Alameda County Transportation Commission (Alameda CTC) staff appreciates the Metropolitan Transportation Commission's (MTC) consideration of Regional Measure 3 (RM3) Dumbarton Corridor funding for projects in Alameda County. As you know, the Dumbarton corridor is an important multimodal corridor connecting Alameda and San Mateo Counties and serves multiple Priority Development Areas.

Based on your project solicitation process for the initial programming of these funds, Alameda CTC reached out to the Cities of Fremont, Union City, Newark, the Altamont Commuter Express (ACE) and AC Transit for a list of needs along the Dumbarton Corridor that would be consistent with the RM3 Dumbarton Corridor program description. The Tri-Cities provided Alameda CTC with a consolidated list of project funding requests totaling \$105 million. Alameda CTC staff reviewed the projects to confirm their inclusion in the Countywide Transportation Plan and PBA 2050, and subsequently forwarded the project information provided by the project sponsors to MTC staff. It is our understanding that any request for RM3 fund allocations for projects in Alameda County will require Alameda CTC review and our Commission approval. At this time, Alameda CTC has not acted on the RM3 list of projects.

Again, thank you for your consideration of projects that support mobility and safety along the Dumbarton Corridor.
