Summary of ABAG Executive Board's Proposed Amendments to <u>Plan Bay Area 2050 Cross-Cutting Issues</u>, Vision and Guiding Principles

Cross-Cutting Issues: *Equity* and *Resilience*

Vision: To ensure by the year 2050 that the Bay Area is affordable, connected, diverse, healthy, and vibrant for all.

Guiding Principles¹

Guiding Principle	Description
Affordable	All Bay Area residents and workers have sufficient housing options they can afford – households are economically secure.
Connected	An expanded, well-functioning, <u>safe and multimodal</u> transportation system connects the Bay Area – fast, frequent, and efficient intercity trips are complemented by a suite of local transportation options, connecting communities and creating a cohesive region.
Diverse	The Bay Area is an inclusive region where people from all backgrounds, abilities, and ages can remain in place – with <u>full</u> access to the region's assets and resources.
Healthy	The region's natural resources, open space, clean water, and clean air are conserved – the region actively reduces its environmental footprint and protects residents from environmental impacts.
Vibrant	The Bay Area is an innovation leader, creating quality job opportunities for all and ample fiscal resources for communities.
