OBAG 3 Overview

One Bay Area Grant (OBAG 3)

- ❖ MTC Resolution 4505, adopted January 2022
- ❖ Supports implementation of *Plan Bay Area 2050*
- ❖ \$768 million in federal highway funds 2023-2026
- ❖ Regional Program
 - MTC-led projects and initiatives
 - Some programs include focused grant opportunities
- County & Local Program
 - Broad eligibility for local-priority projects
 - Regional call for projects May 2022 January 2023
 - County Transportation Agencies (CTAs) conducted outreach and initial evaluation
 - MTC scored and selected projects from CTA nominations



County & Local Program - CTA Evaluation

CTA Outreach Requirements

- ❖ Include sponsors, stakeholders, public
- Ensure input is accessible to all
- Leverage any recent, relevant engagement
- Coordinate with MTC on outreach plan development
- Submit outreach documentation with project nominations
- Complete Streets Policy
 - Consider needs of all roadway users
 - Local bike/ped advisory committee review

CTA Evaluation Criteria

- Eligibility for funding
- Alignment with regional plans/policies, prioritizing:
 - Underserved communities, e.g. Equity Priority Communities (EPCs)
 - Alignment with MTC's Vision Zero and Equity Platform
 - Pro-housing jurisdictions
- Community support
 - Emphasis on historically impacted communities
- ❖ Deliverability and risk
- Additional criteria (optional)

County & Local Program - MTC Evaluation

MTC Evaluation Criteria

- ❖ Alignment with Plan Bay Area 2050 strategies
- Effectiveness in reaching regional objectives
- Contribution to regional networks or facilities
- Project risk and prior sponsor delivery
- Cost-effectiveness of air quality benefits

Equity Lens Example: Bayview to BART Bike/Ped Route




- Based on public outreach

- * Regional Networks

- ❖ ACTC's San Pablo Avenue Complete Streets (\$30M)
- CCTA's Smart Signals (\$27M)
- ❖ San Rafael's 2nd/4th Intersection Improvements (\$3M)
- ❖ Napa's Silverado Trail Intersection Improvements (\$2M)
- ❖ SFCTA's West Side Bridges (\$15M)
- Menlo Park's Caltrain Bike/Ped Undercrossing (\$15M)
- San Jose's Story-Keyes Complete Streets (\$33M)
- ❖ Fairfield's Travis Safe Routes to School/Transit (\$4M)
- * Rohnert Park's US 101 Bike/Ped Overcrossing (\$3M)



County & Local Program - Project Overview

- * \$383 million for 81 projects
 - \$4.6M average grant award
 - Supports \$1.1 billion total project costs
- ❖ \$207M within Equity Priority Communities
- 91% Priority Development Area (PDA)-Supportive
 - 50/70% targets by county
- ❖ \$49M Safe Routes to Schools (SRTS) investment
 - Exceeds \$25M target
