AND OUR ABAG MTC AND BAHFA LEADERSHIP WILL HAVE ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITY TO DISCUSS AND CONSIDER POTENTIAL 6 REVENUE MEASURES TOMORROW AT THE ABAG GENERAL ASSEMBLY. WE'LL 7 8 BE TALKING ABOUT THIS. ALSO AT THE MTC COMMISSION MEETING ON JUNE 22ND AND AT THE BAHFA BOARD MEETING ON THE 22nd. NEXT 9 SLIDE PLEASE. AND PLEASE NOTE THAT FOR OUR 2024 HOUSING 10 MEASURE THERE IS ALREADY SUBSTANTIAL GROUND WORK IN PLACE AND 11 THIS INCLUDES CONSENSUS AND COALITION BUILDING THAT'S BEEN 12 GOING ON FOR SEVERAL YEARS. WE HAVE ENABLING LEGISLATION 13 ALREADY IN PLACE. POLLING HAS SHOWN THAT HOUSING AND 14 15 HOMELESSNESS ARE CONSISTENTLY A TOP CONCERN FOR BAY AREA 16 RESIDENTS. AND THE WORK OF THE BAY AREA HOUSING FOR ALL COALITION HAS BEEN REALLY CRITICAL AND IMPORTANT. THEY HAVE 17 BEGUN A FUND-RAISING EFFORT ALREADY FOR A REGIONAL MEASURE. 18 AND, IN ADDITION, THEY'RE PURSUING A STATEWIDE BALLOT CAMPAIGN 19 THAT WOULD LOWER THE VOTER THRESHOLD FOR OUR GENERAL 20 21 OBLIGATION AFFORDABLE HOUSING MEASURES FROM 2/3, TO A SIMPLE MAJORITY. AND ADDITIONALLY CURRENTLY GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND 22 EXPENDITURES ARE RESTRICTED TO WHAT WE CALL BRICK AND MORTAR 23 VERY RESTRICTED ELIGIBLE USE OF FUNDS AND THEIR STATEWIDE 24 25 MEASURE WOULD OPEN THAT UP A LITTLE BIT SO THAT AT PARTICULAR

AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS YOU COULD ALSO USE GENERAL 1 OBLIGATION BOND MONEY TO CAPITALIZE ON OPERATING RESERVE WHICH 2 IS VERY IMPORTANT FOR HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AND ALSO PROVIDE 3 TENANT SUPPORTIVE SERVICES. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO, WITH YOUR 4 5 SUPPORT, NEXT STEPS WILL INCLUDE CONTINUED OUTREACH TO JURISDICTIONS THAT WE'RE DOING NOW, TOWN HALL INFORMATIONAL 6 MEETINGS, ADOPTION OF OUR BAHFA BUSINESS PLAN, AND THE EQUITY 7 8 FRAMEWORK THAT IS INFORMING THAT BUSINESS PLAN, CREATION OF THE DRAFT DOCUMENT THAT IS REQUIRED FOR A BALLOT MEASURE, AND 9 THEN IN EARLY 2024 WE'LL CONDUCT ADDITIONAL POLLING AND 10 ASSUMING THAT WE HAVE FULL AGREEMENT, WE WILL TAKE ALL THE 11 NECESSARY STEPS TO ENSURE SUCCESS AT THE BALLOT AND THIS WOULD 12 INCLUDE ACTIONS BY BOTH THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD AND THE BAHFA 13 BOARD. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THIS SLIDE SHOWS THE CURRENT 14 15 ESTIMATES OF THE FUND THAT WOULD BE RAISED WITH A \$10 BILLION 16 GENERAL OBLIGATION HOUSING MEASURE. AND AS YOU KNOW, I BELIEVE, ANY FUNDS THAT ARE RAISED IN THIS WAY MEAN THAT 80% 17 OF THOSE FUNDS WOULD RETURN TO THE COUNTY OF ORIGIN. SO, EVERY 18 COUNTY IN THE REGION WOULD RECEIVE AN UNPRECEDENTED VALUE OF 19 FUNDS TO ADDRESS THEIR AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDS, BUT THE REAL 20 KEY TO THIS IS THAT IT'S EVERY COUNTY, IT'S NOT JUST ONE OR 21 TWO THAT WE HAVE SEEN IN THE LAST TWO YEARS WITH THEIR OWN 22 SINGLE BOND MEASURES. THIS IS THE FIRST OPPORTUNITY WE HAVE TO 23 WORK TOGETHER AS A REGION COLLECTIVELY TO ADDRESS OUR 24 AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDS. THEREFORE WE RECOMMEND YOU APPROVE 25

