2 JESSE ARREGUIN, ABAG PRESIDENT: THAT COMPLETES ITEM THREE. 3 WE'LL MOVE TO ITEM FOUR, THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT THIS IS AN INFORMATION ITEM AND I WANT TO BEGIN BY SAYING I GREATLY 4 5 APPRECIATE OUR NAPA COUNTY VICE PRESIDENT AND COUNTY SUPERVISOR BELIA RAMOS AND ALL OF YOU FOR JOINING US REMOTELY 6 TO KEEP OUR AGENCY WORKING IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR NEXT YEAR 7 8 WE'LL BE EMBARKING ON A NUMBER OF IMPORTANT PROGRAMS TO ADDRESS REGIONAL PRIORITIES AND CHALLENGES. REPORT-OUT ON THE 9 10 WORK OF OUR AGENCY OVER THE PAST YEAR IN THE YEAR SINCE THE 2021 GENERAL ASSEMBLY WE HAVE FACED QUITE A LOT BOTH AS AN 11 AGENCY AND ALSO AS ELECTED LOCAL LEADERS AND AS WE MOVE 12 TOWARDS A SUSTAINED RECOVERY FROM THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 WE 13 HAVE SET ON A PATH TO COME TOGETHER AND ADDRESS OUR SHARED 14 15 CHALLENGES. IN SUPPORT OF ECONOMIC RECOVERY, ABAG AND MTC 16 LEADERSHIP MET WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS, BUSINESS LEADERS, LABOR REPRESENTATIVES AND NON-PROFITS IN 2021 AND IN EARLY 2022 TO 17 HEAR DIRECTLY HOW THEY'RE WORKING TO DIRECTLY ADVANCE OUR 18 REGION'S ECONOMIC RECOVERY IS HOW ABAG AND MTC CAN PLAY A ROLE 19 20 IN ASSISTING THEIR EFFORTS. HOUSING, DIVERSITY, EQUITY, 21 INCLUSION, AND THE IMPACTS OF COVID-19 WERE ALL DISCUSSED AND THESE CONVERSATIONS UNDERSCORED THE IMPORTANT ROLE OF OUR 22 REGIONAL AGENCIES AND OUR REGIONAL PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS IN 23 PARTICULAR IN ADVANCING PROSPERITY FOR ALL BAY AREA 24 25 COMMUNITIES AND LOOK FORWARD TO BRINGING FORWARD SOME

RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THOSE CONVERSATIONS THAT WE HAD WITH 1 2 BUSINESS, LABOR, AND ELECTED LEADERS TO HELP PROPOSE SOME 3 PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES AROUND EQUITABLE ECONOMIC RECOVERY IN THE BAY AREA. DURING THE PRECEDING GENERAL ASSEMBLY CONFERENCE 4 5 THAT WE HAD THIS MORNING, OTHER SPEAKERS AND I TALKED ABOUT THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY AND THE POTENTIAL FOR A 6 REGIONAL BALLOT MEASURE WHICH COULD RAISE FUNDS TO BUILD AND 7 8 PRESERVE AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA. WHICH 80% OF THE FUNDS WOULD GO BACK TO THE LOCAL 9 JURISDICTIONS AND 20% WOULD BE USED FOR REGIONAL FUNDING. 10 HEARING THE FEEDBACK FROM OTHER ELECTED LEADERS, WE HAD A 11 REALLY EXCELLENT DISCUSSION WITH A LOT OF GOOD OUESTIONS AND 12 COMMENTS, REALLY HELPED SHAPE A POTENTIAL BALLOT MEASURE, AND 13 I KNOW IT CAN BE DAUNTING CONSIDERING THE EXTENT WE NEED HERE 14 15 IN THE BAY AREA TO ADDRESS OUR HOUSING AND HOMELESS CRISIS BUT 16 I BELIEVE THAT BAHFA CAN PLAY A MAJOR ROLE IN HELPING ACHIEVE THAT H ALSO DRAWING ATTENTION TO THE REGIONAL HOUSING 17 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WHICH PROVIDES FUNDING ASSISTANCE 18 TO HELP LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WITH THEIR HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATES 19 AND MANY JURISDICTIONS HAVE ALREADY BEEN WORKING WITH THE 20 21 TECHNICAL SYSTEMS PRODUCTS PROVIDED BY ABAG STAFF AND I WANT TO THANK STAFF FOR THEIR WORK FOR LAUNCHING THE REGIONAL 22 HOUSING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IT'S BEEN A LOT OF WORK 23 NEEDED UPDATING OUR HOUSING ELEMENT. THE WORK THAT WE DO TOGETHER IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR FOCUSING LARGELY 6 ON HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS AND RESILIENCE. AND THE PROJECTS 7 8 AND PROGRAMS THAT WE CAN HELP ENSURE ALL OF OUR COMMUNITIES RECOVERY. THE LAST TIME WE WERE TOGETHER WAS IN JUNE OF 2021 TO UPDATE ELECTED OFFICIALS ON THE PLANNING 6 AND PROJECT WORK THAT ABAG WAS DOING, AND IT PROBABLY GOES 7 8 WITHOUT SAYING A LOT HAS HAPPENED IN THE ENSUING YEAR. PRESIDENT ARREGUIN MENTIONED THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY CONFERENCE 9 10 THAT JUST CONCLUDED. WE PRESENTED INFORMATION ON THE WORK OF BAHFA, THE BAY AREA HOUSING FINANCE AUTHORITY, AND ITS PROGRAM 11 ACTIVITIES THAT ARE NOW IF FULL SWING. I WOULD MENTION THAT 12 ONE OF THE KEY THINGS THAT HAPPENED LAST YEAR WAS THE 13 DESIGNATION BY PRESIDENT ARREGUIN OF AN ABAG HOUSING COMMITTEE 14 15 TO WORK VERY CLOSELY WITH BAHFA AND THE SISTER COMMITTEE, THE 16 BAHFA OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON, REALLY, ALL THINGS HOUSING, 17 GIVEN THE ACUTE ISSUES THAT WE HAVE IN THAT SPACE, AND IN OUTLINING THE WORK THAT, YOU KNOW, THAT WE HAVE BEEN DOING I 18 WANT TO THANK YOU FOR THE OUESTIONS AND THE FEEDBACK REGARDING 19 A POTENTIAL HOUSING BOND THAT WAS DISCUSSED IN THE LAST 20 SESSION. THERE WILL BE MANY MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO RECEIVE EVEN 21 MORE INPUT IN THE MONTHS TO COME, AND WE WELCOME AND NEED YOUR 22 CONTINUED ENGAGEMENT. THIS PAST YEAR, WE SAW THE CONCLUSION OF 23 RHNA AND MUCH WORK TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO LOCAL 24 JURISDICTIONS IN DEVELOPING THEIR HOUSING ELEMENTS AS WAS 25

