TURN IT OVER TO YOU. 9 10 EDWARD MENG: THANK YOU, CHAIR POWERS. CAN YOU HEAR ME? 11 12 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: YES. COPY THAT. 13 14 15 EDWARD MENG: LAST MONTH WE PRESENTED AN UPDATE TO YOU ALL ON 16 SOME OF THE COST SHARING AGREEMENTS FOR THE NEW MOU AS WELL AS NEXT STEPS TO GET THIS MEMO FULLY EXECUTED BY SEPTEMBER OF 17 THIS YEAR. SO PER THE REQUEST OF THE BOARD, WE HAVE ATTACHED A 18 DRAFT MOU TO THIS ITEM. THE PURPOSE OF THIS IS SPECIFICALLY 19 FOR THE EXECUTIVE OFFICERS, GENERAL COUNSELS, AND AGENCY STAFF 20 21 TO BE ABLE TO REVIEW THE UPDATES TO THE CURRENT 2016MOU, AND 22 IT'S THREE AMENDMENTS WHAT ARE I TALL SIZED IN THE DRAFT 2022MOU. WE WANTED TO HAVE THE GENERAL COUNSEL MANAGERS AND 23 STAFF FAMILIAR WITH NOT ONLY THE FORMAL MEMO OF 2022 WHICH IS 24 ACTUALLY NOT THAT SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENT THAN THE CURRENT MOU 25

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IN PLACE BUT TO BE FAMILIAR WITH THE UPDATES GENERAL CLEAN UP 1 AND CLARIFICATIONS, INCLUSION OF THE ADDITIONAL CONTRACTS 2 3 NEEDED TO SUPPORT THE NEXT GENERATION CLIPPER PROGRAM, APPENDIX B, WHICH ARE THE REGIONAL COST SHARING AGREEMENTS AND 4 5 SPLITTING OF THE COST AND REVENUE, AND APPENDIX C WHICH ARE THE CLIPPER PROGRAM GOALS AND PERFORMANCE MEASURES. APPENDIX 6 B1 OF THE DRAFT 2022MOU DESCRIBES THE AGREEMENTS ON THE 7 8 CURRENT CONTRACT WHICH IS LINE ITEM BASED THIS APPENDIX IS NOT UPDATED OR CHANGED AT ALL FROM THE CURRENT MOU. WHERE I THINK 9 YOU CAN TELL WHERE THE MOU DID NOT NEED UPDATING OR WHERE THE 10 MOU WAS CLEAR, WE'RE HAVE KIND OF AGREED ON IT WE DIDN'T 11 PROPOSE ANY CHANGES. WE LIKELY ARE JUST ADDING CHANGES TO THE 12 NEEDED THINGS THAT ARE COMING UP WITH THE RESULT OF THE 13 DEPLOYMENT OF THE ACCOUNT BASED SYSTEM. WE ALSO DID INCLUDE 14 SOME SLIDES ON THIS ITEM, WHICH, HOPEFULLY, WE CAN PUT UP 15 16 THERE. SO, IF YOU GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. APPENDIX B2 NOW DESCRIBES THE COST SHARING AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE TRANSIT 17 OPERATORS THAT WERE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD LAST MONTH IN 18 RELATIONSHIP TO THE -- OR REGARDING THE RTC PROGRAM. SO, IF 19 YOU WILL RECALL, ALL 23 AGENCIES WILL CONTRIBUTE AT LEAST 1% 20 TO THE RTC OPERATING COST WITH THE REMAINING 77% BEING SPLIT 21 BY AGENCY BASED ON THE RTC, THE UNIQUE RTC CARDS USED DURING 22 THE BILLING PERIOD, AND YOU WILL SEE THAT REFLECTED IN TEXT IN 23 THE CURRENT APPENDIX B2 TO THE DRAFT MOU. I DID, ALSO, WANT TO 24 POINT OUT A APPENDIX B3 IS STILL UNDER DEVELOPMENT AND WE HAVE 25

