7a. <u>15-0685</u> Allocation of FY2015-16 Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds, State Transit Assistance (STA) funds, Assembly Bill (AB) 1107 funds and Regional Measure 2 (RM2) operating funds and capital funds to various claimants in the region, and revision to the FY2015-16 Fund Estimate. MTC Resolution Nos. 4177, Revised, 4186, Revised, 4187, Revised, 4188, Revised, and 4189, Revised.

i. Revisions to the FY2015-16 Fund Estimate to update prior year actual revenues.

ii. Allocation of \$273 million to various operators (NCTPA, SFMTA, Soltrans, Sonoma County, Tri Delta Transit and VTA) to support transit projects and services.

At the request of TJPA, approve the release of the quit claim deed for a small portion of the 568 Howard Street property in order to package it with other properties for auction. The Committee recommends the approval be conditioned on TJPA staff presenting a budget update for both phases of the project at the July Commission meeting. The quit claim deed was developed in 2010 pursuant to a condition of the allocation of RM2 funds for a \$2.3 million purchase of the property, which is necessary to construct the new Transbay Transit Center. TJPA staff will present an update on the Phase 1 and Phase 2 project budget at the meeting, as a condition of the quit claim release.