MENTIONED BY PRESIDENT ARREGUIN. ABAG IS COMMITTED TO HELPING 1 2 LOCAL GOVERNMENTS MEET THE HOUSING CHALLENGES, TRANSCENDING 3 INDIVIDUAL TOWNS, CITY, AND COUNTY BOUNDARIES. AS PRESIDENT ARREGUIN ALSO NOTED, MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THE REGIONAL 4 5 HOUSING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IS AVAILABLE IN THE PACKET FOR THE GA WEBINAR. IT WAS ALSO A BIG YEAR IN TERMS OF 6 PLANNING. PLANNED BAY AREA 2050, OUR REGION'S REQUIRED LONG 7 8 RANGE TRANSPORTATION AND LAND USE PLAN WAS ADOPTED IN OCTOBER 2021. AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF PLANNED BAY AREA 2050 BEGAN IN 9 THE SUMMER OF 2019 AND WAS REVIEWED AND ULTIMATELY APPROVED BY 10 THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD AND MTC. THIS WAS REALLY A 11 TRANSFORMATIVE EFFORT FOR BOTH OF OUR AGENCIES. AND REALLY 12 ADVANCED PLANS FOR THIS REGION. THE PLAN INCLUDES, NOT ONLY A 13 LONG-TERM PERSPECTIVE, BUT NEAR-TERM ACTIONS IN A DETAILED 14 15 IMPLEMENTATION CHAPTER THAT CHARTS OUT SOME NEXT STEPS WE NEED TO BE TAKING TO MAKE PROGRESS ON OUR AMBITIOUS CLIMATE, 16 17 EQUITY, HOUSING, AND MOBILITY GOALS. THE SAN FRANCISCO ESTUARY PARTNERSHIP, BAYREN, AND ABAG POWER, AS WELL AS OUR ACFA 18 FINANCING PROGRAM HAVE KEPT UP THEIR VALUABLE WORK ASSISTING 19 CITIES AND COUNTIES OVER THE COURSE OF THE PAST FISCAL YEAR, 20 AND WILL CONTINUE TO DO SO IN THE YEAR AHEAD. THOSE OF YOU AT 21 OUR PRECEDING WEBINAR HEARD FROM BRAD PAUL, OUR DEPUTY 22 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES ON THESE 23 PROGRAMS PARTICULARLY WITH A DEEPER DIVE ON BAYREN. AND THERE 24 IS MORE INFORMATION IN THE ABAG BUDGET AND WORK PROGRAM 25

MATERIALS THAT WE PROVIDED YOU. I WANT TO HIGHLIGHT, OUICKLY, 1 A NEW TOOL WE LAUNCHED IN SEPTEMBER OF 2021 TO MAKE IT EASIER 2 3 TO ACCESS OUR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE OFFERINGS. WE LAUNCHED A WEB PORTAL TO MAKE IT EASY TO FIND BOTH ABAG AND MTC'S 4 5 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE OFFERINGS AND PROVIDE A ONE-STOP-SHOP TO LINK CITIES AND COUNTIES TO THESE WIDE RANGE OF RESOURCES. 6 THERE WAS ACTUALLY A PRESENTATION MADE ON THE PORTAL TO THE 7 8 MEETING IN MAY OF THE ABAG EXECUTIVE BOARD. SO, ANY MEMBERS THAT WOULD LIKE TO GO TO ON THE WEB SITE AND TAKE A LOOK AT 9 THAT PRESENTATION COULD SEE THE STAFF REVIEW OF THIS EFFORT. 10 THE PORTAL INCLUDES INFORMATION ON A WIDE RANGE OF TOP, 11 GREENHOUSE GAS REDUCTION, EOUITY, AFFORDABILITY AND RESILIENCE 12 AND FEATURE AN EASILY SEARCHABLE DATABASE THAT CAN BE SORTED 13 EASILY ON TOPICS OF HOUSING, ENVIRONMENT, LAND USE, 14 TRANSPORTATION, IT'S A VALUABLE RESOURCE WE PROVIDING TO YOU. 15 16 OUR PARTNERS ARE ACCESSING OUR EOUITY BENCH OF CONSULTANTS WITH EXPERTISE IN INTERNAL OPERATIONS INVESTMENTS AND POLICY 17 PARTNER AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, INNOVATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL 18 JUST. WE ARE CREATING AN EOUITY OFFICE AND WILL HAVE DETAILS 19 ON THIS EFFORT OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS. TURNING TO THE 20 21 BUSINESS MEETING YOU'LL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO VOTE ON ABAG'S BUDGET AND THE WORK PLAN FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR. PAUL. 17 DEREK HANSEL: GREAT. THANK YOU, PRESIDENT ARREGUIN. HAPPY TO 18 BE HERE. BRAD AND THERESE HAVE JUST TALKED ABOUT ALL THE 19 EXCITING WORK THAT ABAG IS DOING THROUGH ITSELF AND THROUGH A 20 21 NUMBER OF DIFFERENT PROGRAMS. AND I'M HERE TO TALK ABOUT THE EQUALLY EXCITING TOPIC OF HOW DO WE ACTUALLY PAY FOR THESE 22 THINGS. SO IF WE CAN --23

 HIM FOR HIS WORK. AND I'LL TURN IT BACK OVER TO MR. HANSEL.