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RECENT UPDATES. WE MET WITH THE TRANSIT OPERATORS LAST FRIDAY 1 AND WE'LL HAVE UPDATES TO THAT LATER DURING THIS PRESENTATION. 2 3 IF YOU COULD GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, AS WE PRESENTED AND DISCUSSED WITH THE BOARD LAST MONTH, MTC AGREED TO 4 5 SHOULDER A HIGHER PERCENTAGE OF THE COST FOR C2 AS RELATED TO C1 WITH EARLY OPERATOR COMMITMENTS TO -- COMMITMENTS AND 6 RECOMMITMENTS TO THE MOU CLIPPER GOALS. APPENDIX C NOW HAS THE 7 8 ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE IN ITALICS THESE REFLECT THE FURTHER ENCOURAGEMENT FOR TRANSIT RIDERS TO PREFER OR PREFERENCES FOR 9 10 THE CLIPPER AS THE PRIMARY FARE PAYMENT SYSTEM IN THE BAY AREA AS WELL AS OTHER REGIONAL PRIORITIES THAT LANGUAGE IS MARKED 11 IN ITALICS IN THE APPENDIX C TO THE DRAFT MOU. I MENTIONED 12 BEFORE -- NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE -- SO FOR THE NEXT STEPS, WE'LL 13 NEED TO FINALIZE AND DOCUMENT ACCOUNT BASED COST AND REVENUE 14 15 ALLOCATION. THESE WILL OCCUR APPENDIX B3 WHICH I'LL TALK ABOUT 16 RIGHT NOW. AS FOR THE ACCOUNT BASED COST SHARING AGREEMENTS THAT WILL BE DOCUMENTED IN APPENDIX B3 THERE HAS BEEN AN 17 UPDATE FROM A TRANSIT LED OPERATOR MEETING LAST FRIDAY. SO THE 18 TRANSIT OPERATORS HAVE PROPOSED TO USE CLIPPER RIDERSHIP AS A 19 METRIC FOR APPORTIONING THE OPERATOR SHARE OF THE COSTS, WITH 20 21 A REQUEST THAT THE REGION'S CLIPPER AND TRANSIT OPERATOR STUFF 22 CONTINUE TO DEVELOP A ROADMAP TO TRANSITION THE REMAINING NON-CLIPPER TRANSIT RIDERS ON TO CLIPPER. AND THIS HAS LARGELY 23 BEEN A TRANSIT OPERATOR REQUEST. I'M SURE, CHAIR POWERS, YOU 24 25 HAVE BEEN KEPT UPDATED BECAUSE BART HAS BEEN A BIG PART OF

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THIS CONVERSATION, AS HAS SFMTA. IT'S ALSO WORTH NOTING, BY 1 THE WAY, THAT OVER THE NEXT YEAR, ESPECIALLY, AS JASON NOTED 2 3 IN HIS REPORT THAT THE EQUIPMENT IS REPLACED AND WE STARTED TO TRANSITION THE CUSTOMERS FROM THE CARD TO AN ACCOUNT BASED 4 5 SYSTEM THAT WE'LL BEGIN TO SEE FEATURES THAT WILL START SEEING 6 INSTANT OR REALTIME LOADS ADDITIONAL RETAILER LOCATIONS, TRANSFER PRODUCTS ROLLED OUT AND FARE ACCUMULATORS SO WITHOUT 7 8 EVEN ANY ADDITIONAL POLICY OR APPROACHES TO TRANSITIONING TO CLIPPER THAT THE NEW FEATURES WILL NATURALLY ATTRACT SOME OF 9 THE REGION'S TRANSIT RIDERS THAT HAVEN'T YET FULLY ADOPTED OR 10 TRANSITIONED TO CLIPPER TWO TO KIND OF MAKE THAT DECISION. 11 ALSO WE'RE PROPOSING TO RETURN TO THE BOARD ON A REGULAR BASIS 12 TO UPDATE THE BOARD ON THE REGION'S ACTIONS TO ENCOURAGE 13 FURTHER CLIPPER USAGE, AND, YOU KNOW, KIND OF WHICH STRATEGIES 14 15 AND APPROACHES THAT WE BELIEVE HAVE SEEN OR HAVE RESULTED IN 16 THE BIGGEST IMPACT TO CLIPPER USAGE WE ARE PLANNING TO BRING THE CLIPPER MOU BACK TO THE BOARD NEXT MONTH FOR APPROVAL. 17 THAT VERSION OF THE MOU WILL HAVE THE COST SHARING AGREEMENTS 18 IN APPENDIX B3 DOCUMENTED. YOU SHOULD ALSO, HOPEFULLY, SEE IN 19 YOUR INBOXES THAT, WE HAVE ALSO SENT AN E-MAIL, AND WE WILL 20 21 LIKELY SEND AN UPDATE TO THAT E-MAIL AGAIN WITH APPENDIX B3 FILLED OUT. AND THAT WILL JUST -- THAT WILL HOPEFULLY LEAD TO 22 AN APPROVAL FROM THIS BOARD AND THEN SUBSEQUENT APPROVAL FROM 23 THE MTC OPERATIONS COMMITTEE IN JULY. I ALSO WANT TO NOTE THAT 24 THE MTC OPERATIONS COMMITTEE IS DARK IN AUGUST THIS YEAR. SO, 25

