Updates

State of the San Francisco Estuary Conference Re-scheduled

- The State of the San Francisco Estuary Conference has been re-scheduled for May 28-29 at the Oakland Scottish Rite Center. The event was cancelled in March because the previous venue was not ready. More information on the Estuary Partnerships website: www.sfestuary.org.

Bay Wheels East Bay Expansion

- Alix and I were joined by ABAG Vice-President and Berkeley Mayor Jesse Arreguin, Emeryville Councilmember Courtney Welsh and BART Director Rebecca Saltzman at an event earlier this month where MTC and Lyft announced the addition of 24 new docking stations and 565 next-generation docked e-bikes to the [Bay Wheels regional bikeshare system](#) in Oakland and Emeryville. The East Bay expansion marks the second phase of a two-step Bay Wheels growth strategy that began last fall with the introduction of more than 1,500 new e-bikes and 30 new docking stations in San Francisco and San Jose.

Disadvantaged & Small Business Enterprise Programs

- At [this month's Administration Committee meeting](#), staff gave an update to commissioners about MTC's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) programs. It is worth noting that from 2020-2023, MTC awarded over \$71 million under the DBE and SBE Programs. MTC also does outreach for these programs, including mentoring, DBE certification assistance, and procurement technical assistance.