DEREK HANSEL: GREAT. THANK YOU, PRESIDENT ARREGUIN. IF WE CAN 6 GO TO THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE? GREAT. JUST WANT TO TOUCH ON A 7 8 COUPLE HIGHLIGHTS OF BOTH THIS LAST YEAR'S BUDGET AS WELL AS WHAT WE'RE LOOKING AT FOR FISCAL '23. JUST A NOTE THE MTC 9 COMMISSION DID APPROVE A ONE TIME REFUND OF SHARED SERVICES IN 10 MEMBERSHIP DUES ASSESSMENT THAT WAS CRITICAL IN TERMS OF 11 KEEPING THE FISCAL '22 BUDGET BALANCED AND NOW WE'LL TALK 12 ABOUT HOW WE GET TO A BALANCED BUDGET FOR FISCAL '23 WITH SOME 13 OF THE CHALLENGES THAT WE'RE GOING TO SEE COMING FORWARD. THE 14 15 BUDGET IS BALANCED AS PRESENTED WITH A VERY SLIGHT SURPLUS NOW 16 ABOUT \$35,000. THIS BUDGET IS BALANCED BASED ON A MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE OF 6%. WOULD NOTE THAT THE ADMINISTRATION BUDGET 17 DOES REQUIRE TRANSFERS IN IN ORDER TO KEEP IT BUDGETED. WE 18 HAVE BUDGETED FOR TWO NEW PROJECT BASED TIME LIMITED POSITIONS 19 ASSOCIATED WITH BAYREN THIS BUDGET INCREASE INCLUDES A 2.8 20 COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT FOR STAFF AS EVERYBODY KNOWS THIS IS 21 CURRENT WE'RE STAFFED BY MTC STAFF. THE MTC COMMISSION 22 COMMITTEES, LAST WEEK RECOMMENDED APPROVAL OF THE MOU WITH 23 STAFF THAT WOULD ACTUALLY INCREASE THAT COST OF LIVING 24 ADJUSTMENT FROM 2.8% TO 4.2%. 2.8% IS THAT IN THE MOST 25

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RECENTLY NEGOTIATED MOU WHICH IS EXPIRING ON JUNE 30TH. 1 2 FINALLY, WE DO NOT HAVE ANY OPERATIONAL OR LEGAL RESERVES FOR ABAG. AND, AGAIN, WE'LL TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THE CHALLENGE 3 OF THAT WITH RESPECT TO THE ADMINISTRATION BUDGET AS WE GO ON. 4 5 NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. SO AS WE LOOK AT THE AGGREGATE BUDGETS FOR ABAG WE'RE TALKING ABOUT A BUDGET OF ABOUT \$45 MILLION, JUST 6 OVER. THE, AGAIN, THIS BUDGET IS BALANCED AS PROPOSED. THERE 7 8 IS AN INCREASE IN OVERALL REVENUE DUE TO ADDITIONAL PROJECT FUNDING THAT IS BEING RECEIVED IN THE FORM OF GRANTS. THERE 9 ARE SLIGHT DECREASES IN TRANSFERS, AND THEN ON THE EXPENSE 10 SIDE, OBVIOUSLY, THERE ARE INCREASES IN EXPENSES FOR 11 CONTRACTUAL PLANNING AND PROJECT OBLIGATIONS, WE SO THOSE BOTH 12 ON THE SFEP SIDE AND THE BAYREN SIDE OF THE LEDGER. NEXT SLIDE 13 PLEASE. ON THE ADMINISTRATIVE SIDE, YOU WILL NOTE, I DID JUST 14 15 MENTION A SECOND AGO THAT WE WERE LOOKING AT A DUES INCREASE 16 OF ABOUT 6%. WE ARE LOOKING AT OTHER INCOME THAT'S DOWN A LITTLE BIT, AND THEN TRANSFERS THAT DROP, AGAIN, THAT TRANSFER 17 PRIMARILY WAS FROM DUES AND ASSESSMENTS COMING IN FROM LAST 18 YEAR AND THAT IS DECREASED OVER TIME. ON THE EXPENSE SIDE OF 19 20 THE LEDGER --21