THE ABAG HOUSING COLLABORATION WITH BAHFA OVERSIGHT AND DIRECT
 STAFF AND COMMITTEE TO BEGIN IMPORTANT WORK NECESSARY TO
 ADVANCING AFFORDABLE AND BETTER HOUSING FOR THE BAY AREA. THAT
 CONCLUDES MY REPORT

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BELIA RAMOS: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THIS IS QUITE A MOMENT FOR 6 US TO RECOGNIZE THE WORK THAT BEGAN WITH A.B. 1487 TO ALLOW US 7 8 THIS OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE PROACTIVE MEASURES IN ADDRESSING HOUSING, SECURITY, AND HOMELESSNESS THAT IS CERTAINLY PLAYING 9 THE BAY AREA JURISDICTIONS. THIS IS A PATH FORWARD AND I WANT 10 TO THANK STAFF FOR WORKING DILIGENTLY BRINGING A PLAN FORWARD 11 OF MAKING A RECOMMENDATION FOR THE HOUSING COMMITTEE TO 12 COORDINATE WITH BAHFA ON THIS. AT THIS TIME, I DO SEE WE HAVE 13 DIRECTOR COMMENTS. AND I WILL START WITH DIRECTOR EKLUND. 14

WE'RE NEVER GOING TO MEET THE 22 REQUIREMENT WITHOUT HAVING THE BUY DOWN OF AFFORDABILITY. CAN 23 WE STRUCTURE TO SOME MONEY BEING DIRECTED TO THE CITIES AND 24 COUNTIES TO BE ABLE TO USE THAT MONEY IN THAT WAY? 25

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KATE HARTLEY: THE USES OF THE FUNDS ARE DIRECTED BY A.B. 1487. 2 3 AND AS I MENTIONED, 80% GOES BACK TO THE COUNTY AND THEN BAHFA WILL RETAIN 20%. WHAT A.B. 1487 REOUIRES IS THAT 52% OF FUNDS 4 5 RAISED BE USED FOR THE PRODUCTION OF RENTAL HOUSING, AND 15% BE USED FOR PRESERVATION AND 5% BE USED FOR TENANT 6 PROTECTIONS. AND THEN WITHIN THE 28% THAT IS UNALLOCATED, 7 8 THERE IS SOME FLEXIBILITY FOR THE COUNTIES. AT BAHFA'S LEVEL, WE HAVE A -- IN ADDITION TO THE 52/15/5 BREAK DOWN, THERE IS 9 10% OF THE MONEY WHERE WE HAVE MORE FLEXIBILITY TO PURSUE 10 AFFORDABLE HOME OWNERSHIP, FOR EXAMPLE, WITH, IN CONJUNCTION 11 WITH THE JURISDICTIONS. AND THERE IS OTHER USES OF FUNDS FOR 12 THOSE DISCRETIONARY PURPOSES. SO, WE WOULD WORK TOGETHER WITH 13 ALL THE COUNTIES AND ALL THE JURISDICTIONS TO ENSURE THAT YOU 14 15 CAN PROVIDE THE HOUSING THAT MAKES SENSE FOR YOUR JURISDICTION 16 AND FOLLOWING A.B. 1487.

