## **Key Updates**

- State Funding for Port Infrastructure: In early July, Governor Gavin Newsom announced a statewide investment of more than \$1.5 billion including funding from the Port and Freight Infrastructure program and a Grade Separation set-aside from the TIRCP cycle 6 program. Awards to the region from the Port and Freight Infrastructure include:
  - o \$102.3 million for the Port of Oakland Terminal Modernization project
  - \$17.3 million for the Port of Oakland Arterial Roadway Improvement project
  - \$21.6 million for the Port of San Francisco's Maritime Eco-Industrial Complex Improvement Program
  - \$13.5 million for Alameda County's 7th Street Grade Separation project

The TIRCP money for ACTC's 7th Street Grade Separation in Oakland was featured in an ACTC press event held Monday, July 24, at the Port (Middle Harbor Shoreline Park), at which Commissioner Miley along with Commissioner Thao, Mayor of Oakland, were participants and speakers.

• State Funding for Grade Separations: The state also announced the final portion of the TIRCP Cycle 6 program, which consists of grant awards for the grade separation project set-aside. Of the \$350 million in funding available for this category, the Bay Area received \$114 million, or about a third of the funds available for four projects, including grade separations in Burlingame, Mountain View, South San

Francisco and Palo Alto. MTC supported projects in this category that were consistent with our regional Bipartisan Infrastructure Law grant strategy, highlighting the fact that having a consistent set of priorities and communicating those to our funding partners can have real benefits when it comes to competitive grants.

- MTC and ABAG kicked off Plan Bay Area 2050+ earlier this month, a limited and focused update to the regional vision for transportation, housing, economic development, and environmental resilience, which was featured at the Joint MTC Planning/ABAG Administrative Committee earlier this month. Given that there is no parallel RHNA process this cycle, Plan Bay Area 2050+ is an opportunity to educate residents about the purpose of long-range regional plans, to integrate updated post-pandemic planning assumptions, and to continue the region's focus on plan implementation. Over the next six weeks, MTC/ABAG staff will be holding pop-up workshops at community events to get early input on this planning process in all nine counties, with a specific focus on Equity Priority Communities. Staff also will seek input on the parallel Transit 2050+ network plan and hear residents' priorities for the potential 2026 regional transportation revenue measure at these events. - MTC and ABAG in June launched the Bay Area Housing and Land Use Viewer, a web-based mapping tool
  created to provide the public with access to data related to housing, land use, transportation, equity and
  the environment. This is the first time this level of detail has been available in one place and publicly
  accessible on the agency website.

### Items to Note

- The Regional Housing Technical Assistance (RHTA) Program has received the 2023 Planning Agency Award of Excellence from APA California in recognition of RHTA's unprecedented array of critical resources for the Bay Area's 101 cities and 9 counties, saving jurisdictions significant time and money and advancing important regional policies through a shared sense of regional priorities and increased capacity and momentum. The award will be presented in September at the APA California 2023 conference.
- MTC recently participated in the inaugural Sustainable Mobility Careers Awareness & Innovation
   Challenge through the Introducing Youth to American Infrastructure (IYAI) organization. The Bay Area IYAI
   youth team, Transit Titans, were awarded second place for its Return to Transit presentation. Thanks to
   Luz Campos, MTC staff, and our partners at BART, Caltrain, Golden Gate Bridget Transportation District,
   SamTrans, SFMTA, and VTA for supporting this workforce challenge. The Transit Titans team participants
   included Alexander Hirji, Jaylene Perez, Nicholas Wilsey, and Sahij Sandhu. Learn more by watching this

- On July 12, I spoke at the **Alameda County Supervisors' Conference** business meeting about the genesis of MTC and ABAG, the staff consolidation, the makeup of the respective governing boards, and the services the agencies provide to the nine-county Bay Area.
- The **Bay Area Housing Finance Authority (BAHFA)** will be holding two public workshops on August 16 and 24 on regional bond measure planning. Stay tuned for invitations.