DEREK HANSEL: THANKS FRED. WE SEE INCREASES ON THE EXPENSE 10 SIDE ON THE PENSION PIECE, AND THEN OTHER EXPENSES, FRANKLY, A 11 LOT OF THAT IS TIED TO IT SERVICES, BUT CERTAIN OTHER 12 EXPENSES, AS WELL. WE DO NOTE, THAT, AGAIN, BALANCING THIS 13 BUDGET DOES REQUIRE \$370,000 IN OTHER FUND TRANSFERS AND THERE 14 15 IS OTHER CONTINUED BATA STAFF AND OVERHEAD REIMBURSEMENT 16 FUNDING THAT IS PROVIDED IN HERE. WE NOTE, WITHOUT CORRECTION, THERE COULD BE, AND, FRANKLY, I WOULD SAY THAT WITHOUT 17 CORRECTION, THERE WILL BE A LONG-TERM STRUCTURAL DEFICIT. WE 18 HAVE, IN ADDITION TO THE PENSION TRANSFER EXPENSES THAT ARE 19 BEING ASSOCIATED WITH THIS YEAR'S BUDGET, AND WE SAW WITH LAST 20 YEAR'S BUDGET, THERE IS A SUBSTANTIAL FUNDED LIABILITY FOR 21 PENSION ASSOCIATED WITH ABAG OPERATIONS. THE GOOD NEWS IS, 22 THAT GOT BETTER IN FISCAL 2021. THE BAD NEWS -- AND THIS IS A 23 TECHNICAL TERM, IS THAT THE PERS PERFORMANCE OVER THE LAST SIX 24 25 MONTHS IS PROBABLY VERY MUCH LIKE WE HAVE SEEN, GENERALLY, IN

THE STOCK MARKET, WHICH IS THAT IT'S GETTING THE STUFFING 1 KICKED OUT OF IT. SO, FISCAL '21 WOULD HAVE LOOKED PRETTY 2 3 GOOD, FISCAL '22, CERTAINLY, NOT SO MUCH ON THE PENSION SIDE. AND THAT'S A CHALLENGE. AND FINALLY NO OPERATING OR LEGAL 4 5 RESERVES ARE PROVIDED WITHIN THE ABAG ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET. NEXT SLIDE PLEASE. THERE IS GOOD NEWS ON THE OPEB OBLIGATION. 6 SO THIS IS OTHER POST EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS. THIS IS, 7 8 ESSENTIALLY, RETIREE HEALTH CARE. WE ARE -- THERE IS AN OPEB ASSET. SO, IT'S ACTUALLY A POSITIVE FOR ABAG. AS OF THE JUNE 9 30, 2020 MEASUREMENT DATE, IT WAS A LITTLE UNDER A MILLION 10 DOLLARS. AGAIN, THIS WOULD HAVE GOTTEN BETTER IN FISCAL '21, 11 AND FISCAL '22 WILL BE REASONABLY LEVEL, JUST GIVEN THE NATURE 12 THAT WE INVEST THE 115 TRUST PROCEEDS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. 13 DIGGING DOWN INTO THE PROGRAMS FOR JUST A SECOND, BAYREN SIDE, 14 GRANTS ARE UP. SO THAT'S GOOD NEWS. THE WATER SAVINGS TRANSFER 15 16 OF A MILLION DOLLARS WAS A TRANSFER IN TO BE ABLE TO PROVIDE CERTAIN LOANS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS. AND THEN ON THE EXPENSE 17 SIDE, REALLY LOOKING AT A NICE JUMP IN CONSULTING EXPENSES, 18 WHICH IS OFFSET BYPASS THROUGH CONTRIBUTIONS. AND, AGAIN, A 19 BALANCED BUDGET AS PROPOSED. AND THIS IS ONE WHERE THOSE 20 21 BUDGETS ARE ESSENTIALLY BALANCED BY VIRTUE OF THE GRANTS EQUALLY THE CONSULTING EXPENSES, SO WE WOULD NOT SPEND MONEY 22 THAT IS NOT RECEIVED. NEXT PAGE, PLEASE. ON THIS -- ON THE 23 SFEP SIDE, AGAIN, AN INCREASE IN GRANTS REVENUE. FEWER PASS 24 THROUGH CONTRIBUTIONS AND SIGNIFICANT CLIMBS IN CONSULT 25

