- 14 WITH THE BLUE RIBBON RECOVERY TASK FORCE, THE STAKEHOLDER
- 15 OUESTION IS GOING TO BE FLUSHED OUT THROUGH THE PROCESS OF
- 16 ENGAGEMENT THAT WE'RE GOING TO REQUEST APPROVAL ON THIS
- 17 MORNING. ULTIMATELY THE STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT GROUP AS PART

WE RECEIVED WRITTEN CORRESPONDENCE ON AGENDA ITEM 41, AND IT WAS A COMBINED 19 COMMENT FROM SEAMLESS BAY AREA SILICON VALLEY INDEPENDENT 20 21 LIVING CENTER AND CHOICE IN AGING. 22 23 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND I DO SEE FOUR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WITH THEIR HANDS UP. AND IN 24

ADDITION TO THE HANDS UP PEOPLE MAY DIAL STAR NINE TO COMMENT



ON THIS ITEM. WITH THAT BEING SAID, MARTHA PLEASE CALL THE 1 2 SPEAKERS. 3 CLERK OF THE BOARD: WILL DO. FIRST UP IS ADINA: GO AHEAD AND 4 5 UNMUTE YOURSELF. YOU HAVE TWO MINUTES. 6 ADINA LEVIN: GOOD MORNING COMMISSIONERS. ADINA LEVIN, I SERVE 7 8 ON THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL AND WANTED TO SAY SOME THINGS THAT HOPEFULLY SOME FELLOW MEMBERS OF THE POLICY ADVISORY 9 COUNCIL WILL ALSO MENTION AND THAT WERE MENTIONED IN THAT 10 LETTER FROM THE BAY AREA CROSS DISABILITY ALLIES AND 11 COALITION. WE WOULD LIKE TO URGE YOU TO PULL 4I THE DISCUSSION 12 FOR THE WAYFINDING PROJECT AND THE REASON IS THAT MTC HAS BEEN 13 REALLY VERY CLEAR ABOUT WANTING THIS AND MANY OTHER THINGS TO 14 15 BE EQUITABLE AND ACCESSIBLE FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES. 16 HOWEVER, SOME OF MY COLLEAGUES ON THE POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL AND IN THE DISABILITY COMMUNITY HAVE BEEN RAISING AN ISSUE 17 THAT THERE ARE SEVERAL ITEMS THAT ARE REALLY IMPORTANT FOR 18 WAYFINDING, WHICH IS AUDITORY OUEUES, WHICH IS WHEN THE TRAIN 19 DOORS OPEN AND CLOSE AND THE WALK SIGN IS ON AT A STOP LINE 20 21 AND TACTILE CUES LIKE VINYL STRIPS ON THE FLOOR THESE ARE 22 REALLY BASIC MEDIA TO PROVIDE WAYFINDING ACCESSIBILITY FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES AND WE'RE CONCERNED THAT IF THIS 23 PROJECT IS NOT INCLUDED THESE ACCESSIBILITY ITEMS AND GOALS 24

WILL NOT BE MET. WE REALLY WANT TO SEE THESE ITEMS PART OF THE



PROJECT WHETHER IT'S UNDER THIS CONTRACT OR UNDER AN ADD O WE 1 DON'T WANT TO STOP THE CONTRACT BUT WE WANT DISCUSSION ABOUT 2 3 HOW TO INCLUDE THESE REALLY ESSENTIAL ITEMS TO PROVIDE ACCESSIBLE WAYFINDING. THANK YOU. 4 5 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: THANK YOU SO MUCH. AND OUR NEXT 6 7 SPEAKER, MARTHA PLEASE? 8 CLERK OF THE BOARD: NEXT SPEAKER IS GOING TO BE CHRISTINE 9 10 FITZGERALD. CHRIS, ARE YOU WITH US? GO AHEAD AND UNMUTE YOURSELF. 11 12 CHRISTINE FITZGERALD: THANK YOU VERY MUCH MARTHA, AND HELLO 13 EVERYBODY. MY NAME IS CHRISTINE FITZGERALD WITH THE COMMUNITY 14 ADVOCATES FOR THE SILICON VALLEY INDEPENDENT LIVING CENTER FOR 15 16 TRANSPARENCY I ALSO SERVE ON THE MTC POLICY ADVISORY COUNCIL. 17 I COULDN'T AGREE MORE WITH WHAT ADINA HAS JUST SAID, SO I'M GOING TO KEEP MY COMMENTS VERY SHORT AND SWEET, AND TO 18 EMPHASIZE WHAT SHE HAS SAID. SO MUCH OF ALL THOSE OF US WITH 19 VISUAL DISABILITIES HAVE TO NEGOTIATE THE WORLD, RELIES VERY 20 21 HEAVILY ON OUR TACTILE AND AUDIO CUES. FOR INSTANCE BEING SIGHT CHALLENGED MYSELF, I HEAVILY RELY ON MY OTHER SENSES, 22 GOING ON AND OFF RAMPS, AND GOING OFF A CURB IN THE 23

