Senate Bill 125 Background

- \$4 billion in Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)
 - Bay Area share expected to be \$770M
 - \$665M collectively dedicated to BART Core Capacity and BART to Silicon Valley Phase II, leveraging \$6 to \$8 billion in federal funds
- \$1.1 billion for new Zero Emission Transit Capital Program (ZETCP)
 - Bay Area share expected to be ~\$400M
- MTC to make remaining \$105M in TIRCP and all \$400M in ZETCP available for transit operations
- State funding supplemented by \$300M in regional funds to address standardized shortfall needs

Regional Contribution to Help Address Gap

- MTC estimates \$300M in **currently unprogrammed funds** could be redirected
- Redirection of funds will require significant trade-offs
- Final regional contribution depends on interest earned on SB 125 capital funds and continued state advocacy

Proposed Regional Funding Framework for FY25-26

- Regional funds assigned to operators based on eligibility requirements
- STP/CMAQ funds preserved where possible to minimize impact on local projects
- Operators confirmed feasibility of framework

* Regional funding for BART includes \$60 million in CMAQ funds that would be programmed to BART Core Capacity, enabling \$60 million in SB 125 capital funds committed to that project to shift to support FY2025-26 operating needs.

- If satisfactory progress is not made, MTC to impose remedies and/or temporarily withhold SB 125 funds

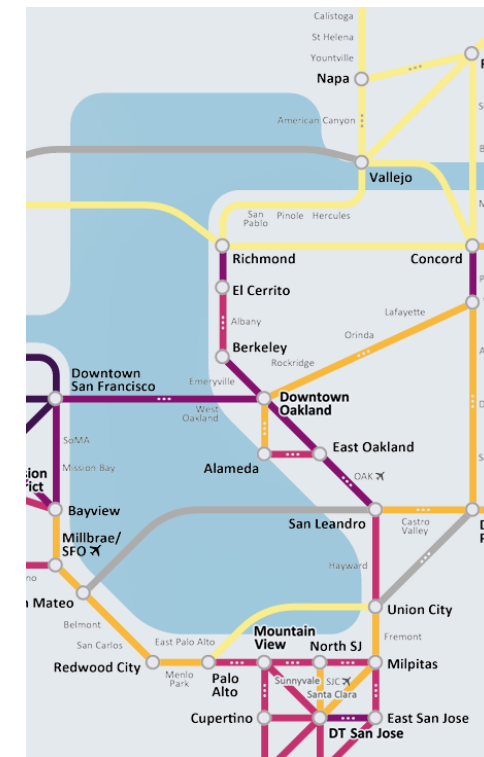

Funding

- FY24-25 SB 125 operating funds were allocated to BART and ACE in October
- FY24-25 SB 125 operating allocation to SFMTA proposed for November
- Staff will return to PAC for approval of programming of regional funds in December
- ***Today's recommended action:*** Refer MTC Resolution No. 4619, Revised to the Commission for approval of the \$300 million regional funding framework

Regional Accountability Measures

- Operators to continue submitting progress updates on rolling basis
- PAC to receive monthly updates upon MTC's receipt of claims
- Staff will prepare a mid-year SB 125 regional accountability measure progress update for early 2025
- MTC staff will continue to support advancement of initiatives and bring updates to committees such as RNM