EXPENSES, AND ARE FUNDAMENTALLY BALANCED WITH CONSULTING 1 2 EXTENTS THAT WILL NOT EXCEED AVAILABLE RESOURCES. NOTE HERE THAT WE HAVE GOT ABOUT 75% OF THE PROGRAM FUNDING WHICH IS 3 ALLOCATED TO PROGRAM EXPENSES. SO IT'S HIGHLY EFFECTIVE 4 PROGRAM FROM THAT PERSPECTIVE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO OUR 5 RECOMMENDATION AND REQUEST IS THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ADOPT 6 RESOLUTION 0822, 2022, APPROVING THIS WORK PLAN, AND THE 7 8 OPERATING BUDGETS. AND WITH THAT, I'LL BE AVAILABLE FOR ANY 9 OUESTIONS.

JESSE ARREGUIN, ABAG PRESIDENT: THANK YOU VERY MUCH. I JUST 11 WANT TO PROVIDE IS OPENING COMMENTS BEFORE WE OPEN DISCUSSION 12 OF THE BUDGET AND WORK PROGRAM AND SAY I APPRECIATE THAT STAFF 13 HAS BROUGHT TO US A BALANCED BUDGET, BUT I WANT TO EXPRESS 14 15 CONCERN ABOUT THE LONG-TERM STRUCTURAL DEFICIT THAT OUR AGENCY 16 FACES. AND THIS IS SOMETHING THEY HAVE IDENTIFIED AS A PRIORITY AS PRESIDENT OF THIS ORGANIZATION TO MAKE SURE WE CAN 17 PUT IN PLACE SOLUTIONS, LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO CLOSE THE 18 STRUCTURAL DEFICIT AND MAKE SURE THAT WE HAVE, ONE, A RESERVE, 19 IN THE CASE OF UNEXPECTED EXPENDITURES OR LITIGATION. IF THERE 20 21 WAS A LAWSUIT, WE WOULD NOT HAVE A SOURCE OF REVENUE TO BE ABLE TO PAY FOR ANY SORT OF MONETARY SETTLEMENT OR ANY LEGAL 22 EXPENSES BEYOND WHEN'S CURRENTLY BUDGETED IN THE PROPOSED ABAG 23 BUDGET. AND I JUST THINK GOOD FISCAL PRACTICE, AS MANY OF YOU 24 25 KNOW, HAVING SERVED AS MAYORS AND IN LOCAL JURISDICTIONS AND