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WE ARE REQUESTING GENERAL MANAGER, COUNCIL, AND STAFF FEEDBACK 1 AS SOON AS POSSIBLE SO THAT WE CAN GET THIS MOU WRAPPED UP AND 2 3 PREPARED FOR SIGNATURE, AND ULTIMATELY FULLY EXECUTED IN SEPTEMBER OF THIS YEAR. AND, SO, WE PLAN ON BEGINNING TO ROUTE 4 5 THE NEW MOU FOR SIGNATURE, AND THAT IS EACH AGENCY'S COUNSEL AND GENERAL MANAGER, AFTER THE JULY OPERATIONS COMMITTEE HAS 6 APPROVED -- THE JULY MTC OPERATIONS COMMITTEE HAS APPROVED THE 7 8 MOU. HAPPY TO TAKE ANY QUESTIONS. AND IF THERE ARE ANY OUESTIONS IN PARTICULAR, GENERAL OUESTIONS OR CLARIFICATIONS, 9 PLEASE FEEL FREE, YOU OR YOUR STAFF TO REACH OUT TO ME, JASON, 10 11 OR CAROL, AND IF THERE ARE ANY SPECIFIC LEGAL QUESTIONS TO PLEASE REACH OUT TO MATTHEW LAVRINETS. AND HOPEFULLY WE'LL BE 12 ABLE TO RESOLVE OR ADDRESS YOUR COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS OR 13 CONCERNS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. SO WITH THAT, HAPPY TO TAKE ANY 14 15 COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS. THANK YOU.

17 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. AND, JUST, SO WHILE IT'S FRESH, 18 FRED, HOLD OFF ON THE PUBLIC COMMENT. I THINK THE DATA SET 19 THAT EDWARD JUST WALKED EVERYBODY THREE IS REFLECTIVE OF THE 20 E-MAIL THAT WAS SENT OUT AT 10:00 TODAY. RIGHT? IS THAT 21 CORRECT EDWARD?

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ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: SO WE ALL COLLECTIVELY HAVE THE DATA 1 2 THAT EDWARD WAS WALKING THROUGH TO TAKE A LOOK AT. JEFF, 3 BEFORE I GET TO COMMITTEE MEMBERS. LET'S GO TO THE PUBLIC REAL OUICK. FRED, WHAT SAY YOU? 4 5 CLERK, FRED CASTRO: THERE ARE NO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH 6 THEIR HAND RAISED, AND THERE WAS NO PUBLIC COMMENT SUBMITTED 7 8 ON THIS ITEM. AND IN THE BOARDROOM, THERE ARE NO PUBLIC MEMBERS QUEUED UP FOR PUBLIC COMMENT. THANK YOU. 9 10 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. WHY DON'T WE GO JEFFREY TUMLIN, 11 HEAD OF SFMTA. THANK YOU, JEFF. 12 13 JEFFREY TUMLIN: THANK YOU FOR THE PRESENTATION, EDWARD. QUICK 14 15 QUESTION, WHERE DO WE STAND ON INCREASING THE RETAILER CUT IN 16 ORDER TO ALLOW US TO MAKE CLIPPER CARDS MORE READILY AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC? 17 18 EDWARD MENG: IN TERMS OF THE COMMISSION PAID TO THE RETAILER 19 THAT'S SOMETHING THAT CUBIC MANAGES. I CAN SAY THAT HOWEVER 20 21 WHILE WE PLAN TO INCREASE OUR RETAILER FOOTPRINT, WE HAVE INCENTIVE IN PLACE FOR ESSENTIALLY CUBIC TO SEEK OUT RETAILERS 22 IN THESE EQUITY OPPORTUNITY ZONES. I BELIEVE THEY USED TO BE 23 CALLED COMMUNITIES OF CONCERN, AND THE MTC LINGO, AS WELL AS 24 INCREASING THE REGION'S FOOTPRINT BY AROUND 100 RETAILERS. 25

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THIS IS IN ADDITION TO ONCE THERE ARE NEW DEVICES OUT THERE, 1 THEY WILL BE CONNECTED TO THE CLIPPER BACK END THROUGH TELE--2 3 THROUGHOUT CELLULAR NETWORK. AND, SO WHEN CUSTOMERS CAN LOAD THEIR PRODUCTS VIA THE WEB, THEY SHOULD BE ABLE TO RECEIVE 4 5 THOSE PRODUCTS INSTANTLY. BUT IN TERMS OF THE RETAILER NETWORK, RIGHT NOW, THE COMMISSIONS ARE THE SAME AS UNDER C1, 6 BUT THEY COULD BE DIFFERENT UNDER C2, WE JUST HAVEN'T GOTTEN 7 8 TO THAT YET, I BELIEVE.

ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. OTHER QUESTIONS FROM COMMITTEE 10 MEMBERS? OKAY. EDWARD, I'M NOT SEEING A WHOLE BUNCH OF 11 ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS ON THIS ITEM HERE. 12 OKAY. I WOULD JUST ENCOURAGE ALL OF US TO READ THE DATA SET, 13 AND TO GET OUR STAFF WAS TO START GOING THROUGH -- THERE IS A 14 15 LOT OF MATERIAL THERE. SO, THANK YOU FOR THAT, EDWARD. THANKS FOR THAT REPORT. AND WE'RE GOING STAY WITH EDWARD, AND HE'S 16 17 GOING TO PROVIDE AN UPDATE ON OUR TWO-YEAR BUDGET AND WORK PLAN AS IT RELATES TO CLIPPER. SO, EDWARD? 18

20 EDWARD MENG: THANKS AGAIN, CHAIR POWERS.

22 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OF COURSE.

24 EDWARD MENG: I WOULD LIKE TO REMIND YOU ALL THAT THIS IS AN 25 INFORMATION ITEM THIS MONTH. WE PLAN TO RETURN TO THE BOARD

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NEXT MONTH WITH A REOUEST FOR APPROVAL. BUT THIS ITEM IS THE 1 2 DRAFT TWO-YEAR CLIPPER BUDGET FOR YOUR REVIEW AND COMMENT. FOR 3 CLARIFICATION, THE TWO YEARS THAT WE'RE ASKING TO YOU KIND OF TAKE A REVIEW ON AND TO -- THAT WE WILL ULTIMATELY REOUEST FOR 4 5 APPROVAL ARE FISCAL YEARS 2022/'23. SO FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY THIS YEAR OVER THROUGH JUNE 30TH, 2023, AND 2023/'24. SO 6 7 THE SIMILAR PERIOD FROM 2023 TO 2024. 8 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: EDWARD, WE'LL APPROVE FY23 AND 24. NOT 9 FY -- WE'RE ALMOST IN THE MIDDLE OF CLOSING OUT '22 RIGHT NOW. 10 SO JUST FY23 AND FY '24. CORRECT? MENG CORRECT. THE PERIOD 11 BEGINNING JUNE 1ST OF THIS YEAR, TO JUNE 30TH NEXT YEAR. 12 13 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THAT'S FY '23. 14 15 16 EDWARD MENG: AND THE REMAINING YEAR AFTER THAT. 17 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: YOU'RE JUST CONFUSION THE TWO. IT'S FY 18 19 2023 AND '24. 20 EDWARD MENG: IN THE OVERALL PICTURE WHEN YOU LOOK AT THE 21 OPERATING COSTS, THAT'S WHAT I'M GOING TO TALK ABOUT FIRST 22 OPERATING COSTS ARE EXPECTED TO INCREASE OVER THE NEXT TWO 23 YEARS FOR BOTH MTC AND THE TRANSIT OPERATORS THIS IS LARGELY 24 THE RESULT OF NEEDING TO PAY TO KEEP TWO PARALLEL SYSTEMS 25

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OPERATIONAL. SO THAT'S THE CURRENT CARD BASED SYSTEM. AND THE 1 UPCOMING ACCOUNT BASED SYSTEM IN WHICH WE'LL EXPECT TO BEGIN 2 3 PAYING ACCOUNT-BASED COST FOR, ONCE WE REACH THAT REVENUE READY MILESTONE. AND WE EXPECT THAT WE CAN COMPLETELY TURN OFF 4 5 THE C1 SYSTEM BY NOVEMBER 2024. THAT'S WHEN WE PLAN TO BE FULLY TRANSITIONED TO THE ACCOUNT-BASED SYSTEM WITH NO KIND OF 6 LINGERING IMPACTS FROM SHUTTING OFF THE CARD-BASED SYSTEM. 7 8 AFTER WE ARE ABLE TO TURN OFF THE C1 SYSTEM, YOU WILL NOTICE THAT OPERATING COSTS IN THE KIND OF FURTHER YEARS OUT ARE 9 10 RELATIVELY STABLE. ESPECIALLY AS COMPARED WITH CURRENT C1 OPERATING COSTS. AND I'LL REMIND YOU THAT HAD THE C2 11 OPERATIONS COST, AS A RESULT OF THE REQUEST FROM THIS BOARD, 12 THEY WILL BE FIXED MONTHLY TERM COSTS, SO THAT WE HAVE LARGELY 13 TAKEN THE GUESS WORK OUT OF THINGS, OUT OF MOST OF THE 14 VARIABLE COSTS THAT ARE A RESULT OF THE CURRENT C1 CARD-BASED 15 16 CONTRACT. SO, AS IN PRIOR YEARS, WE'RE EXPECTING AN OPERATING DEFICIT BEYOND THE TWO FISCAL YEARS THAT WERE BEING ASKED TO 17 APPROVE -- OR WE'RE ASKING THIS BOARD TO APPROVE. SO MTC'S 18 OPERATING BUDGETS ARE APPROVED ANNUALLY. SO WE DIDN'T WANT TO 19 MAKE ANY ASSUMPTIONS ABOUT FUNDING BEYOND THE TWO YEARS BEING 20 21 APPROVED BY THIS BOARD BEYOND EXPECTATIONS AND WITH BEING ABLE 22 TO PAY OUR INVOICES WE ARE WORKING CLOSELY WITH MTC FUNDING PROGRAMMING AND POLICY GROUP TO IDENTIFY THESE FUNDS AND WE 23 HAVE IDENTIFIED WELL OVER TWO YEARS IN ADVANCE THAT WE'LL 24 EXPECT THAT WE NEED TO FIND A SOLUTION TO THIS SO WE HAVE A 25

HEAD START ON THIS. IN TERMS OF THE NEXT ATTACHMENT, WHICH IS 1 THE CLIPPER CAPITAL BUDGET, IT STILL REMAINS STABLE. AS WE 2 3 HAVE IDENTIFIED FUNDING FOR CAPITAL WORK FOR THE SYSTEM COMPLETION MILESTONE IN 2024. IN THIS CAPITAL BUDGET WE HAVE 4 5 ASSUMED ADDITIONAL CAPITAL WORK AND EQUIPMENT PROCUREMENT OF SYSTEM COMPLETION AROUND 6 TO 7 MILLION ANNUALLY I BELIEVE WE 6 HIGHLIGHT THAT IN RED IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET THAT WORK HAS YET 7 8 TO BE IDENTIFIED AND FUNDED BUT WE EXPECT THERE WILL STILL BE ADDITIONAL DESIGN WORK ADDITIONAL TESTING PERHAPS MORE 9 EQUIPMENT AS COMPLETES EXPAND. WE DON'T KNOW YET WHAT THE 10 SCOPE OF THE WORK WILL BE BUT WE ARE PREDICTING IT SO WE CAN 11 MAKE SURE THAT IF THERE IS ANY FURTHER REOUESTS FROM THE 12 REGION ON ANY TYPE OF ADDITIONAL CAPITAL WORK FOR THE CLIPPER 13 PROGRAM THAT WE'LL HAVE IT FUNDED. THE MEMO ALSO MENTIONS RM3, 14 15 RM3, OF COURSE, IS STILL NOT AVAILABLE SO WE ARE CURRENTLY 16 FINDING ALTERNATE FUNDINGS SOURCES, AND WILL BE REFRESHED ONCE RM3 BECOMES AVAILABLE IT'S NOT LIKE WE'RE DOUBLE DIPPING ON 17 ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES. IT'S MORE OF A TIMING ISSUE WHEN 18 THESE ADDITIONAL RESOURCES WILL COME IN AND WHEN WE'LL BE ABLE 19 TO ACCESS THE FUNDS. SO I'M HAPPY TO TAKE ANY ADDITIONAL 20 21 COMMENTS OR OUESTIONS. WE PLAN TO HAVE YOUR CONCERNS OR 22 COMMENTS ADDRESSED BEFORE WE RETURN NEXT MONTH WITH THE REQUEST FOR APPROVAL FOR THE CLIPPER TWO-YEAR OPERATING 23 CAPITAL BUDGETS. THAT CONCLUDES MY REMARKS. 24

8 JASON WEINSTEIN: ONE THING I WANT TO ADD AS WE START ROLLING OUT THE RETAIL DEVICES I THINK ONE OF THE BARRIERS TO 9 RETAILERS TODAY IS THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE TO HAVE A FAIRLY 10 LARGE FOOTPRINT AND A DEDICATED PHONE LINE AND SOME OTHER 11 THINGS THAT ARE NOT VERY CONVENIENT FOR ANYBODY THAT IS DOING 12 POINT OF SALES PARTICULARLY WHEN THEY MIGHT NOT BE DOING MUCH 13 VOLUME AND OUR GOAL ISN'T ABOUT VOLUME IT'S ABOUT AVAILABILITY 14 15 OF ACCESS AS YOU MENTIONED BOARD MEMBER TUMLIN. THE NEW DEVICES WILL BE CELLULAR, SO THEY'RE SMALL, YOU KNOW, YOU 16 PROBABLY -- WE HAVE SHOWN YOU PICTURE IN THE PAST, OF THIS 17 LITTLE DEVICE. IT'S, YOU KNOW, ABOUT THAT BIG. AND IT DOESN'T 18 REQUIRE A DEDICATED PHONE LINE. SO, THINGS LIKE THAT MIGHT 19 ENCOURAGE RETAILERS THAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN APPREHENSIVE BEFORE, 20 21 EVEN THOUGH THEY MIGHT NOT DO A LOT OF VOLUME TO STILL WANT TO DO IT BECAUSE IT'S THE RIGHT THING TO DO. AND OF COURSE, YES, 22 WE CAN CERTAINLY LOOK AT COMMISSIONS TO RETAILERS THEMSELVES. 23 ED MENTIONED THE THINGS THAT WE HAVE AS PROVISIONS AS PART OF 24 OUR CONTRACT WITH CUBIC WITH THEM TO SEEK OUT RETAILERS IN 25

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PARTICULARLY EOUITY AREAS, AS ED MENTIONED BUT YES THERE IS AN

2 EQUITY COMPONENT AS IT RELATES TO VENDORS OR MERCHANTS
3 THEMSELVES, THE STORIES TO TRY TO GET THEM TO PARTICIPATE.

5 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: JASON KEEP THIS IN MIND AS WE'RE COMING
6 BACK IN THE TWO YEAR BUDGET IT'S CERTAINLY SOMETHING THAT JEFF
7 WILL BRING UP BUT I'LL BRING UP AS WELL TO SEE IF WE CAN
8 CONNECT THE DOTS THERE IF YOU WILL.

EDWARD MENG: I WOULD -- I APOLOGIZE, I THINK I MISUNDERSTOOD 10 THE QUESTION. REGARDING THE RETAILER COMMISSIONS WE DID ADD 11 INN ESTIMATE FOR THE RETAILER COMMISSIONS THAT IS EXTREMELY ON 12 THE CONSERVATIVE SIDE. SO, IT IS, WHILE WE --SO, INCLUDED IN O&M IS BOTH THE ASSUMPTION THAT THE RETAILER 16 NETWORK IS GOING TO GROW THAT, WE WILL BE PAYING INCENTIVE 17 PAYMENTS TO CUBIC SO THAT THEY CAN CONTINUE TO GROW RETAIL 18 NETWORKS IN THE AREAS OF CONCERN THAT WE HAVE IDENTIFIED AND 19 THAT LARGER SALES OF THE ITEM AND THE REFLECTIVE COMMISSIONS 20 21 ARE REFLECTED IN THAT BUDGET. IF THERE NEEDS TO BE A MORE AGGRESSIVE APPROACH, WE'RE HAPPY TO MAKE DIFFERENT 22 ASSUMPTIONS, BUT FOR RIGHT NOW, IT'S -- THE AMOUNT THAT WE ARE 23 ESTIMATING FOR THE RETAIL COMMISSION IS ON THE HIGH END SO 24 25 THAT WE DON'T UNDER BUDGET.

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ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. LET US GO TO THE HEAD OF VTA, 2 3 CAROLYN GONOT, AND THEN HEAD OVER TO MTC, THERESE MCMILLAN. CAROLYN. 4 5 CAROLYN M. GONOT: THANK YOU. ON THE BUDGET, I'M JUST CURIOUS, 6 YOU KNOW, I KNOW WE'RE SPENDING A LOT OF TIME DEVELOPING THIS, 7 8 YOU KNOW, THIS NEXT ROUND FOR CLIPPER, BUT I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE TRYING TO BE AS RESILIENT AS POSSIBLE IN THE FACE 9 10 OF, YOU KNOW, EVER-CHANGING TECHNOLOGY. SO IS THAT SOMEHOW THOUGHT ABOUT OR REFLECTED IN THE BUDGET IN TERMS OF BEING 11 ABLE TO ADAPT AS TIME GOES ON? 12 13 EDWARD MENG: YEAH. THAT'S -- OH, I'M SORRY. WERE YOU FINISHED? 14 15 16 CAROLYN M. GONOT: YEAH. I'M DONE. 17 EDWARD MENG: YEAH THAT REFLECTED IN THE KIND OF ADDITIONAL 18 CAPITAL AROUND THE TUNE OF 6 TO \$7 MILLION AFTER THE SYSTEM OF 19 COMPLETION, YOU KNOW, TO KIND OF, EITHER, ADVANCE THE SYSTEM, 20 TO PERHAPS MAKE IT FUTURE PROOF TO THE AVERAGE CHANGING TRENDS 21 OF TECHNOLOGY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS. RIGHT NOW, WE BELIEVE 22 THAT WE ARE DESIGNING AND IMPLEMENTING AND ROLLING OUT THE 23 STATE-OF-THE-ART SYSTEM, BUT WHO KNOWS, IN 2024, 2025, WHERE 24 WE WILL BE ON THAT FRONT. AND, SO, WE HAVE -- OUR THINKING 25



