RE: Cooperative Agreement Amendment – Design/Environmental Services and Oversight of Final

Design and Right-of-Way Phases for I-880 Express Lanes in Alameda County: Caltrans

(\$150,000)

This memorandum seeks approval for the Authority to amend a cooperative agreement with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for the I-880 Express Lanes Project. This cooperative agreement allows Caltrans to provide oversight reviews and approvals of BAIFA's I-880 Express Lanes Project. Caltrans estimates its cost, reimbursable by BAIFA, has increased due to necessary additional coordination and review to integrate the express lanes project with other work in the corridor. The current agreement is for \$1,199,000. Caltrans has requested an additional \$150,000. The amended agreement will not exceed \$1,349,000.

### **Background**

Originally authorized by the Authority in October 2014, the cooperative agreement provides for Caltrans oversight and review of multiple contract documents for the I-880 Express Lanes Project. The I-880 Express Lanes Project will convert existing HOV lanes on I-880 from the Santa Clara County line to the Hegenberger/Lewelling Boulevard interchanges in Alameda County. BAIFA advertised the civil construction package to bidders on April 25, 2017. Pending final approval of permits from Caltrans, bid opening is scheduled for June 2, 2017.

Caltrans has requested additional funds to cover additional coordination costs to integrate delivery of the Express Lanes project with Caltrans projects to upgrade the median barrier upgrade and resurface the pavement as well as additional plan reviews and approvals. Staff has reviewed the request and concurs with it.

#### Recommendation

Staff recommends the Authority authorize the Executive Director or his designee to negotiate and enter into a cooperative agreement amendment with Caltrans in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 to provide review, approvals, and environmental and design services that are required for the I-880 Express Lanes Project in Alameda County.