SUPERVISORS NECESSARY FOR OPERATING WITH THAT AS I PRIORITY. 1 THE MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD ARE GOING PUCKS ON HOW TO 2 3 CLOSE THE STRUCTURAL DEFICIT LONG-TERM HOW DO WE MAKE SURE THE REVENUES TO SUSTAIN THE OPERATIONS OF OUR AGENCY ARE 4 5 SUFFICIENT TO MATCH THE EXPENDITURES, PERSONNEL EXPENDITURES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES. I THINK THAT WARRANTS A BIGGER 6 CONVERSATION AROUND WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF ABAG AND WHAT DO WE 7 8 WANT THE DIRECTION OF ABAG TO BE. I WANT THE DELEGATES TO KNOW THIS WILL LIKELY BE THE SUBJECT OF SOME SPECIAL GENERAL 9 ASSEMBLY AT SOME POINT IN THE FALL. I THINK AS WE LOOK AT HOW 10 WE ADDRESS THE FISCAL HEALTH OF THE AGENCY, I THINK IT 11 WARRANTS A CONVERSATION AROUND ABAG'S ROLE AND HOW IT CAN PLAY 12 A PROACTIVE ROLE IN PROVIDING SERVICES DIRECTLY TO LOCAL 13 GOVERNMENTS. WE'RE GOING TO BE HAVING A RETREAT, SORT OF, AT 14 15 THE EXECUTIVE BOARD, SORT OF, A STRATEGIC CONVERSATION ABOUT 16 THE STRATEGIC DIRECTION OF THE AGENCY WHILE WE'RE TALKING ABOUT THIS ISSUE OF THE BUDGET AND I THINK IT ALSO WOULD BE 17 APPROPRIATE TO HAVE A CONVERSATION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AS 18 WELL. I WANTED TO LET EVERYONE KNOW, I HAVE CONCERNS JUST AS I 19 AM SURE THE DELEGATES DO, AROUND THIS BUDGET AND WE TAKE THIS 20 21 SERIOUSLY WORKING TO DEFINE SHORT AND LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO ADDRESS THIS SO WE CAN CONTINUE TO PROVIDE ALL THE IMPORTANT 22 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES AND THE IMPORTANT WORK WE DO IN 23 ADVOCATING FOR POLICIES FOR OUR REGION. I WANT JUST PROVIDE 24 25 COMMENTS FOR CONTEXT BUT NOTE OUR BUDGET IS BALANCED FOR THIS

FISCAL YEAR BUT WE HAVE TO RECOGNIZE WE HAVE TO FIND SOLUTIONS 1 2 LONG-TERM. AND OUR FORMER FINANCE OFFICER BRIAN MAYHEW HAD 3 PROPOSED POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS WHICH ARE WE CONTINUING TO EXPLORE THIS IS MY TOP PRIORITY IT'S A PRIORITY OF SUPERVISOR 4 5 MITCHOFF WHO CHAIRS THE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND SOMETHING WE'LL BE WORKING ACTIVELY WITH OUR STAFF TO ADDRESS IN THE COMING 6 MONTHS. I WANTED TO PROVIDE THAT CONTEXT AS WE START OUR 7 8 DISCUSSION TODAY. WITH THAT I WOULD LIKE TO OPEN DISCUSSION FROM THE DELEGATES ON THE PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2022, '23 9 10 OPERATING BUDGET AND WORK PROGRAM. THERE ARE ANY DELEGATES WHO WISH TO SPEAK ON THIS ITEM? YES, MR. FULLER? 11

14 INCORPORATED WITH THE OPERATING BUDGET IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING

16 ABAG TO DEVELOP THE HOUSING BOND PROGRAM FOR 2024. IS THAT

THE MONEY TO ACTUALLY DO THE WORK FOR OUR -- FOR BAHFA, IS ACTUAL LIKELY PRINCIPALLY BEING FUNDED THROUGHOUT \$20 MILLION STATE OF APPROPRIATION RECEIVED THAT WE TALKED ABOUT AT OUR 9:00 MEETING. MR. HANSEL IS THAT CORRECT?