AHEAD, AND ALREADY THINKING THAT WE MIGHT NEED, ROUGHLY 6 TO 7 1 MILLION, ROUGHLY, TO JUST STAY WITH THE EXPECTATIONS OF THE 2 3 TRANSIT RIDING POPULATION IN THE BAY AREA. 4 5 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: OKAY. 6 7 CAROLYN M. GONOT: THANK YOU. 8 9 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: THANK YOU EDWARD. THERESE, HEAD OF MTC. 10 THERESE MCMILLAN: TO THE SPECIFIC QUESTION ON THE RETAIL, IT 11 SEEMS TO ME AND I AM SURE YOU GUYS CAN PULL THIS TOGETHER, 12 THERE WOULD BE A COMPARISON OF ROUGHLY, YOU KNOW, COMMISSION 13 PER RETAILER, SORT OF, TODAY, VERSUS WHAT'S BUILT IN, YOU 14 15 KNOW, COMMISSION AMOUNT PER RETAILER AT THE TOP ENDS AND WHAT 16 THAT LOOKS LIKE. BECAUSE IT SOUND LIKE WE'RE ASSUMING -- TELL ME IF I GOT THIS RIGHT -- ASSUME WEEK HAVE A CAPACITY CUSHION 17 TO GO FOR A HUNDRED MORE RETAILERS, 300 TO 400? 18 19 EDWARD MENG: YES THAT'S ALREADY INCLUDED IN THE COST. 20 21 22 THERESE MCMILLAN: AND THAT WE HAVE ALSO ALLOWED EVEN WITH THE GROWTH TO PAY THE INDIVIDUAL RETAILER MORE IN COMMISSION, 23 CORRECT? 24 25

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EDWARD MENG: I -- WELL, WE HAVE N OUR CONTRACT THAT WE WOULD

2 PAY CUBIC MORE TO FIND RETAILER IN SPECIFIC AREAS AND THOSE
3 AREAS THAT ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE EQUITY ZONES, I BELIEVE.
4
5 THERESE MCMILLAN: OKAY. I -- MAYBE I WAS CONFUSED ON YOUR
6 REFERENCE TO, THAT YOU HAD A CONSERVATIVE ESTIMATE ON THE

7 COMMISSIONS.

EDWARD MENG: GENERAL WHEN WE PLAN OUR BUDGET WE ROUND UP, AT 9 LEAST FOR US IT'S -- I THINK WE HAVE SEEN IN THE PAST IT'S 10 EASIER TO EXPECT MORE COST THAN TO EXPECT LESS COST SO OUR 11 ASSUMPTION IN THIS BUDGET IS THAT THE RETAIL COMMISSIONS WILL 12 KIND OF BE AT THE MOST CONSERVATIVE WHICH MEANS WE BELIEVE WE 13 ARE OVERESTIMATING WHAT THE ACTUAL FEES WILL BE. SO WE 14 15 PLANNING FOR A BUDGET HIGHER THAN WHAT WE THINK THE ACTUALS 16 WILL BE SO THAT WE'RE BASICALLY COVERING OURSELVES SO WE DON'T NEED TO RETURN BACK TO THE BOARD AND SAY WE NEED APPROVAL OF A 17 HIGH RETAIL COMMISSION RATE FOR EXAMPLE. 18

20 THERESE MCMILLAN: AND THE OTHER THING I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT FOR 21 THE GROUP IS ONE OF THE WAYS OF INCREASING OUR REGION IS 22 THROUGH THE MOBILE APP AND I THINK THAT'S IMPORTANT TO KEEP 23 THAT MIND BECAUSE THAT DOESN'T REQUIRE SOMEONE HAVING TO GO TO 24 A SPECIFIC LOCATION MADE WITH ALL OF THE OBSERVATION THAT IS 25 NOT EVERYONE HAS A SMART -- ALSO THE NEED TO CONTINUE TO PUSH