AND THE PLANNING DIRECTOR STATED IN A CITY COUNCIL 20 MEETING IN NOVATO THAT SHE BELIEVES THAT IS THE ONLY WAY 21 CITIES IN MARIN ARE GOING TO BE ABLE TO MAKE ANY HEADWAY IN 22 ACHIEVING THE VERY LOW AND LOW. SO, I JUST -- SAYING IT REALLY 23 POINT BLANK. BECAUSE WHEN YOU TALK ABOUT PRESERVATION AND 24 25 EVERYTHING, YOU KNOW, WE'RE PRESERVING 600 AFFORDABLE HOUSING

UNITS IN HAMILTON THAT WE BUILT -- OR THE DEVELOPER BUILT --1 BUT UNDER OUR DIRECTION, IN LATE 1990S -- EARLY, EARLY 2000. 2 3 '90 -- I THINK '98, WHATEVER. AND IT WAS HUGE BECAUSE WE HAD REDEVELOPMENT. SO -- BUT THAT'S NOT THE ONLY AFFORDABLE 4 5 HOUSING WE HAVE SPREAD OUT THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY. BUT IF WE 6 NEED -- WE NEED A CASH --7 8 KATE HARTLEY: [INDISCERNIBLE] -- I'M SORRY -- IT SOUND LIKE THIS MONEY CAN BE USED TO ACHIEVE WHAT YOU HAVE DESCRIBED, 9 10 AND, SO, WE WILL WANT -- WE WILL BE WORKING CLOSELY WITH ALL 11 THE JURISDICTIONS TO MAKE SURE THAT YOUR GOALS -- THE JURISDICTION'S GOALS ARE MET. AND WE ARE WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK 12 OF 1487, BUT IT DOES SOUND, FROM WHAT YOU'RE TELLING ME, THAT 13 YOU COULD USE THAT PRODUCTION MONEY TO SUBSIDIZE VERY LOW AND 14 LOW-INCOME HOUSING IN OTHER DEVELOPMENTS. THAT SOUNDS LOOK A 15 16 PERFECT USE OF FUNDS. 17 **PAT ECKLUND:** AND ADDING -- NOT ONLY DOING THE 20%, BUT DOING 18 MORE. 19 20 KATE HARTLEY: IN THE 52%, YES, IF IT'S RENTAL HOUSING AND 21 YOU'RE TRYING TO REACH VERY LOW AND LOW --22 23 PAT ECKLUND: OR OWNERSHIP. 24 25

BUT THIS IS -- I CAN TELL YOU FROM 18 A STANDPOINT OF BEING IN A CITY GOVERNMENT THAT HAS TO 19 NEGOTIATE WITH DEVELOPERS, THIS IS A HUGE PROBLEM RIGHT NOW, 20 21 AND IT HAS RESULTED IN DELAYS OF MANY YEARS AND TOTAL CANCELLATION OF SOME HOUSING, OR, YOU KNOW, HOUSING PROJECTS 22 CANCELLED, AND WHO KNOWS WHEN SOMETHING WILL BE BROUGHT BACK. 23 AND, SO, THAT'S WHERE -- THAT KIND OF FLEXIBILITY TO SAY, CAN 24 25 WE USE THIS, SOME OF THIS MONEY AS AN INCENTIVE TO GET THE

