

2017-2019 Work Plan & Tasks

A. Regional Planning and Implementation

Initiate and support efforts that advance regional action on resiliency and climate adaptation:

- > Bay Area Resilient by Design Challenge
- > Caltrans Regional Sea Level Rise Planning Grant

Advance local and regional measures and capacity to meet/exceed state goals:

- > Climate Technical Assistance Pilot Program
 - Initial pilots include model solar ordinance for new construction and trip caps
 - New BARC website/data portal to support local jurisdictions, serve as centralized source of climate information

Regional leadership:

- > Bay Area Resilient by Design Challenge
- Great Communities Collaborative Working Groups on Transit-Oriented Development and Climate Equity

B. Integration and Coordinated Communication

Facilitate linkage among other regional climate planning efforts:
