FY 2025 Federal Earmark Repurposing Update

Subject:

Update to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) earmark repurposing process enabled through the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2025.

Background:

The federal Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2025 includes a provision enabling states to repurpose unused earmark balances from projects that have not substantially progressed, or that are completed and closed.

In July, the Commission directed staff to develop the list of available earmark balances in the Bay Area recommended for repurposing and submit necessary documentation to Caltrans by the required deadline. This agenda item is an informational update on this year's earmark repurposing process.

FY 2025 Earmark Repurposing – MTC Submittal

Caltrans distributed the list of earmark balances eligible for repurposing on August 12, 2025, with requests for repurposing any balances due by August 22, 2025. Under this extremely compressed timeline, staff worked with affected project sponsors and County Transportation Agencies (CTAs) to verify the status of projects associated with available earmark balances and identify projects to accept the repurposed funds. By the deadline, staff submitted two repurposing requests to Caltrans, totaling approximately \$1 million, as detailed in the table below.

An additional \$3.2 million in available earmark balances were not recommended for repurposing this year, as project sponsors indicated that these balances could still be put to use on the projects for which they were originally earmarked.

FFY 2025-26 Earmark Repurposing

Additional earmark balances may be eligible for repurposing in the current federal fiscal year. Caltrans has provided initial guidance on accessing additional earmark balances, which MTC staff expects to pursue in the coming months. Staff will present additional information on these additional balances along with a recommendation for repurposing eligible earmarks to this Committee in Summer 2026.