ELEMENTS THAT WE WANT TO SEE AND A DEVELOPERS PROPOSAL TO GET 1 THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TO GET THE APPROPRIATE LABOR STANDARDS, 2 3 CAN WE USE THAT IF A DEVELOPER AGREES TO BUILD A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING. SO, I WOULD JUST -- I ABSOLUTELY 4 5 SUPPORT THE STAFF RECOMMENDATION, BUT, YOU KNOW, I JUST WANTED TO MAKE THOSE COMMENTS AS WE MOVE FORWARD. THAT, I JUST WOULD 6 REALLY LIKE TO SEE THE STATE AND THE LEGISLATURE LOOK --7 8 REALLY EXAMINE WHERE THE PROBLEM IS, AND WHY THE HOLD UP IS. I KNOW THERE ARE CITY WHO IS DON'T NEED THAT -- AND THOSE WHO 9 10 DON'T WANT TO DO IT AT ALL BUT I THINK THERE ARE A LOT OF CITIES LIKE HAYWARD AND CITIES REPRESENTED BY MANY OF US THAT 11 ACTUALLY WANT TO DO THE RIGHT THING BUT ARE FINDING IT HARDER 12 AND HARDER BECAUSE OF DEVELOPERS BALKING AT THE COST. I 13 SUPPORT THE RECOMMENDATION AND HOPE WE CAN HAVE MORE 14 15 DISCUSSION ABOUT THIS.

IS OFF THE TABLE, PEOPLE BUYING FOR EXTREMELY LOW-INCOME, IT'S 1 2 JUST NOT GOING TO HAPPEN IN A CITY WHERE EXTREMELY LOW-INCOME, 3 WHICH WILL BE THE NEXT CELL PROBABLY AFTER THE NEXT MEASURE GOES THROUGH, I CAN'T PRODUCE 375 UNITS FOR PEOPLE THAT MAKE 4 5 \$30,000 A YEAR WHEN MY MEDIAN INCOME IS 167 IT'S JUST NOT GOING TO HAPPEN BUT ON THE RENTAL END OF IT I ACTUALLY HAVE A 6 SHOT, I HAVE A DEVELOPER THAT WAS GOING DO IT WE'RE GOING TO 7 8 BEND OVER BACKWARDS AND LEND TEN AND A HALF MILLION DOLLARS AT 2.79% FOR 50 YEARS NOW I'M OUT OF BUSINESS ONCE WE DO THAT, 9 AND THEN WE HAVE A SECONDARY MARKET MAYBE THEY PAY 9 MILLION 10 FOR THE TEN AND A HALF MILLION DOLLARS LOAN AND COLLECT ON IT 11 FOR 55 YEARS UNTIL SOMEBODY SELLS IT AND TURN AROUND AND DO A 12 \$9 MILLION. I GOT SOMEBODY ELSE 200 UNITS AND WE CAN'T GET 13 ANYBODY ON THE LINE. THE FINANCING OR FUNDING ARMS ARE THE 14 15 ONES CONTROLLING. WHERE PEOPLE HAVE ALREADY GIVEN ENTITLEMENT 16 AND COMMITTED TO FUNDING DON'T HAVE SOMETHING AFTER ITS BUILT OR READIED OUT WHERE YOU BUY THAT LOAN AND HAVE THEM DO IT 17 AGAIN THAT'S AS FAR AS IT CAN GO AND YOU HEARD FROM PAT, 18 SOMEBODY BETTER BE LOOKING AT A SECONDARY MARKET ON THIS OR 19 WE'RE GOING TO BE THROWING A LOT OF MONEY AT PEOPLE THAT LIKE 20 21 MONEY.

I WON'T BELABOR THE POINT MANY OF YOU HAVE ALREADY RAISED THE NEED IS GREATER THAN WHEN WE WERE FIRST EYING A 17 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION MEASURE IN 2020 BEFORE THE WORLD 18 CHANGED AND WITH THE RHNA NUMBERS THE LOCAL JURISDICTIONS ARE 19 FACING WE'RE REALLY MOTIVATED TO WORK TOGETHER WITH ALL OF TO 20 YOU MAKE THIS MEASURE A REALITY IN 2024. DIRECTOR STAFF TO 21 PURSUE THIS WORK IN EARNEST WILL HELP PUT THE WIND IN OUR 22 SAILS ON THE CAMPAIGN COALITION SIDE TO SUPPORT OUR FUND-23 RAISING AND COALITION BUILDING TO MAKE THIS CAMPAIGN 24

SUCCESSFUL. WE LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING TO PARTNER WITH YOU,