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OUT THE INFORMATION ABOUT THE MOBILE CARD AND HOW IT CAN BE 1 USED ET CETERA IT'S A COMBINATION OF HOW WE'RE SPEAKING TO GET 2 CLIPPER IN HANDS IS BOTH NOT ONLY THE PHYSICAL CARD WHICH WILL 3 CONTINUE TO BE IMPORTANT AS BOB YOU POINTED OUT AND ALL OF THE 4 5 SUPPLY ISSUES WE'RE HEARING ATTACHED, AND THE SUCCESS OF SEEING IN TERMS OF GROWTH JUST PART OF THE OVERALL PICTURE OF 6 HOW WE GET OUT AND PUSH CLIPPER INTO THE POPULATION JUST WANT 7 8 TO MAKE THAT OBSERVATION. 9 ROBERT POWERS, CHAIR: AGREE. SHARED. AND OUR FIRST SPEAKER IS 20 21 ALETA DUPREE. GO AHEAD, PLEASE. 22 SPEAKER: THANK YOU, AGAIN, CHAIR BOB POWERS. ALETA DUPREE FOR 23 THE RECORD SHE AND HER. I WAS IN THE BAY AREA A WEEK AND A 24 HALF AGO AND I MIGHT COME BACK IN A FEW DAYS AND ONCE AGAIN 25

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USE CLIPPER. AND MY INTRODUCTION TO CLIPPER, LATELY, HAS BEEN 1 AT THE OAKLAND AIRPORT. I HAVE BEEN USING AC TRANSIT OR THE 2 3 BART CONNECTOR. SO, HOW DO WE CONTINUE BEMOANING AND DEVELOPING THE SYSTEM THAT IS CLIPPER, WHICH I HAVE USED FOR A 4 5 DOZEN YEARS, AND FOR WHICH I HAVE BEEN SPEAKING ON FOR JUST 6 ABOUT FIVE YEARS. AND I BELIEVE IN THE CLIPPER IDEA, ALL-IN. NOW, I DON'T RECOMMEND PEOPLE GO AND TAKE THEIR ENTIRE LIFE 7 8 SAVINGS AND BET IT ON A SPORTS BETTING APP ON A FAVORITE FOOTBALL TEAM. I DON'T BET ON SPORTS ANYWAY, I JUST WEAR A 9 10 RAIDERS T-SHIRT. CLIPPER ISN'T ABOUT GAMBLING THEREFORE I SEE THE POSITIVE POSSIBILITIES OF GOING ALL IN. SO I WONDER AS I 11 LOOK AT THE AGENCY BUDGETS, THE OPERATING OF MULTIPLE SYSTEMS 12 OF WHICH NOT MANY OF THEM FALL SHORT, AS YOU WILL PROBABLY SEE 13 IN MY LETTER, THAT SOME OF US AGENCIES ARE STILL HANGING ON TO 14 15 METHODS THAT HAVE NOT CHANGED SINCE THE LATE 1800S. I LOVE 16 HISTORIC PRESERVATION. AND IN NEW YORK CITY, THERE IS A 17 LEGENDARY MUSEUM, NEW YORK TRANSIT MUSEUM WHICH HAS SUBWAY TRAINS, I THINK WE HAVE TO THINK FORWARD. THANK YOU. 18

25 ONE, BUILDING ON AND BEING THANKFUL FOR GENERAL MANAGER TUMLIN

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IN TERMS OF WANTING TO HAVE MORE RETAIL OUTLET BEING ABLE TO 1 PROVIDE CLIPPER CARDS. AND, ALSO, THIS IS SOMETHING THAT I 2 3 HAVE HEARD FROM COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS ABOUT, IN ADDITION TO HAVING A RETAIL OUTLETS TO GET THE CARD BUT ALSO 4 5 BEING ABLE TO ADD CASH TO THE CLIPPER CARD, FOR PEOPLE THAT CONTINUE TO DEPEND ON CASH, AND, ALSO, HAVING MORE LOCATIONS, 6 AND IT IS POSSIBLE TO ADD CASH TO A CLIPPER CARD. THESE ARE 7 8 THINGS THAT WILL HELP PEOPLE WHO DEPEND ON CASH BE ABLE TO USE THE CLIPPER SYSTEM. AND, LASTLY, BUILDING ON A COMMENT THEY 9 10 MADE EARLIER ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN OPEN PAYMENT AND NEXT GENERATION CLIPPER.