25 DEREK HANSEL: THAT'S CORRECT.

RECEIVED IN THE LAST BUDGET THAT IS FUNDING THE WORK OF BAHFA,
INCLUDING THE WORK ON PUTTING A MEASURE ON THE BALLOT.
GEORGE FULLER: THE REASON I BRING IT UP, IN EAST CONTRA COSTA
COUNTY AND OAKLEY, WE HAVE A NUMBER OF YOUNG FAMILIES WHO HAVE
COME INTO OUR COMMUNITY BECAUSE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HAVE
BEEN ABLE TO BUY AFFORDABLE HOUSING BUT IT'S VERY

10 UNCONSCIONABLE PROPERTY TAX RATES THEY MAY PAY \$450,000 FOR A ROAM FOR THEIR FAMILY BUT THEY'RE PAYING OVER \$12,000 IN 11 PROPERTY TAXES AND MUCH AS IT HAS BEEN AS WELL, LET'S GO AHEAD 12 IS MAKE ANOTHER TAX. SO I'M NOT HAPPY THAT ABAG IS PUTTING 13 TOGETHER SOMETHING TO INCREASE THEIR PROPERTY TAXES AGAIN, AND 14 15 DRIVE AWAY MORE PEOPLE. BECAUSE, NOT NECESSARILY THE PRICE OF 16 THE HOUSE THAT MAY BE THERE, BUT THE PRICE OF PROPERTY TAXES THAT GO WITH IT. SO I'M VERY HESITANT, AND I'M GLAD THAT WE'RE 17 NOT PUTTING IN THERE AND MORE INCLINED TO VOTE FOR IT, BUT 18 AGAIN A 6% INCREASE IN FEES HERE, THE ONLY TRANSLATES OUT TO 19 THE PERSON LIVING IN THE HOUSE EVENTUALLY AND ALL WE'RE DOING 20 IS PUTTING GREATER EXPENSES ON A YOUNG FAMILY TRYING TO MAKE 21 THEIR WAY INTO THE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME BUYING BY RAISING FEES 22 HERE. SO, I'M ALL FOR CUTTING, CUTTING, RATHER THAN 23 INCREASING. I CAN GO -- I WILL PROBABLY VOTE FOR T BUT IT'S 24 25 SOMETHING TO KEEP IN MIND IN THE FUTURE. BUT IF ABAG STARTS

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BACKING -- PUTTING MONEY INTO THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE 1 2 AMENDMENT, THEN I WILL BE VERY DISAPPOINTED. 3 JESSE ARREGUIN, ABAG PRESIDENT: THANK YOU, SIR. I'LL ASK FOR 4 5 OUESTIONS OR COMMENTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE PROPOSED WORK PLAN AND BUDGET? MAYOR BONILLA? 6 7 8 RICK BONILLA: I HAVE LOOKED AT ALL THIS AND I FIND IT ACCEPTABLE. LOOKING AT LONG RANGE OUTLOOK AND SEEING HEARING, 9 AND UNDERSTANDING THE STRUCTURAL DEFICIT I THINK THAT'S A 10 CONCERN. I APPRECIATE YOU SUGGESTED THERE SHOULD BE A MEETING 11 IN THE FALL TO GO OVER THIS. I DON'T THINK THIS IS IMPOSSIBLE 12 TO DEAL WITH THIS. EVERYTHING IS COSTING MORE. I UNDERSTAND 13 THE \$20 MILLION GRANT FOR THE WORK, I THINK IT MAKES IT 14 15 POSSIBLE FOR US TO DO ON A RELATIVELY COST EFFECTIVE BASIS FOR 16 US. THIS IS WORK THAT HAS TO BE DONE, THOUGH. THAT'S THE IMPORTANT THING TO REMEMBER, TO CREATE THE AFFORDABILITY, 17 WHICH I UNDERSTAND, MEMBER FULLER SAID, PROPERTY TAX MAKES 18 AWAY THINGS THAT WE GET. THIS IS THE BEST PATH FORWARD TO 19 ACCOMPLISH WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE. WITH THAT SAID I WOULD LIKE 20 21 TO MAKE A PROGRESSION TO APPROVE WHEN THAT TIME COMES. THANK YOU. 22