APPROPRIATE AREA WHICH COULD BE VERY DANGEROUS. THIS IS AN

EXAMPLE OF HOW WE CAN SHARE TO DEMONSTRATE THIS VERY IMPORTANT

- VISUAL AND TACTILE CUES AND VISUAL DISABILITIES AND WHO ARE 1 VISUALLY IMPAIRED AND BLIND. THANK YOU FOR YOUR ATTENTION AND 2 3 I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH EVERYBODY IN THE FUTURE. 4 5 CAROL DUTRA-VERNACI, CHAIR: MARTHA NEXT SPEAKER, PLEASE? 6 7 CLERK OF THE BOARD: NEXT SPEAKER IS GOING TO BE RANDI KINMAN. 8 GO AHEAD AND UNMUTE YOURSELF. 9 RANDI KINMAN: THANK YOU. RANDI KINMAN OF THE POLICY ADVISORY 10 COUNCIL. I FULLY SUPPORT STATEMENTS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE. THERE 11 HAS BEEN SOME LACK OF COORDINATION WITH OUR PARTICULAR GROUP 12 REGARDING THE PARAMETERS OF SIGNAGE AND WAYFINDING. THE 13 CONTRACT GOING OUT OR WHAT'S GOING TO BE INCLUDED. AND I WOULD 14 15 ALSO SAY, WITH CLIPPER, THAT THE NEW CLIPPER SYSTEM RELATED TO 16 HOW THAT PERFORMED FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, OR, SO, I JUST WANT TO MAKE IT VERY CLEAR THAT THERE IS NO REQUEST FOR 17 ANYBODY TO DELAY THINGS. BUT I THINK THAT WE NEED -- AND WE 18 HAVE HAD A DISCUSSION WITH SENIOR MANAGEMENT ON THIS, BETTER 19 COORDINATION WITH THE ACTUAL COUNCIL. AND I DO EXPECT THAT THE 20 21 COUNCIL HAVE A SEAT ON ANY GROUP THAT IS ACTING AS AN ADVISORY 22 GROUP. THANK YOU. 23

I'M GOING TO 2 3 GIVE YOU A 15 SECOND WARNING WHEN YOU GET DOWN TO YOUR TIMER. 4 5 SPEAKER: CAN YOU HEAR ME? 6 7 CLERK OF THE BOARD: YES I CAN. 8 SPEAKER: GOOD MORNING. MY NAME IS DAVEED MANDELL I AM A MEMBER 9 OF THE BAY AREA CROSS DISABILITY AND ALLY COALITION AND 10 TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE OF THE AMERICAN COUNCIL OF THE BLIND 11 ACCESSIBILITY FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES IS A CIVIL RIGHT 12 AND IT IS INTEGRAL TO ALL WORLD CLASS PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEMS. 13 FOR DECADES THE MTC HAS FAILED TO ENSURE THAT THE BAY AREA'S 14 FRAGMENTED PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEM HAS BEEN FULLY ACCESSIBLE TO 15 16 AND EQUITABLE FOR EVERYONE. HOWEVER, LATELY, IT HAS BEGUN TO MOVE IN A MORE POSITIVE DIRECTION BY ACKNOWLEDGING THE NEED TO 17 DEVELOP AND PROMULGATE STANDARDS FOR ACCESSIBLE WAYFINDING. 18 THE PROBLEM IS THAT THE MTC REFUSES TO DEFINE THIS TERM WHICH 19 IS AT THAT POINT A MOUNT TO ONCE AGAIN DENYING ACCESSIBILITY. 20 21 WE BELIEVE IT IS UNCOUPLE BENT UPON THE MTC TO INCLUDE 22 LANGUAGE FROM BOTH SB 917 THE SEAMLESS TRANSIT BILL AND THE 23 WAYFINDING PROJECT CONTRACT THAT CLEARLY DEFINES WAYFINDING ACCESSIBILITY. FOR INSTANCE VISUAL INFORMATION MUST BE 24 PROVIDED IN NON-VISUAL FORMS FOR BLIND PEOPLE AND PEOPLE WITH 25



- 1 LOW VISION. THESE FORMS INCLUDE, ONE, AUDIBLE CUES THROUGH
- 2 SPECIAL SMART PHONE MAPPING APPLICATIONS WHICH GIVE DIRECTIONS
- 3 FOR NAVIGATING THROUGH SUBWAY STATIONS AND LOCATING BUS STOPS.
- 4 TWO, AUDIBLE CUES IN THE BUILT IN ENVIRONMENT, SUCH AS
- 5 ACCESSIBLE PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS AND RECORDED BUS STOP
- 6 ANNOUNCEMENTS AND THREE, TACTILE CUES IN THE BUILT IN
- 7 ENVIRONMENT SUCH AS HIGH CONTRAST TACTILE TILES ON THE BART
- 8 PLATFORMS FOR WHEN THE EDGE IS NEAR, AND THE TACTILE WARNINGS
- 9 CALLED TRUNCATED DOMESTIC FOUND ON STREET CORNERS. THEREFORE
- 10 WE ASK MTC INCLUDE BRIEF PUBLIC LANGUAGE THAT DEFINES BOTH WAY
- 11 FINDING IN SB 917 AND THE WAYFINDING CONTRACT THANK YOU VERY
- 12 MUCH.

TODAY I'M GOING TO DO A 6 BRIEF PRESENTATION ON HIGHLIGHTING THE CORE AREAS OF THE ONE 7 8 BAY AREA GRANT REGIONAL OPERATIONS PROGRAM. AS YOU KNOW, MTC WORKS DIRECTLY WITH CALTRANS OPERATIONS, THE HIGHWAY PATROL, 9 THE NINE BAY AREA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AGENCIES, TRANSIT 10 OPERATORS, AND THE CITIES IN THE REGION TO DELIVER ON VARIOUS 11 OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO SUPPORT MODE 12 SHIFTS TO TRANSIT AND HIGH-OCCUPANCY VEHICLES BY DEDICATING 13 ACCESS TO HIGH-OCCUPANCY VEHICLES AND BUSES AND IMPROVING WAYS 14 15 THAT THESE VEHICLES STAY CLEAR OF CONGESTION WHERE POSSIBLE. 16 THE PROGRAM IS VERY BROAD AND HAS SEVERAL CATEGORIES OF PROJECTS TO ASSIST IN ACHIEVING THE GOALS OF PLANNED BAY AREA 17 2050. - 1 UPDATE ON THE SIGNIFICANT PROGRAMS IN THE OPERATIONS
- 2 PORTFOLIO. SO, THIS IS A SLIDE THAT WE SHOWED LAST YEAR, AND
- 3 JUST TO, SORT OF, SET THE STAGE, BLUE REPRESENTS CONGESTION
- 4 FREE TRAFFIC, AND THE DARKER THE BLUE THE MORE FREE IT IS, AND
- 5 THE DARKER THE RED THE MORE CONGESTED WE ARE. IT'S BASED ON
- 6 REALLY, 100% REPRESENT WHAT IS IT LOOKED LIKE PRIOR TO THE
- 7 PANDEMIC. SO WHAT WE SEE IN THE TRANSITION FROM LEFT TO RIGHT
- 8 IS THAT WE'RE CONTINUING TO GET DARKER AND DARKER RED, WHICH
- 9 MEANS WE'RE RETURNING TO THE STATUS OF TRAFFIC DELAYS THAT

- 18 VERTICAL ACCESS ON THE LEFT REPRESENTS AT 100% WHAT IT LOOKED
- 19 LIKE PRIOR TO THE PANDEMIC. WE SEE THE STEEP DROP OFF THAT

- 3 DESIGN TO COORDINATE WHEN 880 GETS JAMMED UP FROM AN INCIDENT
- 4 TO FIND SOME ALTERNATIVE ROUTES AND THAT WORK IS UNDERWAY AS
- 5 WE SPEAK. NEXT SLIDE. CONNECTED BAY AREA IS A PARTNERSHIP WITH
- 6 CALTRANS WHERE THEY HAVE BROUGHT QUITE A BIT OF MONEY TO THE
- 7 TABLE AND WE'RE TRYING TO WORK TOGETHER TO MAKE SURE THAT THE
- 8 ENTIRE FREEWAY SYSTEM IN THE REGION IS COVERED BY A BROADBAND
